SATURDAY STORYLINES



TECH SEARCHING FOR BOWL ELIGIBILITY

- Texas Tech, fresh off its third victory away from home this season, returns to Jones AT&T Stadium this Saturday to host Kansas State. The Red Raiders will be looking for a return to bowl eligibility with a win over the Wildcats, who have won five straight in the series and nine of the last 10 overall, including a 31-21 victory a year ago.
- With a win, the Red Raiders can become bowl eligible in the month of October for the first time since 2013 when Texas Tech won its first seven games to start the season. It would mark the 39th all-time bowl appearance in school history, which ranks among the top-25 leaders in NCAA history.



THIS WEEK'S MESSAGE: STACK SUCCESS

- Matt Wells stated immediately after the Kansas win that the Red Raiders' goal moving forward would be to "stack success." Thus, winning two conference games in a row - a feat the Red Raiders haven't done in Big 12 play since 2018 - would be the top goal in that message this week.
- The Red Raiders are coming off back-to-back Big 12 road wins for the first time since 2018 after Texas Tech routed Kansas, 41-14, this past weekend. Tech will look to duplicate that success at home now where the Red Raiders are 42-17 against unranked non-conference opponents since the Big 12 was formed in 1996.



RUNNING GAME POWERING OFFENSE

- Texas Tech fans are used to an explosive offense but it's come in a different way this season as the Red Raiders have been effective on the ground. In the Kansas win alone, Tech used 10 different rushers en route to a season-high 244 rushing yards against the Jayhawks as the Red Raiders found the end zone four times - all by players not listed as a running back.
- The Red Raiders enter this weekend having scored 11 of their last 12 touchdowns via the ground as Texas Tech is averaging 168.3 rushing yards per game. If the season ended today, that average would rank as the second-highest clip for the Red Raiders dating back to 2000.

TEAM NOTEBOOK

RED RAIDERS LOOK TO END DROUGHT AGAINST K-STATE

- Texas Tech and Kansas State will meet for the 22nd time Saturday in a back-and-forth series that currently has the Wildcats at a 12-9 all-time advantage. The Wildcats enter this weekend having won nine of the past 10 meetings, including a 31-21 victory last season in Manhattan. The Red Raiders had won five-consecutive games against K-State before the Wildcats' string of success began in 2011.
- The Red Raiders' lone win during that eight-year stretch came in 2015 when **DeAndre Washington** rushed for a career-high 248 yards and three touchdowns in a 59-44 victory in Lubbock. Washington became the first Red Raider to rush for at least 200 yards since **Shaud Williams** did so against Colorado in 1999 as it was the seventh-highest rushing total in school history. **Patrick Mahomes** also threw for 248 yards and three touchdowns in that win.
- Over the course of its current five-game losing streak against the Wildcats, Texas Tech has dropped three of those games by only one possession. The Red Raiders are 1-5 all-time in games determined by seven points or less versus the Wildcats.
- The two schools have only met three times outside of Big 12 play with the first coming in a 6-0 victory by the Red Raiders in 1933. The two schools also played in Lubbock during the 1963 and 1986 seasons, both Texas Tech victories.

TEXAS TECH-KANSAS STATE CONNECTIONS

- Kansas State defensive tackles coach **Mike Tuiasosopo** was on staff at Utah State in 1996 during **Matt Wells'** final year as an Aggie student-athlete. That season was the first of four for Tuiasosopo as Utah State's defensive line coach where the Aggies claimed the Big West Conference title.
- Texas Tech associate head coach and special teams coordinator **Mark Tommerdahl** and Kansas State defensive ends coach **Buddy Wyatt** both worked together early in their career at Minnesota in 1995. Tommerdahl was the special teams and tight ends coach and oversaw the Golden Gophers' recruiting efforts, while Wyatt was in his fourth and final year as Minnesota's defensive line coach.
- Wyatt later worked with Texas Tech defensive line coach **Paul Randolph** for three seasons at Alabama from 2003-05 where they both worked with the Crimson Tide defensive line. He left the Alabama staff prior to the 2007 season to take the same role at Nebraska where he worked under current Texas Tech linebackers coach **Kevin Cosgrove**, who was the Huskers' defensive coordinator at the time.
- Kansas State cornerbacks coach **Van Malone** has worked with a handful of the Texas Tech staff, including with Tommerdahl at Texas A&M from 2006-07 as well as Randolph and defensive coordinator **Keith Patterson** at Tulsa in 2010. Malone was the secondary coach at both stops as he eventually worked under Patterson for one season when he was the co-defensive coordinator. Randolph was also on that Tulsa staff as the executive senior associate head coach and co-defensive coordinator in charge of the defensive line.
- Texas Tech tight ends and inside receivers coach **Luke Wells** and Kansas State offensive coordinator **Courtney Messingham** worked side by side for four seasons at Iowa State (2009-12). Wells was the wide receivers coach his first two seasons at Ames with Messingham as the tight ends coach before the two switched roles in 2011 with Messingham adding passing game coordinator duties. Messingham was named Iowa State's offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach the following year in 2012.
- Texas Tech outside receivers coach **Joel Filani** put together possibly the best game of his playing career versus Kansas State in 2005 as the then-junior hauled in 10 catches for a single-game school record 255 receiving yards in a 59-20 rout. Filani's single-game record was later snapped in 2018 when **Antoine Welsey** totaled 261 yards through the air against Houston.
- Texas Tech Director of Athletics **Kirby Hocutt** was a four-year letterman at linebacker at Kansas State where he led the Big 8 Conference in tackles as a junior in 1993. Hocutt, who was elected captain his senior year under legendary K-State head coach **Bill Snyder**, was named to the All-Big 8 Conference team following his junior season. The Sporting News selected him in 1993 as one of the nation's top-20 "most underrated" players. He earned his degree in political science from Kansas State in 1995.

CAREER NOTABLES VERSUS THE WILDCATS

- **Henry Colombi** made his Red Raider debut a year ago against Kansas State, coming off the bench to complete 30-of-42 passes for 244 yards and a pair of touchdowns while also rushing eight times for 40 yards. His 30 completions and 42 passing attempts remain a career-high for Colombi, who helped the Red Raiders rally from a 14-point halftime deficit to take the lead in the fourth quarter.
- **Erik Ezukanma** has combined for eight receptions for 146 yards and a touchdown over his career against Kansas State. He found the end zone in the 2019 contest versus the Wildcats as he scored on a 21-yard strike midway through the third quarter.
- **Adrian Frye** has recorded two of his seven career interceptions against the Wildcats and Kansas State quarterback Skyler Thompson. Frye's interception in the 2018 meeting between the two schools marked his fifth of the season as he eventually earned Freshman All-America accolades. Frye's interception in 2019 came with only 6:53 remaining in the game as the Red Raiders capitalized with a 58-yard touchdown pass to **RJ Turner** on the ensuing possession to cut K-State's lead to three points.
- **Riko Jeffers** notched 11 tackles against Kansas State in 2018, marking the second of what is now four career games with double-digit tackles. His 11 tackles at the time matched a career-high. He also matched his career-high with 2.0 tackles for a loss in the 2019 meeting, which included his fifth career sack. Jeffers has 25 career tackles versus the Wildcats despite being limited in last year's contest.
- Kansas State has been a favorite for **Travis Koontz** over his nearly three years as a Red Raider as he has caught five of his 12 career receptions against the Wildcats. He has totaled 64 receiving yards over those two games, including 39 a year ago.

- **SaRodorick Thompson** carried 21 times for 84 yards and a touchdown in 2019 versus Kansas State, while also adding seven receptions for 28 yards in the close loss. His seven receptions marked a career-high as he finished with 112 all-purpose yards. He added 12 carries for 46 yards in the 2020 contest, giving him 133 carries for 130 yards and a touchdown over his career against the Wildcats.
- **Xavier White** notched the first 100-yard rushing game of his career in the 2020 battle between the two schools as he carried only 12 times for 113 yards and a touchdown. White recorded the bulk of his yardage in the second half as he found the end zone via a 49-yard scamper late in the third quarter that cut Kansas State's lead to 17-14.
- Since moving to a wide-open passing offense in 2000, Texas Tech has thrown for at least 300 yards in 14 of the 16 meetings against Kansas State with the lone exception coming in 2018 and 2020.

BOWL ELIGIBILITY IN REACH FOR RED RAIDERS

- The Red Raiders will look to secure bowl eligibility for the first time since 2017 Saturday against Kansas State. The Red Raiders, one of the most frequent bowl participants in college football history, are looking to avoid their first four-year bowl absence since staying home from postseason play over eight consecutive seasons from 1978-85. This is currently the longest Texas Tech has gone without a bowl season since missing the postseason from 1990-92.
- A victory over Kansas State would improve the Red Raiders to 6-2 overall, marking their best start to a season since 2013 when Texas Tech was 7-1 through eight games. It would mark the seventh time in the Big 12 era where Texas Tech has started a season at 6-2 overall or better as the Red Raiders had similar starts in 1998 (6-2), 2005 (7-1), 2007 (6-2), 2008 (8-0), 2012 (6-2) and 2013 (7-1). The Red Raiders finished with eight or more wins in five of those six seasons previously.
- This is the 14th time during the Big 12 era where the Red Raiders have started a season at 5-2 overall. Of the previous 13 occasions, Texas Tech has reached a bowl game in 11 of those seasons with the two exceptions coming in 2011 and 2018.
- Texas Tech entered this season ranked tied for 21st all-time with 38 career bowl appearances, matching the totals of fellow Big 12 member TCU as well as Ole Miss, BYU and Notre Dame. The Red Raiders are tied for third among current Big 12 members for bowl appearances, trailing only Texas (57) and Oklahoma (54).

THERE'S A LACK OF YELLOW ON THE FIELD NOW

- Since being named Texas Tech's head coach, **Matt Wells** has preached discipline in eliminating penalties. That goal has come to fruition this season as the Red Raiders are among the least penalized teams in college football, ranking 20th nationally and third in the Big 12 for both fewest penalties per game (5.0) and fewest penalty yards per game (43.0).
- Texas Tech was flagged only one time for five yards at Kansas as the false start penalty in the fourth quarter pushed Jonathan Garibay back for a 48-yard field goal attempt. It marked a school-record fifth time the Red Raiders were only penalized one time as Texas Tech also had only one flag in 1988 versus Arkansas, 1991 versus Rice, 1992 against Texas A&M and 2016 at TCU. Texas Tech's school record for fewest penalty yards also came in three of those games previously with the lone exception being the 1991 contest with Rice.
- The performance against Kansas followed similar disciplined approaches against both West Virginia (2 penalties, 20 yards) and TCU (4 penalties, 25 yards) where the Red Raiders combined for only six flags for 45 yards. Texas Tech has been flagged seven times for 50 yards in its last three games alone.
- Texas Tech has now recorded four games under **Matt Wells** where the Red Raiders have had 20 or fewer penalty yards (2020 vs. West Virginia, 2020 vs. Texas, 2021 at West Virginia, 2021 at Kansas). The Red Raiders are a combined 3-1 in those games.
- Under **Matt Wells**, Texas Tech is averaging 6.1 penalties and 54.1 penalty yards per game, a drastic improvement from the 7.8 penalties and 69.4 penalty yards per game the Red Raiders averaged from 2000-18.

RANDOM TIDBITS HEADING INTO KANSAS STATE

- The win over Kansas marked Texas Tech's third on the road, or at a neutral site this season. Its most in a season since 2017 when the Red Raiders headed home with victories over Houston, Kansas, Baylor (AT&T Stadium - Arlington) and Texas. The Red Raiders only have two remaining road games at Oklahoma (Oct. 30) and at Baylor (Nov. 27) to close the season.
- Both of Texas Tech's conference wins this season have come on the road as the Red Raiders traveled to top both West Virginia and Kansas in recent weeks. It marks the first time Tech has secured back-to-back Big 12 road wins since 2018 when the Red Raiders opened their league slate with a 41-17 rout of No. 15 Oklahoma State and then followed with a 17-14 victory at TCU. Tech has not won three-straight Big 12 road games since 2008 when the Red Raiders topped Kansas State, Texas A&M and Kansas.
- The injury bug has plagued the Red Raiders in recent weeks as 14 members of Texas Tech's two-deep have missed a game over the last three weeks, a list that includes two of its three All-Big 12 preseason selections in wide receiver **Erik Ezukanma** (WVU) and center **Dawson Deaton** (WVU, KU). Tech has also missed **DaMarcus Fields** (WVU), **Tyler Shough** (all three games), **Adrian Frye** (KU), **Tony Bradford Jr.** (KU), **Marquis Waters** (out for season), **Malik Dunlap** (WVU, TCU), **J.J. Sparkman** (all three games), **T.J. Storment** (KU), **Reggie Pearson Jr.** (TCU), **Kosi Eldridge** (TCU, KU), **Troy Te'o** (KU) and **Tahj Brooks** (all three games) during that stretch.
- This is only the fourth time in the Big 12 era where Texas Tech has faced the two Sunflower State schools in Kansas and Kansas in back-to-back weeks. The Red Raiders previously did so in 2000, 2001 and 2016, splitting the two games in each of those three years.
- Texas Tech enters this weekend with a 42-17 record against unranked conference opponents at home during the Big 12 era.
- **Matt Wells** is an impressive 36-15 over his career in home games (.706 winning percentage) after going 27-7 over his season seasons at Utah State and then 9-6 so far during his Texas Tech tenure. The Red Raiders were 4-2 at home a year ago, marking its first winning season at home since 2015.
- Tell us if you've heard this before: the Red Raiders will be facing another one of the nation's top kick returners in Kansas State's Malik Knowles, who enters this weekend averaging 36.0 yards per return. Knowles leads the Big 12 and ranks second in the FBS for kick return average. The Red Raiders have faced similar elite returners in recent weeks as Tech limited West Virginia returner Winston Wright to only 36 yards on three kickoffs, while J.D. Spielmans of TCU and Kansas' Kenny Logan Jr. failed to even make a return. All three players entered the matchup with Texas Tech ranked among the top-15 kick returners in the country at the time.
- The Red Raiders have been successful in stopping opposing kick returners all season as Texas Tech leads the Big 12 and ranks 25th nationally, allowing only 17.7 yards per kick return. Kickoff specialist **Trey Wolff** has allowed only 14 returns all season thanks to 30 touchbacks on 46 attempts (65.2 percent).

- Despite its 5-2 record, the Red Raiders have only led after the first quarter in two of those wins at West Virginia and Kansas. **Matt Wells** is 40-15 for his career and 9-4 during his time at Texas Tech when his teams lead after the opening quarter.
- This is Texas Tech's second 11 a.m. kickoff of the season and the ninth under **Matt Wells**. The Red Raiders, who had previously had a 6 p.m. start to each of their first three home games this season, are 2-2 in early starts inside Jones AT&T Stadium since Wells was named head coach prior to the 2019 season with wins over No. 16 Oklahoma State in 2019 and then Kansas in 2020.

CLOSE WINS TURNING FOR THE RED RAIDERS

- After struggling to finish out tight games in **Matt Wells'** debut season in 2019, the Red Raiders have turned the tide in one-possession games as the West Virginia victory marked Texas Tech's sixth win since the start of the 2020 season in games determined by eight points or less. The Red Raiders are 6-2 in one-possession games during that span, which includes four Big 12 wins over West Virginia (twice), Baylor and Kansas.
- The results from the past two seasons are a change for the better from 2019 when Texas Tech dropped four games during Big 12 play alone by three points or less. Prior to that season, the Red Raiders had not lost four games by three or less points since 1985.

TEXAS TECH KNOWS OFFENSE

- One thing is certain when watching Texas Tech – the Red Raiders are going to find their way onto the scoreboard. Tech is currently riding a consecutive-game scoring streak that spans 298 games dating back to the 1997 season. The streak, which began against Texas A&M on Oct. 25, 1997, ranks eighth nationally and is the third-longest active streak in the Big 12 behind TCU and Oklahoma.

SCORING IN A VARIETY OF WAYS

- The Red Raiders have found multiple ways to find the end zone this season as Texas Tech currently ranks tied for seventh nationally with two defensive touchdowns, which have come from interceptions by both **Riko Jeffers** and **Marquis Waters**. Baylor and Oklahoma State are the only other Big 12 programs with multiple defensive touchdowns so far this season.
- Dating back to the start of the 2000 season, Texas Tech was able to record a pair of pick-six touchdowns in its first three games for the first time. Jeffers' interception versus Houston marked the first pick-six by a Red Raider since **Adrian Frye** went 43 yards into the end zone against Lamar in 2018.
- Despite a slow start, the Red Raiders scored 54 points versus FIU, marking the first time Texas Tech has hit the 50-point mark since facing Texas in the second game of the 2020 season. It marked the second 50-point performance for the Red Raiders under head coach **Matt Wells**, who has hit the 50-point mark 16 times now as a head coach.

NEW TO TOWN BUT NOT TO THE GAME

- One of the goals for **Matt Wells** and his staff upon their arrival in Dec. 2018 was making the Red Raiders older as a roster. They have done just that, bringing in 22 scholarship transfers from four-year colleges during that span, including 17 that appear on the 2021 roster.
- An area, in particular, Wells and his staff have taken advantage of is transfers with multiple years of eligibility remaining as Texas Tech has signed 14 players in his tenure that will ultimately play multiple seasons for the Red Raiders. That total includes nine Red Raiders who are entering their second season at Texas Tech this season and three more who will have multiple seasons of eligibility after arriving in Lubbock this past January.
- Texas Tech has signed the bulk of its transfers from other power-five schools under Wells as 14 players have arrived after playing in the ACC, Big 12, Big Ten, SEC or Pac-12. Six of Texas Tech's transfer additions for this season came from power-five schools as the Red Raiders include the likes of **Malik Dunlap** (N.C. State), **Reggie Pearson Jr.** (Wisconsin), **Jesiah Pierre** (Florida), **Tyler Shough** (Oregon), **T.J. Storment** (TCU), **Marquis Waters** (Duke) and **Rayshad Williams** (UCLA).
- A few have garnered notice from the Athletic's Max Olson and Bruce Feldman as part of their College Football Transfer Portal Top 100 that was released prior to the season: **Tyler Shough** (No. 21), **Marquis Waters** (No. 49), **T.J. Storment** (No. 74).

CHAMPIONSHIP EXPERIENCE

- Texas Tech has three members of its program with national championship rings in former Alabama running back **Chadarius Townsend** and LSU safety **Eric Monroe**. Townsend was a redshirt on Alabama's 2017 national championship team and later played in the Crimson Tide's College Football Playoff run in 2018. Monroe, meanwhile, saw action in 12 games during the 2019 campaign, including both of LSU's victories in the CFP.
- Texas Tech linebackers coach **Kevin Cosgrove** was also part of LSU's national championship run in 2019 as he was a senior defensive analyst for the Tigers. **Matt Wells** hired Cosgrove to his staff not long after LSU raised the title trophy in New Orleans.

YOU'RE ON SCHOLARSHIP

- Four Red Raiders closed preseason camp by hearing the three words every walk-on dreams of: "you're on scholarship." **Matt Wells** and his staff gave that opportunity to four different Red Raiders this past Saturday as sophomore offensive lineman **Aaron Castro**, sophomore linebacker **Bryce Ramirez**, junior tight end **Henry Teeter** and senior defensive lineman **Troy Te'o** were all recognized for their hard work.
- The presentation was set up, in part, by offensive coordinator **Sonny Cumbie**, a former walk-on himself who discussed his journey to eventually earning a scholarship and then becoming the Red Raiders' starter behind center. Cumbie remains one of the most successful walk-ons in school history after leading the Red Raiders to a memorable win at the 2004 Holiday Bowl to close his career.
- Wells and his staff have rewarded at least one walk-on with a scholarship in each of his three seasons, a list that includes three other current Red Raiders in senior wide receiver **Dalton Rigdon** (presented in 2019), junior place kicker **Trey Wolff** (honored following 2019 season) and junior running back **Xavier White** (earned in 2020).

A NEW TERM FOR 2021 - SUPER SENIORS

- Media and fans alike will likely hear a new term throughout the 2021 season - Super Seniors. The phrase describes many of the seniors across the country who decided to utilize the extra year granted by the NCAA for the 2020 season.
- The defense was the greatest benefactor of the Super Senior movement, retaining a collective 156 career starts between seven players entering this season. The group is led by Colin Schooler, the team's most veteran player, who owned 41 career starts between his playing time at Arizona (33) and Texas Tech (8), entering 2021.
- The offense boasts five Super Seniors who own a collective 58 starts among them. The most experienced of that group is shared by a pair of transfers in Kaylon Geiger (19) and T.J. Stormont (19), who each arrived in Lubbock as Super Seniors.
- For Texas Tech, the Red Raiders lead the Big 12 Conference with 12 super seniors according to recent research by the Associated Press. The list of returnees includes nine players that were on Tech's roster this past fall as well as three others in **T.J. Stormont**, who transferred to join the Red Raiders this spring following one season at TCU, **Kaylon Geiger Sr.**, a veteran wide receiver from Troy, and Marquis Waters, who started in 35 games over his career at Duke.
- According to the Associated Press' research this past spring, Texas Tech is tied for fifth among power-five programs with 12 super seniors as the Red Raiders only trail the likes of Illinois (17), Arizona State (14), USC (14) and Rutgers (13) and are tied with Pittsburgh (12). The arrival of Geiger pushed the Red Raiders ahead of Arizona (11), Utah (11) and Tennessee (11).

- Among the elected captains, **Riko Jeffers**, **Erik Ezukanma** and **SaRodorick Thompson** were selected to represent their peers for a third-consecutive season. It was the second-straight year for **Dawson Deaton**, **Tony Bradford Jr.** and **Jaylon Hutchings** to be recognized.

In addition, nine other Red Raiders transferred to Texas Tech after earning their degrees at various other universities. That list features **Brandon Bouyer-Randle** (Michigan State), **Josh Burger** (Wofford), **Eric Monroe** (LSU), **Jacob Morgenstern** (Duke), **Colin Schooler** (Arizona), **Chadarius Townsend** (Alabama), **Marquis Waters** (Duke), **Tyler Shough** (Oregon) and **T.J. Stormont** (Colorado State) and **Matthew Young** (New Mexico State).

WOMBLE FOOTBALL CENTER



Texas Tech Athletics announced prior to the TCU game a \$20 million gift from Board of Regents member Dustin R. Womble to fund construction of a new football training facility. It marks the largest one-time gift to the athletics department in its history. The lead gift will help Texas Tech continue to reshape its athletics facilities with the help of Womble, who already provided more than \$10 million to fund a state-of-the-art basketball practice facility in his name, the Dustin R. Womble Basketball Center that opened this past May across from United Supermarkets Arena.

Once completed, Texas Tech will boast one of the largest investments into its football program in history as construction of the Womble Football Center is expected to be a \$40-50 million project. The two-story complex will remain in its same location adjacent to both Jones AT&T Stadium and the Sports Performance Center, which has earned rave reviews since its unveiling in 2017 as one of the premier indoor football facilities in the country. As part of the project, Texas Tech will more than double its physical space in the Womble Football Center, which is slated to begin construction in early 2022 in anticipation of opening prior to the 2023 season. The state-of-the-art complex will house a nearly 14,000-square foot weight room and a 7,000-square foot locker room as well as coaches offices, position rooms, a players' lounge and space for nutrition, athletic training and recruiting.

The Womble Football Center is the second project in Texas Tech's three-part master plan for its football program, which also includes future renovations to the south end zone of Jones AT&T Stadium. The projects are among the final items for The Campaign for Fearless Champions, which has transformed Texas Tech's facilities since its inception. Overall, the campaign has funded 25 athletic facility projects to date and has invested more than \$200 million into the athletics department, including critical student-athlete resources such as scholarship endowments, nutrition and the J.T. and Margaret Talkington Leadership Academy.

To date, Womble has gifted his alma mater with more than \$30 million as part of The Campaign for Fearless Champions, placing him historically among one of Texas Tech University's largest individual donors and the largest athletics donor. He joins the ranks of other generous supporters such as Jim Sowell, Ed Whitacre and Jerry Rawls.

MAKING IT LOOK E-Z

Erik Ezukanma has established himself as the Big 12's top wide receiver over the past two-plus seasons as he has caught 121 passes for 1,965 yards and 12 touchdowns over his career. Just a year ago, Ezukanma became the first Red Raider wide receiver to garner All-Big 12 first team honors since two-time Biletnikoff Award winner Michael Crabtree in 2008.

Ezukanma has picked up right where he left off this season as he leads the Big 12 at 84.2 receiving yards per game. He is also fourth in the league with 429 receiving yards and fourth for receptions per game (5.2) despite missing the West Virginia game due to an injury. Ezukanma hit the 100-yard mark in each of the first two games of the season after catching seven passes for 179 yards against Houston and then six catches for 143 yards and a touchdown versus Stephen F. Austin.

OFFENSIVE NOTEBOOK

YARDS, TOUCHDOWNS CONTINUE TO RACK UP FOR THOMPSON

- Texas Tech has turned to a reliable option out of the backfield in recent weeks as **SaRodrick Thompson** has found the end zone six times in the last five games. Thompson, who missed the first two games of the season due to injury, recorded his first 100-yard outing of the season against TCU as he totaled 118 rushing yards and three touchdowns. It was the 10th multi-touchdown game of his career and second in as many weeks after he carried 12 times for 48 yards and a pair of scores at West Virginia.
- Thompson's three touchdowns versus the Horned Frogs marked a career-high and the most for a Red Raider since **Ta'Zhawn Henry** found the end zone four times against Houston early in the 2018 season. He is the 10th Red Raider since 2000 to rush for at least three touchdowns in a game.
- Thompson's final touchdown against TCU - a 6-yard scamper with five minutes remaining in regulation - marked the 29th of his career, moving him into the top 10 all-time in Texas Tech history. He is now tied for eighth in program history for career rushing touchdowns alongside the likes of **Billy Taylor** (1974-77), **Zebbie Lethridge** (1994-97) and Doak Walker Award winner **Byron Hanspard** (1994-96).
- Following his 2020 sophomore campaign, Thompson became the first Red Raider to lead the team in rushing back-to-back years since **DeAndre Washington** during the 2014-15 seasons. Thompson is only the sixth Red Raider all-time to lead the team in rushing as both a freshman and sophomore, joining an elite list that includes two Doak Walker Award winners in **Byron "Bam" Morris** (1991-92) and **Byron Hanspard** (1994-95) as well as **James Gray** (1986-87), **Ricky Williams** (1997) and **Taurean Henderson** (2002-03).
- Thompson overtook **Tahj Brooks** for the team-high in rushing with his 83 yards against Kansas, giving him 314 now on the season. He could become the first Red Raider to lead Texas Tech in rushing over three-consecutive seasons since **Baron Batch** from 2008-10. If he and **Erik Ezukanma** once again lead the team in rushing and receiving yards, respectively, it would mark the first time Texas Tech has had the same two players lead each category over three-straight years since the school began tracking yearly leaders in 1951.

TURN TO K.G.: GEIGER ADDS TO PASSING ATTACK

- **Kaylon Geiger Sr.** proved why coaches were high on the senior transfer the past five weeks as he has combined for 422 of his 433 receiving yards this season during that span. Geiger recorded a pair of 100-yard outings in that stretch as he followed a six-catch, 121- yard performance against FIU with five grabs for 100 yards and a touchdown at Texas. His performance against Texas featured a 75-yard touchdown strike from **Henry Colombi** midway through the third quarter, marking the longest reception of his career.
- Geiger has been a frequent target of Colombi each of the last two weeks as well, logging team-highs of six catches for 79 yards against West Virginia and then five grabs for 85 yards versus TCU. His performance against West Virginia included a key 42-yard grab on Texas Tech's final game-winning drive.
- The performance against Texas marked the 11th 100-yard game of Geiger's career dating back to his two seasons at Troy. Since the start of the 2019 season, Geiger ranks tied for third among FBS receivers for 100-yard performances, trailing only the 14 from Purdue's David Bell and the 12 from former Alabama standout DeVonta Smith (currently with Philadelphia Eagles).

RED RAIDERS FIND BALANCE EARLY IN CUMBIE'S RETURN

- **Sonny Cumbie** has returned the Red Raiders to their high-scoring ways early in his tenure as offensive coordinator as Texas Tech is currently averaging 35.7 points per game, a steady improvement from 29.1 points per outing a year ago. The Red Raiders enter this weekend ranked 25th in the FBS and fifth in the Big 12 for scoring offense.
- Through seven games, the Red Raiders, known for the Air Raid, have actually attempted more rushes (235) to passes (219) to this point. It marks the first time Texas Tech has recorded more rushing attempts than passing attempts during that span since moving to a spread offense in 2000.
- Cumbie, who spent the past seven seasons at Big 12 counterpart TCU, returned to his alma mater where he was the starting quarterback in 2004 before later serving as a graduate assistant in 2009 and then an assistant coach from 2010-13. A native of nearby Snyder, Texas, Cumbie helped TCU boast the Big 12's second-best conference record (38-25) and third-best overall mark (58-30) over his seven seasons, which coincided with six bowl appearances.





QB HENRY COLOMBI

RED RAIDERS SCORE ANOTHER ROAD WIN WITH COLOMBI

- **Henry Colombi** has recorded a pair of 300-yard performances since taking over at quarterback in the second quarter against Texas. The senior threw for 324 passing yards against the Longhorns after relieving an injured **Tyler Shough**, marking the first 300-yard outing of his career. He added his second 300-yard game two weeks ago with a career-high 344 yards against TCU. He came close to another 300-yard outing in the win over West Virginia with 266 passing yards.
- Colombi powered the Red Raider offense on a game-winning drive in the closing minutes of the West Virginia win in what was his first start of the season and the fifth of his career. It was the second-consecutive year Colombi made his first start of the season against the Mountaineers as his 2020 outing versus West Virginia marked his first collegiate start.
- Colombi was the third-highest graded quarterback (93.0) by *Pro Football Focus* for his performance against Texas. He trailed only the grades of Alabama starter Bryce Young (94.2) and Pittsburgh quarterback Kenny Pickett (93.3) for that week.
- Texas Tech is 4-3 in games Colombi has started as he has led the Red Raiders to a pair of wins over West Virginia, as well as Baylor a year ago and Kansas last weekend.
- Colombi made his debut as a Red Raider at Kansas State a year ago as the then-junior replaced an injured **Alan Bowman** on Texas Tech's second offensive drive of the afternoon. Colombi helped lead the Red Raiders back from a 14-point halftime deficit with two touchdown passes in the second half before finishing 30-of-42 overall for 244 yards. Both career highs, to date, for attempts and completions.
- Colombi arrived at Texas Tech in the weeks leading up to the 2020 season after transferring from Utah State where he previously played under then-head coach **Matt Wells** from 2017-18. Colombi was granted an NCAA waiver to make him immediately eligible for 2020 season. He was later named an honorable mention All-Big 12 selection following his debut season as a Red Raider.

NOT A NEW EXPERIENCE FOR WELLS

- The loss of a starting quarterback early in the season isn't a new experience for **Matt Wells** as he successfully made the transition to a new signal caller three times during his Utah State tenure, all of which resulted in bowl appearances. In fact, Wells won 25 games during his first three seasons leading his alma mater, all of which featured at least two starting quarterbacks.
- This is the fifth-consecutive year and the third-straight season under Wells where the Red Raiders will utilize multiple starting quarterbacks. In fact, it will be the ninth time in the last 13 seasons where Texas Tech have been forced to use multiple starters at quarterback, a drastic turn for a program who used the same starting quarterback in every game from 2000-08.

WAITING HIS TURN

- The journey to earning the starting nod didn't come without a few years of waiting for **Henry Colombi**, who had to wait his time behind 2020 NFL Draft first-round selection in former Utah State signal caller **Jordan Love**. Colombi was the primary backup to Love during his final season at Utah State before eventually transferring to Texas Tech in the weeks leading up to the 2020 campaign. Love, who jumped up NFL draft boards as a sophomore quarterback under **Matt Wells** in 2018, was chosen 26th overall by the Green Bay Packers.
- Fellow Texas Tech quarterback **Tyler Shough**, meanwhile, waited his time early in his career behind **Jordan Herbert** at Oregon. Herbert, the NFL AP Rookie of the Year in 2020, was Oregon's starter in each of Shough's first two seasons with the Ducks.

"MOST-TALENTED QUARTERBACK ROOM IN MY TENURE"

- That's the quote **Matt Wells** used to describe his quarterback room throughout preseason camp as the third-year head coach felt the Red Raiders were four deep behind center with junior starter **Tyler Shough** followed by senior **Henry Colombi**, redshirt freshman **Donovan Smith** and true freshman **Behren Morton**.
- **Sonny Cumbie** and Wells both feel the future is bright in the quarterback room thanks to a pair of freshmen in **Donovan Smith** and **Behren Morton**. Smith, the son of running backs coach **DeAndre Smith**, arrived at Texas Tech prior to the 2020 season out of nearby Frenship High School in the Lubbock area. He threw for more than 3,000 yards and 25 touchdowns as a senior after previously starring at Bishop Gorman High School in Las Vegas.
- Smith's role has continued to grow in the offense in recent weeks as he has relieved Colombi at various moments, giving the Red Raiders a heavy pass-run option behind center. He is coming off his best performance of the season at Kansas as he rushed six times for 37 yards and a touchdown while also completing 4-of-5 passes for 70 yards. It marked the first time he has attempted a pass this season. He has 10 rushing attempts for 57 yards and two touchdowns now on the season.
- Morton, meanwhile, is the highest-rated quarterback to ever sign with the Red Raiders after totaling more than 8,800 passing yards and 84 touchdowns in three seasons at Eastland High School. He was a consensus four-star prospect, ranking sixth nationally among pro-style quarterbacks. Morton grew up in Lubbock for part of his youth as his father was the head football coach at Monterey High School in Lubbock for 11 years.
- Shough was impressive up until his injury at Texas as he had completed 69.6 percent of his passes for 872 yards and six touchdowns to that point. The Oregon transfer was Texas Tech's starter in each of its first four games of the season.
- Each of Texas Tech's three quarterbacks currently at the top of the depth chart are the sons of football coaches. Henry Colombi's father is currently an assistant football coach in the South Florida area.

YES, WE RUN THE BALL HERE AT TEXAS TECH

- Texas Tech has been a force on the ground this season as the Red Raiders have totaled 1,178 rushing yards, their second-highest total through seven games dating back to 2000. Tech previously had 1,378 rushing yards at the same point in the 2015 season.
- Texas Tech rushed for a season-high 244 yards in the win at Kansas, marking the seventh time the Red Raiders have hit the 200-yard mark under **Matt Wells** and the second time in as many weeks. The Red Raiders have not rushed for at least 200 yards in three-consecutive games since the first three games of the 1998 season against UTEP, North Texas and Fresno State. Tech has not done so against three-consecutive Big 12 foes since its inaugural season in the league in 1996 against Oklahoma State, Baylor and Kansas.
- Texas Tech's success on the ground has been particularly noticeable in the red zone as the Red Raiders have rushed for four touchdowns in each of its last two games. It marked the first time the Red Raiders have found paydirt four times on the ground in back-to-back weeks since early in the 2018 season against Lamar and Houston and the first time versus Big 12 foes since the final two regular-season games of the 2015 season against Kansas State and Texas.
- Texas Tech used 10 different rushers in its win over Kansas, marking its most in a game since the Red Raiders used the same amount in the 2017 season opener against Eastern Washington. The Red Raiders found the end zone in a variety of ways, none of which included a running back as quarterbacks **Henry Colombi** and **Donovan Smith** both scored as did wide receivers **Erik Ezukanma** and **Myles Price**.
- Texas Tech's final touchdown against Kansas - a 2-yard pass from Henry Colombi to Travis Koontz - snapped a streak of 11-consecutive scores that came via the ground. It was the longest such streak for the Red Raiders since 1977 when Tech put together a similar streak from its final touchdown against Arizona to two of its next three games against Rice and TCU.

POTENT NOTABLES (OFFENSE EDITION)

- Texas Tech has been among the most explosive teams in the country this season as the Red Raiders lead the country with 17 plays of at least 40 yards. Tech also shares the FBS lead with Florida International with 11 plays that have gone 50 or more yards.
- Texas Tech has put points on the board in 94.0 percent of its red zone appearances this season (29-of-31), which ranks 16th in the FBS and fourth in the Big 12 entering this weekend. The Red Raiders have found the end zone in 21 of those red zone appearances as Tech has failed to put points on the board only twice - via an early fumble against Houston and a fourth-down stop versus TCU.
- **Austin McNamara** had a quiet afternoon at Kansas as he was not called on to punt once in the blowout win. It marked the first time Texas Tech has failed to punt in a game since defeating Louisiana Tech in 2016.
- Texas Tech converted 9 of its 11 third-down attempts at Kansas, bringing its season average up to 49.4 percent, which ranks ninth nationally and second in the Big 12. The Red Raiders will be facing a Kansas State program that currently ranks 118th in the FBS for third-down conversion defense as the Wildcats are allowing a first down 45.1 percent of the time.
- Despite shuffling of the offensive line, Texas Tech failed to surrender a sack against Kansas, marking the second time it has kept the quarterback clean this season (other was against FIU). The Red Raiders, who only gave up one sack the previous week against TCU, currently rank 24th nationally in fewest tackles for loss allowed per game (4.0) and 36th for fewest sacks allowed per game (1.57). Tech has ranked in the top 30 of the FBS for the fewest sacks allowed each season under **Matt Wells** and offensive line coach **Steve Farmer**.
- **Travis Koontz** hauled in his third touchdown pass of the season against Kansas, giving him the team-high through seven weeks in the season. He also ranks tied for 11th in the FBS among tight ends for receiving touchdowns. Texas Tech has not had a tight end lead the team in receiving touchdowns since moving to a spread offense in 2000.
- **Loic Fouonji** has been the recipient of a pair of long catches in recent weeks as he hauled in a 69-yard touchdown pass from **Henry Colombi** against Texas before converting a key 3rd-and-4 play to start the fourth quarter with a 46-yard strike at West Virginia. The touchdown at Texas marked the longest reception of Fouonji's career as his previous high was 31 yards, which came on his only other career touchdown at Oklahoma State in 2020.
- **Tahj Brooks** was the breakout star for the Texas Tech offense early this season as he has carried 35 times for 284 yards and four touchdowns in three games. Brooks, who missed each of the last four weeks due to injury, finished with a career-high 134 rushing yards against Houston and then added 103 on the ground versus SFA, marking his first two games to reach the 100-yard mark. Brooks had been explosive in finding the end zone, scoring on touchdown runs of 41 and 44 yards against Houston before breaking loose on a 67-yard scamper against SFA.

IS THAT A BASKETBALL TEAM?

- During a spring media availability, outside receivers coach **Joel Filani** was asked a surprising question: "Is there a certain height requirement to be a receiver now at Texas Tech?" While there is yet to be a set requirement, Texas Tech is beginning to resemble more of a basketball team at the receiver positions as eight Red Raider receivers or tight ends are listed at 6-3 or taller. The Red Raiders only boasted four receivers or tight ends at 6-3 or taller on its preseason depth chart in **Matt Wells'** first season in 2019.
- Outside of transfer **Kaylon Geiger Sr.**, the Red Raiders boast a 6-3 or taller wideout at both outside receiver positions (X & Z) as well as at tight end, which features returning starter **Travis Koontz** (6-5) and a pair of talented true freshmen in **Mason Tharp** (6-9) and **Jed Castles** (6-7). The list of receivers includes **Erik Ezukanma** (6-3), **Trey Cleveland** (6-4), **J.J. Sparkman** (6-4), **Loic Fouonji** (6-4) and talented true freshman **Jerand Bradley** (6-5).

PLENTY OF EXPERIENCE RETURNS ALONG OFFENSIVE LINE

- **Steve Farmer** returned the bulk of his position room this season as the Red Raiders brought back four starters on the offensive line, including All-Big 12 second team selection **Dawson Deaton** at center. Texas Tech boasts 100 career starts as a Red Raider among its offensive line and 141 career starts when you factor in a pair of transfers such as **Josh Burger** and **T.J. Stormont**.
- Deaton, a two-year starter at center, ranks second on the team with 29 career starts, trailing only **DaMarcus Fields'** 43 career starts among returners with starts logged at Texas Tech.
- In addition to Deaton, the Red Raiders also benefit from the return of junior **Weston Wright** and senior **Josh Burger**, who both started all 10 games in 2020. Wright has now started in 25-consecutive games, while Burger, who moved from right tackle to right guard this season, has been in the starting lineup over 42-straight games dating back to his time at Wofford. Burger also played a significant role in Dawson's absence against West Virginia and Kansas, stepping in to quarterback the offensive line at center for a game.

DEFENSIVE NOTEBOOK

DEFENSE BOUNCES BACK IN WIN OVER KANSAS

- **Keith Patterson's** defense bounced back in a strong way against Kansas with one of its best performances of the season, allowing only 273 yards of total offense to the Jayhawks and a pair of late touchdowns. Each of Kansas' two touchdowns came with less than a minute to play against many of Texas Tech's developmental players.
- The look of the defense mirrors similar performances in Texas Tech's four other wins this season as the Red Raiders are allowing only 19.6 points, 80.4 rushing yards and 313.6 yards per game in their five victories. On the other side, however, Tech is surrendering 61.0 points, 365.0 rushing yards and 568.5 yards of total offense in its two losses to Texas and TCU this season.
- The Red Raiders failed to surrender an explosive play of 20 yards or longer against the Jayhawks, marking the first time Texas Tech has done so this season.
- Both of Kansas' touchdowns came via the passing game as Texas Tech did not allow a rushing score for the second time this season (Stephen F. Austin). Tech previously allowed five touchdowns on the ground against TCU as the Red Raiders have given up nine in losses this year compared to only three in their five wins.
- The Texas Tech secondary stepped up in a big way against Kansas, limiting the Jayhawks to only 128 passing yards a week after surrendering just 104 in the loss to TCU. It marked the first time the Red Raiders had kept a Big 12 opponent under 130 passing yards in consecutive games since facing Oklahoma State (94 yards) and Oklahoma (118 yards) late in the 2005 season. The Red Raiders matched their season high with seven pass breakups against Kansas.
- The defensive performance versus the Jayhawks marked the sixth time under **Matt Wells** where the Red Raiders have held an opponent to 20 points or less. Texas Tech is a perfect 6-0 in those games now.

HOW 'BOUT SOME POINTS ON DEFENSE?

- **Matt Wells** has been no stranger in seeing his defense put up points over his career as his teams have created 26 defensive touchdowns during his eight-plus seasons as a collegiate head coach. Texas Tech recorded the 25th defensive touchdown of Wells' career against Houston with **Riko Jeffers'** pick-six midway through the third quarter and the 26th defensive TD thanks to **Marquis Waters'** 72-yard pick-six in the first quarter against FIU.
- Texas Tech is one of 24 FBS programs and one of three in the Big 12 to own multiple defensive touchdowns this season.
- Texas Tech made a knack for finding the end zone via its defense during the 2020 season as the Red Raiders ranked tied for seventh in the FBS and second in the Big 12 with three defensive touchdowns. It marked the most defensive touchdowns in a season by the Red Raiders since the 2017 campaign when Texas Tech had four over 13 games.

POTENT NOTABLES (DEFENSE EDITION)

- Texas Tech's performance against West Virginia was a return to the defensive results the Red Raiders experienced the first three weeks of the season as the Mountaineers were held to only 20 points and 94 rushing yards. It marked the fourth time this season the Red Raiders have limited an opponent to less than 100 rushing yards, all of which have resulted in wins.
- Six different Red Raiders have picked off a pass so far this season as Texas Tech currently ranks second in the Big 12 and tied for 31st nationally with seven interceptions. **Dadrion Taylor-Demerson** leads the group with two, since securing his second of the season last time out at Kansas. The Red Raiders haven't had six different players with an interception in a season, let alone the first seven games, since 2017 when 10 players picked off a pass.
- Texas Tech's seven interceptions this season are already two more than its entire total from the 2020 campaign. It took the Red Raiders a total of 10 games for its five interceptions a year ago.
- **Matt Wells** is 30-10 over his head coaching career when his teams win the turnover battle. The Red Raiders are currently minus-4 in the turnover margin this season, which was an area that was a strength in Wells' debut season in 2019 when Texas Tech ranked third in the Big 12 with a plus-4 margin.
- It didn't take long for **Krishon Merriweather** to emerge as one of Texas Tech's most steady forces in its linebacker core as the junior-college transfer led the team with 75 tackles a year ago and was second with 6.5 tackles for loss. He closed the season by matching his career-high with 12 tackles in the win over Kansas. Through seven games this season, Merriweather ranks fourth on the team with 28 tackles, including 2.5 that have gone for a loss, for a Red Raider defense that often rotates six linebackers.
- **Tyree Wilson** set a career high with 2.0 tackles for loss against Kansas, giving him a team-high 7.0 now on the season. He is the first Red Raider defensive lineman with at least 7.0 tackles for loss through the first seven games since current Seattle Seahawk **Kerry Hyder** in 2013 who had 9.5 at the same point.
- **Riko Jeffers** led the team with six tackles in the win over Kansas, giving him 41 on the season now, which ranks second overall behind only Colin Schooler. Jeffers has 268 tackles for his career after totaling at least 55 tackles in each of the last three seasons, including two with 70 or more stops.

TAKEAWAYS KEY FOR PATTERSON-LED DEFENSE

- The Red Raiders will look to build on the defensive improvements under third-year coordinator **Keith Patterson**, who returned eight starters on his side of the ball this season. Patterson's first year leading the defense was highlighted by an aggressive scheme that had Texas Tech force 19 turnovers while allowing 30.3 points per game, its lowest average since 2009. The Red Raiders have totaled 37 takeaways over Patterson's two-plus seasons.
- Patterson's defenses have long been known for their ability to create turnovers as Utah State led the nation with 32 takeaways in 2018 prior to his hire at Texas Tech. Patterson's unit has created 69 takeaways the past three-plus seasons alone, which ranks eighth nationally among active defensive coordinators.
- Patterson has mentored three Red Raiders into NFL Draft selections during his short tenure as linebacker **Jordyn Brooks** was selected 27th overall by the Seattle Seahawks in 2019 followed by defensive lineman **Broderick Washington Jr.** in the fifth round with the Baltimore Ravens. Defensive back **Zech McPhearson** might have benefited the most from Patterson's guidance as he jumped up draft boards to be picked in the fourth round this past spring by the Philadelphia Eagles.

ONE OF THE BEST IN FBS HISTORY

Texas Tech boasts the nation's active leader in both tackles and tackles for loss in Colin Schooler, who arrived in Lubbock as a graduate transfer from Arizona in the weeks leading up to the 2020 season. Schooler, who currently leads the Red Raiders with 56 tackles this season, hit the 400 career tackles milestone against Texas. He joins three other Red Raiders in program history who have recorded 400 career tackles at the FBS level as Schooler joins the likes of Lawrence Flurgence (1999-02), Brad Hastings (1983-86) and Kevin Curtis (1998-01).

MORE ON SCHOOLER

■ **Colin Schooler** heads into this weekend needing one more tackle for a loss to rank among the all-time greats in college football history. Schooler, who is playing his fifth season overall and second as a Red Raider, currently trails Cincinnati's Antwan Peek (2000-02) and Michigan's Brandon Graham (2006-09) by that total for 24th all-time in FBS history. Schooler totaled 5.0 tackles for a loss over nine games in 2020 in his debut as a Red Raider and has 4.0 TFLs this season.

■ Schooler is already a member of the NCAA record book with 282 solo tackles over his career, which currently ranks 13th all-time in FBS history. Schooler needs four solo stops this weekend to tie former Red Raider safety Cody Davis (2009-12) and former Duke standout Ryan Fowler (2000-03) for 11th in the record book and seven solo stops to enter the top 10 by matching Iowa's Abdul Hodge (2002-05). Davis is currently in his ninth NFL season as a member of the New England Patriots.

■ Schooler hails from a football family as his father, Tom, played at Eastern Michigan, while his older brother, Brendan, played at Oregon before transferring to Texas. His mother, Christine, was also a collegiate athlete as part of the Cal State Los Angeles volleyball program.

FIELDS TO THE PROS

■ Not many defensive backs in the Big 12 yet alone the country have likely seen as much playing time as **DaMarcus Fields** the past four seasons. Fields, entering his sixth and final season as a Red Raider, leads the team with 43 career starts at Texas Tech from his spot at cornerback where he has recorded 195 tackles, four interceptions and 43 passes defended over his career.

■ For his career, Fields ranks second among active FBS players with his 43 passes defended, which trails only the 52 of Devin Taylor from Bowling Green. He matched **Jamar Wall** (2006-09) for the most passes defended by a Red Raider since 2000 against Kansas with his fifth of the season. He passed **Justis Nelson** (2013-16) during the SFA game as he had 39 over his respective career.

■ Fields became the first member of his family to receive a college degree this summer as he graduated in May as a public relations major. Fields, who was cited by **Matt Wells** as one of three Red Raiders who chose to return for a Super Senior season despite having an NFL Draft grade, said at the time he elected to come back for a final year in order to obtain that degree.

PLENTY OF EXPERIENCE RETURNS ON DEFENSE

■ **Keith Patterson** might have the most experienced defense of his tenure in 2021 as the third-year defensive coordinator brought back eight starters as well as the majority of his two-deep. Overall, Texas Tech's 2021 defense currently features nine players with 10 or more starts over their career and three players with at least 200 tackles for their career.

■ Between returning linebackers **Colin Schooler** and **Riko Jeffers** and newcomer **Marquis Waters**, Patterson has three players with plenty of experience as all three have recorded more than 200 tackles for their careers. In fact, Texas Tech was the only FBS program in the country at the start of the season with three players on its 2021 roster that boasted 225 or more tackles. Texas Tech could potentially add to that total during the 2021 season as **DaMarcus Fields** has totaled 195 tackles over his four seasons as a Red Raider.

REWRITING THE RECORD BOOK

Austin McNamara has quickly become a fixture in the Texas Tech record book in only two-plus seasons as the junior punter already owns two of the top five single-season averages in program history as well as the longest punt by any Big 12 player in league history. His success will make him a sure candidate for the Ray Guy Award throughout the 2021 season.

McNamara wrapped the 2020 season averaging an impressive 46.3 yards per punt, the second-highest clip in school history behind only the 46.8 average compiled by Mark Bounds in 1991. He previously averaged 45.0 yards per punt as a true freshman in 2020, which now ranks fifth in program history. He is the only Red Raider with two of the top-five punting averages currently in the school record book.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTEBOOK

MORE ON THE RAY GUY AWARD CANDIDATE...

- **Austin McNamara** has picked up where he left off this season as he is currently averaging 45.7 yards per punt, which ranks fourth in the Big 12 currently entering this weekend. That average, if the season ended today, would place McNamara in fourth place all-time in the Texas Tech single-season record book. **Alex Reyes** is currently the only punter in school history with three of the top-10 single-season averages in program history as has the fourth, eighth and 10th-best clips currently in the school record book.
- McNamara is on pace to snap the Texas Tech career record as he is averaging 45.6 yards per punt through two-plus seasons. **Taylor Symmank** is the current career record holder as he averaged 43.7 yards per attempt from 2012-15 before accepting several NFL training camp opportunities.
- McNamara set social media on fire midway through the 2020 season with his booming 87-yard punt against West Virginia, which marked the longest by an FBS kicker since 2017 and the longest in Texas Tech and Big 12 history. McNamara broke the Texas Tech single-game record for the longest punt that was previously set by **R.W. Moyers** in 1945 against West Texas State. Moyers launched an 85-yard punt in the win, which is the only other punt of 80 yards or longer in school history. He broke the previous Big 12 record of 85 yards that was set by Oklahoma's Tress Way in 2010 against Utah State.
- McNamara closed the 2020 season ranked fifth in the FBS for punting average and fourth among punters who played in at least five games. He was easily the Big 12 leader in punting as his average was five yards higher than any other specialist, earning him All-Big 12 first team honors for a second-consecutive season.
- McNamara became the first Red Raider since **Le'Raven Clark** in 2014-15 to collect first team honors in consecutive seasons and the first Tech specialist to do so during the Big 12 era. He joins Clark (2014-15), **Michael Crabtree** (2007-08), **Joel Filani** (2005-06), **Jarrett Hicks** (2004-05), **Kevin Curtis** (1999-00) and **Montae Reagor** (1997-98) as the only other Red Raiders to garner All-Big 12 first team accolades twice in a career.

GARIBAY BUILDING REPUTATION FOR BIG MOMENTS

- **Jonathan Garibay** is now 9-for-9 on field goal attempts this season as he is one of three Big 12 kickers with at least five attempts without a miss so far this season, joining West Virginia's Casey Legg and Oklahoma State's Tanner Brown. Garibay, who is now 17-for-20 on field goal attempts over his career, matched his career-long with a successful 48-yarder at Kansas. He previously found the uprights from 48 yards out in the 2020 win over Baylor.
- Garibay needs to make his next four field goals to match the Texas Tech record for consecutive successful attempts that was set by **Clayton Hatfield** during the 2018 season. Hatfield remains the most-accurate kicker in program history after making 84.7 percent of his attempts from 2015-18.
- Texas Tech is one of 13 schools in the FBS that has not missed a field goal this season in at least five attempts.
- Garibay connected on the second game-winning field goal of his career at West Virginia as the senior found the uprights 32 yards out with only 18 seconds remaining. He was named the Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week the following Monday for his efforts, alongside Colin Dicker of Texas.
- Garibay previously pushed the Red Raiders to a victory in the final seconds against Baylor late in the 2020 season as drilled a 25-yard attempt as time expired. It was one of four field goals on the day for Garibay, who became the first Red Raider to connect on four field goals since **Ryan Bustin** had the same amount in a 2013 victory over Kansas. The performance earned him Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week honors for that week as well. Prior to his kick against Baylor, the Red Raiders had not previously walked off with a game-winning field goal since Bustin drilled a 28-yarder in the closing seconds of the 2012 Meineke Car Care Bowl versus Minnesota.
- Garibay was inserted into the kicker role for the first time in his Red Raider career as he is only the sixth kicker in Big 12 history to make four field goals in his career debut as the primary field goal specialist and just the second to do so versus a league opponent, joining Colorado's Jeremy Aldrich in 1998 against Nebraska.

THE RIGHT GUARD

- Since becoming a collegiate head coach at Utah State in 2013, **Matt Wells** has prioritized special teams, so much so that every skill player on both sides of the ball is expected to contribute. If you're the top "bigger skill player" (i.e. linebackers, running backs and tight ends), you will find your way on punt coverage as the right guard. **Krishon Merriweather** will take over the position this season, continuing the tradition Wells has employed throughout his career.
- Merriweather was Texas Tech's leading tackler a year ago after totaling 75 stops in his debut as a Red Raider. Merriweather, who transferred to Tech from Garden City Community College, was third in the Big 12 for total tackles per game (7.5) en route to garnering All-Big 12 honorable mention accolades.
- Merriweather follows teammate **Riko Jeffers**, who served as the right guard for the majority of the 2020 season. **Jordyn Brooks** earned the designation in 2019 before eventually garnering second team All-America honors and being selected in the first round of the NFL Draft that next spring by the Seattle Seahawks. Wells utilized other future NFL linebackers such as **Bobby Wagner** and **Nick Vigil** at the right guard on the punt team during his six seasons at Utah State.

THE GAME IS NEVER OVER HERE

TEXAS TECH UNIVERSITY

THE STATE OF TEXAS' TOP ATHLETICS DEPARTMENT

- With all the talk of conference realignment in the air, it's important to remember Texas Tech has led all schools in the state of Texas in the Capital One Cup men's standings in two of the last three complete athletic seasons after finishing third nationally in 2018-19 and then 14th for the 2017-18 athletic year. Below are several other facts regarding Texas Tech's success in competition.
- Since 2017, Texas Tech has had 15 of its 17 athletic programs compete in the NCAA postseason or a bowl game.
- Texas Tech has had six different programs finish among the top-10 teams nationally in their respective sport since 2014 alone.
- The Red Raiders have appeared in 38 bowl games in their history, which ranks tied for third among Big 12 programs and among the top-25 teams in college football history.
- Texas Tech claimed the 2019 Men's Outdoor Track and Field National Championship under head coach Wes Kittley.
- Texas Tech played in the 2019 NCAA Championship Game as well as in two-consecutive Elite Eights (2018-19). The Red Raiders are one of four men's basketball programs in the country with multiple Elite Eight appearances over the last three NCAA Tournaments.
- Texas Tech has advanced to the Men's College World Series four times in recent years (2014, 2016, 2018, 2019), which is tied for the most trips to the hallowed grounds in Omaha among teams nationally since 2014.
- Lady Raider Basketball remains one of the top programs in women's college basketball history as Texas Tech ranks 19th all-time among power-five programs with its 925 victories. Backed by the legendary Sheryl Swoopes, the Lady Raiders claimed the NCAA National Championship in 1993, the first team national championship in school history.
- Since joining the Big 12 as a charter member in 1996, Texas Tech has won 27 conference titles, with 11 of those coming in the past six years alone.
- In addition to its athletics success, Texas Tech has unveiled several new facilities in recent years with the opening of the \$48 million Sports Performance Center in 2017, the Cash Family Sports Nutrition Center in 2020 and the \$32.2 million Dustin R. Womble Basketball Center this past May.

THE NATION'S MOST DEDICATED FANS

- Texas Tech boasts one of the most rabid fan bases in all of college athletics as Red Raider fans have traditionally traveled in droves for bowl trips as well as to basketball games in locations like New York City, Anaheim (CA) and Minneapolis for the Final Four as well as to Omaha for the Men's College World Series.
- To date, Texas Tech has played in the highest-attended games for three bowl games, including two prominent ones in the state of Texas: the Goodyear Cotton Bowl (Dallas), the Academy Sports + Outdoors Texas Bowl (Houston) and the Holiday Bowl (San Diego).
- The Red Raiders had 88,175 fans on tap for the 2009 Cotton Bowl when the Red Raiders faced Ole Miss in the bowl's final game at historic Fair Park. It remains the highest-attended contest in the bowl's history even with the move to AT&T Stadium in Arlington, which can reach over 100,000 fans in capacity.
- Additionally, Texas Tech helped set the Texas Bowl attendance record in 2015 when the Red Raiders faced LSU in NRG Stadium. The bowl drew 71,307 fans that night to see a pair of future NFL standouts in Texas Tech's Patrick Mahomes II and Jakeem Grant.
- At home, Texas Tech has sold out of season tickets for its baseball program over seven-consecutive seasons now and will likely be looking at another sellout in 2022 after the Red Raiders advanced to the NCAA Super Regional round this past June.
- Texas Tech has sold out of season tickets in each of its last two men's basketball seasons, giving the Red Raiders the premier homecourt advantage in college basketball at 15,000-seat United Supermarkets Arena. The Red Raiders averaged a conference-leading 14,057 fans per game during the 2019-20 basketball season.
- On social media, Texas Tech student-athletes earned the highest engagement rate on their posts among peer power-five institutions over the past athletic year. Texas Tech's social media accounts accumulated over 35 million combined video views during the 2020-21 year alone.
- Texas Tech's brand has the ability to reach the nation through its creative social media usage. Texas Tech currently boasts the fifth-highest TikTok following by athletics accounts in the nation.
- Texas Tech is annually one of the top-performing schools among the Collegiate Licensing Company's (CLC) partner institutions, ranking 19th nationally in royalties generated this past year.

A PREMIER RESEARCH INSTITUTION

- Texas Tech University is the flagship institution, with a Moody Aa1 rating, of the five-member Texas Tech University System.
- Texas Tech is one of 16 universities designated as a Carnegie Very High Research Activity Institution and a Hispanic Serving Institution.
- Texas Tech has been named Higher Education Excellence in Diversity award winner in each of the last nine years. The university currently boasts 42 percent of its students identifying as racial-ethnic minorities.
- Texas Tech is a five-star Campus Pride Institution, one of two in Texas, and No. 25 on the Campus Pride Index.
- Texas Tech has awarded over \$170 million in scholarships recently with over 50 percent of students receiving scholarship support.
- Texas Tech boasted more than \$192 million in research expenditures in 2020 alone.



JONES AT&T STADIUM | HOME OF THE RED RAIDERS

STADIUM HISTORY

- Jones AT&T Stadium, home of Red Raider Football since Nov. 29, 1947, is arguably one of the most electric gameday atmospheres in all of college football. Armed with 60,000-plus rabid fans, Dave Curtis of The Sporting News proclaimed in May of 2010 that Jones AT&T Stadium was the "best home field advantage in all of college football."
- Since 2003, Texas Tech has invested \$150 million into the facility with four major renovations, making Jones AT&T Stadium one of the best on-campus football facilities in the country. The renovations have included a \$52 million West Stadium Building, the \$34 million East Stadium Building and the \$16 million north end zone renovation.
- The stadium was officially renamed from Jones Stadium to Jones SBC Stadium in 2000 following major corporate gifts (in excess of \$25 million) from SBC Communications (now AT&T). The stadium was renamed again in 2006 to Jones AT&T Stadium after SBC Communications formally changed its name to AT&T. The "Jones" in Jones Stadium comes from former Texas Tech president Clifford B. Jones and his wife Aubrey. The stadium was named in their honor upon its opening in 1947.
- In addition to consistent renovations to Jones AT&T Stadium, Texas Tech unveiled the \$48 million Sports Performance Center in 2017. The facility includes the Petersen Family Indoor Football Practice Facility, an indoor track and field competition complex with seating for 1,500 fans, a strength and conditioning area, the Becky and Kelly Joy Nutrition Center and the PlainsCapital Bank Sports Medicine Center. The

PROTECTING JONES AT&T STADIUM

- Since his arrival at Texas Tech, **Matt Wells** has stressed the importance in playing well inside Jones AT&T Stadium. In his words, teams that defend their home field elevate their season from "good" to "great," a key message early in his tenure for a Red Raider program that is 7-5 at home in two seasons thus far under Wells.
- The Red Raiders finished 3-3 overall at home in their first season under **Matt Wells**, who scored his first top-25 victory as Texas Tech's head coach with a win over Oklahoma State. Tech followed with a 4-2 record in the COVID-19 shortened 2020 season, marking the first time the Red Raiders had finished over .500 at home since 2015.
- During his six seasons at Utah State, Wells compiled a 27-7 record at home, an impressive .794 winning percentage. Wells led the Aggies to a .500 or better record at home in each of his six seasons and twice finished with a perfect 6-0 mark.
- Texas Tech is looking to get back to its winning ways as the Red Raiders were 69-18 at home over the course of the first 14 years (1996-2009) in the Big 12 Conference (a .793 winning percentage). Tech boasted a .500 or better record at home in each of those seasons en route to playing in 12 bowl games with the two lone exceptions being a result of a self-imposed postseason ban in 1997 and the retirement of **Spike Dykes** in 1999. Tech was 29-4 during the final five years of that stretch, including a pair of perfect 7-0 years (2005, 2008).
- Outside of the 2020 season where attendance was restricted to only 25 percent, Texas Tech has averaged more than 55,000 in every season with a record mark of 58,934 fans during the 2014 campaign.

HEAD COACH MATT WELLS

Matt Wells, a two-time conference Coach of the Year recipient, enters his third season at Texas Tech as he was named the 16th head football coach in school history on Nov. 29, 2018. The 2021 season will be Wells' ninth season as a collegiate head coach as he has compiled a 56-49 overall record following six seasons at his alma mater, Utah State, and two years leading the Red Raiders. He led the Aggies to five bowl appearances during his tenure, a feat he will look to accomplish frequently as he continues to build the Texas Tech program.

Through his first two seasons in Lubbock, Wells has set the groundwork for future success at Texas Tech behind a commitment to creating a true developmental program with the Red Raiders. That effort has already paid off as Tech has landed seven All-Big 12 first team selections during that time, its most in a two-year span since the 2004-05 seasons.

In only their first season, Wells and his staff helped Jordyn Brooks and Douglas Coleman III produce their best seasons as Red Raiders, ultimately leading to All-Big 12 first team accolades. Both were strong candidates for national awards as well with Coleman a semifinalist for the Jim Thorpe Award and Brooks a finalist for the Butkus Award. They were joined on the All-Big 12 first team by punter Austin McNamara, who led all FBS freshmen after averaging 45.0 yards per punt during the 2019 season.

Brooks is one of four Red Raiders to hear his name called during the NFL Draft under Wells as Broderick Washington Jr. was picked in the fifth round by the Baltimore Ravens in 2020, while McPhearson was selected in the third round of the 2021 draft by the Philadelphia Eagles followed by Anderson in the seventh round to the Buffalo Bills. For Wells, he became the first head coach to deliver multiple NFL Draft picks in each of his first two seasons since Jerry Moore during the 1982-83 drafts. It also marked the first time since the 2004-05 seasons where Tech boasted multiple NFL Draft selections in back-to-back years.

Wells was tabbed the head coach for his alma mater on Dec. 20, 2012, following two seasons as an assistant coach on staff. Utah State experienced its best stretch in history during Wells' tenure as the Aggies won 44 games and played in five bowl games under his guidance, quite the feat for a program that had only eight postseason trips to its record prior to his promotion.

Wells, the fourth-longest tenured coach in program history, departed Utah State as the only coach to lead the Aggies to at least three bowl games as well as multiple bowl victories. In fact, Wells was a player (1993), a coordinator (2012) or the head coach (2013-14) for four of Utah State's five bowl wins in its history with the lone exception coming at the 2018 Gildan New Mexico Bowl after he had already accepting the job at Texas Tech. Wells, a quarterback for the Aggies from 1994-96, was a member of two conference championship teams as a student-athlete, which came as a redshirt freshman in 1993 and as a senior in 1996 when Utah State was a member of the Big West.

In only their short time at Texas Tech, the Wells family has contributed significantly to the Lubbock community through local non-profit organizations such as Voice for Hope, Women's Protective Services and CASA of the South Plains through his Women's Football Clinic as well as the South Plains COVID-19 Relief Fund.

A DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAM

Since taking the reigns as Texas Tech's head coach, Matt Wells has stressed the importance in turning the Red Raiders into a "developmental program." Over his career, Wells and his staff have done just that with eight former players moving on to the NFL, including a pair of first-round draft picks last year in Jordyn Brooks and Jordan Love. Below is a look at several notable players under Wells who have moved on to the next level.



JORDYN BROOKS | LB

Brooks put together his best season of his career under Wells en route to being selected 27th overall by the Seattle Seahawks in 2020 NFL Draft. He became the first Red Raider defensive player to be chosen in the first round since Ring of Honor member Gabe Rivera in 1983.



ZECH MCPHEARSON | DB

McPhearson developed into a top NFL prospect after transferring to Texas Tech prior to Wells' first season in 2019. He earned All-Big 12 first team honors as a senior before being selected in the fourth round of the 2021 NFL Draft by the Philadelphia Eagles.



JORDAN LOVE | QB

Love set numerous school records on his way to establishing himself among the nation's top quarterback prospects under Wells and David Yost at Utah State in 2018. He was later selected 26th overall by the Green Bay Packers in the 2020 NFL Draft.



NICK VIGIL | LB

Vigil, a two-time first team All-Mountain West selection under Wells, heard his name called one pick before Fackrell in the third round of the 2016 NFL Draft. He played his first four NFL season with the Cincinnati Bengals before signing with the LA Chargers this offseason.

Career Breakdown: Filani enters his third season as the outside receivers coach at Texas Tech, the same position he starred at for the Red Raiders during the mid-2000s. Filani joined Matt Wells' charter

staff prior to the 2019 season, returning to his alma mater where he was a two-time All-Big 12 first team selection. He remains one of the top wide receivers in school history, amassing 2,667 receiving yards and 23 touchdowns from 2003-06. Filani arrived in Lubbock after a three-year stint at North Texas.



DEANDRE SMITH

Career Breakdown: Now in year No. 3 with the Red Raiders, Smith reunited with head coach Matt Wells for the third time in his career. Smith served as Utah State's running backs coach in 2018 and

the two were also assistant coaches together at New Mexico in 2008. Over his two decades of coaching, Smith has mentored four All-Americans and has had 10 running backs rush for at least 1,000 yards, namely Mikel LeShoure at Illinois and Michael Turner and Garrett Wolfe at Northern Illinois.

Career Breakdown: Patterson enters his third season as Texas Tech's defensive coordinator and his fourth-straight year working alongside Matt Wells after previously serving in a similar role at Utah

Over his last three seasons at both Texas Tech and Utah State, Patterson's units have created 61 takeaways, which ranks tied for eighth among active defensive coordinators during that stretch and leads all those in the Big 12 Conference.

RED RAIDERS IN THE NFL



SPORTS LARGEST CONTRACT

- There isn't a bigger star in the NFL currently than Texas Tech's own **Patrick Mahomes II**. The one-time Red Raider gunslinger has transformed the NFL in only four professional seasons, claiming NFL MVP honors in 2018 before leading the Kansas City Chiefs to back-to-back Super Bowl appearances, including a win in 2020.
- With his Super Bowl win over the San Francisco 49ers, Mahomes became the youngest player in history to be named NFL MVP and also win a Super Bowl. Mahomes, who at only 24 years of age, was tabbed Super Bowl MVP after leading the Chiefs to only their second Super Bowl title in history and their first since 1970.
- In July 2020, Mahomes signed the richest contract in NFL history as he and the Chiefs agreed on a 10-year extension worth up to \$503 million. It marked the second time in school history where a Red Raider has signed the richest NFL contract as Ring of Honor member **Donny Anderson** previously did so with the Green Bay Packers upon being drafted in 1965.
- Dating back to his time as a Red Raider, the 2016 Sammy Baugh Trophy winner is the only quarterback in history to throw for 5,000 yards at both the collegiate and NFL levels.

WELLS NAMED TO ALLSTATE AFCA GOOD WORKS TEAM

- **Matt Wells** was recognized for his work in the Lubbock community prior to the Texas game as he was named the honorary head coach for the 2021 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. Wells joined 11 student-athletes from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) and 11 more from the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS), Division II, Division III and NAIA ranks to make up the final roster of 23 award recipients from across college football on the Good Works Team.
- During the 2020-21 academic year alone, the Red Raiders combined for more than 1,200 hours of community service, serving organizations such as the local YWCA, the South Plains Food Bank, Ronald McDonald House, Boys and Girls Club of Lubbock and Habitat for Humanity, among others. Aside from the football program, the Wells family has also been strong contributors to the Lubbock community through his Women's Football Clinic. Proceeds from the annual event are presented to a charity of choice for the Wells family with previous recipients including Voice of Hope, Women's Protective Services and most recently, CASA of the South Plains.
- Allstate, the presenting sponsor of the Good Works Team, will make a \$10,000 donation to a charitable organization of choice for the Wells family in recognition of his selection.

TEXAS TECH AMONG NATION'S MOST ACTIVE TEAMS IN COMMUNITY

- Since his hire at Texas Tech, **Matt Wells** has stressed the Red Raiders will be heavily involved in the community. That initiative was so important, in fact, that one of his first hires was a former teammate of his in **Troy Kema** as the football program's Associate Athletics Director for player development and student-athlete services to work closely on integrating the Red Raiders with the Lubbock community.
- Texas Tech continues to be recognized at the national level as the Red Raider football programs recently learned it ranked second this past year in community-service hours among FBS schools that utilize the Helper Helper app. The Red Raiders completed more than 1,200 hours of community service this past year, which ranked only behind Boston College among FBS football programs. Texas Tech was No. 10 in community service hours served a year ago, a steady increase of 350 hours that saw the Red Raiders volunteer for 39 different opportunities with 19 organizations.
- Even with the COVID-19 pandemic, the Red Raiders took precautions to make sure their community was served as Texas Tech continued its tradition of volunteering for a service project on the Friday before every home game. The Special Spectator program, meanwhile, moved to a virtual format, which allowed the Red Raiders to still reward a local student who has experienced a tragic life event, normally of a physical nature.
- The Special Spectator program is a cornerstone of Texas Tech's community outreach as it provides a two-day experience, in normal years, at a football practice, a tour of the Football Training Facility and Sports Performance Center as well as on-field recognition prior to the start of a selected home football game.

TEXAS TECH FOOTBALL HELPS ESTABLISH LOCAL SCHOLARSHIP

- The Texas Tech football program, in conjunction with 100 Black Men of West Texas, established a community scholarship this summer that will benefit a local student each year that plans to attend Texas Tech University. The scholarship will cover all tuition and fees for one full year, providing a life-changing opportunity for a local student to attend the university. The scholarship recipient will be selected each year by a committee comprised of representatives from the 100 Black Men of West Texas organization as well as Red Raider football student-athletes.

POLICE CHIEF, TONY BRADFORD JR.

- In the midst of a national conversation regarding social injustice in this country, Texas Tech has found a voice with a unique perspective - junior defensive lineman **Tony Bradford Jr.**, who desires to join law enforcement once his playing career is over. Bradford's goal is to one day rise to the role of police chief in a major city where he says he "can make real change."
- Bradford has received a crash course in his future profession over the last year as he has served as a security guard with the Texas Tech Police Department. Bradford chose to spend his 2020 Spring Break with TTPD in what was expected to be a one-week internship but was extended through June due to the COVID-19 pandemic that ultimately canceled spring practice. Bradford returned to TTPD this past spring and summer, occasionally even working other Texas Tech athletics events.
- In only two years on campus, Bradford has become a leader in the Red Raider locker room as he has helped organize peaceful walks on the Texas Tech campus and in East Lubbock. Based on his career ambitions, Bradford has also been a key voice for student-athletes over the past year when it pertains to conflicts with law enforcement. Texas Tech has hosted multiple visits from police administration from around the Lubbock area with Bradford playing a key voice in those discussions.
- Bradford's efforts have translated to his work in the community as well as he is the leader of the Red Raider football program in service hours. Bradford, who is typically the leader in organizing community events, has helped the Red Raiders commit to multiple projects such as building a home for Habitat for Humanity, organizing a voter-registration drive and park cleanup as well as numerous visits to local schools. Bradford, himself, has volunteered at the South Plains Food Bank, the local Boys and Girls Club and several children's homes during his two-plus seasons on campus. For his efforts, Bradford is a nominee for the AFCA Good Works Team and the Wuerffel Trophy, two of the top community service awards in college football.

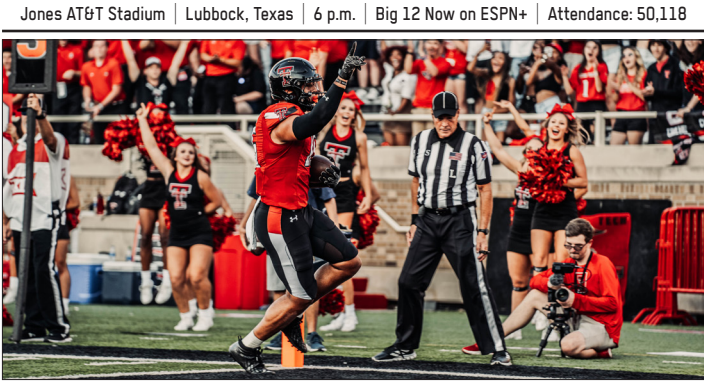
