Bye Week: #10/10 BYU and TCU

- BYU (I0th), Texas Tech (I3th), Cincinnati (I7th), Houston (22nd) and Utah (24th) give the Big I2 five teams ranked in this week's AP Top 25. It marks the first time the Conference has had five ranked programs in the month of October since 2022.
- ESPN's College GameDay will make a Big I2 visit this week for the top-25 showdown between Cincinnati and Utah in Salt Lake City.
- As the Big I2 Conference celebrates its 30th season of football, this week's Kansas State-Texas Tech game is a rematch of the inaugural Conference game played on August 31, 1996.
- Six Big I2 programs are bowl eligible, with another two that are one win away entering Week IO.
- Only eight FBS programs have active winning streaks of seven games or more and two of them are BYU (IO wins) and Cincinnati (7 wins).
- Texas Tech's average margin of victory of 36.2 points per game ranks second nationally and is the most by a Big I2 team through seven games since 20I3.
- The Big I2 boasts five of the top 25 scoring defenses and four of the top 25 scoring offenses nationally. Texas Tech ranks fourth in both categories, while both BYU and Utah rank in the top 25 in both distinctions.
- The Big I2 has had nine different teams defeat an AP Top 25 opponent this season, which is second most among all FBS conferences.
- Utah amassed 422 yards on the ground in its win over Colorado on Saturday, which were the most by an FBS team in conference play this season.

Conference News & Notes

- Big I2 QB Club: Six of the top 25 national leaders in passing touchdowns are from the Big 12, including Baylor's Sawyer Robertson (2nd - 23 TD's), TCU's Josh Hoover (3rd - 22 TD's), Cincinnati's Brendan Sorsby (T-7th - 19 TD's), KU's Jalon Daniels (T-11th -18 TD's), Arizona's Noah Fifita (T-16th – 17 TD's) and K-State's Avery Johnson (T-24th - 15 TD's).
- After picking up its first AP top-25 win on the road since 2017, Houston's seven wins this season nearly match its win total of eight from the previous two seasons combined.
- Among Power 4 teams with only one loss this season, Cincinnati is the only team to have its lone defeat come away from home by three or fewer points.
- Arizona State is one of five FBS teams this season that has yet to allow any points off turnovers (Connecticut, Miami, San Diego State, Temple).
- BYU is 3-0 this season when trailing at any point in the fourth quarter, which are the most wins without a loss in such games by any FBS team this season.
- Big I2 QB Club: The Big I2's signal callers collectively have a 1.9 interception rate this season, lowest among all FBS conferences. The group's 3.03 TD-to-interception ratio this season is also best among all FBS conferences (excluding Independents).

College Football Playoff (CFP) Selection Process

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is the event that crowns the national champion in college football. The CFP Selection Committee ranks the top 25 teams at the end of the season, and the I2 playoff participants consist of the five highest-ranked conference champions, plus the next seven highest-ranked teams. The four highest ranked conference champions will be seeded one through four and receive a first-round bye. The schools seeded five through eight will host those seeded nine through I2 in first-round games. The quarterfinals and semifinals rotate annually among six bowl games – the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, Vrbo Fiesta Bowl, Capital One Orange Bowl, Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl Game presented by Prudential and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. This year's quarterfinals will take place on December 31, 2025, and January 1, 2026, while the semifinals will be January 8-9, 2026. The College Football Playoff National Championship will be Monday, January 19, 2026, at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami.
