### TEXAS TECH TRAVELS TO NEBRASKA FOR FIRST ROAD CONTEST

Texas Tech (4-0, 1-0 Big 12) hits the road for the first time this season when the Red Raiders face the Nebraska Cornhuskers (4-0, 1-0) at 3 p.m. in Lincoln. The two teams are meeting for the second time in as many years, but will take a two-year hiatus beginning next season as part of the league's divisional rotation. The game will be televised nationally on TBS.

### TECH IN THE MIDST OF TRIFECTA AGAINST THE NORTH DIVISION

The Red Raiders' game against the Huskers this weekend is the second of three straight against members of the league's North Division. The Red Raiders knocked off Kansas (30-17) last weekend and face Kansas State next weekend in Lubbock. This year marks the first time since the 2002 season that Tech has faced each of the three North Division members on consecutive weekends. Iowa State, Missouri and Colorado were on Tech's schedule in a three-week span three seasons ago.

### TECH CONTINUES CLIMB

Texas Tech remained at the No. 13 slot in the *USA Today* Coaches poll, while moving up one spot to No. 15 in the Associated Press poll. The No. 13 ranking is the highest for a Tech team since Oct. 15, 1977, when the Red Raiders were ranked 13th in the AP. This is the sixth-straight week the Red Raiders have been in the polls and the longest such run under head coach Mike Leach.

### RED RAIDER FOOTBALL IN 81st SEASON

The 2005 season marks the 81st year of Texas Tech Football on the South Plains. Over that span, the program has 469 wins, 375 losses and 32 ties.

### TECH IN MIDST OF BEST START SINCE 2000

Texas Tech's 4-0 record to open the 2005 season is the best since the team opened the 2000 season 4-0. The school record for consecutive games without a loss to open a season is eight when the Red Raiders were 8-0 during the 1976 season. That team finished 10-2 and is the last team to win 10 games.

### LEACH IN SIXTH SEASON

Aside from Spike Dykes' 13 seasons (1987-99), the last Texas Tech coach to spend more than six seasons in Lubbock was JT King, who was at the helm of the program from 1961-69. Leach has seen continual improvement in each of his first five years, highlighted by last season's 45-31 win over California in the Pacific Life Holiday Bowl. Leach has posted a 43-25 record and 22-19 record in Big 12 play, including last season's 5-3 league record and Big 12 third-place finish, the highest finish for Tech in the league standings. He is the first coach in school history to lead each of his first five teams to bowl games and also to win three-straight post-season games. His Tech teams have combined for over 151 team and individual records. Additionally, the Red Raider offense has led the nation in passing the past three years and total offense the last two.

### MORE ON LEACH

*The Sporting News* acknowledged Mike Leach in its preseason Big 12 issue as the second-best coach in the Big 12 Conference. In a league littered with outstanding coaches, only OU coach Bob Stoops ranked higher than Leach. Texas' Mack Brown, Kansas State's Bill Snyder and Colorado's Gary Barnett ranked third through fifth.

### BIG 12 LEADERS

Texas Tech leads the Big 12 in seven statistical categories and is tied for the lead in three others. Tech tops the charts in scoring offense (57.2), pass offense (449.2), total offense (585.2), turnover margin (+1.25), pass efficiency (170.7), first

## ABOUT THE NEBRASKA CORNHUSKERS

Nebraska is 4-0 on the season, including a 27-20 overtime win against then-No. 23 Iowa State last weekend in Lincoln. The Huskers, who have yet to play a road game this year, knocked off Maine (25-7) in their season opener, followed by wins over Wake Forest (31-3) and Pittsburgh (7-6). The Huskers are averaging 22.5 points per game, while its Blackshirt defense is holding the opposition to just under 10 points per game. The rushing game has provided 112.8 yards per game, while the passing game is putting up 207.5 yards per contest. The defense is holding opponents to 73.8 yards per game, but is yielding 193.8 yards per game through the air. Husker opponents also have managed only three touchdowns this season and Nebraska has scored 10. Entering their game against ISU last weekend, the Husker defense was leading the team in scoring with four touchdowns, while the offense had managed only three. RB Cory Ross leads the team on the ground with 97.0 yards per game and two rushing scores. QB Zac Taylor is posting 207.5 yards per game and has thrown three touchdown passes. His favorite targets have been Ross and Terrence Nunn, who each have 14 receptions, and Frantz Hardy, who leads with 15 catches. Ross leads the group with two touchdown receptions. Defensively, Cory McKeon leads the team with 36 tackles, including 10 tackles for loss and five sacks.

## TECH POSTS BIG WIN OVER NU

Despite trailing 7-1 in the series with Nebraska, Texas Tech made a statement with its first win last season. The Red Raiders took advantage of several Husker miscues in the second half en route to a 70-10 win in Lubbock. The loss marked the worst in Nebraska football history. The two teams first met in the Bluebonnet Bowl in Houston

at the conclusion of the 1976 season, the last year a Red Raider team won more than 10 games. The Huskers won the initial meeting 27-24 and subsequent meetings in 1993 and 1994, before both teams began play in the Big 12 Conference in 1996.

## LAST MEETING

The Red Raiders wowed the hometown crowd with their second 70-point game of the season, defeating the Cornhuskers 70-10, handing NU its worst loss in the school's 114-year history. Running backs Taurean Henderson and Johnnie Mack recorded a double hat trick, accounting for six of 10 Tech touchdowns. Quarterback Sonny Cumbie finished the day with 436 yards and five touchdowns, including a career long 80-yard touchdown pass to receiver Jarrett Hicks.

Nebraska missed a 43-yard field goal attempt in the opening drive of the game, giving the Red Raiders an opportunity to put seven on the board first with a 22-yard Sonny Cumbie pass to Jarrett Hicks with 6:23 on the clock. Rush end Adell Duckett tipped and intercepted a Joe Dailey pass on the next possession, running the ball back 36 yards for his third-career interception. Running back Taurean Henderson added a three-yard touchdown run with 10:35 remaining in the first half to give Tech a 14-0 lead. Nebraska put three on the board with a 46-yard field goal at 4:53. Cumbie connected with Hicks on an 80-yard pass just before the half, stretching the lead to 21-3.

The Huskers scored early in the opening drive of second half on a busted play to put the score at 21-10, but the Red Raiders continued their offensive assault to blow the game wide open. With 4:16 on the clock in the third, Cumbie connected with Mack on a six-yard pass to put Tech up 28-10. The Red Raiders added two more touchdowns in the quarter, a three-yard pass to Bristol Olomua and a 14-yard run by Mack. Henderson and Mack combined for three more trips into the end zone during the fourth quarter.

downs (122) and fourth-down conversions (100.0). The Red Raiders are tied for the lead in PAT kicking (100%) and redzone offense (100%). Individually, QB Cody Hodges leads the league in passing (362.5), pass efficiency (173.9) and total offense (374.8). IR Robert Johnson and WR Jarrett Hicks top the receptions per game chart (6.0), while RB Taurean Henderson leads in scoring (12.0). PK Alex Trlica is the league's second-leading scorer with 10.8 points per game.

**NCAA LEADERS**

Texas Tech also leads the country in passing and scoring. The Red Raiders also rank among the top 10 in total offense, scoring defense and pass efficiency. Hodges leads the country in total offense and passing, while Henderson is the nation's leading scorer.

**REDZONE OFFENSE AMONG NATION'S BEST**

The Texas Tech offense has made 26 trips into the opponent's redzone this season and has come away with scores each time. Tech has 23 touchdowns, including 13 on the ground, and a field goal. The Red Raiders' 26 visits leads 13 teams nationally who have a perfect 100 percent rate in the redzone. Missouri has 21 redzone opportunities, while Illinois and Toledo follow with 18 and 16, respectively. Three teams, including Kansas, are perfect on 14 attempts.

**TECH DEFENSE RISES TO CHALLENGE**

Prior to its game against Kansas, the Texas Tech defense held its first three opponents to seven points per game, but didn't really garner much respect outside of the program. The Red Raiders hushed their critics against the Jayhawks, limiting a team that averaged 33 points per game entering the contest to 17 points on the night. Tech also held KU to 271 yards of total offense and 3.6 yards per play. The Red Raiders forced six Jayhawk fumbles, recovering one for a touchdown, picked two passes and forced eight punts. Tech also shutout KU in the first half, marking the first blanking of a Big 12 opponent in a half since outscoring Kansas 20-0 in the second half of last year's game.

**TRLICA ADDS SCORING PUNCH**

During the first three games of the season, sophomore PK Alex Trlica ran through his usual routine of kicking extra points – several times. The Red Raiders scored 28 touchdowns in the non-conference season and Trlica effortlessly booted extra point after extra point. He took advantage last Saturday when field goal opportunities came his way. Trlica's first field goal against the Jayhawks was a career-long 41-yard kick, giving Tech a 10-0 lead early in the second quarter. He followed with a 39-yard field goal to close the half and send the Red Raiders to the locker room with a 20-0 advantage. On Tech's final score of the game in the fourth quarter, Trlica bested his infant career long kick with a 46-yarder with 4:44 to play. Trlica is second on the team in scoring with 10.8 points per game. Additionally, Tech's last three-field goal game came against Nebraska during the 2001 season.

**RECEIVING RECORD IN REACH FOR HENDERSON**

When Taurean Henderson catches his fourth pass from this point, he will become Tech's all-time receptions leader with 260 in his career. Henderson's nine receptions against Kansas pushed his career total to 256. Wes Welker set the record of 259 from 2000-03. Additionally, Henderson needs seven receptions to set the NCAA record for catches by a running back. Long Beach State's Mark Templeton holds the record of 262, set during the 1984-87 seasons.

**REYES' NUMBERS IN LAST TWO GAMES**

Texas Tech coach Mike Leach likes his odds when it comes to fourth-down situations. He likes his choices, too. Tech is perfect on fourth-down attempts this season, but when not going for it, Leach has junior P Alex Reyes to fall back on. The Ray Guy Award candidate got off to a slow start by his standards, averaging 41.0 yards per punt on three punts in the first two games. In the last two games, Reyes has punted 13 times and is averaging 45.7 yards. On the season, Reyes is averaging 44.8 yards per punt.

**MECKS COMES BACK STRONG**

After missing the first two games of the season, senior SS Vincent Meeks has continued his strong play in the last two. Meeks caught his 10th career interception against Kansas and is tied with Kevin Curtis in seventh place on the Tech career picks list. Meeks, the 2004 Holiday Bowl Defensive MVP, has four tackles in two games.

**HARD TO GET ANYTHING BY THESE GUYS**

Texas Tech's front four on the defensive line gave the Kansas running game fits, as well as the Jayhawk's three quarterbacks used during the game. Tech sacked KU quarterbacks four times during the game and limited the Jayhawk running game to 117 yards. KU quarterbacks Adam Barmann and Brian Luke combined for 42 lost yards on the ground due to the penetration of Tech's d-line in the KU backfield. Tech also forced four fumbles by KU quarterbacks, one resulting in a touchdown.

**SLAY PACKS A PUNCH**

An internal radar for the ball and a knack for applying punishing hits are how senior FS Dwayne Slay has become the team leader in tackles. Slay leads the team with 25 tackles and paced the Red Raiders with nine solo stops against Kansas. Slay's bruising tackles have given him a team lead with three forced fumbles this season. Slay is one of five team captains this season.

**JOHNSON LEADS BALANCED RECEIVING ATTACK**

Six Red Raider receivers already have 10 or more receptions on the season, led by junior IR Robert Johnson's 25 catches. Johnson also leads the team with 104.8 yards per game and has two touchdowns. RB Taurean Henderson is second with 20 receptions and a touchdown, while WR Jarrett Hicks has 18 catches and a team-leading four scoring catches. WR Joel Filani and H Danny Amendola each have 16, while WR Marquis Johnson has 10 receptions.

**WOODS ASSUMES RETURN ROLE**

Redshirt freshman RB Shannon Woods has been a solid backup to Taurean Henderson at running back and is averaging 7.9 yards per carry on 16 rushes this year. But coaches have found another

use for his talents. Woods has positioned himself as the top kickoff return man for the Red Raiders this season, having returned three of the six returns this season. He is averaging 27.3 yards per return.

**DEPTH AT DEFENSIVE END SOLIDIFIED BY DIXON'S PLAY**

True freshman DE McKinner Dixon has been nothing short of outstanding during the infancy of his career. Dixon was inserted into the lineup during the opener against Florida International, missed the Sam Houston State game, started against Indiana State, and came off the bench against Kansas. Regardless of when he lines up, Dixon has done his job when afforded the opportunity. He posted two tackles from his rush end position against the Jayhawks, recording a sack and forcing a fumble. On the season, Dixon has 10 tackles, including four for loss and two sacks. He also has a quarterback hurry and a forced fumble.

**DEPTH IN THE SECONDARY STRONG AS EVER**

When junior CB Antonio Huffman left the Kansas game a little banged up, sophomore CB Chris Parker stepped in and the Red Raider secondary didn't skip a beat. Parker, also a special teams stalwart, had two solo tackles and two pass breakups in his backup role. Additionally, Joe Garcia has done well this season backing up Vincent Meeks at the strong safety position. Garcia, who did start the first two games in Meeks' absence, has 11 tackles and a pass breakup this season.

**WILLIAM TELL WOULD BE PROUD**

QB Cody Hodges' dead aim this season reflects in his completion percentage – 72.2 percent. Hodges has completed 114-of-158 passes on the season, turning in a completion percentage better than his three predecessors. Additionally, Hodges is averaging just over three touchdown passes per game. If his current pace continues throughout the season, he will finish the regular season with 36 touchdown passes.

**QB DEBUTS UNDER LEACH**

Cody Hodges is the fourth different quarterback to open the season as the starter in head coach Mike Leach's six seasons at Texas Tech - and his performance against Florida International mirrored those of his predecessors. Additionally, Hodges' four touchdown passes were the most since Sonny Cumbie completed four in Tech's 70-35 win over TCU last season.

**GIVE AND TAKE**

QB Cody Hodges made it through 84 pass attempts this season before throwing his first interception. No worries, though. Hodges forced a fumble on the same play to get the ball back. Former Tech QB Sonny Cumbie holds the record among Leach starters with 90 pass attempts before throwing his first pick.

**TECH BACKUP ACCURATE AS WELL**

Redshirt freshman backup QB Graham Harrell relieved Hodges early in the fourth and third quarters against Florida International and Sam Houston State, respectively, and played the entire second half against Indiana State. Harrell has hit 75 percent of his receivers this season and has completed 30-of-40 pass attempts. He also has 341 yards and two passing scores. Harrell's pass attempts are the most for a backup in a season since Sonny Cumbie's 56 pass attempts as a backup to B.J. Symons in 2003.

**IT'S CONTAGIOUS**

Sixteen players have caught a pass in the first four games this season, including six who have at least 10 receptions. IR Robert Johnson leads the team with 25 receptions, while RB Taurean Henderson follows with 20.

**HICKS TIES RECORD**

Junior WR Jarrett Hicks turned in one of the best single seasons in Tech history for a receiver a year ago when he hauled in a school record 13 touchdown receptions and 1,177 yards. Currently this season, he has four touchdown receptions on nine catches. Hicks' 22 career touchdown catches ties him atop the Tech charts with Mickey Peters (2000-03).

**HENDERSON BREAKS TECH SCORING RECORDS, APPROACHES OTHERS**

Senior RB Taurean Henderson, a candidate for the 2005 Doak Walker Award, is living proof that Texas Tech has a running game. The versatile back has 55 career touchdowns, including 40 of those on the ground. With his first score against Indiana State, Henderson set a new scoring standard at Tech, breaking the previous touchdowns scored record of 52, held by James Gray (1986-89).

**HENDERSON ACTIVE TOUCHDOWNS LEADER**

Henderson ranks first in the NCAA among all active players with 55 career touchdowns. He leads New Mexico's DonTrell Moore and Memphis' DeAngelo Williams.

**TRUE FRESHMEN SEEING PLAYING TIME**

Four newcomers saw playing time in the first game of the season - the most in one season in the Mike Leach era. DE McKinner Dixon, WR Todd Walker, WR Catron Houston and OG Louis Vasquez each have seen significant playing time this season. Walker has three catches on the season for 26 yards, while Houston is averaging 18.3 yards per catch on three receptions. Dixon's start against Indiana State was the earliest start for a true freshman under Mike Leach. Dixon has 10 tackles, four tackles for loss and two sacks this season.

**TECH DEFENSIVE ENDS CONTINUE TRADITION**

Tech's string of fielding talented defensive ends didn't end last year with the graduation of Adell Duckett (2001-04). First, there was Montae Reagor (95-98), then current Tech sack record holder Aaron Hunt (99-02). The three aforementioned ends all rank one, two and three on the Tech career sacks list. Enter junior end Keyunta Dawson and newcomer McKinner Dixon. Despite spending last season as a backup to Duckett at

rush end, Dawson still led the team in sacks (6.5) and tackles for loss (9). Dawson's sack total also tied for fifth in the Big 12. Dawson has 12.5 career sacks, including his first of the season against Sam Houston. Dixon has 10 tackles on the season, including six in his first-career start against Indiana State.

**FRESHMEN CONTRIBUTION**

Texas Tech's freshman class (true and redshirt) have done their part in practice to get involved statistically on game day. Six players have caught a pass or rushed the ball, while one has seen ample time passing the ball. QB Graham Harrell has seen significant action in each game this season, completing 30-of-40 passes for 341 yards and two touchdowns. Six receivers, led by IR L.A. Reed, have made contributions to the offensive effort this year. Reed leads the group with eight receptions for 118 yards. RB Shannon Woods is the team's second-leading rusher with 127 yards on 16 carries and three touchdowns. He also has a score through the air. Defensively, eight freshmen have taken the field this year, led by DE McKinner Dixon. The true freshman is the only freshman with a start on the defensive side of the ball. LB Calen Shearer has nine tackles.

**TECH TIES FIRST-HALF SCORING RECORD**

Texas Tech's 49 first-half points against Indiana State tied the school record for points in a half that was previously done against Baylor in 2001 and against Sam Houston State on Sept. 17. The Red Raiders' 28 first-quarter points against Sam Houston State also set a new standard, breaking the old mark of 21 set against Baylor in 2001 and 2003.

**SCORING STREAK**

Texas Tech is in the middle of a 96-game scoring streak, the second-longest in school history, and fourth among Big 12 schools. The run began with a 16-13 win over Texas A&M on Oct. 25, 1997, a week after dropping a 29-0 decision to second-ranked Nebraska. During its current run, the Red Raiders have scored 10+ in all but four games.

**SUCCESS IN NON-CONFERENCE GAMES**

In six seasons under head coach Mike Leach, the Red Raiders are 21-6 in non-conference games, including postseason bowl games. Tech finished this season's non-conference slate with a 3-0 mark. Texas Tech also is 15-1 when scoring 30 or more points against non-conference opponents in the Mike Leach era. Tech's lone loss was a 51-48 overtime loss against N.C. State in Lubbock during the 2002 season.

**CAPTAINS**

In a vote by their teammates, five Red Raiders were named captains for the 2005 season. QB Cody Hodges, OT E.J. Whitley, DE Keyunta Dawson, CB Khalid Naziruddin and FS Dwayne Slay were chosen by their teammates.

**GRAD RATES AMONG NATION'S BEST**

Texas Tech's football program boasted a 79 percent graduation rate for the 1999-00 freshman class, which was recognized by the American Football Coaches Association in the spring. For the fifth-straight year, Texas Tech's graduation rate was higher than 70 percent. Tech was one of 30 schools recognized by the AFCA.

**RED RAIDERS WINNING WAYS AMONG NATION'S BEST**

Texas Tech is one of nine schools nationally that currently has 10 or more consecutive seasons with a winning record. The Red Raiders are tied with Miami (Ohio) with 10, while Florida State tops the list with 28-straight winning campaigns. cont'd...

**TECH HAS TIES IN NEW HARRIS POLL**

Former Texas Tech All-American E.J. Holub and former Red Raider head coach Spike Dykes are among 114 panelists that will have a vote in the new Harris Interactive College Football Poll this season. The poll is one of three components in the Bowl Championship Series Standings Formula used to determine the two teams that play in the BCS National Championship game and those that qualify for at-large selections.

**ALONE AT THE TOP**

Texas Tech is the only program of the 12 member institutions to boast an overall winning record each season since 1996. Others have finished at .500, but none have posted winning marks each of the last nine seasons. Additionally, Tech is the only program to be bowl eligible each season of the league's existence.

**HISTORIC JONES SBC STADIUM**

The 2005 season marks the 58th season of Texas Tech football in Jones SBC Stadium. The stadium was opened during the 1947 season and named for then-Tech president Clifford Jones and his wife, Audrey. The name was altered prior to the 2000 season with the addition of "SBC" to the title, due in part to the \$20 million donation given to the school for renovations from Southwestern Bell Communications.

**BOWLED OVER**

Texas Tech made its 28th bowl appearance last season and its first to the Pacific Life Holiday Bowl. Leach is the only coach in school history to guide each of his teams to bowl appearances. Under Leach, the Red Raiders are 3-2 in bowl appearances, including last season's 45-31 win over California. Tech advanced to the 2000 Galleryfurniture.com Bowl and fell to East Carolina (40-27) and appeared in the 2001 Alamo Bowl, losing 19-16 to Iowa. The Red Raiders defeated Navy (38-14) in the Houston Bowl in 2003, giving the program its first back-to-back bowl wins in consecutive years in school history. Tech routed Clemson (55-15) in 2002 at the Tangerine Bowl in Orlando.

**RAIDERS POST TOP OVERALL LEAGUE FINISH**

Texas Tech's 5-3 record in 2004 tied the Red Raiders with Texas A&M in third place in the overall conference standings, marking the highest finish for a Tech team since the inception of the league in 1996. Oklahoma finished the conference season undefeated at 8-0 followed by Texas at 7-1.

**CRAZY EIGHTS**

With an 8-4 record last season, the Red Raiders won at least eight games in three-consecutive seasons for the first time in school history. The Red Raiders finished the 2002 season 9-5 and had an 8-5 mark in 2003.

**OPPONENTS IN BOWLS**

Four of Tech's 11 opponents this season participated in bowls a year ago. Texas defeated Michigan in the Rose Bowl, while Texas A&M (Cotton), Oklahoma State (Alamo) and Oklahoma (Orange) each dropped their respective bowl games. Sam Houston State advanced to the semifinals of the Division I-AA playoffs.

**PACKING THEM IN**

Texas Tech finished the 2004 season ranked sixth among Big 12 schools in average attendance and fourth in capacity percentage. Over the course of Tech's five home games last season, Jones SBC Stadium was filled at a 99.9% capacity (22nd nationally). In the Big 12, only Nebraska, Oklahoma and Texas filled their stadiums to a greater capacity percentage throughout the season. The attendance of 51,717 against Oklahoma State in the season finale gave Tech a season average and new school record of 52,823. The season average surpassed the 2003 record of 49,608 and marked the third year under Mike Leach that Tech set a season attendance record.

**TECH DOMINANT WITH HALFTIME LEAD**

Texas Tech has had a tremendous amount of success when entering the locker room with a halftime lead. Tech is 33-1 when leading at the half under head coach Mike Leach. The only blemish came at Texas A&M last season after the Aggies overcame a 7-6 deficit to Tech at the break to win in overtime.

**TEXAS TECH SCORING UNDER LEACH**

Texas Tech has scored 30 or more points in 41 games during the Leach era and has won 34 of those games. Additionally, the Red Raiders are 15-3 under Leach when scoring 40+ and 13-0 when scoring over 50. On the flip side, Tech is 8-18 when scoring 29 points or less.

**DEGREES IN HAND**

Four current Red Raiders have already completed their degrees and are working in postgraduate areas. Senior quarterback Cody Hodges and offensive lineman Bryan Kegans are both working on post-baccalaureate teaching certifications. Senior defensive back SirDon Lewis is pursuing a second degree in psychology and Spanish, while place kicker Keith Toogood began graduate work this fall.

**THE SPORTING NEWS RECOGNIZES TECH PLAYERS**

In addition to Hicks and Henderson being listed among the country's best at their positions by *The Sporting News*, the publication also recognized junior OG Manny Ramirez as the No. 15 offensive guard; junior Antonio Huffman as the No. 17 cornerback; senior Vincent Meeks as the No. 9 strong safety; and sophomore Danny Amendola as the No. 12 return man in the country. Tech's wide receiver corps also was selected as the best in the Big 12 Conference.

**TEXAS TECH BRINGS RADIO RIGHTS IN-HOUSE**

The Texas Tech Sports Network, in its first season, will carry the live broadcast of every football game throughout the state of Texas on its 30-station network, including flagship station KKAM 1340. Play-by-play man Brian Jensen calls the action with longtime Lubbock broadcasting fixture John Harris as the color analyst. Mark Finkner provides the sideline coverage, while Tim Chambers serves as statistician. Former Tech quarterback Sonny Cumbie provides analysis from the sideline. Engineer Steve Pitts is in his 16th season, the first time in school history. The Red Raiders finished the 2002 season 9-5 and had an 8-5 mark in 2003.

## TEXAS TECH HEAD COACH MIKE LEACH

Texas Tech's Mike Leach is in his sixth season on the South Plains as head coach of the Red Raider football program. His overall record at Tech is 43-25.

During his tenure at Tech, he has transformed the face of Red Raider football. His Tech teams have three-straight NCAA passing titles and two-consecutive NCAA total offense titles. Two of his three starting quarterbacks at Tech, Kliff Kingsbury and B.J. Symons, both were taken in the 2003 and 2004 NFL Drafts, respectively.

Leach came to Tech in 2000 after installing an Oklahoma offense in 1999 that went on to win the National Championship the following season. He was instrumental in the recruitment and development of OU All-American Josh Heupel and assisted in the recruitment of Heisman winner Jason White.

Leach got his coaching start under current Tech defensive coordinator Lyle Setencich in 1987 at Cal Poly SLO, when Setencich was the head coach there. Following a year coaching the offensive line at Cal Poly, Leach coached the linebackers for a season at the College of the Desert. His first head coach stint came during the 1989 off-season in Pori, Finland, in the European Football League.

Additionally, Leach has coaching stops at Iowa Wesleyan (1989-91), Valdosta State (1992-96) and Kentucky (1997-98). While at UK, Leach coached NFL Draft pick Tim Couch.

## GAME RECAPS

## TEXAS TECH 56, FLORIDA INTERNATIONAL 3

**LUBBOCK, Texas (AP)** - Cody Hodges threw for 454 yards and four touchdowns and ran for another to lead No. 21 Texas Tech past Florida International 56-3 Saturday night.

Hodges showed a running dimension Tech's two previous quarterbacks - both of whom led the nation in passing - did not. He looked at ease in rushing seven times for 44 yards, including a 17-yard scamper for a score in the second quarter to put Tech up 21-0.

He was no slouch in the air, either. Hodges, the third straight fifth-year senior to start for Tech (1-0), found his rhythm early and connected on TD passes of 47, 39, 38 and 7 yards. He completed 29 of 37 passes.

Hodges' favorite receiver was Robert Johnson, a junior college transfer who came to Tech last year to be a quarterback. In his first start at receiver, Johnson caught nine passes for 129 yards and a touchdown. He caught a 47-yarder from Hodges that made in 28-3 late in the first half.

The Golden Panthers (0-2) hurt themselves with back-to-back fumbles in the first half, both of which led to Tech scores. The second fumble came on the Tech 3-yard line after Florida International had driven from their own 35.

Tech safety Dwayne Slay stripped the ball from running back Julian Reams' hands and Chris Hudler recovered it for Tech. The Red Raiders needed just 2:55 to go 97 yards and capitalize on the turnover. Hodges threw passes of 11, 11, 8, 14 and 15 yards before he raced in from the 17 for the score.

On their ensuing possession, the Golden Panthers' 14-play drive stalled at the 13 and they had to settle for a field goal to trail 21-3 at halftime.

Florida International got inside Tech's 20 only three times in the first half and twice in the second.

Tech running back Taurean Henderson, who scored a touchdown on a 20-yard run in the first and caught a 38-yarder from Hodges in the third, moved three catches closer to becoming the NCAA leader in receptions for a running back. He now needs 24 to break Mark Templeton's 262 receptions at Long Beach State.

The Florida school, in its fourth year of football and its first as a Division I-A member, played in front of its largest crowd ever when 50,156 showed up to watch Saturday night's game.

Hodges threw for more yards and touchdowns in his first outing than did Tech quarterback B.J. Symons two years ago. Symons threw for 297 yards, three touchdowns and one interception in his first start two seasons ago.

He went on to set a NCAA single-season record of 5,833 yards passing.

Sonny Cumbie, who led Tech last year, threw for 470 yards and four touchdowns in his first start.

## TEXAS TECH 80, SAM HOUSTON STATE 21

**LUBBOCK, Texas (AP)** - Cody Hodges sees no reason Texas Tech can't score even more points than the 80 points the Red Raiders put up Saturday night.

Hodges threw for 356 yards and four touchdowns in the first half and Texas Tech embarrassed Division I-AA Sam Houston State 80-21, the Red Raiders' highest scoring game in 52 years.

The fifth-year senior who led the nation in total offense coming into the game, added 80 yards passing and another TD throw in the third quarter to put Tech up 56-7 before backup quarterback Graham Harrell took over.

Hodges finished 26-of-37 for 436 yards.

Tech's point total was the largest since October 1953, when they put up 71 points against New Mexico A&M, now New Mexico State. In 1925, Tech scored 120 against Wayland Baptist.

Tech's 770 yards was second best in school history to the 775 yards the Red Raiders got against Iowa State in 2003.

The Bearkats were outplayed from the outset. They punted on their first four possessions, all from inside their own 25, and didn't cross midfield until 11:53 in the second quarter.

Getting into Tech (2-0) territory was a gift, though. Tech was hit with a personal foul on a kickoff after going ahead 35-0 on an 11-yard TD pass from Hodges to Joel Filani early in the second quarter.

The Bearkats needed just five plays to capitalize on their good fortune, cutting the margin to 35-7 on a 19-yard run by Stevie Smith. They didn't score again until early in the fourth quarter when Jason Godfrey ran 1 yard to make it 66-14.

The first half numbers told the story succinctly: Sam Houston State had 72 yards of total offense and was penalized 90 yards. They finished with 253 total yards.

For a second straight game, Hodges favorite target was Robert Johnson, the quarterback-turned-receiver who had a breakout game last week with nine catches for 129 yards and a touchdown.

Against the Bearkats, Johnson caught eight passes for 209 yards, becoming only the seventh Tech player in history to have more than 200 receiving yards in a game. The last time was when Jarrett Hicks got 211 in a 70-35 win over TCU in 2004.

Johnson's longest catch was a 67-yarder from Hodges.

Tech scored on 12 of 15 possessions, missing on a field goal in the third quarter and having to punt once in the second quarter. Time ran out while Tech had the ball.

Harrell completed 14 of 17 passes for one touchdown and 208 yards, the longest a 44-yarder to Catron Houston that set up a 1-yard score by Taurance Rawls to give Tech a 66-7 lead late in the third quarter.

## TEXAS TECH 63, INDIANA STATE 7

**LUBBOCK, Texas (AP)** - Texas Tech's backups had another chance to shine during a third straight early season runaway.

This time, coach Mike Leach said they didn't make the most of it.

Taurean Henderson ran for 141 yards and three touchdowns, and No. 19 Texas Tech beat Division I-AA Indiana State 63-7 on Saturday night. But the Red Raiders scored only once after taking a 56-0 lead on their first possession of the third quarter, leaving Leach worried about his team's effort.

Texas Tech (3-0) was coming off an 80-21 win over Sam Houston State, another I-AA school. After that game, quarterback Cody Hodges said he believed his offense could score 100 points. He later clarified his comments, saying the Red Raiders expect to score every time they have the ball, but weren't focusing on reaching triple digits.

Henderson and Hodges came out after the first half, and Indiana State (0-4) easily avoided the record book.

Leach said the Red Raiders' lopsided wins - they also beat Florida International 56-3 in their opener - have enabled younger players to gain experience. But he was disappointed after Texas Tech had trouble scoring in the second half Saturday.

Henderson, the NCAA's active leader in touchdowns, scored on carries of 3, 44 and 6 yards to give Texas Tech a 21-0 lead. His first scoring run made him the Red Raiders' career leader in touchdowns and points. Henderson finished the game with 55 touchdowns for 330 points - James Gray had 52 touchdowns and 312 points from 1986-89.

Henderson has scored in 10 straight games.

Hodges went 25-of-32 for 227 yards and three touchdowns. His 10-yard pass to Jarrett Hicks made it 28-0 in the second quarter, and Texas Tech blew the game open later in the period with two touchdowns in 9 seconds.

Hodges threw a 7-yard scoring pass to Joel Filani with 3:37 left in the half. After Martuan Sample fumbled the ensuing kickoff, Hodges found Filani again for an 11-yard touchdown.

On Indiana State's next possession, Brandon Douglas blocked a punt, picked up the loose ball and ran 2 yards to the end zone to make it 49-0.

Hodges, who entered as the nation's leader with 445 yards passing per game, threw his first interception of the season in the opening quarter. But when Rocky Alo tried to return it, he was hit by Hodges and fumbled. Texas Tech recovered.

Texas Tech entered ranked No. 1 in the nation in scoring offense, total offense and passing offense, but Indiana State forced the Red Raiders to punt after only three plays on their first possession.

## GAME RECAPS

### TEXAS TECH 30, KANSAS 17

**LUBBOCK, Texas (AP)** - Cody Hodges threw for 333 yards and a touchdown and ran for another score to lead No. 16 Texas Tech past Kansas 30-17 in each team's Big 12 opener Saturday night.

In the Red Raiders' first game against decent competition, Hodges had a few rough spots. He threw an interception and fumbled four times, losing two that the Jayhawks (3-1, 0-1) converted into points.

Hodges, though, didn't get much support from his offensive line as he has earlier this season. In Tech's first three games, the line allowed the first-team offense to scored pretty much at will. The Red Raiders (4-0, 1-0) led the nation in scoring coming into the Kansas game, having tallied 56, 80 and 63 points against two Division I-AA opponents and a Sun Belt Conference team.

Kansas defenders put pressure on Hodges throughout the game, forcing him to hurry numerous passes and sacking him four times.

He completed 34 of 52 passes and his yardage was a season low for when he's played in all four quarters. Jarrett Hicks caught nine passes for 112 yards - one of them a 4-yard TD pass.

But the Jayhawks' offense couldn't match the defense's effort, at least not in the first half.

In the second half, the Jayhawks came to life. Down 20-0, Kansas finally got on the scoreboard after a turnover by Tech. Hodges faked a pass and the ball slipped from his hands at his own 23. Jayhawks end Charlton Keith picked up the ball and returned it to the Tech 11.

The Jayhawks scored on their first play when John Cornish ran for a touchdown to whittle the margin to 20-7 early in the third quarter.

But Tech drove 56 yards in six plays on the ensuing possession and made it 27-7 when Hodges ran around end for 5 yards and a touchdown.

The Jayhawks found its rhythm three possessions later, driving 73 yards to pull within 27-14. The drive included four catches for 43 yards by Mark Simmons, who caught the last one for 17 yards and a touchdown to close within 27-14.

On Tech's ensuing possession, Hodges fumbled again and gave Kansas the ball at the Tech's 38. Five plays later, Scott Webb's field goal made it 27-17 Tech.

A career-best 46-yard field goal by Tech's Alex Trlica put the game out of reach at 30-17 with 4:44 remaining in the game.
