Headlines in 1-2-3

* As Texas Tech takes on Kent State for the first time in program history, the two missed each other at Rip Griffin Park in 2018 during the Lubbock Regional that slotted Texas Tech (1-seed), Louisville (2-seed), Kent State (3-seed) and New Mexico State (4-seed) together. Louisville defeated Kent State 13-6 in the two vs. three-seed matchup, then eliminated NMSU, 2-1, before catching its second loss to Louisville, 12-6, to eliminate them from the tournament before facing Texas Tech. The Red Raiders defeated NMSU and Louisville (twice) en route to the Super Regional and eventual College World Series appearance.

* Texas Tech opened its 2022 home slate on Tuesday at Rip Griffin Park after beginning the season on the road at the State Farm College Showdown. Owning one of the top home-field advantages in the nation, Texas Tech looks to continue its home-field dominance where it has won over 75% of its home games since Dan Law Field at Rip Griffin Park opened in 2012. The Red Raiders own a 237-71 mark since 2012. Last year TTU won its first 11 games at home, which was a part of a 14-game winning streak after losing three in Arlington in 2021.



* The 2022 Red Raiders feature 21 new faces and 19 veterans. Tech returns six position players that started at least 30 games and 11 pitchers including Brandon Birdsell who was selected in the 11th round of last year's MLB draft. Meanwhile, Jace Jung is who's grabbed the headlines, as the 2021 Big 12 Player of the Year, enters 2022 as the conference's preseason player of the year, a Golden Spikes Watch Lister, and a five-time first team preseason All-American.

Notes**SCOUTING - KENT STATE**

- Kent State did not have a midweek game, and played two different teams over its opening weekend in Conway, S.C. Two games against the host Coastal Carolina that they split, and lost a single neutral site game against West Virginia.
- The Kent State "Golden Flashes" are located in Kent, Ohio, about 50 miles southwest of Cleveland. The university is the third-largest in the state sporting an enrollment of 39,367, which trails Ohio State and Cincinnati.
- Kent State was picked to finish third in the 2022 preseason MAC coaches' poll.
- The Golden Flashes kept their streak of 30-win seasons alive last year with their 30-26 final record. They have had at least 30 wins in every full season since 1999.
- Projected Friday night starter Richie Dell has allowed three earned runs or fewer in five of last six starts.
- Clean-up hitter, and catcher, Justin Miknis (Jr.) was named the 2022 Preseason MAC Player of the Year.
- Centerfielder Collin Mathews (Sr.) is coming off an All-MAC and All-Region season, as he led the Flashes in RBI (49), doubles (14), and steals (17).

NOT THE FIRST TIME TO LUBBOCK FOR KENT STATE, BUT FIRST TIME TO SEE TECH

A NEW OPENING WEEKEND OPPONENT

This weekend's pairing topples a two-year trend of hosting Houston Baptist the opening weekend in the 2020 and 2021 seasons. The 2021 version was a 3-game sweep that included a 7-inning run rule victory on Friday, and weather for the most part held up for the mid-February slate. In 2020, the opening Friday game could come close to mirroring what's in store in 2022 as the first pitch temperature was 36 degrees at 1 p.m. against HBU in 2020. The high temperature this Friday is expected to be 40 degrees.

DaDaDa-DaDaDa

Saturday of Texas Tech's opening weekend provided theatrics from centerfielder Dillon Carter as he robbed Auburn of a home run as he leapt over the right-centerfield fence in the bottom of the seventh inning at Globe Life Field. It registered No. 6 on that Saturday night's edition of #SCTop10 plays on SportsCenter. A couple facts that make the story wilder:

- Carter robbed Auburn's Cole Foster, who is from Plano, Texas, and the Big 12 and SEC foe knew one another quite well. Foster was Carter's summer-baseball teammate on the Dallas Tigers. The two caught up with one another on the phone after the game to have some friendly banter about the play.
- Texas Tech baseball was not the only Texas Tech program highlighted on this particular Saturday as Texas Tech basketball checked in at No. 7 and Texas Tech softball checked in at No. 2 to give the nation a solid dose of the Red Raiders' athletic achievements taking up three spots in a single Top10.

HEY FRESHMAN

The young guns of Texas Tech's 2022 squad have made its presence known just four games in the season. Most notably right fielder Owen Washburn (4 starts), catcher Hudson White (4 starts) and RHP Trendan Parish.

- Washburn: leads team in batting average (.357), runs scored (5) and hits (5), and is second behind Jace Jung in base on balls (4). The highlight came in his first collegiate game, providing the 2-out, walk-off single to give Tech a 7-6 win against Michigan on Feb. 18.
- White: the Red Raiders lost the veteran leadership behind the dish in Braxton Fulford, who started 144 games and was drafted in the sixth round by the Colorado Rockies in last year's MLB Draft. The freshman from Byron Nelson HS in Keller, Texas has stepped right in to be a steady presence for this year's pitching staff.
- Parish: shares the team-lead in innings pitched (6.0) with Chase Hampton. Parish owns a 0.00 ERA and is the only pitcher on staff to have a clean sheet of those that have pitched 5.0 innings or more. He relived Birdsell on Saturday against Auburn, and finished the game's last four innings, and closed Tuesday's game in 2.0 innings and earned his first career save.

NO FLY ZONE

While typically a nickname in football, the outfielders of the Texas Tech baseball team like to think of their territory as a no-fly zone. This was demonstratively shown in two instances over the first four games after Dillon Carter's SportsCenter worthy catch last Saturday versus Auburn, and again last time out when left fielder Dalton Porter crashed into the fence to halt a potential multi-base hit. Carter has started all four games in centerfield, Owen Washburn all four games in right field, and Cooper Swanson and Porter have split time in left field, two games each. Carter said after Tuesday's game, "You see all of us out there putting our bodies on the line for the guys up on the hill that are dealing for us. From the standpoint of being fearless, that's how you have to play outfield, you can't be scared of hitting the wall or missing a diving catch. Our thing out there is "no fly zone," we take that to heart, no matter who is in the corners, or who's in center, if it's hit in the air it's expected to be caught."

RED RAIDER NATION TRAVELS

Saturday's games at the State Farm Showdown were the highest neutral site attendance (10,515) of the season, and the seventh-biggest crowd in college baseball during opening weekend. A large contingent of that crowd was from the scarlet and black as "Raider, Power" chants even broke out during Saturday's opening game between K-State and Michigan, which was about 2 p.m. when the Texas Tech basketball game went final, prior to the baseball team's 3 p.m. scheduled game against Auburn.

Notes

EARN IT IN LEAGUE PLAY

Texas Tech was voted third in the 2022 Big 12 Baseball Preseason Poll, the conference revealed on Jan. 27. The league's nine head coaches voted the order and were not permitted to vote for their own team.

Positioned No. 3, the Red Raiders face their first uphill fight after four-straight seasons being pegged the preseason favorite (2018-2021). The last time Tech was not picked preseason No. 1, they were slotted third in 2017, which marked, at the time, the Red Raiders' highest preseason ranking since being picked third in 2000. In 2017, the Red Raiders won the Big 12 regular season title and hosted a regional as the No. 5 national seed.

Texas received eight first place votes for a total of 64 points to nab the top spot and its first time being atop the preseason league poll since 2010. Oklahoma State followed in second with 52 points and one first place vote while Texas Tech was third with 49 points. TCU and Baylor round out the top five with 48 and 33 points, respectively. Oklahoma (25), Kansas State (23), West Virginia (20) and Kansas (10) wrap up the ledger.

JUNG FAVORITE TO REPEAT AS BIG 12 PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Texas Tech sophomore infielder Jace Jung was named the Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year, the conference announced on Jan 26. The 2022 Big 12 preseason awards were selected in a vote of the league's nine head coaches, who could not vote for their own players. Jung, also a unanimous first team selection, was the sole honoree from the Red Raiders' squad among preseason award recognition. Jung was the Big 12 Player of the Year in 2021, hitting .337 for the Red Raiders and led the Big 12 with 21 home runs. The infielder from San Antonio was a consensus All-American in 2021 and was selected as the NCBWA National Freshman Hitter of the Year.

BACK ON THE GOLDEN SPIKES WATCH LIST

USA Baseball announced Texas Tech sophomore infielder Jace Jung to its preseason Golden Spikes Award watch list on Feb. 15, beginning the process of identifying the top amateur baseball player in the country for the 2022 season. The 2022 preseason watch list features 55 of the nation's top amateur players from high school and college baseball. Jung headlines a group of six 2021 Golden Spikes Award semifinalists, joined by Landon Sims (Mississippi State), Jacob Berry (LSU), Austin Knight (Charlotte), Ethan Long (Arizona State), and Paul Skenes (Air Force). Berry, Jung, Knight, and Sims were also named to the midseason watch list in 2021.

COULD JUNG GIVE TECH ITS' THIRD?

The Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Award (BBCSA) presented by SR Bats announced Jace Jung as part of its watch list for the 2022 college baseball season. The BBCSA is based on performance at the plate, academics and personal integrity. Jung was one of four finalists for the award in 2021. His brother Josh Jung won the award in 2019 for Texas Tech, and fellow Red Raider Hunter Hargrove won the award in 2017.

CONSENSUS PRESEASON FIRST-TEAM ALL-AMERICAN

The preseason recognition rolled in one by one leading up to the season for Jace Jung. Each of the following organizations named Jung a first-team preseason All-American.

TECH BASEBALL IN HIGH DEMAND

For the eighth-consecutive year, the Texas Tech baseball allotment of season tickets sold out. The anticipation for the 2022 baseball season to get started is at an all-time high for the Red Raiders' fan base as the team qualified for the NCAA Super Regional round for the third consecutive season, and fifth time in program history in 2021, and have been ranked as high as No. 4 nationally in respective 2022 preseason polls.

More than 2,750 season tickets have been sold for the 2022 season, establishing a new season ticket sales record. It is the eighth sell-out in 10 years under head coach Tim Tadlock and his staff's leadership.

WHERE'S THE LONG BALL

The Red Raiders were one of the top home run hitting teams in the country last season with 90 dingers on the year, which ranked 10th in the country. The 90 home runs were the most by a Tech club in 23 years when it hit 95 in 1998. Oddly in 2022 through four games, there has yet to be a Red Raider home run.

PRESEASON BALL WITH THE RANGERS

The Texas Tech baseball team hosted an exhibition contest on Oct. 25, 2021 against the Texas Rangers Instructional League team. The Red Raiders won 14-11 in a 12 inning scheduled contest. Tech led by as much as nine in the game, taking an 11-2 lead into the ninth inning. The Red Raiders were led by four players who tallied two hits each in Parker Kelly, Cole Stilwell, and newcomers Owen Washburn and Hudson White. Stilwell went 2-of-3, and tallied the Red Raiders' sole home run on the night, hammering a 3-run shot over the left-field fence in the 10th, and added a single in the first. On top of his two hits, he drew three walks. Alike Stilwell, Jace Jung drew three walks, and got on base a fourth time with an RBI double that he roped to the centerfield wall in the third, scoring Dillon Carter who found the base pads via base on balls earlier in the inning. Brandon Birdsell got the start, and struck out three while on the mound for his one inning of work that was followed by a bevy of Red Raider pitchers throughout the night.

2021 SEASON REVIEW

Tech's 2021 season was one that saw a squad rally together and fight through a slow start and a season that plagued them with injuries. The Red Raiders won 14 in a row after its opening series. Tech finished 39-17, including 27 wins in the friendly confines of Rip Griffin Park. The team was rewarded with a No. 8 national seed in the NCAA tournament and hosted a regional for the fifth-straight year and qualified to host a Super Regional for the third time in the last five completed seasons. Tech's loss to Stanford marked the first time the Red Raiders did not advance out of the Super Regional, having been 4-0 in such series previously.

After the season, Texas Tech turned in the second-most Major League Baseball Draft selections of any team in the country with nine. Despite only a 20-round draft, Tech boasted its third-highest draft haul in school history, matching its total from 2012 while only trailing the 11 Red Raiders picked following the 2018 season and 10 chosen in 2016. Second baseman Jace Jung was heralded with many season accolades including being named a consensus All-American and Academic All-American.

LET'S MAKE IT FOUR

Only two other programs in the country have hosted a Super Regional three-consecutive seasons. The Red Raiders' have hosted a Super Regional five times in program history, and until faltering last season against Stanford, has advanced to the College World Series in their four previous tries.

5-STRAIGHT REGIONALS IN LUBBOCK

For five-consecutive postseasons, the Red Raiders have been one of 16 host sites selected to host the regional round by the NCAA Selection Committee. Texas Tech is the only program in the country to host every year since 2016. It was the first time in school history Tech secured hosting an NCAA Regional in five-straight seasons, and it was the eighth time overall. The Red Raiders have played regional action in Lubbock in 1996, 1997, 1999, 2016, 2017, 2018, 2019 and 2021.

THE LUBBOCK REGIONAL: WHERE TITANS FALL

Since Texas Tech hosted its first regional under Tadlock in 2016, several name programs have traveled to Lubbock and met their demise, including Arizona (2017), Louisville (2018), Florida (2019), North Carolina (2021) and UCLA (2021).

WAS THAT TADLOCK'S BEST COACHING JOB?

Despite significant injuries issues all season long in 2021, Tim Tadlock had the Red Raiders back in the Super Regionals for the fifth time in seven years and in position for yet another postseason run. The Red Raiders have been ranked in the Top-10 of at least one national poll for 16 of a possible 17 weeks during the 2021 season, despite starting the year with three key arms on the shelf in starters Austin Becker and Hunter Dobbins and lefty reliever Jakob Brustoski. Tech would have a fourth loss in Friday starter Brandon Birdsell. Tech also lost the Big 12 Preseason Player of the Year in Dylan Neuse and a versatile starter in Kurt Wilson around the same time it lost Birdsell. Wilson started the first 26 games of the season between various positions, mostly at third base and in the outfield, before injuring a thumb in the TCU series and missing the next seven weeks. Finally, starting outfielder Dillon Carter missed the first 20 games of the season, returning in the USF series and filling in at center field.

SNEAKY GOOD PITCHING AND DEFENSE

Tech's pitching and defense has quietly moved near the top-35 nationally in three categories last year. Tech was No. 30 in hits allowed per nine innings, No. 28 in double plays and No. 32 in strikeouts per nine innings.

BIG 12 PLAYER OF THE YEAR AWARD RESIDES IN LUBBOCK

The Big 12 Player of the Year trophy has been in the Jung household since 2019 and will remain there until at least 2022 as Jace Jung made it back-to-back Jung's to win the award. Josh Jung won it in 2019 before being picked No. 8 overall in the 2019 MLB Draft. The award was not presented in 2020. A Red Raider has now won four of the last five Big 12 Player of the Year awards - Eric Gutierrez (2016), Hunter Hargrove (2017), Josh Jung (2019), Jace Jung (2021).

TOP-3 FINISH IN CONFERENCE

Texas Tech is the only program in the Big 12 to finish in the top three of the league standings every year since 2016. The Red Raiders wrapped up conference play at 14-10, including series wins over No. 3 Texas and No. 10 TCU. Tech won six of its eight Big 12 series, including three out of the four it played on the road. The Red Raiders finished the regular season strong with series wins in three of its last four series. Tech was especially strong on the back-end of weekend series this season, going a combined 11-5 in middle games and series finales. You could look to a lack of midweek games as a potential reason for a poor record in series openers as the Red Raiders were 2-0 in Big 12 openers following midweek games and just 1-5 in openers following no midweek game.

THE STATE OF TEXAS' TOP ATHLETICS DEPARTMENT

- With all the talk of conference realignment in the air, it's important to remember Texas Tech has led all schools in the state of Texas in the Capital One Cup men's standings in two of the last three complete athletic seasons after finishing third nationally in 2018-19 and then 14th for the 2017-18 athletic year. Below are several other facts regarding Texas Tech's success in competition.
- Since 2017, Texas Tech has had 15 of its 17 athletic programs compete in the NCAA postseason or a bowl game.
- Texas Tech has had six different programs finish among the top-10 teams nationally in their respective sport since 2014 alone.
- The Red Raiders have appeared in 38 bowl games in their history, which ranks tied for third among Big 12 programs and among the top-25 teams in college football history.
- Texas Tech claimed the 2019 Men's Outdoor Track and Field National Championship under head coach Wes Kittley.
- Texas Tech played in the 2019 NCAA Championship Game as well as in two consecutive Elite Eights (2018-19). The Red Raiders are one of four men's basketball programs in the country with multiple Elite Eight appearances over the last three NCAA Tournaments.
- Texas Tech has advanced to the Men's College World Series four times in recent years (2014, 2016, 2018, 2019), which is tied for the most trips to the hallowed grounds in Omaha among teams nationally since 2014.
- Lady Raider Basketball remains one of the top programs in women's college basketball history as Texas Tech ranks 19th all-time among power-five programs with its 925 victories. Backed by the legendary Sheryl Swoopes, the Lady Raiders claimed the NCAA National Championship in 1993, the first team national championship in school history.
- Since joining the Big 12 as a charter member in 1996, Texas Tech has won 27 conference titles, with 11 of those coming in the past six years alone.
- In addition to its athletics success, Texas Tech has unveiled several new facilities in recent years with the opening of the \$48 million Sports Performance Center in 2017, the Cash Family Sports Nutrition Center in 2020 and the \$32.2 million Dustin R. Womble Basketball Center this past May.

- Texas Tech boasts one of the most rabid fan bases in all of college athletics as Red Raider fans have traditionally traveled in droves for bowl trips as well as to basketball games in locations like New York City, Anaheim (CA) and Minneapolis for the Final Four as well as to Omaha for the Men's College World Series.
- To date, Texas Tech has played in the highest-attended games for three bowl games, including two prominent ones in the state of Texas: the Goodyear Cotton Bowl (Dallas), the Academy Sports + Outdoors Texas Bowl (Houston) and the Holiday Bowl (San Diego).
- The Red Raiders had 88,175 fans on tap for the 2009 Cotton Bowl when the Red Raiders faced Ole Miss in the bowl's final game at historic Fair Park. It remains the highest-attended contest in the bowl's history even with the move to AT&T Stadium in Arlington, which can reach over 100,000 fans in capacity.
- Additionally, Texas Tech helped set the Texas Bowl attendance record in 2015 when the Red Raiders faced LSU in NRG Stadium. The bowl drew 71,307 fans that night to see a pair of future NFL standouts in Texas Tech's Patrick Mahomes II and Jaqueem Grant.
- At home, Texas Tech has sold out of season tickets for its baseball program over seven consecutive seasons now and will likely be looking at another sellout in 2022 after the Red Raiders advanced to the NCAA Super Regional round this past June.
- Texas Tech has sold out of season tickets in each of its last two men's basketball seasons, giving the Red Raiders the premier homecourt advantage in college basketball at 15,000-seat United Supermarkets Arena. The Red Raiders averaged a conference-leading 14,057 fans per game during the 2019-20 basketball season.
- On social media, Texas Tech student-athletes earned the highest engagement rate on their posts among peer power-five institutions over the past athletic year. Texas Tech's social media accounts accumulated over 35 million combined video views during the 2020-21 year alone.
- Texas Tech's brand has the ability to reach the nation through its creative social media usage. Texas Tech currently boasts the fifth-highest TikTok following by athletics accounts in the nation.
- Texas Tech is annually one of the top-performing schools among the Collegiate Licensing Company's (CLC) partner institutions, ranking 19th nationally in royalties generated this past year.

A PREMIER RESEARCH INSTITUTION

- Texas Tech University is the flagship institution, with a Moody Aa1 rating, of the five-member Texas Tech University System.
- Texas Tech is one of 16 universities designated as a Carnegie Very High Research Activity Institution and a Hispanic Serving Institution.
- Texas Tech has been named Higher Education Excellence in Diversity award winner in each of the last nine years. The university currently boasts 42 percent of its students identifying as racial-ethnic minorities.
- Texas Tech is a five-star Campus Pride Institution, one of two in Texas, and No. 25 on the Campus Pride Index.
- Texas Tech has awarded over \$170 million in scholarships recently with over 50 percent of students receiving scholarship support.
- Texas Tech boasted more than \$192 million in research expenditures in 2020 alone.

The 2022 season is the 10th as head coach at Texas Tech for Tim Tadlock. During his tenure, Tadlock has built his alma mater into a national powerhouse, leading the Red Raiders to four College World Series in the last seven contested seasons and claiming three of the last five Big 12 Championships.

A two-time National Coach of the Year, Tadlock was named head coach of his alma mater on June 8, 2012, becoming the ninth head coach in program history. He owns a collegiate career record of 775-299 in 18 years as a head coach with nine seasons at Grayson County College (435-127) and nine at Texas Tech (340-172).

Under Tadlock, the Red Raiders have become a national contender year in and year out. Tech is one of four schools in the nation to advance to the College World Series four times since 2014, including consecutive trips in 2018 and 2019 for the first time in school history. Tadlock has put his teams in a position to host five consecutive regionals, making Texas Tech the only school in the country to accomplish the feat. In each of the last five tournaments Tech hosted, Tech was also named a national seed having most recently been the No. 8 seed in 2021.

During Tadlock's nine seasons, the Red Raiders have recorded five 45+ win seasons and three Big 12 titles. Individually, Tech has earned 49 All-America honors, 29 Freshman All-America honors, a College Baseball Foundation National Pitcher of the Year, a Brooks Wallace Award Winner, and two Bobby Bragan Collegiate Slugger Awards. At the conference level, Tech has accumulated 57 All-Big 12 selections, four Big 12 Player of the Years, a Big 12 Pitcher of the Year, two Big 12 Freshman of the Years and a Big 12 Newcomer of the Year.

The Red Raiders have had 59 student-athletes selected in the MLB Draft under Tadlock, including a school-record 11 in 2018. In 2021, a school-record seven Red Raiders were selected within the top-10 rounds. Overall, Tadlock has coached 167 MLB Draft picks, including at least one draft pick during the last 26 seasons and has coached four first-round selections, 18 players taken in the top five rounds and 51 selections in the top-10 rounds of the draft during his coaching career.

With the remarkable team success, Tech fans have packed Rip Griffin Park in Tadlock's nine seasons. In 2015, Texas Tech sold out its season ticket allotment for the first time ever following its first appearance in the CWS. And since, Texas Tech season tickets have been sold out each ensuing season. The 2022 season marked the eighth-straight that season tickets have sold out prior to the start of the season. Tech has consistently ranked among the national leaders in attendance, finishing in the top 15 each year since 2015 while compiling a 164-45 home record in that span.

Tadlock returned to his alma mater for the 2012 season as the program's associate head coach and recruiting coordinator. During his one season in this role, the Red Raiders had a school-record nine MLB Draft picks, including first-round selection center fielder Barrett Barnes, who became the third highest draft pick in school history with the 45th overall pick.

After beginning his college coaching career as an assistant at Hill College (1993-96) for four seasons, Tadlock became the head coach at Grayson County Junior College, where he led the Vikings to back-to-back National Junior College Athletic Association World Series titles in 1999 and 2000. During his nine seasons at Grayson, Tadlock posted a 435-127 (.774) overall record while being named National Coach of the Year following both title runs (1999-2000).

After a prep career at Denton High School and two years at Hill College, Tadlock was a two-year starting shortstop for the Red Raiders while helping Texas Tech to its first-ever 40-win season as a senior in 1991 (42-18). In his two-year career at Tech, Tadlock played in 120 games, batted .289 (120-for-415) with 96 runs scored, 19 doubles, four triples, eight home runs, 68 RBI, 71 walks, 65 strikeouts and was 28-of-41 in stolen bases. Tadlock played for legendary coach Larry Hays while at Texas Tech.

Tadlock graduated with his bachelor's degree in physical education from Texas Tech in May 1992. He also earned a master's degree in education in August 1994 from the University of Texas at Tyler. Tadlock and his wife, Kelly, have two children, daughter, Chloe, and son, Benjamin. Tadlock is originally from Denton, Texas, and was born in 1968.

RED RAIDERS IN THE MLB DRAFT

- Under Tadlock, Texas Tech has had a whopping 59 Red Raiders selected in the MLB Draft since 2013.
- Tech has had multiple draft picks for 31-straight years, the third longest streak in the nation.

team's hitters, while serving as the program's recruiting coordinator. Thomas enters his 17th year in collegiate baseball - his 10th on head coach Tim Tadlock's coaching staff at Tech. He was named assistant coach/recruiting coordinator with the Red Raiders on June 20, 2012. Known as a tireless worker and as one of the top recruiters in college baseball, Thomas has proven his abilities early and often throughout his career at Tech. He was recognized as the ABCA/Baseball America Assistant Coach of the Year in 2017 and by Perfect Game in September 2015 as one of 10 coaches nationally "who are everywhere recruiting." A native of Duncanville, Texas, Thomas played for legendary coach Bob Rombach at Duncanville High School where he led his team to three straight Texas High School state playoff appearances (1998-2000). **ERIC GUTIERREZ, #12**

4th Season at Tech

Coaching Capsule: Former Red Raider All-American first baseman Eric Gutierrez begins his fourth season as a volunteer assistant coach in 2022. He is the acting first base coach for the Red

Raiders. Gutierrez returned to Lubbock to join Tim Tadlock's staff in 2018 after wrapping up a professional career in the Miami Marlins organization. In 2016, Gutierrez was drafted in the 20th round by the Marlins and spent three years with the Batavia Muckdogs, Greensboro Grasshoppers and the Jupiter Hammerheads. Gutierrez, a native of Mission, was a four-year letterwinner and one of the most decorated student-athletes to don the scarlet & black at Texas Tech. He started every game of his collegiate career, primarily at first base, totaling 244 games, the most in school history. Gutierrez still holds four school records, leading the team in eight yearly categories and checks in with 30 marks that rank in the top 10 in the Tech record books.

**RAY HAYWARD**

Coaching Capsule: Ray Hayward enters his 10th season on staff at Texas Tech in 2022, his fifth in the role of special assistant. Hayward was named assistant coach on June 26, 2012, as part of Tim

Tadlock's inaugural staff at Texas Tech, and served in that role for the first five years of his tenure. A former big league pitcher, scouting supervisor and one of the most respected pitching coaches in the country, Hayward came to the South Plains after spending eight years (2005-2012) at the professional ranks as the Midwest scouting supervisor for the Miami Marlins. Hayward spent five seasons in the Big 12 Conference as the pitching coach at his alma mater, Oklahoma, from 2000-2004. Prior to beginning his coaching career, Hayward pitched three seasons in the big leagues with the San Diego Padres (1986-87) and the Texas Rangers (1988). He finished his playing career in the Rangers organization in 1991 before spending six years as an area scout with the Detroit Tigers (1994-99). He returned to Norman as the Sooners pitching coach and recruiting coordinator in 2000, where he helped guide Oklahoma to three NCAA Tournament appearances in five seasons.
