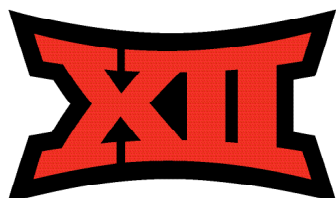

QUICK KICKS

- The No. 25 Texas Tech soccer team begins the conference portion of the schedule on Friday, Sept. 23, on the road against Kansas at 7 p.m. at Rock Chalk Park in Lawrence. The Red Raiders will return home to square off with Iowa State at 1 p.m. on Sunday, Sept. 25, at the John Walker Soccer Complex.
- The Red Raiders wrapped up the non-conference portion of the season with a 7-1-2 record. Tech went on the road last weekend, battling Loyola Marymount to a 1-1 draw in Los Angeles on Friday, Sept. 16, before picking up a 1-0 victory over San Diego State two days later.
- The Red Raiders moved to No. 25 in the latest National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) poll. It's the 20th consecutive week Tech has been inside the top 25 of the rankings.
- The Jayhawks (5-3-2) enter the weekend coming off their own California swing, dropping a 2-0 decision to Southern California, followed by a 1-1 draw with Pepperdine. Tech and Kansas have met six times over the last four seasons, thanks to dates at the Big 12 Tournament in 2012 & 2015. The Cyclones (6-2-0) ride a two-match win streak into this weekend's matchups, taking down Wisconsin-Milwaukee (1-0) and South Dakota (2-0) in each of the last two contests. Sunday's match will be a top 35 RPI battle, as Iowa State checks in at No. 28, while Tech is ranked at 35th in the first RPI rankings of the year.

WEEK 5 WRAP

The Red Raiders wrapped up the non-conference portion of the season with a 7-1-2 record. Tech went on the road last weekend, battling Loyola Marymount to a 1-1 draw in Los Angeles on Friday, Sept. 16, before picking up a 1-0 victory over San Diego State two days later. Junior defender Rebekah O'Brien tallied the lone goal for the Red Raiders last weekend, notching her second goal of the season in the match at LMU. Sunday's score came off an own goal from the Aztecs, making it the second time in 2016 the Red Raiders have benefited from an opponent own goal.

FOES GOLD

The Jayhawks (5-3-2) enter the weekend coming off their own California swing, dropping a 2-0 decision to Southern California, followed by a 1-1 draw with Pepperdine. CONFERENCE SHOWDOWN

The Big 12 schedule is a daunting eight-match slate, with all but the first two dates coming during the month of October. After this weekend, Tech will host Oklahoma State (Oct. 7) & Baylor (Oct. 9) in Lubbock and will then hit the road for a three-match stretch at No. 5 West Virginia (Oct. 14), Texas (Oct. 21) and TCU (Oct. 23). The Red Raiders will conclude the regular season at the John Walker Soccer Complex against Oklahoma on Oct. 28, before the conference tournament the following week.

20 AND COUNTING

Despite going 3-0-1 over the last two weeks, the Red Raiders have dropped one spot in each of the last two polls, moving to No. 25 in this week's National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) ranking, which was released on Sept. 20. It marks 20 consecutive weeks Tech has appeared in the top 25 of the poll. The Red Raiders debuted at No. 19 in the preseason poll on Aug. 2, and were ranked 16th and 15th the next two weeks, respectively, before slipping to No. 22. Two of Tech's opponents also appear in the latest poll, with three others receiving votes.

Senior goalkeeper Lauren Watson posted her fourth shutout of the season last weekend after a 1-0 victory on the road at San Diego State. Her total ranks second in the conference standings. Already sitting in second place in the all-time records at Texas Tech in career shutouts, she is now 5.5 behind school record holder Victoria Esson for the lead in the category with 23.5.

BUILDING A WALL

Watson entered the season with 168 career saves, needing only seven to move into No. 5 on the career saves list at Texas Tech. After recording nine against Arizona and two more in the win over Northeastern, along with her four in the opening weekend, she took sole possession of the fifth spot in the standings. Last weekend, she racked up 11 more saves, six against LMU and five vs. San Diego State, giving her a career total of 207. Her nine saves against Arizona on Aug. 26 are tied for the most in a single-match by a Big 12 goalkeeper this season. She is now six saves away from Victoria Esson in fourth at 213, a number she has a chance to achieve this weekend.

**WALKER MAGIC**

Since Stone's arrival in Lubbock, the Red Raiders have amassed an incredible 67-21-4 record at the John Walker Soccer Complex. Texas Tech has won their home opener in 11-straight seasons, dating back to 2006. During that stretch, Tech has outscored opponents 36-4 in home openers.

RED RAIDERS TOP BIG 12 IN WINS SINCE 2012

Winning has pretty much become second nature for the Red Raiders the past four seasons under Tom Stone. During that stretch, Texas Tech has recorded 70 victories and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Championship in each of the past four seasons. This is the winningest stretch for the Red Raiders in school history, as Tech won 16 matches in 2012 and then followed up with a school-record 18 victories in 2013. The Red Raiders then posted a 16 win season in 2014 and 14 in 2015. Heading into conference play this year, Tech has already amassed seven victories. That success has made Tech one of the most successful Big 12 programs the past four seasons.

CAREER FIRSTS

Seven Red Raiders have notched their first career goals during the 2016 season. The last to do so was sophomore midfielder Jordan Duke, who tallied the lone goal over ORU with a header after locating a corner kick from sophomore defender Margaret Begley from the far side of the field. While three are freshman, the other half have come from two juniors (Rebekah O'Brien & Natalie Schmutz) and two sophomores (Cassie Boren & Duke).

SPREADING THE WEALTH

Tech has had eight different goal scorers in 2016. Last weekend, No. 8 came from sophomore midfielder Jordan Duke, who scored the lone goal against Oral Roberts off a header. The Red Raiders almost had their ninth in freshman forward Tatum Barton in their match at Appalachian State, after her shot was saved by the goalkeeper, then bounced in front of the net and was kicked in for an own goal by a Mountaineer defender.

KING'S KINGDOM

Freshman forward Jade King is a threat to put a ball in the back of the net every time she touches the ball. She notched her team-high third goal of the season nine minutes into the match against Abilene Christian. Not only do her shots per game (4.80) and total shots (48) lead the Big 12, but she also ranks top 15 in the country in shots per game (13th).

AWARD SEASON

It didn't take long for Texas Tech soccer to receive its first award of the 2016 season. After a two-goal performance in the opening weekend, freshman midfielder Jordie Harr was named Big 12 Freshman of the Week on Aug. 23. It is the first newcomer recognition for the Red Raiders since Oct. 21, 2014 and is the 10th overall award for a member of the program.

PRESEASON RECOGNITION

The Red Raiders were picked to finish second in the 2016 Big 12 standings, as part of the preseason poll that was voted on by the league coaches. It is the fourth consecutive season Tech has been projected to finish second in the conference, which had five of the nine teams ranked nationally, or receiving votes, throughout the season. Senior Goalkeeper Lauren Watson was named to the 2016 Preseason All-Big 12 Soccer team. She was also rated as the No. 7 player in the conference and No. 85 in the nation by TopDrawerSoccer.com.

2015 QUICK HITTER

The Red Raiders finished the 2015 season with a 14-4-5 overall record and captured the program's first Big 12 Championship. Tech also advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the fourth consecutive season. In January, two Red Raiders were drafted in the 2016 National Women's Soccer League (NWSL) College Draft, as Janine Beckie went eighth overall to the Houston Dash, followed by Alli Murphy to the Washington Spirit with the 20th pick. With the selections, Texas Tech became one of four college programs in the nation to have multiple picks in the first two rounds. Tech was the only Big 12 school to have a player drafted in the top 10 for the second-straight season and the only school in Texas in the last two years to have a player drafted in consecutive seasons. Beckie also represented Canada in the 2016 Olympic Games, tallying three goals, including the fastest goal ever scored in a women's Olympic soccer match, coming 21 seconds into their opening match against Australia.

LUBBOCK, Texas – The No. 19 Texas Tech soccer team kicked off the 2016 season with a 2-1 victory over New Mexico on Friday night at the John Walker Soccer Complex.

The win kept head coach Tom Stone's undefeated streak in home openers intact, improving to 10-0. It also broke the all-time series mark with the Lobos, giving Tech a 5-4-1 lead.

The Red Raiders' two scores came from freshman midfielder Jordie Harr, who found the back of the goal in the 59th and 65th minutes of the match. Her two goals tie for the most by a Red Raider in a single match in each over the last two years.

"I think New Mexico came out and did a great job of trying to keep us from coming out of the backfield," Stone said. "Everyone knows we like to play that way and it was obvious that they spent a considerable amount of time getting that organized. Heather (Dyche) is a great coach and made it difficult on us."

After an hour and 40 minute weather delay, the Red Raiders took the field and immediately went on the offensive, as Tech earned a corner kick and freshman forward Jade King registered the first shot of the match all within the first three minutes. New Mexico would log three scoring opportunities from the eighth to the 18th minute in the first half, as senior goalkeeper Lauren Watson grabbed one of her two saves during that span.

Other than a shot in the 36th minute, that would end the offense for the Lobos in the first half. The Red Raiders put up six more shots before halftime, which were spread between King (two), Jordie Harr, Sarah Norman, Cassie Conarty and Tatum Barton.

The Red Raiders came out firing in the second half, racking up three shots from King and Gwennie Puente before finally breaking through in the 59th minute. Freshman midfielder Jordie Harr buried a free kick from 20 yards out to give Tech its first goal of the 2016 season.

Six minutes later, Harr did it again, sending the ball to the back of the net from nearly the same spot on the field to put the Red Raiders up 2-0.

"This was an unbelievable experience," Harr said. "To score two games in our first game at home was unbelievable. Our whole team worked hard in the spring and we could see it pay off tonight. In the first half, we struggled a little bit, but after our talk at halftime, we all picked it up and we got the result we wanted."

The Lobos would answer in the 70th minute as New Mexico midfielder Maddie Irwin squeaked one in to cut Tech's lead to 2-1. The Lobos would have a couple other opportunities late in the match, but couldn't get them to materialize, giving the Red Raiders their first win of the 2016 season.

"We are going to work to play much better as the season goes on," Stone added. "When you have so many new personalities on the field and they all need to find their way, you still have to win. We can say all day that we didn't play that great, but we still scored two goals and held on to win, 2-1. We are extremely excited to be off and running at 1-0."

The Red Raiders return to action on Sunday, Aug. 21, when they take on Missouri State for the first meeting ever between the two programs at 7 p.m. at the John Walker Soccer Complex.

LUBBOCK, Texas – The No. 19 Texas Tech soccer team posted a 1-0 victory over Missouri State on Sunday night at John Walker Soccer Complex, improving to 2-0-0 after the first weekend of the 2016 season.

The lone goal for the Red Raiders came from freshman forward Jade King, her first of the season, in the 25th minute of the match. Her tally is the third by a freshman this year, as midfielder Jordie Harr netted two in Friday's contest vs. New Mexico.

It also marked the first shutout of the year for the Red Raiders and senior goalkeeper Lauren Watson, bringing her career total to 20.5. She ranks second all-time at Texas Tech in career saves, moving to 8.5 behind Victoria Esson in the school's record books.

"I liked the fact that Jade King, who has been scoring goals all spring and all preseason got her first goal tonight," head coach Tom Stone said. "She also came very close to getting goal two and goal three, so we're excited to see Jade rolling. She's been our most dangerous player and tonight she got the game winner in her second college game, so we're thrilled with that."

"I'm also excited that freshmen have all three of our goals. That makes us think the future is going to be very bright around here."

The first meeting between the two programs started off with a strong offensive outpour from the Red Raiders, who logged eight shots and three corner kicks in the first 22 minutes of action. Tech finally broke through in the 25th minute, after sophomore forward Gwennie Puente used her head to redirect a pass from deep in the Red Raider territory right ahead of King, who buried it past the goalkeeper to the left side of the net for the goal.

"I am so happy," King said on her scoring her first collegiate goal. "Coach Stone instills that in us every practice to go to the goal, get your shot off and score. Without scoring, we can't win. So he's invested a lot of time in the forwards so that we know what kind of shots to take, from where to shoot it and when to pass it."

The Red Raiders would have several more scoring opportunities before the break, going into halftime with 14 shots. Missouri State did not record a shot in the first frame and would not put one toward the net until the 82nd minute, when the Bears had two, both corralled by Watson.

Missouri State's two shots would be the last pair in a frame filled with 14 fouls and two yellow cards, one from MSU's Brooke Zenner in the 69th minute and the other charged to Texas Tech's Natalie Schmutz in the 76th. Tech added six shots in the second half, four on net, totaling 20 overall Sunday night.

"We've had two teams come in with the objective to slow us down," Stone said. "They've made it not necessarily harder for us to dominate the flow of play, but for us to put it away. If we had gotten goal two and goal three, it would've been over."

"But, credit Missouri State, they fought hard. We got a lot of balls at them, we out-shot them 20-to-2, but their two shots were good. Lauren Watson had to make two saves, so they deserve credit for that. They didn't play Friday night and we did, so we knew they were a fresh team. Overall, we're happy to be 2-0, but probably a little dissatisfied with our execution today."

With the first weekend in the books, the Red Raiders turn their focus toward a ranked matchup against No. 20 Arizona on Friday, Aug. 26, at 7 p.m. at the John Walker Soccer Complex. Two nights later, Tech will host Northeastern in Lubbock, which is also slated for a 7 p.m. start time.

LUBBOCK, Texas - The No. 16 Texas Tech soccer team posted a 2-2 draw with Arizona on Friday night, coming from behind twice with the help of 1,328 of the Lubbock faithful at the John Walker Soccer Complex.

The Red Raiders moved to 2-0-1 with the result, as the Wildcats now sit at 1-1-1 in 2016.

Freshman forward Jade King tallied her second goal of the season in the 65th minute, knotting the score at one. Trailing late in the match, junior defender Rebekah O'Brien went top shelf and buried the equalizer in the 89th minute for her first tally of the year.

"I've been waiting for three weeks to see what we were going to do in an environment like this and after 45 minutes, I was pretty concerned," head coach Tom Stone said. "But, after the next 45 plus overtime, there was a lot of excitement. We were able to see who's ready for this and see how they responded to being down.

"They didn't want to let the big crowd down. They were awesome tonight. This was a classic Friday night at John Walker Soccer Complex and our fans got to see one of the best teams in the PAC-12 last year that also made the sweet 16 a few years ago. They're legit and we stared them down. We would've loved to get the victory, but given the fact that we had to come back twice, we're not completely disappointed about the draw."

It marks back-to-back meetings and third overall time that the two programs have ended the match in a draw. The first was a scoreless bout in 2011, while last year's contest went finished 1-1.

The opening half saw 10 shots by the Wildcats, with senior goalkeeper Lauren Watson tallying six saves, who would finish the night with nine. However, miscommunication in the 28th minute by Watson and a defender in front of her resulted in the first goal of the night for Arizona. It was the first time the Red Raiders had trailed in a game in 2016 and would be the only score of the first frame.

In the second half, a flurry of fouls set up a free kick for O'Brien, who sent it to the middle of the box, where the ball found King, who was able to send it past the goalkeeper in the 65th minute to knot it up at one. It marked back-to-back games she's scored a goal for the Red Raider offense.

Eleven minutes later, the Wildcats would earn it back, after a header from Jade Degraice-Bailey deflected back to Cali Crisler and found its way past Watson and in the goal.

With time running out, O'Brien served up a beauty that floated just over the tip of the keeper's outstretched hands top shelf in the far corner of the net in the 89th minute, ensuring there would be overtime. It was her first goal of her Red Raider career.

"It's a pure ball-striker's goal," Stone said about O'Brien's tally. "It's on the rise all the way until it hits the net. Once it hits the keeper, if there's geography left, it's going to hit the back of the net, and she just drove it to the far post. It was a great strike."

After two 10 minute overtime periods and two scoring opportunities for Tech in the final frame, time expired, completing the first draw for the Red Raiders since Oct. 18, 2015.

Texas Tech returns to the field for game four of the seven-match homestand on Sunday, Aug. 28, squaring off with Northeastern (1-1-1) at 7 p.m. at the John Walker Soccer Complex.

AUG. 28 // NORTHEASTERN VS. NO. 16 TEXAS TECH

LUBBOCK, Texas – The No. 16 Texas Tech soccer team picked up its third victory of the season on a weather-delayed Sunday night, shutting out Northeastern, 2-0, at John Walker Soccer Complex.

The Red Raiders' (3-0-1) two goals were the first career tallies for junior forward Natalie Schmutz (61') and redshirt freshman defender Gabbie Puente (76').

"It's amazing," Schmutz said on her goal. "It's really unlike anything else to get the first one, it's kind of like a 'Finally,' kind of thing. Jordie Harr made an amazing shot and I was just happy to reward her for her hard work."

Schmutz and Puente's goals were just two of 10 shots Tech had on goal Sunday night. The Red Raiders totaled 20 shots overall, posting 10 in each half.

"I think it was a tale of two halves," head coach Tom Stone said. "They had the wind and that put a lot of pressure on us in the first half. We just made some changes in the second half: moved some people around, changed our shape and were just able to wrestle control of the game away."

"Once we did that, we felt like it was going to happen sooner or later. Jordie Harr tried to trick the keeper, it came off the crossbar and Natalie was running in like a forward is supposed to and followed it and finished it. I felt like once we scored, we would win, but that second goal from Gabbie gave us some breathing room."

For the second-straight weekend, Tech was hit with a weather delay. After an hour and 50 minutes, the two teams took the field, with the Red Raiders immediately going on the attack. Tech found themselves with two corner kicks and three shots within the first eight minutes. Northeastern would only get two shots on net during the match, both coming before halfway through the first frame, with senior goalkeeper Lauren Watson corralling both opportunities.

After halftime, Schmutz had a great opportunity with a strike from the far side of the field that bounced off the left post. However, 10 minutes later in the 61st minute, she would find the back of the net, after Harr's shot hit the crossbar and fell right in front of Schmutz, who buried it to give Tech a 1-0 lead.

"Natalie has been on a two-and-a-half year mission to earn the minutes she's getting now, which she totally deserves and she scored the game-winner," Stone said. "I don't think there's a single player on the team that isn't thrilled about her success. She had to sit behind some really good players that were older than her and now that she has the chance, she's making the most of it. Natalie did that for eight years as a youth player and she was hurt a little bit once she got here. Now she's 100 percent healthy, she looks like a Ferrari and runs like one too."

The Red Raiders stayed on the offensive, earning three more corner kicks and recording several shots before Gabbie Puente notched Tech's second goal off a feed from Jade King in the 76th minute. Her goal helped seal the third victory of the season for Texas Tech and the first overall win in the all-time series between the two programs.

With their assists, Harr & King lead the team in points with five each over the four matches played in 2016. It also gave Watson shutout No. 21.5, pulling her to 7.5 away from the all-time lead for career shutouts in Texas Tech history.

Up next for the Red Raiders is a date with No. 21 California, as the Red Raiders continue their seven-match homestand at the John Walker Soccer Complex on Friday, Sept. 2, at 7 p.m.

"This is the best Cal team they've ever had," Stone said about their next opponent. "Neil [McGuire] has been around long enough to get everybody right and exactly where they want them to. They're legit. They're a PAC-12 contender and they'll push for the title, so we know we'll have our hands full there. We beat them a couple years ago when we were the more mature team and now I think we've found that they're going to be the more experienced team, so we have to be our best on Friday."

LUBBOCK, Texas – The No. 15 Texas Tech soccer team suffered its first loss of the 2016 season to No. 19 California, 4-0, on Friday night at the John Walker Soccer Complex.

"They deserve the credit, they came out and took over the game and kept possession," head coach Tom Stone said. "They created chances. In the first half they had three shots on goal and three goals, that's a pretty tough stat to overcome, especially when they had so much of the ball. So, they had the ball and a three-goal lead, and they put our young team in an odd position that they're not used to."

It was the first time the Red Raiders (3-1-1) had lost against a ranked non-conference opponent since 2011. Texas Tech is now 5-3 all-time against ranked non-conference opponents under Tom Stone.

Cal (4-1-0) got off to a strong start on Friday, netting their first goal four minutes into the match, after Heather Wallesh found Arielle Ship, who used a header to notch her first goal of the year. The Bears would strike again the 14th minute, as Miranda Nild lifted one over senior goalkeeper Lauren Watson to take a 2-0 lead.

The Red Raiders got an offensive opportunity from freshman forward Jade King a few minutes later, but her shot sailed above the net. However, the momentum would swing back to the Bears, who after three corners, found themselves with a penalty kick thanks to a Red Raider foul in the box. Kelly Fitzgerald, who already had two goals this season, picked up her third when she made a move to the left side and found the back of the net, giving Cal a 3-0 advantage going into halftime.

Tech recorded four shots in the first frame, while California put up 10. After the break, the Red Raiders put together a string of offensive chances, with shots coming from Tatum Barton, Brooke Denesik and King, but none of the three broke through.

In the 63rd minute, the Bears would score their final tally of the night, coming shortly after a corner kick from the far side, as Emma Fletcher put one in through traffic to put Cal up, 4-0.

Even though Tech recorded 10 shots in the second half, the Bears led in the category at the end of the night, 18-to-14, with eight on goal. King finished with four shots, two on goal.

The Red Raiders return to action on Sunday, Sept. 4, as they host Abilene Christian at 1 p.m. at the John Walker Soccer Complex.

LUBBOCK, Texas – The No. 15 Texas Tech soccer team returned to the win column after recording a 3-1 win over Abilene Christian on Sunday afternoon at the John Walker Soccer Complex.

The Red Raiders (4-1-1) racked up the first three goals of the match, coming from freshman forward Jade King (9'), sophomore defender Cassie Boren (18') and sophomore forward Gwennie Puente (47'). The lone goal for the Wildcats (1-4-1) came in the 51st minute thanks to junior midfielder Leslie Snider.

"It was a good response," head coach Tom Stone said on his team's play after Friday's loss to Cal. "We knew we had to win today and with the wind, we put a lot of pressure on them to score goals and not be too complacent with the ball. We got the two in the first half, even though it came on 15 shots."

After a couple of early shots from King and fellow freshman forward Tatum Barton, the Red Raiders broke through in the ninth minute with a goal from King to go up 1-0. King found the ball on the left side of the field, danced around her defender and lifted her shot to the right corner of the net and over the goalkeeper for her third tally of the season.

Nine minutes later, junior defender Rebekah O'Brien sent a ball to the middle of the field, where Boren drove it home to give Tech a 2-0 lead. It was Boren's first goal of her Red Raider career.

Texas Tech built up 15 shots in the first half, compared to Abilene Christian's three, who did not log a shot until 33rd minute of the match. Although the Red Raiders held a two-goal lead at halftime, Stone said one of the biggest moments of the match came after the break.

"I think the key to the game was us scoring two minutes into the second half," Stone said. "We sprung Jordie Harr free in the flat zone in front of their back line and she played a great ball into Gwennie. Then, Gwennie slotted the keeper and that kind of did it for us. Now, we gave up one on the other end and that made it a little tighter down the stretch, but that third goal right out of the break probably won it for us."

Puente's marker in the 47th minute was her first of the year and fourth overall as a Red Raider.

In the 51st minute, ACU's Chloe Fifer found midfielder Leslie Snider, who sent a header to the back of the net to cut Texas Tech's lead to 3-1. However, it would be the only successful strike for the Wildcats on Sunday afternoon, as Tech would hold ACU to just three more shots through the final 39 minutes of action.

The victory moved Texas Tech to 2-0 all-time against Abilene Christian, with their first meeting in 2014 ending in a 2-0 Red Raider victory. This weekend also marked the first time the Red Raiders had competed in a Sunday midday match following a Friday night contest in 2016.

Texas Tech wraps up the seven-match homestand on Friday, Sept. 9, with a date with Oral Roberts at 7 p.m. at the John Walker Soccer Complex. The Red Raiders will then hit the road for the first regular season away contest in 2016 when they take on Appalachian State at noon in Boone, North Carolina.

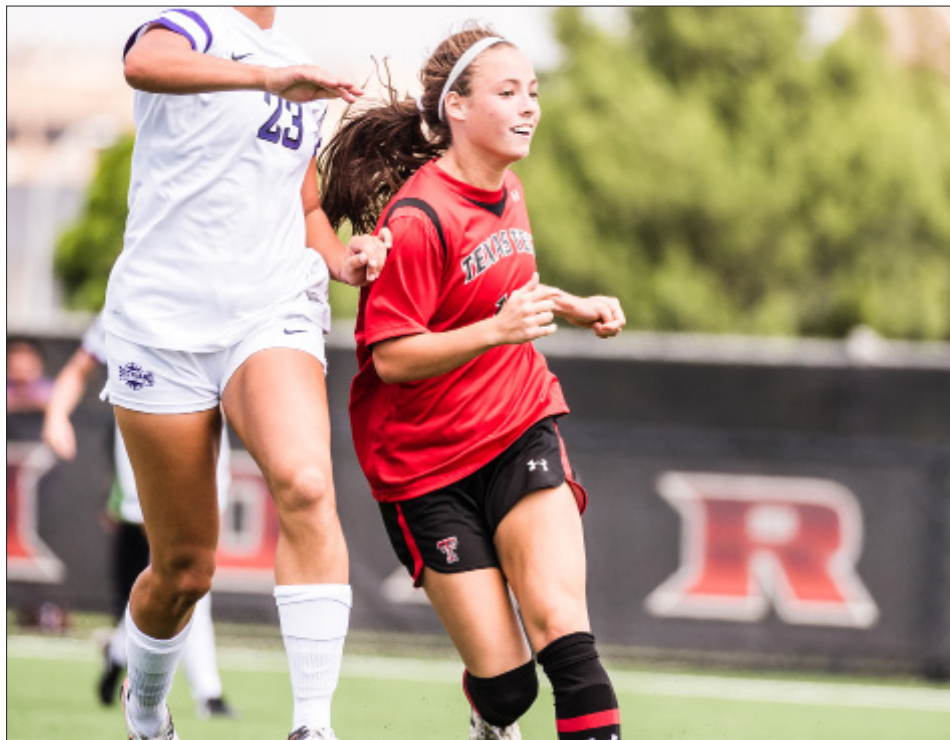

LUBBOCK, Texas – The No. 22 Texas Tech soccer team recorded a 1-0 victory over Oral Roberts in front of 1,129 members of the Lubbock faithful on Friday night at the John Walker Soccer Complex.

Sophomore midfielder Jordan Duke tallied the lone goal in the contest in the 47th minute off a corner kick feed from sophomore defender Margaret Begley. The Red Raiders improved to 5-1-1 this season with the win, while Oral Roberts dropped to 4-3-0 in 2016.

"I thought Oral Roberts did a good job of holding onto the ball tonight," head coach Tom Stone said. "They're a pretty good passing team. Our plan was to press them into a few key turnovers and see if we could capitalize on them. I thought the first 20 minutes of the second half is what really turned the game to our favor. We really pushed up the field, pushed up their players and turned them over a few times. One of those times turned into a corner kick and then Jordan Duke hammered it home for the win."

After a string of fouls from both sides to begin the match, the Red Raiders notched three of the first four shots of the night, with opportunities from junior defenders Cassie Conarty (2) and Rebekah O'Brien (1). Tech would have two more chances late in the frame, totaling five shots in the first half, with two on goal.

Less than a minute after halftime, the Red Raiders earned a corner kick, which set up Duke's tally in the 47th minute to put Tech up, 1-0. Sophomore defender Margaret Begley sent the corner to the middle of the box, where Duke sent a header to the back of the net for her first goal of the season.

Duke is the eighth different Red Raider to record a goal in 2016. It also marked back-to-back matches Tech has scored within the first two minutes of the second half.

The Red Raiders stayed on the attack after the strike, with two more chances two minutes later. Tech would rack up eight more shots for 14 overall, along with three additional corners in the period.

"Rebekah [O'Brien] hit the crossbar and Tatum [Barton] hit the post and Natalie [Schmutz] missed a breakaway," Stone added about some of the other opportunities for Tech in the second half. "If one of those go in, then we are able to shut it down at the end of the game. But because we didn't and the post was the size and the dimension that it is, we had to hold on there at the end."

Senior goalkeeper Lauren Watson brought in three saves, two in the first and one in the second half, en route to her third shutout of the season. The victory moved her to 6.5 away from the all-time lead in career shutouts at Texas Tech with 22.5. Her three saves gave her 26 on the year, putting her 19 away from No. 4 in the career saves category in the scarlet & black record book with 194.

"I think it was a real positive for us, since last weekend was pretty rough," Duke said about tonight's match. "It's how we respond. Sunday we responded well and I think tonight it was good that we came out and played a lot better with our possession. The second half was a lot better than the first half when we came out and started pressing the ball and keeping it. So, it was a good start to the weekend and we have to carry that into Sunday."

By wrapping up the seven-match homestand, the Red Raiders hit the road for the first time during the 2016 regular season, as they head to Boone, North Carolina, to square off with Appalachian State at noon on Sunday, Sept. 11.

BOONE, N.C. – The No. 22 Texas Tech soccer team ended its first road trip of the regular season with a come-from-behind 2-1 victory over Appalachian State on Sunday afternoon at Appalachian Soccer Stadium.

The Red Raiders (6-1-1) fell behind late in the first half after a goal from App. State's (5-3-0) Peatross in the 44th minute. In the second half, Tech picked up tallies from sophomore forward Gwennie Puente (2) in the 61' and a Mountaineer own goal in the 76', to complete the 2-1 win.

The first 13 minutes of the match featured back-and-forth action from the two sides, as both teams were able to log a few offensive opportunities. The Red Raiders found themselves with the ball on the attack in the Mountaineer zone several times starting in the 19th minute of the frame. Tech recorded six shots over the next 14 minutes of play, peppered from five different student-athletes.

With time winding down in the first half, the Red Raiders picked up a foul outside the box that would prove costly. In the 44th minute, Mountaineer midfielder Sarah Peatross curved the free kick into the right side of the goal to give App. State a 1-0 lead, which they would take into the break.

Tech racked up nine shots in the first frame, two on goal, compared to four overall shots from the Mountaineers. Both teams also had two corners in the first half, while the foul count was also close, with Tech at five and App. State at four.

Once again, the Red Raiders came out strong in the second half, earning their first of three corners in the frame five minutes in. Shortly after a King shot was saved by App. State's Sam Steyl, Tech found themselves having to defend a Mountaineer corner kick. Peatross' pass was punched away and out to Puente, who took off in a sprint down the field with the ball. Splitting a pair of defenders and making another miss, Puente went one-on-one with Steyl, who came out to challenge the play, but Puente sent her shot past the diving keeper in the 61st minute and into the net for the equalizer.

Puente's score marked her second in the season and was the ninth goal the Red Raiders have scored in the second period of match in 2016. The 10th came 15 minutes later after a shot from freshman forward Tatum Barton was saved by Steyl, but careened off a Mountaineer defender in front of her and into the net for the go-ahead score.

The Red Raiders mirrored their shot total from the first half in nine for a match total of 18, while adding four on goal. Senior goalkeeper Lauren Watson wrapped up two saves, bringing her 2016 total to 28 through eight matches played.

The victory was the third in-a-row for the Red Raiders and was the first contest in the all-time series between the two programs.

Texas Tech will have another pair of first-time meetings next weekend when they hit the road for California to battle Loyola Marymount (4-2-1) at 9 p.m. CDT on Friday, Sept. 16, in Los Angeles, before heading down to San Diego on Sunday, Sept. 18, to face San Diego State at 8 p.m. CDT.

LOS ANGELES, Calif. – The first meeting all-time between the No. 24 Texas Tech soccer team and Loyola Marymount ended in a 1-1 draw on Friday night at Sullivan Field.

The Red Raiders' (6-1-2) equalizer came in the 52' off a penalty kick from junior defender Rebekah O'Brien. She would finish the night with six shots, four on goal, while playing all 110 minutes of the match. It is the seventh time this season she has played in the entire contest.

The Lions (4-2-1) struck first in the eighth minute of the match, after a cross from forward Sarah Sanger found forward Sarina Bolden, who used a header to lift the ball above Watson for the score.

The Red Raiders put up four of the next five shots, with a pair coming from sophomore Brooke Denesik and forward Jade King, both sailing over the goal. The third came off a free kick from O'Brien after a Lion foul, followed by a great opportunity from junior forward Natalie Schmutz that was poked away by the diving LMU goalkeeper.

LMU put together a flurry of shots over a two-minute span to start the 31st minute. It would be replicated by the Red Raiders near the end of the half, as Tech got shots from O'Brien and sophomore forward Gwennie Puente, which set up a Red Raider corner.

Although Tech trailed 1-0 at the half, they recorded eight shots, three on goal, compared to LMU's six overall and three on goal.

The Lions started the second half by earning a corner and having another header attempt blocked, before shifting to the other side of the field for the Red Raider attack. Harr and King each sent shots toward the goal, with one saved by Pruitt, and the other blocked.

Four yellow cards would be given out during the frame, three to LMU and one to Tech, but none more costly than the one in the 51st minute that awarded the Red Raiders a penalty kick. Tech called upon O'Brien to take the penalty, who easily converted it to tie the match at one. Her goal was her second of the season and was the 11th for the Red Raiders in second half play in 2016.

The Red Raiders amassed nine shots total in the second half, five on goal, while LMU put up only three shots, one on goal. Several of Tech's chances in the second frame came within the final 10 minutes of the half, while Watson's fourth save of the evening put the bow on regulation and sent the two teams to overtime. She would finish the night with six.

The Red Raiders had several opportunities in the first overtime, as O'Brien immediately got a shot off within the first minute that dinged off the post. It was one of four shots Tech would have, as O'Brien and would record another shortly after that required Pruitt to make a save. Later in the frame, King had a breakaway chance, but her shot went under the diving keeper and wide of the goal. Harr had the final shot for Tech in the frame that was punched above the net by Pruitt and set up a Red Raider corner, but it did not materialize and ended the period.

The second overtime was not as eventful, as both teams only logged one shot each, as a header by LMU was brought in by Watson, while Tech picked up a shot from O'Brien that traveled just above the crossbar late in the frame.

Tech racked up 23 shots overall, 11 on goal, both figures the most in a single match this season for the Red Raiders. Watson's six saves gives her 34 this season, which is 11 away from fourth all-time at Texas Tech with 202.

Up next for the Red Raiders is a trip south to face San Diego State (2-4-0) on Sunday, Sept. 18, at 8 p.m. CDT.

SEPT. 18 // NO. 24 TEXAS TECH AT SAN DIEGO STATE

SAN DIEGO, Calif. – The No. 24 Texas Tech soccer team concluded its non-conference portion of the 2016 schedule with a 1-0 victory against San Diego State on Sunday night at the Aztec Sports Deck.

"This was a very important weekend for our growth and development," head coach Tom Stone said. "We faced the second & third-toughest teams on our non-conference schedule away from home and we needed results. We were certainly disappointed by the draw on Friday, but to leave California with a win and a tie ends the non-con season on a good note.

"Both of these teams will challenge for their respective conference championships and they pushed us to be better than we have been. So, headed into the Big 12 slate next week we are about as ready as we could be."

The lone goal in Sunday's match came in the 77th minute, after a ball from the Aztecs (2-5-0) deflected off of one of their own and into the net for the Red Raider score. It was the second time Tech has benefited from an own goal in 2016, both as the go-ahead tallies.

Already playing without freshman midfielder Jordie Harr, who was fulfilling a previous commitment to the U-20 U.S. Women's National Team today in Carson, California, the Red Raiders lost another in senior defender Megan McCullough to a red card after the goal. Tech was forced to play with only 10 members for the final 13 minutes of action, but were able to close out the match with a win.

Sunday's match was the first in the all-time series between the two programs and gave Tech a 7-1-2 record to wrap up the non-conference action.

"We had one less day of rest than our opponent after a double overtime game Friday, we lost Jordie Harr to the US U-20 National Team, who played Brazil today, we missed a penalty kick and played a man down for the last 15 minutes against a very energetic and athletic team away - and we still found a way to win," Stone added on the obstacles his team overcame on Sunday. "That definitely speaks to the fight in this young team. We are proud of their effort tonight for sure."

Tech found its way on the attack early, earning a corner kick within the first three minutes of action. San Diego State would flip it to their side of the field shortly after for a pair of shots in the sixth minute, one that dinged off the post, followed by another that was blocked by the Red Raider defense. Tech would do the same thing a few minutes later, as freshman forward Tatum Barton's strike met the crossbar and sophomore midfielder Jordan Duke had an opportunity blocked.

San Diego State went back on the offensive in the 23rd minute, as forward Aliyah Utush sent one above the goal and one from forward Angela Mitchell that required senior goalkeeper Lauren Watson's attention, who quickly wrapped up the save. SDSU would also have a shot blocked a couple minutes later.

The final three shots of the first frame came from the Red Raiders, with sophomore midfielder Jordan Duke found an opportunity, but sent hers just wide of the net. Subbing into the match in the 37th minute, junior forward Natalie Schmutz quickly found herself with the ball and took advantage, deflecting a shot off an Aztec defender to set up a Red Raider corner. Tech connected on the chance, as Duke's feed found sophomore defender Cassie Boren, but it was saved by SDSU's Gabby English in the 38th minute.

The remainder of the first half was plagued by Aztec fouls, who ended the chippy first half with eight-straight fouls, giving them 13 overall in the frame. Tech only committed five, while racking up six shots, compared to SDSU's six. The number of fouls were essentially flipped in the second half, as Tech picked up 15 to the Aztec's four.

It looked like the Red Raiders would find the back of the net the same way they did on Friday night via penalty kick, as the Aztecs were called for a hand ball two minutes into the second half. However, the conversion by redshirt freshman midfielder Mary Heiberger was unsuccessful.

Schmutz would get another chance in the 51st minute, with her shot traveling wide of the net. The next 10 minutes of play were peppered by four Red Raider fouls and two offside calls. Sandwiched between the two offsides was a SDSU corner, taken by midfielder Victoria Barba, but it did not materialize.

Tech picked up two yellow cards two minutes apart, charged to defenders Rebekah O'Brien & Meagan McCullough in the 67th & 68th minutes, respectively. Watson went back to work a few minutes later, as the Aztecs added two more shots in the 73rd minute, with only one needing Watson to make the save.

In the 77th minute, the Red Raiders took the lead after the Aztecs committed an own goal, the only score of the night. The pressure wouldn't let up; however, after McCullough's red card sent Tech down to 10 players for the duration of the match. During that stretch, the Aztecs would garner five more shots, including two in the final five seconds of the contest that were saved and hit the crossbar, as the Red Raiders held on for the win.

Watson finished the night with five saves, giving her 39 so far this season. She is now six away from fourth all-time at Texas Tech with 206. Sunday was also Watson's fourth shut-out of the year, putting her just 5.5 from the Red Raider career record of 29.0 overall.

"Overall, I thought it was a great weekend for our back line and holding mids," Stone said. "They really came alive this weekend and played with a great combination of physicality and possession. I thought they took a big step forward over these two games."

With the weekend over, the Red Raiders turn their attention to Big 12 competition, as they travel to Lawrence, Kansas, on Friday, Sept. 23, to battle Kansas (5-3-2) at 7 p.m.

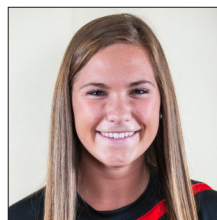

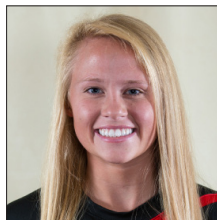
