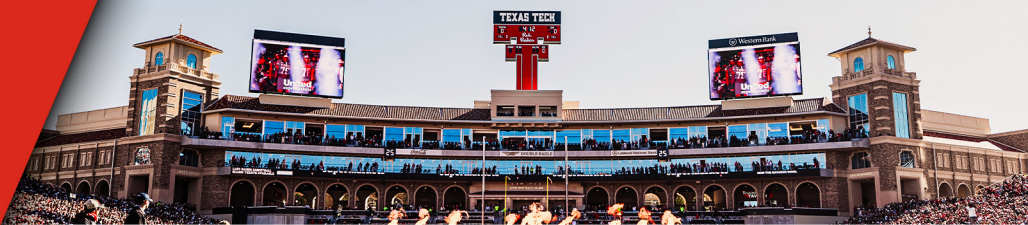

TECH LOOKS TO BOUNCE BACK AT HOME

Texas Tech will look to bounce back from its first loss of the season Saturday when the 14th-ranked Red Raiders welcome Oklahoma State to Jones AT&T Stadium. The Red Raiders will aim to bounce back against an Oklahoma State team that is 1-6 on the season and 0-4 so far in Big 12 play in what will be the 52nd all-time meeting in a series that is tied 24-24-3 entering this weekend. Texas Tech is a perfect 4-0 at home this season and an impressive 19-5 inside Jones AT&T Stadium 2022, which is tied for the highest Big 12 winning percentage during that span.



STILL PLENTY OF SEASON REMAINING

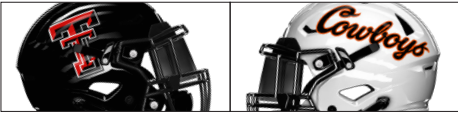
Arizona State used a two-minute drive to snap Texas Tech's six-game winning streak to start the season, marking the 11th-consecutive win for the Sun Devils against a Big 12 opponent when quarterback Sam Leavitt starts. It is the longest active streak among all power-four quarterbacks. The Red Raiders, meanwhile, remain in the Big 12 hunt thanks to their balance as Texas Tech is one of only two FBS teams leading its conference in both scoring offense and scoring defense entering this weekend, joining Toledo.



BAILEY OFF TO HISTORIC START

David Bailey arrived at Texas Tech as one of the top signings from the transfer portal this offseason. The Stanford transfer has more than lived up to the billing as he leads the FBS with 10.5 sacks this season, placing him on pace to possibly snap the Texas Tech single-season record of 15.0 that was set by Brandon Sharpe in 2009. Bailey has combined for 8.0 sacks during Big 12 play alone, with 3.0 coming against Kansas and then 2.0 this past weekend at Arizona State, as he easily leads the FBS for sacks against conference opponents.

SERIES NOTEBOOK

INSIDE THE SERIES

- This will be the 52nd all-time meeting between Texas Tech and Oklahoma State in a series that is tied 24-24-3 overall after the Red Raiders handed the Cowboys a 56-48 loss a year ago in Stillwater. Texas Tech is 13-8-2 all-time at home against the Cowboys with Oklahoma State's last visit coming in 2021.
 - The Red Raiders are 12-16 all-time against the Cowboys during the Big 12 era despite winning seven of the first nine meetings after the league formed prior to the 1996 season. Oklahoma State returned the favor, winning 12 of the last 15 meetings with Texas Tech's two wins during that stretch coming in a 41-17 road win in 2018, a 45-35 victory at home a year later and then last season's victory.
 - The Red Raiders snapped a nine-game losing streak to Oklahoma State in their 2018 visit to Stillwater following a 41-17 victory in 2018. It marked the first time Texas Tech had topped Oklahoma State away from home since the 2001 season. Texas Tech is only 3-10 in Stillwater during the Big 12 era with its lone other win coming via a 27-3 victory in 1997.
 - The victory over Oklahoma State in 2019 marked Texas Tech's first at home against the Cowboys since the 2008 season as the Red Raiders created five takeaways and totaled seven sacks, their most in a game at the time since 2009.
 - Texas Tech and Oklahoma State have produced several high-scoring shootouts in recent years as the two schools have combined for at least 70 points in 10 of the past 12 meetings. The two schools have combined for 50 or more points in 13 of the past 14 meetings and in 21 of the past 25 contests overall.
- THE BOYS FROM OKLAHOMA**
- Texas Tech has two players from the state of Oklahoma in true freshman cornerback Deante Lindsay and junior corner Maurion Horn. Lindsay, arrived at Texas Tech, after a promising high school career in Ada, roughly 90 miles southeast of Oklahoma City. Horn has been a staple in the Texas Tech secondary the past few years after signing with the Red Raiders out of Broken Arrow in the Tulsa area.
 - In addition, Tech has two Oklahoma natives on its staff in defensive line coach Zarnell Fitch and director of player development Dave Martin. Fitch grew up in the Oklahoma City

suburb of Spencer before attending TCU and beginning his coaching career in the DFW metroplex. Martin, meanwhile, was raised not far from Fitch in nearby Jones where he later returned to be the head coach of his alma mater, compiling a 138-38 record and one state title during his 14 seasons as the athletic director and head coach at Jones High School.

TEXAS TECH-OSU CONNECTIONS

- Texas Tech associate head coach and special teams coordinator Kenny Perry was on the same Kansas staff as Oklahoma State interim head coach Doug Meacham during the 2017-18 season. Perry was in a similar role during those two seasons with the Jayhawks, while Meacham was the offensive coordinator. Texas Tech wide receivers coach and offensive passing game coordinator Justin Johnson was also on the Kansas staff during that span, first as an offensive analyst from 2016-17 and then as the wide receivers coach in 2018.
- Meacham also crossed paths with Texas Tech defensive line coach Zarnell Fitch as the two were on the same TCU staff on two different occasions during the 2014-16 seasons and then again from 2020-21. Fitch began his tenure at his alma mater as TCU's Director of High School Relations from 2014-15 before being promoted to defensive line coach, a position he held from 2016-21. Meacham was TCU's co-offensive coordinator and inside receivers coach from 2014-16 before departing for Kansas. He returned to TCU in 2020 as inside receivers and tight ends coach before moving back into the offensive coordinator role a year later.
- Oklahoma State offensive line coach Andrew Mitchell also spent time on the TCU staff alongside Fitch, first as an assistant offensive line and tight ends coach in 2016 and then as an offensive analyst in 2021.
- Oklahoma State quarterbacks coach Kevin Johns spent one season on the Texas Tech staff, serving as the offensive coordinator and inside receivers coach under then head coach Kliff Kingsbury in 2018. Texas Tech boasted one of the nation's top offenses that season, ranking fourth nationally with 352.6 passing yards per game and 12th with 485.2 total yards per contest. The Red Raiders averaged 37.3 points per game despite starting three different quarterbacks throughout the season.

TEXAS TECH 56, OKLAHOMA STATE 48

STILLWATER, Okla. (AP) - Behren Morton and Tahj Brooks each accounted for four touchdowns while Jacob Rodriguez made two big defensive plays to secure Texas Tech's 56-48 victory against Oklahoma State on Saturday.

The Red Raiders (7-4, 5-3 Big 12) bounced back from their previous loss to Colorado, while the Cowboys (3-8, 0-8) extended their losing streak to eight games, remaining the Big 12's lone team without a conference win.

Brooks ran for a 1-yard touchdown with 6:12 left, giving Texas Tech a lead it never surrendered. He capitalized on Drae McCray's 45-yard kick return, which allowed the Red Raiders to open the drive on their 47-yard line.

Rodriguez then spoiled OSU's chance to tie the game, recovering a fumble in the end zone as Texas Tech extended its lead to 56-42.

Rodriguez sealed the win when he intercepted a pass from OSU freshman quarterback Maealiuaki Smith, who made his first career start in place of benched passer Alan Bowman.

Morton completed 35 of 50 pass attempts for 366 yards and four touchdowns, while Brooks had 28 carries for 133 yards and three touchdowns. Brooks also caught nine passes for 65 yards and a touchdown.

The Red Raiders showcased their high-powered offense to get their season back on track. For the third straight season under coach Joey McGuire, Texas Tech has at least five conference wins.

LAWRENCE, Kan. (AP) - With Graham Harrell throwing for 386 yards and five touchdowns and a swarming defense forcing Todd Reesing into his worst game since high school, No. 8 Texas Tech pasted No. 19 Kansas, 63-21. The Red Raiders scored 49 straight points.

Harrell, the nation's No. 1 passer also scored on a 1-yard run for the Red Raiders, who rolled up 556 yards of total offense while matching their best start in 32 years.

Parcel McBath intercepted three of Reesing's first four passes of the third quarter to snuff out any flickering hopes for the Jayhawks (5-3, 2-2).

Harrell's touchdown passes ranged from 55 yards to Edward Britton to 4 to Michael Crabtree. He also connected with Eric Morris on scoring tosses of 10 and 7 yards and found Crabtree on a tackle-breaking 16-yard scoring play.

The Red Raiders' career passing leader was 34-for-42 with no interceptions. But late in the game, long after the outcome was decided, Harrell was sacked on successive plays after being sacked only once in his first seven games.

Kansas matched Harrell touchdown-for-touchdown through a first quarter that ended 14-14. But the Red Raiders ripped off 49 unanswered points for their 10th victory in 11 games against Kansas, which had won 13 straight at home.

The Jayhawks kept trying to disguise coverages. But a week after giving up an Oklahoma school-record 468 yards passing, they were helpless against Harrell and his offensive machine. When they dropped everybody back in coverage, Harrell would simply stand back, protected by huge blockers, and pick out targets.

Any hope Kansas had in the second half was extinguished by the two quick touchdowns that resulted from McBath's interceptions, and turned a game that had Kansas favored by two points into one of the most embarrassing routs in Mangino's seven years as coach.

Reesing finished 16-of-26 for 154 yards and two touchdowns in Kansas' most lopsided home loss since a 64-0 setback to Kansas State in 2002.

■ Roster-wise, Texas Tech has one Oklahoma State transfer on its roster in senior wide receiver Haydon Wiginton, who arrived in 2022 following one redshirt season with the Cowboys.

■ Texas Tech junior center Sheridan Wilson is more than familiar with the Cowboys, as his older brother, Preston, was an offensive lineman at Oklahoma State from 2020-24. The older Wilson made 46 starts for the Cowboys, including a streak of 24 consecutive starts to end his career.

■ Oklahoma State Director of Athletics Chad Weiberg was previously on staff at Texas Tech as he served as Deputy A.D. from 2015-17. Weiberg departed Kirby Hocutt's executive staff to accept the same position at Oklahoma State, which ultimately led to his promotion in 2021 to the Athletics Director chair.

BEHREN MORTON VERSUS THE COWBOYS

■ Behren Morton has combined for 780 yards and six touchdowns over his career against Oklahoma State, the second-highest total for the senior quarterback against any single opponent, trailing only West Virginia. Morton has recorded two of his eight career 300-yard passing performances versus the Cowboys as he threw for 379 yards and two touchdowns in 2022 and then a career-high 401 yards and four touchdowns in last season's shootout in Stillwater.

■ The 2022 matchup versus Oklahoma State marked the first start in Morton's young career at the time as the then redshirt freshman completed 39-of-62 passes for 379 yards and two touchdowns. His 379 passing yards marked the third-highest total for a Red Raider making his starting debut against a conference opponent during the Big 12 era. Morton's 62 passing attempts were also the most for an FBS freshman making his starting debut at the time since Jared Goff had 64 in the 2023 season opener for Cal in its loss to Northwestern. Morton also rushed 17 times for 53 yards and a touchdown in the loss as he found the end zone on a nine-yard scamper near the end of the first quarter.

OTHER NOTABLE OKLAHOMA STATE OUTINGS

■ Jacob Rodriguez had his hand in two key takeaways in last season's victory over the Cowboys as he recorded a key fumble for a touchdown and delivered the game-clinching interception with only seven seconds remaining. Rodriguez, who gave Texas Tech a 56-42 lead with 4:41 remaining after racing to fall on an errant snap into the end zone, added 12 tackles and a quarterback hurry in the win. He has 14 career tackles over his two matchups with the Cowboys to go with three quarterback hurries as he had two stops and two hurries in 2022.

■ Caleb Douglas recorded his third career 100-yard receiving game against Oklahoma State a year ago after hauling in five catches for 102 yards and a touchdown. He capped Texas Tech's opening drive with a nine-yard touchdown catch from Behren Morton to give the Red Raiders an early 7-0 lead.

■ Coy Eakin recorded a season-high seven receptions and 90 receiving yards in last season's win over the Cowboys, falling a catch shy of his career high that was set in 2023 against TCU.

■ Maurion Horn recorded a career-high two pass breakups in his return to his native state of Oklahoma a year ago, to go

along with three tackles in the win. It was his third consecutive game at the time with a pass breakup.

■ Lee Hunter put together one of the best performances of his UCF tenure against Oklahoma State in 2023 as he was part of a Knights defense that limited the nation's leading rusher in Ollie Gordon II to only 25 yards on 12 carries. Hunter had eight tackles in the win, including 2.0 for a loss. It is one of five games in Hunter's career where he has recorded multiple tackles for loss.

RED RAIDER NOTEBOOK

THIS WEEK IN THE TOP-25 POLLS

■ Texas Tech dropped to No. 14 this week in the latest Associated Press poll and to No. 15 in a vote of AFCA coaches compiled by USA Today. The Red Raiders were previously ranked as high as No. 7 prior to their loss at Arizona State, their highest appearance in either poll since late in the 2008 season.

■ The Red Raiders have been ranked inside the top 25 of both major polls every week thus far this season. Texas Tech entered the 2025 season ranked inside the top 25 of both major polls for the first time since 2008, as the Red Raiders were No. 23 in the Associated Press poll and No. 24 in the AFCA coaches poll. Texas Tech was previously ranked No. 24 in the 2023 AFCA preseason poll before falling out after a season-opening loss at Wyoming.

■ It was the first time the Red Raiders had appeared in the Associated Press poll since Sept. 23, 2018, when Texas Tech was No. 24 nationally after starting its season 3-1 overall with wins over Lamar, Houston, and at No. 15 Oklahoma State, and the lone loss coming in the opener to Ole Miss.

WHERE TEXAS TECH'S START RANKS

■ Texas Tech's successful 6-0 start to the season marked the seventh time in school history the Red Raiders have opened with a 6-0 record or better. It was the first time Texas Tech rolled off at least six-consecutive wins to start a season since Kliff Kingsbury's debut as head coach in 2013.

■ In the six previous seasons with a 6-0 start, the Red Raiders have gone on to win at least 10 games in half of those, doing so in 1938 under Pete Cawthon, 1976 under Steve Sloan and again in 2008 under Mike Leach. Texas Tech also went 6-0 to start the 1998 season under Spike Dykes before finishing 7-5 overall. The 2005 team under Leach ended its season at 9-3 overall, while the 2013 campaign for Kingsbury finished with an 8-5 record. Texas Tech has six 10-win seasons in its history with the most recent coming under Leach in 2008.

Even more impressive, the Red Raiders are one of four FBS teams in the last 30 years to start a season winning their first six games by 20-plus points while holding each opponent to under 20 points. Texas Tech joins Michigan (2023), Stanford (2011) and Wisconsin (2011), all of which eventually won at least 11 games in those respective seasons. Texas Tech did not trail in a single game over that stretch, becoming the final FBS team to finally fall behind on the scoreboard last weekend at Arizona State.

ULTIMATE GOAL: GET TO ARLINGTON

- Texas Tech began this season with the ultimate goal of finding its way to AT&T Stadium in Arlington, the site of the Big 12 Championship game. That goal is still in reach even with the Red Raiders' loss last weekend at Arizona State. Texas Tech is now one of five Big 12 programs at 3-1 or better in Big 12 play, joining unbeaten BYU (4-0), Cincinnati (4-0) and then Arizona State (3-1) and Houston (3-1).
- Texas Tech secured its second 3-0 start to Big 12 play in as many years with its 42-17 victory over Kansas. It marked the sixth time since joining the Big 12 in 1996 that the Red Raiders opened league play with three-consecutive victories. Dating back to joining the Southwest Conference in 1960, this is the eighth time the league slate has been started with a 3-0 record, having done so in 1976 and 1983 and then five times in the Big 12 era in 1998, 2005, 2008, 2013, and 2024.

TEXAS TECH DOMINANT OVERALL

- The Red Raiders have been dominant in their six victories this season, winning all six games by at least 24 points while outscoring opponents, 307-99, overall. Texas Tech currently ranks tied for third nationally in average points differential as the Red Raiders are outscoring opponents to the tune of a 29.7 margin this season, which trails only Indiana (32.2) and Ohio State (30.6) and is tied with Oregon.
- Texas Tech is the only team in the country with six or more wins by 20 or more points this season. Only five other schools - Memphis, Oregon, South Florida, Utah and Vanderbilt - have recorded five wins by at least 20 points this season with the Utes being the lone team to do so from the Big 12 Conference.
- Texas Tech won each of its three Big 12 games by at least 24 points, marking the first time a conference school has done so since Baylor in 2015. It is the sixth time in league history a Big 12 program has opened conference play with three-consecutive wins by 24 points or more. The Red Raiders were

the first Big 12 program to boast an average point differential of at least 35.3 and be 6-0 since Baylor in 2015, prior to their loss at Arizona State.

FROM A HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE...

- When the point differential is dropped to only 20 points, this was the first time since the 1953-54 seasons the Red Raiders won six-straight games by at least that margin. Texas Tech closed the 1953 season with five-straight wins by 20 or more points and then opened the 1954 campaign with a 41-9 victory at Texas A&M and a 33-7 win over West Texas State. The Red Raiders set the Texas Tech single-season record with nine of their 11 victories in 1953 coming by 20 or more points.
- This is the eighth time in school history the Red Raiders have won six or more games in a season by 20 points and the first time since 2009. Texas Tech has won seven games by that margin only three times in history, which came in 1953 (9), 1932 (8) and 2009 (7).
- Texas Tech's current average margin of victory of 29.7 points would rank as its highest in school history. That record dates back to 1953, when Texas Tech outscored opponents to the tune of 29.6 points per game. Since joining the Southwest Conference in 1960, Texas Tech's highest average point differential is its 20.6 margin from 2005.

NOTES

- Texas Tech will look to reverse its recent fortunes against Kansas State next weekend as the Red Raiders are riding an eight-game losing streak to the Wildcats. It is the longest winning streak by either team in the series as Kansas State is 15-9 all-time in the series after winning 12 of the last 13 contests overall.
- The Red Raiders will be looking for their first win over Kansas State since late in the 2015 season when Texas Tech downed the Wildcats, 59-44, at Jones AT&T Stadium. Texas Tech has not won in Manhattan since the 2008 season when the Red Raiders downed K-State, 58-28. Kansas State has won six-consecutive games in the Little Apple.
- The Red Raiders have gone down to the wire against Kansas State over the course of the eight-game losing streak as six of those losses have been determined by 10 points or less with four of them being one-possession games. Texas Tech is only 1-6 all-time in games determined by eight points or less versus the Wildcats with its lone win coming in the first-ever meeting between the two schools, a 6-0 victory in 1933.
- The two schools have only met three times outside of Big 12 play with the first coming in a 6-0 victory by the Red Raiders in 1933. The two schools also played in Lubbock during the 1963 and 1986 seasons, both Texas Tech victories.

HARRELL ENTERS RING OF HONOR SATURDAY

- Texas Tech will induct its 12th member to the prestigious Ring of Honor this Saturday when Graham Harrell's name is unveiled on the West Stadium Building at halftime of the Oklahoma State game. Harrell's name will forever be honored alongside Donny Anderson (2012), E.J. Holub (2012), Dave Parks (2012), Gabe Rivera (2014), Zach Thomas (2016), Michael Crabtree (2021), Patrick Mahomes II (2022), Thomas Howard (2024), Andre Tillman (2024) and Wes Welker (2024).
- Harrell was previously selected this past January to the 2025 class of the NFF College Football HOF as he will be inducted Dec. 9. He will become the seventh Red Raider in program history to be inducted into the CFB Hall of Fame.
- To this day, Harrell remains Texas Tech's career leader for passing yards (15,793), touchdown passes (134), pass attempts (2,062), completions (1,403), passing yards per game (350.9), 300-yard games (32) and 400-yard games (20). He broke seven NCAA records during his playing career and remains in the top five of seven FBS statistical categories, including career passing yards and career touchdown passes.
- Harrell finished fourth in the 2008 Heisman Trophy voting, narrowly topping teammate and fellow Ring of Honor inductee Michael Crabtree, who was fifth overall after a memorable season that saw the Red Raiders finish 11-1 in the regular season and rise to No. 2 in the national polls. Texas Tech combined to win 28 games during Harrell's three seasons as the starting quarterback.

REMINDER ABOUT SCHEDULE COMPARISONS

- The only real criticism the Red Raiders have received so far this year is regarding their non-conference schedule. As a reminder, two other current top-15 teams in No. 6 Oregon and No. 13 Oklahoma, faced two of Texas Tech's non-conference opponents in recent weeks, with both winning by a smaller margin of victory. Oregon topped its in-state rival Oregon State, 41-7, on Sept. 20 in Eugene, one weekend after the Red Raiders downed the Beavers, 45-14, at home. Oklahoma, meanwhile, shut out a Kent State program, 44-0, that was blown out by the Red Raiders, 62-14, in week two.
- Texas Tech's four opponents thus far in Big 12 play are a combined 9-3 in conference games not involving the Red Raiders and 19-5 overall. Texas Tech has faced two of the top-five teams in the Big 12 standings thus far, splitting road games with a win at Houston and a loss at Arizona State.
- Dating back to joining the Southwest Conference in 1960, Texas Tech has opened conference play with a 2-0 record as a result of road wins only once previously, which came during its memorable 1976 season. The Red Raiders shared the Southwest Conference title that season with a 7-1 league record, finishing 10-2 overall under Steve Sloan. Texas Tech began Big 12 play by delivering a 34-10 victory at previously-No. 16 Utah and then a 35-11 win at Houston, giving the Cougars what is still their only loss this season. Utah, meanwhile, is 5-2 overall.
- The Red Raiders, who closed last season with November road wins at No. 10 Iowa State and Oklahoma State, were in the midst of their longest conference road winning streak since 1996-97 until their loss last weekend at Arizona State. Texas Tech closed the 1996 campaign with three-consecutive Big 12 road wins over Kansas, Texas A&M and Oklahoma before beginning league play a year later with a victory at Baylor.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Texas Tech returns to the friendly confines of Jones AT&T Stadium this weekend, where the Red Raiders are a perfect 4-0 this season and 19-5 under Joey McGuire since his hiring prior to the 2022 campaign. Texas Tech is tied with Kansas

State for the highest home winning percentage among Big 12 members during that span, entering this weekend. Texas Tech is 11-4 at home against Big 12 opponents under McGuire and an impressive 8-1 during non-conference play.

- This is the 14th time in program history and the third time in a four-year span that Tech has hosted seven games in a season, continuing its recent trend of prioritizing home games. The Red Raiders are slated to host seven home games in two of the next three seasons, with 2027 being the lone exception.

RED RAIDERS IN ONE-POSSESSION GAMES

- Texas Tech has ranked among the nation's most successful teams in one-possession games since hiring Joey McGuire in 2022. The Red Raiders are 13-5 in such games under McGuire — a drastic improvement for a program that went a combined 13-20 in the seven seasons prior to his arrival. Texas Tech was 4-0 in one-possession games during McGuire's debut season in 2022, followed by a 3-3 mark in 2023 and a 6-1 record last year. The Red Raiders, who had beaten opponents by no fewer than 24 points per game through their first six contests (6-0), dropped their first game of 2025 on Oct. 18 at Arizona State — a 26-22 one-possession defeat that came down to a 28-yard Hail Mary on the final play, which fell just outside the grasp of a Red Raider receiver.
- Among teams nationally with at least eight one-possession games since 2022, Texas Tech leads the Big 12 for winning percentage. A trio of Big 12 teams are the next-closest Big 12 program to the Red Raiders in terms of winning percentage, which includes BYU (12-6, .667), Houston (12-6, .667 and West Virginia (10-5, .667), which is 10-5 overall since 2022.
- Texas Tech is an impressive 8-1 at home in one-possession games under McGuire, with the lone loss coming early in the 2023 season to No. 13 Oregon. The Red Raiders are 5-4 on the road, including three wins this past season at Arizona, Iowa State and Oklahoma State. Texas Tech also won a one-possession game at Iowa State in 2022 and at Kansas in 2023.

THE HOTTEST TICKET IN TOWN

- Texas Tech sold out of season tickets for the third consecutive season in early May as Red Raider fans purchased more than 33,000 season passes for the 2025 campaign. This total does not include seats reserved for Texas Tech's student body, either. Texas Tech also sold out its entire premium seating inventory in all areas of Jones AT&T Stadium, which includes more than 100 luxury suites and 1,600 club seats.
- Texas Tech has added more than 14,000 season tickets since Joey McGuire's hiring in November 2021. Texas Tech previously sold 28,000 season tickets for McGuire's debut season in 2022, which, like this year's total, ranks among the top-10 highest season ticket counts in program history.
- Texas Tech has played in front of a sold-out crowd in each of its first four home games of the season, as 60,229 fans were on hand for the Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Kent State, Oregon State, and Kansas wins. The Red Raiders are already scheduled for two other advanced sellouts this season, as tickets are also already sold out for Saturday's home date versus Oklahoma State and the Nov. 8 contest against BYU, making the regular-season finale against UCF the only game still available.
- At its current pace, Texas Tech is on course to easily snap the school's single-season average attendance record of 58,934 fans that was set over six games in 2014.

RED RAIDERS DELIVER RANKED WIN AT UTAH

- Texas Tech landed its third road win over a ranked opponent in as many seasons at previously No. 16 Utah, topping the Utes, 34-10, in the Big 12 opener. It marked Texas Tech's largest win over a top-25 team since the Red Raiders downed No. 15 Oklahoma State, 41-17, to open conference play on the road in 2018 under then head coach Kliff Kingsbury.
- The Red Raiders are now 5-7 against ranked opponents under Joey McGuire as Texas Tech toppled No. 25 Houston and No. 19 Texas during his inaugural season in 2022 and then

No. 16 Kansas on the road in 2023 and No. 10 Iowa State last season. McGuire's five wins thus far are tied with Spike Dykes for the most all-time for a Texas Tech head coach in his first four seasons.

THE BIG 12 LEADER IN BOWL APPEARANCES

- Texas Tech secured its 43rd bowl appearance in its history and fifth in as many years with the win over Kansas, which leads all active Big 12 Conference teams. Texas Tech ranks tied for 20th nationally in all-time bowl appearances as the Red Raiders have one more than fellow Big 12 member BYU and two more than West Virginia.
- Texas Tech is currently in the midst of its longest bowl streak since its 2000-10 stretch, primarily under Mike Leach. That 11-year run represents the only time in program history that Texas Tech has made the postseason in five consecutive seasons. This is the third time in program history the Red Raiders have reached a bowl game in four-straight years, as Texas Tech also did so from 1993-96 under Spike Dykes.
- Joey McGuire is the first head coach in program history to lead the Red Raiders to a bowl appearance in each of his first four seasons. Texas Tech is 2-1 in bowl games under McGuire after topping Ole Miss in the 2022 TaxAct Texas Bowl and Cal in the 2023 Independence Bowl, while falling this past season to Arkansas in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl.

- Texas Tech will continue to recognize the hometowns of every student-athlete on its roster this season with a special decal on the back of each gameday helmet. The decal will feature a throwback Masked Rider logo with the area code associated with each student-athlete's hometown as part of an initiative started in 2022 by head coach Joey McGuire.

THE BRAND NUMBER



Here at Texas Tech, there is only one available jersey number that is protected: No. 3. The jersey represents the player or players who best represent the core tenets of "The Brand," which represents Texas Tech's daily quest to be the "toughest, hard-working, most competitive team in the country."

The Red Raiders have two players wearing the jersey this season in returning linebacker Bryce Ramirez and wide receiver Coy Eakin. Ramirez was awarded the jersey prior to the 2023 season in recognition of his determination and leadership in response to a catastrophic leg injury suffered the year before at N.C. State.

Eakin, meanwhile, is coming off his best season as a Red Raider as he caught 49 passes for 652 yards and a team-leading seven touchdowns as only a sophomore this past season. He has 85 catches now for his Red Raider career, totaling 1,068 yards and nine touchdowns in 27 games. Eakin finished as Texas Tech's third-leading receiver this past season, trailing only departed senior Josh Kelly and returning senior Caleb Douglas. Eakin will move to Kelly's previous spot in Texas Tech's inside receiver position beginning this spring under new offensive coordinator Mack Leftwich.

In addition to representing the standards of "The Brand," the No. 3 jersey is designated to honor the life of the late Luke Siegel, who passed in August 2021 after inspiring countless others across the nation with his fighting spirit in the wake of a golf-cart accident. The No. 3 represented Siegel's favorite number.

DEGREES EARNED

The Red Raiders will enter the 2025 season with 21 student-athletes who are current college graduates, including 12 who earned their degree from Texas Tech University.

HEAD COACH JOEY MCGUIRE

THE HALL OF FAMER

- There likely isn't a power conference football program in the state of Texas with better ties to its high school coaches than at Texas Tech as McGuire hired six members of his charter coaching staff who have ties to the Texas High School Coaches Association (THSCA). McGuire, himself, is already a legend at the prep level as a member of the THSCA Hall of Honor and the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame.
- McGuire, owner of three state titles as head coach of Cedar Hill High School in the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex, was inducted into the THSCA Hall of Honor (THSCA) in 2020 and then the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame in 2022 in the months after accepting the Texas Tech position. McGuire is still an avid speaker at the annual THSCA Convention and regularly hosts clinics for high school coaches each year.

NOT THE ONLY COACH IN THE FAMILY

- Texas Tech will have a second member of the McGuire family on its sidelines this season with Garret McGuire joining the staff as running backs coach. The younger McGuire previously played under his father at quarterback at Cedar Hill High School before enjoying four years as a backup quarterback at Baylor. He joined the coaching profession immediately after, serving as an offensive assistant with the NFL's Carolina Panthers (2021-22) and then as the wide receivers coach for Nebraska the past two seasons (2023-24).
- Garret isn't the only McGuire building an impressive career, either, as Raegan McGuire is a fashion designer for AMUR in New York City. Her designs have been worn by several high-profile figures, including Natalie Biden, the granddaughter of President Joe Biden, as well as Taylor Swift during her spring 2023 Eras Tour.

AN NFL FRONT OFFICE

- Under McGuire, Texas Tech's personnel department resembles an NFL front office, a first-in-its-kind approach in the world of college football. Texas Tech's personnel department is overseen by James Blanchard, who began the rise of the general manager role in college football soon after joining McGuire in Lubbock as his first hire after accepting the Texas Tech position.
- Few, if any, general managers across college football have the autonomy Blanchard enjoys under McGuire. Blanchard and his staff are responsible for identifying every prospect Texas Tech ultimately offers a scholarship opportunity, allowing McGuire and his coaching staff to prioritize player development and opponent scouting, especially during the season.
- The setup has helped Texas Tech land several of the nation's top recruits, especially in the lucrative footprint of the state of Texas. The Red Raiders began McGuire's tenure with a 2023 class that ranked as high as No. 23 by Rivals, its highest recruiting record in more than a decade. Texas Tech followed with another highly-rated class in 2024, which led the Big 12 and again ranked as high as No. 23 overall nationally.
- For McGuire, the Red Raiders have consistently prioritized recruiting the top high school talent in Texas, leaning into his staff's ties to the high school coaches throughout the state. Texas Tech has complemented that approach with several additions via the transfer portal where McGuire and his staff have delivered successful results via the likes of All-Big 12 selections like linebacker Jacob Rodriguez, wide receiver Josh Kelly, tight end Jalin Conyers and defensive back C.J. Baskerville, among others. Texas Tech landed On3's top transfer portal class this offseason as McGuire and his staff landed 21 newcomers to an already talented roster.



THE BRAND

The core tenant under McGuire revolves around The Brand, which stands for his desire that the Red Raiders be the "toughest, hardest-working, most-competitive team in the country." On his final interview for the Texas Tech position, McGuire described his vision for the Red Raider program using The Brand, which President Lawrence Schovanec said "describes West Texas."



WHAT'S NEXT!

Step into any Texas Tech practice and the phrase "What's Next" is one you'll hear early and often. No matter if something good or bad happens on the field, McGuire and his staff stress a "What's Next!" mentality, emphasizing that the focus should be on the next play or rep. And for reference, the phrase is always a statement, never a question, as evidenced by its exclamation point at its end.



TAKE THREE UNIVERSITY

McGuire, a defensive coach at heart, heavily utilizes the phrase "Take Three" as a program. The phrase has transformed into a rallying cry from the defense with in-house video production signaling "one," "two" or "three" each time the Red Raiders create a takeaway. McGuire, prior to each game, regularly wears a t-shirt designed for the defense that says "Take Three University."





THE UNOFFICIAL HOME OF THE THSCA

Since his hire as Texas Tech's head coach, Joey McGuire has made it a point to brand the Red Raiders the "unofficial home of the Texas High School Coaches Association." Already a Hall of Famer, himself, McGuire has hired a staff filled with experience at both the collegiate and high school levels, with five assistant coaches who have previous ties to the THSCA as well as a slew of support staff members.

That list includes associate head coach and special teams coordinator Kenny Perry (Bowie, Halton City and Sam Houston H.S.), offensive coordinator Mack Leftwich (Kirkland H.S.), offensive run game coordinator Josh Cochran (Lindale H.S.), offensive passing game coordinator Justin "Juice" Johnson (Plano West and Berkner H.S.) and defensive line coach Zarnell Fitch (Lincoln H.S.). Five support staff members also have THSCA experience in assistant defensive backs coach Jah'Shawn Johnson (Ennis H.S.), assistant linebackers coach Taylor Young (Richardson H.S.), Director of Player Personnel Brian Nance (Temple H.S.), Director of Player Development Dave Martin (Cedar Hill) and assistant strength coach Brandon Stevenson (Midland Christian and Lake County Christian H.S.).

Texas Tech defensive coordinator Shiel Wood and senior defensive analyst Jack Teachey, meanwhile, both have experience at the high school level on the East Coast.

SUCCESS IN BIG 12 PLAY

- Texas Tech has ranked among the most-consistent Big 12 programs during Joey McGuire's three-plus seasons as head coach, winning 19 conference games in that span. In fact, the Red Raiders are joined by Kansas State as the only two Big 12 programs to boast an above-.500 conference record in each of the past three seasons, regardless of league affiliation.
- McGuire has returned the Red Raiders to being one of the Big 12's most competitive teams as Texas Tech was 5-4 in each of his first two seasons and then 6-3 in 2024. Prior to his debut 2022 season, Texas Tech had not recorded a winning conference record since 2009 as the Red Raiders were a combined 36-71 (.336) in the 12 years before McGuire's arrival with no seasons of at least a .500 record.
- Prior to his arrival, Texas Tech had finished with at least five conference wins in three-straight years only once in its history from 1995-97 while transitioning from the Southwest Conference to the Big 12. That stretch coincided with a seven-year period with a winning conference record from 1991-97.
- Dating back to Texas Tech's acceptance into the Southwest Conference in 1960, McGuire is the only head coach in history to have 19 or more league wins in his first 31 games, besting the likes of Jim Carlen. Carlen was also 19-12 at the same point in his tenure, which spanned the 1970-74 seasons. Steve Sloan also had a strong league record early in his tenure, finishing 15-8 overall in Southwest Conference play during his three seasons from 1975-77.

NEWS & NOTES ON MCGUIRE...

- McGuire is only the second head coach in program history to lead the Red Raiders to bowl games in each of his first four seasons, joining the late Mike Leach, who pushed Texas Tech to a bowl game in each of his 10 seasons.
- Texas Tech has hit the 40-point mark 16 times during McGuire's tenure as the Red Raiders are a perfect 16-0 in those games during his three-plus seasons.
- There is defense in West Texas as Texas Tech is 20-1 overall under McGuire when holding opponents to 25 or fewer points. Texas Tech has limited its opponents to 25 or fewer points 13 times during Big 12 play under McGuire and has done so in each of its two bowl victories.
- Texas Tech recorded six Big 12 wins during the 2024 season, marking the third time the Red Raiders have done so since joining the league in 1996. McGuire joins Steve Sloan as the only head coaches to win six conference games within their first three seasons in school history after Sloan pushed Texas Tech to a 7-1 mark in SWC play in 1976.

JACOB RODRIGUEZ, THE TAKEAWAY KING

Jacob Rodriguez has established himself as one of the nation's top linebackers the past two seasons, not only for his tackling ability for his ability to create turnovers for the Red Raider defense. Rodriguez, the Big 12 Preseason Defensive Player of the Year, was among the top tacklers in college football last season and ranks among the best in creating takeaways, especially at opportune times. Over his career, Rodriguez has had his hand in 14 takeaways, including three already in Big 12 play this season. The Red Raiders are 9-1 in games that he creates a takeaway with the one loss coming in the 2023 season opener where he departed with a significant injury on the same play he forced and recovered a fumble.

DEFENSIVE NOTEBOOK

RODRIGUEZ NOT ALONE IN TAKEAWAYS

- For as good as Jacob Rodriguez has been in creating takeaways during his career, he's not alone on the Red Raider roster. Between not only Rodriguez but also fellow linebacker Ben Roberts and edge linebacker David Bailey, Texas Tech has three of the nation's active leaders in career forced fumbles as the trio has combined for 26 entering this weekend. Texas Tech is the only school in the FBS boasting two players with seven or more career forced fumbles, let alone three.
- Rodriguez ranks second in the FBS with 10 career forced fumbles, including four from this season alone. He trails only Buffalo's Red Murdock, who leads the nation with 15 forced fumbles of his own. Bailey is tied for third nationally with nine forced fumbles in his career, followed by Roberts and six others in a tie for sixth overall with seven.
- Rodriguez knocked loose two forced fumbles this past weekend at Arizona State, both of which were recovered by the Sun Devils. He previously created an eighth forced fumble and second of the season at Utah before adding an interception to help seal the victory late in the fourth quarter. Roberts has also knocked loose a fumble in two of the past four games after doing so at Utah and then against Kansas last weekend. Both forced fumbles were recovered by the Red Raiders.

THE NATION'S TOP LINEBACKER

- Joey McGuire often refers to Jacob Rodriguez as the "quarterback of the defense." It's a fitting description for Rodriguez, who was a standout high school quarterback at Wichita Falls Rider High School and later signed with Virginia to play offense. Rodriguez has adapted that quarterback mentality into becoming the nation's top inside linebacker, both in his ability to stop the run and also assist in coverage.
- Rodriguez enters this week as the highest-graded inside linebacker with at least 200 snaps by Pro Football Focus as he's grading out at 92.3 overall through the first seven games of the season. That grade ranks tied third nationally among players of all positions and second on his own team. Rodriguez leads the country (all positions) with a 96.8 grade in rush defense, while his 87.0 grade in coverage ranks second among linebackers and 20th overall.

NOT THE ONLY "TOUGH" RODRIGUEZ

- Jacob Rodriguez considers himself a tough guy. It makes sense knowing he's one of the few players in America who could go from a college quarterback to an All-Big 12 linebacker in only a matter of years. Rodriguez will tell you he's not the toughest member of his family, though. That honor belongs to his wife, Emma, who is an active-duty helicopter pilot in the U.S. Army. The couple was married in July 2023 in a surprise ceremony (to some) in Houston, beginning a great journey in different parts of the country with Jacob in Lubbock and Emma at Fort Riley in Junction City, Kan.



“TAKE THREE DEFENSE” AMONG NATION’S BEST

- “Take three” has long been the mantra of Joey McGuire, dating back to his days leading Cedar Hill High School in the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex. The phrase describes Texas Tech’s continual goal to force at least three takeaways per game, which McGuire credits as greatly increasing his team’s chances to walk away with a victory.
- The Red Raiders have reached the “take three” mark in two of four games to open Big 12 play as Texas Tech created four takeaways at Utah before following with three at Houston. Texas Tech is 9-1 under Joey McGuire when “taking three” and is 24-3 when leading or tied in the turnover margin.
- Texas Tech is tied for 12th in the FBS with 13 takeaways this season, which is also tied for second in the Big 12, trailing only TCU by one. The Red Raiders are also tied for 21st nationally at plus-5 in the turnover margin.

CAN’T RUN ON US

- Texas Tech enters this weekend as the FBS leader for rushing defense, as the Red Raiders are giving up only 64.3 yards per game on the ground this season. That is a significant improvement from a year ago, when Texas Tech surrendered 152.1 rushing yards per game.
- Each of Texas Tech’s first four Big 12 opponents entered the matchup with the Red Raiders averaging at least 170.0 rushing yards per game before failing to come even close to that mark. Utah, which currently ranks sixth in the FBS with 245.0 rushing yards per game, was limited to only 101 yards, while Houston managed only 103 yards. Of the total versus Utah, 28 yards came on its final drive after the Red Raiders had already put the game away with a 34-10 lead.
- Texas Tech followed those two performances by only giving up 47 rushing yards versus Kansas, the fewest by a Big 12 opponent since Baylor was limited to only 17 yards on the ground midway through the 2023 season. Arizona State finished with only 75 rushing yards last weekend.
- Texas Tech kicked off the season allowing only 53 rushing yards to Arkansas-Pine Bluff, 63 to Kent State and then only eight yards in the win over Oregon State. The performance against the Beavers marked the fewest rushing yards since Texas Tech stuffed Kansas State to negative-12 yards in the first-ever Big 12 game to open the 1996 season.
- The Texas Tech record for rushing defense average was set in 1964 when the Red Raiders gave up 115.6 yards per game. Texas Tech’s best rush defense during the Big 12 era came in 1998 when the Red Raiders allowed only 118.9 yards per game.

THE NATION’S SACKS LEADER

- Texas Tech made splash after splash across college football this offseason with the signing of the top transfer portal class in the country. The loudest splash, however, came in early April with the signing of outside linebacker David Bailey, who committed to join the Red Raiders after three seasons at Stanford and is considered a potential NFL first-round selection next spring.
- Bailey has lived up to his billing as he enters this week as the FBS leader with 10.5 sacks already this season. Bailey, the highest-rated returning edge player in college football, has found the quarterback at least once in all seven games

this season, combining for 8.0 sacks during Big 12 play alone, which also easily leads the FBS. In fact, Bailey easily leads the country for most sacks against conference opponents as Western Michigan’s Nadame Tucker and Colin Simmons of Texas rank second overall with 5.5 sacks each.

- Bailey entered the top 10 in Texas Tech single-season history with his 2.0 sacks at Arizona State, as he is now tied for seventh all-time with 10.5 sacks this year. Bailey is more than halfway to the school record of 15.0 sacks that was set by Brandon Sharpe in 2009, and has recorded at least a share of a sack in seven consecutive games dating back to his time at Stanford. If that streak continues against Oklahoma State, he’s potentially tie or pass the likes of Pete Robertson (2014) and Aaron Hunt (2001) for fourth place at 12.0 sacks and Shawn Jackson (1992) for sixth with 11.0 sacks.
- Bailey currently leads the FBS with 48 total pressures, according to Pro Football Focus, with 13 of those coming against Houston, earning him the publication’s National Defensive Player of the Week honors. His 48 pressures lead the country as Adam Trick of Miami (Ohio) ranks second in the FBS with 44 pressures. Bailey’s teammate in Romello Height is second among power-conference players with 36 pressures.
- Bailey matched his career high with 3.0 sacks against Kansas and then followed with 2.0 at Arizona State, giving him 25.0 now for his career. Bailey ranks third among active FBS players for career sacks, trailing only Trey Moore of Texas (29.5) and Akheem Mesidor of Miami (26.5).

STRENGTH IN THE MIDDLE

- The middle of Texas Tech’s defensive line received a significant boost with the signing of Lee Hunter, Skyler Gill-Howard and A.J. Holmes Jr. this offseason. That trio alone has combined for 331 tackles, including 59.0 for a loss and 21.0 sacks, forming one of the top interior defensive line units, possibly in college football.

WOOD EXPERIENCED IN TURNING AROUND DEFENSES

- Shiel Wood is in his first season as Texas Tech's defensive coordinator and inside linebackers coach, bringing a reputation of immediately improving defenses from stops at Army (2021), Troy (2022), Tulane (2023) and Houston (2024).
- Wood's defenses have ranked inside the top 35 for total defense in all four seasons since he was first named co-defensive coordinator at Army in 2021. In addition, opposing offenses have averaged less than 23.0 points per game against Wood's defenses since his promotion to play-caller at Army in 2021. Texas Tech, meanwhile, has not allowed less than 25.0 points per game since 2009.
- Wood has built a reputation for immediately improving defenses, particularly through turnovers. Both his defenses at Troy and Tulane ranked in the top 10 nationally for takeaways as his defenses are averaging 22.3 takeaways per season over the past four years. His defenses have increased their takeaway total from the previous year in each of his last three stops as a defensive coordinator. Texas Tech is more than halfway to that average through seven games as the Red Raiders are 12th nationally with 13 takeaways this season.
- Wood has certainly impressed early in his tenure after inheriting a Red Raider defense that surrendered 34.8 points per game a year ago. Texas Tech has seen immediate returns on his hiring as the Red Raiders enter this weekend ranked in the top-15 nationally for rushing defense (1st), takeaways (12th), scoring (7th), and total defense (11th).

- Texas Tech's front is as impressive as the Red Raiders have boasted in recent years, with PFF's Max Chadwick ranking the defensive line third nationally entering the 2025 season behind only Clemson and Alabama. The trio of Red Raider newcomers has backed up that preseason ranking with their performance on the field with all three ranking among the top-20 interior defensive linemen in the country thus far by PFF.

GETTING TO THE QUARTERBACK

- One of Texas Tech's biggest weaknesses defensively a year ago was its ability to get to the quarterback. The Red Raiders have already proven to be much-improved in that area with the addition of outside linebackers David Bailey and Romello Height as well as defensive tackles Lee Hunter, A.J. Holmes Jr., and Skyler Gill-Howard. Texas Tech enters this weekend ranked as the top-ranked defense by Pro Football Focus with a 96.3 overall grade and the nation's best pass rushing unit (91.2).
- The edge-rushing duo of Bailey and Height has more than paid dividends for the Red Raiders thus far, as they have combined for 15.5 sacks and 84 pressures alone. The duo ranks among the top players in college football with Height credited with a 93.0 overall grade followed by Bailey at 91.3, which ranks second and sixth nationally.
- Texas Tech set a school record with nine sacks in the win over Kansas, snapping the previous mark of eight that was set in a 1993 win at SMU. It matched the most sacks by an FBS team this season as New Mexico previously had nine against New Mexico State on Sept. 27, while Oklahoma also recorded nine versus Auburn on Sept. 20. It was the fifth time in Big 12 history where a conference team notched 9.0 or more sacks and was the first since Oklahoma had the same total in a 2020 victory over Kansas.
- Texas Tech has already surpassed its sacks total from a year ago with 25.0 on the season, which ranks tied for sixth in the FBS and easily leads the Big 12 entering this weekend. The Red Raiders have recorded 16.0 of their 25.0 sacks during Big 12 play, which is tied with Texas A&M, Minnesota, and Oklahoma for the second-highest total against conference opponents this season behind only Indiana (18.0).

ROBERTS OFF TO GREAT START

- Ben Roberts heads into this weekend with 236 tackles already in his career and is yet still a junior. Roberts has a long way to reach the Texas Tech career list, but the successful start has put the thought in reach over the next two seasons as he is more than halfway to reaching Ryan Aycock for 10th all-time in program history. Aycock, a member of this year's Texas Tech Hall of Fame class, compiled 338 tackles as a Red Raider safety from 2000-03.
- Roberts ranks tied for 11th nationally and fifth among players currently at a power-conference school with his 236 tackles since the 2023 season alone. The only active Big 12 player with more tackles during that span than Roberts is Oklahoma State linebacker Bryan McCoy, who has combined for 259 snaps between his time at Akron and with the Cowboys.





MORTON AGAINST OTHER RETURNING QBs

There was a misconception this offseason that Behren Morton isn't among the top returning quarterbacks in college football. The senior gunslinger, fully healthy for the first time since his redshirt freshman season, is coming off a gritty 2024 campaign where he threw for 3,335 yards and 27 touchdowns to only eight interceptions. In fact, he is one of only six quarterbacks nationally to return this season after throwing for at least 3,000 yards and 20 touchdowns a year ago with eight or fewer interceptions.

OFFENSIVE NOTEBOOK

WINNING IS THE NAME OF THE GAME

- In the second episode of the Texas Tech documentary series "The Brand," Behren Morton details how he wants to be best remembered - a winner. Since the start of the 2023 season, Texas Tech is 18-4 in games Morton starts and does not depart due to injury, which includes a 12-3 mark during Big 12 play.
- During that span, Morton has departed four games due to injury, leaving the Kansas State loss in 2023 and the TCU road trip in 2024 at halftime with the Red Raiders locked in a one-possession game. He departed both the Big 12 opener at Utah just after halftime with the Red Raiders leading 10-3 at the time and then again against Kansas with Texas Tech enjoying a 21-0 lead at the time.
- Texas Tech has won each of its last eight games Morton has started as the Red Raiders closed the 2024 regular season with back-to-back wins over Oklahoma State and West Virginia before opening this year with a 6-0 record. Morton missed Texas Tech's appearance in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl a year ago to begin rehab from offseason surgery.
- Since becoming Texas Tech's primary starting quarterback beginning with the Houston win in 2023 - the fifth game of that season, Morton has missed only three starts during that span, sitting out the road trip to BYU in 2023, the AutoZone Liberty Bowl in 2024 and then last weekend at Arizona State. The Red Raiders are unfortunately 0-3 in those games.
- Overall, Morton has helped lead the Red Raiders to 21 wins over his 30 career starts, marking the most for a Texas Tech quarterback since Graham Harrell pushed the Red Raiders to a combined 28 victories in his three seasons as a starter from 2006-08. Harrell will be inducted into the Texas Tech Ring of Honor this Saturday as well as the National Football Foundation College Football Hall of Fame. Kliff Kingsbury also led the Red Raiders to 24 wins as a starter from 1999-02 as he and Harrell represent the two-winningest quarterbacks for Texas Tech in the Big 12 era.

MORTON OFF TO A STRONG START

- Behren Morton has combined to throw for 1,501 yards and 13 touchdowns to only three interceptions this season, despite playing only one full game to this point. In fact, Morton has combined to play roughly only 14 quarters thus far as he departed the season opener versus Arkansas-Pine Bluff midway through the second quarter before leaving at halftime versus Kent State and then after the third quarter against Oregon State. He played all four quarters at Houston, throwing for 345 yards and a touchdown.

- Even with limited time, Morton enters this week among the FBS passing leaders, ranking in the top 30 nationally for yards per pass attempt (2nd), passing efficiency (6th), passing yards per completion (7th), passing touchdowns (23rd) and completion percentage (29th). He has led a Red Raider offense that is ninth in the FBS with 302.5 passing yards per game.

MORTON IN THE RECORD BOOK

- Morton moved into seventh place all-time on the career passing yards chart with his career-high 486 passing yards versus Oregon State, passing both Zebbie Lethridge (1994-97) and Billy Joe Tolliver (1985-88) in the victory. Morton now has 7,710 passing yards over 39 games as a Red Raider as he trails Taylor Potts (2007-10) by 125 yards for sixth in program history and Robert Hall (1990-93) by 198 yards for fifth.
- With a strong finish to the season, Morton could end his Red Raider career ranked as high as fourth on Texas Tech's all-time passing chart. Seth Doege currently ranks fourth as he totaled 8,646 passing yards over his career after leading the Red Raider offense from 2009-12. His total is separated by 936 yards from Morton to this point.
- Morton has needed little time to find the end zone 13 times through the air this season as he now has 62 scoring tosses over his career. He enters this weekend tied with Potts for fifth all-time in program history as he needs seven to match Doege for fourth place in program history.

THE OFFENSIVE STANDARD

Texas Tech has long been considered the offensive standard since the Red Raiders moved to a passing attack in 2000. In fact, the numbers don't lie when it pertains to the high-octane Red Raider offense. Below is where Texas Tech ranks nationally in several offensive categories since the start of the 2000 season:

HAMMOND MAKES SECOND CAREER START

- Joey McGuire has raved about his backup quarterback in Will Hammond since he arrived in Lubbock. Hammond gave McGuire more reason to brag in the Big 12 opener at Utah as the redshirt freshman completed 13-of-16 passes for 169 yards and two touchdowns in the second half in place of an injured Behren Morton. The performance earned Hammond not only Big 12 Freshman of the Week honors but also one of the league's top offensive accolades.
- Hammond has had to come on to relieve Morton three times now during Big 12 play as he threw for 42 yards, while also rushing for 61 yards and two touchdowns in the win over Kansas. Hammond hasn't been afraid to use his legs to keep the Red Raider offense going this year as he's Texas Tech's third-leading rusher with 278 yards and five touchdowns on the ground on only 39 attempts.
- Hammond made his second career start last weekend at Arizona State as he completed 22-of-37 passes for 167 yards and two touchdowns, while also rushing 15 times for 47 yards and another score. The rushing touchdown with 3:45 remaining in regulation marked his fifth of the season, the most for a Red Raider quarterback since Donovan Smith had seven in 2022.

REPLACING TECH'S ALL-TIME RUSHER

- Texas Tech has filled its void at running back this season following the graduation of Tahj Brooks, who departed as the school's all-time leading rusher after back-to-back 1,500-yard rushing seasons. He snapped the Texas Tech career rushing record previously set by Byron Hanspard, while finishing fourth all-time on the Big 12 rushing chart with 4,557 yards over 56 games played from 2020 to 2024.
- The Red Raiders have not slowed down with the sophomore tandem of J'Koby Williams and Cameron Dickey, who have combined to outpace Texas Tech's rushing output from a year ago. Texas Tech has combined for 1,506 rushing yards and 17 touchdowns on the ground this season, a steady improvement from a year ago when the Red Raiders had 1,171 rushing yards and 12 touchdowns at the same point. Texas Tech is also averaging 5.7 yards per carry on the ground this season, up from a 5.0 clip a year ago.
- The duo has combined for 1,011 rushing yards and 12 touchdowns this season alone, with Dickey carrying 100 times for 631 yards and eight scores, while Williams has added 380 yards and four touchdowns on 71 carries of his own. Texas Tech is one of 18 teams in the country currently to have multiple players with at least 350 rushing yards and four rushing touchdowns this season and one of two to do so from the Big 12.
- Texas Tech was fortunate to experience life in a post-Tahj Brooks world after he sat out the AutoZone Liberty Bowl to close the 2024 season. Williams earned the start against Arkansas, rushing for a career-high 123 yards and a touchdown, while Dickey added 74 rushing yards on a similar 15 carries.
- Williams rushed for 109 yards and two touchdowns at Houston, marking the second 100-yard outing so far in his still young career. Dickey came close to giving the Red Raiders multiple 100-yard rushers as he finished with 96 yards on 20 carries to go along with a 69-yard touchdown reception late in the first quarter.

IN THE RECORD BOOK

- Cameron Dickey placed his name in the Texas Tech record book against Kansas after rushing for 263 yards and two touchdowns in the win. It marked the fifth-highest single-game rushing total by a Red Raider in school history and the most since Byron Hanspard set the Texas Tech record with 287 yards against Baylor in 1996.
- Dickey's performance remains the most single-game rushing yards in the FBS this season and the most for a Big 12 rusher since Iowa State's Abu Sama went for 276 yards on Nov. 25, 2023, at Kansas State.
- Dickey hit the 100-yard mark for the first time in his career in the first half alone as he opened the game with a 71-yard sprint into the end zone on Texas Tech's first play. He later found the end zone again via a 55-yard scamper early in the fourth quarter that pushed the lead to 35-17 with 14:12 remaining. As a team, the Red Raiders rushed for 372 yards, their most since racking up 453 yards on the ground against Louisiana early in the 1997 season.
- Dickey enters this weekend with a share of the Big 12 lead for both rushing touchdowns (8) and total touchdowns (9), ranking in the top-15 nationally in both categories. He also ranks 19th in the FBS and third in the Big 12 with 631 rushing yards. Dickey is averaging 6.3 yards per carry this season, which ranks 25th nationally and leads all Big 12 rushers entering this weekend.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD

- Texas Tech enters this weekend ranked tied for fourth in the FBS for scoring offense as the Red Raiders are averaging an impressive 43.9 points per game through their first seven games of the season. The Red Raiders trail only North Texas (45.0), Oregon (44.1) and Tennessee (44.1) nationally heading into this weekend's matchup with Oklahoma State.
- Since moving to a spread offense in 2000, the Red Raiders are averaging 35.9 points per game, the fourth-highest clip during that span behind only Oklahoma (38.2), Boise State (37.9) and Oregon (37.6). Texas Tech has averaged at least 30.0 points per game in all but three of those seasons.

BIG PLAY THREATS ALL AROUND

- When Mack Leftwich took over as Texas Tech's offensive coordinator, he stated he wanted his version of the Air Raid offense to be more 50-50 in terms of play calls, focusing heavily on running the football and capitalizing on big plays in the passing game. The Red Raiders have done just that as Texas Tech enters this week as one of only two teams in the country to rank in the top 15 nationally for both passing offense (9th) and rushing offense (18th), joining Arkansas.
- Texas Tech ranks fourth in the FBS with 50 offensive plays already this season that have gone for at least 20 yards. The Red Raiders have capitalized on 32 passing plays of that distance this year, which ranks tied for eighth in the FBS, while their 18 explosive rushing attempts are the fourth-highest total in the country. Texas Tech had six explosive plays of 20 or more yards in the Kansas win alone.

IT STARTS UP FRONT

- Texas Tech entered the 2025 season with one of the most experienced offensive line units in the country with a combined 165 career starts between its list of newcomers and returners. In fact, Texas Tech entered the season with the fourth-most combined career starts in the FBS.
- The added experience has paid off as Texas Tech is the 14th-highest graded pass blocking team in the country, according to Pro Football Focus. The Red Raiders have given up only 5.0 sacks so far this season, which ranks tied for 15th in the FBS entering this weekend and tied for fourth in the Big 12.

PLENTY OF OPTIONS AT RECEIVER

- The Red Raiders have proven to be among the deepest teams at wide receiver so far this season as Texas Tech shares the FBS lead with five players with at least 200 receiving yards this season in Coy Eakin (407), Caleb Douglas (414), tight end Terrance Carter Jr. (297), Reggie Virgil (286) 336 running back J'Koby Williams (235).
- Texas Tech had three different players eclipse 100 yards receiving versus Oregon State in Eakin (123), Williams (116)

LEFTWICH TAKES OVER OC DUTIES

- Texas Tech has a new offensive coordinator for the first time in Joey McGuire's tenure following the departure of Zach Kittley to accept the head coaching position at Florida Atlantic. In his place, McGuire landed Mack Leftwich, who had quickly developed into one of the fastest-rising offensive playcallers in college football following successful stints at both Incarnate Word and Texas State.
- Leftwich arrived at Texas Tech following two seasons at Texas State where he developed one of the nation's top offenses as the Bobcats led the Sun Belt Conference and ranked in the top 15 nationally for total offense and scoring during the 2023-24 campaigns. Texas State's success offensively pushed the Bobcats to their first two bowl appearances in school history and 16 combined victories.
- Leftwich inherited a Texas State offense that ranked 110th in the country for scoring at only 21.1 points per game prior to his arrival in 2022. He quickly changed that narrative, however, as Texas State used a balanced attack to average 36.7 points

and Carter Jr. (102). It marked the first time Texas Tech boasted three 100-yard receivers in the same game since Jakeem Grant, Bradley Marquez and DeAndre Washington did so versus Baylor in 2014.

- Virgil and Carter lead the Red Raiders with five receiving touchdowns each, making Texas Tech one of five teams in the country with multiple players with five or more this season. Carter is tied for the FBS high among tight ends.
- Texas Tech's balance was also on display against Houston, marking the first time since last year's regular-season finale against West Virginia, where the Red Raiders featured a 300-yard passer in Behren Morton, a 100-yard rusher in J'Koby Williams and a 100-yard receiver in Caleb Douglas.

MCGUIRE ON FOURTH DOWNS

- Much has been said about Joey McGuire's aggressive approach to fourth downs over his three full seasons. Even with an evolved approach last season, Texas Tech has been among the most active teams in the country in going for it on fourth down 126 times, which ranks as the fifth-highest total since 2022.
- The Red Raiders are a combined plus-151 over Joey McGuire's four seasons in the plus/minus scale, which is determined based on the result of Texas Tech's ongoing drive or points scored by an opponent on a failed attempt. Texas Tech ranks second in the Big 12 and 20th nationally with a 59.5 fourth-down percentage (75-of-126) since 2022.
- In total, the Red Raiders have gone for it on fourth down at least five times in 10 different games under McGuire. Texas Tech has attempted at least one fourth-down conversion in all but six games under McGuire, with three of those in 2024 and two others this year at Utah and against Kansas.

per game in 2023 and then 36.5 points in 2024, easily its highest two single-season averages since the Bobcats joined the FBS level in 2012.

- Leftwich coached the quarterback position in each of his five seasons at Incarnate Word, helping identify three of the best in program history in Jon Copeland (2018-19), Cameron Ward (2020-21) and Lindsey Scott Jr. (2022). Ward, the No. 1 pick in the 2025 NFL Draft after finishing his career at Miami, combined for 6,908 passing yards and 71 touchdowns during his two seasons, which remain the most in school history.

MCGUIRE ERA DRAFT PICKS

- Five Red Raiders have heard their names called during the NFL Draft during Joey McGuire's tenure (2022-pres.). Most recently, the Las Vegas Raiders drafted offensive lineman Caleb Rogers in the third round (98th overall) in the 2025 Draft, and in the sixth round, the Cincinnati Bengals selected the Red Raiders' all-time leading rusher, Tahj Brooks. Defensive back Dadrion Taylor-Demerson went in the fourth round in 2024, followed by rush end Myles Cole going in the seventh round to Jacksonville. During Tech's first spring offseason under McGuire, the Red Raiders had only one draft pick, but it came quickly, as the Raiders made Tyree Wilson the highest-drafted defensive player in school history at No. 7 overall.

THREE-TIME SUPER BOWL CHAMPION

- Patrick Mahomes II became the first Red Raider in school history to win three career Super Bowls after he helped lead the Kansas City Chiefs to a 25-22 overtime victory over the San Francisco 49ers in Super Bowl LVIII in 2024. It was the second-straight Super Bowl title for the Chiefs and their third in five years. Mahomes guided Kansas City to its third consecutive Super Bowl appearance last season but was denied a three-peat by the Philadelphia Eagles.
- With his first Super Bowl win (2020) over the San Francisco 49ers, Mahomes was named Super Bowl MVP at only 24 years of age, making him the youngest player in NFL history to earn Super Bowl MVP honors.

FIRST ROUND DRAFT PICKS

- Texas Tech currently has three first-round NFL Draft picks active heading into the 2025 NFL season. In addition to Patrick Mahomes II being the 10th overall pick by the Kansas City Chiefs in 2017, and while maybe not known for its defense in recent years, the two others include linebacker Jordyn Brooks and defensive end Tyree Wilson.
- The Miami Dolphins selected Jordyn Brooks 27th overall in the 2020 draft and has since moved on to the Miami Dolphins. Meanwhile, Tyree Wilson was the seventh overall selection in the 2023 draft, making him the highest-drafted defensive player in program history.

COME-FROM-BEHIND WINS

The victory over Cincinnati at home on Sept. 28 marked the 27th time since 2000, and fourth time under Joey McGuire, that the Red Raiders overcame a double-digit deficit to win. Below is a listing of Tech's come-from-behind wins during that span:

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTEBOOK

KP KNOWS KICKERS

- Texas Tech entered the 2025 season similar to a year ago when special teams coordinator Kenny Perry was splitting kicking duties between returning starter Gino Garcia and fellow senior Reese Burkhardt. The experiment resulted in Texas Tech ranking among the nation's leaders in field goal percentage after connecting on 22-of-24 team field goal attempts.
- The procedure the Red Raiders followed to start the 2024 season has returned through seven weeks with a back-and-forth exchange between transfer Upton Bellenfant and returning junior Stone Harrington after the two were hard to separate during preseason camp. Bellenfant arrived at Texas Tech this offseason after finding the uprights on 18-of-21 field goal attempts in 2024 at Buffalo, where he was an All-MAC third team honoree.
- Harrington, meanwhile, was Texas Tech's backup kickoff specialist and made his first career attempt in the season opener versus Arkansas-Pine Bluff. He recorded a memorable performance at Utah, where he was 2-for-2 on field goal attempts, which included a 58-yarder just before halftime. It marked the second-longest field goal in program history, trailing only the 62-yard attempt Jonathan Garibay connected on as time expired in Texas Tech's victory over Iowa State in 2021. He was named the Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week following the win over Houston as he connected on three of Texas Tech's five field goals, a new single-game record.
- Needless to say, Perry knows the right buttons to push at the kicker position. In fact, his kickers have made 81.0 percent of their field goal attempts since he became a quality control analyst at SMU in 2020. He was promoted to special teams coordinator at SMU in 2021 before joining Joey McGuire's charter staff at Texas Tech a year later, where he has already developed two of the top kickers in program history in Garcia and Trey Wolff.

COWBOY COY, THE PUNT RETURNER

- Coy Eakin has found another role in recent weeks in addition to being one of Texas Tech's top wide receivers as he's taken over as the primary punt returner. Eakin has made five returns since moving into the role at Houston as he's totaled

119 yards at a 23.8 average. He had a 36-yard return at Arizona State, marking the third-consecutive week he's brought back a punt of at least 30 yards. He also had a 30-yard return against Houston and another 36-yard return versus Kansas.

- Eakin currently does not meet the minimum number of punt returns to enter the NCAA stat rankings. If he did, however, his 23.8 yards per return average would rank third nationally behind only Iowa's Kaden Wetjen (25.9) and Texas' Ryan Niblett (25.3).

BURGESS AMONG NATION'S TOP PUNTERS

- Jack Burgess was singled out by head coach Joey McGuire during a preseason press conference, praising him for his offseason work and a notable 5-yard distance improvement he had observed. He's been called on to punt only 22 times through the first seven games of the season, as he's averaging 43.7 yards per attempt with 11 that have been downed inside the 20.

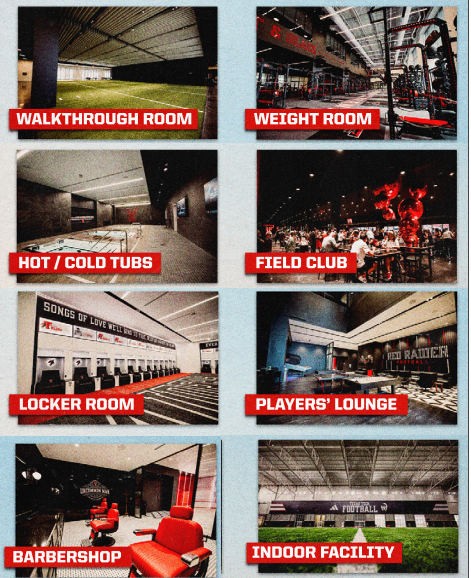
SWAT PATROL

- Texas Tech has blocked 13 kicks in the four seasons under Joey McGuire and special teams coordinator Kenny Perry, which leads the Big 12 Conference since 2022 and ranks tied-sixth nationally.
- Texas Tech is tied for the FBS lead with four blocked kicks already this season, all on punt returns. The Red Raiders got their hands on a punt in the season opener versus Arkansas-Pine Bluff and again last weekend at Arizona State and then two against Kent State. Texas Tech is tied with Buffalo, Penn State and Wyoming for the FBS lead entering this weekend.
- A.J. McCarty got his hands on two punts against Kent State, marking the first time a Big 12 player had blocked a pair of kicks since Oklahoma State's Korie Black did so in its 2023 season opener against Central Arkansas. The performance alone marked the first time Texas Tech had blocked multiple kicks in the same game as a team since the Red Raiders traveled to New Mexico in 2010.
- E'Maurion Banks has been one of the Red Raiders' biggest disrupters on those lines as he has recorded one block in each of the past two seasons against UCF in 2023 and then against Arizona State a year ago. Both blocks came in pivotal moments in the second half of the two victories.

THE HOME OF TEXAS TECH FOOTBALL



SOUTH END ZONE & WOMBLE FOOTBALL CENTER

- Texas Tech moved into the South End Zone and Dustin R. Womble Football Center in 2024, which features more than 340,000 combined square feet of space with a blend of world-class modern design and technology elements with Spanish Renaissance architecture well known on the Texas Tech campus. The \$242 million project marks the largest contiguous football facility in the country, connecting the south end zone building to the Womble Football Center and the Sports Performance Center, which opened in 2017 as Texas Tech's indoor football practice facility and indoor track and field venue.
- Joey McGuire and his staff's offices are on the second floor of the south end zone building, giving them a stunning view overlooking Cody Campbell Field at Jones AT&T Stadium. The office location places McGuire and his staff steps from each position room and the skybridge connected to the Womble Football Center where offensive and defensive breakout rooms are located as well as a team meeting space and a state-of-the-art walkthrough area on the second level.
- The Womble Football Center is a two-story building that maintains its football strength and conditioning, sports medicine and equipment areas on the main level as part of the new layout. The Red Raiders' main locker room is located in the Womble Football Center, which includes space for 120-plus athletes and modern primary designs from Hollman that are fully ventilated and contain USB charging ports and DreamSeat technology for every player.
- The second floor of the Womble Football Center features a revolutionary 4,500-plus square foot multi-purpose walkthrough area designed for large-scale indoor team strategy implementation, instruction and technique evaluation only a few steps from the team meeting space and position rooms. The space boasts a 25-by-20 yard turf surface in front of a 70-foot wide by 10.5-foot high LED screen that will be the largest in both college football and the NFL for walkthrough areas. The LED screen will allow Texas Tech's coaches to simulate an opponent's formation and scheme, giving the Red Raiders real-time feedback through the advanced technology during game preparations.

- Texas Tech now boasts a 15,000-square-foot, two-level weight room, one of the largest in college football. The weight room area is located in the southwest corner of the Womble Football Center, giving the Red Raiders direct access into the Sports Performance Center and the outdoor practice fields.
- The entire facility significantly upgraded the amenities provided to the Red Raiders on a daily basis, notably with a two-story players' lounge, the "Uncommon Man" barber shop, a state-of-the-art hydrotherapy recovery suite and a primary 12,000-square-foot locker room located in the Womble Football Center.
- The Red Raiders enter Jones AT&T Stadium each gameday through the Gary Petersen Field Club, a 12,000-square-foot premium space that is among the first of its kind in college football. It is one of several new premium areas as Texas Tech has added 17 new luxury suites to go along with 500 club and loge box seats and two spacious party decks.
- The opening of the South End Zone Building to Jones AT&T Stadium officially closed The Campaign for Fearless Champions, one of the most-successful fundraising initiatives in university history that raised more than \$500 million to transform Texas Tech's athletic facilities across every sport, while also pouring resources into the student-athlete experience through scholarship endowments and the creation of the J.T. and Margaret Talkington Office of Student-Athlete Development.
- In addition to the large-scale construction, Texas Tech also enhanced its gameday experience as part of the project, adding nine LED displays through Daktronics as well as a state-of-the-art sound system by Clair Audio, a national leader in large venue audio production. The added LED displays include the main videoboard on the north end of the stadium, expanding it to 37-feet high by 136-feet wide in size with 10-millimeter pixel spacing for excellent image clarity and contrast. Texas Tech also constructed two new video displays atop its south end zone measuring 28-feet high by 48-feet wide, featuring content zoning abilities that are already a staple of the north end zone videoboard. All three new videoboards feature 10mm pixel pitch, providing every fan in the 60,000-plus seat stadium with the highest resolution display in college football.

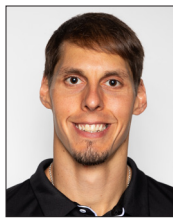

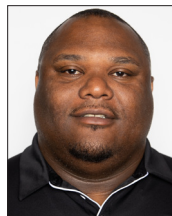

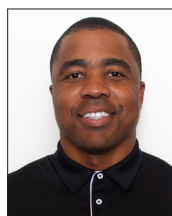
