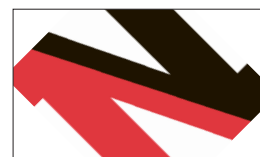

QUICK KICKS

- The No. 16 Texas Tech soccer team continues their seven-match homestand with a pair of matches at the John Walker Soccer Complex this weekend, taking on Arizona on Friday, Aug. 26, and Northeastern on Sunday, Aug. 28, both at 7 p.m.
- Tech will also square off with No. 21 California, Abilene Christian and Oral Roberts over the rest of the four week stretch in Lubbock.
- The Red Raiders climbed three spots to No. 16 in the latest National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) poll. It's the 16th consecutive week Tech has been inside the top 25 of the rankings.
- The all-time series with Arizona dates back to 1994 and is a series where the Wildcats hold a slight 1-2-2 advantage. The last two meetings between the two programs have ended in a 1-1 tie (2015) and a 2-0 Red Raider victory (2013). Sunday will mark the first overall contest between Texas Tech and Northeastern.
- The Red Raiders return 17 letterwinners from last year's squad, including seven starters.
- Two freshmen have done all of the scoring for the Red Raiders so far in 2016. Midfielder Jordie Harr has two goals, while forward Jade King has notched one.
- Harr's performance earned her Big 12 Freshman of the Week on Aug. 23, the first for Tech since Oct. 21, 2014.

JADE KING

Freshman Jade King notched her first collegiate goal last Sunday, scoring the game-winner against Missouri State. After two matches, she's logged 14 shots, including six on goal, but also the conference.

Freshman Jordie Harr had a spectacular college debut against New Mexico last Friday, netting both of Tech's goals in the 2-1 victory over the Lobos. Her performance earned the school's first Big 12 Freshman of the Week award since October 2014.

Sophomore Gwennie Puente played a key role in Tech's spotless opening weekend of competition. Puente assisted on freshman Jade King's goal on Sunday, helping the Red Raiders to a 1-0 win over the Bears. She also added a shot on goal against the Lobos in the home opener last Friday.

Senior Lauren Watson racked up four saves during the first weekend of play, two against both the Lobos and the Bears. She helped Tech record a shutout victory over Missouri State, moving her career total to 20.5. It puts her 8.5 away from Tech's all-time leader, Victoria Esson, in the career shutouts category.

WEEK 1 WRAP

The Red Raiders put together a spotless 2-0 opening weekend last week, taking down New Mexico, 2-1, on Aug. 19, along with a 1-0 shutout victory over Missouri State on Aug. 21. All three goals for the Red Raiders were scored by freshmen, with midfielder Jordie Harr netting two against the Lobos and forward Jade King notching the game-winner against the Bears.

ALL-TIME HISTORY

The all-time series with Arizona goes back to 1994 and the advantage is held slightly by the Wildcats at 1-2-2 overall. The last two meetings between the programs have ended in a 1-1 tie (2015) and a 2-0 Red Raider victory (2013). Sunday will also mark the first overall contest between Texas Tech and Northeastern.

SWEET 16

The Red Raiders jumped three spots to No. 16 in this week's National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) poll on Aug. 23. It marks 16 consecutive weeks Tech has appeared in the top 25 of the rankings. The Red Raiders debuted at No. 19 in the preseason poll on Aug. 2. Two of Tech's future opponents are also ranked in the latest poll, with three others receiving votes.

AWARD SEASON

It didn't take long for Texas Tech soccer to receive its first award of the 2016 season. After a two-goal performance last weekend, freshman midfielder Jordie Harr was named Big 12 Freshman of the Week on Aug. 23. It is the first newcomer recognition for the Red Raiders since Oct. 21, 2014 and is the 10th overall award for a member of the program.

TOP OF THE MOUNTAIN

After the first weekend of competition, Harr is tied for the Big 12 lead in goals (two) and points (four). Both of her scores came in one match, Tech's 2-1 victory over New Mexico on Aug. 19, six minutes apart from similar places on the field. Her first tally came off a free kick from 20 yards away from the goal, while her second was at a tougher angle a few yards closer to the net. She finished the weekend with four shots on goal for a clip of .800. Harr is also the only freshman in the conference to net multiple scores.

YOUNG FIREPOWER

Texas Tech freshmen have scored all three goals for the Red Raiders so far this season. Along with Harr's multi-goal performance against the Lobos, forward Jade King notched the game-winner in a 1-0 victory over Missouri State on Aug. 21. King's marker came after a deep pass from the other side of the field was directed just ahead of King by sophomore Gwennie Puente, giving her the perfect opportunity to bury it just past the diving goalkeeper in the 25th minute. Harr & King combined for 19 shots, 10 on goal, and six points after week one.

Tech's 1-0 shutout victory over Missouri State on Aug. 21 moved senior goalkeeper Lauren Watson's career shutout total to 20.5. Already sitting in second place in the all-time records at Texas Tech in career shutouts, she is now 8.5 behind school record holder Victoria Esson for the lead in the category. Last weekend, Watson recorded four saves, two in each match, en route to a successful 2-0 record to start 2016. Watson is also three saves away from moving to No. 5 in the career saves list at Texas Tech with 172 heading into this weekend.

PRESEASON RECOGNITION

The Red Raiders were picked to finish second in the 2016 Big 12 standings, as part of the preseason poll that was voted on by the league coaches. It is the fourth consecutive season Tech has been projected to finish second in the conference, which had five of the nine teams ranked nationally, or receiving votes, throughout the season. Senior Goalkeeper Lauren Watson was named to the 2016 Preseason All-Big 12 Soccer team. She was also rated as the No. 7 player in the conference and No. 85 in the nation by TopDrawerSoccer.com.

2015 QUICK HITTER

The Red Raiders finished the 2015 season with a 14-4-5 overall record and captured the program's first Big 12 Championship. Tech also advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the fourth consecutive season. In January, two Red Raiders were drafted in the 2016 National Women's Soccer League (NWSL) College Draft, as Janine Beckie went eighth overall to the Houston Dash, followed by Alli Murphy to the Washington Spirit with the 20th pick. With the selections, Texas Tech became one of four college programs in the nation to have multiple picks in the first two rounds. Tech was the only Big 12 school to have a player drafted in the top 10 for the second-straight season and the only school in Texas in the last two years to have a player drafted in consecutive seasons. Beckie also represented Canada in the 2016 Olympic Games, tallying three goals, including the fastest goal ever scored in a women's Olympic soccer match, coming 21 seconds into their opening match against Australia.

WALKER MAGIC

Since Stone's arrival in Lubbock, the Red Raiders have amassed an incredible 64-20-3 record at the John Walker Soccer Complex. Texas Tech has won their home opener in 11-straight seasons, dating back to 2006. During that stretch, Tech has outscored opponents 36-4 in home openers.

RED RAIDERS TOP BIG 12 IN WINS SINCE 2012

Winning has pretty much become second nature for the Red Raiders the past four seasons under Tom Stone. During that stretch, Texas Tech has recorded 65 victories and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Championship in each of the past four seasons. This is the winningest stretch for the Red Raiders in school history, as Tech won 16 matches in 2012 and then followed up with a school-record 18 victories in 2013. The Red Raiders then posted a 16 win season in 2014. That success has made Tech one of the most successful Big 12 programs the past four seasons.

LUBBOCK, Texas – The No. 19 Texas Tech soccer team kicked off the 2016 season with a 2-1 victory over New Mexico on Friday night at the John Walker Soccer Complex.

The win kept head coach Tom Stone's undefeated streak in home openers intact, improving to 10-0. It also broke the all-time series mark with the Lobos, giving Tech a 5-4-1 lead.

The Red Raiders' two scores came from freshman midfielder Jordie Harr, who found the back of the goal in the 59th and 65th minutes of the match. Her two goals tie for the most by a Red Raider in a single match in each over the last two years.

"I think New Mexico came out and did a great job of trying to keep us from coming out of the backfield," Stone said. "Everyone knows we like to play that way and it was obvious that they spent a considerable amount of time getting that organized. Heather (Dyche) is a great coach and made it difficult on us."

After an hour and 40 minute weather delay, the Red Raiders took the field and immediately went on the offensive, as Tech earned a corner kick and freshman forward Jade King registered the first shot of the match all within the first three minutes. New Mexico would log three scoring opportunities from the eighth to the 18th minute in the first half, as senior goalkeeper Lauren Watson grabbed one of her two saves during that span.

Other than a shot in the 36th minute, that would end the offense for the Lobos in the first half. The Red Raiders put up six more shots before halftime, which were spread between King (two), Jordie Harr, Sarah Norman, Cassie Conarty and Tatum Barton.

The Red Raiders came out firing in the second half, racking up three shots from King and Gwennie Puente before finally breaking through in the 59th minute. Freshman midfielder Jordie Harr buried a free kick from 20 yards out to give Tech its first goal of the 2016 season.

Six minutes later, Harr did it again, sending the ball to the back of the net from nearly the same spot on the field to put the Red Raiders up 2-0.

"This was an unbelievable experience," Harr said. "To score two games in our first game at home was unbelievable. Our whole team worked hard in the spring and we could see it pay off tonight. In the first half, we struggled a little bit, but after our talk at halftime, we all picked it up and we got the result we wanted."

The Lobos would answer in the 70th minute as New Mexico midfielder Maddie Irwin squeaked one in to cut Tech's lead to 2-1. The Lobos would have a couple other opportunities late in the match, but couldn't get them to materialize, giving the Red Raiders their first win of the 2016 season.

"We are going to work to play much better as the season goes on," Stone added. "When you have so many new personalities on the field and they all need to find their way, you still have to win. We can say all day that we didn't play that great, but we still scored two goals and held on to win, 2-1. We are extremely excited to be off and running at 1-0."

The Red Raiders return to action on Sunday, Aug. 21, when they take on Missouri State for the first meeting ever between the two programs at 7 p.m. at the John Walker Soccer Complex.

LUBBOCK, Texas – The No. 19 Texas Tech soccer team posted a 1-0 victory over Missouri State on Sunday night at John Walker Soccer Complex, improving to 2-0-0 after the first weekend of the 2016 season.

The lone goal for the Red Raiders came from freshman forward Jade King, her first of the season, in the 25th minute of the match. Her tally is the third by a freshman this year, as midfielder Jordie Harr netted two in Friday's contest vs. New Mexico.

It also marked the first shutout of the year for the Red Raiders and senior goalkeeper Lauren Watson, bringing her career total to 20.5. She ranks second all-time at Texas Tech in career saves, moving to 8.5 behind Victoria Esson in the school's record books.

"I liked the fact that Jade King, who has been scoring goals all spring and all preseason got her first goal tonight," head coach Tom Stone said. "She also came very close to getting goal two and goal three, so we're excited to see Jade rolling. She's been our most dangerous player and tonight she got the game winner in her second college game, so we're thrilled with that.

"I'm also excited that freshmen have all three of our goals. That makes us think the future is going to be very bright around here."

The first meeting between the two programs started off with a strong offensive outpour from the Red Raiders, who logged eight shots and three corner kicks in the first 22 minutes of action. Tech finally broke through in the 25th minute, after sophomore forward Gwennie Puente used her head to redirect a pass from deep in the Red Raider territory right ahead of King, who buried it past the goalkeeper to the left side of the net for the goal.

"I am so happy," King said on her scoring her first collegiate goal. "Coach Stone instills that in us every practice to go to the goal, get your shot off and score. Without scoring, we can't win. So he's invested a lot of time in the forwards so that we know what kind of shots to take, from where to shoot it and when to pass it."

The Red Raiders would have several more scoring opportunities before the break, going into halftime with 14 shots. Missouri State did not record a shot in the first frame and would not put one toward the net until the 82nd minute, when the Bears had two, both corralled by Watson.

Missouri State's two shots would be the last pair in a frame filled with 14 fouls and two yellow cards, one from MSU's Brooke Zenner in the 69th minute and the other charged to Texas Tech's Natalie Schmutz in the 76th. Tech added six shots in the second half, four on net, totaling 20 overall Sunday night.

"We've had two teams come in with the objective to slow us down," Stone said. "They've made it not necessarily harder for us to dominate the flow of play, but for us to put it away. If we had gotten goal two and goal three, it would've been over.

"But, credit Missouri State, they fought hard. We got a lot of balls at them, we out-shot them 20-to-2, but their two shots were good. Lauren Watson had to make two saves, so they deserve credit for that. They didn't play Friday night and we did, so we knew they were a fresh team. Overall, we're happy to be 2-0, but probably a little dissatisfied with our execution today."

With the first weekend in the books, the Red Raiders turn their focus toward a ranked matchup against No. 20 Arizona on Friday, Aug. 26, at 7 p.m. at the John Walker Soccer Complex. Two nights later, Tech will host Northeastern in Lubbock, which is also slated for a 7 p.m. start time.

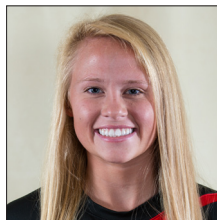
