GETTING STARTED

- Today's weather at kickoff: 78 degrees, 5 mph winds from the NE and sunny skies.
- · Texas Tech won the coin toss and chose to receive in the first half. Tarleton State started the second half with the ball.
- Today's game marked the first-ever meeting with Tarleton State.
- Texas Tech wore 1960's inspired throwbacks which were black helmets with red jerseys and white pants against Tarleton State.
- Today's game captains were Tahi Brooks, Myles Cole, Austin McNamara and Cole Spencer.
- Today's attendance: 56,200 (sellout).

TODAY'S WIN...

- Gives Texas Tech a 1-0 all-time record against Tarleton State.
- Gives Texas Tech a 27-1 all-time record against FCS opponents.
 - → The Red Raiders extend their streak of consecutive wins versus FCS opponents to 21
 - → The Red Raiders last loss to an FCS opponent came in 1988 versus North Texas.
- Gives Texas Tech wins in 42 of its last 44 nonconference games at home dating back to 2002.
- Gives Joey McGuire a 7-2 career record versus unranked opponents.
- Gives Joey McGuire wins in five of the Red Raiders last seven games played.
- Gives Joey McGuire a 7-2 record in games played at Jones AT&T Stadium.

TEAM NOTES

- Texas Tech announced its second-straight sellout. The last time Texas Tech announced back-to-back sellouts was in 2018 when Texas Tech hosted Oklahoma (Nov. 3) and Texas (Nov. 10) in back-to-back weeks.
- For the 23rd time in 28 games versus an FCS opponent, Texas Tech scored better than 40 points in the 41-3 win.
- Texas Tech's 21-point first quarter marked the most points in the opening frame since scoring 21 points versus West Virginia on
- · Tarleton State, who entered the game scoring better than 50 points in each of its first two games were held without a touchdown in the 41-3 defeat. The last time Texas Tech did not allow an offensive touchdown in a game was versus UTEP on Sept. 7, 2019.
- · Texas Tech held Tarleton to zero points in the first half. It was the first, first-half shutout for the Red Raiders' defense since being at Kansas on Oct. 16, 2021.
- Texas Tech's defense registered its first three interception game since having three in the Texas Bowl versus Ole Miss.
- Texas Tech did not commit its first penalty until 4:52 remaining in the fourth quarter. Texas Tech finished with two penalties in the game - its fewest in a game since committing one at lowa State on Nov. 19, 2022.
- Texas Tech held Tarleton State to 197 passing yards its first time limit an opponent under 200 yards passing since traveling to lowa State on Nov. 19, 2022.
- The Red Raiders improve to 3-0 when manufacturing three turnovers or better in a game under Joey McGuire.

NOTING THE RED RAIDERS

OFFENSE

OB. Tyler Shough (Sr.)

- Improves to 9-3 in games he's started for Texas Tech.
- · Logged his 10th career rushing touchdown on a 1-yard score in the first quarter.

RB, Tahj Brooks (Sr.)

- Finished with 158 rushing yards the most by a Red Raider since Justin Stockton rushed for 161 yards at Kansas on Oct. 7, 2017.
- Posted his fifth career 100-yard rushing game, which was surpassed in the first half as he owned 140 rushing yards at the break. His previous high in a first half was 90 rushing yards in the Liberty Bowl versus Mississippi State.
- Had a career-high 19 rushing attempts.
- Had two explosive runnings plays, scampering for 38 yards and 22 yards, respectively. The 38-yarder was his fifth-longest career run.

WR, Myles Price (Sr.)

• His third quarter TD catch marked his third of the season, which is the most in a single season in his career. Correspondingly, it is also the first time in his career to catch a TD in three-straight names

WR, Jordan Brown (Jr.)

Set career-high marks for reception (6), receiving yardage (73), career-long catch (46) and caught first career touchdown.

TE, Mason Tharp (Jr.)

· Registered his fifth career touchdown catch, hauling in a 28vard pass from Tyler Shough in the first quarter. It also marks the first time in his career catching touchdown passes in backto-back games.

DEFENSE

OLB, Myles Cole (Sr.)

· Posted his first 2.0 sack game of his career. He entered the game owning 1.5 career sacks, all produced while at Louisiana-Monroe having logged 0.5 sacks in 2021 and a solo sack in 2020

DB, Dadrion Taylor-Demerson (Sr.)

Recorded first interception of the season in the third quarter. He leads all active Red Raiders with seven career INTS.

DB, Malik Dunlap (Sr.)

- · Had two interceptions, each in the first quarter, marking his second and third career interceptions.
- The last time a Red Raider posted two INTs in the same game was Sept. 14, 2019 when Douglas Coleman III had a pair at Arizona
- His first INT of the game was a 52-yard "pick-6" to give Tech a 7-0 lead in the first quarter. It was his second career interception; his first since Oct. 22, 2022 versus West Virginia.
- The interception return for a touchdown was the first by a Red Raider since Marquis Waters did so versus FIU on Sept. 18,

DL, Jaylon Hutchings (Sr.)

· Made his 49th consecutive start, which ranks second among all active FBS players for most consecutive starts.
