

SEASON PREVIEW



▲ Texas Tech enters its third season under head coach JOEY MCGUIRE, who is the first head coach in program history to lead the Red Raiders to a bowl victory in each of his first two seasons as well as a winning conference record. Texas Tech defeated 0le Miss in the TaxAct Bowl in 2022 and then Cal this past season in the Independence Bowl.

THE BIG 12 LEADER IN ALL-TIME BOWL APPEARANCES

- Texas Tech enters the 2024 campaign as the Big 12 Conference's leader in total bowl appearances as the Red Raiders have made 41 in their history, including one in each of the last three seasons. Texas Tech ranks tied for 20th nationally in all-time bowl appearances as the Red Raiders have one more than fellow Big 12 members BYU and West Virginia. The next closest from there is TCU with 36 bowl appearances in its history.
- Texas Tech dispatched Cal in the Independence Bowl for its third bowl victory in as many years to end the 2023 campaign. It marked only the second time in program history where the Red Raiders have ended three-straight seasons with a bowl wins, matching the run from 2002-04 when Texas Tech won the Tangerine Bowl over Clemson, the Houston Bowl over Navy and the Holiday Bowl versus No. 4 Cal. Texas Tech's current run with a 34-7 rout in the 2021 AutoZone Liberty Bowl, which was followed by a 42-25 victory a year later over Ole Miss in the TaxAct Texas Bowl to close the debut season under Joey McGuire.
- **BIG 12 CONFERENCE BOWL LEADERS**

- Texas Tech is the lone Big 12 Conference member and one of only seven schools nationally to win
 a bowl game in each of the last three seasons, joining the likes of Georgia, Minnesota and Maryland from the power-four ranks as well as Air Force, Fresno State and
 Western Kentucky. Of that list, the Red Raiders are joined by only Georgia and Maryland who have also defeated a team from a power-four conference each year during
- that stretch.

 Texas Tech is currently in the midst of its longest bowl streak since its 2000-10 stretch, primarily under Mike Leach. Texas Tech has made a postseason appearance in four-consecutive seasons only twice in its history as, in addition to the run under Leach, the Red Raiders reached a bowl game four-straight years from 1993-96 under
- Joey McGuire is the first head coach in program history to lead the Red Raiders to a bowl victory in each of his first two seasons. He previously joined Leach as the only other head coach to push Texas Tech to at least a bowl appearance over the first two seasons of his tenure.

ALWAYS BEEN GREATER THAN 12

- The Big 12 Conference will once again welcome four new members for the 2024 season with the addition Arizona, Arizona State, Colorado and Utah, pushing the league's membership up to 16 schools for the first time. The Red Raiders will face three of those schools this season as Arizona State and Colorado will both travel to Jones AT&T Stadium, while Texas Tech will travel to Arizona early in Big 12 play.
- The four new additions come only a year after the Big 12 was at 14 members following the arrival of BYU, Cincinnati, Houston and UCF. The Red Raiders faced three of those four this past year with the lone exception, Cincinnati, scheduled to travel to Lubbock on Sept. 28 this season. This will only be the second all-time meeting between the Red Raiders and Bearcats and the first since 1968, which resulted in a 10-10 tie in Lubbock to start the season.
- Texas Tech has been league members with Arizona once previously as the two schools faced each other regularly as part of the Border Conference from 1931-59 up until the Red Raiders were invited to the Southwest Conference. The Red Raiders and Wildcats have squared off 33 times with Texas Tech controlling a commanding 26-5-2 lead in the series. The two schools last met in 2019 as non-conference foes with Arizona claiming a 28-14 victory at home.
- Texas Tech and Arizona State are no stranger to one another, either, especially in recent years. All four all-time meetings between the two schools have come since 1999 as Texas Tech is 2-2 against the Sun Devils with wins in the 2013 Holiday Bowl and again in 2017 at home. The 2017 contest closed a home-and-home non-conference agreement between the two schools.
- For Colorado, it is a return to the Big 12 Conference where it was a charter member in 1996 until its departure in 2011. Texas Tech and the Buffaloes were 3-3 against each other as Big 12 members and are 5-5 all-time in the series with four previous non-conference dates. Colorado is led by second-year head coach Deion Sanders, whose son, Deion Jr., was coached by Texas Tech head coach Joey McGuire as a freshman at Cedar Hill High School. McGuire transformed Cedar Hill into a Texas powerhouse with three state titles over his 14 seasons as head coach.

RED RAIDERS SET FOR SEVEN HOMES IN RENOVATED JONES AT&T STADIUM

■ Texas Tech will play five of its first seven games at home this season where the Red Raiders are a combined 10-3 overall under Joey McGuire. The Red Raiders have road trips to Washington State and Arizona during that stretch with home visits by Abilene Christian, North Texas, Arizona State, Cincinnati and Baylor. It is only the fourth time in the Big 12 era for the Red Raiders to start a season with five of their first seven games at home as Texas Tech also did so in 2000, 2005 and 2016.

SEASON PREVIEW

- The Red Raiders will open Big 12 play during that stretch with back-to-back home games, welcoming both Arizona State and Cincinnati to Jones AT&T Stadium. It marks only the second time since joining the Big 12 that Texas Tech has opened conference play with consecutive home games as the Red Raiders also did so in 2003, defeating both Texas A&M and lows State en route to an eventual 8-5 season.
- Texas Tech is slated for seven home games this season in a renovated Jones AT&T Stadium, including five against Big 12 foes. In its history, Texas Tech has hosted seven or more home games in a season 13 times previously with the most recent being in 2022. The Red Raiders are scheduled to host seven home games in three of the next four seasons as part of its new non-conference scheduling model to prioritize home agreements.

TEXAS TECH SET FOR 100TH SEASON OF FOOTBALL

- Texas Tech will kick off its 100th season of football Aug. 31 when Abilene Christian makes the short drive to Jones AT&T Stadium. The Wildcats were actually the seventh opponent for the Red Raiders in their inaugural season in 1925 with Texas Tech prevailing, 10-7, in Abilene. Despite the two programs being separated by a mere 170 miles, the season opener between Texas Tech and Abilene Christian will be the first meeting since 1949 and only the 10th overall. Abilene Christian will also serve as Texas Tech's season opener in 2026.
- The Red Raiders will also be looking to secure their 600th all-time victory early in the season as Texas Tech is 597-481-32 over its 99 seasons of football. Following the Abilene Christian opener, Texas Tech will play three of its next four games at home as visits from North Texas, Arizona State and Cincinnati follow a non-conference road trip to Washington State.

FAMILIAR FACES ON THE OPPOSING SIDELINES

■ Texas Tech fans will notice a few familiar faces on the opposing sidelines this season as the Red Raiders will face five teams whose head coach was previously on staff here in Lubbock. That list includes Abilene Christian's Keith Patterson (defensive coordinator 2019-21), North Texas' Eric Morris (former letterwinner from 2005-08, offensive coordinator 2013-17), Baylor's Dave Aranda (graduate assistant 2000-02), TCU's Sonny Dykes (Texas Tech graduate class of 1993, assistant coach 2000-04, co-offensive coordinator 2005-06) and West Virginia's Neal Brown (offensive coordinator 2010-12).

RED RAIDERS PICKED NINTH IN BIG 12 PRESEASON POLL

- Texas Tech will enter its third season under head coach Joey McGuire picked to finish ninth overall in the new 16-team Big 12, according to the conference preseason poll of media members that was announced by the league office in July, Five different league schools received at least one first-place vote in the poll as Utah led the way with 20 with Kansas State one behind with 19 followed by Oklahoma State with 14, Kansas with five and Arizona with three.
- Texas Tech will not face three of the top-five teams in the preseason poll during the regular season in Utah, Kansas State and Kansas as well as four of the top eight teams overall as the Red Raiders will also not face UCF this season.

BROOKS, MCCRAY NAMED TO BIG 12 PRESEASON TEAM

- Tahj Brooks and Drae McCray headlined the accolades collected by the Red Raiders from the Big 12 in its annual preseason awards, which were announced by the league in July. Brooks was one of two running backs selected to the preseason team, while McCray was the lone return specialist chosen.
- Brooks, who opted to return to Texas Tech after one of the best seasons by a Red Raider running back in school history in 2023, will chase the all-time school record for career rushing yards, needing 1,167 to match Byron Hanspard's record of 4,219 yards from 1994-96. Brooks was an All-Big 12 first-team selection by the conference coaches and Associated Press in 2023 after recording 1,538 rushing yards and 10 touchdowns on the ground the fourth-most yards by an FBS player last year.
- McCray was one of the most electric kick returners in the nation a year ago. He was third in the country for total kick return yards (717), trailing only Zylan Perry of Louisiana-Lafayette (862) and Jacob De Jesus of UNLV (822), and he ranked tied for third in the FBS for most kick returns at least 30 yards (7) and 40 yards (3). McCray shared the FBS high with three kick returns of at least 50 yards on the season, which included a 100-yard touchdown return at home versus Houston on Sept. 30.

CLAY MCGUIRE RETURNS AS OFFENSIVE LINE COACH

- Texas Tech will have a new but familiar face back on its sideline this season with Clay McGuire's return as offensive line coach. This will be McGuire's third stint on the Texas Tech coaching staff as he previously served in various roles from 2006-09, ultimately rising to special teams coordinator (2007-08) and running backs coach (2009) under Mike Leach before returning again in 2018 to be the co-offensive coordinator and running backs coach for Kliff Kingsbury. McGuire (no relation to Joey McGuire) returns to his alma mater following two seasons as the offensive line coach at Washington State, his second stint with the Cougars after serving in a similar capacity for six years under Leach from 2012-17.
- Joey McGuire has established continuity on his coaching staff as eight of his 10 assistant coaches, including all three coordinators in Tim DeRuyter, Zach Kittley and Kenny Perry, as well as head strength and conditioning coach Lance Barilow are all entering their third season. Besides Clay McGuire, Justin Johnson is the only other position coach not in his third year as he joined the Red Raiders as assistant head coach, offensive passing game coordinator and wide receivers coach prior to the 2023 season.

FIVE RED RAIDERS NAMED TEAM CAPTAINS

■ Joey McGuire announced back in January the naming of five team captains for the 2024 season in senior running back Tahj Brooks, senior offensive lineman Caleb Rogers, junior quarterback Behren Morton, junior linebacker Jacob Rodriguez and senior linebacker Bryce Ramirez. The five captains, all previous members of McGuire's leadership committee during the 2023 season, were tasked with identifying and developing new leaders for the football program throughout spring practices as well as enhancing Texas Tech's player-led culture. This is the first time during McGuire's tenure he has named set captains as he previously relied on a leadership committee of upperclassmen from each position group.

SEASON PREVIEW

THE UNOFFICIAL HOME OF THE THSCA

Since his hire as Texas Tech's head coach, Joey McGuire has made it a point to brand the Red Raiders the "unofficial home of the Texas High School Coaches Association." Already a Hall of Famer himself, McGuire has hired a staff filled with experience at both the collegiate and high school levels with four assistant coaches who have previous ties to the THSCA as well as a slew of support staff members.

Texas Tech also has three current student-athletes on its roster whose fathers have been prominent high school coaches in the state in Allen's Lee Wiginton, the father of junior wide receiver **Haydon Wiginton**, Amarillo Tascosa's Ken Plunk, the father of senior defensive back **Joseph Plunk** and Eastland's James Morton, the father of junior quarterback **Behren Morton**. Lee Wiginton is a former president of the THSCA.



NEWS & NOTES ON TEXAS TECH'S THIRD-YEAR HEAD COACH

- With a win over Cal in the Independence Bowl, McGuire improved to 15-11 overall (.577), which marked the fourth-highest winning percentage for a Texas Tech head coach through two seasons and the highest since **Steve Stoan** was 16-7 overall (.696) following the 1976 campaign. His 15 wins, meanwhile, mark the most for any Red Raider head coach through two seasons.
- McGuire became the first head coach in school history to win a bowl game in each of his first two seasons after the Red Raiders downed Cal in the Independence Bowl. Texas Tech previously knocked off Ole Miss to close his inauqural 2022 campaign at the TaxAct Texas Bowl.
- McGuire is now only the second head coach in program history to lead the Red Raiders to bowl games in each of his first two seasons, joining the late Mike Leach, who pushed Texas Tech to a bowl game in each of his 10 seasons. McGuire previously became the eighth head coach in program history to lead the Red Raiders to a bowl game in his debut season a year ago and the 12th head coach to lead Texas Tech to a winning record in his first year.
- Texas Tech has hit the 40-point mark seven times during McGuire's tenure as the Red Raiders are a perfect 7-0 in those games during his two seasons.
- There is defense in West Texas as Texas Tech was 5-1 this past season and is 9-1 overall under McGuire when holding opponents to 25 or fewer points. Texas Tech had not previously limited its opponents to 25 or less points six times during Big 12 play under McGuire and has done so in each of its two bowl victories.
- McGuire 's eight-win debut in 2022 finished one victory shy for the most by a first-year head coach in program history as Dell Morgan previously led the Red Raiders to a 9-2 record in 1941. McGuire led the Red Raiders to a 5-4 record in Big 12 that same season, becoming the first head coach to notch a winning conference record (above .500) in his debut season since David McWilliams did so in 1986. He is a combined 10-8 in Big 12 play now over his two seasons.
- The success the Red Raiders had in Big 12 play during the 2022 season pushed Texas Tech to its most conference wins since 2009 and a fourth-place finish in the standings, its highest since the league went to a 10-team format in 2011.
- McGuire is the only head coach in program history to defeat both Texas and Oklahoma in the same season after knocking off both in overtime in 2022.

RECRUITING SUCCESS UNDER MCGUIRE

- Under McGuire, Texas Tech's personnel department resembles an NFL front office, a unique approach in the world of college football. Texas Tech's personnel department is overseen by general manager James Blanchard, who was McGuire's first hire after accepting the Texas Tech position. Blanchard has the ability to offer any potential recruit he and his staff feel will fit at Texas Tech, allowing McGuire's coaching staff to prioritize player development.
- The setup has paved the way for consecutive top-25 classes as the Red Raiders ranked as high as No. 23 each of the past two years by the likes of Rivals and 0n3.com. Texas Tech's 2023 class ranked as high as No. 23 nationally by Rivals, marking its highest-rated class in more than a decade. Its 2024 class, meanwhile, was the highest-rated class in the Big 12 at No. 23 overall, a testament to McGuire and his staff's ties to the state of Texas.

WELCOME TO THE THREE STRIPE LIFE

- Texas Tech will have a new footwear, uniform, apparel and accessory partner beginning with the 2024 season after signing a 10-year agreement with adidas. The collaboration comes as part of adidas' evolving work with brand partner and Texas Tech alumnus Patrick Mahomes II, who will be the first adidas athlete to have his logo featured on official collegiate apparel. Texas Tech and adidas have already launched co-branded apparel featuring Mahomes' signature Gladiator logo.
- On a busy day in college athletics, the Texas Tech and adidas announcement reached 17 million users across social media platforms as part of a large-scale unveiling that incorporated "ripping the tape" off the partnership, a reference to the shirt Mahomes infamously wore the 2019 Men's Final Four.
- As part of the partnership, all eligible student-athletes at Texas Tech will have the opportunity to join the brand's historic NIL Ambassador Network, which gives all student-athletes at adidas-partnered Division 1 schools the chance to benefit from their Name, Image and Likeness. Since its inception, over 12,000 student-athletes nationwide across a variety of sports have participated in the network, earning a percentage of the sales they drive for key products and campaigns.



ONE OF THE NATION'S TOP RUNNING BACKS

SEASON PREVIEW

Tahj Brooks entered the national picture as one of the nation's top running backs last season, validated not only in stats but also by being honored as a Doak Walker Award semifinalist and an All-Big 12 first team selection. Brooks ended the 2023 season ranked fourth nationally in both rushing yards and rushing yards per game after totaling 1,538 yards on the ground. It marked only the fifth time in program history where a Red Raider has rushed for at least 1,500 yards in a season and the first since Ricky Williams in 1998.

Brooks will now enter the 2024 season as the nation's second-leading returning rusher, trailing only Oklahoma State's Ollie Gordon II. He will be one of only two active FBS rushers to return with at least 3,000 career rushing yards, joining another Big 12 rusher in Kansas' Devin Neal. Brooks is just the seventh Red Raider in program history to reach the 3,000 career rushing mark.

BROOKS RETURNS TO CHASE HANSPARD'S RECORD

- Tahj Brooks may have surprised some when he opted to return for a super-senior season following his more-than-impressive 2023 campaign. His return puts the top spot on Texas Tech's career rushing chart clearly in Brooks' sights as he will need 1,167 yards to match Byron Hanspard's record. Brooks moved to seventh all-time in program history with 3,052 career rushing yards after his successful 2023 campaign where he recorded 1,538 yards on the ground, the fourth-highest total in program history.
- Brooks registered eight 100-vard games last season, which came over the final 11 contests. primarily during Big 12 play. In the three games he did not eclipse 100 yards during that span, he had at least 95 in each contest. Brooks, who topped out with a career-high 182 rushing yards in the home finale versus UCF, now has 12 career games with 100 or more yards, which is fifth all-time in program history behind Hanspard with 21, James Gray with 18, Byron Morris with 16 and James Hadnot with 13.
- Brooks will have his shot at one more career category as well as he needs 196 rushing attempts this season to match Hanspard's school record. For reference, Brooks carried 290 times this past season, which led all power-four rushers and ranked second nationally only behind Kimani Vidal of Troy. It marked the most fourth-most rushing attempts by a Red Raider in program history and the most since Ricky Williams had 336 in 1998
- Brooks found the end zone on the ground in seven of the last eight games of the regular season, failing to do so only in the finale at Texas. Prior to the trip to Austin, his streak of seven-straight games with a rushing touchdown marked the first time a Red Raider has done so since Eric Stephens between the last two games of the 2010 season and the first five of the 2011 campaign. The last time it was done in a single season was Taurean Henderson over the final eight games in 2004. His first rushing touchdown of the 2024 season will move him into a tie for ninth all-time in program history.

HARD TO TACKLE

- According to Pro Football Focus, Brooks controlled a commanding lead nationally with 96 forced miss tackles this season, which was easily the most among power-four players last season. The next-closest power-five player in that category was Quinshon Judkins formally of Ole Miss with 78 forced missed tackles. Kimani Vidal of Troy ranked second nationally with 94 forced missed tackles followed by Boise State's Ashton Jeanty with 82.
- Additionally, PFF ranked Brooks fourth in the FBS for yards after contact with 998 this past season, including an astounding 151 against UCF. He trailed only a pair of Doak Walker Award finalists in North Carolina's Omarion Hampton, who has 1,072 yards after contact and Ollie Gordon's 1,056 yards after contact, as well as Vidal of Trov with 1.056 vards.

MORE THAN JUST A RUSHER

- Ask just about anyone in the Texas Tech football office, and they'll likely brag about Tahj Brooks' ability as a pass blocker just as much as his rushing skills. In Texas Tech's spread offense, Brooks is called upon heavily in protection as Pro Football Focus credited him with 105 pass blocking opportunities a year ago, which was tied for ninth in the FBS and third among power-four rushers.
- PFF graded Brooks at 76.5 as a pass blocker, which was the highest for a power-four rusher with at least 70 opportunities on the season. Brooks ranked seventh nationally in overall pass-blocking grade as he surrendered only one sack on the season. In fact, it represented the only sack Brooks has been charged with during his career over 193 pass-blocking opportunities.

IT'S ALWAYS TAHJ TIME IN WEST TEXAS

Texas Tech has launched TahjTime.com, a promotional website for Red Raider senior running back Tahj Brooks for both national awards and to track his progress towards Byron Hanspard's career rushing record during his final season. The website, which plays off Brooks' popular celebration following each touchdown, debuted prior to his appearance at Big 12 Media Days in July and will be updated regularly throughout the 2024 season.

SOUTH END ZONE & WOMBLE FOOTBALL CENTER



▲ Texas Tech will complete ts largest facility investment in athletics history this season with the opening of the South End Zone and Dustin R. Womble Football Center project. The \$242 million project marks the largest contiguous athletics facility in the country with more than 300,000 combined square feet of space.

THE LARGEST CONTIGUOUS FOOTBALL FACILITY IN THE COUNTRY

- Texas Tech will officially open the South End Zone and Dustin R. Womble Football Center project this season, featuring more than 340,000 combined square feet of space with a blend of world-class modern design and technology elements with Spanish Renaissance architecture well known to Texas Tech supporters. The \$242 million project marks the largest contiguous football facility in the country, connecting the south end zone building to the Womble Football Center and the Sports Performance Center, which opened in 2017 as Texas Tech's indoor football practice facility and indoor track and field venue.
- Joey McGuire and his staff moved into their new coaches' offices on the second floor of the South End Zone Building in July 2024, giving them a stunning view overlooking Cody Campbell Field at Jones AT&T Stadium. The office location places McGuire and his staff steps from each position room and the skybridge connected to the Womble Football Center where offensive and defensive breakout rooms will be located as well as a team meeting space and a state-of-the-art walkthrough area on the second level.
- Texas Tech is slated to open the Womble Football Center this fall as the two-story building will maintain its football strength and conditioning, sports medicine and equipment areas on the main level as part of the new layout. The Red Raiders' main locker room will be located in the Womble Football Center, which includes space for 120-plus athletes and modern primary designs from Hollman that are fully ventilated and contain USB charging ports and DreamSeat technology for every player.
- The second floor of the Womble Football Center will feature a revolutionary 4,500-plus square foot multi-purpose walkthrough area designed for large-scale indoor team strategy implementation, instruction and technique evaluation only a few steps from the team meeting space and position rooms. The space will feature a 25-by-20 yard turf surface in front of a 70-foot wide by 10.5-foot high LED screen that will be the largest in both college football and the NFL for walkthrough areas. The LED screen will allow Texas Tech's coaches to simulate an opponent's formation and scheme, giving the Red Raiders real-time feedback through the advanced technology during game preparations on the turf field.
- Texas Tech will boast a 15,000-square-foot, two-level weight room once completed, one of the largest in college football. The weight room area is located in the southwest corner of the Womble Football Center, giving the Red Raiders direct access into the Sports Performance Center and the outdoor practice fields.
- The entire facility will significantly upgrade the amenities provided to the Red Raiders on a daily basis, notably with a two-story players' lounge, the "Uncommon Man" barber sharp, a state-of-the-art hydrotherapy recovery suite and a primary 12,000-square-foot locker room located in the Womble Football Center. Texas Tech will also maintain an 85-player gameday locker room in the south end zone located not far from a gameday lounge for recruits during pregame and then letterwinners after kickoff. The Womble Football Center also features a letterwinners lounge, giving former players direct access to the facility to watch practice from a balcony overlooking the putdoor grantice fields
- The 2024 season will mark the return of the iconic Double T scoreboard, a landmark on the Texas Tech campus since 1978. As part of the project, Texas Tech constructed a new Double T scoreboard to sit atop the new south end zone building, using the same dimensions as its previous model but placing it at a much higher elevation. The new Double T scoreboard is now 115 feet off the ground at its peak, giving students and alumni stunning views at various locations throughout campus.
- The Red Raiders will enter Jones AT&T Stadium each gameday through the Gary Petersen Field Club, a 12,000-square-foot premium space that is among the first of its kind in college football. It is one of several new premium areas as Texas Tech has added 17 new luxury suites to go along with 500 club and loge box seats and two spacious party decks. Texas Tech now boasts 102 premium suites throughout Jones AT&T Stadium to go along with more than 2,500 club and loge box seat options.
- Texas Tech will debut a new team entrance during its Aug. 31 season opener against Abilene Christian as the Red Raiders will now enter behind the south goalpost prior to kickoff. The iconic Masked Rider saddle will be located in the Gary Petersen Field Club, giving fans in that area an opportunity to see the Red Raiders touch it one final time on their way into the stadium.
- In addition to the large-scale construction, Texas Tech also enhanced its gameday experience as part of the project, adding nine LED displays through Daktronics as well as a state-of-the-art sound system by Clair Audio, a national leader in large venue audio production. The added LED displays include the main videoboard on the north end of the stadium, expanding it to 37-feet high by 136-feet wide in size with 10-millimeter pixel spacing for excellent image clarity and contrast. Texas Tech also constructed two new video displays atop its south end zone measuring 28-feet high by 48-feet wide, featuring content zoning abilities that are already a staple of the north end zone videoboard. All three new videoboards feature 10mm pixel pitch, providing every fan in the 60,000-plus seat stadium with the highest resolution display in college football.
- The opening of the South End Zone Building to Jones AT&T Stadium officially closed The Campaign for Fearless Champions, one of the most-successful fundraising initiatives in university history that raised more than \$500 million to transform Texas Tech's athletic facilities across every sport, while also pouring resources into the student-athlete experience through scholarship endowments and the creation of the J.T. and Margaret Talkington Office of Student-Athlete Development.
- Texas Tech previously enhanced the atmosphere inside Jones AT&T Stadium prior to the 2023 season with a new Musco LED lighting system to go along with a state-of-the-art playing surface from Hellas. The lighting system provides Texas Tech with the ability to utilize choreographed patterns designed to music during its pregame entertainment, in-between quarters and after touchdowns. The lighting system has already greatly enhanced the in-game fan experience, especially under the Jones AT&T Stadium lights where the Red Raiders have traditionally boasted one of the nation's top homefield advantages.
