K-STATE RETURNS HOME, HOSTS TEXAS TECH

Following a heartbreaking 17-16 loss at West Virginia last weekend to open Big 12 play, K-State returns home to Bill Snyder Family Stadium as the Wildcats host the Texas Tech Red Raiders in a primetime nationally-televised league matchup. Saturday's game, which kicks off at 6 p.m., will be televised nationally on ESPNU with Clay Matvik and **Dusty Dvoracek** calling the action. The contest can also be heard across the K-State Sports Network with Wyatt **Thompson** (play-by-play), former K-State guarterback Stan Weber (analyst) and Matt Walters (sidelines) on the call, as well as Sirius channel 136, XM channel 199, Live stats are available at k-statesports.com, while Twitter updates via @ kstate_gameday and @KStateFB will all be a part of the coverage.

A LOOK AT K-STATE

- Guided by 2015 College Football Hall of Fame inductee Bill Snyder, who is in the midst of his 25th season at the helm of the Wildcats, K-State is looking to bounce back from a tough 17-16 loss at West Virginia.
- . K-State continues to play tough defense as it currently leads the Big 12 and ranks fourth nationally in total defense and has held its opponents to an average of 12.5 points and 239.8 yards per game. This week, the Cats rank tops in the league in rush defense, pass defense, total defense and scoring defense and will face the league's most potent offense on Saturday.
- Seven players on defense have recorded 10 or more tackles, led by Elijah Lee's 33 stops, while Jordan Willis currently is tied for the league lead in sacks with 4.0.
- K-State has held each of its first four opponents to an average of 85.2 yards a game on the ground.
- K-State held high-powered West Virginia scoreless in the first half of last week's contest, marking the first time since the 2014 Iowa State game that the Wildcats pitched a shutout in a half in a Big 12 road game.
- K-State is a perfect 20-of-20 in red zone scores so far this season, and, dating back to last year, the Wildcats have been perfect on its last 45 red-zone attempts, 32 of which resulted in touchdowns.

A LOOK AT TEXAS TECH

- Texas Tech currently boasts the top offense in the Big 12. leading the league in pass offense, total offense and scoring offense.
- Patrick Mahomes II has thrown for a Big 12-best 442.5 yards per game has totaled 483.8 yards per game.
- Wide Receiver Jonathan Giles has caught a Big 12-best 31 passes for 565 yards and seven touchdowns.
- The Red Raiders have scored 55 or more points in each of their first four games while giving up 37.2 per game.

A LOOK AT THE SERIES

- This weekend's game against the Red Raiders is the 17th all-time meeting, including the 14th in Big 12 play, as Texas Tech holds a 7-9 advantage.
- The Wildcats have won four of the last five meetings but are looking to bounce back from a 59-44 loss in Lubbock last year.
- K-State holds a 4-2 advantage in games played in Manhattan and have won two-straight in Bill Snyder Family Stadium by an average of 50.0-18.5.

CONFERENCE HOME OPENER

- K-State is 12-8 all-time in Big 12 home openers, including an 11-6 mark under head coach Bill Snyder.
- Since Snyder's return to the sidelines in 2009, K-State is 4-3 in Big 12 home openers after dropping last year's conference opener to No. 2 TCU, 52-45.
- The Wildcats also opened up its 2014 home Big 12 schedule against Texas Tech with a 45-13 victory.

TOUGH SLATE

- The 2016 season opener at then-No. 8/7 Stanford represented the beginning of a tough 2016 schedule for the Wildcats.
- Eight opponents on K-State's schedule are either ranked or receiving votes in this week's Associated Press or Coaches polls, including five that are road contests.

SUSTAINABLE SUCCESS

- Kansas State is in rare company in college football as the Wildcats rank in the top 20 in wins among FBS programs over the last 21-plus seasons.
- Since 1995, K-State has picked up 176 victories, which is ranks 19th in the nation.
- The Cats are only three wins away from 16th and six victories away from the top 15.
- Among current Big 12 teams, only Oklahoma (6th; 198), Texas (11th; 193) and TCU (15th; 182) rank

GAME NO. 300

- Saturday's contest against Texas Tech represents the 300th K-State game under the direction of head coach Bill Snyder.
- Snyder will become just the seventh person all-time to coach 300 games on one FBS school. Among the seven to accomplish the feat, six -**Joe Paterno** (Penn State), Bobby Bowden (Florida State), LaVell Edwards (BYU), Chris Ault (Nevada), Tom Osborne (Nebraska) and Snyder – are in the College Football Hall of Fame.

SNYDER IN ELITE COMPANY

- Head coach **Bill Snyder** currently has 195 career victories, 156 more than any other coach in school history.
- Snyder ranks first in the FBS in wins among active coaches at their current schools, second in total victories among active coaches overall and 28th in all-time wins.
- He is five wins away from becoming the 25th coach in FBS history with 200 career wins.
- Snyder, who has 112 conference wins, is one of four coaches with 100 Big 8/12 victories (**Tom Osborne** [153], **Bob Stoops** [112], **Barry Switzer** [100]).

SNYDER: HALL OF FAMER

- The architect of the "greatest turnaround in the history of college football," K-State head coach **Bill Snyder** was inducted into the National Football Foundation's College Football Hall of Fame last December.
- Snyder is just the fourth person in the history of college football to be inducted into the Hall of Fame as an active coach
- Snyder has compiled an amazing 195-103-1 (.656) record in the midst of his 25th season as the helm of the Wildcats. He is 28th all-time in victories among FBS coaches and continues to climb the ladder with each win.

CLEAN IT UP

- K-State led the Big 12 and ranked 16th nationally last year with only 39.3 penalty yards per game, while the Cats were second in the league with 4.38 penalties per game.
- Penalties were more frequent early in the year, but the Wildcats cleaned up down the stretch. In the final eight games of the regular season, K-State had just 32 (4.0 per game) penalties to jump back to No. 1 in the Big 12.
- With 11 underclassmen starters in the first four games of 2016, the Wildcats have been flagged more than usual as they are committing 7.0 penalties per game for an average of just under 50 yards.
- K-State has ranked first or second in the conference in fewest penalty yards per game each of the previous five years. The Wildcats led the league in 2014, 2013 and 2011, while they ranked second in 2012 and 2010.
- The Cats have work to do to get back into the top two in the conference as they currently rank fourth in the Big 12.

RECORD ATTENDANCE

- Attendance at K-State games have been at an all-time high over the last four-plus years as K-State has recorded 29 consecutive sellouts, a number that is expected to reach 33 after the 2016 season.
- For a third-straight year, K-State finished second nationally by filling up its stadium at a 106.20-percent clip, a number that was just 0.52-percent behind Oregon (106.72).
- K-State averaged a school-record 53,100 fans in its 50,000-seat stadium in 2015, a number that has increased each of the last four seasons.
- Twenty-two of the largest 25 crowds in stadium history have come in the last three-plus years, including six of the seven home games in 2015.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Since 1990, K-State holds a 141-34-1 (.804) record when playing at Bill Snyder Family Stadium.
- That record includes a 70-5 (.933) mark in non-conference games and a 71-29-1 (.708) record in league games.
- K-State is looking to bounce back from a 4-3 (.571) home record in 2015, its worst home winning percentage since also going 4-3 in 2008.

YOUTH IS SERVED

- The season-opening depth chart featured 24 combined underclassmen (Fr. or So.; does not count special teams), including 17 on offense. It was the most on the initial depth chart of a year since at least 1988.
- K-State started 11 underclassmen including four freshmen in the opener at No. 8/7 Stanford. It was the most for either category since at least 1997.
- The previous high of underclassmen starting during that stretch was nine in 2005.
- The four freshmen starters at Stanford marked the second-straight year the Wildcats started at least three freshmen in a season opener.
- K-State had no more than two freshmen starters in a season opener in any of the previous 18 years, while the Wildcats had started a combined total of eight freshmen in season openers from 1998-2014.

DRAWING FIRST BLOOD

- Since 1990, K-State is 157-30 (.840) when scoring first.
- K-State, 2-1 this year when scoring first, will be looking to bounce back from a 3-2 record in 2015 when getting on the board first, defeating South Dakota, Louisiana Tech and Kansas, but losing to Oklahoma State and Arkansas.
- In 2014, the Cats held a perfect 7-0 record when scoring the game's first points.

HITTING 60

- For the first time in seven years, Kansas State reached the 60-point mark in its 63-7 victory over FAU.
- The last time the Wildcats had at least 60 points was a 62-14 triumph over Texas A&M in 2009.
- It was the Wildcats' most points since a 69-10 win over Montana State in 2008, and the most by a **Bill Snyder**-led team since a 64-0 shutout at Kansas in 2002.

OFFENSIVE NOTES RED ZONE ALERT

- Kansas State has been one of the best red zone teams over the past few years, including a perfect mark over the final seven games of the 2015 season and again so far in 2016 through three games (20-for-20).
- The Wildcats, one of two Big 12 teams to be perfect in the red zone thus far in 2016, led the league last year and ranked second nationally by converting on 94.5-perecent (52-of-55) on their red-zone attempts, which included 35 touchdowns.
- Over the last 11 games dating back to 2015, K-State is perfect on 45 red zone attempts with 32 touchdowns.
- In their 46 wins over the last six seasons, the Cats are 212-for-232 (.914) in red zone chances with 156 touchdowns, while four of their non-scoring trips have come via kneel downs to close out victories.

- Kansas State has started games on the right side of the scoreboard this season, outscoring opponents 42-3 in the opening 15 minutes.
- That mark improves to 93-17 through the first two quarters and 106-20 after three, but opponents have gotten the best of K-State in the final quarter to the tune of 30-21.

BY LAND

- Kansas State has recorded 11 rushing touchdowns in the last three games — seven against FAU, three against Missouri State and one against West Virginia.
- The last time the Wildcats had 10 rushing scores over a two-game stretch was against Oklahoma State and Texas A&M back in 2011.

RUNNING MATES

- K-State ran for 336 yards against FAU, marking the most yards gained on the ground since the 2012 game against KU.
- It also marked the first time since that game against the Jayhawks with four different players running for 40 or more yards as **Dalvin Warmack** (90), **Alex Barnes** (73), **Charles Jones** (40) and **Jesse Ertz** (40) did so vs. FAU.
- **Alex Delton** added 37 yards as a total of six players recorded rushes of 10 yards or more in the game.

ERTZ GAINING EXPERIENCE

- A year after sustaining an injury on the first offensive play of 2015 and missing the rest of the year, quarterback **Jesse Ertz** has started all four games in 2016.
- In the season opener, Ertz threw for only 58 yards in the first half but was better in the second 30 minutes, accumulating 149 yards and a touchdown.
- The running game was the theme in the home opener against FAU as he rushed nine times for 40 yards, including a 12-yard touchdown rush, the first of his career.
- Although it was only a half, the Missouri State game may have been his most complete game, going 7-of-8 through the air for 94 yards and two touchdowns, good for a 268.7 pass efficiency rate to rank fifth in school history.
- He also set career highs in rushing yards (85) and long rush (40) against the Bears.

YOUNG RBs PROVIDE SPARK

- Sophomore **Dalvin Warmack** and redshirt freshman **Alex Barnes** were dynamic off the bench against FAU, as the top two rushers in the game combined for 163 yards on 16 attempts (10.3 yds/rush).
- Warmack recorded 90 yards against the Owls. His total was helped by a career-long 43-yarder, which was the longest by a Wildcat running back since John Hubert went 63 yards to paydirt at Texas Tech in 2013.
- Barnes had 73 yards against the Owls, including a 22-yard burst on his first-career carry.

DIMEL GETS IT DONE

- Winston Dimel has 12 of K-State's 40 (30.0-percent) rushing scores over the last two years, including six of the 11 rushing scores this year.
- All six of Dimel's rushing touchdowns in 2016 came within a two-game stretch against FAU and Missouri State as he became the first Wildcat with six in two games since Collin Klein vs. West Virginia (4) and Texas Tech (2) in 2012.

• Dimel found paydirt four times against FAU – tying for third in school history and third nationally this year – as he enters this week's contest ranked 19th in the NCAA and third in the Big 12 in rushing touchdowns.

HEATH MAKING HEADWAY

- Receiver Dominique Heath has had a great start to his sophomore season, but he is looking to remain consistent throughout the season.
- Heath leads the team with 149 yards this year, which includes touchdowns against both FAU and Missouri State.
- A product of Huntersville, North Carolina, Heath leads the team with four catches that have gone for third-down conversions.

DEEP, BUT INEXPERIENCED, AT RECEIVER

- K-State has had six different wide receivers tally a catch through four games, but many of those players came in with limited experience as four new receivers — sophomore Byron Pringle, redshirt freshman Isaiah Zuber and true freshmen Isaiah Harris and Corey Sutton — have received their first Division I experience this year.
- Pringle tallied his best game of the year at West Virginia, carding four catches for 61 yards.
- Against FAU, Harris had a team-high six receptions, which was tied for the fifth most by a freshman in school history and the most since **Aaron Lockett** had six against Nebraska in 1998.
- Zuber hauled in a 15-yard touchdown reception at Stanford, becoming the first freshman to catch a touchdown pass in a season opener since **David Allen** at Northern Illinois in 1997.

WORK CONTINUES ON THE LINE

- The Wildcats' 2016 offensive line must grow up in a hurry as the unit has a combined 37 career starts, led by 17 from **Dalton Risner** and eight by **Terrale Johnson**.
- K-State had just 17 combined starts entering this season, which was the fewest for the Wildcats since the 1990 squad also had 17 combined starts entering the year.
- Three players, left tackle Scott Frantz and guards Will Ash and Tyler Mitchell, have earned their first-career starts this year.
- Despite the inexperience, Run Game Coordinator/Offensive Line coach Charlie Dickey does have a good track record when it comes to developing offensive lines quickly.
- The 2012 line had just a collective 26 starts but ended up placing four linemen on the All-Big 12 team, including first-time starters Cornelius Lucas, Tavon Rooks and Cody Whitehair.

JONES' CLIMBING THE CHARTS

- In the midst of his third year serving as the primary running back, **Charles Jones** is using his final season to climb up the school's career rushing yardage list.
- Jones enters this week with 1,395 career yards to rank 18th in school history as he is five yards shy of a tie for 17th and 39 yards away from 16th.
- Jones can easily reach the top 15 by replicating the second half of 2015. Over the final six regular-season games last season, Jones averaged 79.3 yards compared to a 30-yard average in the first half of the year.



DEFENSIVE NOTES UNDER 300

- K-State held its first three opponents to less than 300 total yards for the first time since the 2007 season.
- The last time a **Bill Snyder** team opened the year with such a feat was in 1998 against Indiana State (87), Northern Illinois (170) and Texas (292).
- That season, K-State held its first five opponents to under 300 total yards as the Cats continued the streak against Louisiana-Monroe (273) and Colorado (262).

TURNOVER TURNAROUND

- K-State has seen its defense force nine turnovers through the first four games of the season as the Cats currently lead the Big 12 in turnover margin (+5).
- In 2015, K-State forced just three total turnovers in the first three games, compared to seven so far this season.
- K-State's +5 turnover margin this season is the highest for the Wildcats since finishing the 2014 season +8 in that department.

PICKING THEM APART

- Over the last 36 contests K-State has recorded multiple interceptions in a game, the Wildcats hold a 30-6 record.
- The Wildcats are 10-1 over the last two-plus seasons when recording two or more picks.
- Kansas State has notched at least one interception in 20 of the last 29 games.
- With the interceptions being recorded by Kendall Adams and D.J. Reed against FAU, it also marked the first multi-interception game by defensive backs since the 2014 KU game. Adams and Reed are tied for third in the Big 12 in interceptions.
- Matt Seiwert picked up the lone Wildcat interception against Missouri State and currently is the only defensive lineman in the Big 12 to record a pick this season.
- Elijah Lee's interception at WVU was the fourth of his career, the most by a K-State linebacker since the early 2000s.

BEHIND ENEMY LINES

- The Wildcats have recorded at least 7.0 tackles for loss in four of their last six regular season games, including 8.0 TFLs in the 2016 season opener at Stanford.
- Over half of the TFLs against the Cardinal came from senior safety **Dante Barnett** and junior defensive end **Tanner Wood**. Barnett had 2.5 TFLs, just 0.5 shy of his career high, while Wood had a career-best 2.0 TFLs.
- Jordan Willis leads the team with 5.5 and ranks fifth in the league
- The Cats recorded 4.0 TFLs in the first half of the Missouri State game before it was called due to weather.

SACK MASTERS

- Kansas State had one of its better seasons in terms of sacks in 2015, recording 38 to rank third in the Big 12, tie for ninth in the nation and tie for eighth in school history.
- K-State finished in the top-10 nationally in sacks for the first time since 2006.
- K-State started 2016 with a pair of sacks at Stanford, including a sack-strip by defensive end Jordan Willis and the first sack of safety Dante Barnett's career, and followed up with four against FAU.

SECOND HALF RESURGENCE

- The Wildcats have turned in some terrific performances on defense in the second half of games over the last nine regular-season contests.
- Over the final six games of 2015 (Texas, Baylor, Texas Tech, lowa State, KU and West Virginia) and through the first two games this season, the Cats yielded up an average of 164.1 total yards and 8.1 offensive points in the final 30 minutes.
- At Stanford, the Cats allowed just 70 total yards and one touchdown in the second half. Included in those figures are a 41-yard touchdown by Christian McCaffrey as the Wildcats held last year's Heisman Trophy runner up to just 11 rushing yards and six receiving yards in the second half when taking away his late scamper.
- In last year's win over lowa State, K-State gave up 144 yards and zero points, which helped lead to the largest comeback victory in school history (21 points).
- K-State also allowed just 10 second-half points to Baylor last season, which was averaging 61.1 points per game entering the contest.

LEE LEADS THE CHARGE

- Junior linebacker **Elijah Lee**, a Second Team All-Big 12 pick in 2015 after leading K-State with 80 tackles, has hit the ground running in 2016 with a team-leading 33 tackles, nearly double the among of the player in second place.
- Lee, who ranks fourth in the Big 12 with 8.2 tackles per game, started his year with a career-high tying 12 stops at Stanford before breaking that mark with 14 stops last week at West Virginia.
- For his efforts against the Mountaineers, he was named Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week.

LEE LIKES INTERCEPTIONS

- Another area where **Elijah Lee** has produced is in pass defense as he tallied his fourth-career interception last week at West Virginia.
- Lee, who had three picks as a sophomore in 2015, is one of 19 linebackers in the nation with four or more career interceptions, including the only one from the Big 12.
- The Blue Springs, Missouri, native is the first Wildcat linebacker with four career interceptions since Bryan Hickman (2000-03), and is one of four Wildcat linebackers with at least four picks under head coach Bill Snyder.

BARNETT SERVES AS VETERAN PRESENCE

- A year after seeing his season end with an injury in the first half of the season opener, safety **Dante Barnett** came back with a vengeance in this year's opener at Stanford.
- Barnett, who received a medical hardship for the 2015 season, tallied four tackles, including 2.5 TFLs and his first career sack, which came in his 41st-career game.
- Barnett leads all K-State defenders with 198 career tackles, sitting 52 takedowns shy of becoming the 27th player in school history with 250 career tackles.
- The Tulsa, Oklahoma, ranks fifth among active Big 12 players in career tackles.

Making active rosters for the first time in their respective careers were first-year offensive lineman **B.J. Finney** (Pittsburgh) and rookie offensive lineman **Cody Whitehair** (Chicago), who was drafted in the second round this year. **Glenn Gronkowski** began the season on the active roster with Buffalo, but he is now on New England's practice squad.

Players who are on new teams in 2016 include linebackers **Emmanuel Lamur** (Minnesota) and **Arthur Brown** (Jacksonville).

Wide receiver **Tyler Lockett**, who earned a Pro Bowl nod as a rookie last season, is back for his second year with Seattle, while offensive lineman **Cornelius Lucas** begins his third NFL season with Detroit.

- Willis recorded two sacks against the Mountaineers, giving him 18.5 in his career to tie for eighth in K-State history.
- Willis, who leads all active Big 12 players in career sacks, is now looking to jump up the list as he is 2.0 sacks shy of a tie for fifth place, 3.5 away from fourth and 5.5 shy of third.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES CATS TOPS IN NON-OFFENSIVE TDs

- K-State is the nation's best in non-offensive touchdowns over the last 15-plus seasons as it has 102 since 1999.
- Since 1990, the Wildcats are 57-17 when scoring on special teams and 19-1 when scoring on special teams and defense, including a 17-0 mark under **Bill Snyder**.
- The Cats have had at least five non-offensive touchdowns in four of the last five years and in 15 of the 17 seasons since 1999.
- Morgan Burns had all five of the Wildcats' non-offensive scores in 2015 with four kickoff-return touchdowns, while he also recovered a blocked punt in the end zone for a score in a win at Kansas.
- **Dominique Heath** gave K-State its first non-offensive score of 2016 as he raced 75 yard on a punt return for a touchdown in the third quarter against Florida Atlantic.

- The Wildcats have a combined 41 kickoff- and puntreturn touchdowns since 2005, 13 more than any other FBS school over the last 11-plus seasons. Oklahoma State is second on the list with 28 combined kickoff- and puntreturn touchdowns.
- K-State has been fairly consistent between kickoff and punt returns with 21 and 20 touchdowns, respectively, during the current stretch.

DEFENSE IN THE THIRD PHASE

- On the flip side, K-State has been just as consistent in terms of kickoff and punt coverage.
- The Cats have not allowed a kickoff-return touchdown in the last 41 games as the last time an opponent took a kickoff back for a score was Louisiana on Sept. 7, 2013.
- K-State finished the 2015 season ranked 12th nationally in kickoff return defense, but after Florida Atlantic averaged 23.5 yards on six returns last week, the Wildcats are currently 37th.
- Similarly, the Wildcats haven't allowed a punt-return score since the second game of 2014 Sept. 6 at lowa State which is a span of 28 games.

RETURNERS RANK HIGH

- K-State returners have routinely enjoyed success under head coach Bill Snyder, and it appears that 2016 will be no different as both Dominique Heath and Byron Pringle rank in the top 15 nationally.
- Heath enters play this week ranked sixth in the nation with an 18.5-yard punt return average and is second in punt-return touchdowns. Pringle is 14th with his 30.2-yard kickoff-return average, which features a 58-yard return at West Virginia.
- Both players have earned Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week honors this year Heath after his 75-yard punt return touchdown against FAU and Pringle following a combined 78 return yards in just one half against Missouri State.
- Heath also had a touchdown reception against the Bears, becoming the first Wildcat since Tramaine Thompson against Missouri State in 2012 to have a receiving touchdown and punt-return score in the same game.

KICKERS IN THE RECORD BOOK

- Juniors Matthew McCrane and Nick Walsh have performed to historic marks as both are etching their names into the K-State record book.
- McCrane, a two-time All-Big 12 place kicker, made his first two field goals in at Stanford to extend a streak to a career record 16-straight makes.
- Additionally, he is ranks ninth in school history in career field goals made with 30, while he also connected on a school-record tying nine PATs against Florida Atlantic.
- A 2015 All-Big 12 punter and two-time member of the Ray Guy Award watch list, Walsh has booted to a career 41.6-yard average to rank sixth in K-State history.
- Walsh's career averaged was aided by a 48.7-yard mark in the 2016 season opener at Stanford, which was the second-highest best of his career.

CATS COME UP SHORT IN HIGH-SCORING AFFAIR

LUBBOCK, Texas – Kansas State pulled within one possession late in the fourth quarter, but it was not enough as the Wildcats fell to Texas Tech, 59-44, at Jones AT&T Stadium.

The setback extended the Wildcats' losing streak to six games, the longest since dropping seven straight in 1989.

Down 28-7 after one quarter of action, K-State rallied to within 52-44 with 3:38 remaining in the contest behind quarterback Joe Hubener's three touchdown runs. However, Texas Tech was able to recover the on-side kick before scoring for the final time with 1:02 to play.

Hubener had a productive afternoon, throwing for 289 yards on 19-of-40 passing and two touchdowns to go with his three scores on the ground. Running back Charles Jones fell one yard short of a 100-yard day, rushing for 99 yards, as he became the 27th player in school history with 1,000 career rushing yards.

Receiver Kyle Klein posted the first 100-yard receiving day for the Wildcats, catching a career-high six passes for a career-high 131 yards. Wide out Dominique Heath's 6-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter moved him into fourth place in school history in receptions (22) and yards (267) by a freshman.

On defense, sophomore defensive back **Kaleb Prewett** set a career high in tackles with 12, three more than his previous career high set against Oklahoma State on Oct. 3. Fellow sophomore Will Geary recorded his second-career forced fumble and recovered his first fumble of his career. Elijah Lee recorded 11 tackles, including a sack.

Texas Tech sophomore quarterback **Patrick Mahomes** completed 33-of-42 passes for three touchdowns and added 14 yards on the ground for one touchdown. Senior running back **DeAndre** Washington had a career day, rushing for a career-high 248 yards for a career-high three touchdowns. The 658 yards of total offense tallied by the Red Raiders was the most by a Wildcat opponent since 2011.

Texas Tech opened the scoring less than three minutes into the game, as Mahomes connected with Justin Stockton for a 17-yard touchdown pass.

On the ensuing kickoff, the Wildcats used strong downfield blocking to open up a hole for Morgan Burns, who returned the kick 93 yards for a touchdown to tie the game at 7-7.

But Tech fired back with 21-straight points to take a 28-7 lead after the first quarter, the most points allowed in a quarter by the Wildcat defense since 2008, and K-State played catch up for the rest of the game.

SNYDER

Head Coach 25th Year - William Jewell '63

Precise. Intense. Tireless. Accomplished. Dedicated. Caring. Hall of Famer. Kansas State head coach Bill Snyder is all of these and much more.

To understand the full picture of Snyder, it is necessary to acknowledge his values, sincerity and warmth, along with the concern he shows for the people around him - all qualities that solidify his reputation as an innovator and mentor in college athletics.

The architect of the "greatest turnaround in college football history" returned to the sidelines in 2009 with hopes of revitalizing a program that he once built, piece by piece, into a national force. And, after seven seasons back in charge, he has done just that - and then some.

Over the past seven years under Snyder, K-State has totaled 57 victories - an average of 8.1 wins per year - advanced to six-straight bowl games, won a conference championship in 2012 and finished third or better in the ultra-competitive Big 12 Conference in three of the last five seasons

Turning around a program not only once, but twice, is one of the biggest reasons why Snyder became just the fourth person all-time to be elected to the College Football Hall of Fame as an active coach. The man who said. 'No.' to those who said it couldn't be done in Manhattan. Kansas, was enshrined in the hall in December 2015.

Snyder's squad was put to the ultimate test in 2015 as virtually everyone outside of the new Vanier Family Football Complex had concluded the season to be a failure in the middle of November. The difficulty of withstanding a large personnel turnover from the previous season was compounded by injuries at multiple positions early in the season, namely at quarterback and in the secondary. Following yet another rally that fell short at Texas Tech, the Wildcats were reeling, standing a 3-6 and suffering through a six-game losing streak.

With their backs firmly against the wall, the Wildcats trailed to lowa State, 35-14, at halftime and saw a five-year bowl streak slipping away. However, Snyder's resilient group fought back and scored 10 points over the final 42 seconds of the contest to earn a 38-35 win and kick start a stretch of three-straight wins to end the season and become bowl eligible for a sixth-straight campaign.

Following the win against lowa State, K-State routed its in-state rival, Kansas, for seventh-straight season and made another fourthquarter comeback, this time against West Virginia, for a 24-23 win to earn another bowl berth. The in-season turnaround in 2015 was one of the best in school history, rivaled only by Snyder's 2002 and 2013 squads. With the feat, K-State became just the sixth Power 5 team in the 12-game schedule era (2006) to stave off bowl elimination in at least three-straight games (2-6 or 3-6 record). Additionally, the Wildcats became just the third team since 1980 (joining 2011 Illinois and 2015 Indiana) to have a six-game losing streak yet finish the season with bowl eligibility.

Throughout his entire coaching career, Snyder has emphasized an importance in special teams, and it was the specialty units that spearheaded the in-season turn around in 2015 as kick returner Morgan

Burns was named the Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Year and an All-American by numerous outlets. In all, 10 Wildcats earned All-Big 12 honors, led by first teamers Burns, offensive lineman Cody Whitehair, place kicker Jack Cantele and fullback Winston Dimel.

Act Two of the renowned career started in 2009 when the Wildcats went 6-6 prior to a 7-5 campaign in 2010 and a berth in the inaugural Pinstripe Bowl. K-State's climb back into the nation picture continued in 2011 as the Cats went 10-3, finished No. 8 in the BCS standings and earned their first Cotton Bowl invitation since 2001.

The bar was raised again in 2012 as Snyder led the Cats to their third conference championship in school history. Kansas State, which won its first 10 games of the season and finished the regular season at 11-1 with an 8-1 mark in Big 12 play, tied the school record for overall wins and conference victories while also ascending to No. 1 in the BCS rankings following its 10-0 start. Snyder went on to win the Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year Award as well as top Big 12 coach honors for the second straight season following the Cats' memorable 2012 season that culminated with a berth in the Tostitos Fiesta Bowl.

Named the 32nd head football coach at K-State on Nov. 30, 1988, and again as the 34th on Nov. 24, 2008, Snyder has amassed a 195-103-1 (.656) record during his tenure with the Wildcats, including a 112-78-1 (.593) mark in Big 8/12 games. His 187 victories are more than four times the man in second place on K-State's all-time coaching

Snyder's unprecedented success in 24 years at Kansas State has not gone unnoticed. He has been named the National Coach of the Year on five occasions (1991, 1994, 1998, 2011 and 2012). He has been a finalist for the prestigious Bear Bryant/FWAA National Coach of the Year Award in 1993, 1995, 2011 and 2012 before winning in 1998; a finalist for the Football News National Coach of the Year Award in 1995 and 1998; and a finalist for the AFCA National Coach of the Year Award in 1993 and 1998

In 1993, he joined legendary Nebraska head coach Bob Devaney as the only head coaches in Big Eight history to be named Associated Press Big Eight Coach of the Year three times in a four-year period (1990. 1991 and 1993).

During his three-year hiatus, Snyder remained involved with the university and is currently a member of several halls of fame, while the long-time mentor is also involved in many organizations, and both of those lists are on page 58 of the 2016 K-State Football Media Guide.

Snyder, 74, received his B.A. from William Jewell in 1963. He earned his M.A. from Eastern New Mexico in 1965. As a player, he was a three-year letterwinner as a defensive back at William Jewell. Snyder and his wife. Sharon, have two sons (Sean and Ross) and three daughters (Shannon, Meredith and Whitney). They also have eight grandchildren, Sydney, Katherine, Tate, Matthew, Alexis, Gavin, Kadin and Tylin, and one great-grandson, D.J.



- Eight Wildcats received their first-career starts Friday night... Among the group was running back Charles Jones, who earned his first-career start despite playing in his 27th-career game... - Coming off a season-ending injury in the first game of 2015, senior safety **Dante Barnett** returned with a vengeance, recording four tackles, including 5.5 tackles for loss... It marked the second time in his career he recorded at least 2.0 TFLs.
- Linebacker Charmeachealle Moore recovered a third-quarter fumble and ran 35 yards to set up K-State's second field goal... It was K-State's longest fumble return since Jarell Childs ran 56 yards against Texas Tech on Oct. 27, 2012.

STANFORD PUSHES PAST K-STATE IN OPENER

STANFORD, Calif. – Behind an efficient offense and stingy defense, Stanford protected its home field on Friday night as the Cardinal defeated Kansas State, 26-13, in front of 46,147 fans at Stanford Stadium

The Wildcats (0-1) fell behind early, spotting Stanford the game's first 17 points through the first 23 minutes of action.

K-State's defense went to work in the second half, limiting the Cardinal to just 70 yards of total offense, but the struggles to find the end zone plagued the Wildcats in the end.

Junior **Jesse Ertz**, in his first action since a season-ending knee injury in the first game of 2015, completed 16-of-34 pass attempts for 207 yards and one touchdown. The majority of the ground gains came through senior **Charles Jones**, who rushed for 43 yards on eight carries.

Sophomore **Dominique Heath** led the Wildcats in receiving with four catches for 65 yards, including a 44-yard grab late in the fourth quarter. Redshirt freshman **Isaiah Zuber** hauled in K-State's lone touchdown, a 15-yard pass from Ertz with 2:20 left to play in the game. Senior **Deante Burton** and Jones also added four catches a piece for K-State.

In total, the Wildcats amassed 335 yards of total offense with 243 coming through the air. K-State ran 24 more plays than the Cardinal and out-possessed Stanford by 1:58.

On the defensive side, the Wildcats held Stanford's (1-0) balanced effort to 272 yards of total offense. The front seven and company contained the Cardinal rushing attack to 105 yards on 30 rushes, as Heisman Trophy runner-up **Christian McCaffrey** ran 22 times for 126 yards and two touchdowns. Stanford quarterbacks **Ryan Burns** and **Keller Chryst** combined to complete the team's first 11 passes. The duo finished 15-of-19 for 167 yards and one score through the air.

In the second half, K-State surrendered just 70 yards, with 41 alone coming on McCaffrey's second touchdown late in the fourth quarter. The Stanford offense executed 20 plays compared to the Wildcats' 48 after the break.

Junior linebacker **Elijah Lee** had a game-high 12 tackles, tying his career-high. Senior defensive end **Jordan Willis** finished five tackles, including a sack and a forced fumble. The fumble was recovered by senior linebacker **Charmeachealle Moore**, who returned it 35 yards to put the Wildcats in scoring position.

In his first game since returning from a season-ending injury, senior captain **Dante Barnett** collected four tackles, including one sack and two and a half tackles for loss.

Special teams played a major role, as always, with the Wildcats needing the help of place kicker **Matthew McCrane**. The junior from Brownwood, Texas, booted 2-of-3 through the uprights, connecting from 30 yards twice and missing from 42 yards out. McCrane also displayed his delicate touch with a perfectly execute onside kick late in the game.

RUSHING ATTACK KEYS K-STATE TO 63-7 WIN

MANHATTAN, Kan. – Kansas State dominated defensively and ran with conviction in its return to Bill Snyder Family Stadium, defeating Florida Atlantic, 63-7, in front of 50,871 fans.

The Wildcats (1-1) flexed their muscles early, putting 21 points on the board in the first guarter. Three FAU turnovers turned into 21 points for K-State in the first half as the home team built a 42-0 advantage at the half. A special teams' touchdown propelled the Wildcats after the break as the team eclipsed the 60-point mark for the first time since scoring 62 against Texas

K-State rushed for 336 yards and seven touchdowns on 54 attempts, the first time eclipsing the 300-yard mark since going for 327 yards against Baylor in 2013. K-State added 159 yards through the air, including the game's opening touchdown, to combine for 495 yards of total offense, as the Wildcats won the time of possession battle by just over 10 minutes.

In his second start of the season, junior Jesse Ertz completed 8-of-13 passes for 117 yards and a touchdown. Ertz rushed nine times for 40 yards, including for his first career touchdown from 12-yards out in the second quarter.

The ground game was a group effort for the Wildcats, with seven players carrying the ball on five or more occasions. Sophomore **Dalvin Warmack** led the charge, rushing for 90 yards on eight carries, while redshirt freshman Alex Barnes gained 73 yards on eight carries. K-State's scoring was largely the product of sophomore fullback Winston Dimel, who bouldered into the endzone four times on his five carries.

Defensively, K-State's front seven limited FAU to just 82 yards on 37 rushes and forced two fumbles. The Wildcats' bundled up running backs Greg Howell, who ran for FAU's touchdown in addition to 34 yards, and **Kerrith Whyte**, who led the Owl rushing attack with 54 yards on 10

The Wildcats recorded six tackles for loss and sacked FAU quarterback Jason Driskel four times. The secondary surrendered just 129 passing yards and added two interceptions of their own, as sophomore safety Kendall Adams and freshman cornerback D.J. Reed collected their first career interceptions.

Sophomore cornerback **Duke Shelley** paced K-State players with seven tackles, all of which were solo. Senior linebacker Charmeachealle Moore added a forced fumble and a fumble recovery - his second fumble recovery of the season.

K-State's special teams highlight came through **Dominique Heath**'s 75-vard punt return touchdown in the third quarter, boosting K-State's number of non-offensive touchdown's to 102, the nation's most since 1999.

CATS WIN IN WEATHER-SHORTEDNED GAME

MANHATTAN, Kan. — A delayed start to the game didn't slow the Kansas State offense, as the Wildcats piled on 35 points before the half to dismantle Missouri State, 35-0, at Bill Snyder Family Stadium. The game, which was delayed by 55 minutes at the start, was not resumed after another weather delay during halftime.

Similar to the previous week, K-State took little time to exert its power, scoring 14 points in the first 10 minutes of play. In the two quarters of action, K-State accumulated 270 yards of offense, with 165 coming on the ground through seven different rushers. The Wildcat defense limited Missouri State to just 54 yards and forced two fumbles on 29 snaps from scrimmage.

Junior quarterback Jesse Ertz led the offensive surge again, completing 7-of-8 passes for 94 yards and two touchdowns. Ertz also topped all K-State rushers, carrying the ball three times for 85 yards, including separate runs of 35 and 40-yards.

Alongside Ertz, the Wildcats continued with their running back by committee strategy. Senior **Charles Jones** ran in the game's first touchdown as he gained 23 yards on five carries and also caught a ball for another 16 yards. Sophomore **Winston Dimel**, fresh off his four touchdowns last week, bouldered in for two more scores on his seven rushes for 19 yards, while fellow sophomore **Justin Silmon** ran it three times for 19 yards.

Through the air, nine different Wildcats hauled in 10 completions for 105 yards and two scores. Sophomore **Byron Pringle** caught his first career touchdown pass as a Wildcat, a 19-yarder, and added another grab for 30 receiving yards. Dimel claimed two balls for 19 yards, while senior **Deante Burton** caught one pass for 20 yards. Sophomore **Dominique Heath** pulled down K-State's other touchdown reception from 9-yards out.

On the defensive side of the ball, K-State surrendered only four first downs in holding Missouri State to 54 yards of offense. The Wildcats' front seven suffocated the Bears' rushing attack, allowing just 30 yards on 17 attempts -1.8 yards per carry. The secondary didn't budge much either as Missouri State quarterback Brodie Lambert completed just 3-of-12 passes for 24 yards.

Senior linebacker **Charmeachealle Moore** totaled five tackles, including one for loss, while senior safety **Dante Barnett** recorded four tackles, all of which were solo. The defense also snatched two turnovers — a fumble recovery by senior defensive end **Jordan Willis** and an interception by junior defensive tackle **Matt Seiwert**.

Special team duties were again limited this week, as the special teams highlight came through **Jayd Kirby**, who recorded K-State's first blocked punt of the season midway through the second quarter.

After the 55-minute long delay, kickoff took place at 7:05 p.m. Despite some wait and continued severe weather, the game was not continued out of the halftime break. The game, with stats remaining official, was called at 35-0.

▶ Game Notes

- West Virginia defeated K-State for the first time since the Mountaineers joined the league prior to the 2012 season.
- The Wildcats went 4-for-4 in the red zone but had to settle for three field goals as opposed to only one touchdown... Over the last 11 games dating back to last year, K-State is perfect on its last 45 attempts with 32 touchdowns... The last time K-State has not converted a red-zone trip into points was vs. Oklahoma on Oct. 17, 2015.
- Kansas State shut out West Virginia in the first half... It was the first time the Wildcats pitched a shutout in a half in a Big 12 road game since the second half at lowa State in 2014... It was also the third time this year the Wildcats shut out an opponent in a half (FAU 2nd Half, Missouri State 1st half)... West Virginia scored a touchdown early in the fourth quarter, making it five quarters between touchdowns allowed by the K-State defense.
- Jordan Willis tallied 2.0 sack Saturday afternoon, moving into a tie for eighth place in school history in career sacks with 18.5... He is tied with with Chris Johnson (1997-2000).
- Junior linebacker Elijah Lee recorded his first interception of the season and fourth of his career in the first quarter... Lee's four career interceptions are the most by a K-State linebacker since Bryan Hickman also had four from 2000-03... Lee also added a career-high 14 tackles, bettering his previous high of 12 against Louisiana Tech last year and this year at Stanford.

WVU COMPLETES COMEBACK OVER K-STATE

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. — West Virginia scored the game's final 14 points to stay unbeaten and complete the comeback against Kansas State, 17-16, before 61,701 fans at Milan Puskar Stadium

The loss was K-State's first to West Virginia since the Mountaineers joined the Big 12.

Like the previous two weeks, K-State jumped out to an early advantage, scoring the game's first 13 points. The Wildcats held a slim margin in total offense at the half, 178-174, but were entirely stumped in the second period of play, mustering only 98 yards. West Virginia found its groove after the break, accumulating 248 yards of offense on its way to two fourth-quarter touchdowns, including the game-winner with just over six minutes to play.

K-State's offensive effort was led by junior quarterback **Jesse Ertz**, who ran for the Wildcats' lone touchdown score in the first quarter. Ertz finished with 25 yards on 12 rushing attempts, while completing 10-of-30 passing attempts for 166 yards and one interception.

On the ground, the Wildcats' running back by committee strategy was held to just 120 yards. Senior **Charles Jones** had the most success, carrying it 16 times for 53 yards while sophomore Dalvin Warmack ran for 35 yards on eight carries. K-State managed just 2.9 yards per rush on its 42 attempts.

Leading the K-State receivers was sophomore **Byron Pringle**, who hauled in four passes for 61 yards. Pringle was followed by sophomore **Dominique Heath**, who caught two balls for 35 yards.

The Wildcats finished with 286 yards of total offense with 166 yards coming through the air. K-State ran four fewer plays from the line of scrimmage, but won the time of possession battle by more than seven minutes.

On the defensive side of the ball, the Wildcats forced two turnovers and won out on 10-of-14 third-down situations, but were ultimately hurt through the air as the Mountaineers averaged 12.4 yards per completion.

Junior linebacker **Elijah Lee** paced all defenders with 14 total tackles, a career-high, including 12 solo tackles, one sack and one interception — the fourth of his career. Senior safety **Dante Barnett** was in on eight tackles with his fellow captain **Jordan Willis** getting in on five tackles, including two sacks to move into K-State's career top-10 list.

Special teams duties were ever-so important, as the Wildcats relied on field goal makes. Junior **Matthew McCrane** delivered on 3-of-4 attempts, connecting from 37, 31, and 22 yards. In the return game, Pringle accumulated 101 yards on his three returns, including a long return of 58 yards.

For the second consecutive week, the Wildcats received the opening kickoff. Ertz and company were forced to punt on the game's first drive before the defense worked itself out of a jam on West Virginia's opening possession, as the Mountaineers were unable to connect on a 30-yard field goal.
