GETTING STARTED

- · Today's weather at kickoff: 64 degrees, 5-10 winds and sunny.
- Kansas won the coin toss and elected to defer to the second half. Texas Tech started the game with the ball.
- Today's game was televised by Big 12 Now on ESPN+. All seven games in 2021 have been on the ESPN family of networks.
- Today's game marked the 23rd all-time meeting between Texas Tech and Kansas, and the 19th time as Big 12 foes.
- Today's game was the Red Raiders' fourth Big 12 conference game of 2021, and third road game in that stretch.
- Texas Tech wore red helmets, white jerseys and red pants against Kansas. The last time the Red Raiders wore this combination was against Kansas State on Nov. 17, 2016.
- Today's game captains were DaMarcus Fields, Caleb Rogers and Colin Schooler.
- · As part of Texas Tech's pregame entrance, Devin Drew carried the U.S. flag, Riko Jeffers ran out with the state of Texas flag.
- Today's attendance: 25.106.

TEXAS TECH'S WIN...

- Gives Texas Tech a 5-2 overall record in 2021 its best start since 2018.
- Gives Texas Tech a 21-2 all-time record against Kansas.
- Gives Texas Tech a 17-2 all-time record against Kansas in Big 12 games.
- Gives Texas Tech an 11-1 mark in games played against Kansas at Kansas Memorial Stadium.
- Gives Texas Tech back-to-back Big 12 road wins for the first time since 2018.
- Gives Matt Wells a career record of 13-16 at Texas Tech.
- Gives Matt Wells a 57-50 career record all-time as a head coach.
- Gives Matt Wells a 2-1 career record all-time against Kansas.

TEXAS TECH'S TEAM NOTES

- · Texas Tech's first four scores were on the ground on Saturday, following up seven-straight rushing touchdowns entering the game.
 - Tech scored via the passing game with a 2-yard TD pass to Travis Koontz in the third quarter its' fifth trip to the end zone on Saturday breaking the streak of 11 consecutive Red Raider rushing TDs.
- · Texas Tech scored on its opening drive for the second time this season its first time since hosting SFA in the home opener.
- · Texas Tech pitched a first half shutout for the second time in the last three games (at West Virginia/at Kansas).
- Of Tech's four rushing touchdowns none were recorded by a running back (QB Colombi, QB Smith, WR Ezukanma, WR Price).
- Ten different Red Raiders rushed the football among their season-high 42 attempts for a season-high 244 rushing yards (most rushing yards since 2020 contest against Oklahoma State 255).
- Texas Tech started its' third different offensive line combination in game No. 7 of the season Landon Peterson received his first start, and Josh Burger moved to center.
- Tech went 9-for-11 on third downs (81.8 percent) its' best percentage of the season which included zero three-and-outs.
- Texas Tech picked up its seventh interception of the season thanks to Taylor-Demerson's second of the year. Tech owns eight takeaways this season 7 INT, 1 FR.
- Kansas' quarterback Jason Bean, who entered the game leading KU in rushing yards was limited to 14 yards rushing.
- Texas Tech was held without a sack. KU has surrendered just one sack in its last four games.
- Tech went a perfect 6-for-6 on trips to the red zone and improved to 29-of-31 for the season.
- In Texas Tech's five victories, the defense is allowing only 19.6 points, 80.4 rushing yards and 313.6 yards total offense.
- The Red Raiders' defense matched a season-high of seven pass breaks up TTU first recorded seven against SFA.
- Tech tied a school record of committing just one penalty in the contest the fifth time there was just one penalty looking back to games: vs. Arkansas (1988), Rice (1991), Texas A&M (1992) & TCU (2016).

NOTING THE RED RAIDERS

- · Henry Colombi recorded his second rushing touchdown of 2021, and fifth of his career to open the scoring on Saturday.
- · Dadrion Taylor-Demerson registered his second INT of the season in the second quarter. He leads the team with two on the season.
- · Jonathan Garibay improved to 9-for-9 this season a 28-yard field goal and matched his career-long with a 48-yard field goal.
- Erik Ezukanma recorded his first career rushing touchdown in the second quarter on a 9-yard jet sweep. It's his second touchdown of the season looking back to his 75-yard receiving TD against SFA.
- · Myles Price recorded his second career rushing touchdown. His first career score on the ground also came against Kansas, a 70-yard burst in the 2020 contest.
- Tyree Wilson logged a career-high 2.0 TFLs.
- Donovan Smith rushed for a five-yard touchdown his second rushing TD of the season on the ground.
- Donovan Smith recorded his first career passing attempts and completions he was 4-of-5 for 70 yards.
- Landon Peterson logged the first start of his career.
