USE OF AUDIO/VIDEO COVERAGE

Any accredited media entity using "video or audio materials" (film, traditional video or audio, digital video or audio, photos, etc.) from University of Texas Athletics events (games, practices, post-practice/postgame interviews and press conferences) may use that material only for traditional television newscasts, web-based or print coverage (see note below regarding policy on game video on web), or other electronic transmission as approved by The University in writing, with a limitation of up to three (3) minutes in length from any single event. That three (3)-minute package may contain no more than two (2) minutes of game highlights. Its usage must be only as supporting edited video/audio for a reported video/audio story and not simply as a raw video post/rebroadcast/ streamed highlights or interview sessions. Accredited media entities may not offer any live video, audio or other coverage of the event (or tape delay rebroadcast coverage in its entirety) without the advance written permission of The University of Texas athletics department. Video is for news usage only and may not be sponsored or sold. This policy includes all games, matches, practices and events involving any of Texas' athletics programs. It includes all media events — press conferences, pre/post-practice interviews and pre/post-game interviews.

NOTE REGARDING USE OF GAME VIDEO: Policy permits entities to use up to two (2) minutes of video on air (whether taken from the network feed or shot themselves) or on the entity's website. Reports and features must be filed postgame and not during the game. If a game/event is contracted to a network television partner, all highlights may remain on a website no longer than 48 hours following the game/event's conclusion. Highlights may not be used via social media platforms except as a link back to the website/URL hosting the highlights.

EXCEPTION: With advance written permission from the UT Athletics department, media entities will be permitted to rebroadcast the Steve Sarkisian weekly Monday press conferences in its entirety. Video from that 20-minute press conference can be used for either over the air rebroadcast or web postings. Live distribution of the weekly Monday press conference is not permitted. If posted on a website, it must be removed 48 hours after the conclusion of the press conference.

THE OPENING KICKOFF

- The University of Texas continues its 131st season of football on Friday when the Longhorns host Texas Tech for the 73rd all-time meeting and 40th time in Austin.
- Texas was ranked No. 7 in last week's College Football Playoff rankings for the third consecutive week, matching the highest ranking and the third-ever Top-10 appearance in program history.
- Texas (No. 7/7) is ranked in the AP Top-10 for the 11th consecutive week and the Coaches poll Top-10 for the sixth-straight week, the longest streak for UT in both polls since the 2009-10 seasons.
- Last time out, Texas (10-1, 7-1) defeated Iowa State on the road, 26-16, improving to 5-0 on the road this season and snapping a two-game losing streak to the Cyclones in Ames.
- Texas Tech (6-5, 5-3) defeated UCF 24-23 in the Red Raiders home finale last Saturday. The victory was keyed by a blocked extra point attempt after the Golden Knights scored on a 71-yard touchdown pass with 5:30 remaining to play.
- The Longhorns' 10-1 start is the best for the program since 2009.
- Texas is 7-1 in Big 12 Conference play, matching the best start for the team since 2013.
- UT has won six consecutive home games, the longest stretch for the Longhorns since 2007-10 (16 games).
- The Longhorns will be hosting and playing in the final regular-season game as a member of the Big 12 Conference.
- Texas enters Saturday's game with an all-time Big 12 record of 156-79.
- Texas currently boasts 946 all-time wins, tied for the fourth-most in college football history.
 UT holds an all-time record of 946-391-33 (.702).

SERIES HISTORY VS. TEXAS TECH

- Texas holds a 54-18 advantage over Texas Tech in the all-time series between the schools, and has won 11 of the last 14 matchups.
- UT has won 10 of the last 12 games in Austin, including each of the last two.
- Texas and Texas Tech have played each other every year since 1960.
- The Longhorns scored 10 touchdowns in a 70-35 win over the Red Raiders the last time the teams played in Austin in 2021.
- Texas holds the longest winning streak by either side (8 games) and the largest margin of victory (51 points) in series history.
- Last season, the Longhorns fell on the road to the Red Raiders in overtime, 37-34.
- Texas and Texas Tech will square off in the regular season finale for the first time since 2019, a 49-24 home victory for the Longhorns. It will be the third all-time meeting in the regular season finale with all three taking place in Austin. TTU won the first on in 2017, 27-23.

TEXAS TECH RED RAIDERS SCOUTING REPORT

- Joey McGuire is in his second season leading the Texas Tech Red Raiders
- McGuire is an inductee of the Texas High School Coaches Association (THSCA) Hall of Honor and the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame.
- Joey McGuire is the second head coach in program history to lead the Red Raiders to bowl games in each of his first two seasons, joining the late Mike Leach, who guided Texas Tech to a bowl game in each of his 10 seasons.
- The Red Raiders rank ninth in the Big 12 in scoring offense (28.6 ppg) and 10th in total offense (404.1 ypg), while defensively they are sixth in both scoring defense (24.3) and total defense (382.0).
- RB Tahj Brooks ranks second in the conference and third nationally with 1,348 rushing yards and 122.5 rushing yards per game.
- LB Ben Roberts ranks fourth in the Big 12 with 87 total tackles (47 solo) and 7.9 tackles per game.
- DB Dadrion Taylor-Demerson is tied for third in the conference with four interceptions, while DB Malik Dunlap has three interceptions.
- KR/WR Drae McCray has the second-best kickoff return average in the conference 28.2 ypr, including a 100-yard touchdown return.
- Texas Tech enters play on Friday with a threegame winning streak.
- TTU is Bowl eligible for the third-straight season.
- The Red Raiders have won six consecutive games in the month of November.

A TEXAS WIN WOULD ...

- Be Texas' 947th all-time victory, the fourthwinningest program in college football history.
- Clinch a spot in the Big 12 Conference Championship Game for the first time since 2018 and seventh time in program history.
- Give Steve Sarkisian his 70th victory as a head coach and 24th at Texas in his 118th career game as a head coach.

- Mark the first 11-1 start for a Steve Sarkisian led team and the best for the Longhorns since 2009 (12-0).
- Be the Longhorns' first 11-win season and first 11-win regular season since 2009.
- Finish the season unbeaten at home for the first time since 2009.
- Extend Texas' winning streak to six-straight games, the longest since 2018.
- Move the Longhorns' home winning streak to seven in a row, the Longest since 2007-10 (16 games).
- Improve Texas' all-time Big 12 Conference record as 157-79.

THIRD SEASON OF SARKISIAN ERA

- Texas Football Head Coach Steve Sarkisian is in his third season at the helm of the Longhorns and his 10th season as a head coach overall.
- Last season, the Texas offense ranked 24th in the nation and third in the Big 12 Conference with 34.5 points per game, the fourth-straight top-25 scoring output for a Sarkisian-led offense.
- The offensive showing also marked the eighth top-25 scoring offense in Sarkisian's career.
- Marked the seventh time a Sarkisian offense averaged at least 34 points per game.
- Jonathon Brooks surpassed 1,000 rushing yards for the season in the victory over Kansas State, marking the 12th consecutive year a Sarkisian offense (as head coach or offensive coordinator) has had a 1,000-yard rusher.

VICTORY COUNT

- Texas has 10 regular-season wins for the first time since 2009.
- The Longhorns have at least eight regularseason wins in back-to-back seasons for the first time since 2012-13.
- Texas has tallied eight or more regular season victories three times in the last 10 seasons (2018, 2022, 2023).

100TH SEASON OF TEXAS FOOTBALL AT DARRELL K ROYAL-TEXAS MEMORIAL STADIUM

- 2023 marks the 100th season in which Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium at Campbell-Williams will serve as the home for Texas Football.
- The first game at Texas Memorial Stadium took place on Nov. 8, 1924, as the Longhorns welcomed 13,500 fans for a Southwest Conference matchup against Baylor.
- The stadium was dedicated on Thanksgiving Day 1924, after the UT student body decided to name the stadium in honor of the 198,520 Texans who fought in World War I and the 5,280 who lost their lives doing so.
- In 1977, the stadium was rededicated to veterans of all wars.
- The stadium was renamed in honor of College Football Hall of Fame Darrell K Royal in 1996.
- In 2020, the field, previously named for Joe

Jamail, was renamed in honor of Heisman Trophy winners Earl Campbell and Ricky Williams.

• The Longhorns have an all-time record at Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium of 398-122-10 (.760).

HOME SWEET HOME

- Texas welcomed 102,846 fans to Darrell K Royal-Texas Memorial Stadium for the victory against Kansas State.
- The Longhorns played in a packed house at DKR-Texas Memorial Stadium in the victory over BYU, drawing the then-10th-largest crowd in stadium history with 101,670 in attendance.
- In UT's previous home game against Kansas, the Longhorns had 102,986 fans witness the victory over the Jayhawks, the fourth-largest crowd in stadium history.
- Two weeks prior, Texas drew 101,777 fans for the game against Wyoming.
- UT has drawn over 100,000 fans to DKR-Texas Memorial Stadium in nine of the 11 last home games.
- In the 12 home games since the start of the 2022 season, the Longhorns have hosted seven of the 11 largest home crowds in program history.
- The Horns have had 38 home games of 100,000-plus fans.

CELEBRATING THE 2023 SENIOR CLASS

LONGHORNS COLLECT SENIOR BOWL INVITES

- Six Longhorns earned invitations to the Reese's Senior Bowl in Mobile, Ala. where elite draft prospects from around the country are selected to showcase their talent and connect with coaches and decision-makers from all 32 NFL teams.
- Texas' invitees were DB Jahdae Barron, DL Alfred Collins, LB Jaylan Ford, OL Christian Jones, DL Byron Murphy II and DL T'Vondre Sweat.

COACHING CONTINUITY

• Texas has had only three total coaching changes in three seasons under Steve Sarkisian. RB Coach Stan Drayton left after year one (2021) to be head

- coach at Temple and WR Coach Andre Coleman moved on as well that year; WR Coach Brennan Marion left after one season (2022) to become the offensive coordinator at UNLV this past year.
- In the decade prior to Sarkisian's arrival on the Forty Acres, Texas had three head coaches, seven offensive coordinators and six offensive line coaches.
- 2023 marks the third year with the same offensive play caller (Sarkisian)/OC (Kyle Flood) and OL coach in Sarkisian's tenure.
- Marks the first time since Greg Davis and Mac McWhorter's 10-year run together (2001-10) that Texas has had the same play caller/OC and OL coach for more than two years in a row.
- The defensive staff has remained intact for all three years of Steve Sarkisian's tenure.

SCORING IN BUNCHES

- Texas scored 30 points or more points in each of the first nine games of the season for the first time in program history.
- The Longhorns were one of three teams to score at least 30 points in each of their first nine games this season. The other two were Michigan and Oregon.
- UT has scored at least 30 points in 11 of the last 14 games and 18 of 24 games since the start of the 2022 season.
- The Longhorns scored at least 21 points in a quarter in each of the first four games this season with two of those occurrences taking place in the fourth quarter.
- In the home opener against Rice, the Longhorns opened the second half with three consecutive touchdown drives.
- UT trailed Alabama 16-13 heading into the fourth quarter, but quickly scored a pair of touchdowns on back-to-back drives early in the frame to take 27-16 lead. Texas added a touchdown on their next drive to go up 34-24.
- In week three, Texas and Wyoming were all square, 10-10, heading into the fourth quarter. The Longhorns collected touchdowns on their firsts two drives then added a third on a Jerrin Thompson pick-six that closed out the scoring, 31-10.
- Against Baylor, the Longhorns scored three rushing touchdowns in the second quarter to build a 22-point halftime lead on the way to a 38-6 road win.
- UT has had at least one quarter in seven of 10 games in which they have scored at least two touchdowns.

• Texas ranks seventh in ESPN's College Efficiencies rankings with an overall rating of 84.5. The Longhorns rank 19th in offensive efficiency (74.3) and sixth in defensive efficiency (83.2) and

are one of 10 teams nationally (Alabama, Florida State, Georgia, Kansas State, Michigan, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Oklahoma and Oregon) to rank in the top-20 of both.

- Texas ranks 11th among Power 5 programs in total offense (454.3) and 23rd in total defense (336.6), one of nine programs to rank among the top-25 in both categories. The others are Arizona, Florida State, Georgia, Louisville, Miami, Ohio State, Oregon and Oregon State.
- The Longhorns are one of only 10 FBS schools (and nine Power 5 programs) scoring at least 32 points (32.9) and allowing 19 or fewer points (18.2) per game. The list also includes Alabama, Florida State, Louisville, Michigan, Notre Dame, Ohio State, Oregon, Penn State and SMU.

OFFENSIVE EXPLOSION

- Texas exploded for 661 yards of offense against Kansas in the Big 12 Conference home opener.
- The 661 yards were the sixth-most in program history and the most since totaling 689 yards against UTEP in 2020.
- UT's 661 yards were the most in a Big 12 game in program history, topping the previous mark of 658 in 2016 against Texas Tech.
- Texas rushed for 336 yards and threw for 325 yards in the victory over Kansas. It marked the seventh time in program history the Longhorns rushed and passed for over 300 yards in the same game and the first time since 2021 against Texas Tech.
- The Longhorns tallied at least 500 yards of offense in three-straight games at Baylor (503), against Kansas (661) and vs. Oklahoma (527), equaling the longest stretch in UT history.
- It marked the sixth time in program history and first time since 2016 that the Longhorns tallied 500-plus yards in three consecutive games with the prior instances occurring in:
 - 1968: 538, at Rice, 547, SMU; 657, at Baylor
- 1969: 676, at SMU; 555, Baylor; 651, TCU
- 2005: 606, at Oklahoma State; 645, at Baylor; 617, Kansas
- 2007: 545, Nebraska; 589, at Oklahoma State; 551. TCU
- 2016: 548, Baylor; 658, at Texas Tech; 536, West Virginia

AIR AND GROUND ASSAULT

- Texas' offensive effort against Kansas was highlighted by the second-ever game with a 300-yard passer, 200-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver in program history.
- In the victory over Kansas, Quinn Ewers passed threw for 325 yards, Jonathon Brooks rushed for 217 yards and Adonai Mitchell tallied 141 receiving yards.
- The only other 300-200-100 game in Texas history came in 1999 when Major Applewhite threw for 328, Hodges Mitchell rushed for 204 and Montrell Flowers recorded 111 yards receiving in a 38-28 win over Oklahoma.
- In addition to the efforts of Ewers, Brooks and Mitchell, Xavier Worthy posted 93 receiving yards and CJ Baxter collected 67 rushing yards.
- The following week against Oklahoma in Dallas,

the Longhorns notched the program's secondever game with a 300-yard passer, 100-yard rusher and two 100-yard receivers and first in the Red River Rivalry.

- Ewers threw for 346 yards and Brooks rushed for 129 yards, while Jordan Whittington tallied a career-high 115 receiving yards and Worthy added 108 yards.
- The previous 300-100-100x2 game occurred against Ole Miss in 2012: David Ash 326 pass; Malcolm Brown 128 rush; Mike Davis 124 rec; Marquise Goodwin 102 rec.
- The Kansas and Oklahoma games also featured a 10-catch receiver for Texas in each contest
- Adonai Mitchell against Kansas and Jordan Whittington versus Oklahoma.
- It marked the second time in program history and first time since 2009 - Jordan Shipley, UTEP (10) and Colorado (11) - that Texas had backto-back games with a receiver collecting 10+ receptions.

SPREADING THE BALL AROUND

- Xavier Worthy hauled in 10 passes against TCU, the third time this season Texas had a receiver with at least 10 receptions in a game.
- It marked the first time since 2019 the Longhorns had three games with a player catching 10 or more passes.
- The three games are tied with 1999 and 2019 for third-most in a season in program history. The program record is five in 2008, followed by four in 2009.
- Three players have had 10-reception games this season: Xavier Worthy (10 at TCU), Jordan Whittington (10 vs. Oklahoma) and Adonai Mitchell (10 against Kansas).
- Three different players with 10 receptions in a season is the most in program history. The only other season to feature multiple players with 10-plus receptions games was 2008 (Jordan Shipley, three times; Quan Cosby, once).

THE RUNNING BACK ROOM: BROOKS + BAXTER

- For the third consecutive season and eighth time in program history, the Longhorn backfield has featured a 1,000-yard rusher and 500-yard rusher.
- Jonathon Brooks rushed for a career-high 1,139 yards during the first 10 games of the season, while CJ Baxter brought his season total to 507 yards after rushing for a career-high 117 yards in the win at Iowa State last Saturday.
- The duo have combined for seven 100-yard games through the first 11 games of the season.
- As a team, Texas has rushed for at least 100 yards in every game this season, and on its current five-game winning streak has rushed for 843 yards (169 ypg) on 184 carries (4.6 ypc).
- During the 2021 and 2022 seasons, Bijan Robinson rushed for over 1,100 yards each season, while Roschon Johnson topped 550 rushing yards in both the first Texas duo to accomplish the feat since 2001 (Cedric Benson, Ivan Williams).

PROTECTING THE ROCK

• Since the beginning of the Steve Sarkisian Era in

2021, Texas' featured running backs have done a phenomenal job of holding onto the football.

During the stretch, Bijan Robinson (498 touches), Jonathon Brooks (266 touches),
 Roschon Johnson (214 touches) and CJ Baxter (134 touches) combined for 1,112 touches (987 carries, 115 receptions) and had only five lost fumbles.

RUNNING INTO A WALL

- The Longhorns held lowa State to nine yards rushing on 21 carries the fewest allowed by Texas in Big 12 game since 2011.
- Texas has held seven opponents, including each of the last five, to fewer than 100 yards rushing.
- The five consecutive games of under 100 rushing yards allowed is the longest Texas since 2009 and tied for the third-longest streak in the Big 12 Conference over the last 15 seasons:

- Texas limited Rice to 27 rushing yards in the Horns season-opening 37-10 victory.
- UT did it, again, in the conference opener at Baylor, holding the Bears to a total of 60 yards on the ground.
- At Houston, the Cougars were only able to muster 14 yards rushing, the fewest surrendered by a Texas defense since 2018 (-5 vs. USC).
- The Horns made it back-to-back games by

holding BYU to 95 yards.

- UT notched a third-straight game against Kansas State, limiting the Wildcats to 30 rushing yards in the overtime victory. The Wildcats entered play averaging 226 yards per game, the fifth-best output in the nation.
- Texas made it four in a row at TCU, allowing the Horned Frogs to accumulate just 88 yards on the ground.
- The Texas defensive front took it to another level at Iowa State, holding the Cyclones to just nine rushing yards the fifth-straight game Texas held an opponent to fewer than 100 yards rushing.
- It marked the 10th time in the last two seasons that Texas has limited its opponent to fewer than 100 rushing yards.

DEFENSE TAKES CENTER STAGE

- Texas allowed only 176 yards of offense in the victory against Rice, the fewest yards allowed by a Longhorn defense since 2017 (171, San Jose State).
- Rice had just 114 yards during their first 10 drives, adding 62 yards on their final drive of the game.
- At Baylor, the Longhorns registered eight tackles for loss and five sacks, including a pair of sacks by Byron Murphy II.
- The UT defense did not yield a touchdown to the Bears; the first time Texas kept an opponent out of the end zone since shutting out Oklahoma last season 49-0.
- Against BYU, the Texas defense held the Cougars to six points, the fewest they have scored in a game since 2019 (3, at San Diego State).
- It also marked the first time in 47 games that the Cougars were held out without a touchdown.

DEFENSIVE SPARKS

- Sophomore EDGE Ethan Burke has become a force for the defense. In 10 games played this season, he posted 31 tackles (16 solo), 8.5 tackles for loss and leads the team with 5.5 sacks, while also adding two quarterback hurries. Against Kansas State, he had an early sack against the Wildcats the set the tone for the early portion of the game, then tallied a second sack, forcing a fumble that was recovered by the Longhorns at the Texas 5-yard line and led to a UT touchdown.
- True freshman LB Anthony Hill Jr. came up huge against Alabama, collecting a pair of sacks including on Alabama's final offensive play that buried the Crimson Tide deep in their own territory. He ranks second on the team with 52 total tackles and 32 solo tackles, is fourth in sacks (3) and fifth in tackles for loss (5.5).
- True freshman DB Derek Williams Jr. is seventh on the team and third among defensive backs with 32 tackles (19 solo), while adding a tackle for loss and two pass breakups during his first season on the Forty Acres. He's tallied three or more tackles in four of the last six games.
- True freshman DB Malik Muhammad quickly established himself in the Longhorn secondary, tallying five tackles (all solo) in the seasonopener against Rice. He opened the scoring for Texas against Oklahoma when who scooped up

- Texas has scored two special teams' touchdowns during the 2023 campaign, the most since scoring two in 2020.
- Xavier Worthy returned a punt 74 yards for a touchdown to open the scoring against BYU.
- Worthy's return for a touchdown was the first by the Longhorns since 2018 and the 74 yards was the 10th-longest in program history.
- It marked the first punt return for a touchdown allowed by BYU since 2019.

- Texas did it again the following week at Baylor. driving 95 yards on just seven plays in 3:28, closing out the drive with a 21-yard reception by Xavier Worthy.

• After Wyoming's game-opening 75-yard touchdown drive, the Texas defense held the Cowboys to 88 yards on 27 plays (3.3 ypp) over

the remainder of the first half.

- Senior DB Jahdae Barron was a critical cog for the Longhorn defense, registering three key third-down stops (one PBU, two tackles) during the stretch.
- Texas forced Wyoming into five-straight punts after their opening drive.

STOPPING THE TIDE

- Texas defeated No. 3/3 Alabama, 34-24, on the road in Week 2, improving UT's all-time record against the Crimson Tide to 8-2-1.
- The victory was the first-ever non-conference road win for Texas versus an AP Top 3 opponent.
- It marked the first victory on the road against any top-three team since then-No. 1-ranked Longhorns won "The Game of the Century" at conference foe and second-ranked Arkansas, 15-14, in 1969.
- The Longhorns victory snapped Alabama's 21-game home winning streak. The Tide had won 57 consecutive regular-season games versus nonconference opponents.
- Texas' win was the first double-digit home loss for Alabama head coach Nick Saban as a college football head coach since 2003.
- Longhorn QB Quinn Ewers threw for 349 yards and three touchdowns in the victory, the first non-SEC quarterback to eclipse 250 passing yards and two touchdowns since Saban took over the Crimson Tide program in 2007.
- Texas had five sacks in the game, the most surrendered by the Crimson Tide since 2021 (at Auburn) and the most at home since 2015 (Tennessee). The five sacks were the most for a non-conference foe at Bryant-Denny Stadium since 2012 (6, Western Kentucky).

TAIL OF THE TAPE

- The Longhorns averaged 7.9 yards on first down to Alabama's 4.6 yards.
- Texas totaled five sacks and nine tackles for loss against the Crimson Tide.

FOURTH QUARTER FOCUS

- Texas scored 21 points in the fourth quarter, matching the most ever scored in the final frame against a Nick Saban-led Alabama team.
- After taking a 34-24 lead with 8:18 remaining, the Longhorns forced an Alabama 3-and-out then ran 12 plays over the final 7:14 of the game.
- Texas' victory ended a 73-game home win streak for Alabama when leading in the fourth quarter.

CONTROLLING THE FINAL FRAME

- Texas took control of the fourth quarter against Alabama and Wyoming during the second and third weeks of the season.
- During that span, Texas outscored Alabama and Wyoming 42-8 and outgained them 317 yards to 133, while converting 4-of-7 third-down opportunities to 1-of-5.
- On the year, Texas has outscored opponents 104-68 in the fourth quarter.

RED ZONE STOPS

• The Longhorns lead the Big 12 and rank fifth in

the nation in red zone defense.

- Texas has allowed opponents to score on just 67.7% of their red zone opportunities.
- In the Big 12 opener at Baylor, the Bears made six trips into the red zone resulting in two field goals and one turnover on an interception, while twice turning the ball over on downs and a Texas stop at the UT 4-yard line to end the game.

TEXAS IN THE SPOTLIGHT

- The Texas-Alabama broadcast on September 9th was the most-viewed regular-season game for ESPN since 2015.
- The broadcast averaged 8.8 million viewers on ESPN and ESPN2, peaking at over 10.7 million viewers
- UT-UA had the best Saturday viewership for an ESPN game since 2014.
- "Field Pass with The Pat McAfee Show" on ESPN2 had 799,000 viewers – the most-watched McAfee Alternate Telecast and most-viewed College Football Alternate Telecast since the 2018 CFP National Championship.
- Texas-Oklahoma had 8.1 million viewers on ABC
 the second-highest mark ever for the Red River Rivalry (2009).
- Viewership peaked at 11.1 million viewers, while "Field Pass with The Pat McAfee Show" on ESPN2 had 559.000 viewers.

- · Last season, the quintet combined for a total of 2,143 pass-blocking snaps and allowed only eight sacks.
- The group helped Texas average 34.5 points per game, the 17th-highest scoring average among Power 5 programs, and 429.5 yards per game, the 23rd-best mark among Power 5 teams.
- · Left tackle Banks, an Outland Trophy and Lombardi Award candidate, started all 13 games as a true freshman in 2022, allowing just one sack and one quarterback hit during the season.

- On the year, he has totaled a career-high 63 receptions for 834 yards and four touchdowns. He is second in the conference in receiving yards, third in receptions, ranks third in receiving yards, and is tied for 13th in touchdowns, while also second in receiving yards per game (75.8) and third in receptions per game (5.7).
- Eleven of his 63 receptions are for at least 20 yards, including a pair of 44-yard touchdown catches, a 42-vard touchdown reception, a 44vard reception and two 39-vard receptions.
- Worthy now has three seasons of 60-plus receptions, the second Longhorn to accomplish the feat (Roy Williams).

- Worthy also caught four passes for 27 yards in the victory over the Cougars.
- At Houston, he had six receptions for a teamleading 92 yards and had a 42-yard touchdown.
- Worthy was everywhere on the field against Oklahoma, registering season highs with eight receptions and 108 yards.
- It was the sixth time in his career that Worthy eclipsed the century mark, the 10th-most in program history.
- Against Kansas, Worthy had seven receptions for 93 yards and became the 11th Longhorn to reach 2,000 career receiving yards.
- At Baylor, he caught 3 passes for 31 yards and one touchdown while also returning three punts for 48 yards, including a career-long 40-yard return.
- He followed his 40-yard punt return with a career-long 35-yard pass completion to Ja'Tavion Sanders, the second pass and completion of his career.
- His fourth-quarter touchdown reception against Wyoming sparked the Longhorns' offense after catching the ball on the Texas 46-yard line, breaking a tackle at the 40, and racing down the right sideline to score the first of Texas' three unanswered touchdowns.
- The 44-yard touchdown reception was his sixth career TD catch of 40 or more yards.
- Against Alabama in Tuscaloosa, Worthy had five receptions for 75 yards, including a 44-yard touchdown reception early in the second quarter.
- The 44-yard score was the ninth career reception of at least 40 yards and the fifth touchdown of 40-plus yards.
- Last season, he led the Big 12 and ranked 19th in the nation with nine touchdown receptions, while tying for fourth in the Big 12 in receptions (60), ranked fifth receiving yards (760), and seventh in receiving yards per game (58.5) and receptions per game (4.6).
- Worthy also served as the Longhorns' primary punt returner, averaging 9.7 yards per return, the third-best return average in the Big 12.
- Against K-State last season, he caught four passes for 42 yards and two touchdowns against Kansas State.
- His scores brought his career receiving TD total to 21, third all-time in UT history while accomplishing the feat in just 21 games.
- The two-touchdown game was his third of the season and the sixth multi-touchdown game of his career.
- Marked the sixth consecutive game with a touchdown reception, tied for the third-longest streak in UT history.
- Tallied a touchdown reception in at least four consecutive games for the second time in his career.
- His second touchdown reception against Kansas

State was the 100th overall reception of his career. The reception occurred in his 21st game played, the fastest any Longhorn has reached 100 career receptions, besting the previous record of 22 games by Longhorn great Roy Williams.

- Versus Oklahoma in the Red River Showdown, he tallied three receptions for 29 yards, including a 10-yard touchdown reception.
- Against West Virginia, he caught seven passes for 119 yards and two touchdowns of 15 and 44 vards.
- He also threw a 33-yard touchdown pass to Ja'Tavion Sanders on the first pass attempt of his career
- Worthy was the first Longhorn to pass and receive a touchdown in the same game since Lil'Jordan Humphrey against Oklahoma in 2018.
- He caught five passes for a game-high 97 yards against Alabama, including a diving 46-yard reception at the end of the first quarter.
- Worthy was a dynamic performer in 2021 during his first season on the Forty Acres, smashing decades-old Texas records and setting a new standard for Longhorn freshmen.
- He established Texas freshman single-season receiving records for receptions (62), yards (981) and touchdowns (12), while also holding the top single-game marks for receptions (14), yards (261) and touchdowns (3, twice).
- He was named the Big 12 Conference's Offensive Freshman of the Year and earned All-Big 12 First Team honors, the only freshman among the conference's first- and second-team selections.

OUINN IN COMMAND

- Sophomore Quinn Ewers has led Texas to 14 wins in 19 starts during his first two seasons on the Forty Acres.
- Ewers currently leads the Big 12 in completion percentage (70.3%) and is second in passing efficiency (162.0) and passing yards per game (279.2), while ranking third in passing yards (2,513) despite missing two games due to injury. Nationally, he is ninth in completion percentage, 13th in passing efficiency, 17th in passing yards per game and yards per attempt (9.01).
- At Iowa State, he connected on 22-of-33 passes for 281 yards and two touchdowns.
- He has thrown at least one touchdown pass in all nine games he has played this season.
- After missing two games due to a shoulder injury, he returned to lead Texas to victory over TCU, completing 22-of-33 passes for 317 yards and one touchdown.
- It marked his sixth career 300-yard game and fourth this season.
- Against Houston, he completed 23-of-29 passes for 211 yards and two touchdowns, marking his eighth consecutive game with a touchdown pass and the ninth multi-touchdown pass game of his career.
- He had a string of 14 consecutive completions against the Cougars, the eighth-longest streak in program history.
- Ewers surpassed 4,000 career passing yards during the matchup with Houston, the 11th

- In the Red River Rivalry against Oklahoma, Ewers threw for 346 yards and one touchdown on 31-of-37 passing.
- He connected on a string of 19 consecutive passes against OU, breaking Colt McCoy's record of 18 straight against Oklahoma State in 2008.
- His 31 completions equaled a career high and are tied for the 10th most in a game in UT history.
- It marked his second consecutive 300-yard passing game, the first Longhorn with back-to-back games of 300 passing yards since Sam Ehlinger in 2009 (vs. Kansas, at TCU).

- Ewers connected on 25-of-35 passes for 325 yards and one touchdown in the Horns' victory over Kansas, while also rushing seven times for 40 yards and two touchdowns, including a careerlong 30-yard run.
- He also rushed for a touchdown in his third consecutive game, the first Texas QB to accomplish the feat since Sam Ehlinger in 2018 (Tulsa, USC, TCU).
- Tallied his third-straight game with a passing and rushing touchdown and the fourth of his career.
- Marked the sixth game in which he accounted for at least three touchdowns.
- Had his streak of consecutive passes without an interception ended at 245, the second-longest streak in program history (Sam Ehlinger, 308).

- Ewers opened the 2023 campaign completing 19-of-30 passes for 260 yards and three touchdowns, while also rushing for another score in the victory over Rice.
- The four touchdowns accounted for matched his career high, established last season against Oklahoma.
- Ewers had one of the top freshman campaigns for a Texas QB in program history, guiding the Longhorns to six wins in 10 starts.
- In his 10 games last season, Ewers completed 172-of-296 passes (58.1%) for 2,177 yards, 15 touchdowns and six interceptions in 2022.
- His 2,177 passing yards were the fifth-most all time for a Texas freshman and the 22nd-most in program history, while the 15 touchdown passes were the fourth-most in a season for a Longhorn freshman.
- He led Texas to six victories, tied for third-most by a freshman in program history.
- In the Alamo Bowl against Washington, he connected on 31-of-47 passes for 369 yards and one touchdown, establishing career highs for completions and passing yards.
- The 31 completions and 47 passing attempts were the third-most ever for a Texas quarterback in a bowl game and both marks equaled the 10th-most in any single game in program history.
- Additionally, his 369 passing yards were the third-most ever for a Longhorn in a bowl game and 16th-most in a single game in UT history.
- Ewers threw for 319 yards and two touchdowns on 19-of-49 passing at Oklahoma State, the first 300-yard passing game of his career.
- He had a standout performance against Oklahoma in the Red River Showdown, completing 21-of-31 passes for 289 yards and four touchdowns, establishing then-career bests in each category.
- The four touchdown passes are tied for thirdmost in the UT-OU game in series history and are the most-ever by a Texas freshman.
- Ewers' four passing scores are also tied for

- 10th-most in a game in program history and tied for third among Texas freshmen.
- His four touchdown passes were the most for a Texas freshman since Shane Buechele had four against UTEP in 2016.
- His efforts earned him Big 12 Conference Newcomer of the Week honors, the first weekly conference honor of his career.
- He started the first two games of the season for the Longhorns, completing 25-of-36 passes (69.4%), for 359 yards and two touchdowns in four total guarters of action.
- Against then-No. 1 Alabama, Ewers passed for 134 yards and connected on 9-of-12 passes before being sidelined with an injury at the end of the first quarter.
- He made his first career start and his Longhorn debut in the season opener against ULM, guiding the Texas to a season-opening 52-10 victory.
- The transfer from Ohio State completed 16-of-24 passes for 225 yards and two touchdowns. After throwing an interception on his second career passing attempt, he bounced back to connect on eight-straight passes and nine of 10, guiding Texas to four touchdowns, a field goal and a field goal attempt on his next six drives.

JONATHON ON THE SPOT

- Sophomore RB Jonathon Brooks' performance out of the backfield has been critical to the Longhorns' success in the 2023 season.
- Brooks has tallied a career-high 1,139 rushing yards on the season, the third-straight season in which Texas has had a 1,000-yard rusher and the 26th time overall.
- His 1,139 rushing yards are the 14th-most in a season in program history.
- Through the first 10 games of the season, he ranked sixth in the nation in rushing yards (1,139), seventh in rushing yards per game (113.9 ypg) and sixth in all-purpose yards (142.5 ypg). He was second in the Big 12 in all-purpose yards, third in rushing yards, rushing yards per game and total touchdowns (11), and fourth in rushing yards per carry (6.09) and rushing touchdowns (10).
- His versatility was on display over his last eight games, rushing 161 times for 1,030 yards (103.0 ypg) and catching 22 passes for 240 yards to total 1,270 yards (127.0 ypg).
- At TCU, Brooks rushed 21 times for 104 yards and two touchdowns and caught three passes for 74 yards, including a career-long 73 yard reception, before leaving early in the fourth quarter due to a knee injury.
- Against Kansas State, he racked up 112 yards on 22 carries (5.1 ypc) with one touchdown.
- It marked his fifth 100-yard rushing game in the last seven games and the fifth time in the last six games with at least one touchdown.
- In the victory over BYU, he carried the ball 16

- times for 98 yards 6.1 ypc) with one touchdown and hauled in four passes for 40 yards.
- Against Houston, he rushed for 99 yards on 20 carries and established career bests with eight receptions for 51 yards to total 150 all-purpose yards, his third consecutive game with 150+ allpurpose yards.
- Brooks went over the century mark for the fourth-straight game against Oklahoma with 129 rushing yards and a touchdown on 22 carries (5.9 ypc).
- His fourth quarter touchdown against the Sooners had tied the game at 27-27.
- Oklahoma had entered the game ranked 28th in rushing defense, allowing 105.2 yards per game.
- Brooks was dominant in the Texas victory over Kansas, posting his first career 200-yard rushing game, totaling 218 yards on 21 carries (10.4 ypc) with two touchdowns.
- His 218 yards were the fourth-most for a Longhorn versus an AP-ranked opponent.
- Brooks had a 54-yard touchdown run in the win over Kansas. Of his 13 career touchdowns (11 rushing, two receiving), five have been for 34 or more yards (three rushing, two receiving).
- Rushed for multiple touchdowns in his second consecutive game and third time in his career.

- At Baylor, he carried the ball 18 times for 106 yards and two touchdowns and also had an 18yard reception.
- He had a dominant day in the victory over Wyoming, establishing then-career bests with 21 carries for 164 yards (7.8 ypc) while adding the eighth rushing touchdown of his career.
- During Texas' two fourth-quarter scoring drives against the Cowboys, Brooks rushed for 107 yards on eight carries, including a 61-yard run.
- Against Alabama, he rushed a career-high 14 times for 57 yards and one touchdown.
- Brooks has scored a touchdown in three-straight games (2 rushing, 2 receiving) dating back to the Alamo Bowl against Washington when he had a rushing and receiving touchdown.
- He proved to be a dual threat in the win over Rice, rushing 12 times for 55 yards and catching a pair of passes for 42 yards, including a 37-yard touchdown reception, the longest reception of his career
- For his career, the Hallettsville, Texas native is averaging 6.2 yards per carry, rushing 238 times for 1,479 yards with 16 touchdowns.
- In 2022, he established career highs with 30 carries for 197 yards and five touchdowns.
- He had career day against Kansas with 11 carries for 108 yards (9.8 ypc) and two touchdowns, including a career-long 70-yard

 He made his Longhorn debut in 2021 in Texas' 58-0 victory over Rice, totaling nine carries and 63 yards while also rushed for his first-career touchdown.

A FREQUENT FACE IN THE AP POLL

- Texas has made 770 all-time appearances in the Associated Press Top 25, which debuted in 1936. Oklahoma and West Virginia are the league's only other current members to feature in the AP Top 25 on more than 300 occasions.
- The Longhorns' AP Top 25 history includes 56 preseason poll appearances (34 top-10), 45 total weeks at No. 1 and 50 appearances in the final poll (27 top-10).
- Texas has been ranked in 60 of the last 91 AP Polls, dating back to week five of the 2018 season.

- True freshman RB CJ Baxter has made an immediate impact on the Longhorn offense.
- In the season-opener against Rice, he became the first true freshman to start for Texas since Ricky Williams in 1995.
- The Orlando native put his stamp on the victory at lowa State, eclipsing the century mark for the first time with a career-high 117 yards on 20 carries, while also catching a team-high five passes
- He became just the third Texas running back and first since Cedric Benson in 2003, to rush for over 100 yards in Ames.
- Baxter rushed 15 times for 67 yards in the win over Kansas.
- · He collected his first career touchdown in the

win at Baylor, rushing six times for 21 yards and the score, while also catching a pair of passes for 16 yards.

SANDERS IS A SENSATION

- Junior TE Ja'Tavion Sanders is now a two-time semifinalist for the John Mackey Award (2022-23) after posting dominating performances this season.
- In the win at TCU, he caught four passes for 47 yards, including a 19-yard reception and followed that with a pair of receptions for 32 yards at Iowa State.
- During the victory over the Horned Frogs, he became the fourth Longhorn tight end to surpass 1,000 career receiving yards and just the third to collect 80 receptions.
- At Baylor, Sanders caught five passes for 110 yards to help lead Texas to victory over Baylor.
- He became the first Longhorn tight end in program history to have two 100-yard receiving games in his career.
- For his career, Sanders is tied for second all-time among Longhorn tight ends in receptions (80), is fourth in receiving yards (1,038) and ranks seventh in touchdowns (6).

WHAT THEY'RE SAYING:

- Has caught at least four passes in a game four this season and 12 times over the last 23 games.
- In the victory over BYU he tallied for receptions for 37 yards, including a 20-yard reception his seven catch of 20-plus yards this season.
- Sanders registered his first career 100-receiving yard performance in the victory over Alabama, catching five passes for 114 yards, including a career-long 50-yard reception that set up the Longhorns go-ahead score early in the fourth quarter.
- Sanders' 100-yard receiving performance was the second for a Longhorn against the Crimson Tide, joining Jordan Shipley who had 122 yards on 10 receptions in the 2009 BCS Championship Game.
- His 50-yard reception was the 12th-longest for a Texas tight end in program history.
- He kicked off the 2023 season hauling in two passes for 44 yards against Rice, including a 44-yard touchdown reception in which he caught at the Rice 36-yard line and out-sprinted the Owl defenders to the end zone.
- The 44-yard reception was the longest of his

career and was the sixth touchdown of his career, the seventh-most for a Texas tight end.

- Sanders was tremendous during the 2022 campaign, earning All-Big 12 Honors from the league's coaches and the Associated Press.
- A John Mackey Award semifinalist last season, hauled in 54 receptions for 613 yards and five touchdowns.

- The four-game streak tied for the sixth-longest in program history.
- The Missouri City, Texas native has 11 touchdown receptions over his last 13 games.
- He three receptions for 61 yards and one touchdown against TCU and three receptions for 32 yards at Iowa State.
- He has had three or more receptions in 10 of 11 games this season.
- Mitchell had a career day in the victory over Kansas State, collecting eight receptions for a career-high 149 yards and equaling his career best with two touchdown receptions. It marked his second 100-yard receiving game of the season as well as his second two-touchdown performance.
- In the Texas win over BYU, Mitchell collected three receptions for 59 yards and equaled his season high with two touchdown catches.

WHITTINGTON PUTS IN THE WORK

- Senior WR Jordan Whittington has been a steady presence in the wide receiver room for the last five season.
- Against Iowa State, he caught three passes for 56 yards, including a 30-yard touchdown reception, the second-straight season in which he has caught a touchdown against the Cyclones.
- He had a career day against Oklahoma in the Red River Rivalry, equaling his career high with 10 receptions and setting a new career best with 115 receiving yards.
- The Cuaro, Texas native caught three passes for 44 yards, including a 33-yarder, in the victory over Alabama, after hauling in four passes for 47 yards in the season-opener against Rice.
- Whittington has had three or more receptions in seven of the last 13 games.
- Whittington returned for his senior campaign after a career year for the wideout in 2022.
- Last season, he was among the most reliable pass-catchers in the nation, hauling in 50 passes for 652 yards and one touchdown.
- Whittington had seven games of at least four receptions with at least one reception in all 13 games.
- Of his 50 receptions in 2022, 12 were for at least 20 yards and 30 (60%) were for 10+ yards.
- He had 10 receptions on third-down snaps with nine resulting in a first down.
- Caught six passes for 56 yards at Kansas and six passes for 78 yards against TCU.
- He hauled in his first touchdown of the season against lowa State, totaling two receptions for 27 yards in all.
- Against Oklahoma, Whittington had a huge game with five receptions for 97 yards, including a pair of 22-yard catches and a 32-yard reception.
- The junior was Texas' top target in the matchup with No. 1 Alabama, hauling in seven passes for 64 yards, including a first-quarter, third-down 17-yard reception that kept the Longhorns' second scoring drive alive.
- He opened last season strong in the Longhorns' victory against Louisiana, hauling in seven receptions for a career-high 113 yards and one touchdown. Of those 113 yards, 54 of them came after the catch.
- In 2021, Whittington set then-career highs with 26 receptions, 377 yards and three touchdowns.
- Whittington entered the 2021 season with career marks of 23 receptions for 223 receiving yards, including a career-best 10 catches and 65 yards against Oklahoma in 2020.

JAHDAE ALL DAY

- Senior DB Jahdae Barron is a Jim Thorpe Award semifinalist whose impact in the defensive backfield can be felt throughout the team.
- He tallied five tackles (four solo) in the victory at TCU, then collected a trio of tackles at Iowa State.
- Barron made plays all over the field against BYU, collecting six tackles (two solo) with two tackles for loss, one pass breakup and a pass deflection that led resulted in a Terrance Brooks interception to set up Texas' second touchdown of the game.
- He was a difference-maker for the Longhorns

- against Houston, providing a spark with three timely tackles (two solo) and a pass breakup on the Cougars' final offensive play of the game that halted the drive at the Texas 10-yard line.
- The Austin native registered 11 tackles (five solo) with one tackle for loss in the Red River Rivalry against Oklahoma.
- Barron tallied three solo tackles, including a tackle for loss, and recovered a fumble that led to a Texas touchdown.
- Against Wyoming, Barron had a then-seasonhigh 11 tackles (six solo), 0.5 TFL and one pass breakup in the win, including four third-down plays to force fourth down - three tackles and one pass breakup.
- At Alabama, Barron set the tone for the day, intercepting a pass to shut down the Crimson Tide's first drive and returning it 16 yards to set up Texas' first score.
- Barron added four tackles (three solo) in the win in Tuscaloosa, including a third-down tackle that forced an Alabama field goal.
- In 2022, Barron tallied a career-high 78 tackles (43 solo) including a team-leading 11.5 tackles for loss while adding two interceptions, one quarterback hurry, three pass breakups, one fumble recovery and two defensive touchdowns (INT, FR).
- He became the first FBS defensive back since 2000 to register double-digit tackles for loss, one fumble return for a touchdown and one interception return for a touchdown in the same season.
- Posted at least five tackles in eight games last season, including three double-digit performances.
- The pair of non-offensive touchdowns gave him three for his career, two shy of Michael Huff's UT record.

- Barron notched seven tackles (three solo) in the Alamo Bowl against Washington.
- He tallied five tackles (two solo) with two tackles for loss and his first career sack in helping Texas to a win in the season finale against Baylor.
- The Austin native had a career day against TCU, recording 11 tackles with a career-high nine solo and 3.5 tackles for loss, while also collecting his first fumble recovery and returning it 48 yards.
- Barron posted a critical PBU to prevent a TD and create a turnover on downs at Kansas State.
- He had a standout game against Oklahoma State, recording a career-best 12 tackles (six solo) with 1.5 tackles for loss.

Longhorns, collecting nine over the last 18 games, including all six of his interceptions, while also forcing a fumble in the win over Houston that was recovered by the Longhorns. • The Frisco, Texas native tallied seven tackles (four solo), including one tackle for loss, in the Horns win against Wyoming, bringing his total tackles to over 200 for his career.

- Against Alabama, Ford tallied five tackles (two solo) with one tackle for loss in the victory.
- He opened the 2023 season right where he left off last season, registering five tackles (one solo) and intercepting one pass.
- In 2022, he led the Longhorns with a career-high 119 tackles (61 solo), three forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and four interceptions.

Alabama, posting a team-high 10 tackles (six solo) with two tackles for loss and one sack, helping hold the Crimson Tide to 20 points.

- In 2021, the Frisco, Texas native led the team with six tackles for loss. He collected at least one five of the least six games of the season with two in the season finale against Kansas State.
- He notched a then-career-high 12 tackles (seven solo) against Oklahoma State.
- Ford had at least six tackles in each of the last three games of the season, recording six against Kansas, five at West Virginia and six (all solo) against K-State.

T'VONDRE'S TIME

- Super senior DL T'Vondre Sweat has become a force in the middle of the Texas line and the way to being named a semifinalist for both the Outland Trophy and Bednarik Award.
- For his career, he has totaled 119 tackles (45 solo) with 17 tackles for loss and five sacks in 59 career games played.
- In 11 games this season, he has established career highs with 36 total tackles, 16 solo tackles, 7.5 tackles for loss, two sacks and one blocked kick.

WHAT THEY'RE SAYING:

"Sweat can really move at 6-4, 362 pounds. He can run, he's got great hands and strength. He will certainly be one of the top 15 picks next spring (NFL Draft)." — Joel Klatt, FOX

- At lowa State, he led a Longhorn defense that limited the Cyclones to just nine rushing yards and also blocked a point after try that led to the first defensive two-point conversion since 2019.
- In the win at TCU, he collected four tackles (two solo) and had a sack for a loss of nine yards.
- The super senior was a force against Kansas State, collecting four tackles, one tackle for loss, one quarterback hurry and one pass breakup.
- He had a career day in the victory over BYU, establishing a career best with seven tackles (three solo), including 1.5 tackles for loss.
- Sweat has tallied one tackle for loss in three of the first seven games and is tied for fourth on the team with four TFLs on the year.
- He recorded four tackles (three solo) with one tackle for loss and a pass breakup against Baylor after posting three tackles with one tackle for loss in the victory over Wyoming.
- At Alabama, Sweat registered one sack of the Longhorns' five sacks on the game: the most the Crimson Tide had surrendered at home since 2015.
- Against Rice in the 2023 season opener, he matched his career high with five tackles (two solo) with half a tackle for loss.

MURPHY ON A MISSION

- Junior DL Byron Murphy II has appeared in 35 career games, registering 65 tackles (29 solo), 14.5 tackles for loss and eight sacks during his three seasons on the Forty Acres.
- At Iowa State, he on the Texas D-Line held the Cyclones to nine rushing yards, while he collected

two tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks in the win.

- Murphy had a monster game at TCU, registering three tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss and one sack for a loss of 10 vards.
- He was a menace in the middle of the line for Texas against Baylor, collecting four tackles (all solo) and establishing career highs with three tackles for loss and two sacks.
- Murphy played a critical role in UT's first touchdown drive against Wyoming, catching a 1-yard pass from Quinn Ewers to give the Longhorns their first lead of the game.
- It marked the first reception and touchdown of his career as he became the fourth Texas lineman ever to score an offensive touchdown.
- On the defensive side of the ball, Murphy tallied two tackles and had one QB hurry in the win.
- At Alabama, he was helped spearhead a defensive front that registered nine tackles for loss, five sacks and four quarterback hurries.
- Last season, Murphy recorded a career best with 26 tackles and had eight games with at least two tackles.
- He had a standout performance at Texas Tech, tallying a career-high five tackles with four solo tackles.
- Murphy recorded a sack for a 7-yard loss in the shutout victory over Oklahoma in the Red River Showdown.

SORRELL SETS HIS SIGHTS

- Junior EDGE Barryn Sorrell has become a reliable stopper on the defensive line for Texas.
- The New Orleans native sealed the overtime victory over K-State, collecting a sack on the final play of the game as the Wildcats attempted to pass for the winning score. On the day, he collected three tackles, two tackles for loss, two sacks for 19 yards and two quarterback hurries.
- Sorrell registered three tackles (one solo), one sack and established a career high with three quarterback hurries against BYU.
- In the red River Rivalry against Oklahoma,
 Sorrell notched five tackles (four solo) along the defensive front.
- Sorrell was a force against BYU, registering three tackles with a tackle for loss and one sack and recording a career-high three QB hurries.
- He came up huge against Wyoming, totaling five tackles (three solo) and a monster third-down sack for a loss of nine yards in the third quarter that pushed the Cowboys from the Texas 10-yard line to the 19, forcing Wyoming into a field goal situation
- In the victory over Alabama, Sorrell collected a pair of tackles (one solo) and had two quarterback hurries.
- In 2022, Sorrell appeared in all 13 games with 10 starts, totaling 44 tackles (16 solo), nine tackles for loss, a team leading 5.5 sacks, one forced fumble, seven quarterback hurries and one pass breakup.
- At Kansas, he notched four tackles (all solo) and a tackle for loss.
- He had a career day against TCU, recorded 11 tackles (four solo), with three tackles for loss and

- 1.5 sacks while adding one pass breakup.
- At Kansas State, Sorrell made an earlier impact recorded a sack for a 10-yard loss midway through the second quarter that resulted in a punt that put Texas in scoring position.
- Sorrell tallied six tackles (two solo), a half tackle for loss, one QB hurry and a forced fumble at Oklahoma State.
- He collected his first career start in the 2022 season opener against ULM and made an immediate impact, registering then-career highs with six tackles (one solo), two tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks.
- His efforts helped silence the ULM ground game. holding the Warhawks to 92 yards on the ground.

JERRIN'S JUMPSTART

- Senior DB Jerrin Thompson has emerged as the field general of the Longhorn secondary and a vocal leader of the defense.
- In the win at Iowa State, he registered four tackles (two solo), one pass deflection and intercepted a pass that let to a Texas touchdown and an eight-point swing in the game.
- He matched his season high with five tackles. all in the first half, in the Longhorns' victory at
- · Against Oklahoma in the Red River Rivalry, he tallied a season-high five tackles (four solo) and broke up two passes.
- . Thompson sealed the Longhorn victory against Wyoming with his first career touchdown, intercepting a pass at the Wyoming 27-yard line and returning it for the first pick-six of his career.
- It marked his second-straight game with an interception and third over a four-game stretch.
- He came up huge in the victory at Alabama. intercepting an early fourth-quarter pass at the Alabama 37 and returning it 32 yards to the 5-yard line to set up a Jonathan Brooks touchdown that gave Texas a 9-point lead.
- The 2022 season proved to be a breakout year for Thompson, establishing career bests with 83 tackles, 50 solo tackles, one interception and seven pass breakups.
- . Thompson recorded at least five tackles in eight games last season, including three double-digit performances.
- He was all over the field against Washington in the Alamo Bowl, posting a career-high 11 tackles and equaling career bests with seven solo tackles and one interception.
- Tallied nine tackles (four solo) in the seasonfinale against Baylor.
- Thompson had five tackles (three solo) and a career-best three pass breakups at Oklahoma
- He tied for the team lead with seven tackles (four solo) against Oklahoma to help lead the Longhorns to a shut out of the Sooners in the Red River Showdown.
- Thompson was flying to the ball against West Virginia, posting his second-straight 10-tackle performance, including six solo tackles.
- At Texas Tech, Thompson established thencareer highs with 10 tackles and seven solo tackles, while also breaking up one pass.

- Thompson registered one of the best games of his career against Alabama, tallying seven tackles (four solo) against the Crimson Tide.
- In 2021, he had six starts in his 12 appearances, registering 41 tackles (26 solo) with three tackles for loss, one forced fumble and a fumble recovery.
- In 2020, Thompson appeared in all 10 games and contributed on special teams. He totaled 14 tackles, 10 of which were solo stops.

NON-OFFENSIVE TOUCHDOWNS

- Texas has made scoring non-offensive touchdowns a habit, registering at least one in each of the last seven season and in 14 of the last 15 seasons overall.
- Xavier Worthy returned a BYU punt 74 yards for a touchdown for the first score of the game in Texas' victory over the Cougars.
- · Malik Muhammad opened the scoring for Texas in the Red River Rivalry after recovered a Kitan Crawford blocked punt in the first quarter against Oklahoma.

- · Jerrin Thompson clinched the Longhorns' week three victory over Wyoming with a 27-yard interception return.
- The Horns wasted no time last season when Keilan Robinson scored on a D'Shawn Jamison blocked punt to close out the first drive of the season opener by ULM.
- · Jamison secured a defensive score with a thirdquarter, 69-yard interception return against ULM, giving UT multiple non-offensive touchdowns in a season for the fourth time in six years.
- UT added a third for the 2022 campaign when Jahdae Barron intercepted a pass against UTSA at the Roadrunner 44-yard line and took it to the house for the first interception return of his career. He followed that with a scoop-and-score fumble recovery against TCU.
- Josh Thompson tallied a 27-yard interception return against Texas Tech in 2021 that marked the fifth-straight season in which the Longhorns had a non-offensive touchdown.
- D'Shawn Jamison's 100-yard kickoff return against Oklahoma State in 2020 was the second of his career and fueled the Longhorns comeback from an 11-point deficit at the sixth-ranked Cowboys.

LONGHORNS MAKING THEIR MARK

- Currently, the Texas Football program has 36 players on NFL rosters.
- The current crop of Longhorns in the NFL have won a combined four Super Bowl titles, been named to eight All-Pro teams and been selected to appear in six Pro Bowl games.

2023 NFL DRAFT

- Texas had five players selected in the 2023 NFL Draft. · With five draft selections, Texas had at least five players
- chosen for the second time in three years and seventh time in the last 17 drafts
- On the opening day, RB Bijan Robinson was selected by the Atlanta Falcons in the first round with the eighth overall pick, and one day later LB DeMarvion Overshown was taken with the 90th overall pick in the third round by the Dallas Cowboys. Texas has had at least two players chosen in the first three rounds of the draft in 17 of the last 23 drafts. It also marked the 56th time in the last 62 years (since 1962) that the Longhorns had two or more picks in the NFL Draft.
- . Day three of the draft saw the Chicago Bears select RB Roschon Johnson in the fourth round, DL Keondre Coburn was drafted by the Kansas City Chiefs in the sixth round, and the Philadelphia Eagles picked DL Moro Ojomo in the seventh round.

WATTS BRINGS THE ENERGY

- Senior DB Ryan Watts has been a huge presence in the Longhorn defensive backfield since his arrival on the Forty Acres.
- Watts had a career day against Kansas State, establishing career highs with eight total tackles and seven solo tackles while adding one pass breakup.
- He recorded four tackles (all solo) in the victor over Baylor after posting a season-high six tackles (all solo) against Wyoming, helping limit the Cowboys to 136 passing yards.
- Watts was all over the field at Alabama, totaling four tackles (two solo) with one tackle for loss and one pass breakup.
- The Little Elm native started all 13 games for the Horns in 2022, totaling 51 tackles (33 solo), four tackles for loss, one sack, one interception, one quarterback hurry and three pass breakups.
- Watts had six games with at least five tackles, including four in a six-game stretch.
- Against TCU, Watts registered a pair of tackles for loss for 14 yards, highlighted by a 10-yard sack, helping UT defense limit the high-powered Horned Frog offense to 17 points.
- He intercepted a pass in the end zone against Oklahoma State to snuff out a Cowboy drive.

KEILAN COMING THROUGH

- Senior RB/KR Keilan Robinson has been an impact on the offense and on special teams during his time on the Forty Acres.
- In the victory at Houston, he registered a pair of kickoff returns for over 30 yards, including a 45-yard return in the second quarter that was the second-longest of his career.
- In 2022, the Washington, D.C. native averaged 25.2 yards per kick return, the second-best mark in the Big 12 Conference and 15th in the nation.
- His 422 combined kick return yards were the third most in the Big 12.
- Against TCU, he had two kick returns for 73 yards, including one of 52 yards.
- At Oklahoma State, he returned four kicks for 109 yards (27.3 ypr) including a long of 38, caught one pass for 19 yards and recovered a fumble on a muffed punt return.
- He blocked the second punt of his career versus lowa State on the opening drive of the game.
- He hauled in his first-career touchdown reception at Texas Tech, a 35-yard score that he caught at the 22-yard line along the left side of the field, sprinting in for the score.
- Robinson found the end zone with a special teams touchdown on a scoop and score against ULM off a blocked punt for Texas' first points of the season.
- In 11 games with one start in 2021, Robinson rushed the ball 45 times for 322 yards (7.2 ypc) and scored three touchdowns.
- At West Virginia in 2021, he ran for a career-high 111 cards on nine carries (12.3 ypc), including a 49-yard touchdown run.
- · Against Rice, the transfer from Alabama blocked

- a punt in the first quarter that rolled out of the back of the end zone for a safety, the first blocked punt for a score for UT since last season's Big 12 opener against Texas Tech.
- Robinson added a career-long 65-yard touchdown run early in the third quarter that put Texas up 51-0. On the day, Robinson had five carries for 83 yards (16.6 ypc) and one touchdown.

BURNT ORANGE AUBURN

- Junior K Bert Auburn is currently the fourth-most accurate kicker in Longhorn history, connecting on 81.5% (44-of-54) of his career attempts.
- Auburn currently leads all active players averaging 9.2 points per game for his career and second with an average of 1.76 field goals made per game.
- The Flower Mound, Texas native has made 23-of-28 field goal attempts this season (82.1%) and all 39 of his point after tries.
- His 23 successful field goals are tied for secondmost in a season in program history with Justin Tucker (2010) and one behind Hunter Lawrence (2009) for the program record, while he is also one of two Longhorns to have two seasons of 20plus field goals made.
- He has made each of his last 14 field goals, the third-longest streak in program history.
- Auburn has been successful on 97 consecutive extra point tries, the second-longest streak in program history (Dusty Mangum - 121, 2001-03).

· He was clutch at Iowa State, connecting on all

three of his field goal attempts, including a careerlong 50 yard field goal as time expired in the first half.

- At TCU, he was 3-for-3 on field goal attempts, tying his career long in the game with a 49-yard effort.
- The junior was phenomenal against Kansas State, going 4-for-4 on field goal opportunities, including a pair for over 40 yards, and connecting on all three of his point after tries, scoring a career high 15 points in the 33-30 overtime victory.
- He came up clutch against Oklahoma in the Red River Rivalry, connecting on all three of his field goal tries, including two of at least 45 yards.
- The Flower Mound, Texas native made a 47-yard field goal with 1:17 remaining in the game that gave the Longhorns a 30-27 lead.
- Against Rice, he connected in 3-of-4 field goal tries, including a career-best tying 49-yard attempt to close out the first half, while also succeeding on all four of his extra-point attempts.
- He currently leads the Big 12 in scoring with 60 points and 10.0 points per game, while his 12 made field goals and 17 attempts rank second in the conference.
- His 41 career field goals includes two stretches from of 11 straight that mark the fifth longest in program history.
- In 2022, he earned honorable mention All-Big 12 recognition after connecting on 21-of-26 field goals (80.8%), including 7-of-9 tries from 40 or more yards.
- He ranked second in the Big 12 Conference with 118 points scored and in points per game (9.2).
- His 118 points scored are the eighth most in a season in UT history and second for a Texas kicker.
- The 21 successful field goals tied for fourth-most on UT's all-time list.
- At Texas Tech, he connected on both of his field goal attempts, including a 48-yard attempt as time expired to help send the game to overtime.
- Auburn earned Lou Groza Award Star of the Week honors following an outstanding game against top-ranked Alabama. He was good on 4-of-5 attempts, including a 49-yard try with 1:29 remaining that gave the Longhorns a 19-17 lead.

SALUTING A TEXAS LEGEND

- The University of Texas and The National Football Foundation (NFF) & College Hall of Fame jointly honored 2023 College Football Hall of Fame electee Derrick Johnson with an NFF Hall of Fame On-Campus Salute during the Longhorns' game against Rice.
- The NFF Hall of Fame On-Campus Salute program, which began with the inaugural College Football Hall of Fame Class in 1951, has become a hallowed tradition, and to this day the singular events remain the first of numerous activities in the Hall of Fame experience.
- During the NFF Hall of Fame On-Campus Salutes, each electee returns to his respective school to accept a Hall of Fame plaque that will stay on permanent display at the institution. The events take place on the field during a home game, and many Hall of Famers cite the experience as the

ultimate capstone to their careers, providing them one more chance to take the field and be recognized in front of their home crowd.

- A two-time First Team All-American, consensus in 2003 and unanimous in 2004, Johnson put together a career for the ages, claiming the Butkus Award as the nation's top linebacker and the Bronko Nagurski Trophy as nation's top defender in 2004. He finished 12th in Heisman Trophy voting and as a finalist for the Bednarik, Lombardi and Lott IMPACT awards in 2004. His nine forced fumbles that season place him in a tie for No. 1 in NCAA history for a single season. He was also named the 2004 Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year and 2004 Big 12 Male Athlete of the Year. In 2003, he became the Longhorns' first consensus First Team All-America linebacker since 1983; was one of three finalists for the Butkus Award; and was named the team MVP. In 2001, he was tabbed the Sporting News National Freshman of the Year, a First-Team Freshman All-American and Big 12 Co-Defensive Freshman of the Year.
- Texas posted a 43-8 record during his tenure in Austin, and the Longhorns earned four bowl appearances, including a 47-43 win over Washington in the 2001 Holiday Bowl (with Johnson named the Defensive MVP), a 35-20 victory over LSU in the 2003 Cotton Bowl, and a 38-37 victory in the 2005 Rose Bowl against Michigan with future College Football Hall of Fame teammate Vince Young under center. A three-time First Team All-Big 12 performer, Johnson's efforts helped the Longhorns notch three 11-win seasons, while earning impressive final national rankings each of his four years: No. 5 in 2001, No. 6 in 2002, No. 12 in 2003 and No. 5 in 2004.
- The two-time UT Defensive MVP tallied 458 career tackles, placing him at third in the school record books, while his 280 solo tackles rank him fourth on the UT career list. His 65 tackles for loss land him first in school annals, and he had 10.5 sacks, 30 pass breakups and nine interceptions, with both the breakups and interceptions being the most by a UT linebacker. He added 11 forced fumbles and five fumble recoveries during his time in Austin.
- Drafted in the first round (15th overall) in the 2005 NFL Draft by Kansas City, he played with the Chiefs until 2017, becoming the team's all-time leading tackler (1,262). He was selected to the Pro Bowl four times, and he finished his career in 2018 with the Raiders.
- He founded and currently serves as the director
 of the Defend the Dream Foundation in Austin,
 Texas, which provides low-income and innercity youth the opportunities and resources to
 reach their full potential in school and in life. The
 foundation has helped transform multiple libraries
 and elementary schools into reading areas called
 DJ's Discovery Dens, and he has donated more
 than 25.000 children's books.

REMEMBERING BILL LITTLE

 Legendary University of Texas Athletics Administrator Bill Little passed away peacefully surrounded by family on Friday, Aug. 18 in Austin. He was 81.

- Little was the face and often the voice of Longhorn athletics for more than 50 years. Long before sports reporting turned digital, Little, as sports editor of The Daily Texan, was hammering out copy on a manual Royal typewriter. He continued to masterfully and skillfully share stories of Longhorn Athletics through the many transformations of broadcast radio and television, varying forms of delivering news, and from the 24-hour news cycle to the non-stop news cycle that took over the industry.
- A 1964 UT graduate, Little spent two years writing for The Austin American-Statesman, then moved to Oklahoma City to write for The Associated Press. After two-years with The AP, he returned home to Austin and to The University of Texas for good.
- Inducted into the Longhorn Hall of Honor in 1993, Little served UT in many capacities: first as assistant SID under the legendary Jones Ramsey, then as Sports Information Director, as Special Assistant to the Athletics Director, as Assistant AD for External Communications, then head of communications for Mack Brown.
- Little worked 37 bowl games, was a publicist for three football national championship teams (1969, 1970, 2005), and accompanied an unheard of 25 teams to the College World Series in Omaha. He worked more than 1,700 baseball games, had lengthy radio stints with both men's and women's basketball, and his record-setting streak at one point reached 521 consecutive Longhorn football games. The string was almost broken when, just before the 1995 Sugar Bowl, he suffered a heart attack, but the ever-professional Little convinced doctors that he'd be under more stress in the hospital than he would if he attended the game. The streak remained intact all the way until his retirement in 2014.

THE NATION IS WATCHING

- Texas drew over three million viewers in five of the team's first eight games in 2023.
- The Longhorns week two matchup with No. 3
 Alabama in Tuscaloosa drew 8.8 million viewers
 to ESPN and ESPN2, the most-viewed ESPN
 Saturday game since 2014, peaking at 10.7 million
 viewers. ESPN2's "Field Pass with The Pat McAfee
 Show" had 799,000 viewers.
- Texas-Oklahoma had 8.1 million viewers on ABC
 the second-highest mark ever for the Red River
 Rivalry (2009). Viewership peaked at 11.1 million
 viewers, while "Field Pass with The Pat McAfee
 Show" on ESPN2 had 559,000 viewers.
- Texas' 2022 home game against No. 1 Alabama, the Crimson Tide's first visit to Austin since 1922 and just the third time Texas hosted the topranked team in the nation, drew more than 10.6 million viewers during the second week of the season, the most-watched game of the week with more than the combined total of the second and third-ranked game that week.
- In Week 11, Texas hosted then-No. 4 TCU with 5.03 million viewers tuning in. It was the highest rated Primetime game of the week and the mostwatch Big 12 game of the season. Six of the Longhorns' 13 games of 2022 were among the

Top 10 in viewership for that week with five having more than three million people tuning in.

- During the 2021 season, three of Texas' games were among the top five most viewed broadcasts of the week with each drawing more than three million viewers. In all, six of the Longhorns' games were among the top 10 most viewed that week.
- In 2020, six of the Longhorns' nine regularseason games were among the top five most viewed games of the week, with three broadcasts drawing more than 3.5 million viewers. Eight of the contests landed in the Top-10 most viewed games.

- Five of Texas' games in 2019 garnered huge television audiences. ABC's featured telecast, "Saturday Night Football," broadcast both the LSU and Oklahoma State games and brought in ABC/ESPN's largest viewership for that weekend in each of those games. When totaled with an Oct. 5 matchup at West Virginia, UT's three games on ABC last season recorded a combined 15.7 million viewers.
- Dating back to 2018, the Longhorns have had 26 games pull in audiences of three million-or-more viewers. Including an audience of 13.3 million tuning in to the Allstate Sugar Bowl (ESPN), 10.6 million for Alabama (FOX) and 10.3 million viewers watching the Big 12 Championship game (ABC), those 26 games over the past six seasons have tallied a total of
- 143.7 million viewers. Fourteen of those 25 broadcasts were the network games top-rated game of the weekend. The 2019 Alamo Bowl was the second-highest rated non-New Year's Six bowl game.

COACHING STAFF



STEVE SARKISIAN



HEAD COACH

In his 22nd year of coaching and ninth as a head coach, Steve Sarkisian is in his second year as head coach at The University of Texas.

A former All-American quarterback at BYU whose coaching career includes six years as an offensive coordinator at both the NFL and collegiate levels, Sarkisian was the 2020 Broyles Award winner (best assistant coach in college football) as offensive coordinator at Alabama. The former head coach at USC and Washington, he was named the 31st Head Football Coach at The University of Texas on January 2, 2021.

In 2022, Sarkisian guided Texas to an 8-5 record with all five defeats coming by seven points or fewer, and it is just the second time in the last nine years the Longhorns reached eight wins in the regular season. Meanwhile, this past season's trip to the Valero Alamo Bowl marking the sixth bowl game Sarkisian has led his teams to in nine completed seasons as a head coach. The 2022 Longhorns featured a balanced attack that averaged 34.5 points per game (25th FBS) and allowed just 21.6 points per game (28th FBS). Running back Bijan Robinson won the Doak Walker Award and earned first-team All-America honors after leading the nation in tandem yards during the regular season with 1,894 (1,580 rushing, 314 receiving) and ranking second in total touchdowns (20), while averaging a Big 12-best 131.7 rushing yards and 157.83 all-purpose yards per game. Robinson was also a first-team All-Big 12 selection and was joined in that honor by tight end Ja'Tavion Sanders and linebackers Jaylan Ford and DeMarvion Overshown. A threetime Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week honoree in 2022, Ford was second in the Big 12 in tackles (119; 9.2 tpg). His four interceptions were tied for the UT linebacker record and were the most among FBS linebackers this year. He was also the only Power 5 player with four interceptions and three forced fumbles, and the only FBS player with four interceptions, three forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries. Additionally, wide receiver Xavier Worthy, true freshman offensive lineman Kelvin Banks Jr. and defensive lineman Keondre Coburn earned second-team All-Big 12 accolades, as a total of 20 Longhorns received all-conference recognition. Five Longhorns were selected in the 2023 NFL Draft, highlighted by the first-round selction of Robinson (8th overall) by the Atlanta Falcons. Also selected were Overshown (Dallas Cowboys - 3rd Round), running back Roschon Johnson (Chicago Bears - 4th Round), Coburn (Kansas City Chiefs - 6th Round) and defensive lineman Moro Ojomo (Philadelphia Eagles - 7th Round).

Year one of the Coach Sark era at Texas had its ups and downs as the Longhorns dealt with inconsistency, injuries and adversity in a 5-7 campaign. Texas opened and closed the 2021 season with big victories as the Sarkisian era began with a 38-18 victory over No. 23 Louisiana and ended with a 22-17 win over Kansas State. In between, five of the Horns' seven losses came down to the end with Texas falling by eight points or fewer in each of those. The Longhorns offense averaged nearly 200 yards rushing and 425 total yards while ranking 18th nationally in scoring at 35.2 points per game on the season. Wide receiver Xavier Worthy had a recordsetting season on his way to Freshman All-America and Big 12 Offensive Freshman of the Year honors. Despite missing the final two games with an injury, running back Bijan Robinson compiled 1,127 rushing yards and 11 touchdowns to go with 26 receptions for 295 yards and four more touchdowns. Kicker Cameron Dicker and offensive lineman Derek Kerstetter joined Worthy and Robinson as four Longhorns who earned firstteam All-Big 12 honors. All totaled, 14 Longhorns earned All-Big 12 recognition.

Prior to arriving on the Forty Acres, Sarkisian served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Alabama where he was the architect of 24 straight games in which the Crimson Tide's offense scored 35 or more points, the longest streak in major college football history. Despite coming up just short of that in a 31-14 win over Notre Dame in the College Football Playoff semifinals, the victory propelled Alabama to the National Championship Game where they defeated No. 3 Ohio State, 52-24.

In 2020, Alabama's offense ranked second in the nation in scoring and led all Power 5 schools with 48.5 points per game, which set a school record and included five 50-point games against Southeastern Conference competition. The Crimson Tide became the first team in league history to record five such games in a single season in conference play. The Tide followed that by posting 52 points against Florida in the 2020 SEC Championship to earn the No. 1 seed in the College Football Playoff. They later matched that total in the National Championship Game.

Alabama led the nation in third-down conversion percentage (58.9), team passing efficiency (198.99) and completion percentage (76.2), led by Heisman Trophy finalist and Davey O'Brien Award winner Mac Jones, who posted the top individual ratings in passing efficiency (203.1) and completion percentage (77.4), as well. The receiving end of the nation's No. 3 passing offense (358.2 ypg) featured the Heisman Trophy winner in DeVonta Smith, who led the nation in receiving yards (1,856) and receiving touchdowns (23), and was second in receiving yards per game (142.8 ypg) despite missing the second half of the National Championship Game due to injury. Along with the Heisman Trophy, Smith claimed the Walter Camp Football Foundation Player of the Year Award, the Maxwell Award and the Biletnikoff Award.

The offense also boasted the nation's leader in rushing touchdowns in Doak Walker Award winner RB Najee Harris with 26, while Harris was third in rushing yards (1,466) and 13th in rushing yards per game (112.8 ypg). Harris finished fifth in the voting for the Heisman Trophy to make Alabama the second team ever to place three players in the top five of the same Heisman vote, joining 1946 Army with Glenn Davis, Doc Blanchard and Arnold Tucker

Blocking for that group was an offensive line that won the Joe Moore Award and was anchored by two first-team All-Americans in Outland Trophy winner LT Alex Leatherwood and Rimington Trophy winner C Landon Dickerson. Jones, Smith and Harris have all received first-team All-America honors, as well. As a team, Alabama ranked fourth in the nation in total offense at 541.6 yards per game to break the school record.

The 2019 Alabama offense averaged a school-record 47.2 points per game, which ranked second nationally, while averaging 510.8 yards per game, which was sixth nationally and is currently second on school record. Quarterbacks Tua Tagovailoa and Mac Jones combined to throw for 4,449 yards and 49 touchdowns which equated to a school-record 342.2 passing yards per game that ranked third nationally. Alabama's 199.61 passing efficiency rating was not only a school record, but the second-best mark in NCAA history. Smith ranked fifth nationally with 14 receiving corps also featured Jerry Jeudy, who was 25th (10) and 20th (1,163) in those categories, respectively. Harris was also in the top 25 in rushing touchdowns (21st/13) and rushing yards (1,224). Jeudy and Leatherwood both earned first-team All-America

honors, while Smith and OT Jedrick Willis were tabbed secondteam All-America. Four members of the Crimson Tide offense went on to be drafted in the first 15 picks of the first round, including Tagovailoa (No. 5/Miami), Willis (No. 10/Cleveland Browns), WR Henry Ruggs III (No. 12 Oakland Raiders) and Jeudy (No. 15/Denver Broncos).

The past two seasons marked Sarkisian's second stint at Alabama after serving as an analyst for most of the 2016 season before being promoted to offensive coordinator for the 2017 College Football Playoff National Championship Game.

Prior to his return to Alabama, Sarkisian was the offensive coordinator for the Atlanta Falcons. During his two years coordinating the Falcons' attack, Sarkisian built one of the most dangerous offenses in the NFL. The 2018 unit finished in the top 10 in the NFL in passing yards (fourth – 4,653 yards), total yards (sixth – 6,226 yards) and scoring (10th – 25.9 ppg). Quarterback Matt Ryan was third in the NFL in passing yards (4,924 yards) while tossing 35 touchdowns. Wide receiver Julio Jones caught 113 passes for 1,677 yards and eight touchdowns, and Calvin Ridley added 64 catches for 821 yards and a team-high 10 scores. Jones led the league in receiving yards in 2018, while Ridley paced all rookies in receiving yards and touchdowns.

In 2017, two pieces of the Falcons offense, Jones and center Alex Mack, were selected to the Pro Bowl. Atlanta led the NFL in third-down percentage in Sarkisian's first season, while finishing eighth in the league in passing offense (249.4) and third in yards per play (5.93).

Sarkisian not only boasts play-calling experience at the highest levels of football, but seven years as an FBS head coach. He guided the Southern California program in 2014-15, and the Washington Huskies from 2009-13. He posted a head coaching record of 46-35 over those seven seasons while leading his teams to five bowl appearances.

During his time as head coach at USC, Sarkisian led the Trojans to a 12-6 overall record including a second-place finish in the Pac-12's Southern Division in 2014. His 2014 offense ranked in the top 25 nationally in passing efficiency (fourth – 165.35), passing offense (15th – 296.6 ypg), third down conversions (19th – 46.6 percent) and scoring offense (22nd – 35.8 ppg). The Trojans finished 9-4 overall, including wins in four of their last five games, and capped the year with a Holiday Bowl win over Nebraska.

In 2014, Sarkisian produced a pair of first-team All-Americans in DE Leonard Williams and WR Nelson Agholor, a sophomore All-American first teamer in S/LB Su'a Cravens, a quartet of Freshman All-American first teamers in CB/WR Adoree' Jackson, who was the Pac-12 Freshman Defensive Player of the Year, along with OL Toa Lobendahn, WR JuJu Smith and OG Viane Talamaivao. Quarterback Cody Kessler had the most efficient passing season in USC history (69.7 completion percentage, 39 passing TDs, five interceptions), Agholor had 104 receptions, which was third-best in USC history, and Allen rushed for 1,489 yards, the most by a Trojan since 2005. USC's offense ranked in the national Top 25 in passing efficiency, passing offense, third down conversions and scoring offense, while the defense was in the nation's Top 20 in turnover margin, red zone defense and third down conversion defense. Six Trojans were drafted by the NFL, including a pair of first rounders in Williams and Agholor, along with four players he coached at Washington, including three in the first round in DT Danny Shelton, CB Marcus Peters and LB Shaq Thompson.

At Washington, Sarkisian inherited a program in 2009 that had won just 12 games during the previous five seasons, including a winless season the year prior. Despite that challenge, he guided the Huskies to bowl games in his last four seasons. His eight victories in 2013 were the most at UW since 2000 and the Huskies finished ranked No. 25 in the Associated Press poll. His overall Washington record was 34-29, and his tenure in Seattle resulted in eight wins over Associated Press Top 25 teams (No. 3 USC, No. 19 California in 2009; No. 18 USC, No. 18 Nebraska and No. 24 Oregon State in 2010; No. 7 Oregon State and No. 8 Stanford in 2012: No. 13 Boise State in 2013).

Among the UW players Sarkisian coached were nine additional NFL draftees, including OB Jake Locker, CB Desmond Trufant, LBs Donald Butler and All-American Mason Foster, DE Daniel Te'o-Nesheim and RB Bishop Sankey, plus All-Pac-12 RB Chris Polk.

Sarkisian arrived at Southern Cal as an assistant in 2001 and took over as the quarterbacks coach in 2002, where he tutored quarterback Carson Palmer to the

Heisman Trophy and the No. 1 overall pick in the

2003 NFL Draft. After spending the 2004 season as the quarterbacks coach for the Oakland Raiders, Sarkisian returned to the Trojan staff in February of 2005 as the assistant head coach and quarterbacks coach for four seasons (2005-08). He added the offensive coordinator role to his duties in 2007 and 2008 at USC.

At USC, Sarkisian coached Heisman Trophy-winning quarterbacks in Palmer and Leinart, along with NFL signal-callers Mark Sanchez, John David Booty and Matt Cassel. The Trojans went 23-3 during his tenure as the offensive coordinator.

Prior to his start in coaching as quarterbacks coach at El Camino College in 2000, Sarkisian starred at the quarterback position at the prep, collegiate and pro levels. He spent time with the Saskatchewan Roughriders of the Canadian Football League for three seasons (1997-99) following his collegiate career at BYU.

While with the Cougars from 1995-96, he completed 549-of-824 passes (66.6 percent) for 7,755 yards and 55 touchdowns. His 162.0 career passing efficiency rating was third on the all-time NCAA list when he finished playing. As a senior in 1996, he led the nation in passing efficiency (173.6, the fourth-best mark in NCAA history at the time), leading the Cougars to the WAC championship and a win in the 1997 Cotton Bowl. He was the WAC Offensive Player of the Year in 1996 and earned second team All-America honors.

Sarkisian earned his bachelor's degree in sociology from BYU in 1997 after getting his associate's degree in general studies from El Camino College in 1994.

He is married to the former Loreal Smith, who competed and coached in track and field. He has two daughters, Ashley and Taylor, and a son, Brady.
