FIRST PITCH

- The No. 3 Texas Tech baseball team finishes its road trip with a date with UTRGV on Tuesday, Feb. 27, at noon, at UTRGV Baseball Stadium in Edinburg.
- The Red Raiders (8-0) embarked on their first road trip after a strong five-game opening home stand to begin the 2018 season. Tech began the year with a four-game sweep of Maine on Feb. 16-18 at Dan Law Field at Rip Griffin Park. The Red Raiders grinded out a 4-2 victory on Opening Day against the Black Bears, then rolled in the Saturday doubleheader by scores of 12-1 & 12-5. Tech wrapped the weekend with a 21-6 rout to put the bow on the first series between the two programs.
- Tech racked up 49 runs & 48 hits against the Black Bears in the opening weekend. Six Red Raiders recorded multi-hit games, totaling 11 for the weekend, as sophomore infielder Josh Jung led the way with three. Jung added another against NMSU to lead the team in multi-hit games (4) and multi-RBI performances (3).
- Last Tuesday, the Red Raiders posted its first shutout of the year, as Tech blanked New Mexico State, 12-0, to close the home stand. It was the fourth-straight game the Red Raiders had racked up 12 or more runs & over 10 hits. Sophomore designated hitter Brian Klein plated the first three runs behind a pair of homers, then the rest of the Red Raiders bats followed suit with two more dingers & nine runs to cap the day.
- Over the weekend, Tech squared off with UTSA, posting back-to-back shutouts in the opening contests by scores of 5-0 & 3-0. Then, Tech capped the sweep with a 10-6 victory on Monday.
- Junior right-handed pitcher Ryan Shetter will get the start on Tuesday against the Vaqueros. The Friendswood native started for the Red Raiders on Feb. 20 against New Mexico State and tossed a gem, throwing 6.0 scoreless frames. He allowed just one hit, did not issue a walk and struck out nine batters, including the first four Aggies he faced.
- Over the last four games, the Red Raider pitching staff put together a school record 37.0 innings without allowing a run. The previous most was 29.0 over Feb. 17-21, 2015.
- Sophomore & freshman outfielders Grant Little & Kurt Wilson have posted two-hit games in each of the last two contests.
- The three-straight shutouts against New Mexico State & UTSA (Feb. 20-25) was the first time since 2014 during the NCAA Regional & Super Regional play against Miami & College of Charleston.
- The Red Raiders check in at No. 3 in the latest set of rankings by D1 Baseball, NCBWA & the USA Today Coaches Poll.
- Tech is 8-0 to begin the season for the first time since 1996, when that Red Raider squad began the year 9-0.
- This is the first meeting between the Red Raiders and the Vaqueros since 2009
- The Red Raiders have won each of the last five meetings but trail the all-time series, 18-20.

- The last loss against UTRGV came on March 14, 2000, a 6-5 heartbreaker
- Head Coach Tim Tadlock has never squared off with UTRGV as head coach of the Red Raiders
- The Red Raiders are 69-20 all-time against members of the WAC
- It's the second time this season Tech has played a member of the WAC, defeating New Mexico State on Feb. 20, 12-0.

THE ARTIST FORMERLY KNOWN AS...

- The last time the Red Raiders faced UTRGV, they went by the name UT-Pan American
- UTRGV heads into Tuesday's game with a 5-3 overall record
- The Vaqueros have not left the confines of UTRGV Baseball Stadium yet this season
- UTRGV has wins over Central Michigan & Stephen F. Austin, coming in the Al Ogletree Classic to begin the year, as well as a victory over Illinois-Chicago.
- The Vaqueros were set to face Mississippi State on Tuesday but had to call off the game due to heavy fog.
- UTRGV recently came off a 2-1 series loss to Illinois-Chicago over the weekend, dropping the first two games, 4-3 & 14-3, before picking up a win in the series finale, 9-4.
- Elijah Alexander leads the Vaqueros with a .429 batting average in eight games & seven starts
- Alexander also paces the team with 12 hits, including a homer, five RBI and seven runs
- Tyler Torres has driven in the most runs this season with six RBI, while Ivan Estrella has scored the most with nine in 2018
- The Vaqueros are expected to start Trevelle Hill against the Red Raiders on Tuesday.
- Hill has pitched in three games this season, starting one, posting five strikeouts & two walks over 7.2 innings pitched. He's allowed just four hits and the first run he gives up will be the first of the season for Hill

- The Red Raiders moved up to No. 4 in the CB Newspaper release this week
- Tech remained the same in the other three polls released so far this week. Two polls have yet to be released by their outlets.
- Texas Tech started the season with its highest collection of preseason rankings in program history.
- It is the highest Tech has been ranked in each preseason poll, while matching Baseball America's No. 5 from 2015.
- This is the fourth-straight year where the Red Raiders have started their season ranked in a preseason poll.
- It is only the second time under Tadlock Tech has been ranked in all six polls to begin the year.
- Last year, the Red Raiders were ranked as high as No. 14 to start the year by D1 Baseball, and was not ranked by one outlet.
- As the year progressed, Tech spent 11 weeks as a unanimous top-10 squad, reaching as high as No. 2 by the Coaches poll (March 27).
- In the final RPI poll of the year, Tech was ranked fourth.
- Tech was awarded the No. 5 National Seed by the NCAA Selection Committee for the Tournament for the second-straight season in 2017.
- The Red Raiders ended the year as high as No. 7 by Perfect Game, capturing the program's second consecutive top-10 rank to end the year.
- Tech has been ranked No. 1 just three times in the program history, all happening in 1997 from April 14-28 by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper.

Texas Tech sophomore infielder Josh Jung was placed on the Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Award Watch List earlier this week. It is the same award that Hunter Hargrove won last year, in its inaugural year. Last year, Jung hit .306 in 62 games, with 75 hits, 43 RBI, 55 runs and 24 multi-hit games.



NICE

2018 marks the 69th edition of Texas Tech baseball in Lubbock. The Red Raider program began in 1926 and lasted four years before going on hiatus until 1954. A total of 2,961 games have been played in the school's history, as Tech has amassed a 1,674-1279-8 overall record with 43 winning seasons. Tech has been historically good at home, putting together a 1,081-491-5 clip in Lubbock.

SHETTER'S FULL

Junior right-handed pitcher Ryan Shetter got the start for the Red Raiders and tossed a gem, throwing 6.0 scoreless frames. The Friendswood native allowed just one hit, did not issue a walk and struck out nine batters, including the first four Aggies he faced. It was the third-most strikeouts he's recorded in a game during his Tech career & the 14th time he's held his opponent scoreless. In 2017, he posted 10 strikeouts against California (2/25) and 11 against Kansas (5/19), the latter earning him Big 12 Pitcher of the Week honors.

WEEKEND ROTATION

Tadlock handed the ball over to a pair of juniors, sandwiched with a sophomore in the middle for this weekend's rotation against UTSA. On Friday, the Red Raiders will hand the ball over to right-handed pitcher Davis Martin, who started the season opener for Tech, while RHP John McMillon and lefty Erikson Lanning get the nods on Saturday and Sunday, respectively. Martin & McMillon both picked up wins during the opening weekend after each tossing 5.0 frames in their respective outings. Both men enter the weekend with a 1.80 ERA after allowing one earned run each, as Martin struck out four & McMillon punched out seven. Lanning had a rougher go, tossing 2.2 innings, giving up six runs, four earned, on five hits & striking out two. Saturday was McMillon's first career start, after coming out of the bullpen for 24 appearances during his freshman season in 2017.

TECH DIGS THE LONG BALL

Tuesday's four home run downpour was the second game this season the Red Raiders had sent four long balls over the fence at Rip Griffin Park. Against the Aggies, sophomore infielder Brian Klein rattled off two homers, a solo in the 3rd and a two-run blast in the fifth to put the first three runs for the Red Raiders on the board. The fifth inning featured three two-run home runs, as sophomore outfielder Grant Little and freshman outfielder Kurt Wilson joined the HR party with their own blasts. Three days earlier, Tech blasted four homers in the opening frame, with freshman infielder Gabe Holt getting it rolling with a solo bomb, followed by a two-run blast from Little, another solo shot from junior infielder Cameron Warren and a two-run homer from senior infielder Michael Davis. Tech has 11 homers so far this season through five games. Last year, the Red Raiders finished with 60 dingers over 62 contests.

SCORING IN BUNCHES

The Red Raiders have scored at least three runs in a single inning in every game this season, with three sitting at the low end of the spectrum. In the first contest, Tech posted a three-run third inning on their way to a 4-2 victory over Maine. Game two featured a three-run second frame, with a five-spot in the eighth inning to roll to a 12-1 win over the Black Bears. Games 3 & 4 featured nine-run onslaughts, doing so in the first inning of game three & in the second frame of the series finale, while also throwing down a three-run seventh & a six-run eighth to win, 21-6. Against the Aggies, Tech opened up the scoring in the fifth with a six-run frame, followed by five in the eighth to blank New Mexico State, 12-0.

STRONG START, STRONG FINISH

Through five games this season, Tech is scoring early to apply pressure and late to cap a successful day at the plate. The Red Raiders have scored a combined 22 runs in the first two innings & 22 runs in the seventh & eighth innings, including an impressive 16 runs in the eighth frame. On the flip side, Tech has allowed just one run in the opening two frames and two in the last two. The only frame the Red Raiders have yet to score in is the ninth, due to playing at home and leading going into the final frame. So far this season, Tech is outscoring their opponents, 61-14.

#AWARDSZN

One weekend down and the Red Raiders have already racked up two Big 12 weekly awards. Sophomore infielder Josh Jung won Big 12 Player of the Week, while freshman infielder Gabe Holt earned Big 12 Newcomer of the Week honors. It's the first honor of each kind for both Red Raider student-athletes. The duo's accolades marks the second-straight year Tech has won Player & Newcomer of the Week awards after the opening weekend, as Jung earned Newcomer & Hunter Hargrove earned Player accolades after

Any media entity collecting any sort of "video or audio materials" (film, traditional video or audio, digital video or audio, photos, etc.) from Texas Tech University Athletics game events or press conference/media events may use that material only for traditional television newscasts, Web-based or print coverage, or other electronic transmission as approved by the University in writing, with a limitation of up to three (3) minutes in length from any single event. Such media entity may not offer any live video, audio or other coverage of the event without the advance, written permission of Texas Tech University Athletics.

This policy includes all games, matches and events involving any of Texas Tech's athletic programs. It includes all media events -- press conferences, pre/post-practice interviews and pre/post-game interviews. An exception would be a one-on-one interview arranged through the Texas Tech Athletics Communications office with a Texas Tech, coach, athlete or administrator.

the 2017 season-kickoff trip to Starkville against Western Illinois & Mississippi State. Last weekend, Jung racked up 10 hits, the most of any Big 12 player, while Holt tallied eight knocks, the most of any freshman, as the two put together three and two multi-hit games, respectively.

#NEEDSHITFORCYCLE

Last season, the Red Raiders came on knock away from hitting for the cycle on five different occasions. After the first weekend of action, two different student-athletes have been one hit shy of accomplishing the feat. The Big 12 Player & Newcomer of the Week both needed triples to become the first Red Raider since Chris Richburg against New Mexico State on April 23, 2008. Jung's happened on Opening Day, as he hit a double, a single & a homer in his first three at-bats. Holt opened Saturday's second game of the doubleheader with a home run & a double in the first inning, then a single in the seventh. He would get his triple the next day in his first at-bat of the finale against the Black Bears.

BEAN BALL

Junior infielder Cameron Warren had one of the most interesting weekends in college baseball over Feb. 16-18. The Midwest City, Oklahoma, native went 4-for-8 at the plate with a homer, three RBI and four runs scored, but it was the rest of his line that catches the eye. Warren was walked four times, one intentionally, and was hit-by-a-pitch on six different trips to the plate. Included in those six were four HBP in the series finale against the Black Bears, making him the first Red Raider to get hit four times in a single game. On top of that, Tech tallied 18 free passes on Sunday, with 10 walks, while only dropping 17 hits in the contest. So far this season, the Red Raiders have been hit 22 times, which leads the NCAA, and walked 36 times, which ranks second in the country.

THE BULLPEN IS FINE

The Texas Tech bullpen put together a nice showing over the four-game set against the Black Bears. Thirteen pitchers made appearances against Maine, allowing a combined five runs over 21.1 innings of work, whiel striking out 21 Black Bears.

2018 ROSTER BREAKDOWN

The 2018 squad is made up of 35 student-athletes ready to don the scarlet & black uniforms on Friday. This year's senior class consists of five guys: Outfielder Connor Beck, infielder Michael Davis, LHP Dylan Dusek, RHP Jose Quezada and infielder Zach Rheams. Eight juniors, 12 sophomores and 10 freshmen make up the rest of this year's group. Three of 13 newcomers arrived to Lubbock as non-freshmen in: junior catcher Zayne Willems & sophomore pitchers Dane Haveman (LHP) & Connor Queen (RHP).

SENIOR CLASS

Tech's five seniors are mix of guys who have been in Lubbock for their entirety of their collegiate careers and players who have transferred in from other squads. Michael Davis & Dylan Dusek have been Tech's two mainstays, with Dusek being at Tech longer than most as a fifth-year senior. Dusek is the only member of Tech's roster to have been to both College World Series trips in the program's history (2014 & 2016). Last season, Connor Beck, Jose Quezada & Zach Rheams transferred to Texas Tech, coming from all over the state to don a Red Raider uniform.

WEALTH OF EXPERIENCE RETURNS

Despite losing several household names to the 2017 MLB Draft & graduating class, Tech returns several student-athletes who have seen a lot of college baseball & picked up some nice accolades along the way:

Texas Tech junior left-handed pitcher Steven Gingery got all of the preseason love after a phenomenal sophomore campaign. A 10-1 record with 1.58 ERA & 107 strikeouts has landed him on six preseason All-America lists, as well as the USA Baseball Golden Spikes Award Watch list.

PRESEASON FAVORITE

For the first time since 1999, the Red Raiders were picked to win the Big 12 after a preseason vote by the league's coaches. The Red Raiders received 61 points after a vote by the conference coaches, with five first-place votes. Tech topped the poll for the first time since 1999 after claiming back-to-back conference crowns in 2016 & 2017. The 1999 ranking was the first conducted by the Big 12 coaches. Tech has been chosen in the top five in each of the last four preseason rankings. Last season, the Red Raiders were picked third in the league, with a No. 2 spot in 2016 and fourth in 2015. The Red Raiders return 22 letterwinners from last year's squad, a team that posted a 45-17 overall record, clinched the program's sixth conference title in school history and second consecutive Big 12 crown. Tech also earned its second-straight No. 5 national seed for the NCAA Tournament, capping 2017 as high as seventh in the end-of-year polls.

ANOTHER TOUGH SCHEDULE AWAITS

Tadlock has consistently put together one of the toughest schedules in the country, and this year will be no different. The 56-game slate includes 31 contests against 2017 NCAA Tournament teams, including three NCAA Regional hosts, three Super Regional teams, two national seeds and two College World Series teams. The Red Raiders will play all three Super Regional squads on the road, beginning with Kentucky (March 9-11), followed by College World Series teams Louisville (March 13-14) and TCU (April 27-29). Texas Tech, coming off its second-straight Big 12 championship and back-to-back years as an NCAA National Seed, will square off with six different conference champions in 2018 for a total of 19 games. With the release of the preseason rankings, Tech will play 10 different opponents ranked in at least one of the polls this year. The Red Raiders are one of eight squads to play 10 or more ranked teams, which is the fifth-most of any program this season and is the second-most in the Big 12. Of those eight squads with 10 or more, the Red Raiders will play four of those teams in 2018.

WHAMMER

Sophomore John McMillon got his first crack in a starting pitching slot on Saturday, as he's was tabbed to take the mound in game three of the series. McMillon picked up preseason All-America utility honors by Collegiate Baseball Newspaper after putting together a 1.75 ERA & five saves last season, while also cracking eight dingers at the plate. In his first start, he picked up the victory after going 5.0 innings, giving up two hits and two runs, one earned, while walking four & striking out seven.

Tim Tadlock embarks on his sixth season as the head coach at Texas Tech after his program earned its second-straight Big 12 championship in 2017.

Tadlock, the 2014 College Baseball Hall of Fame National Coach of the Year, was named head coach of his alma mater on June 8, 2012, becoming the ninth head coach in program history. Tadlock will enter his 26th year in collegiate baseball in 2018. He owns a collegiate career record of 629-239 in 14 years as a head coach with nine seasons at Grayson County College (435-127) and five at Texas Tech (194-112).

Tech recorded back-to-back Big 12 titles after putting together a 45-17 record on the diamond in 2017, with a 16-8 record in league play. For the second-straight year, the Red Raiders earned the No. 5 National Seed in the NCAA Tournament, which capped off 13 consecutive sellout crowds at Rip Griffin Park to end the season.

Tadlock's squad picked up multiple All-America accolades, as well as conference recognition. Steven Gingery became the first unanimous first team All-American in program history, while also earning Big 12 Pitcher of the Year and National Pitcher of the Year.

Hunter Hargrove, an All-American by Collegiate Baseball, received Big 12 Player of the Year honors and Josh Jung, a freshman All-American by three different outlets, garnered Big 12 Freshman of the Year accolades. Grant Little also picked up three freshman All-America bids for his 2017 performance.

The Red Raiders posted their second 45+ win season under Tadlock in 2016, going 47-20 overall, the third-most wins in the program record books. Tech earned its fifth conference title in school history after tallying a 19-5 Big 12 mark and advanced to the College World Series for the second time in three years. In Omaha, the Red Raiders recorded their first CWS victory in Tech history after defeating No. 1 Florida, 3-2, in an elimination game.

For the first time in program history, the Red Raiders were awarded a national seed for the NCAA Tournament, checking in at No. 5 to set up Lubbock Regional action at Dan Law Field at Rip Griffin Park. A two-run double and a walk-off pickoff helped Tech move past Dallas Baptist and welcome in East Carolina for Super Regional play. After a 13-inning thriller in game two, the Red Raiders ran past ECU with an 11-0 victory in a record crowd of 4,817 in the finale to punch their ticket to Omaha.

Facing elimination, Tech turned in a strong performance against the top-ranked team in the country, Florida, and picked up a 3-2 win for Tech's first-ever victory at the College World Series. The Red Raiders ended the year ranked fourth in the final poll of the 2016 season, their highest ever in program history.

Tadlock and the Red Raiders completed the biggest turnaround in school history and the second biggest turnaround in Big 12 history, going from 26 wins in 2013 to 45 wins in 2014. The season culminated with Texas Tech's first trip to the College World Series in Omaha.

Tadlock was named the ABCA Midwest Region Coach of the Year as well as the Skip Bertman National Coach of the Year while guiding the Red Raiders to their best season in school history with a 45-21 overall mark and 14-10 Big 12 record. Tech posted just the sixth 40-win regular season in school history while claiming its first-ever NCAA Regional title at the Coral Gables Regional hosted by No. 3 nationally-ranked Miami (Fla.). Tech won the regional with three wins, two of them coming against Miami on its home field.

Tech finished 31-24 overall in Tadlock's third season in 2015, marking the first time since 2005-06 where the Red Raiders have posted consecutive 30-win seasons. The Red Raiders completed Big 12 play at 13-11 overall, securing a tie for third place in the conference standings, Tech's highest finish since the 2004 season. It was also the second-straight season where Tech has finished among the top four in the Big 12 standings, a first for the Red Raiders since the 2001 and 2002 seasons.

Tadlock returned to his alma mater for the 2012 season as the program's associate head coach and recruiting coordinator following six successful seasons as an assistant coach/recruiting coordinator at Oklahoma. Tadlock produced several of the nation's top recruiting classes while an assistant coach at Oklahoma, helping lead the Sooners back to the College World Series in 2010, the Sooners first trip to Omaha since 1995.

After beginning his college coaching career as an assistant at Hill College (1993-96) for four seasons, Tadlock became the head coach at Grayson County Junior College, where he led the Vikings to back-to-back National Junior College Athletic Association World Series titles in 1999 and 2000. During his nine seasons at Grayson, Tadlock posted a 435-127 (.774) overall record while being named National Coach of the Year following both title runs (1999-2000).

After a prep career at Denton High School and two years at Hill College, Tadlock was a two-year starting shortstop for the Red Raiders while helping Texas Tech to its first-ever 40-win season as a senior in 1991 (42-18). Tadlock graduated with his bachelor's degree in physical education from Texas Tech in May 1992. He also earned a master's degree in education in August 1994 from the University of Texas at Tyler.

Tadlock and his wife, Kelly, have two children, daughter, Chloe (16), and son, Benjamin (14).

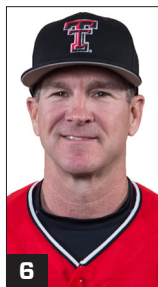
