THE GAME

- NC State and Texas Tech will face each other for the first time since 2003 and the sixth time in history. The Wolfpack has won four of the previous matchups, including the last four.
- The Wolfpack's lone loss in the series was in Lubbock in 1952 (7-54).
- The two squads played in Lubbock in 2002 and in Raleigh in 2003. The No. 17 Pack won a shootout in overtime in 2002, with RB T.A. McLendon rushing for a school record five touchdowns in that 51-48 win. In 2003, QB Philip Rivers led NC State to a 49-21 win in Raleigh.
- The Red Raiders trip to Carter-Finley Stadium in 2003 marks the last time a Big 12 school played on the Wolfpack's home field (West Virginia was scheduled to play here in 2018, but the game was cancelled due to Hurricane Florence).

#PACKUNITED WEEK

The week leading up to the Texas Tech game will be Pack United Week for NC State Athletics. #PackUnited, a student-led initiative through the Student-Athlete Advisory Committee, is dedicated to raising awareness about social issues and ensuring justice and fairness for all, in the Raleigh area and beyond.

LB Isaiah Moore and C Grant Gibson were driving forces behind the movement's inception and it's growth since the spring of 2021.

#PackUnited encourages NC State's student-athletes to use their platform to push for change and is focused on three platforms: awareness, action, and education.

McNeill actually served as head coach at Texas Tech for one game: the Alamo Bowl on Jan. 2, 2010, filling in for Leach. The Red Raiders won that game over Michigan State: 41-31.

MORE TTU TIES

Wolfpack cornerbacks coach Brian Mitchell was also on Leach's Texas Tech staff, working with the CBs there from 2006-09.

HOME FIELD ADVANTAGE

NC State enters the Texas Tech game with an 11-game winning streak at Carter-Finley Stadium. That's the fifth-best active home winning streak in the FBS and is the second-longest in the history of Carter-Finley Stadium (which opened in 1966).

NC State posted a 7-0 mark in games played in Carter-Finley in 2021 and has not lost a home game since Nov. 6, 2020. The 2021 Wolfpack was the first squad since 1986 (35 years!) to go undefeated at home (and that squad did post one tie) and one of just six teams in school history (1967, 1972, 1973, 1974, 1986) to post an unblemished record at Carter-Finley Stadium.

The Pack outscored its foes 254-115 (36.3-16.4) at home last season.

TBAKE-AWAY

Nickel Tyler Baker-Williams (known to his teammates as "T-Bake") is having a great start to the 2022 season - his fifth in a Wolfpack uniform. After two games, Baker-Williams leads the ACC and ranks second in the FBS in interceptions. He pulled down his fourth career pick in the win at East Carolina on the Pack defense's second play of the 2022 season.

Last week, when Charleston Southern took the opening kickoff of the second half, the Raleigh native sacked the QB for a 13-yard loss, causing a fumble that was recovered by the Wolfpack. The Pack offense scored on the next play to go up 45-0.

When CSU got the ball back following the Pack touchdown, Baker-Williams picked off his fifth career pass.

SPECIALTIES

It's becoming a tradition. NC State's special teams units have like to score touchdowns. In fact, in the last three games of 2021 and the first game of 2022, NC State's special forces have scored points for the Pack.

In last year's final vs. UNC and then in this year's season opener at ECU, the Pack's punt block unit has blocked a punt and scored touchdowns in incredibly close games.

Last year vs. UNC, Jordan Houston blocked a punt and C.J. Riley recovered it in the end zone for the game's first score. In this year's season opener at ECU, the unit was at it again, as Jasiah Provillon broke through to block an ECU punt, and Sean Brown fell on it in the end zone to give the Pack its first lead of the game (14-7).

It marked the first time since the middle of the 2003 season that NC State had scored off of a blocked punt in back-to-back games. At Texas Tech that season, Manny Lawson blocked a second quarter punt which was recovered in the end zone by Richard Washington. The next week vs. UNC, Lawson recovered a punt blocked by Pat Thomas in the end zone.

In the previous two games - last year vs. Wake Forest and Syracuse - Zonovan Knight scored on kick-off returns in back-to-back games last season.

GETTING PICKY

Maybe it was the new Turnover Bone. Maybe it was just defensive coordinator Tony Gibson looking for what he calls 'dawgs' in the film room. But the Pack defense has improved in a crucial area over the last couple of seasons: picking off the opposing QB.

In 12 games of 2021 and the first two in 2022, the NC State defense has recorded 19 interceptions. The Pack had only two games last season without an INT.

In 2020 and 2019 combined – 24 total games – the Pack's defense only picked off 14 passes, and went 16 games with zero INTs, including a stretch of seven straight in 2019.

The Pack has recorded an INT in seven straight games dating back to last season. This ties as the longest such streak for NC State since the final five games of the 2015 season and then first two games in 2016. The Pack had INTs in eight straight games with a pick in 2011.

COLLIN THE CANNON

PK Collin Smith waited his turn. Prior to this season, he had appeared in one game - kicking off one time against UNC in 2020. This season, however, he is proving to be a pivotal part of the Pack's special teams.

Smith is serving as the Pack's kickoff specialist this season, and after his performance against Charleston Southern on Saturday, it's a role that he's performing quite well.

In his first game handling kickoffs in Carter-Finley Stadium, the local product from Gibsonville boomed all 10 of his kickoffs for a touchback against Charleston Southern.

On the season, 10 of his 14 kickoffs (71.4%) have gone for a touchback.

MAKING IT COUNT

Sophomore running back Demie Sumo-Karngbaye - known to his teammates as "Sharko" - has definitely made his presence known in 2022. After playing in six games last season as a true freshman, only on special teams, he has proven hard to bring down while rushing 21 times for 149 yards this season.

Do the math. That's a 7.10 yards per carry average - which ranks second-best in the ACC and 12th in the FBS.

In just two games, Sumo-Karngbaye has notched seven explosive plays - more than double any other Pack player. In game 2, five of his seven rushes were for 10 or more yards. In the opener, he had two explosive plays, including a 24-yard touchdown romp and another 22-yard run.

The Willingboro, N.J., native never took a recruiting visit to NC State before arriving on campus in the summer of 2021.

POLL POSITION

The Wolfpack entered the season with its highest national ranking in 47 years.

With a preseason rank of No. 13 in the AP poll and USA Today Coaches' polls, it ties as the best mark in school history (in 1975, Lou Holtz's squad opened the season ranked 13th).

After a close win at ECU, NC State dropped in the polls, but is back up to 16th in the AP and 12th in the USA Today/AFCA ranking this week.

It marks the first time NC State has ranked in the top 20 for three straight polls since the 2002 season - when the Pack spend nine straight weeks in the top-20.

LEARY LEGS IT

Devin Leary had two rushing touchdowns in his career heading into last Saturday's game vs. Charleston Southern. By the time the game was over, he had four.

**DLEARY DELIVERS**

When you start thinking about what NC State starting quarterback Devin Leary does best, it's hard to pin it down.

He just ... delivers.

Delivering Results:

Over the past two seasons, Leary posts a 14-3 record as NC State's starting quarterback.

Delivering Touchdowns:

For his career, Leary has thrown for 56 touchdowns (while starting 22 games) - the no. 6 mark in school history and just three TDs from ranking in the top five.

In 2021, Leary threw for a school-record 35 touchdowns, breaking the mark previously held by Philip Rivers. He led the ACC in TD throws vs. league opponents with 27.

Delivering Superlatives:

Leary finished 2021 with 35 passing touchdowns and just five interceptions, while racking up 3,433 yards through the air. Only three other QBs have done that (35 TDs, five or less picks and 3,400+ yards) in the playoff era: Mac Jones (Alabama), Marcus Mariota (Oregon) and Cody Kessler (USC).

Delivering When It Counts:

Leary had 11 TD passes in the 4Q or OT last season. He was the only QB in the FBS with 10+ TDs and 1 or 0 INTs in the 4th quarter or OT last year and only the 3rd ACC QB to do that in the playoff era.

NOT Delivering When It Doesn't Count:

Last season, Leary had eight games with multiple TD passes and no interceptions. Going back to 2004, no ACC QB has had more. He currently ranks second in NC State history in career interception avoidance.

In the last 10 years, there have been just four other FBS quarterbacks to throw at least 35 touchdown passes and no more than five interceptions: Mac Jones (2020), Justin Fields (2019), Cody Kessler (2014) and Marcus Mariota (2014).

Leary is the only quarterback in ACC history to hit the 35-5 threshold in a season.

QB1 scored on a 12-yard rush in first quarter - showing some pretty impressive moves to get to the endzone - and then again in Q2.

LEARY LETS IT FLY

Devin Leary not only rushed for two scores in the win over CSU, but he threw for another four. With six touchdowns for the day, he tied the school record for single-game TD responsibility - tying marks held by Philip Rivers (vs. Navy, 2002) and Mike Glennon (vs. Maryland, 2011).

For his career, Leary has been responsible for 60 TDs (56 pass, 4 rush) and tied Rivers and Russell Wilson for the single-season record with 37 last season.

CLEAR THE BENCHES

We’re calling it a school record. A total of 83 players saw action in the win over Charleston Southern.

Fourteen offensive linemen saw action, while 13 wide receivers and 13 linebackers got into the res-sounding win.

TOUCHDOWN, THOMAS!

When wide receiver Thayer Thomas was being coached in high school by NC State’s all-time touchdown reception leader Torry Holt, he had no idea that one day his name would be second to Holt’s in the NC State record book in that category.

Thomas hauled in eight touchdown catches last season and one in the opener - giving him 21 for his career. That mark that is now tied for second in school history with the great Jericho Cotchery and trails Holt’s career mark by 10.

Thomas has pulled down a touchdown reception in 16 different games during his career, two more than any other active player.

The Wolfpack posts a 7-0 record when he has at least 80 yards receiving.

THOMAS ON THE RETURN

In addition to catching touchdowns, Thayer Thomas has also been pretty good as a punt returner throughout his career. His 11.45 career punt return average ranks fifth in school history, but in 2022, his mark is double that.

Thomas is currently the FBS leader in punt return average with a 25.7 mark (even though he has just three returns for the season).

LINE LONGEVITY

Although the Wolfpack has a new starter at left tackle this season (Anthony Belton is replacing first-round draft pick Ickey Ekwonu) and left guard Chander Zavala is back after playing just five games before an injury last season, the entire right side of the line has been through wars with the Wolfpack.

NC State’s center (Grant Gibson), right guard (Dylan McMahon) and right tackle (Bryson Speas)

have combined to play almost 6,000 career snaps (5,979 to be exact), 129 total games and 88 total starts.

Gibson and Speas - both playing in their fifth season - have each played in 51 career games (tied for the most on the team) and Gibson has 88 starts.

NOBODY'S DUNN IT BETTER

When kicker Christopher Dunn's career at NC State is over, there is a good chance that his name will be etched in the Wolfpack record book forever.

Now in his fifth season as NC State's starting kicker, Dunn set career records for scoring, PATs and field goals in his third and fourth seasons. Now he's simply making sure no one will ever break them.

Dunn has now scored 393 career points, connected on 71 field goals and has 180 PATs to his credit. He is tied for eighth in ACC history in kick scoring, tied for ninth in overall scoring and tied for seventh in FGs.

SNAP DECISION

NC State long snapper Joe Shimko has snapped for every placekick since the beginning of the 2019 season. He boasts 183 long snaps and 192 short snaps (that's 375 total snaps for his career with ZERO bad snaps!)

Shimko was named to the 2022 Patrick Mannelly Award Watch List - given to the nation's best player at his position. Before this season, only seniors were eligible for the award, which is named after the former NFL long snapper, and will be presented to the player judged to be the best FBS long snapper.

Last season, Shimko was named a fourth-team All-American according to Phil Steele.

THREE CENTURIES (PLUS A DECADE)

NC State may have one of the most experienced coaching staffs in the nation for 2022. The Wolfpack's 10 assistant coaches + head coach Dave Doeren combine to boast 310 years of coaching experience. That's more than THREE CENTURIES!

The Wolfpack is the *only* staff in the ACC to return all of its full-time position coaches from a year ago.

ESTABLISHING THE CULTURE

Anyone who spends any time around the NC State Football program will tell you that the culture might be its strongest asset. Dave Doeren introduced his IPack1Goal brand when he became head coach in December of 2012, describing it as a united mission to win a championship.

In 2016, when former quarterback Philip Rivers spoke to the team, he added to that, saying that the Wolfpack played "hard, tough, together."

Those aren't just hashtags for the Wolfpack, they've become a way of life. And stability at the head coach position has definitely given the Wolfpack an advantage when it comes to building that culture and passing it down.

Doeren, who is in his 10th season at NC State, boasts the second-longest current tenure in the ACC and the 11th among FBS coaches.

SUCCESS

Stability at the head coach position has also resulted in unprecedented success for the Wolfpack under head coach Dave Doeren.

Here are some of the highlights from Doeren's tenure at NC State:

- Ranks second in school history in career wins at NC State (66).
- Has led the Wolfpack to five of the top 20 win totals in school history.
- The Wolfpack has qualified for seven bowls in his previous nine years as head coach - more than any coach in school history.
- His 2020 squad set a school record with seven ACC wins.
- His players have won three national awards (Bradley Chubb won the Nagurski & Hendricks Award in 2017 and Garrett Bradbury won the Rimington Award in 2018).
- Has had 23 players drafted by the NFL, including 16 in the last five drafts.
- Boasts three first-round draft picks.

CAPTAINS

The coaching staff isn't the only part of the team that boasts experience heading into 2022 - the player leaders also have a pretty long track record.

Fifth-year players Grant Gibson and Isaiah Moore were selected as captains for the third-straight year, marking the first time in school history that players were three-year captains.

Preseason ACC Player of the Year Devin Leary will serve in that leadership role for the second season and linebacker Drake Thomas, who finished the 2021 season as captain, will return in that role for 2022.

Joining them will be offensive lineman Bryson Speas and nose tackle Cory Durden.

"We have great leadership throughout our team, but these are the best of the best," said Doeren. "They have earned the trust and respect of their teammates and coaches and really embody the one Pack, one goal culture that we have established here."

DADDY DUTY

The Wolfpack's first and second-team players at nose guard have more than their position in common.

Corey Durden has two children - Jaxxon (2) and Oliviana (8 mos), while Josh Harris is the father of Aylah - who just turned 1.

DRAKE-ING IT HAPPEN

A first-team All-ACC performer in 2021, Drake Thomas ranked fourth among all Power 5 LBs (with 200+ snaps in coverage) in yard allowed per target at 3.1. That was the top mark in the ACC.

With a mark of 22.9%, Thomas posted the second-best pressure rate

among ACC LBs (min 75 pass rush snaps) behind Trenton Simpson and ranked fifth among all P5 linebackers.

His 21 tackles at or behind the line of scrimmage on run plays, best in the ACC and tied for fourth nationally.

Thomas was one of only 10 P5 LBs last year who:

- had 90+ tackles
- had 10+ TFL
- Did not allow a TD in coverage (min 100 coverage snaps)

Since 2018, only 10 ACC LBs have hit those marks in a season. Four of them are played for the Wolfpack: Thomas in '21, Isaiah Moore & Payton Wilson in '20 and Germaine Pratt (Cincinnati Bengals) in 2018.

WATCH OUT FOR THE WOLFPACK

NC State made its presence known on the preseason watch lists for national awards, as nine different players were named to the lists for 12 different awards.

Quarterback Devin Leary garnered nods on four different watch lists (Maxwell, O'Brien, Manning and Walter Camp Player of the Year), while linebacker Drake Thomas is on three (Butkus, Bednarik and Nagurski).

BROTHERS

There are four sets of brothers on the 2022 NC State football squad.

Crowell: Micah redshirted last season at wide receiver while recovering from a high school injury, while Isaiah is a true freshman nickel.

Seabrough: See if you can tell these two apart when they're not in their jerseys. Ced and Fred are the same height (6'4), within five pounds of the same weight (245/250) and both play tight end.

Thomas: Drake was a first-team All-ACC linebacker for the Wolfpack while Thayer is one of the top receivers in school history.

Vann: Davin is in his third year playing DE/DT while Rylan is a true freshman offensive lineman.

BABY BROTHERS

In addition to the four sets of brothers currently on the squad, there are four current players whose older brothers are Wolfpack alums.

Throwing it back the furthest is cornerback Darius Edmundson, whose older brother Duane Herndon lettered on the defensive line under head coach Chuck Amato from 2003-05.

Reserve quarterback Ben Finley is the younger brother of Ryan, who was the Pack's starting QB from 2016-18 and ranks second in school history in career passing yards (10,505).

Offensive lineman Timothy McKay is the younger brother of Matthew McKay, another former Wolfpack quarterback, who started the first five games of 2019.

And finally, true freshman Ashton Locklear is the second in his family to run with the Pack. His older brother Gavin played wide receiver from 2015-17 and then went on to become a graduate assistant coach for the offense. He is now the wide receivers coach at Stony Brook.

THE BREAKFAST CLUB

Every Sunday during the football season, the Wolfpack offensive staff hands out bottles of syrup to his players in commemoration of their pancake blocks from the previous game.

GIVE A DAWG A BONE

Defensive coordinator Tony Gibson says he wants 'dawgs' on his defense, aka tenacious, relentless, aggressive players. To commemorate those who play with those characteristics, the defensive staff introduced TAKEAWAY BONE in 2020.

When a Wolfpack defender recovers a fumble or intercepts a pass, the BONE comes out on the sideline. The player who got the takeaway signs it and at the end of the season, whoever has signed it the most times gets to keep the bone.

THE JUICE SQUAD

One of the factors behind the Wolfpack's success in recent games has been the contributions of the players on the bench - otherwise known as the JUICE SQUAD.

Head coach Dave Doeren challenged the players who are redshirting, injured or otherwise not playing on the sidelines to become a factor in the Wolfpack's home games but helping get the crowd into the game and loudly supporting the players on the field.

You can see that group on the sidelines at Carter-Finley waving towels, jumping up and down ... basically bringing the juice!

When NC State played at East Carolina to open the season, the entire juice squad was able to come down on game day to be on the sidelines.

HOME OPENERS

NC State has won all 10 of its home openers under head coach Dave Doeren. And the Wolfpack has not just won, but won big.

Doeren's previous nine home openers have been won by an average of 24.5 points (401-156). The Pack has also scored 45+ points in each of the last three (55 in 2022 vs. Charleston Southern, 45 in 2021 vs. UCF, 45 in 2020 vs. Wake Forest).

Overall, NC State has won 13 straight home openers, with the last loss against South Carolina in 2009 (final score 7-3).

AGAINST FCS OPPONENTS

Under Doeren, the Pack has posted a perfect 10-0 record against FCS foes.

NC State has outscored its FCS opponents 388-99 (38.8-9.9) under Doeren, and has recorded three shutouts.

CHAIRMAN OF THE BOARD

In January, NC State Director of Athletics Boo Corrigan was named the selection committee chair for the College Football Playoff (CFP). Corrigan, who is in the second year of a three-year term at a member of the CFP selection committee, will spend part of the 2022 season commuting back and forth between Raleigh and Texas as the committee begins its weekly rankings.

He will also serve as the spokesperson for the CFP committee following each week's picks.

NO. 1

Since 2014, NC State head coach Dave Doeren has honored a member of the Wolfpack squad by giving them the No. 1 jersey. The 2022 campaign will mark linebacker Isaiah Moore's *third* wearing that special number.

Moore was only the second underclassman to earn the privilege (Jaylen Samuels wore the No. 1 jersey as a junior and senior) when he first wore the jersey in 2020.

Moore has also been the de facto leader of the team's involvement in the #PackUnited movement, which stands out against racial violence and social justice.

Heading into the 2021 season, eight former Wolfpack defensive linemen are currently on NFL squads. Seven have been drafted over the last five years, including three in the last three NFL Drafts.

Highlighting the group are the four d-linemen drafted in 2018 - all now

entering their five NFL seasons. Bradley Chubb made his first Pro Bowl last season with the Denver Broncos, Justin Jones is a projected starter for the Chicago Bears while B.J. Hill played in a Super Bowl last season with the Bengals and Kentavious Street (New Orleans Saints) is looking to provide depth with his squad.

The 2020 draft saw Larrell Murchison selected by the Tennessee Titans and James Smith-Williams by the Washington Commanders. Alim McNeill was a third-round selection by the Detroit Lions in 2021 and started as a rookie.

Although he went undrafted in 2015, T.Y. McGill is entering his eighth NFL season and is now with the Minnesota Vikings. Daniel Joseph signed with the Buffalo Bills in 2022.

RUN IT BACK

To say that the 2022 Wolfpack is the most experienced in school history would be an understatement. Not only did the Pack return 10 starters on defense and seven on offense, but a total of 11 players decided to RUN IT BACK in 2022.

Those 11 players, all who started at least one game for the Pack in 2021, decided to return to NC State for their fifth (or more!) year of play for 2022, including six players on the defensive side of the ball, four on offense and the leading scorer in school history (K Christopher Dunn).

Those players have now combined to play 480 career games and had 333 total starts.

QUICK HITTERS

- OC/QB coach **Tim Beck** attended the high school that has served as the birthplace of college coaches: Cardinal Mooney HS in Youngstown, Ohio. Fellow football coaches Bo Pelini, Carl Pelini, Bob Stoops, Mark Stoops, and Mike Stoops also graduated from Cardinal Mooney.
- Head coach **Dave Doeren** planned to become an orthopaedic surgeon following graduation from Drake and even took the MCAT exams. But after working a seven-on-seven camp one summer he fell in love with coaching and never went back.
- NC State's all-time leading scorer **Christopher Dunn** honed his kicking skills on a goal he welded himself in his yard as a freshman in high school.
- **Grant Gibson's** grandfather, Harvey Gantt, was the first black student to attend Clemson University and the first black mayor of Charlotte. The Gantt Center for African-American Arts+Culture is named in his honor. His mother Sonja was a long-time news anchor, working at WGN in Chicago and WCNC in Charlotte.
- When he was 10 years old, RB **Jordan Houston** was the second-fastest kid in the U.S. in the 100 meters competing for USA Track & Field.
- QB **Devin Leary** is actually left-handed. When he was a kid, he wanted to play baseball with his brother and only a right-handed glove was available, so he began to throw with his right hand.
- Freshman offensive lineman **Jacarrius Peak** was featured in the Netflix Series Titledown High, which chronicled Valdosta High School.
- When CB **Derrek Pitts** was six years old, playing for the South Dekalb Saints, a midget league team in Atlanta, he took his first handoff and ran nearly 60 yards in the wrong direction before spiking the ball in the end zone and looking for teammates to celebrate with. Upon realizing his mistake, he promptly picked the ball up and weaved his way 100 yards the other way for a real score.
- Long snapper **Joe Shimko** raised \$160,000 in a fundraiser over the summer for the Monmouth Ocean Foundation for Children and the Red Bank Food Bank in his home state of New Jersey. He raised so much money that he was able to take \$25,000 and donate it to GiGi's Playhouse - a down syndrome achievement center in Raleigh.
- The Pack has a Thomas brother starting on both sides of the ball: **Thayer Thomas** at WR and **Drake Thomas** at linebacker. When they started in the same game for the first time in 2019, there were the first brothers to start at the same time since DaJuan and DeAndre Morgan started at SAF and CB in 2007.
- **Payton Wilson's** brother Bryse is a pitcher for the Pittsburgh Pirates (formerly the Atlanta Braves).
- Graduate transfer **Chandler Zavala** is the son of Demetrio Zavala, a chef and "Chopped" Grand Champion on the Food Network.

One of the landmarks of North Carolina's capital city, Carter-Finley Stadium has gained a national reputation as being one of the toughest places to play. The home of the Wolfpack, which celebrated its 50th birthday in 2016, boasts 56,919 permanent seats and is surrounded by acres of convenient parking.

The playing surface at Carter-Finley Stadium was reconstructed in 2009. Named for Wolfpack alumnus Wayne T. Day in 2002, it is built to USGA specifications for a golf green.

The south end zone is the home of the 103,254 square-foot Murphy Center, which is the football team's home for training and preparation.

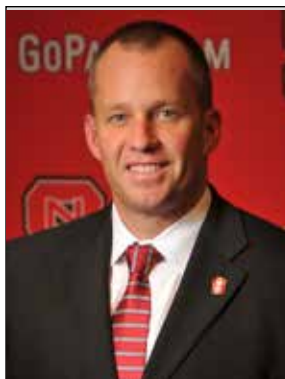
The A.E. Finley Fieldhouse in the north end zone houses two spacious, state-of-the-art locker rooms that can be divided into smaller locker rooms when NC State plays host to high school championship games. There are also halftime locker room areas for the cheerleaders, the dance team, game referees and coaches.

In the summer of 2022, the 117,000 square-foot West Side Tower that stretches from endzone to endzone (previously known as C. Richard Vaughn Towers) was renamed TowneBank Center after TowneBank committed \$5 million to Wolfpack Athletics that will support key upgrades and improvements within Carter-Finley Stadium.

HEAD COACH DAVE DOEREN

- In his 10th season at NC State, his 12th season as a head coach overall.
- Ranks second among the longest tenured coaches in NC State history behind Earle Edwards (17, 1954-70).
- Also ranks second in Wolfpack history in coaching victories (66).
- Has more nine-win campaigns than any coach in school history (three) and has now led five of his nine NC State squads to seasons with eight or more victories.
- The only Power 5 teams with more wins than NC State over the past two years are Alabama, Notre Dame, Georgia, Oklahoma, Oklahoma St., and Clemson.
- Between 2017-22, 19 of his players have been drafted by the NFL - including an ACC-best seven in 2017 - the sixth-highest total nationally. Three of his players have gone on to be first-round picks, including OT Ikem Ekwonu (No. 6 to the Panthers) in 2022.
- In the past two years, NC State ranks second only to Clemson in the ACC in league wins, posting a 13-5 record.
- In 2021, the Pack qualified for the seventh bowl game during his tenure, the most under any coach in program history.
- The Wolfpack has boasted 43 Academic All-ACC performers under his guidance - including a program-high seven in 2021 - and in 2018 had a player named to the prestigious NFF National Scholar-Athlete Team.
- Last season, Doeren's NC State squad became the first since 1986 (35 years!) to go undefeated at home (and that squad did post one tie) and one of just six teams in school history to post an unblemished record at Carter-Finley Stadium.
- In 2021, the Pack qualified for the seventh bowl game during his tenure, the most under any coach in program history.
- Has coached bowl eligible teams in 16 of his 20 years in Division I.
- One of his players won one of college football's national award in 2017 and 2018: Bradley Chubb (2017 Nagurski & Hendricks) and Garrett Bradbury (2018 Rimington).
- Led Northern Illinois to the most successful two years in program history.
- His first Husky squad won the school's first MAC Championship since 1983 and tied the school record with 11 wins.
- His 2012 NIU team repeated as league champ and set a new school mark with 12 victories, earning a trip to the Orange Bowl - the first BCS berth ever for a MAC school.
- Was a finalist for several national coach of the year awards in 2012.
- NIU boasted the nation's longest conference winning streak (17) and never lost a home game during his tenure.
- Spend five seasons in the Big Ten, serving as defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Wisconsin.
- Spent four seasons at Kansas and was on staff when the Jayhawks ended a seven-year bowl drought.
- In 2000 and 2001, coached the secondary at NCAA Division I-AA powerhouse Montana. The Grizzlies advanced to the national title game in 2000, losing by two points, but returned in 2001 to win the championship.
- Montana posted a 28-3 record and won two Big Sky titles during his tenure.
- Planned to go to medical school following college and become an orthopedic surgeon. He took the MCAT but after helping coach high school between his junior and senior years, fell in love with coaching.
- Lettered at tight end at Drake and was an Academic All-American.
- Earned his undergraduate degree in pre-medical biology. Earned his master's from Drake in educational leadership and began work on a Ph.D. while serving as a graduate assistant at the University of Southern California.
