Texas Track & Field hosts its final meet of the regular season as the Longhorn Invitational will serve as the team's final tune-up before the Big 12 Championship in two weeks. The Longhorn Invitational brings in a number of teams from the Power Five conferences and ranked opponents for a team scored meet that will have two days worth of action.

The Auburn Tigers highlight the ranked opponents visiting this weekend as their women are ranked No. 13 in the latest USTFCCA Rankings. The Auburn men jumped seven spots this week to land at No. 14. Virginia Tech's men are ranked No. 25 and the Hokies are only bringing their pole vaulters. The men's pole vaulters from VT are ranked No. 7 in the nation for that event. Stanford is another top team headed to the meet with the Cardinal women ranking No. 13 on the strength of their mid-distance runners. Other teams bringing top talent are Minnesota and Michigan, whose women each boast some of the top throwers in the country.

Action starts on Friday afternoon with the hammer throw and javelin. Saturday's slate begins at 10 a.m. for field events with running events starting at 11. Admission to the meet is free both days.

#### TEXAS TRACK & FIELD NOTEBOOK

##### Lloyd Breaks School Record

- Sophomore **Meghan Lloyd** broke her first school record as she became the fastest Longhorn in the steeplechase at the Cardinal Classic, clocking in at 10:20.37.
- Lloyd bests the previous school record of 10:26.90 set by Brittany Marches in 2014, also set at a meet hosted by Stanford.
- Lloyd shattered the previous record by more than six seconds and is now the Big 12 leader in the event this season.

##### Gordon, Robinson Sweep Big 12 Awards

- Texas claimed both the men's and women's Big 12 Track & Field Athlete of the Week awards on Wednesday as the conference announced **Chrisann Gordon** and **Byron Robinson** as this week's winners.
- Gordon, a senior from Jamaica, threw down the fastest time in the nation last weekend to win the 400 meters at the LSU Alumni Gold. Her time of 50.64 seconds establishes her as the No. 1 runner in the NCAA with just a few weeks left in the regular season. With that time, Gordon shattered her previous personal best by nearly half a second and she is now the No. 4 performer in school history.
- Gordon's time also puts her at No. 3 on the world list so far in 2017 and she is .34 of a second ahead of No. 2 on the NCAA list.
- Robinson ran his fastest time of the season in the 400 meter hurdles at the LSU Alumni Gold, clocking in at 49.55 seconds. He finished second behind a post-collegiate runner and now stands at No. 2 on the NCAA descending order list.
- His time was not far off his mark from a year ago when he ran the No. 1 time in the NCAA all season in 2016 at the LSU meet. Robinson also ran the anchor leg of the winning 4x400m relay that finished in 3:05.59. That time puts the Longhorns at No. 12 in the NCAA so far this season.

##### Rogers Makes Statement in 1500m

- Sophomore **Alex Rogers** did not get the win in the invitational section of the 1,500 meters, but he made a big

statement with his time of 3:40.85 as he went toe-to-toe with a pair of All-Americans, including Big 12 champ Craig Nowak from Oklahoma State.

- Rogers finished third with Colorado's Ben Saarel clocking 3:40.24 and Nowak at 3:40.41.
- His time puts him at No. 6 in the NCAA this season and the No. 3 performer in school history ahead of Kyle Merber.

### Daniels Takes on Top Talent at LSU

- Sophomore **Teahna Daniels** kept her steady improvement going as she ran her fastest times in both the 100 and 200 at the LSU Alumni Gold.
- With some of the top sprinters in the nation in the field for both events, Daniels got to test herself against LSU's and Clemson's best. She took third in the 100 meters with a time of 11.18 seconds and finished sixth in the 200 at 23.05.
- Both her times were wind-aided and will not count toward record keeping, but they will stand for NCAA standings this year and move her up that descending order list.
- She is now ranked No. 1 in the Big 12 in the 100 and is No. 3 in the 200 with the conference championship meet approaching in two weeks.

### Burton Wins Big 12 Athlete of the Week

- Freshman **Rushelle Burton** earned the first Big 12 Athlete of the Week honor (April 19) for the Longhorns with her NCAA-leading time in the 100m hurdles at the Texas Invitational.

## EVENTS TO WATCH

### LONGHORN INVITATIONAL

#### • WOMEN'S POLE VAULT

This event will be full of All-Americans with junior **Kally Long** leading the way for the Longhorns. The field will include Indiana's Sydney Clute who ranks No. 2 this season at 4.55m. Auburn's Jessie Johnson is a 3-time All-American in her career. Tulane's Alyssa Applebee is No. 16 on the descending order list this season and was an All-American last year at Missouri. UT junior **Shay Petty**, who is redshirting this outdoors season, is expected to be in the field and finished 10th at NCAA Indoors this year. Former Cal star and current professional vaulter Allison Stokke also is in the field.

#### • WOMEN'S THROWS

Michigan and Minnesota both boast some of the deepest groups in the nation in the shot put and discus this season. Stanford has the No. 2-ranked javelin thrower on the women's side and Texas junior **Haley Crouser** is ranked No. 17 and tops in the Big 12 at the moment. All 4 of the women's throws will feature Top 25 athletes, including 4 in the shot put and javelin. The women's javelin field is anticipated to include 3 of the top 8 throwers in the nation.

#### • MEN'S POLE VAULT

Another field loaded with All-Americans and top talent fans will see a spectacular competition that includes Texas redshirt sophomore Barrett Poth. The All-American currently ranks No. 15 in the nation this season and the field is expected to have No. 2 Torben Laidig and No. 15 Deakin Volz from Virginia Tech.

## CONGRATS TO 2016 BOWERMAN WINNER COURTNEY OKOLO!



- Burton went stride-for-stride with world record holder Keni Harrison, clocking in at 12.65 seconds. Her time was slightly wind-aided at 2.3 meters per second to not be eligible for record keeping. Harrison ran 12.54.
- Burton's time does rank as the second-fastest ever by a freshman in the NCAA under all conditions. Defending NCAA champion Jasmine Camacho-Quinn of Kentucky ran 12.54 (3.8 m/s wind) last year at the NCAA Championships.
- Burton won silver at the 2016 IAAF World Junior Championships for Jamaica and has been posting fast times all season in her first year as a Longhorn.
- She crossed the line at the Texas Relays in 12.80 seconds to take second place in the 100m hurdles. That time ranks her fifth in school history and puts her at No. 4 in the NCAA at that point in the season.
- Burton finished 5th at the NCAA Indoor Championship in the 60m hurdles and won the Big 12 title as well to be named Big 12 Freshman of the Year.
- So far this outdoor season, Burton has also played a key role in UT's 4x100m relay team. She ran anchor at all three meets. The Longhorns currently rank 9th in the NCAA this year.

### Bailey Among National Leaders

- Senior **Aldrich Bailey Jr.** ran his 2017 outdoor debut in the 400m at the Texas Invitational to take 2nd place.
- He clocked 46.06 and now ranks No. 22 in the NCAA so far this season. Bailey also crossed the line in the 200m in 20.40 seconds to put him at No. 10. He also is No. 2 in the Big 12 in the 200.
- His 200m time, although slightly wind-aided, is faster than any mark he recorded last season when he won the Big 12 title and earned Big 12 High Point Scorer at the championship meet.
- Bailey also has played a key role on both the 4x100m and 4x400m relay teams that have the Longhorns among the best in the nation so far this season.

### Peterson Wins Texas Invitational

- Redshirt sophomore Brian Peterson grabbed his 2nd win in 3 meets this outdoor season in the discus with a new personal record at the Texas Invitational.
- Peterson's toss of 56.42m (185-1) on his final throw gave him the win and moved him to No. 3 on the Big 12 list.
- His throw also puts him among the top in the nation, standing at No. 26 heading into this weekend's action.
- Peterson currently ranks No. 11 in the West Region. The top 12 finishers at the NCAA West Preliminary Rounds in May advance to the NCAA Championship site in Eugene, Oregon.

### 400m Hurdlers Take Big Step

- Junior **Ariel Jones** made a big improvement in her best time of the season at the Texas Invitational. Jones ran 56.68 to finish 2nd behind Kentucky's Kiah Seymour by just .01.
- That time cut more than 1.5 seconds off her previous best time of the season (58.29) and shot her up the national rankings to No. 9.
- Jones is the back-to-back defending Big 12 champion in the event.
- Sophomore **Kirema Macharia** took a full second off his personal best time in the men's race at the Texas Invitational.
- Macharia clocked in at 52.47 seconds to finish in 2nd place. That time puts him in position to qualify for the NCAA West Preliminary Rounds at this time and is No. 6 in the Big 12 as the postseason approaches.

### Longhorns Among NCAA Favorites

- Texas is among the elite programs in the NCAA again in 2017 with both teams ranked in the Top 10 by the USTFCCA.
- The women currently stand at No. 8 with the men No. 9 to make the Longhorns the only school in the Big 12 to have both its teams ranked in the Top 10.
- Texas is 1 of 7 schools to have its men's and women's teams ranked in the Top 10.
- The Big 12 Conference has 4 other men's team ranked in the Top 25: Texas Tech (4), Baylor (10), Kansas (11), Oklahoma State (24).
- The Big 12 has 2 other women's teams ranked in the Top 25: Kansas State (11), Baylor (12).
- During the indoor season, the men finished in 9th place at the NCAA Championships with 21 points.

### Future Longhorn Wows Crowd at Texas Relays

- Incoming freshman Sam Worley showed what the future could look like for the mid-distance program at Texas as the high school senior grabbed a victory in the Jerry Thompson Men's Mile at the 90th Clyde Littlefield Texas Relays.
- Worley bested a few of his future teammates and Lifetime Longhorn Leo Manzano with an amazing time of 4:00.61 to narrowly miss becoming just the 10th American high school runner to clock a sub-4 minute mile. Instead, Worley ranks No. 11 all-time in U.S. history with his mark.

### Bruckner Breaks School Record

- Freshman **Elena Bruckner** came to Texas as the No. 1 throwing recruit in the nation and showed her potential at the 90th Clyde Littlefield Texas Relays by taking down the school record in the discus.
- Bruckner muscled the disc out to a distance of 54.64 meters (179-4) on her second attempt to better the previous record of 177-7.
- The discus record, set by Laura Messner in 1981, was the oldest women's school record still standing. Messner set her mark at Texas Relays as well. Now the oldest women's school record is the 1500m and triple jump, but set in 1986. The oldest overall record is the men's 3000m steeplechase set back in 1984.

### Standard Bearers

- No school holds more current collegiate records than the Texas Longhorns. The men and women combine to hold a total of 7 collegiate records in NCAA championship events half way into the end of the 2017 outdoor season. Oregon recently tied Texas by breaking the women's 800m and 4x100m relay records last week at the Mt. SAC Relays. Arkansas and Texas A&M each hold 5 records. Colorado and LSU have 4, and all of Colorado's records are held by a single athlete.
- Two of UT's records were set during the 2016 campaign. **Ryan Crouser** tied the indoor collegiate record in the shot put at the Big 12 Indoor Championships. **Courtney Okolo** already owned the collegiate record in the outdoor 400 meters, but she cut .32 off her time running 49.71 seconds at the LSU Alumni Gold in April.

### Mahler Among Best in Texas History

- Redshirt junior **Wolf Mahler** put together the best 2 days of his career at the 90th Clyde Littlefield Texas Relays as he finished 3rd in the decathlon with a total of 7,897 points.
- Mahler posted personal records in nearly every event, including an impressive 4 PRs in the high jump alone to catapult himself to No. 4 in school history with his point total.
- He stands No. 7 in the NCAA this season and is knocking on the door of joining the 8000-point club.

### Robinson Debuts in Primary Event

- Olympian **Byron Robinson** made his season debut in his primary event at the Texas Relays, clocking 51.21 seconds to advance to the final of the men's 400 meter hurdles.
- In the final Robinson ran 49.93 seconds to finish in second place and stand 6th on the descending order list this season.

### Long Posts PR in Outdoor Debut

- In her first outdoor meet of the season, All-American **Kally Long** set a new outdoor personal record at the Texas Relays with a clearance of 4.40m (14-5.25).
- Long almost tied the school record, being knocked out of the competition at 4.50m. Her 3rd attempt saw her get hip clearance over the bar but she brushed it and it fell for her final miss.
- She currently leads the Big 12 in her event outdoors and ranks No. 6 in the NCAA.
- 5 of the top 10 marks in the country came from the Texas Relays.

### Steeplechasers Making Impact

- Redshirt freshman **John Rice** posted a victory for the Longhorns in the men's steeplechase at the Texas Relays.
- He ran his first race over the barriers since high school and clocked in at 9:04.30 while holding off a late charge from the competition. His time is No. 3 in the Big 12 this season.

- Sophomore **Meghan Lloyd** flirted with breaking the school record in the women's 3,000 meter steeplechase during Texas Relays by shattering her previous PR.
- Lloyd ran 10:30.17 to finish second and miss the record by less than four seconds. Her time puts her just outside the top 30 in the NCAA and is 3rd in the Big 12.

### Triple Jumpers Fly at Texas Relays

- Freshman **O'Brien Wasome** found himself in a tight battle in the men's triple jump during Texas Relays with 5 of the top 10 marks in the NCAA this season coming out of that competition.
- Wasome leapt an impressive 16.31m (53-6.25) for a new personal best. That mark also ranks 6th in school history.
- Wasome finished 4th in the meet and currently stands at No. 2 in the NCAA behind Baylor's Felix Obi. He is tied with NCAA indoor champion KeAndre Bates of Florida at 16.31m.
- Moving up the conference rankings for women was redshirt freshman **Georgia Wahl** as she put together her best performance as a Longhorn.
- Wahl leapt 12.77 meters (41-10.75) in the B section of the women's triple jump to finish in fifth place. Her mark was wind-aided and does not count toward official records, but it does move her into 4th on the Big 12 list this season. She also is now in the top 30 at the national level.

### Hurdlers Roll at Victor Lopez Classic

- Texas hurdlers put on a show for the fans in Houston last month with the Longhorns winning the women's 100 meter hurdles, men's 110 meter hurdles and women's 400 meter hurdles. All with some of the top times in the nation.
- Freshman **Rushelle Burton** showed why she was one of the top high school runners in the world last year, clocking 13.12 seconds to win and post the No. 3 time in the NCAA at the time in the 100 meter hurdles.
- Redshirt junior **Spencer Dunkerley-Offor** followed suit by winning the men's 110 hurdles with a blazing time of 13.86 seconds. That time put him No. 2 in the NCAA list to-date in the season.
- Junior **Ariel Jones** ran her first 400 meter hurdle race of the season and got a win in her hometown. Jones clocked 58.29. Sophomore **Mariam Abdul-Rashid** ran right with Jones in second place and a time of 58.41. The pair still stands in the top 20 in the NCAA so far this season.

### Golden Shines in Houston

- Sophomore **Zola Golden** grabbed 3 wins at the Victor Lopez Classic besting the field in the 100m, 200m and 4x100m.
- Golden clocked a new personal best time 11.71 seconds despite slowing down early in the 100.
- She finished the 200 in 23.26 seconds, which still ranks 32nd in the NCAA this season.
- Golden also ran the 3rd leg of the victorious 4x100 relay, which clocked 44.64.

### Bruckner Sweeps Throws Events at Rice

- Freshman **Elena Bruckner** continued her early success as a Longhorn with a pair of victories at the Victor Lopez Classic. She posted a new season best mark in the shot put at 16.53m (54-4.25).
- Her shot put mark ranks her No. 20 in the NCAA so far this season and No. 5 in school history.
- She was not even scheduled to compete in the shot put until minutes before warmups started.
- Bruckner won the discus with a distance of 50.70m (166-4).

### Caldwell Breaks School Record Twice

- Junior **Lauryn Caldwell** broke her own school record in the hammer throw twice to open the outdoor season.
- Caldwell finished 5th at the UTSA Invitational with a final mark of 55.42m (181-10). She improved her previous record by nearly 5 feet.

### Crouser Dominates in Javelin Debut

- Junior transfer **Haley Crouser** posted her first win as a Longhorn when she crushed the field in the javelin at the UTSA Invitational to open the outdoor season.
- Crouser posted a throw of 51.41m (168-8) to set a new meet record and defeat the field by more than 50 feet.
- Her throw ranks her 8th on the NCAA list so far this season.

### Wasome Joins Group of Elite Freshman

- Triple jumper O'Brien Wasome finished 3rd at the NCAA Indoor Championships with a leap of 16.49m (54-1.25). It was the best finish by a Longhorn in the event since Chris Hercules finished 2nd in 2001.
- The distance of 16.49m puts Wasome among the best freshmen in NCAA history. He is now 1 of 6 freshman to hit the 16.40m mark indoors in the triple jump, joining Christian Taylor (Florida), Will Claye (Oklahoma), Clayton Brown (Florida), Bryce Lamb (Texas Tech) and KeAndre Bates (Florida).
- It is elite company that has gone on to do well on the international stage as Taylor has won back-to-back gold medals at the Olympic Games with Claye taking silver at both the London and Rio Olympic Games behind Taylor.
