- The Big I2 leads the FBS with I7 lead changes in the fourth quarter in conference games this season.
- BYU and lowa State represent two of the remaining eight undefeated FBS teams and give the Big I2 its first season with two teams starting 7-0 or better since 2019.
- The Big I2 has the most go-ahead scores in the final three minutes of conference games in FBS with II.
- Nine of I6 Big I2 institutions are separated by two or fewer conference losses in the standings.
- BYU, Colorado, Iowa State and Kansas State give the Big I2 Conference four bowl-eligible teams after Week Nine with another four programs just one win away.
- According to ESPN's FPI, three Big I2 schools rank in the top I0 nationally in strength of record with BYU (third), Iowa State (sixth), Kansas State (ninth).
- No FBS conference has a higher rushing average per game than the Big I2 at I68.7.
- The Conference has five teams in the top eight of Power Four in rushing yards per game; UCF (first), K-State (third), Kansas (fifth), Arizona State (seventh) and West Virginia (eighth).
- Colorado's Travis Hunter, the reigning Big I2 Offensive Player of the Week, became the first player in Conference history to win an offensive and defensive weekly award. He has played nearly every snap on offense and defense and is the only FBS player with even more than 50 snaps on both sides of the ball. Hunter has now tallied over 350 snaps on each side of the ball this season.

- Six of the top 25 FBS leaders in passing yardage are Big I2 quarterbacks, which is the most of any FBS conference.
- Conference players have eclipsed 100 yards receiving in a game 55 times this season, which leads the country.
- 19 of 39 (48.7%) completed games in Big I2 play have been decided by one score this season.
- II different players for BYU have intercepted a pass this season, which is the most in the country.
- lowa State's Jontez Williams owns the longest active streak of games with an interception in FBS with four heading into Week Nine.
- In addition to leading the Big I2 in passing defense, Iowa State is tied with Washington for fewest passing plays of 20 or more yards allowed in FBS with II.
- K-State signal caller Avery Johnson is the only Big 12 quarterback, and one of five nationally with at least 1.600 vards passing and 350 yards rushing this season.
- The Big I2 Conference and Raycom Sports announced the launch of Big I2 Studios in September, a new programming and content venture designed to expand and enhance the league's storytelling efforts. Big I2 Studios will create and deliver original programming and content to fans as a FAST (Free Ad-Supported Television) channel across multiple major platforms, including planned launches on leading platforms early this Fall that will be announced soon, as well as major VOD platforms such as YouTube.
- The 2024 season will be the Big I2 Conference's first as a 16-team league. The Big I2 footprint now spans IO states, four time zones and 90 million people as it begins its 29th football season.
- The Conference partnered with TuneIn, the world's leader in live audio, to launch Big I2 Radio prior to week one. The new 24/7 Conference-branded audio station, is now streaming to fans across the United States. The station includes Big 12 weekday sports talk, extensive Saturday game-day coverage, Big 12 school content and music programming. Additionally, listeners can access a 'Game of The Week' featuring gameday coverage from their Big I2 school's local play-by-play broadcast team.

College Football Playoff (CFP) Selection Process

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is the event that crowns the national champion in college football. The CFP Selection Committee ranks the top 25 teams at the end of the season, and the I2 playoff participants consist of the five highest-ranked conference champions, plus the next seven highest-ranked teams. The four highest ranked conference champions will be seeded one through four and receive a first-round bye. The schools seeded five through eight will host those seeded nine through I2 in first-round games. The quarterfinals and semifinals rotate annually among six bowl games – the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, Vrbo Fiesta Bowl, Capital One Orange Bowl, Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl Game presented by Prudential and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. This year's quarterfinals will take place on Dec. 3I, 2024, and January I, 2025, while the semifinals will be January 9-I0, 2025. The College Football Playoff National Championship will be Monday, January 20, 2025, at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta.
