GETTING STARTED

- Today's weather at kickoff: 56 degrees, 12 mph winds from the north and overcast skies.
- · West Virginia won the coin toss and chose to receive in the first half. Texas Tech started the second half with the ball.
- Today's game marked the 13th all-time meeting with West Virginia and 12th as Big 12 foes.
- · Texas Tech wore red helmets with white jerseys and red pants against West Virginia.
- Today's game captains were Tony Bradford Jr., Baylor Cupp, Rusty Stats and Rayshad Williams.
- Today's attendance: 50,071.

TODAY'S LOSS.

- Gives Texas Tech a 6-7 all-time record against West Virginia.
 - → The Red Raiders are now 6-6 all-time in Big 12 games against West Virginia.
- Snaps Texas Tech's four-game win streak against the Mountaineers
 - → The Red Raiders last loss to the Mountaineers previously was on Sept. 29, 2018.
- Gives Texas Tech an 0-1 record in Big 12 games for the first time since 2021.
 - \rightarrow That game was also a road game, which took place in Austin, Texas in 2021.
- Gives Texas Tech a 7-3 record versus unranked opponents since the start of the 2022 season.
- Gives Texas Tech a 1-6 record in true road games since the start of the 2022 season.

TEAM NOTES

- After the first half, Texas Tech's three points (trailed, 13-3) were the fewest since posting just three points in the opening half versus Baylor on Oct. 29, 2022.
- After the first half, Texas Tech's 56 yards total offense (outgained 171 to 56) were the fewest since having 31 total yards versus Oklahoma State on Nov. 20, 2021.
- Second game this season the Red Raiders had a pair of double-digit tackles looking back to Dadrion Taylor-Demerson and Ben Roberts doing so versus Oregon.
- Texas Tech was limited to a season-low three explosive plays (20-yard gains or more).
- Tech was 2-for-18 (11.1%) while also 5-of-8 (62.5%) on fourth downs. Heading into this weekend's games, no team had attempted more than six fourth downs in a single game.
- Texas Tech forced two turnovers and won the turnover margin 2-0.
 - → The Red Raiders entered the season 5-0 under head coach Joey McGuire when forcing two or more takeaways. Tech has lost to both Wyoming and West Virginia in 2023 having two turnovers in each of those games.
- Texas Tech committed a season-high nine penalties for a season-high 96 yards.
 - → Four of the nine penalties were called against the defense on third downs which produced first downs for the Mountaineers each time - two holding calls and two pass interference calls.
- · Texas Tech's defense has produced five interceptions over the last two games.

NOTING THE RED RAIDERS

OFFENSE

OB. Behren Morton (So.)

- Was 1-for-7 with 14 yards in the first half having entered beginning with the first offensive play of the second quarter for an injured Tyler Shough. Finished 13-for-37 for 147 yards in his most significant action since exiting last year's TCU contest with an injury on Nov. 5, 2022.
- Tossed his 10th career touchdown pass.

RB, Tahj Brooks (Sr.)

- · Posted his sixth career 100-yard rushing game, which marks back-to-back games eclipsing 100 yards - it's the second time posting back-to-back 100-yard games in his career - he did so for the first time to lead off the 2021 season versus Houston and SFA.
- Brooks set a career-high last week with 158 yards, besting 134 yards set versus Houston in 2021 with 134.
- Had three carries for 18 yards at halftime today, and then exploded for 131 yards in the second half.

WR, Jerand Bradley (So.)

· Caught his third touchdown pass of the season; he has caught a touchdown pass in five of the last six games dating back to the 2022 season.

WR, Xavier White (Sr.)

• Led the team in receiving yards, totaling 45 yards on three catches.

DEFENSE

LB. Jesiah Pierre (Sr.)

- · Led Tech with 12 tackles.
- · At halftime he led Tech with 10 tackles. Versus Wyoming, he had matched his then-career high with seven tackles en route to a then-career-high 14 tackles.

LB, Ben Roberts (RFr.)

- · Posted his second double-digit tackle game in his third career start. He finished with 11 tackles. His career-high was set in his first career start versus Oregon with 12.
- Roberts owns 27 tackles in his three starts this season.

DB, Malik Dunlap (Sr.)

- · Becomes first Red Raider to have an interception in consecutive games since Dadrion Taylor-Demerson ended the 2022 season with interceptions against both Oklahoma and Ole Miss.
- Becomes first Red Raider to combine for three interceptions over a two-game stretch since Douglas Coleman III had same total versus Oklahoma State and Baylor in 2019.

DL, Jaylon Hutchings (Sr.)

- · Made his 50th consecutive start, which ranks second among all active FBS players for most consecutive starts.
- · Set a new career-high for TFLs with 2.5; finishing with six tackles in the contest

SPECIAL TEAMS

P. Austin McNamara (Sr.)

- · His six punts were one shy of his 2022 season-high seven versus Oklahoma. His career-high is nine set versus Oklahoma State in 2021.
- · He averaged 49.0 yards per punt.
