TEXAS LONGHORNS QUICK KICKS ...

• Texas sophomore forward **Trinity Byars** is setting quite a pace nationwide as the Richardson, Texas, native is currently the **ONLY PLAYER IN DIVISION I TO RANK IN THE TOP SIX FOR GOALS, ASSISTS AND POINTS**. She's fifth in the national stats in points (33) and sixth in both goals (12) and assists (nine). **Byars is incredibly efficient as she's scored on 50% of her shots on goal in 2022 (12 goals on 24 shots on frame).**

• Texas leads its all-time series over Iowa State by a total of 25-3-1, including 10-2-1 on the road in Ames. The Longhorns have won the last five meetings in the series with the most recent Cyclones win occurring in Ames back on Oct. 14, 2016, by a score of 2-0. UT has won 11 of the last 12 match-ups dating back to Oct. 17, 2010.

• Texas enters Thursday riding a school record **15-MATCH BIG 12 CONFERENCE REGULAR-SEASON UNBEATEN STREAK (11-0-4)**. UT's last regular-season Big 12 defeat **OCCURRED 713 DAYS AGO** back on Nov. 6, 2020, in a 1-0 loss at Texas Tech.

• Texas also enters Thursday riding a **13-MATCH UNBEATEN STREAK (10-0-3)** dating back to Aug. 28 against Florida. That's tied for the second-longest such skein in school history. The program unbeaten streak record is 14 matches stretching from Sept. 12 to Nov. 4, 2021 (10-0-4 record).

• **Byars** enters Thursday's match at Iowa State riding her **second five-point scoring streak of the season**. The longest such streak of her career was eight consecutive contests from Sept. 12-Oct. 8, 2021.

• Sophomore midfielder **Jilly Shimkin** was rewarded for her three-point performance against West Virginia by picking up her **first career selection to Top Drawer Soccer's National Team of the Week**. The Rockville Centre, N.Y., native scored a penalty and dished an assist on the match winner as UT won for the first time in Morgantown, 2-1.

• **Byars** is closing in on more program history. After registering 12 goals and 10 assists during her 2021 freshman campaign, **Byars is only one assist from becoming just the second player in Longhorns history to post two seasons with double-digit goals & assists (and the first to do it in consecutive years)**. The other was former two-time All-American Kelly Wilson back in 2001 (13G, 12 A) and 2004 (16G, 14A).

• The Longhorns currently rank **FIRST IN NCAA DIVISION I in assists-per-match (3.07) and SECOND in assists with 46 helpers over their first 15 contests**. Individually, sophomore forward Trinity Byars is tied for **SIXTH IN THE NATION in total assists (nine) and ranks SEVENTH in assists-per-match (0.64)**. Sophomore midfielder Lexi Missimo is also currently **tied for 11TH IN THE NATION with eight assists**.

• The Longhorns also currently rate **FOURTH IN NCAA DIVISION I in points (128), FIFTH in goals (41), EIGHTH in scoring offense (2.73) & NINTH in shots-per-match (19.47)**. Individually, sophomore forward Trinity Byars currently ranks **FIFTH IN NCAA DIVISION I in points (33) and points-per-match (2.36) and SIXTH in total goals (12) and goals-per-match (0.86)**.

• At its **current scoring rate of 2.73 goals-per-match, Texas is on pace to score approximately 50 goals during the 18-match 2022 regular season**. That would be good for fourth all-time in a single campaign in Longhorns history prior to even entering the postseason. The current program record of 57 goals was established back in 2002, while the 2004 (55 goals), 2006 (51 goals), 2000 (49 goals) & 2007 (48 goals) squads round out the top five.

• With a brace during the 2-0 victory at Texas Tech (Sept. 25), Texas sophomore forward **Trinity Byars REACHED THE 10-GOAL MARK IN A SINGLE SEASON FASTER THAN ANY LONGHORNS PLAYER IN SCHOOL HISTORY (10 matches played)**. The old mark of 10 goals over 13 matches played was shared by former Texas All-Americans Kelly McDonald (2003), Kelly Wilson (2001) & Cyera Hintzen (2018).

• The Longhorns defense **recently posted a shutout streak of 402:40** stretching from the second half of the 1-1 tie at No. 12 TCU on Sept. 22 to the first half of the match at West Virginia on Oct. 13. UT also **TIED A SCHOOL RECORD WITH FOUR STRAIGHT SHUTOUTS**.

• Texas needed just 11 matches to reach the 100-point plateau on Sept. 25 at Texas Tech. That tied the 1997 & 2000 Longhorns squads' **SCHOOL RECORD FOR FASTEST TO 100 POINTS IN A SINGLE CAMPAIGN IN PROGRAM HISTORY**. The UT record of 172 total points is shared by the 2002 & 2004 Longhorns.

• Texas has already **attracted two of the top 10 home crowds in Longhorns history** this season. The crowd of 3,264

fans versus No. 1 North Carolina marked the eighth-largest attendance in program history, while the 3,130 fans for the Sept. 30 match-up vs. Baylor ranked No. 10 all-time. The UT record of 5,585 fans was set back on Sept. 26, 2008, against Texas A&M.

● Sophomore forward **Trinity Byars** in rolling along offensively after missing the start of the 2022 fall campaign on international duty. The Richardson, Texas, native has now **scored a goal in eight of the Longhorns last 13 matches (owns points in 11-of-14 contests) and has totaled at least one point in 23 of her 36 career matches.**

● Sophomore forward **Trinity Byars** registered her **SECOND CAREER HAT TRICK and the 16th all-time in program history** during the 8-0 rout of Texas Southern (Sept. 15).

● Texas sophomores **Trinity Byars** (2.36) and **Lexi Missimo** (1.80) currently **rank No. 1 and No. 2, respectively, in the latest Big 12 points-per-match statistics.** The duo also ranks in the league's current top six in points, points-per-match, goals, goals-per-match, assists and assists-per-match. **Byars tops the league in points (33), assists (nine) and goals (12), while Missimo is second in assists (eight).**

● Texas has spread the scoring around over in its opening 15 matches of 2022. So far, **11 different Longhorns have scored at least one goal, while 14 different UT players have registered at least one point.**

● With **24** assists over her first 35 career matches, sophomore midfielder **Lexi Missimo already rates THIRD ALL-TIME in program history** in the category. She needs 10 more helpers to move into a tie for second with former UT All-American Kati McBain (2000-03).

● **Lexi Missimo** owns **17 career goals, 24 career assists and 58 career points over her first 35 official collegiate matches (has tallied at least one point in 21 matches).** In 2021, she became the fastest Longhorns player to reach 10 career goals in program history (just 12 matches), breaking former Longhorns All-American Kelly Wilson's (2001) record by one match. **Trinity Byars** is right there alongside her teammate with **24 goals and 19 assists for 67 points over her first 36 career matches (has tallied at least one point in 23 matches).**

● Texas fifth-year senior midfielder/defender **Emma Regan** has been voted as one of the team leaders for a reason. It's because she provides a consistent presence for the Longhorns. The Burnaby, British Columbia, native has **played in Texas' last 75 matches and is riding a streak of 73 consecutive starts dating back to Oct. 25, 2018.** For her career, Regan has played in 83 total matches with 82 starts. As a freshman in 2018, she missed one match because of injury and six matches due to a Team Canada call-up for senior-level international duty at the CONCACAF Women's Championship.

● The Longhorns **are unbeaten over their last 53 matches (52-0-1) in which they scored two-or-more goals in a contest** dating back to the start of the 2017 season. The last time Texas failed to win or tie when tickling the twine on two occasions was during a 3-2 defeat at TCU back on Oct. 28, 2016.

● UT is 44-4-6 since the start of the 2018 season when scoring first in a match & is 8-0-3 in such contests in 2022.

● After going just 2-8 in one-goal matches back in 2016, the Longhorns have turned around their fortunes by going 37-17 in their last 54 one-goal matches since beginning 2017.

● With an Aug. 30 selection to Top Drawer Soccer's National Team of the Week (Honorable Mention), Texas sophomore forward **Trinity Byars picked up her fourth career nod to the organization's national team of the week** after previous inclusions on Sept. 21 & 28, 2021 (honorable mention) and Nov. 2, 2021 (full team). In her first weekend back with the Horns after her trip to the FIFA U-20 Women's World Cup, Byars played 80 minutes in the loss to No. 1 North Carolina before scoring a brace (two goals) and dishing an assist during the 3-2 win over Florida.

● Texas holds a 31-22-4 overall record in matches following a loss (that total doesn't carry over losses from end of a season to the next) under the guidance of head coach **Angela Kelly**.

● Texas' roster is dominated by players from a pair of standout club soccer programs, Solar SC (Dallas area) & the Vancouver Whitecaps (Canada). Previously coached at Solar SC by Derek Missimo (Lexi's dad), the Longhorns currently boast a staggering 11 different players from the program (**Byars, McFarland, Missimo, Nobles, Claros, Lapomarda, Sydney Cox, EmJ Cox, Miller, Sprout, Dellosso**), while freshman **Olivia Ahern** joins **Holly Ward, Emma Regan & Teni Akindoju** as products of the Whitecaps system. **In all, 15-of-29 Texas players come from the two programs (52%).**

● Texas sophomore forwards **Trinity Byars** (USA) and **Holly Ward** (Canada) wrapped up international stints with their respective squads at the FIFA Under-20 Women's World Cup in Costa Rica (August 2022). Unfortunately, both the U.S. and Canadian squads failed to advance out of group play to the knockout round.

● Back in March 2022, Texas sophomores **Lexi Missimo** and **Trinity Byars** got their busy international slate off to a strong start by helping Team USA earn gold at the 2022 CONCACAF Women's Championship in the Dominican Republic. In helping the Red, White & Blue go 7-0 while out-scoring opponents, 49-0, Missimo scored three times in group action to earn a nod to the CONCACAF Women's U-20 Championship Best XI Team. Sophomore forward **Holly Ward** scored four times during the same CONCACAF event (including the match-winning PK to beat Panama in the quarterfinals) in helping Canada to a third-place finish.

● In June 2022, **Byars** earned top scorer honors while joining **Missimo** in powering the U.S. U-20 National Team to the title at the Sud Ladies Cup in Aubagne, France. The Richardson, Texas, native scored three times over three matches, including a brace during a 3-0 triumph over Mexico.

● **Lexi Missimo** was named by Goal.com as the No. 4-ranked player on the #NXGN list of the world's best wonderkids of women's football for the second straight year (2021 & 2022).

INTERESTING LONGHORNS FACTS

Check out some interesting tidbits on the members of the 2022 Texas Longhorns soccer team:

- Redshirt freshman defender/midfielder **Taylor Dellosso** was a part of the Sarasota Sailing Squadron (Florida) while in high school and has been sailing every summer in Florida since she was seven years old. Her dad was also a goalkeeper at The Ohio State University (1987-89) while her mom played lacrosse for the Buckeyes (1990-91).
- Freshman goalkeeper **Kendall Sprout's** grandfather Ed played football at the University of Iowa from 1956-60.
- Sophomore midfielder **Jilly Shimkin** went to the same high school (South Side H.S.) and grew up just down the street from U.S. Women's National Team and pro standout Crystal Dunn.
- **Lexi Missimo's** dad Derek coached 11 current Longhorns as part of the Solar Soccer Club in Dallas. He remains the all-time leading scorer for the North Carolina men's soccer program, while her mother played collegiate soccer at TCU. Lexi's sister Gabriella was also a part of the Texas soccer program back in 2019.
- Freshman midfielder **Olivia Ahern's** mom played golf for Canada (1987-89) and squash for British Columbia (1986-88), her dad played soccer for the University of Victoria (1989-92) and her sister Isabella played field hockey at Dalhousie University.
- Sophomore midfielder **Amelia Abbott** earned her first senior-level cap with New Zealand during the "Canada Celebration Tour" in a friendly against Canada (and former Longhorns player Julia Grosso) on Oct. 23, 2021.
- Junior midfielder **Sydney Cox** and sophomore center back **EmJ Cox's** mom, Jeanie, played basketball at Vanderbilt, while their dad, John, played lacrosse at Stanford.
- Sophomore center back **Charlotte Bluemel**, long a stalwart on the German U-17 and U-19 national team rosters, has played the saxophone (was in her school band) and the drums for five-plus years.
- Junior defender **Lauren Lapomarda's** sister, Katie, played forward/midfielder at the University of San Diego (2017-20). Lauren also possesses Italian dual citizenship and was scouted for the Under-17 Italian National Team.
- Junior midfielder **Avery Vander Ven's** father played soccer at the University of Wisconsin (1991-94), while her grandfather, Gary Adams (1966-68), and her cousin, Hayden Hill, both played football at the University of Arkansas.
- Senior forward **Teni Akindoju** is a longtime member of Canada's U-15, U-17 and U-20 National Teams, even participating in the 2018 FIFA U-17 Women's World Cup in Uruguay. She traveled to British Columbia over Aug. 11-16, 2019, to participate with the U-20 squad at a Women's National Team EXCEL Camp.
- Senior forward **Lauryn Oliver** is a true lover of dogs, having fostered over 20 in her lifetime that were abandoned or abused, including her favorite, a three-legged pitbull.
- Fifth-year senior goalkeeper **Madison Hogue's** father Jeremy played football and was a two-time Academic All-American as an offensive lineman at USC from 1992-96. He was a part of the Trojans' 1996 Rose Bowl championship team.
- Junior midfielder **Avery Vander Ven** has a twin sibling, Jackson.
- Fifth-year senior midfielder **Carlee Allen's** parents each played basketball at SMU. Her father Chad was a four-year starter for the men's team from 1990-94, while her mother Missy was a four-year starter for the women's squad from 1989-93.
- Graduate student goalkeeper **Savannah Madden** was a part of three national championship teams before arriving at Texas. Two of those were with her Olympic Development Program (ODP) squad (2015, 2016), including stopping all four shots in a penalty kick shootout for the national title in 2015, while the other was with her ECNL team, the San Diego Surf U-15, in 2014. She was also called up to the U.S. Under-17 National Team training camp in Sept. of 2015.
- **Lexi Missimo** was named by Goal.com in both 2021 & 2022 as the No. 4-ranked player on the #NXGN list of the world's best wonderkids of women's football.

Texas sophomore forward Trinity Byars was honored on Sept. 27 with her second consecutive Big 12 Conference Offensive Player of the Week accolade (sixth career weekly Big 12 selection) as well as her fifth career nod as part of Top Drawer Soccer's National Team of the Week.

NATIONAL PLAYER OF THE WEEK!

Texas sophomore midfielder Lexi Missimo was named Top Drawer Soccer's National Player of the Week on Sept. 13 after scoring a combined three goals and dishing two assists during wins over Utah State (2-1) and UTRGV (5-0).

WINNING THE POSSESSION BATTLE

So far through 15 matches, winning the possession battle has proven important to Texas' success. When leading the possession percentage in 2022, UT is 9-0-1, but just 2-1-2 when trailing in possession. Check the totals below:

SCORING FIRST SETS THE RIGHT TONE

In 10-plus seasons under coach Angela Kelly, the Longhorns have posted a 97-12-14 mark when scoring the initial goal of the contest. On Thurs., Sept. 15, Texas tied or broke numerous program records during its 8-0 rout of Texas Southern. The Longhorns broke school single-match marks for shots (54), shots on goal (28) and shot differential (+52), while tying the school mark for corner kicks (17).

LIZ IS THE WORD(EN)

It was quite an impressive collegiate debut for Texas forward Liz Worden on Aug. 18 against Lipscomb. The Riverside, Calif., native earned her first career selection as the Big 12 Conference Freshman of the Week (Aug. 23) after scoring her first career brace (two goals) and dishing an assist as the Longhorns routed defending the Atlantic Sun Conference champions, 5-0. Worden continued her impressive contributions on Aug. 28 against Florida by posting her first career two-assist effort in a 3-2 win.

PRO PLAYING

Texas boasts a number of current professional players from its ranks of Texas-Exes, including Abby Smith (Portland Thorns), Phoenetia Browne (SC Sand - Germany) and Chelsea Surpris (FF Yzeure Allier Auvergne - France). Most recently, Cyera Hintzen, Haley Berg and Julia Grosso have joined that group by signing pro deals to play overseas. Hintzen began her career back in July 2021 and scored four goals in helping lead Valur Reykjavik (Iceland) to the Urvalsdeild kvenna title. It was announced on Sept. 20, 2021, that Hintzen would continue her pro career with Perth Glory FC in Australia. Berg started her pro career in Spain with Zaragoza CFF of the Segunda Division Pro in September 2021, recently signed as an international player replacement deal with the Houston Dash (NWSL) and is currently playing in Denmark for FC Nordsjælland of the top division - Elitedivisionen. Grosso has made the largest pro splash by earning a contract with Juventus FC of Italy's Serie A.

THE BIG 12 PRESEASON SURVEY SAYS...

Texas picked up one first-place vote while being selected to finish SECOND in the annual Big 12 Conference preseason poll. Defending Big 12 regular season and tournament titlist TCU picked up seven first-place votes and 78 total points in topping the listing. Texas ranked second with one first-place vote and 66 total points. West Virginia (one first-place vote, 60 points) was third, while Texas Tech (53 points) and Oklahoma State (49 points) rounded out the top five. Oklahoma (one first-place vote, 40 points), Baylor (34 points), Kansas (30 points), Iowa State (24 points) and Kansas State (16 points) completed the preseason poll.

PRESEASON HONORS FOR THE DYNAMIC DUO

Texas sophomore midfielder Lexi Missimo and sophomore forward Trinity Byars have already picked up a pair of preseason honors entering the 2022 campaign. Both were named to the 11-member 2022 Preseason All-Big 12 Conference Team and were tabbed by United Soccer Coaches to their respective national "Player to Watch" lists for midfielders/forwards.

THERE'S NO PLACE LIKE HOME

Dorothy once said there's no place like home. The Texas soccer squad takes that line from "The Wizard of Oz" to heart as in 10-plus seasons under coach Angela Kelly, the Longhorns have posted a 75-28-10 (.707) record in the friendly confines of Myers Stadium and are 70-23-9 (.730) over the last 100 home matches. Texas owns an all-time home record of 172-54-23 (.737) in the 25th year (1999-present) at Mike A. Myers Stadium and Soccer Field. In the 20+-year history of Texas Soccer, the Horns have registered an overall record of 196-66-25 (.727) in all home games.

AWAY FROM THE FRIENDLY CONFINES...

Texas owns a 33-31-11 mark in true road matches under head coach Angela Kelly but has seen a run of success improve on that total. UT is 31-22-11 in its last 64 road contests.

In her collegiate debut, freshman forward Liz Worden powered the Longhorns offensive onslaught by scoring her first career brace (two goals) and registering an assist. Sophomore defender EmJ Cox, sophomore transfer midfielder Jilly Shimkin (making her Texas debut) and senior defender Cameron Brooks each scored a goal and dished an assist. Sophomore MAC Hermann Trophy Watch List inclusion Lexi Missimo recorded two assists, while senior forward Mackenzie McFarland also managed an assist.

Texas Match Notes

- Worden's second goal marked the 1000th all-time goal in Texas soccer history.
Three of Texas' five goals came off set pieces (two corners, one free kick).
The Longhorns extended their home unbeaten streak to nine matches (7-0-2) dating back to Sept. 12, 2021. UT has outscored its opposition over that stretch, 23-3.
