## This is Texas Softball



In 27 varsity seasons, Texas has established itself among the elite programs in the nation. UT has made six Women's College World Series (WCWS) appearances, eight NCAA Super Regional trips and 23 NCAA Regional appearances. Texas has advanced to NCAA Regional play 18 consecutive years entering the 2024 season (2005-23 - there was no 2020 event because of the COVID-19 pandemic).



The Longhorns have finished with a record of .500 or better for the last 19 years. The last time UT ended a campaign below .500 was in 2004, when its record was 24-25.



UT made its first WCWS in the program's second year of existence (1998), setting an NCAA record for fastest ascension to the sport's marquee event.



Texas' Big 12 Conference regular season championship in 2010 extended a streak at UT in which every freshman class from 1999-2010 won at least one Big 12 title during its four years on the Forty Acres.



Texas owns four Big 12 Conference regular-season crowns (2002, 2003, 2006 and 2010), second most in the league, and added four postseason Big 12 Championship titles (1999, 2002, 2003 and 2005).



Texas became the first unseeded team to reach the Women's College World Series Championship Series with its magical 2022 runner-up finish.



Texas holds an all-time regular season record of 290-167 (.634) in Big 12 play, the second-highest winning percentage in the history of Big 12 regular-season competition.



UT claims two Olympic gold medalists (Cat Osterman, 2004, 2008 and 2020 USA, and Christa Williams, 1996 and 2000, USA) and a total of 12 national and junior national team members.



The Longhorns have had 10 Easton All-America selections and 25 National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) All-America honorees. Texas is also one of only three programs in the NCAA (along with UCLA & Oklahoma) to capture three-or-more USA Softball National Player of the Year awards.



UT has been continually recognized for its on-field exploits by the Big 12 Conference, earning five Pitcher of the Year accolades and six Freshman of the Year honors. Additionally, Texas has claimed a total of 135 All-Big 12 selections. Amy Hooks (2011) and Taylor Thom (2014) received Texas' two Big 12 Player of the Year honors.



During 27 years of varsity softball, Texas players have not only shined on the field, but in the classroom as well. Longhorns have accumulated a total of six Academic All-America honors, 21 Academic All-District awards and 184 Academic All-Big 12 lauds.



Texas has finished the season ranked in the NFCA Top 25 poll 16 times in program history and has appeared in the poll during the season in 24 of its 27 years as a varsity program.



The Longhorns consistently rank among the nation's best in home attendance average, standing in the top 30 nationally every season it was measured since Red & Charline McCombs Field opened in 1998.



On June 4, 2022, during the WCWS, Texas battled Oklahoma in the first softball game ever broadcast live on ABC.

## CREDENTIALS

Requests for media credentials and parking permits for UT softball games must be made through Chris Allen Brown at [chris.brown@athletics.utexas.edu](mailto:chris.brown@athletics.utexas.edu) at least 24 hours in advance of a home game. Credentials will be left at the Will Call window at the McCombs Field ticket office, located on the corner of E. 20th St. and Comal St.

## PRESS SERVICES

Weekly press releases, including individual and team statistics, as well as information on upcoming games, will be available each week in which the team competes. Members of the media can request to be added to the email list to automatically receive up-to-date information on UT softball. On game days, game flipcards, individual and team stats and any pertinent pregame information will be available in the press box.

## VIDEO/PHOTO DISTRIBUTION

With limited media access, Texas Athletics will distribute photography links for use by media outlets by request. This will include images of both Texas and the visiting team. Video of any Texas postgame press conference may also be provided via a YouTube link. Television stations are asked to use the network's game broadcast to produce highlights.

## INTERVIEWS

All athlete and coach interviews must be coordinated with the media relations department. We ask that all interview requests be made AT LEAST 24 HOURS in advance. No interviews are granted on game days prior to the contest. The media relations office will arrange an interview time that is mutually convenient for both the player and the media representative. Players' home and cell phone numbers will not be given out. Generally, players and coaches are available for interviews after practice and games at McCombs Field (please contact the media relations office for times).

### PRIOR TO TEXAS (NOTRE DAME, 2020-23)

Despite not seeing game action throughout the 2021 softball season, Mitchell, who is a two-time NFCA Mid-Atlantic All-Region selection, concluded a three-year playing career with the Fighting Irish having slashed .344/.420/.595 in 299 official plate appearances throughout 116 career games played. She's totaled 178 total bases on 103 career hits and 41 walks to go along with 27 stolen bases and 73 runs scores. Mitchell has connected for 17 home runs and 22 doubles while driving in 69 runs. Throughout her Notre Dame career, Mitchell, who split time between third base and designated player, has steadily increased her offensive productivity. She boosted a .234 batting average — in 47 plate appearances as a freshman during the 2020-shortened season — to a .340 mark in 103 at bats in 2022. Last season, Mitchell, who was selected to the All-ACC First Team, was credited with 57 hits in 149 official at bats for a .383 batting average. Mitchell ended the 2023 season on a 15-game hitting streak and a 35-game on-base streak while finishing with 14 multiple hit games and 10 multiple runs batted in (RBI) contests. She was also named the ACC Player of the Week for March 14.

### HIGH SCHOOL

Mitchell, who prepped at Rose Bud (Ark.) High School, concluded her prep career with a .622 batting average, 58 home runs, 281 runs scored and 197 RBI. She was named the 2019 Gatorade Player of the Year for the state of Arkansas following a senior season that saw her hit .717 with 85 runs, 55 RBI, 34 stolen bases, 38 extra base hits and 13 home runs.

After building the University of Oregon’s softball program into a consistent national power from 2010-18, Mike White was named Head Softball Coach at The University of Texas on June 25, 2018, by Vice President and Athletics Director Chris Del Conte.

White holds a 640-181-3 overall record (.777) over 14 combined seasons and has led his teams to at least an NCAA Super Regional berth in all 13 possible chances during his career as a head coach (no 2020 NCAA Tournament due to the COVID-19 pandemic).

Through his first four years at Texas, White has put together a 205-71-2 overall record (.741) while guiding the Longhorns on a magical run to a national runner-up finish at the 2022 Women’s College World Series as well as to three additional NCAA Super Regional berths (2019, 2021, 2023). During his stint in charge of the Longhorns program, White has had five NFCA All-Americans, eight Softball America All-Americans, 14 NFCA All-Central Region and 19 All-Big 12 Conference selections.

In 2023, White, again, guided the Texas Longhorns to postseason success as the program made its 23rd appearance in a NCAA Super Regional after winning the minimal three games to win the NCAA Austin Regional en route to finishing the campaign with a 45-15-1 record and a No. 11 final ranking. Behind a stella quintet of freshmen, all of which went on to set a Big 12 Conference record for the most selections (5) to the league’s all-freshman team by a single team, Texas finished second in the Big 12’s regular season standings and postseason tournament, but earned an opportunity to host a NCAA Regional. In the opening game of said regional, Mac Morgan and Estelle Czech combined to throw the first program’s first combined no-hitter in postseason history when the duo blanked Seton Hall during Texas’ eight-run victory over the Pirates. By season’s end, the Longhorns had the eighth-highest batting average (.325) in all of Division I softball, while also being credited with the 14th-most doubles (89) and the 14th-highest scoring offense at 6.07 runs per contest. Morgan, who guided the team’s pitching staff with 18 wins, Mia Scott, who concluded the season with a team-leading 75 hits, and Leighann Goode, who became the first student-athlete in program history to begin her Longhorn career with a hitting streak that reached double digits, all earned NFCA All-Central Region honors.

The 2022 season proved to be a magical ride for Texas as the Longhorns posted a 47-22-1 mark, and won 15 games over ranked teams, on their way to a No. 2 final national ranking & a national runner-up finish while becoming the first unseeded team to reach the Women’s College World Series Championship Series. Overall, the Burnt Orange & White offense was arguably the best in school history, setting new single-season team records for runs (397), hits (560), doubles (116), total bases (906), walks (224) and RBIs (355), while registering top five Texas totals for HR’s (68) and stolen bases (97). The squad’s 116 doubles topped all of NCAA Division I, while the 224 walks were good for seventh in the nation. UT also led the

Big 12 Conference in double plays-per-game (0.43) and stolen bases-per-game (1.39). Seniors Janae Jefferson and Hailey Dolcini earned NFCA, Softball America and DI Softball All-American honors, while Jefferson became the Big 12 Conference’s career hits leader. Standouts Mary Iakopo & Mia Scott joined Jefferson & Dolcini in earning NFCA All-Central Region honors. In all, seven Longhorns reaped All-Big 12 Conference selections (Jefferson, Dolcini, Iakopo, Scott, Katie Cimusz, Sophia Simpson, Alyssa Washington).

The 2021 campaign saw the Burnt Orange & White set numerous program offensive records on the way to a 43-14 overall record, a No. 12 final ranking and a berth in the NCAA Stillwater Super Regional. The program put up school records in team batting average (.342 - third in NCAA Division I), slugging (.561 - seventh NCAA) and on-base percentage (.419 - fourth NCAA) and top five single-season school marks for hits (512 - third NCAA), doubles (79), RBIs (338) and HR’s (78). Junior second baseman Jefferson was named a NFCA (third time) and Softball America Third Team All-American, while seven Longhorns were named to the various NFCA All-Region and All-Big 12 Conference squads.

During the abbreviated 2020 campaign, that was canceled in March because of the COVID-19 pandemic, White led UT to a 24-3 overall record as well as to the program’s first No. 1 national ranking in any regular-season poll since 2006 (Softball America - March 3) and to the first No. 1 final poll finish in school history (Softball America - March 24 - final release). Senior pitcher Miranda Elish was named *Softball America’s* Shortened Season National Player of the Year, Elish and Jefferson were both tabbed as *Softball America* Shortened Season All-Americans and Texas’ offense led all of NCAA Division I in team batting average (.376) and total doubles (62). Texas also ranked in the NCAA Division I national top 10 in doubles-per-game (2nd - 2.30), on-base percentage (3rd - .450), solo shutouts (4th - 10), slugging percentage (5th - .597), won/loss percentage (6th - .889) and scoring (8th - 7.37). During the season, UT rallied for eight come-from-behind wins, went 5-1 against ranked teams (including beating the top two teams in the nation in consecutive games for the first time in school history - No. 1 UCLA & No. 2 Washington) and scored more runs over the first 27 games (199) than any squad in program history.

White wasted no time putting his stamp on the Texas program during his first season at the helm in 2019, leading the Longhorns to a 46-17 record (a 15-win improvement from the 2018 campaign), a No. 10 final ranking in the ESPN.com/USA Softball poll (No. 11 in the USA Today/NFCA ranking) as well as the first NCAA Regional title and NCAA Super Regional appearance for the Burnt Orange & White since 2013. He mentored three *Softball America* All-Americans, pitchers Miranda Elish & Shea O’Leary as well as second baseman Jefferson, a pair of NFCA All-Americans (Elish & Jefferson), three NFCA All-Central Region inclusions (Elish, Jefferson & catcher Mary Iakopo) and five All-Big 12 selections (Elish, Jefferson, Iakopo, O’Leary and outfielder Kaitlyn Washington). From a pitching standpoint, Elish completed the season with 18 wins, led the Big 12 with 11 solo shutouts and finished second in the league with 226 strikeouts. O’Leary was the NCAA Division I statistical champion in ERA at 0.65, was named *Softball America’s* National Freshman Pitcher of the Year and was a top 10 finalist for the NFCA National Freshman of the Year award.

During his nine years at the helm of the UO program, White registered a 435-111-1 (.796) overall record, while guiding Oregon to five Women’s College World Series appearances and nine straight NCAA Super Regional appearances to go along with five Pac-12 Conference titles in a six-year stretch, including four in a row from 2013-16, and to five 50-plus win seasons. He led the Ducks to five of the program’s six overall WCWS berths (2012, 2014, 2015, 2017 and 2018) and to the school’s first ever NFCA No. 1 ranking in 2014 (also reached No. 1 in the polls in 2015 & 2018). Along the way, he

tutored 22 NFCA All-Americans, 56 NFCA All-Region selections, 50 All-Pac-12 honorees, five Pac-12 Pitchers of the Year, two Pac-12 batting champions, three Pac-12 Freshmen of the Year and one Pac-12 Defensive Player of the Year.

During the 2018 campaign, Oregon posted a 53-10 overall record while winning the Pac-12 title, earning the No. 1 national seed for the NCAA Tournament and advancing to the WCWS. The Ducks finished the season third in NCAA Division I in winning percentage (.841), fifth in earned run average (1.38), seventh in team batting average (.322), ninth in home runs-per-game (1.24) and 10th in scoring (6.11).

In all, four players reaped 2018 NFCA All-American accolades as catcher Gwen Svekis, pitcher Megan Kleist, pitcher Elish and third baseman Jenna Lilley all were named to the prestigious squads. Elish (25-2 pitching record) and Kleist (21-7) both posted more than 20 wins and finished the campaign at 12th and 17th in the nation in ERA, respectively. Svekis hit a team-leading 17 home runs and rated in the national top 20 for RBIs (60), while Lilley batted .363 with a squad-best 14 doubles, five homers and 41 RBIs.

In 2017, Oregon reached 50 wins for the fourth time in program history and the third time under White. The Ducks also advanced to the Women's College World Series for the fourth time. Under White's guidance, the Ducks used one of the top pitching staffs in the country to reach the WCWS semifinals. Oregon's 1.41 team ERA was the eighth-best in UO history. Oregon opened the 2017 season with 35 straight wins, matching the NCAA record shared by UCLA.

The Ducks won a fourth straight Pac-12 title in 2016 and White was rewarded with his third Pac-12 coach of the year honor. He guided the Ducks to an 80-15-1 record in Pac-12 play during the four-year winning streak, losing just two league series. Under the former pitcher's guidance, lefty Cheridan Hawkins was named Pac-12 pitcher of the year in 2016, her third straight year taking home the honor. No other pitcher in the long and storied history of the Pac-12 had won the award more than twice. In 2016 the Ducks swept rival Washington for a second straight season and shut out Arizona over a three-game series for the first time in the Wildcats' history. Oregon hit a NCAA-best .353 in 2016 and also led the Pac-12 with a 2.14 team ERA.

White guided Oregon to its third straight Pac-12 title in 2015 and a program-record 21 conference victories. The Ducks remained a perfect 18-0 in regional games and advanced to their sixth straight Super Regional under White. Oregon made its third Women's College World Series appearance in the last four years. The Ducks visited their third WCWS under White in 2015. The Ducks won their third straight Pac-12 title after going 21-3 in league play and 51-8 overall. Oregon closed out old Howe Field with a super regional sweep of NC State before moving on to Oklahoma City for the third time in four seasons.

Oregon had a magical run in 2014, as White guided the Ducks to their most successful season in program history with a 56-9-1 record and 20-3-1 Pac-12 mark. Oregon won a program-record 56 games in 2014 while advancing to the WCWS for the third time in program history. The Ducks were the No. 1 team in the nation for the first time in program history as well and held on to the No. 1 ranking in both the NFCA poll and USA Softball poll for the final seven weeks of the regular season. Oregon ended the year ranked No. 3 in both polls after advancing to the semifinals of the WCWS. White was named Pac-12 Coach of the Year for the second straight season after leading the Ducks to their second consecutive Pac-12 title. Oregon did not lose a Pac-12 series in 2014, with a 1-1-1 draw against then No. 3 Arizona State the closest the Ducks came to defeat. Oregon swept Stanford, Oregon State and California but the biggest in 2014 was the program's first ever sweep of Washington, which ranked No. 5 at the time. The Ducks didn't sweep No. 1 ranked UCLA, but taking 2-of-3 from the Bruins pushed the to No. 1 in the nation for the first time ever. Individually, White saw senior third baseman Courtney Ceo lead the nation in batting average at .493 in 2014 as she also became the all-

time UO career leader in hits (288) and runs scored (193).

In 2013, the Pac-12 Coach of the Year led Oregon to its first-ever Pac-12 title, its second-highest overall win total (50), and its best rankings in both coaches polls (No. 3) in the regular season's final edition. UO advanced to its fourth straight Super Regional appearance (and fourth ever), and were 16-0 at home at Howe Field during the regular season. Overall on the season, Oregon sported a 17-10 mark vs. top-25 foes and a 28-10 ledger vs. NCAA Tournament qualifiers. Team-wise, Oregon led Pac-12 rankings in stolen bases (82), lowest ERA (1.64), lowest opponent batting average (.192), batters struck out (456), fewest hits allowed (283) and fewest walks allowed (96). Three Ducks led Pac-12 individual categories - Janie Takeda (batting, .442; stolen bases, 31; hits, 92), Alexa Peterson (.527) and Cheridan Hawkins (saves, 6; games finished, 19; lowest opposing batting average, .128; games in relief, 20). In national rankings, UO stood top 15 in six categories - win-loss percentage (fourth, .845), ERA (fifth, 1.58), slugging (sixth, .538), batting (ninth, .332), home runs (12th, 1.36 per game) and scoring (13th, 6.31 runs per game). Fueled by one of the nation's most powerful teams, the squad combined for 80 homers - nine better than the previous school record - and also set school season bests for batting (.329), runs (366) and slugging (.526).

In 2012, UO registered its second-ever Women's College World Series trip. Oregon racked up its then-second-most wins ever (45), and ended the season ranked a best-ever fifth nationally in both the NFCA and USA Softball polls. The Ducks ranked top 25 all season long after being tabbed No. 14 in both preseason editions (and part of a streak of 42 straight weeks since 2010). In the postseason, UO opened regional play with a 3-0 mark for the third straight year (and successfully hosted its first ever postseason tilts in Eugene). A week later, the Ducks logged their first-ever NCAA Super Regional victories en route to a 2-1 mark and upset at #6 seed Texas. In its first trip in 24 years to the ASA Hall of Fame Stadium in Oklahoma City, #11 seed Oregon beat #5 seed Tennessee in the WCWS, while its other hard-fought losses came to #1 and #3 seeds California and Arizona State. Afterwards, two Ducks - Samantha Pappas and Alexa Peterson - were honored to the All-WCWS Team for their impressive stats.

In 2011, the Ducks polished off another strong season with its second straight year-ending No. 14 national ranking. Earlier in the campaign, UO made its second straight and all-time Super Regional trip after it scored its then-best Pac-12 Conference finish and record (third-tie, 11-10). UO won nine of its last 12 league tilts and claimed its last four Pac-12 series. The Ducks took three-game sets from No. 12 UCLA and No. 10 Stanford for the first time since 2005 and 2007, claimed its first Civil War sweep of Oregon State since 1994, and took a series from eight-time national champion Arizona for only the third time in the rivalry dating back to 1984.

In 2010, an ESPN national audience watched the upstart Ducks claim their first-ever Super Regional bid to cap an amazing campaign. The Ducks shocked the NCAA Tournament's eighth seed, Georgia Tech, with 11-2 and 4-3 eight-inning regional wins on the Yellow Jackets' own turf to advance to Columbia, Mo., to play seventh-seeded Missouri in Supers.

A well-known quantity throughout the softball world as both a coach and former pitching standout for U.S. National Teams, White followed up a previous two-year stint as an Oregon assistant coach (2003-04) by taking over as the head coach of the Oregon program prior to the 2010 campaign.

A standout during his own fastpitch playing career, White was a top pitcher on U.S. National Teams before retiring in 2007. A native of New Zealand, he became an American citizen in 1994 and helped guide Team USA to a bronze medal at the 2000 World Championships, going 2-0 with a 0.89 ERA and 19 strikeouts. In 1999, he posted a 3-2 mark with a 0.68 ERA and 35 K's in helping the United States to a Pan American Games silver medal. He also helped New Zealand to two gold medals, three silver medals and one bronze in four events. For his

efforts, White was inducted into the International Softball Congress (ISC) Hall of Fame.

The Wellington, New Zealand, native earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in marketing and management from Mount Mercy College (Cedar Rapids, Iowa) in 1989. He is married to the former Lisa Revers, and the couple have three daughters: Nyree, Kenzie and Sidney.



# Associate Head Coach Steve Singleton



**Fifth season at Texas**

**P**romoted to the position of Associate Head Coach in Sept. 2022, Steve Singleton originally joined the Longhorns staff as an assistant coach on July 1, 2019.

A former shortstop and second baseman with the Minnesota Twins organization of Major League Baseball, Singleton possesses 15-plus combined years of college and pro playing and coaching experience.

Singleton was instrumental in the offensive productivity of the Longhorns' five-member freshmen class that ultimately were all named to the All-Big 12 Freshman Team following the conclusion of the 2023 regular season. Redshirt-freshman Ashton Maloney ended the season by leading all qualified Longhorn offensive student-athletes with a .382 batting average (58 hits in 152 official plate appearances), while true freshman Viviana Martinez set a program record for most runs batted in (RBI) by a first-year Longhorn after totaling a team-high 52 in 188 at bats. The fifth-year head coach also worked with freshman Reese Atwood, who led the program with 11 home runs throughout the 2023 season as well as becoming the first student-athlete in program history to be credited with walk-off at bats in three consecutive games.

The 2022 campaign was truly one for the record books as Texas went 47-22-1 overall and won 15 games over ranked teams on its way to a No. 2 final national ranking while also becoming the first unseeded team to reach the Women's College World Series Championship Series. Along the way, the UT offense was arguably the best in school history, setting new single-season team records for runs (397), hits (560), doubles (116), total bases (906), walks (224) and RBIs (355), while registering top five Texas totals for HR's (68) and stolen bases (97). The 116 doubles led all of NCAA Division I, while the 224 walks were good for seventh in the nation. UT also led the Big 12 Conference in double plays-per-game (0.43) and stolen bases-per-game (1.39).

The Longhorns offensive success under Singleton's tutelage continued into the 2021 season as the Burnt Orange & White established numerous program offensive records on the way to a 43-14 overall record, a No. 12 final ranking and a berth in the NCAA Stillwater Super Regional. The squad set school marks for team batting average (.342 - third in NCAA Division I), slugging (.561 - seventh NCAA) and on-base percentage (.419 - fourth NCAA) while putting up top five single-season totals for hits (512 - third NCAA), doubles (79), RBIs (338) and HR's (78).

Singleton wasted no time making his impression felt through his work with the offense as part of the Longhorns' staff during the COVID-19 pandemic-abbreviated 2020 campaign. Texas put up a 24-3 record, tied for the third-best 27-game start in school history, and reached No. 1 in the *Softball America* poll while leading the nation in team batting average (.376) and total doubles (62). UT also ranked in the NCAA Division I national top 10 in doubles-per-game

(2nd - 2.30), on-base percentage (3rd - .450), solo shutouts (4th - 10), slugging percentage (5th - .597), won/loss percentage (6th - .889) and scoring (8th - 7.37). UT rallied for eight come-from-behind wins, went 5-1 against ranked teams (including beating the top two teams in the nation in consecutive games for the first time in school history - No. 1 UCLA & No. 2 Washington) and scored more runs over the first 27 games (199) than any squad in program history.

He spent two seasons (2017, 2018) as the hitting coach of the Fort Myers (Fla.) Miracle (High Single A) and was originally contracted to be the hitting coach for the Pensacola (Fla.) Blue Wahoos (AA) in 2019 before deciding to accept the open assistant coach role with the Longhorns. He served as the U.S. hitting coach for the 2018 MLB All-Star Futures Game and spent time with the Twins during 2019 Spring Training, working with hitters, infielders and outfielders. During his stint as a minor league coach, he helped developed top Twins MiLB prospects Royce Lewis, Alex Kirilloff and Brent Rooker.

Singleton helped guide the Miracle to the 2018 Florida State League title by developing player routines, working to implement data-driven approaches to expedite player development and with players on their process, mental game and mindset. He also prepared daily opposing pitching and hitting scouting reports for both the manager and position players, built player development plans in collaboration with staff and front office, helped in Major League Spring Training with batting practice, cage work and in the dugout, assisted the organization in player movement, evaluation and placement of higher-level prospects and served as interim MiLB manager when required.

Prior to his time with the Miracle, Singleton led all offensive development for the rookie level Gulf Coast League Twins (Fort Myers, Fla.) in 2016. With the squad he served as both a first- and third-base coach, worked with infielders on daily skill development, helped implement and teach the system, plays, ideology and culture of a MLB club to entry level minor league players and helped the front office and minor league staff implement organizational objectives.

At the collegiate level, Singleton was previously an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Florida SouthWestern State College (Fort Myers, Fla.) from Jan.-Dec. 2015. During his brief time with the program, he worked to land a recruiting class that consisted of four eventual MLB draft picks and 10 NCAA Division 1 transfers. Besides recruiting efforts, he was also in charge of hitting development and theory as well as infield/outfield defense. He ran the team's speed and agility programs, handled all budgeting, travel planning and expenses,

assisted with scheduling, supervised weight training sessions and handled camp scheduling and marketing while also coaching first base on game days.

Singleton served as the Vice President of Baseball Operations for Scout Sports (Sealy, Texas) in 2014, where he ran the scout baseball division, a high school recruiting, video and showcase company. He also spent time in 2013 as the hitting and head infield instructor for Baseball Rebellion (Durham., N.C.), providing one-on-one private instruction that included extensive video breakdown while handling sales, marketing and advertising to reach new clientele.

An 11th round draft pick out of the University of San Diego (2006), Singleton played in 654 career games from rookie to AAA level as a shortstop and second baseman in the Twins organization. He registered a .282 career batting average, while earning three Minor League All-Star nods (2008, 2009, 2010), was a 2009 Arizona Fall League participant and received a 2010 invite to MLB Spring Training. He led the Appalachian League in both batting average (.340) and triples (five) during the 2006 campaign and topped the Eastern League, while tying for second in MiLB, in doubles (43) in 2010.

Singleton began his scholastic career at the University of San Diego before leaving school early when drafted by the Twins. He eventually went on to earn both a bachelor's degree in sports management (2014) and a master's degree in athletic administration (2017) from Southern New Hampshire University. He has two sons, Stephen and Mathew.



# Assistant Coach Kristen Zaleski



## Second season at Texas

College \_\_\_\_\_ Texas State, 2004

On July 1, 2022, Texas head coach Mike White announced that former Oklahoma volunteer assistant and Texas A&M-Corpus Christi & Temple College head coach Kristen Zaleski would be heading to the Forty Acres to join his staff as an assistant coach with the Longhorns.

In her first season working with the Longhorn student-athletes, Zaleski worked alongside Steve Singleton to guide the Texas offense to a team batting average of .325 to go alongside 52 home runs, 326 runs batted in and 797 total bases. Under the duo's guidance, five different student-athletes finished the 2023 season with 50-or-more hits, led by sophomore Mia Scott's 75. By season's end, the Longhorns finished the season with a .390 on-base percentage and a .486 slugging percentage. Three student-athletes finished with 100-or-more bases (Leighann Goode, 112; Mia Scott, 100; Viviana Martinez, 100), while Ashton Maloney, Bella Dayton and Alyssa Popelka combined for five outfield assists. Zaleski also helped Scott transition from third base to centerfield during the midst of the 2023 season.

During the 2022 campaign, Zaleski served as the volunteer assistant on head coach Patty Gasso's staff during Oklahoma's record-setting run to the program's sixth national title. Along the way, the Sooners held the No. 1 national ranking wire-to-wire while leading NCAA Division I in numerous team categories including batting average (.371), ERA (1.05), HR's (155), on-base percentage (.474), scoring (9.34), walks (268) and shutouts (33).

Prior to her year at OU, Zaleski spent two seasons as the head coach at Texas A&M-Corpus Christi (2020-21). During her time with the Islanders, her main focus was on a complete rebuild of a program that had gone just 8-43 the year prior to her arrival. In her only full non-COVID season in charge in 2021, Zaleski's squad registered 18 wins, marking the most single-season victories for the program since 2016, while also setting a program record with five consecutive shut-out triumphs.

Before arriving on the Island, Zaleski spent nine seasons (2010-19) as the head coach at Temple College in Temple, Texas. Under her guidance, the Leopards posted a sterling 413-127 overall record (.765) and a 237-47 (.835) North Texas Junior College Athletic Conference (NTJCAC) mark while securing five league titles (2011, 2015, 2016, 2018, 2019) and the 2018 National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) D1 National Championship. A three-time NTJCAC Coach or Co-Coach of the Year, Zaleski's 2018 staff was rewarded for its national title run by being voted as the NFCA NJCAA DI National Coaching Staff of the Year. In all, her teams won four Region V North Championships and made four national tournament appearances (2012, 2015, 2018, 2019). At Temple College, she also spent time as a Sports Information Director, as a Student Success Coach for all athletes, as the Deputy Coordinator for Title IX for Athletics and as an instructor in the Physical Education Department.

Zaleski did double duty while still at Temple College by also serving as an assistant coach with the Dallas Charge of National Pro

Following a two-season stint as the volunteer assistant coach at UConn (2020-21), Taylor spent two seasons (2022-23) as an assistant coach that oversaw the pitching staff of the Lehigh University softball program.

In her first season at Lehigh, Taylor guided a pitching staff that helped Lehigh win its 15th Patriot League tournament championship and first since 2017. Gabriella Nori, who was named the tournament’s most valuable player, allowed just one run over her last 20 innings pitched heading into the NCAA Seattle Regional. In 2023, the Lehigh pitching staff posted a 2.73 earned run average (ERA) as the program won 40 games, including a 7-4 win over then-No. 7/9 Alabama as well as winning 16 of 18 Patriot League contests.

During her time with the UConn student-athletes, Taylor coached an AAC Player, two BIG EAST Pitcher and one BIG EAST Freshman of the Week selections. The pitching staff posted a 2.01 ERA, .208 opponent batting average, six shutouts, a no-hitter and a combined no-hitter during the 2020 campaign. # Red & Charline McCombs Field

One of the top facilities in all of collegiate softball opened on Feb. 7, 1998, when a then-sellout crowd of 1,251 walked through the gates of Red & Charline McCombs Field, the new home of The University of Texas softball program. Like all of UT's construction projects, McCombs Field represents UT's continuing commitment to provide Longhorns student-athletes with the finest facilities in the country.

The \$4.5 million complex originally sported all of the amenities of a first-class stadium, with spacious home and visiting team dugouts and locker rooms, along with coaches suites, team meeting areas and an umpire locker room, as well as a fully-equipped athletic training room in the home locker room. A unique feature of the home and visiting locker rooms was their direct access to the dugouts.

The NCAA regulation-size field sports the finest grass and clay infield, which was laser leveled in the summer of 2004, available.

In the fall of 2005, the facility underwent a face-lift as a new study area was constructed in the Horns' locker room, the athletic training room was equipped with a state-of-the-art whirlpool, equipment storage was added both inside and out and the press box was redesigned to accommodate the growing media attention.

In 2009, McCombs originally installed an LED scoreboard with full video capabilities.

The press box underwent another renovation in the fall of 2012 as a television broadcasting booth was constructed and two radio booths were added.

The field surface was replaced in the summer/fall 2017 and re-leveled to provide better drainage while sections of artificial turf were added down both foul lines. New fencing and padding were added to the outfield and along both bullpen areas to provide a new aesthetic.

Construction on a new Performance Development Center addition down the left field line began in September/October 2019, while a larger improved LED scoreboard was added prior to the start of the 2020 season.

On Friday, Oct. 30, 2020, Texas Athletics officially opened the Performance Development Center. Located down the left-field line, the approximately \$13.5 million dollar, 10,000-plus square foot project featured indoor batting cages and pitching mounds. It provided Longhorn student-athletes with a brand new locker room, players' lounge, team meeting room and nutrition station. The center also incorporated an upgraded training room as well as an office suite and locker rooms for coaches and staff.

When fans and opponents arrive at McCombs Field, they are treated to unobstructed grandstand seating, a concessions area and accessible parking.

The fan-friendly atmosphere at McCombs Field has attracted some of the nation's top crowds since its opening. Year in and year out, McCombs Field welcomes thousands of Longhorns faithful to witness some of the best collegiate softball.

**In fact, Texas has been ranked in the top 32 nationally in total attendance every season that rankings have been produced since opening McCombs Field in 1998.** In 2023, with the help of additional bleachers added beyond the right-field wall, the Horns welcomed a program-record 54,745 fans to McCombs Field for an average of 1,564 per contest.

The field and complex area were named in the spring of 1997 for Texas businessman Red McCombs and his late wife, Charline, generous benefactors to The University of Texas.

# Cat Osterman - National Honors

## NATIONAL COLLEGIATE PLAYER OF THE YEAR: CAT OSTERMAN (2003, 2005, 2006)

During her four years on the Forty Acres, Cat Osterman was named USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year three times and is recognized as one of the top softball pitchers in the world. Osterman was the youngest member of the U.S. Olympic team to bring home a gold medal from Athens in 2004, and the 6-foot-2-inch lefthander set the NCAA career record for strikeouts-per-seven innings (14.34), as well as ranking No. 2 all-time in career strikeouts (2,265) and career shutouts (85). While leading the NCAA as a senior in 2006 with an ERA of 0.42 and 15.4 strikeouts-per-seven-innings pitched, Osterman finished 38-4 with 28 shutouts and five no-hitters and led 55-9 Texas to a Women's College World Series berth for the third time in her Longhorn career. She was inducted into the Texas Sports Hall of Fame in February 2013 and had her No. 8 jersey officially retired at Texas on April 16, 2022.

Osterman broke virtually every University of Texas school pitching record, as well as several Big 12 Conference records. As a freshman, she pitched the first perfect game in UT softball history -- the first of her seven career perfect games and just one of her 20 career no-hitters. As a sophomore, she was named USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year after leading the Longhorns to their second-ever Women's College World Series appearance. In her junior year, she posted a season record of 30-7 with an NCAA Division I-leading 0.36 ERA, pitched 22 shutouts and six no-hitters with three perfect games to again garner Player of the Year laurels and a return trip to the World Series.

Osterman was a four-time National Fastpitch Coaches Association All-American and four-time Big 12 Conference Pitcher of the Year -- becoming the first Big 12 student-athlete across all sports to earn a player of the year honor four times. In addition, the psychology major was a three-time member of the Academic All-Big 12 Team.
