GETTING STARTED

- Today's weather at kickoff: 83 degrees, 9 mph winds from the northeast and sunny skies.
- · Cincinnati won the coin toss and chose to defer the kickoff in the first half. Texas Tech started the second half with the ball. → This was the first time Texas Tech lost a coin toss this season after winning the first four to start the season.
- Texas Tech wore black helmets with black jerseys and black pants against Cincinnati.
- Today's game captains were C.J. Baskerville, Tahj Brooks, Coy Eakin and Jacob Rodriguez.

TONIGHT'S WIN..

- Gives Texas Tech six straight wins at home.
- Gives Joey McGuire a 19-12 career record as head coach at Texas Tech.
- Gives Joey McGuire a 9-1 career record as head coach in home games played in August/September at Texas Tech.
- Gives Joey McGuire his first 2-0 start in Big 12 play.
- Gives Joey McGuire a 16-6 career record versus opponents that are unranked.
- Gives Joey McGuire a 14-3 career record in games played at Jones AT&T Stadium.
- Gives Texas Tech a 1-0-1 all-time record against Cincinnati.
 - → Today's game marked the first matchup against the Bearcats since Sept. 21, 1968.
 - → Today's game marked the first Big 12 game between the two programs since UC joined the league in the summer of 2023.

TEAM NOTES

- Tonight marked Texas Tech's 27th double-digit come-from-behind win since 2000. The Red Raiders trailed by 11 points, 14-3, in the first quarter.
- → It was the fourth time under head coach Joey McGuire.
- → 2022 vs. Texas, 2022 vs. Oklahoma and 2023 vs. UCF each at home.
- The Red Raiders' six-straight home wins are the most consecutive wins at Jones AT&T Stadium since setting the stadium's alltime record for consecutive wins in a row, 12, between the end of the 2007 season and the start of the 2009 season.
- Texas Tech completed its three-game homestand a perfect 3-0. The last time the Red Raiders had a three-game homestand was in 2013; the Red Raiders also went 3-0 in that stretch en route to a 7-0 start that season.
- The Red Raiders are off to their first 2-0 start in Big 12 since the 2013 season; Tech started conference play 4-0 that year.
- Tech moves to 3-0 this season in one-possession games. The Red Raiders improve to 10-3 under McGuire in one-score games.
- Tonight was the second sellout after the first four home games; Tech's average attendance is 59,279 after four games.
- Tonight's interception return for a touchdown by A.J. McCarty marked the second of the season for the Red Raiders, joining the Bralyn Lux pick-6 versus North Texas. The last time Texas Tech had two interceptions returned for a touchdown in the same season was in 2021 - those two came via Riko Jeffers and Marquis Waters in 2021.
- → The interception also marked the first giveaway for Cincinnati's quarterback Brendan Sorsby.
- Texas Tech allowed its opponent to score on its opening drive of the first half for the first time this season it gave the Bearcats a 7-3 lead. The Red Raiders recorded a field goal on their opening possession, marking points scored on their first drive of all four home games this season.
- Texas Tech trailed 14-10 after the first quarter. The game was tied 24-24 after Cincinnati missed a 42-yarder to close the half. The Red Raiders move to 2-0 under McGuire with a game knotted at halftime.
- Texas Tech won the turnover battle, 2-1. The Red Raiders move to 11-2 under McGuire when owning the takeaway advantage. Through five games, Texas Tech is +2 this season in turnover margin.

NOTING THE RED RAIDERS

OFFENSE

QB, Behren Morton (Jr.)

- Morton improves to 8-1 in his career in games he started and finished at Jones AT&T Stadium.
- It was his third straight game without an interception. Since his last interception on Sept. 7 at Washington State, he's had 105 consecutive attempts without an INT.
- Ran 26 yards on an option-keeper in the second guarter, his longest career run, ultimately setting up a 49-yard TD throw to Coy Eakin.

RB, Tahj Brooks (Sr.)

- Recorded the 2nd-most yards in a game in his career with 172.
- Tonight marked Brooks' 16th career 100-yard game; Brooks is now tied with Bam Morris at No. 3 all-time for most 100-yard games in a career.
- Brooks moved past Bam Morris (3,545) and now ranks No. 4 in all-time career yards at Texas Tech with 3,603. He needs 58 more yards to reach Ricky Williams at No. 3.
- Recorded his 12th 100-yard game in his last 15 games played. He's rushed for at least 95 yards in 15 straight games.
- Tonight marked the eighth game of his career with multiple rushing touchdowns (2).
- Tled Bobby Cavazos for No. 7 all-time in career rushing touchdowns, scoring his 31st and 32nd on Saturday night.
- Has found the endzone in 11 of his 13 games played dating back to last season.
- Has rushed for at least 77 yards in the first half of all four games he's played this season.

WR, Coy Eakin (So.)

- Scored his fourth and fifth touchdowns of the season.
- It was his second career game catching a pair of touchdowns as well as the second time this season having also catcing a pair of TDs in the season opener versus ACU.
- Eakin has scored at least once in 3 of 5 games this season.
- His first score was a 7-yard reception; it was followed by a 49yard TD reception, marking the 2nd-longest catch of his career - second to his 70-yard TD catch versus ACU this season.

WR. Josh Kellv (Sr.)

- Registered his ninth career 100-yard game and his second this season; as he finished with 111 receiving yards.
- Owns 39 receptions through his first five games. It's the most receptions by a Red Raider through five games since Keke Coutee had 39 receptions through five games in 2017.

DEFENSE

LB, Ben Roberts (So.)

- Led Texas Tech with 12 tackles. It was his second-straight game with double-digit tackles.
- Roberts owns eight career double-digit tackle games in just his 20th career game played.
- Forced a fumble on Cincinnati's opening drive of the second half that led to a Red Raiders' touchdown. Roberts owns three forced fumbles this season through five games
- Had a season-high and matched his career-high with 2.0 TFLs.

LB, Jacob Rodriguez (R-Jr.)

- Forced a fumble on Cincy's opening drive of the second half.
- Led Tech with seven tackles at halftime; finished with 11 stops.

DB, A.J. McCarty (R-Jr..)

Returned an interception 51 yards for a touchdown in the fourth quarter. It was his second career interception return for a touchdown inside Jones AT&T Stadium with his first coming as a member of the Baylor Bears in 2022 intercepting a Tyler Shough pass attempt.
