- The Big 12 Conference matched its record-breaking number of selections from a year ago with nine teams selected for the postseason, which was highlighted by Dr Pepper Big 12 Football Champion Arizona State being selected as the No. 4 seed in the College Football Playoff.
- The Sun Devils earned a bye in the new 12-team playoff format and will play in the Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl on Wednesday, Jan. 1 on ESPN. ASU will take on Texas, who defeated Clemson in the first round of the CFP, for the right to advance to a semifinal matchup in the Goodyear Cotton Bowl at AT&T Stadium in Arlington, Texas on Friday, Jan. 10.
- Arizona State, Baylor, BYU, Colorado, Iowa State, Kansas State, TCU, Texas Tech and West Virginia make up the Big 12's nine-team contingent of postseason teams. The Big 12's postseason matchups will also include two meetings versus SEC opponents as well as games against the AAC, ACC, Big Ten and the Sun Belt.
- BYU and Colorado will square off in the Valero Alamo Bowl in an all-Big 12 showdown due to the game's Big 12 and Pac-12 legacy bowl agreements. The Cougars and Buffaloes did not face each other this season.
- Colorado two-way star Travis Hunter won the 2024 Heisman Trophy, becoming the eighth player in Big 12 history to win the most prestigious award in college football. Hunter, who earned 61% of first-place votes, broke NCAA and Conference records in his junior season for the Buffaloes.
- The Big 12 is the only conference in FBS with multiple undefeated teams since November 1. Arizona State and Baylor join Oregon, Notre Dame and South Carolina in that distinction.

**CONFERENCE NEWS & NOTES**

- 74% of the Big 12's wins have been against Power Four teams, leading all FBS conferences.
- Non-Power Four teams went 11-80 versus Power Four teams this season, setting the worst mark since 2014.
- 84% of Big 12 games were played against Power Four teams, which is the highest percentage in FBS.
- The Big 12 led the nation in fourth-quarter lead changes and go-ahead scores in the final minute of conference games.
- The Conference features four programs who have posted single-year improvements of five or more wins. Baylor, BYU and Colorado have won five more games than last season and Arizona State has upped its win total by eight.



**All-Big 12 Honors Notebook:**

➤ Shedeur Sanders was selected as the Offensive Player of the Year following a banner season ranked in the top 10 nationally in completion percentage, passing yards and touchdowns while breaking school records for passing touchdowns, passing yards, consecutive games with a touchdown pass, quarterback rating and completion percentage.

➤ With four interceptions, 11 pass breakups and a record-breaking season on both sides of the ball, Travis Hunter became CU's first Conference Defensive Player of the Year since Jordon Dizon in 2007. The defensive back also became the first player in Big 12 history to tally multiple games with an interception and an offensive touchdown.

➤ Jordyn Tyson was selected as the Offensive Newcomer of the Year after tallying 75 catches for 1,101 yards and 10 touchdowns. The wideout elevated his play during the final three games of the regular season, recording 29 catches for 444 yards and three touchdowns. Tyson also finished the season second in the Big 12 in touchdown catches (10) and third in receiving yards (1,101).

➤ BJ Green II, the Big 12's Newcomer of the Year on the defensive side, spearheaded a disruptive CU defensive unit with seven-and-a-half sacks that tied for the second most among all Big 12 players. He played a pivotal role in the Colorado pass rush finishing the regular season with a Big 12-best 37 sacks, which ranks 11th nationally.

➤ After winning Big 12 Newcomer of the Week three times this season for the Sun Devils, quarterback Sam Leavitt earned Offensive Freshman of the Year. ASU was 10-1 in games Leavitt started as he completed 62.7% of his passes for 2,444 yards and 21 touchdowns to just five interceptions.

➤ West Virginia's Josiah Trotter is the first Mountaineer ever to be named Big 12 Defensive Freshman of the Year, following a strong season that featured 93 tackles, four tackles for a loss and an interception.

➤ Will Ferrin secured Special Teams Player of the Year honors for BYU by converting on 21 of his 24 field goal attempts and made all 38 of his extra points. His season highlights included a 44-yard game-winning field goal against Utah in addition to a career-best 54 yard make at Baylor.

➤ Iowa State wide receiver and returner Jaylin Noel shared Special Teams Player of the Year accolades after averaging 15.3 yards per punt return while also averaging 17.7 yards per kick return. The Kansas City native is the first Cyclone to win the award since it was established in 2005.

➤ Wyatt Milum anchored the WVU offensive line in his senior season and joins Colton McKivitz in 2019 and Yodny Cajuste in 2018 as the only Mountaineers to be named Offensive Lineman of the Year.

➤ Defensive Lineman of the Year honors were claimed by Kansas State's Brendan Mott. The defensive end recorded 44 tackles, 8.5 sacks and a fumble recovery and an interception. The Conference's leader in sacks eclipsed his previous season-high in sacks by two-and-a-half.

➤ Arizona State's Kenny Dillingham was named the Chuck Neinas Big 12 Coach of the Year after posting the largest single-year win improvement in school history, improving the Sun Devils' record by seven wins and guiding the team to a berth in the Dr Pepper Big 12 Football Championship.

➤ Big 12 Football Scholar-Athlete of the Year honors were split by Texas Tech's Tahj Brooks and Jalon Daniels of Kansas. Brooks, who became the Red Raiders' all-time leading rusher this season, has begun post-graduate work after completing his bachelor's degree in Sport Management with a GPA of 3.56. He was also named a finalist for the prestigious William V. Campbell Trophy earlier this season. Daniels has also earned honors on and off the field this season, including being named a semifinalist for Comeback Player of the Year and multiple appearances on the Big 12 All-Academic Team. The Sports Management major carries a 3.54 GPA while throwing for 2,174 yards and rushing for 402 yards with 20 total touchdowns this season.
