TECH, HOUSTON MEET AS BIG 12 MEMBERS

Texas Tech returns to the friendly confines of Jones AT&T Stadium on Saturday as the Red Raiders will host Houston in their Big 12 home opener. Texas Tech has won 10 of the past 11 meetings against the Cougars dating back to their time together in the Southwest Conference, including each of the last five contests as non-conference opponents. This will be the first meeting between the two schools as Big 12 members, which will come in front of a sellout crowd. Joey McGuire is 7-2 in home games as head coach of the Red Raiders.



BACK-TO-BACK BIG GAMES FOR BROOKS

Tahj Brooks is coming off back-to-back impressive performances on the ground as the senior set a career high with 158 rushing yards versus Tarleton State, only to follow it with 149 yards this past weekend at West Virginia. Brooks is the first Red Raider to rush for at least 140 yards in consecutive games since DeAndre Washington combined for 421 yards over the final two games of the 2015 regular season versus Kansas State and Texas. Brooks enters this weekend ranked 12th in the FBS with 417 rushing yards.



DEFENSE CUTTING DOWN ON EXPLOSIVES

Texas Tech entered the 2023 season with high expectations defensively due to the amount of experience returning, especially up front with veterans Tony Bradford Jr. and Jaylon Hutchings, a preseason All-Big 12 selection with 50 starts over his career. One goal for the Red Raiders, though: cutting down on explosive plays. Texas Tech managed to do that through four games this season as the Red Raiders lead the Big 12 and rank tied for 16th in the FBS with only 11 plays allowed of 20 or more yards, which includes only one rush going that distance.

Texas Tech has not allowed any points on the opening drive of the game or the second half this season. In fact, the Red Raiders have surrendered just four first downs in those situations.

Austin McNamara ranks second in the FBS after averaging 48.6 yards per punt through four games this season. That mark would snap his school and Big 12 record for single-season punting average.

Malik Dunlap shares the FBS lead with three interceptions, all of which have come the past two games. He is the first Red Raider with three picks over a two-game span since Douglas Coleman III in 2019.

TEAM NOTEBOOK

INSIDE THE HOUSTON SERIES

- Texas Tech and Houston will meet for the 35th time in program history this weekend and the first time as Big 12 members. The Cougars lead the all-time series with an 18-15-1 advantage despite having dropped 10 of the past 11 games versus the Red Raiders, including each of the previous five meetings. A win over Houston this Saturday would mark the longest winning streak for Texas Tech all-time in the series.
- While this will be the first meeting as Big 12 members, it won't be the first as conference foes as Texas Tech and Houston were previously counterparts in the Southwest Conference up until its closing following the 1995 season. The Red Raiders were only 7-12-1 against Houston during the SWC era but went 5-1 over six non-conference games as Texas Tech recorded wins in 2010 at home (35-20), in 2017 at Houston (27-24), in 2018 at home (63-49), in 2021 in the Texas Kickoff at NRG Stadium (38-21) and a year ago in a double overtime victory at home (33-30).
- Houston is the lone new member of the Big 12 that has faced Texas Tech multiple times in its history. The Red Raiders have only played BYU once previously in 1940 as its matchup later in the season with UCF will be the first in school history. Likewise, Texas Tech only has one previous matchup with Cincinnati, which came during the 1960 campaign.

RED RAIDERS IN BIG 12 HOME OPENERS

- Texas Tech is 16-11 all-time in Big 12 Conference home openers entering this weekend despite having nine losses since 2010. The Red Raiders have split their last four conference home openers, defeating No. 19 Texas last season and No. 21 Oklahoma State in 2019, while falling to TCU in 2021 and No. 8 Texas in overtime in 2020.
- The matchup versus Houston represents only the fourth time since 2010 that the Red Raiders have hosted a non-ranked opponent for its Big 12 home opener since 2010. Texas Tech is 12-3 against unranked opponents to open its home conference slate since joining the Big 12 in 1996.
- During their days in the Southwest Conference, Texas Tech only hosted Houston in a league home opener once, which came in a 51-35 loss to the 18th-ranked Cougars in 1990. It was the only contest in 20 meetings as SWC foes that the two schools faced each other outside the month of November.
- Texas Tech dropped to 15-13 all-time in Big 12 openers this past weekend after falling, 20-13, at West Virginia. The Red Raiders were previously 10-3 when opening Big 12 play against an unranked opponent, including a 7-3 mark in road games.

TEXAS TECH-HOUSTON CONNECTIONS

- There will be several noticeable ties between the two schools this weekend, none greater probably than Houston head coach **Dana Holgorsen**, who was the inside receivers coach for the Red Raiders from 2000-04 and then co-offensive coordinator from 2005-07. Holgorsen departed the Texas Tech coaching staff prior to the 2008 season to take the offensive coordinator position at Houston. This will be the 10th time the Red Raiders have faced Holgorsen as the head coach on the opposing sideline as Texas Tech is 4-5 in those games between his time at Houston and West Virginia.
- Texas Tech offensive line coach **Stephen Hamby** is more than familiar with Holgorsen as he was an offensive lineman



with the Red Raiders during the final three years of Holgorsen's tenure. Their time together was capped by a memorable come-from-behind victory in the 2007 Gator Bowl against Virginia. Texas Tech Associate A.D. for football administration **Antonio Huffman** was also a standout on the other side of the ball during Holgorsen's tenure as a three-year starter in the secondary from 2003-06.

■ Houston has another former Red Raider one-time staff member in assistant head coach and running backs coach **Mike Jinks**, who served in a similar role at Texas Tech from 2013-15 under **Kliff Kingsbury**. Jinks, who was Texas Tech's associate head coach during his final season, departed the Red Raiders in 2016 to accept the head coaching position at Bowling Green. Jinks was the running backs coach at USC in 2021 where he worked alongside current Texas Tech outside linebackers coach **C.J. Ah You**, who was a defensive quality control assistant for the Trojans.

■ Texas Tech, likewise, has two University of Houston alumnus on its staff in associate head coach **Kenny Perry** and offensive passing game coordinator **Justin "Juice" Johnson**. Perry was a four-year letterwinner for the Cougars from 1988-91 as a cornerback his first two seasons at Houston before moving to safety for his final two years. He also served as a graduate assistant for his alma mater from 1992-94, working with the special teams and defensive backs.

■ Johnson was a four-year letterwinner for Houston where he still remains one of the top pass catchers in program history. A first team All-CUSA selection as a senior in 2011, Johnson had an explosive final season as a Cougar, catching 87 passes for 1,229 and 12 touchdowns as he still ranks in the top 10 all-time in Houston history for single-season receiving yards and touchdowns. Johnson capped his Houston career with a bowl record 12 catches for 148 yards in the Cougars' 30-14 victory over No. 23 Penn State in the 2012 Ticket City Bowl. Johnson was considered one of Houston's most versatile athletes during his playing career, competing on special teams and as a running back, wide receiver and tight end at various times for a Cougars program that played in three bowl games and two Conference USA Championship games. Johnson spent one season on the Houston staff under Holgorsen in 2019 as the Cougars' running backs coach.

■ Houston has two one-time Red Raiders on its roster now in and senior defensive back **Alex Hogan** and junior quarterback **Donovan Smith**, who, ironically, will both wear a No. 1 jersey. Hogan spent two seasons at Texas Tech from 2019-20 prior to transferring to Houston where he has appeared in 24 games over the last two-plus seasons.

■ Smith, meanwhile, was Texas Tech's starting quarterback in its double-overtime victory over the Cougars a year ago. Smith completed 36-of-58 passes for 350 yards and two touchdowns, while also rushing for one more as part of 31 yards on the ground. It was the second career 300-yard passing performance at the time for Smith, who sealed the Texas Tech victory with a nine-yard touchdown run in the second overtime.

■ Besides Smith, Houston has two other West Texas natives on its roster junior kicker **Cooper Hamilton**, a Lubbock Coronado alumnus, and redshirt freshman **Karson Jones**, a Frenship graduate like Smith.

■ The city of Houston is annually a hotbed for Texas Tech's recruiting efforts as the Red Raiders currently boast 13 players from the city and the surrounding area. That list includes several prominent Red Raiders such as defensive lineman **Tony Bradford Jr.**, inside linebacker **Tyrique Matthews**, outside linebacker **Bryce Ramirez**, tight end **Mason Sharp** and offensive lineman **Dennis Wilburn**.

CAREER NOTABLES VERSUS HOUSTON

■ **Tahj Brooks** hit the 100-yard mark for the first time in his career in the 2021 meeting against Houston as the then-sophomore carried 15 times for 134 yards and a pair of touchdowns. That total was Brooks' career high until he rushed for 158 yards two weeks ago against Tarleton State. In addition, it marked the most rushing yards by a Red Raider against Houston since Doak Walker winner **Byron Hanspard** posted 228 yards on the ground to close the 1995 regular season. Brooks followed with 78 rushing yards on 17 carries and a touchdown last season, giving him 212 yards on the ground and three scores over his career versus Houston.

■ In addition to Brooks, Texas Tech has three other Red Raiders with a touchdown in their career versus Houston in wide receivers **Nehemiah Martinez I** and **Myles Price** as well as quarterback **Tyler Shough**, who will miss this weekend's matchup due to injury. Price caught five passes for 78 yards and a touchdown a year ago in the overtime win over Houston, while Martinez added five catches for a career-high 76 yards and a score of his own.

■ **Jaylon Hutchings** has combined for eight tackles in the middle of the Texas Tech interior the past two seasons, including six a year ago in the win. He and interior teammate **Tony Bradford Jr.** both have sacks in their careers versus Houston with Hutchings leading the two with 1.5 career tackles for loss.

■ Three of the top four single-game receiving marks in school history have come against Houston as **Antoine Wesley** set a new Texas Tech record with 261 yards through the air in the 2018 matchup between the two schools. **Rodney Blackshear** ranks third all-time for single-game receiving numbers with 251 yards versus Houston in 1991, which snapped the school record at the time of 248 yards from Leonard Harris against Houston in 1983.

KINGSBURY, LEACH AMONG HOF CLASS

■ **Kliff Kingsbury** and **Mike Leach** will headline the latest list of inductees to the Texas Tech Hall of Fame and Hall of Honor that will be formally inducted this weekend. Kingsbury will join fellow Red Raider **Matt Wingo** as football inductees into the Hall of Fame, which is reserved strictly for former athletes.

■ The rise of Texas Tech's Air Raid offense began with Kingsbury, who arrived at Texas Tech under legendary head coach Spike Dykes and later developed into one of the top passers in college football history under Leach. Kingsbury went on to set 39 school records the next three seasons as well as 16 different Big 12 marks and 17 NCAA FBS records. He recorded more than 12,000 passing yards and total offense, including over 1,000 completions, making him only the third player in NCAA history to accomplish all three feats.

■ Wingo remains one of the top linebackers in program history after a decorated career in the early tenure of Spike Dykes from 1988-91. Wingo, a two-time All-Southwest Conference honoree, racked up 385 tackles during his four-year career, which ranked third all-time in school history following his senior season. To this day, Wingo still ranks sixth in Texas Tech history for career tackles. Wingo earned All-Southwest Conference honors following both his junior and senior seasons.

■ Leach, meanwhile, will be recognized posthumously in the Hall of Honor for his decade of success leading the Red Raider football program. Leach, the winningest coach in program history, led the Red Raiders to a bowl appearance in all 10 of his seasons, finishing with an 84-43 overall in one of the most-successful eras all-time at Texas Tech. The Hall of Honor is designated for non-athletes who have provided outstanding contributions to Texas Tech Athletics.

Recap: Texas Tech built a 17-3 lead at the half and held off a second-half Houston rally to knock off the No. 25 Cougars for their first ranked victory of the Joey McGuire era. Donovan Smith threw for 350 yards and two touchdowns in his first start to the season, while Tahj Brooks carried 17 times for 78 yards and a score of his own. Trey Wolff connected on a 47-yard field goal with three seconds remaining in regulation to force overtime where Smith pushed the Red Raiders to 2-0 on the season with a nine-yard touchdown scamper in the second extra period.

EXCITEMENT AT ALL-TIME LEVEL FOR 2023

■ Texas Tech will play in front of its third advanced sellout crowd of the season this weekend against Houston as tickets to Jones AT&T Stadium continue to sell at high numbers. The Red Raiders already boasted sellout crowds in each of their first two home games of the season against Oregon and Tarleton State, marking its back-to-back sellouts since 2018 when the Red Raiders hosted Oklahoma (Nov. 3) and Texas (Nov. 10) in consecutive weeks. Ticket inventory for the Oct. 14 Homecoming game versus Kansas State are already sold out as well.

■ For months, **Joey McGuire** encouraged Red Raider fans to purchase their season tickets before it'd be too late. That time officially came in early August when Texas Tech announced it had officially sold out of season tickets for the 2023 campaign. In total, Texas Tech sold 31,649 season tickets for this season, which includes 6,511 new season tickets after an impressive debut for the Red Raiders under McGuire and his staff.

■ Texas Tech's capacity has been set for 56,200 for the 2023 season due to the ongoing construction on the south end zone portion of Jones AT&T Stadium.

■ Over his two seasons as head coach, Texas Tech has added more than 13,000 season tickets since McGuire's hiring in November 2021. Texas Tech previously sold 28,000 season tickets for McGuire's debut season in 2022, which, like this year's total, ranks among the top-10 highest season ticket counts in program history.

RED RAIDERS IN UNFAMILIAR TERRITORY

■ There's no doubt the Red Raiders are entering unfamiliar territory thanks to a 1-3 start that is only their second in the Big 12 era (2020) and the 21st over 99 seasons of football. The positive news for Red Raider fans is Texas Tech has overcome similar starts three times since 1972 to post a .500 record or better with two of those trips leading to bowl appearances.

■ Texas Tech is 2-5 since 1972 in its fifth game of the season after a 1-3 start. The Red Raiders previously prevented a 1-4 start in 2020 with a 34-27 victory over West Virginia and again in 1978 with a 36-23 win at New Mexico. The victory in 1978 kicked off six-consecutive wins for the Red Raiders, who finished 5-3 in the Southwest Conference en route to finishing 7-4 overall.

WHERE WE STAND THROUGH FOUR GAMES

■ Texas Tech has experienced several significant winning streaks snapped in recent weeks following its losses to Wyoming and Oregon to start the season. It marked the first time Texas Tech has dropped multiple non-conference games in a season since falling at No. 12 Ohio State and at home versus No. 16 N.C. State early in the 2002 campaign.

■ Texas Tech had previously won 34-consecutive regular season games at home or on the road against non-power-five opponents prior to falling at Wyoming to start the season. It marked the first time Texas Tech has dropped a non-conference game against a Group of Five foe since falling at No. 17 Houston, 29-28, early in the 2009 season. In addition, Texas Tech had not lost to an unranked, Group of Five opponent since New Mexico surprised the Red Raiders, 27-24, in 2004.

■ The Red Raiders had previously won each of their previous 23 home openers before falling at the hands of No. 13 Oregon. It marked the first loss in a home opener for Texas Tech since 1999 when North Texas shocked the Red Raiders, 23-14, in the third game of the season.

■ Even with the two losses, the Red Raiders have been dominant against non-conference foes over the past two decades, especially at home. Texas Tech has now won 42 of its last 44 non-conference games at home dating back to the 2002 season with its lone two losses during that span coming against Arkansas in 2014 and then Oregon this season. The Red Raiders are an impressive 49-3 overall in non-conference home games since moving to a spread offense in 2000.

■ Oregon represented the highest-ranked non-conference opponent to visit Jones AT&T Stadium in recent years as the Ducks entered the contest ranked 13th by both major polls. It marked the highest-ranked non-conference opponent for the Red Raiders at home since No. 1 Nebraska traveled to Lubbock early in the 1994 season. The Ducks were the first ranked opponent to serve as Texas Tech's home opener since No. 15 Oklahoma defeated the Red Raiders in 1992.

THAT BOWL-WINNING FEELING

■ Texas Tech is coming off consecutive seasons with a bowl victory for the first time since the 2012-13 campaigns when the Red Raiders claimed the Meineke Car Care trophy (2012) and then the Holiday Bowl crown (2013). The Red Raiders, who routed Mississippi State to end the 2021 season at the AutoZone Liberty Bowl and then Ole Miss in the TaxAct Texas Bowl this past December, will look to extend that streak this fall, which has not been done previously over a three-year stretch since the 2002-04 campaigns.

■ Texas Tech, historically, is one of the most successful programs nationally with 40 all-time bowl appearances, which ranks in the top 25 of FBS history. A return to a bowl game in 2023 would mark Texas Tech's longest streak of consecutive postseason appearances since a school-record run of 11-straight years from 2000-10.

■ **Joey McGuire** became the second head coach in program history to lead the Red Raiders to a bowl game in each of his first two seasons as head coach, which placed McGuire in the same category as **Mike Leach**, who remains the all-time winningest coach with an 84-43 record from 2000-09.

THE TEXAS BOWL GOOD LUCK CHARM

■ The Red Raiders' stay in Houston for the TaxAct Texas Bowl was one to remember, highlighted by a 42-25 victory over Ole Miss. Now, the hope is the win will translate the same way it has for the last three Big 12 schools to win the bowl game. Since the 2017 season, the last three Big 12 winners of the Texas Bowl have turned that momentum into an appearance in the conference championship game the next season.

■ In fact, **Joey McGuire** has seen this himself as he was part of a Baylor program that defeated Vanderbilt in 2018 and proceeded to finish 11-3 the next season with a loss to Oklahoma in the Big 12 Championship game and an appearance in the Allstate Sugar Bowl. Texas previously started the run in 2017, defeating Missouri in the Texas Bowl before a 10-4 season the following year and a loss to Oklahoma in the league

title game. Kansas State, meanwhile, won the Texas Bowl in 2021 and then followed with a 10-4 record this past season, which featured a win over TCU in the Big 12 Championship.

NEW LOOK BIG 12 ON TAP FOR 2023

■ The Big 12 Conference will welcome four new members this season as BYU, Cincinnati, Houston and UCF all joined this summer to bring the conference's membership up to 14 schools. The Red Raiders will face three of those schools as Houston and UCF will both visit Jones AT&T Stadium, while Texas Tech will make its first-ever trip to BYU.

■ While new to the Big 12, Houston has been a frequent opponent for the Red Raiders in recent years as the two schools completed a four-game non-conference series against each other in 2022. The Red Raiders, who topped Houston, 33-30, in double overtime in 2022, have won 10 of the past 11 meetings against the Cougars as it will be the 35th all-time meeting between the two former Southwest Conference foes.

■ Texas Tech has a limited history with both BYU and UCF as it will be only the second all-time meeting with the Cougars (other was a 21-10 Tech win in 1940) and the first contest against the Knights. It will be the Red Raiders' first-ever trip to the state of Utah for a football contest.

TECH FOURTH IN BIG 12 PRESEASON POLL

■ Texas Tech entered its second season under **Joey McGuire** picked to finish fourth overall, according to the Big 12 preseason poll of media members that was announced by the conference office in July. The preseason nod is the highest Texas Tech has been slotted by the media prior to a season since the Big 12 moved to a division-less format in 2011. Texas Tech received four first-place votes from the media, finishing fourth with 729 points behind only league favorite Texas (886 points), Kansas State (858 points) and Oklahoma (758 points).

■ Six different league schools received at least one first-place vote in the poll as Texas led the way with 41, while K-State gathered 14 and both Oklahoma and Texas Tech had four each. TCU was fifth in the preseason poll, only two points back of Texas Tech with 727 after receiving three first-place votes. Oklahoma State, picked to finish seventh overall, was the final school collecting a first-place vote.

■ Texas Tech sophomore wide receiver **Jerand Bradley** and super senior defensive lineman **Jaylon Hutchings** were named to the All-Big 12 preseason team that was determined by media members who cover the conference. This is the most-significant preseason accolade to date for both Hutchings and Bradley, who were each named honorable mention All-Big 12 selections following the 2022 season. The All-Big 12 preseason team was made up of 29 players from across the league's 14 teams.

WHAT RETURNS FOR THE RED RAIDERS

■ **Joey McGuire** will return the bulk of his production on both sides of the ball this season as Texas Tech boasts 16 returning starters, including 10 on offense and an additional six on defense. The list of returnees also features a pair of specialists as well in long snapper **Jackson Knotts**, a two-year starter, and punter **Austin McNamara**, who will enter 2023 on pace to snap the Texas Tech career punting average record. Additionally, Texas Tech boasted 26 other returners on both sides of the ball with starting experience, including 10 more on offense and six on defense.

■ As a team, Texas Tech's list of returners accounted for 322 career starts between both sides of the ball (165 offense, 157 defense) prior to the start of the season.

■ Texas Tech will continue to recognize the hometowns of every student-athlete on its roster this season with a special decal on the back of each gameday helmet. The decal will feature a throwback Masked Rider logo with the area code associated with each student-athlete's hometown as part of an initiative started in 2022 by head coach **Joey McGuire**.

NEW FACE IN TOWN BRINGING THE 'JUICE'

■ **Justin Johnson** is the lone new member to **Joey McGuire's** staff this season as he serves as assistant head coach, offensive passing game coordinator and wide receivers coach. Johnson, nicknamed "Coach Juice" throughout his career, arrived in Lubbock after a three-year stint at Baylor where he worked alongside McGuire during the 2020-21 seasons. Johnson has also worked at both Houston, his alma mater, and Kansas in full-time roles during his career.

■ The addition of Johnson brings in another assistant coach who is more than familiar with McGuire as he joins linebackers coach **Josh Bookbinder** and tight ends coach **Josh Cochran** who crossed paths with McGuire at Baylor. Head strength and conditioning coach **Lance Barilow** was also on the Baylor staff prior to his arrival in Lubbock in 2022.

60TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE DOUBLE T

■ This football season will mark the 60th anniversary of the iconic Double T appearing on the Texas Tech football helmet. The Double T, easily one of the most recognizable brands in all of college athletics, was first placed on a Red Raider football helmet in 1963 by then-head coach J.T. King. Prior to the 1963 season, the individual player number had traditionally been placed on each side of the helmet.

MADE IN TEXAS



Since his arrival at Texas Tech, **Joey McGuire** has made it clear the Red Raiders will be built by the best talent the Lone Star State has to offer. Texas Tech boasts 90 players on its roster from the state of Texas alone, which leads all power-five programs and ranks second among all FBS programs in the state.

HEAD COACH JOEY MCGUIRE

THE HALL OF FAMER

■ There likely isn't a power-five football program in the state of Texas with better ties to its high school coaches than at Texas Tech as McGuire hired six members of his charter coaching staff that have ties to the Texas High School Coaches Association (THSCA). McGuire, himself, is already a legend at the prep level as a member of the THSCA Hall of Honor and the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame.

■ McGuire, owner of three state titles as head coach of Cedar Hill High School in the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex, was inducted into the THSCA Hall of Honor (THSCA) in 2020 and then the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame in 2022 in the months after accepting the Texas Tech position. McGuire is still an avid speaker at the annual THSCA Convention and regularly hosts clinics for high school coaches each year.

NOT THE ONLY COACH IN THE FAMILY

■ Turn on a television any weekend this fall and you could possibly see another McGuire roaming the sidelines as Garret McGuire is entering his first season as the wide receivers coach at Nebraska. The younger McGuire previously played under his father at quarterback at Cedar Hill High School before enjoying four years as a backup quarterback at Baylor. He joined the coaching profession immediately after, serving as an offensive assistant under new Nebraska head coach Matt Rhule while with the NFL's Carolina Panthers.

■ Garret isn't the only McGuire building an impressive career, either, as Raegan McGuire is a fashion designer for AMUR in New York City. Her designs have been worn by several high-profile figures, including Natalie Biden, the granddaughter of President Joe Biden, as well as Taylor Swift during her spring 2023 Eras Tour.

JOEY MCGUIRE, THE OFFICIANT

■ Joey McGuire, known as a players' coach, has added another title in recent years: officiant. He presided over the second wedding of a former player this past summer in defensive quality control assistant James Lockhart, who previously played for McGuire at Baylor. McGuire previously performed the wedding for Sam Tecklenburg, another former Baylor player, and is scheduled to do his third ceremony next April for quarterback Tyler Shough and his fiancée.

AN NFL FRONT OFFICE

■ Under McGuire, Texas Tech's personnel department resembles an NFL front office, a unique approach in the world of college football. Texas Tech's personnel department is overseen by general manager James Blanchard, who was McGuire's first hire after accepting the Texas Tech position. Blanchard has the ability to offer any potential recruit he and his staff feel will fit at Texas Tech, allowing McGuire's coaching staff to prioritize player development. Blanchard has been named top rising personnel and recruiting staffers in the country by the On3.com website.

■ Texas Tech's 2023 class was ranked as high as No. 23 nationally by Rivals as McGuire and his staff inked 28 high school prospects, a key component to the Red Raiders' recruiting philosophy. It marked the highest-ranked Texas Tech recruiting class in more than a decade.

■ Texas Tech has reaped the benefits of McGuire's ties to the state of Texas in the year following his hire as the Red Raiders have signed two of their best classes now in history. The 2022 class, boosted by McGuire's hiring in November 2021, was ranked as high as 39th nationally by Rivals, a steady improvement from its spot in the 70s prior to his hire.



THE BRAND

The core tenant under McGuire revolves around The Brand, which stands for his desire that the Red Raiders be the "toughest, hardest-working, most-competitive team in the country." On his final interview for the Texas Tech position, McGuire described his vision for the Red Raider program using The Brand, which President Lawrence Schovanec said "describes West Texas."



60 MINUTES OF US

McGuire issued a new challenge to not only his team this summer but to all of Red Raider Nation: can opponents handle "60 Minutes of Us?" The "us" in that equation is not only the Red Raiders on the field but one of the top homefield advantages in college football. Since then, the phrase has become a rallying cry for McGuire and Texas Tech as a whole entering the 2023 season.



TAKE THREE UNIVERSITY

McGuire, a defensive coach at heart, heavily utilizes the phrase "Take Three" as a program. The phrase has transformed into a rallying cry from the defense with in-house video production signaling "one," "two" or "three" each time the Red Raiders create a takeaway. McGuire, prior to each game, regularly wears a t-shirt designed for the defense that says "Take Three University."



THE UNOFFICIAL HOME OF THE THSCA

Since his hire as Texas Tech's head coach, **Joey McGuire** has made it a point to brand the Red Raiders the "unofficial home of the Texas High School Coaches Association." Already a Hall of Famer, himself, McGuire has hired a charter staff filled with experience at both the collegiate and high school levels with four assistant coaches who have previous ties to the THSCA as well as a slew of support staff members.

- McGuire made his name in the coaching profession during his 14 seasons leading Cedar Hill High School in the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex. McGuire has had five former Cedar Hill standouts on the Texas Tech roster already during his tenure, including three this season in sophomore outside linebacker **Charles Esters III**, redshirt freshman outside linebacker **Harvey Dyson III** and redshirt freshman defensive back **Jalon Peoples**. Peoples is the brother **Dimitri Moore**, who played his final season of collegiate eligibility under McGuire a year ago.
- While he did not graduate from Cedar Hill, **Jordan Brown** attended the high school up until his senior year as he was a freshman when McGuire departed for Cedar Hill. His older brother, Laquvionte Gonzalez, was on a Cedar Hill team under McGuire that played in the Class 6A state title game as a senior in 2012.

NEWS & NOTES ON MCGUIRE...

- Texas Tech's win over Tarleton marked the 150th of McGuire's career as a head coach, combining both his success at Cedar Hill High School and at Texas Tech. McGuire was previously 141-42 over his 12 seasons leading Cedar Hill in the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex from 2003-16 before moving to the college ranks as an assistant coach at Baylor from 2017 up until his hire at Texas Tech in November 2021.
- Entering his second season, McGuire will look to become only the second head coach in program history to lead the Red Raiders to bowl games in each of his first two seasons, joining the late **Mike Leach**, who pushed Texas Tech to a bowl game in each of his 10 seasons. McGuire previously became the eighth head coach in program history to lead the Red Raiders to a bowl game in his debut season a year ago and the 12th head coach to lead Texas Tech to a winning record in his first year.
- Texas Tech has hit the 40-point mark six times during McGuire's tenure as the Red Raiders are now a perfect 6-0 in those games following their win over Tarleton State.
- Texas Tech is 6-2 under McGuire when creating two or more takeaways in a game with the two losses coming at Wyoming and at West Virginia. Likewise, the Red Raiders are also 6-4 when giving up one or fewer turnovers per game as well.
- The Wyoming game marked the first overtime loss for the Red Raiders under McGuire, who has labeled similar close contests as "brand games" during his tenure. The Red Raiders were 3-0 in overtime games a year ago with wins over Houston, Texas and Oklahoma.

- McGuire 's eight-win debut finished one victory shy for the most by a first-year head coach in program history as **Dell Morgan** previously led the Red Raiders to a 9-2 record in 1941. In its now 99 seasons of football, Texas Tech has never had a head coach record at least eight wins in each of his first two seasons leading the Red Raiders.
- McGuire led the Red Raiders to a 5-4 record in Big 12 play a year ago, becoming the first head coach to notch a winning conference record (above .500) in his debut season since **David McWilliams** did so in 1986.
- The success the Red Raiders had in Big 12 play pushed Texas Tech to its most conference wins since 2009 and a fourth-place finish in the standings, its highest since the league went to a 10-team format in 2011. McGuire is the only head coach in program history to defeat both Texas and Oklahoma in the same season.
- Of the head coaches in Texas Tech's history, McGuire resembles **Spike Dykes** likely the best, not only for his charm and engaging personality but also his ties as a former high school head coach. Dykes spent a decade at the prep level with stops as an assistant in Eastland, Ballinger, San Angelo Central and then head coaching roles at Coahoma, Belton, Big Spring, Alice and Midland Lee.

BROOKS TIME OFF TO STRONG START

- Possibly no other Red Raider has had a better start to the 2023 season than **Tahj Brooks**, who enters this weekend ranked 12th in the FBS and third in the Big 12 with 417 rushing yards through only four games. Brooks has rushed for 100 yards in each of the past two games with a career-high 158 yards on the ground versus Tarleton State followed by 149 yards this past weekend at West Virginia.
- With his performance at West Virginia, Brooks became the first Red Raider to rush for at least 140 yards in consecutive games since **DeAndre Washington** combined for 421 yards over the final two games of the 2015 regular season versus Kansas State and Texas. The performance marked the second time in Brooks' career that he has hit the 100-yard mark in back-to-back weeks since doing so in the first two games of the 2021 season against Houston and Stephen F. Austin. He now has six 100-yard performances in his career.
- If Brooks can reach the 100-yard mark again this weekend versus Houston, it would mark the first time a Red Raider had rushed for 100 yards in three-consecutive games since Washington did so over the final three games of the 2015 regular season against West Virginia, Kansas State and Texas. That also marked the last time a Red Raider had rushed for at least 100 yards in consecutive Big 12 games.
- Brooks has set new career highs for attempts each of the past two weeks as he carried 19 times versus Tarleton State and then 25 times at West Virginia.
- Brooks' 417 rushing yards through the first four games of the season are the most for a Red Raider during that span since Washington had 475 yards at the same point in the 2015 season. Brooks is only the fifth Red Raider in the Big 12 era and only the third since Texas Tech moved to a spread offense in 2000 to record at least 400 rushing yards in the first four games of the season. He joins Doak Walker winner **Byron Hanspard** (1996), **Ricky Williams** (1998), Washington (2015) and **Eric Stephens** (2011) on that list.

THREE-TIME TEAM RUSHING LEADERS

- Brooks, who had 691 rushing yards and seven touchdowns a year ago, is looking to become the first Red Raider since **Baron Batch** (2008-10) to lead Texas Tech in rushing over

three-consecutive seasons. In the process, he would become the ninth Red Raider since 1950 to lead the team in rushing in three-consecutive seasons. That list includes the likes of **Batch** (2008-10), **Taurean Henderson** (2002-05), **Byron Hanspard** (1994-96), **Byron "Bam" Morris** (1991-93), **James Gray** (1986-89), **Larry Isaac** (1974-76), **Donnie Anderson** (1963-65) and **Bobby Cavazos** (1951-53). **Ricky Williams** (1997-98; 2000-01) also led the team in rushing four times over his career but not over three-consecutive seasons.

CLIMBING THE RECORD BOOK

- Brooks needs 69 rushing yards this weekend to reach 2,000 for his career, which will make him the 16th Red Raider in program history to reach the mark and the second in as many years. **SaRodorick Thompson Jr.**, who shared the backfield with Brooks the past two seasons, hit the 2,000-yard mark early in his final season as a Red Raider a year ago.
- If Brooks is able to maintain this pace, he will become the first Red Raider to rush for 1,000 yards in a season since **DeAndre Washington** totaled 1,492 yards on the ground in 2015. Washington, who also hit the 1,000-yard mark in 2014 as well, is the only Red Raider to reach the century mark in a season since Texas Tech moved to a spread offense prior to the 2000 campaign.
- Brooks will also be looking to place his name in the all-time Texas Tech record book as he needs 570 rushing yards over the final eight regular-season games and possible bowl to match **Baron Batch** for 10th all-time on the career rushing chart.

GIVING BACK TO HIS HOMETOWN

- Brooks returned to his hometown of Manor, Texas (outside of Austin) this past summer to host his first summer camp for local kids in his hometown. The camp, which is allowed now due to changes in Name-Image-Likeness (NIL) rules, attracted more than 200 students in Brooks' hometown where he rushed for at least 1,000 yards three times during his prep career. Brooks totaled more than 4,400 rushing yards and 65 total touchdowns as a four-year letterwinner for the Mustangs.



MORTON SET FOR FIFTH CAREER START

With the injury to Tyler Shough, sophomore **Behren Morton** will make his fifth career start at quarterback Saturday against Houston. Morton, who made four starts in Big 12 play a year ago, has thrown for 1,347 yards and 10 touchdowns already in his career, including 230 passing yards and three scores in limited duty already this season.

Morton threw for at least 300 yards in each of his first two starts last season, finishing with 379 yards and two touchdowns at Oklahoma State and then 325 yards and two more scores in a win over West Virginia. He departed his final start of the year at TCU early due to an injury.

OFFENSIVE NOTEBOOK

THE INJURY BUG STRIKES AGAIN

■ The injury bug has returned to the Texas Tech quarterback room as Tyler Shough will miss significant time moving forward due to a leg injury. This will be the seventh-consecutive season Texas Tech has utilized multiple starting quarterbacks and the 11th time in the past 15 years. **Patrick Mahomes II** (2015-16) and **Seth Doege** (2011-12) are the only two quarterbacks during that stretch to not miss a start in a season since 2009.

TEXAS HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL ROYALTY

■ The son of a Texas high school coach, **Behren Morton** was the highest-rated quarterback to ever sign with Texas Tech as he was a consensus four-star prospect as part of the 2021 class, ranking sixth nationally among pro-style quarterbacks. Morton grew up in Lubbock for part of his youth as his father, James Morton, was the head football coach at Monterey High School in Lubbock for 11 years.

MORTON NOTABLES FROM 2022

■ Morton became the eighth Texas Tech freshman to make his first career start at quarterback during the Big 12 era, joining **Kliff Kingsbury** (1999), **Seth Doege** (2009), **Baker Mayfield** (2013), **Davis Webb** (2013), **Patrick Mahomes II** (2014), **Alan Bowman** (2018) and teammate **Donovan Smith** (2021). Among that group, Morton was the sixth quarterback to make his first career start against a Big 12 foe.

■ During the Big 12 era (1996-present), Morton's 379 passing yards against Oklahoma State were the third-highest total for a Red Raider making his starting debut against a conference opponent. He trailed only the 490 passing yards **Steven Sheffield** compiled versus Kansas State in 2009 and the 415 yards **Davis Webb** totaled against Iowa State in 2013. Webb's outing is the only freshman performance that has topped Morton's numbers from the Oklahoma State game.

■ Morton's performance against Oklahoma State alone marked the 10th time since 1999 that a Red Raider has thrown for 300 yards in his first career start.

■ Despite it being his first career start, that didn't stop offensive coordinator **Zach Kittley** from airing it out as Morton recorded 62 passing attempts, the second-highest total for a Red Raider in his starting debut during the Big 12 era behind **Sonny Cumbie's** 66 attempts in 2004. It marked the most passing attempts for an FBS freshman making his starting debut since **Jared Goff** had 64 on Aug. 31, 2013, in Cal's season-opening loss to Northwestern.

■ Morton was only the second Red Raider in the Big 12 era and the only freshman quarterback to make his first career start against a ranked opponent as he joined **Jackson Tyner**, who was 1-of-5 in limited action at No. 6 Oklahoma in 2019.

■ Morton was the eighth Red Raider in the Big 12 era to throw for at least 300 yards in his first two career starts, joining the likes of **Nic Shimonek** (2017), **Webb** (2013), **Mayfield** (2013), **Taylor Potts** (2009), **Graham Harrell** (2006), **Cody Hodges** (2005) and **Cumbie** (2004). Of that group, only Webb is the only other Red Raider to do so versus two Big 12 opponents.

KITTLEY AMONG NATION'S YOUNGEST OCs

■ **Zach Kittley**, who turned 32 in August, ranks as the third-youngest power-five offensive coordinator in the country, trailing only a former assistant of his in Ben Arbuckle at Washington State as well as Charlie Weis Jr. at Ole Miss and Tommy Rees at Alabama. Kittley is the sixth-youngest offensive coordinator overall in the FBS.

■ Texas Tech ended the 2022 season averaging 34.2 points per game, which marked the 21st time in the past 22 years that the Red Raiders averaged at least 30.0 points per game. The average was the Red Raiders' highest clip since 2018.

■ Kittley previously served in various roles under **Kliff Kingsbury** from 2013-17, rising from a student assistant to graduate assistant and assistant quarterbacks coach in his final three seasons. Kittley worked alongside Kingsbury in the development of **Patrick Mahomes II**, tutoring the future NFL MVP into becoming the nation's leading passer in 2016 and an eventual top-10 selection by the Kansas City Chiefs.

■ Mahomes is one of two NFL quarterbacks to tutor under Kittley as he spent three years mentoring **Bailey Zappe** at both Houston Baptist and Western Kentucky. Zappe, who heard his name called in the fourth round of the 2022 NFL Draft by the New England Patriots, set the NCAA FBS records for single-season passing yards (5,967) and passing touchdowns (62) as a senior for the Hilltoppers in 2021, both records that were previously held by former Red Raider **B.J. Symons** (2003).

SERIES NOTES

- Saturday's contest will mark the second for Texas Tech head coach **Joey McGuire** against his former school in Baylor. The Bears represented McGuire's first position at the collegiate level as he served in a variety of roles at Baylor, coaching the tight ends from 2017-18, the defensive ends in 2019 and then the outside linebackers in 2020-21. He was promoted to associate head coach prior to the 2019 season.
- Texas Tech and Baylor boast one of the longest-running series in the Big 12 as the two schools have met annually since 1956 dating back to their time in the Southwest Conference. Baylor controlled a 19-17 advantage over the Red Raiders during their SWC tenure but immediately lost its next 15 games in the series upon entering the Big 12 in 1996.

NO ONE IS MORE AGGRESSIVE

- Much was said about **Joey McGuire's** aggressive approach to fourth downs in 2022 as Texas Tech finished 33-of-52 on conversion attempts, which ranked first nationally for both total successful conversions and attempts. The Red Raiders were third in the Big 12 and 16th nationally with a .635 conversion percentage.
- Since McGuire took over as Texas Tech's head coach, the Red Raiders lead the FBS with 66 total fourth-down attempts and 43 total conversions (65.2 percent). Baylor also has 39 conversions during that span on 62 attempts to rank second in both categories nationally.
- The Red Raiders enter this weekend ranked second in the FBS with 10 total conversions and tied for fifth with 14 fourth down attempts. Army is the only school in the country with more fourth down conversions this season with 13 (on 14 opportunities), while West Virginia, USF, Hawaii and Baylor lead the FBS with 15 total attempts. Texas Tech currently ranks tied for 20th in the FBS with a .714 conversion percentage.
- Texas Tech has turned fourth down conversions into points in each of the past two weeks with 10 points as a result in both the Tarleton State and West Virginia games. Texas Tech totaled 129 points as a result of its fourth down conversions a year ago, finishing with an astounding plus-78 advantage overall.
- Texas Tech was 5-for-8 on fourth down attempts at West Virginia, which tied the second-most conversions in a FBS game this season and the most attempts nationally. Baylor also had five fourth down conversions Sept. 16 against LIU, while Army has the national lead after going 6-for-6 on attempts versus UTSA on Sept. 15. Texas Tech's season high for fourth down conversions a year ago was also six.
- Texas Tech is 9-4 under McGuire when it was tied or leading the plus/minus scale on its fourth-down decisions with three of those losses coming this season. The only loss from the 2022 season came at Oklahoma State.

NEWS AND NOTES ON THE OFFENSE

- Texas Tech has scored first in all four games this season and has done so now in 11 of 15 games during **Joey McGuire's** tenure as head coach.
- **Jerand Bradley** has started his sophomore season much like he finished his freshman campaign from a year ago as he has a team-leading 20 receptions for 241 yards and three touchdowns. Bradley matched his career high with eight receptions in the season opener at Wyoming, finishing with 88 yards and a touchdown before adding five catches for 83 yards and another score versus Oregon. He caught his third touchdown pass of the season at West Virginia, which now ranks third in the Big 12. Bradley led all Big 12 freshmen and ranked third among FBS freshmen for receiving yards overall,

■ Bradley's streak of four-consecutive games with a touchdown reception came to an end against Tarleton State as it was the longest streak by a Red Raider since **Erik Ezukanma** found the end zone through the air over five-consecutive games over the course of the 2019-20 seasons. During that four-game stretch, Bradley caught 29 passes and was averaging 108.0 yards a contest.

■ Over his career, **Xavier White** has succeeded as both a running back and wide receiver over his Texas Tech career. Now in his final season, White is one of only two Red Raiders since 2000 to record multiple games with at least 100 rushing yards as well as two more 100-yard receiving performances. He joined **Taurean Henderson** on that list. His most recent 100-yard receiving performance came a year ago with 139 yards versus West Virginia.

■ **Myles Price** leads all returning Red Raiders in career receptions and receiving yards as he has caught 130 passes for 1,459 yards over the previous three-plus seasons. Price, who has totaled at least 500 receiving yards each of the past two seasons, saw his three-game streak of catching a touchdown pass snapped at West Virginia as he was limited offensively. He was previously the first Red Raider to be on the receiving end of a touchdown catch in each of the first three games to a season since **KeSean Carter** in 2020.

■ Texas Tech has to have one of the lengthiest passing threats in the country this season in 6-9 tight end **Mason Tharp**, who has a receiving touchdown in two of the past three games. Tharp caught four passes for 37 yards and a score versus Oregon and followed with three catches for 43 yards and another touchdown versus Tarleton State. His touchdown versus the Texans was a 28-yard strike from **Tyler Shough**, marking the longest reception thus far in his career.

■ **Jordan Brown** has added to the Red Raider passing attack with two games with at least 50 receiving yards as he caught two passes for 51 yards at Wyoming before posting a career night versus Tarleton State with six catches for 73 yards and his first-ever touchdown. Brown, who was making his first career start against the Texans, currently ranks second on the team with 151 receiving yards and fourth overall with 10 receptions.

PLENTY OF EXPERIENCE BACK UP FRONT

- If there was a perceived weakness to the Red Raider offense in 2022, it was the inexperience along the offensive line as offensive coordinator **Zach Kittley** and offensive line coach **Stephen Hamby** were looking to reshape a unit that lost three starters from the previous year. Now, that same group could be seen as a major strength for the Red Raiders this year as four of five starters return to go along with the signing of **Rusty Staats**, a 27-game starter at Western Kentucky.
- Texas Tech's 141 career starts among its offensive line entering the 2023 season ranked sixth in the FBS and second in the Big 12, only behind Houston. The Red Raiders also boasted 209 games played among its offensive linemen, a figure that led the Big 12 and ranked 10th in the FBS.

TONY & JAYLON SHOW RETURNS

Texas Tech's prospects for the 2023 season got a boost this past December when the duo of **Jaylon Hutchings** and **Tony Bradford Jr.** announced their return for a final year of eligibility. The pair has formed one of the Big 12's top interior units the past four-plus seasons as they have combined to make 79 starts between the two with 279 tackles, 50.0 tackles for loss and 21.0 sacks.

The duo combined for 66 pressures in 2022, according to *Pro Football Focus*, with Bradford leading the way with 35 followed by Hutchings with 31 of his own. The two combined to become one of only three FBS duos of interior defensive linemen to record 30 or more pressures each this past season. Hutchings was the third-highest graded interior defensive lineman (84.5) by PFF in the Big 12 last season and was ninth overall among his power-five counterparts. The nose tackle recorded 50 tackles on the season, which led all down-linemen, to go along with 5.5 tackles for loss and 1.5 sacks. He has 149 tackles for his career, including 18.5 tackles for loss and 7.5 sacks.

DEFENSIVE NOTEBOOK

ADD "RB" TO HIS NAME

■ Not many defensive linemen in college football have a carry on their career stat sheet, let alone three. **Jaylon Hutchings** can proudly boast he might be the rare exception, however, as he was used on two offensive snaps during the regular-season finale against Oklahoma a year ago. On the first play, he was targeted on a pass attempt that was out of his reach, but on the very next play, Hutchings rushed the ball for a 1-yard touchdown. He also totaled nine yards on the ground in 2019 as part of two fake punt attempts. Hutchings, a former running back despite his size at Forney High School, was included prior to each of the last two seasons on the annual "Freaks List" column by Bruce Feldman of *The Athletic*.

THE MAYOR

■ Now in his fifth year in Lubbock, **Tony Bradford Jr.** has earned a new nickname by head coach **Joey McGuire**: "The Mayor." The nickname is a result of Bradford's consistent presence in the West Texas community, a distinction that earned him national recognition last season as part of the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. Bradford became the fourth Red Raider student-athlete all-time to be recognized on the Good Works Team.

■ Bradford is the driving force behind a Texas Tech football program that has committed more than 3,500 hours of community service the past three years alone, contributing to visits to local elementary and junior high schools, the Ronald McDonald House, the Texas Boys Ranch, South Plains Food Bank, Habitat for Humanity, Burgers and Badges and area children's homes.

■ In addition to his role in the community, Bradford has taken steps to advance his future career in law enforcement by serving as a security guard with the Texas Tech Police Department. Bradford, who lists becoming a police chief as his goal after football, has worked with the police department each of the past four springs to gain valuable knowledge of the profession. During the spring, Bradford will often go from a morning workout, to a class to potentially riding along with a member of the Texas Tech police department to protect his peers on campus.

■ Bradford was named the "honorary mayor" of Lubbock by actual city of Lubbock Mayor Tray Payne on Dec. 28, 2022, prior to the Red Raiders' victory over Ole Miss in the Texas Bowl. Bradford has since visited City Hall this past offseason in addition to being a regular at community events involving law enforcement agencies.

OLB ROOM A SPECIALITY OF DERUYTER

■ After losing a top-10 draft pick in **Tyree Wilson**, Texas Tech will rely on the tandem of **Myles Cole** and **Steve Linton** to pair on the outside of interior defensive linemen **Tony Bradford Jr.** and **Jaylon Hutchings**. Cole resembles Wilson in size, measuring 6-6, 285 pounds with a wingspan at 86 inches, which is slightly longer than Wilson's impressive numbers from the NFL Combine (35 5/8-inch wingspan). Cole can also bend and move around tackles as the Texas Tech strength staff clocked him with a max speed of 20.3 mph this past summer. Cole delivered his first multi-sack game of his career versus Tarleton State as the edge rusher got to the quarterback twice in the win.

■ In addition, Texas Tech brings back sophomore **Joseph Adedire**, who made six starts late in the 2022 season as only a true freshman, as well as senior **Bryce Ramirez** and sophomores **Charles Esters III** and **Terrell Tilmon**. Returning outside linebacker **Isaac Smith**, who emerged late in the 2022 season as one Texas Tech's top young prospects, has already been declared as out for the season with an injury.

■ Wilson, who was selected seventh overall by the Las Vegas Raiders, became the third rush end type player to be selected within the first 10 picks of the NFL Draft during defensive coordinator **Tim DeRuyter's** career. DeRuyter has coached 17 NFL Draft selections during his career now, which includes a pair of other defensive ends/edge linebackers like Wilson who were selected in the first round such as **Kayvon Thibodeaux** at Oregon and **Von Miller** at Texas A&M.

MAJOR SIZE BACK IN THE SECONDARY

■ It's really hard not to like the size Texas Tech returns in the secondary this season in 6-3 corners **Malik Dunlap** and **Rayshad Williams** as well as two rangy safeties in **C.J. Baskerville** and **Tyler Owens**. Baskerville also measures at 6-3 in height, while Owens is 6-2, giving Texas Tech what has to be one of the tallest secondaries in college football.

■ This is the sixth collegiate season for both Dunlap and Williams, who own similar journeys to Texas Tech after arriving as transfers. Dunlap arrived in Lubbock by way of N.C. State, while Williams came from the opposite coast at UCLA.

■ Dunlap is coming off his first-career game with multiple interceptions as he picked off two passes versus Tarleton State, returning the first 52 yards for Texas Tech's opening touchdown. It was the first start of the season for Dunlap, who became the first Red Raider to intercept two passes in a game since **Douglas Coleman III** did so at Arizona in 2019. His pick-six was the first by a Red Raider since **Marquis Waters** found

the end zone versus Florida International in 2021. He followed with another interception this past weekend at West Virginia, pushing him into a tie for the FBS lead with three this season. He is the first Red Raider to combine for three interceptions over a two-game span since Coleman had the same total versus Oklahoma State and Baylor in 2019.

- In his two-plus seasons as a Red Raider, Dunlap has used his size to become one of the top pass defenders in the country. He ranked second in the Big 12 and tied for 17th in the FBS in 2022 with 12 pass breakups, eventually earning him All-Big 12 second team honors by the conference coaches.

- Dunlap and Williams are two of three regular starters back for the Red Raiders in the secondary, joining fellow super senior **Dadrion Taylor-Demerson**, who has made 28 starts over his career and currently ranks among the nation's top tacklers. Taylor-Demerson currently shares the Big 12 lead in solo tackles per game with teammate **Jesiah Pierre** as the pair are both averaging 5.8 solo stops per game, which also ranks 10th in the FBS.

- Owens, meanwhile, made two starts a year ago, including in the TaxAct Texas Bowl where he matched his career high with six tackles to go along with his first career interception. Owens ranked 29th on the annual Freaks List compiled by *The Athletic's* Bruce Feldman due to his overall athleticism with a vertical jump over 40 inches and a clocked running speed at more than 23 miles per hour in a game.

PUTTING OUT THE FIRE

- Texas Tech was one of the most-successful teams nationally in 2022 in limiting opponents in the red zone, all part of a philosophy by **Joey McGuire** and **Tim DeRuyter** to challenge the defense to "put out the fire." By putting out the fire, the Red Raiders strive to either create a takeaway, force a fourth-down stop or keep their opponent to only a field goal.

- The Red Raiders, ultimately, led the Big 12 and ranked ninth in the FBS for red zone defense in 2022 after opponents scored in 43-of-58 trips inside the 20. Among power-five teams, the Red Raiders ended the season ranked fifth overall.

- While no points are obviously the preference, Texas Tech was among the top teams in the country in limiting opponents to only a field goal. In fact, 16 of the 43 red zone conversions by opponents were the result of a field goal, which led all power-five schools and ranked fourth in the FBS, trailing only Georgia Southern (18), Tulsa (17) and Hawaii (17).

- Texas Tech's red-zone stats can be deceiving again this season as opponents have put up points in 14-of-16 appearances inside the 20-yard line. Six of those occurrences, though, has been the result of a field goal, which ranks tied for fifth in the FBS and as the most in the Big 12 this season.

BRYCE RAMIREZ IS BACK

You'd be hard pressed to find a more inspiring story in college football this season than **Bryce Ramirez**. A former walk-on, Ramirez rejoined the team as a full participant to start preseason camp and played a significant role at Wyoming, an impressive feat after suffering a compound leg fracture in the third week of the 2022 season at N.C. State. The injury forced Ramirez to remain in Raleigh for several days to recover from multiple surgeries before he was allowed to return to Lubbock. Ramirez was making his first career start against the Wolfpack and had just recorded a key third-down tackle to end an N.C. State drive earlier in the first quarter.

Since then, Ramirez has been diligent in his recovery, spending countless hours with the Texas Tech medical staff in order to return to the field. A candidate for the Comeback Player of the Year Award, Joey McGuire announced in June that Ramirez had been selected to wear the coveted No. 3 jersey intended for the player who best resembles the traits of The Brand (the toughest, hardest-working, most-competitive team in the country).

NEWS AND NOTES ON THE DEFENSE

- Texas Tech is allowing 24.0 points per game through the first four weeks of the season, matching its lowest average to start a season over the past 10 years (since 2014). The strong start continues its improvements under second-year coordinator **Tim DeRuyter**, who helped guide the Red Raiders to only allowing 29.2 points per game in 2022, their lowest average in more than a decade. The Red Raiders had not previously surrendered less than 30 points per game since 2009 when opposing offenses averaged 22.6 points.

- The Red Raiders have limited opponents to under 200 passing yards in three of the first four games of the season as Wyoming totaled only 149 yards through the air, while Tarleton State was limited to 197 yards despite being more of an Air Raid program. West Virginia, meanwhile, was limited to 99 passing yards on 22 total attempts. Each of Texas Tech's first three opponents this season attempted at least 30 passes as the Red Raiders currently ranked fourth in the Big 12 for passing yards allowed per game (201.0).

- Texas Tech delivered on **Joey McGuire's** goal to "take three" against Tarleton State as the Red Raiders picked off three passes in the win. It marked the second time in a four-game span Texas Tech has registered three interceptions dating back to its win over Ole Miss in last season's Texas Bowl.

- **Jesiah Pierre** leads the Red Raiders with 37 tackles through the first four games of the season. Pierre, who moved from an outside linebacker to the inside this offseason, currently ranks tied for first in the Big 12 for both solo tackles per game (5.8) as well as second for total tackles per contest (9.2). He set a new career high with 14 stops alone in the season opener versus Wyoming and then added his second career game with 10 or more stops with 12 this past weekend at West Virginia.

- Ben Roberts has also emerged as one of Texas Tech's top tacklers through the first four games of the season as he ranks second on the team with 29 stops. Roberts, who ranks sixth in the Big 12 for tackles per game (7.2), has made 10 or more stops in two of the past three games with a career-high 13 tackles versus Oregon and 11 this past weekend at West Virginia. His performance in Morgantown also featured his first career interception.

- The Red Raiders have created seven takeaways through the first four games of the season with two fumble recoveries at Wyoming, three interceptions against Tarleton State and two more interceptions at West Virginia. That total is two more than Texas Tech's amount at the same point in the 2022 season where the Red Raiders registered 16 of their 18 takeaways on the year over the course of their eight wins. That total included five forced turnovers in Texas Tech's win over Ole Miss in the TaxAct Texas Bowl.



THE BEST PUNTER IN ALL THE LAND

Already a fixture in the Big 12 and Texas Tech record books, Austin McNamara will look to wrap his Red Raider career this season by placing his name among the all-time NCAA FBS leaders for punting. McNamara's current 46.01 career punting average ranks sixth all-time in FBS history among punters with 150-249 career attempts. His average would snap the FBS record for punters with at least 250 career attempts. McNamara needs 42 more punts to qualify for that list.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTEBOOK

MORE RECORD BOOK TALK...

■ **Austin McNamara** is already a fixture as one of the top punters in history as he is the school and Big 12 record holder for single-season punting average (48.2 in 2021) and longest punt (87). Following the 2022 campaign, McNamara has four of the top eight single-season averages in program history.

■ Now, the Arizona native will look to cement his name as the top punter in conference history as he is on pace to snap the Big 12 career record of 45.9 yards per punt that was set by Oklahoma State's Quinn Sharp from 2009-12. McNamara, who is averaging 46.0 yards per punt, himself, over the last four-plus seasons, is also on pace to easily shatter the Texas Tech career record of 43.7 yards an attempt that was set by **Taylor Symmank** following the 2015 campaign.

■ McNamara set the program record for single-season punting average (48.2) in 2021 after booting 42 punts for 2,023 yards. It smashed the Tech single-season record of 46.8 that was set by **Mark Bounds** in 1991. He is on pace to break that record again with his 48.6 average through four games.

■ By bombing eight punts of at least 50 yards in a single game, McNamara set a new single-game FBS record on Nov. 20, 2021 against Oklahoma State. The performance broke the previous FBS record of seven that was set by Colorado's Mark Mariscal in a 2002 home game against Southern California. McNamara averaged 56.4 yards per punt overall against the Cowboys, which finished just shy of the Texas Tech single-game record of 57.0 yards an attempt that was set by **Alex Reyes** in a 2004 win versus Baylor (only three attempts).

■ McNamara set social media on fire midway through the 2020 season with his booming 87-yard punt against West Virginia, which marked the longest by an FBS kicker since 2017 and the longest in Texas Tech and Big 12 history. McNamara broke the Texas Tech single-game record for the longest punt that was previously set by **R.W. Moyers** in 1945 against West Texas State.

MCNAMARA vs. RAY GUY WINNERS

■ Over the course of his illustrious career, one accolade has somehow eluded McNamara: being named a finalist for the prestigious Ray Guy Award. That fact is disappointing knowing McNamara's numbers historically have measured up to the eventual winner of college football's top punting award.

■ In its 23 years of existence, the Ray Guy Award has never presented its trophy to a winner who did not average at least 44.0 yards per punt that season. McNamara has compiled at least a 44.3 average in all four seasons as a Red Raider and is averaging 46.0 yards per attempt over his career, which is

higher than seven previous winner's single-season total.

■ McNamara averaged a school and Big 12 record 48.2 yards per punt as a junior in 2021, which is a higher average than all but two previous winners of the Ray Guy Award - Matt Araiza of San Diego State in 2021 (51.2) and Braden Mann of Texas A&M in 2018 (51.0). His average matched the clip of 2002 winner, Mark Mariscal of Colorado. His current single-season average of 48.6 yards would also rank third all-time among Ray Guy Award winners.

■ According to the NCAA FBS record book, McNamara's current career average of 46.0 yards per punt is higher than all 20 previous winners of the Ray Guy Award. Max Duffy, the 2019 winner of the award, totaled a 45.96 average over his three seasons at Kentucky to rank just behind McNamara.

■ McNamara's longest career punt of 87 yards is longer than any other previous winner of the Ray Guy Award. In fact, only four other previous winners had a punt go at least 80 yards in the year he won the award.

GARCIA TAKES OVER KICKING DUTIES

■ **Gino Garcia** is now 7-for-11 on field goal attempts this season as he has made each of his last five attempts over the past three games. Garcia, who arrived at Texas Tech prior to the 2022 season following three seasons at Houston Baptist (now known as Houston Christian), is a perfect 4-for-4 from inside 39 yards as all four of his misses have come from 40 yards or longer this season. He is 3-for-7 from 40-yards plus as he drilled a 54-yarder in his first attempt of the year at Wyoming.

■ For his career, Garcia has connected from 48 yards or longer seven times now in his career, including a career-long 59-yarder at Houston Baptist in 2021 that ranked fourth all-time in Southland Conference history for distance.

■ Garcia, who was a 2021 first team honoree on the All-Southland Conference, is now 39-for-57 on field goal attempts over his career. He was 9-for-10 on attempts for the Huskies in 2021 prior to transferring to Texas Tech.

NEWS & NOTES ON SPECIAL TEAMS

■ In addition to Garcia, Texas Tech tabbed **Reese Burkhardt**, a transfer from UAB, to handle kickoff duties. Burkhardt, known for a strong leg, has sailed 16 of his 23 kickoff attempts for touchbacks thus far this season (69.6 percent).

■ Texas Tech has blocked five kicks now under head coach **Joey McGuire** and special teams coordinator **Kenny Perry**. Four of those blocks came in 2022 as the Red Raiders ranked tied for 10th in the FBS. The four blocks matched the most in a season for the Red Raiders during the Big 12 era with the 2000 and 2020 squads, respectively.

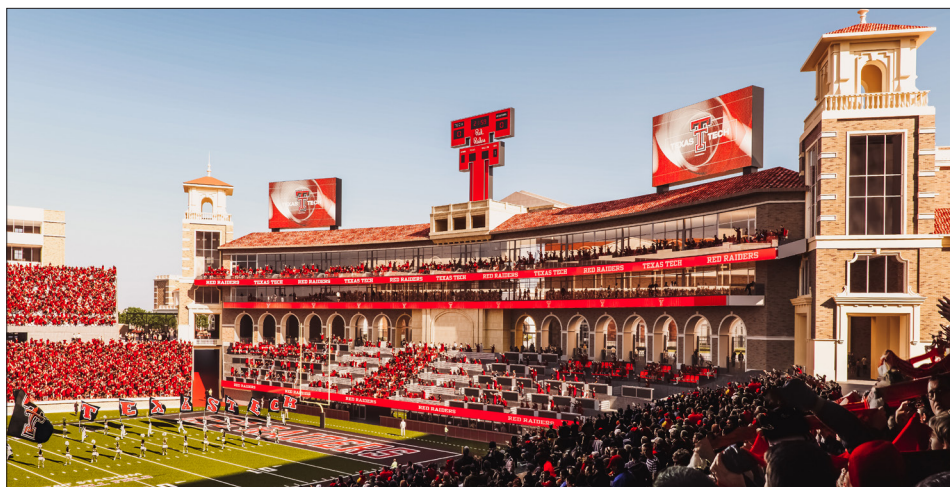

A \$230 MILLION INVESTMENT

FUTURE HOME OF TEXAS TECH FOOTBALL

■ Texas Tech announced its largest investment into the Red Raider football program to date in July 2022 as the athletics department unveiled plans for a more than \$230 million facilities project to construct a new south end zone building to Jones AT&T Stadium, which will connect to the new Dustin R. Womble Football Center. The newly-constructed facilities will include over 300,000 combined square feet and blend world-class modern design and technology elements with Spanish architecture well known to Texas Tech supporters.

■ Construction crews officially began work on the project on Nov. 27, 2022, the day following Texas Tech's victory over Oklahoma to close the regular season. The first task was the removal of the historic Double T Scoreboard, the historic landmark that had rested atop the south end zone building since 1978. Construction will move solely into the south end zone area beginning in August in order to prepare for the 2023 season.

■ Texas Tech will relocate its coaches' offices to the third floor of the south end zone, which will overlook Cody Campbell Field at Jones AT&T Stadium and connect to both the Womble Football Center and the Sports Performance Center through a skybridge. Plans are for the Womble Football Center to be constructed on the same land that currently occupies the present Football Training Facility, featuring two stories in height as well as the expansion to Sixth Street to further increase the overall square footage of the facility.

■ Texas Tech will maintain its football strength and conditioning, sports medicine and equipment areas on the main level of the Womble Football Center as part of the new layout. The second floor will connect to the skybridge, housing many of the football program's meeting spaces, including individual position rooms and the Spike Dykes Team Meeting Room. This floor will also feature a revolutionary 6,000-plus square foot multi-purpose walkthrough area designed to allow for large-scale indoor team strategy implementation, instruction and technique evaluation.

■ Between the south end zone project and the Womble Football Center, the two facilities will contain space for both recruiting and players' lounges, a new player locker room, a television studio for gameday and social media content as well as a significant investment into technology through digital signage and displays.

NEW TURF, LIGHTS AMONG 2023 ADDITIONS

■ In addition to the progress already made on the south end zone and Womble Football Center, Texas Tech has two additional enhancements already completed for the 2023

season as it installed a new artificial playing surface as well as a new LED lighting system this summer. The two projects are an estimated \$2.2 million.

■ Texas Tech contracted the services of Hellas for its next playing surface, which will be its Matrix Helix® turf, the company's latest technology that has been installed recently at several NFL facilities, namely The Star in Frisco and AT&T Stadium (Dallas Cowboys), SoFi Stadium (Los Angeles Rams), Allegiant Stadium (Las Vegas Raiders) and the University of Kansas Health System Training Complex of the Kansas City Chiefs.

■ The new lighting system, meanwhile, was designed by Musco, using its Total Light Control technology. This will provide Texas Tech the ability to utilize choreographed patterns designed to music during its pregame entertainment, in-between quarters and after touchdowns. The lighting system will greatly enhance the in-game fan experience, especially under the Jones AT&T Stadium lights where the Red Raiders have traditionally boasted one of the nation's top homefield advantages.

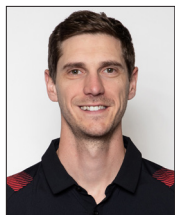
MORE THAN \$100 MILLION IN DONATIONS

■ Director of Athletics Kirby Hocutt announced for the first time Aug. 23 that Texas Tech had reached its \$100 million milestone in fundraising for the transformative project. Despite already reaching its primary fundraising goal, Texas Tech will continue to seek philanthropic gifts to the project in order to help offset the remaining overall cost that was being funded by athletics department bonds and future revenue.

■ Fundraising for the project was boosted in October 2021 with Texas Tech University System Board of Regents member Dustin R. Womble provided a \$20 million lead gift that was the largest one-time gift, at the time, in athletics department history. Womble previously provided more than \$10 million to fund Texas Tech's state-of-the-art basketball practice facility that bears his name, which opened in May 2021 across from United Supermarkets Arena. He is the largest athletics donor in history.

■ Fellow Board of Regents member Cody Campbell, a former letterwinner for the Red Raiders under Mike Leach, followed with a \$25 million gift on Dec. 2, 2021. In recognition of the gift, Texas Tech named the Jones AT&T Stadium playing surface Cody Campbell Field in honor of the largest one-time contribution in the history of the athletics department. Campbell is a fourth-generation Red Raider who earned multiple All-Big 12 and Academic All-Big 12 honors during his playing career as an offensive lineman from 2001-04.

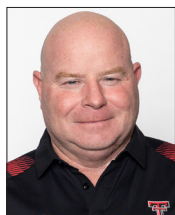

Tyree Wilson became the third Red Raider since 2017 to be selected in the first round of the NFL Draft after he was picked seventh overall this past spring by the Las Vegas Raiders.

RED RAIDERS IN THE NFL

- There isn't a bigger star in the NFL currently than Texas Tech's own **Patrick Mahomes II**. The Red Raider gunslinger has transformed the NFL in only six professional seasons, claiming NFL MVP honors in both 2018 and 2022 before leading the Kansas City Chiefs to two Super Bowl titles in three appearances, winning the Lombardi Trophy in 2020 and 2022.
- With his first Super Bowl win over the San Francisco 49ers, Mahomes became the youngest player in history to be named NFL MVP and also win a Super Bowl. Mahomes, who at only 24 years of age, was tabbed Super Bowl MVP after leading the Chiefs to their second Super Bowl title in history and their first since 1970.
- In July 2020, Mahomes signed the richest contract in NFL history as he and the Chiefs agreed on a 10-year extension worth up to \$503 million. It marked the second time in school history where a Red Raider has signed the richest NFL contract as Ring of Honor member **Donny Anderson** previously did so with the Green Bay Packers upon being drafted in 1965.
- While maybe known for its offense in recent years, Texas Tech has had two first round draft picks from its defense in current Seattle Seahawk linebacker **Jordyn Brooks** and Las Vegas Raiders edge end **Tyree Wilson**. Wilson became the highest-drafted Red Raider in program history this past April after being selected seventh overall. Brooks, meanwhile, has led the Seahawks in tackles each of the past two seasons.

- Today's attendance: 26,450.

TODAY'S LOSS...

- Gives Texas Tech a 2-4 all-time record against Wyoming.
- Gives Texas Tech a 68-28-3 all-time record in season openers.
 - The Red Raiders lost their first season opener since falling vs. Ole Miss at NRG Stadium in 2018.
 - The Red Raiders drop to 2-2 in season openers that were true road games dating back to 2000.
 - The Red Raiders are now 21-3 in season openers dating back to 2000.
- Snaps Texas Tech's four-game win streak that closed the 2022 season.
- Gives Texas Tech its first overtime loss under head coach Joey McGuire, dropping to 3-1.

TEAM NOTES

- Texas Tech experienced its first weather delay since Sept. 16, 2017 at home versus Arizona State. That contest was delayed one hour in Lubbock due to lightning.
- True freshman Brenden Jordan, a 4-star recruit from Mansfield HS in the DFW area, started at the star position. The last true freshman to start a season opener for Texas Tech came in 2017 when OL Jack Anderson started. Anderson started all 13 games that season.
- Texas Tech forced two turnovers in the first quarter; it's only two takeaways of the game.
 - The Red Raiders were previously 5-0 under head coach Joey McGuire when forcing two or takeaways.
- After building a 17-0 lead in the first quarter. Wyoming tied the game, 17-17, with 5:37 left in the third quarter. Wyoming took a 20-17 lead with 8:58 left in 4th quarter, building to 20-straight points. It was the second loss under head coach Joey McGuire where the Red Raiders lost after scoring first and held a halftime lead.
- Wyoming ran more total plays than Texas Tech midway through the third quarter - 49 to 38 (30, 5:37) - a category the Red Raiders traditionally control having led the FBS averaging 84.2 plays per game in 2022. The Red Raiders eventually topped the Cowboys in that category to close the game, 80 to 78.
- Tech falls to 6-2 in games scoring 30 or more under head coach Joey McGuire. The previous loss was at No. 7 Oklahoma State (41-31).

NOTING THE RED RAIDERS

OFFENSE

QB, Tyler Shough (Sr.)

- Started a season-opener for the fourth-consecutive season, and started a season-opener for the Red Raiders for the third-straight year. Shough is the fifth Red Raider since 1980 to start three-straight consecutive seasons.
- As Tech's starting quarterback, Tyler Shough drops to 8-2 in his career and 8-1 in games that he started and finished in his Red Raider career.
- Shough finished with 338 yards passing, surpassing the 300-yard mark for the fifth time in his career.

RB, Tahj Brooks (Sr.)

- Scored his 19th rushing TD of his career. Finished with a team-high 39 yards rushing.

WR, Myles Price (Sr.)

- Scored sixth career touchdown, catching a 33-yard pass from Shough in the first quarter. It was his longest reception in a game since hauling in a 54-yard TD catch vs. Houston on Sept. 10, 2022.

RB, Jerand Bradley (So.)

- Led Tech with eight receptions for 88 yards. The eight catches match his career-high, set three times before in 2022.

DL, Jaylon Hutchings (Sr.)

- Made his 47th consecutive start, which ranks second among all active FBS players for most consecutive starts.
- Logged one of the Red Raiders two sacks. His solo sack increases his career sack total to 8.5.

- Improves to 9-3 in games he's started for Texas Tech.
- Logged his 10th career rushing touchdown on a 1-yard score in the first quarter.

RB, Tahj Brooks (Sr.)

- Finished with 158 rushing yards - the most by a Red Raider since Justin Stockton rushed for 161 yards at Kansas on Oct. 7, 2017.
- Posted his fifth career 100-yard rushing game, which was surpassed in the first half as he owned 140 rushing yards at the break. His previous high in a first half was 90 rushing yards in the Liberty Bowl versus Mississippi State.
- Had a career-high 19 rushing attempts.
- Had two explosive runnings plays, scampering for 38 yards and 22 yards, respectively. The 38-yarder was his fifth-longest career run.

WR, Myles Price (Sr.)

- His third quarter TD catch marked his third of the season, which is the most in a single season in his career. Correspondingly, it is also the first time in his career to catch a TD in three-straight games.

WR, Jordan Brown (Jr.)

- Set career-high marks for reception (6), receiving yardage (73), career-long catch (46) and caught first career touchdown.

TE, Mason Tharp (Jr.)

- Registered his fifth career touchdown catch, hauling in a 28-yard pass from Tyler Shough in the first quarter. It also marks the first time in his career catching touchdown passes in back-to-back games.

DEFENSE

OLB, Myles Cole (Sr.)

- Posted his first 2.0 sack game of his career. He entered the game owning 1.5 career sacks, all produced while at Louisiana-Monroe having logged 0.5 sacks in 2021 and a solo sack in 2020.

DB, Dadrion Taylor-Demerson (Sr.)

- Recorded first interception of the season in the third quarter. He leads all active Red Raiders with seven career INTs.

DB, Malik Dunlap (Sr.)

- Had two interceptions, each in the first quarter, marking his second and third career interceptions.
- The last time a Red Raider posted two INTs in the same game was Sept. 14, 2019 when Douglas Coleman III had a pair at Arizona.
- His first INT of the game was a 52-yard "pick-6" to give Tech a 7-0 lead in the first quarter. It was his second career interception; his first since Oct. 22, 2022 versus West Virginia.
- The interception return for a touchdown was the first by a Red Raider since Marquis Waters did so versus FIU on Sept. 18, 2021.

DL, Jaylon Hutchings (Sr.)

- Made his 49th consecutive start, which ranks second among all active FBS players for most consecutive starts.

- Texas Tech won the coin toss and chose to receive in the first half. Tarleton State started the second half with the ball.

- For the 23rd time in 28 games versus an FCS opponent, Texas Tech scored better than 40 points in the 41-3 win.
- Texas Tech's 21-point first quarter marked the most points in the opening frame since scoring 21 points versus West Virginia on Nov. 9, 2019.
- Tarleton State, who entered the game scoring better than 50 points in each of its first two games were held without a touchdown in the 41-3 defeat. The last time Texas Tech did not allow an offensive touchdown in a game was versus UTEP on Sept. 7, 2019.
- Texas Tech held Tarleton to zero points in the first half. It was the first, first-half shutout for the Red Raiders' defense since being at Kansas on Oct. 16, 2021.
- Texas Tech's defense registered its first three interception game since having three in the Texas Bowl versus Ole Miss.
- Texas Tech did not commit its first penalty until 4:52 remaining in the fourth quarter. Texas Tech finished with two penalties in the game - its fewest in a game since committing one at Iowa State on Nov. 19, 2022.
- Texas Tech held Tarleton State to 197 passing yards - its first time limit an opponent under 200 yards passing since traveling to Iowa State on Nov. 19, 2022.
- The Red Raiders improve to 3-0 when manufacturing three turnovers or better in a game under Joey McGuire.

NOTING THE RED RAIDERS

OFFENSE

QB, Behren Morton (So.)

- Was 1-for-7 with 14 yards in the first half having entered beginning with the first offensive play of the second quarter for an injured Tyler Shough. Finished 13-for-37 for 147 yards in his most significant action since exiting last year's TCU contest with an injury on Nov. 5, 2022.
- Tossed his 10th career touchdown pass.

RB, Tahj Brooks (Sr.)

- Posted his sixth career 100-yard rushing game, which marks back-to-back games eclipsing 100 yards - it's the second time posting back-to-back 100-yard games in his career - he did so for the first time to lead off the 2021 season versus Houston and SFA.
- Brooks set a career-high last week with 158 yards, besting 134 yards set versus Houston in 2021 with 134.
- Had three carries for 18 yards at halftime today, and then exploded for 131 yards in the second half.

WR, Jerand Bradley (So.)

- Caught his third touchdown pass of the season; he has caught a touchdown pass in five of the last six games dating back to the 2022 season.

WR, Xavier White (Sr.)

- Led the team in receiving yards, totaling 45 yards on three catches.

DEFENSE

LB, Jesiah Pierre (Sr.)

- Led Tech with 12 tackles.
- At halftime he led Tech with 10 tackles. Versus Wyoming, he had matched his then-career high with seven tackles en route to a then-career-high 14 tackles.

LB, Ben Roberts (Rfr.)

- Posted his second double-digit tackle game in his third career start. He finished with 11 tackles. His career-high was set in his first career start versus Oregon with 12.
- Roberts owns 27 tackles in his three starts this season.

DB, Malik Dunlap (Sr.)

- Becomes first Red Raider to have an interception in consecutive games since Dadrion Taylor-Demerson ended the 2022 season with interceptions against both Oklahoma and Ole Miss.
- Becomes first Red Raider to combine for three interceptions over a two-game stretch since Douglas Coleman III had same total versus Oklahoma State and Baylor in 2019.

DL, Jaylon Hutchings (Sr.)

- Made his 50th consecutive start, which ranks second among all active FBS players for most consecutive starts.
- Set a new career-high for TFLs with 2.5; finishing with six tackles in the contest.

SPECIAL TEAMS

P, Austin McNamara (Sr.)

- His six punts were one shy of his 2022 season-high seven versus Oklahoma. His career-high is nine set versus Oklahoma State in 2021.
- He averaged 49.0 yards per punt.

- Second game this season the Red Raiders had a pair of double-digit tackles looking back to Dadrion Taylor-Demerson and Ben Roberts doing so versus Oregon.
- Texas Tech was limited to a season-low three explosive plays (20-yard gains or more).
- Tech was 2-for-18 (11.1%) while also 5-of-8 (62.5%) on fourth downs. Heading into this weekend's games, no team had attempted more than six fourth downs in a single game.
- Texas Tech forced two turnovers and won the turnover margin 2-0.
 - The Red Raiders entered the season 5-0 under head coach Joey McGuire when forcing two or more takeaways. Tech has lost to both Wyoming and West Virginia in 2023 having two turnovers in each of those games.
- Texas Tech committed a season-high nine penalties for a season-high 96 yards.
 - Four of the nine penalties were called against the defense on third downs which produced first downs for the Mountaineers each time - two holding calls and two pass interference calls.
- Texas Tech's defense has produced five interceptions over the last two games.
