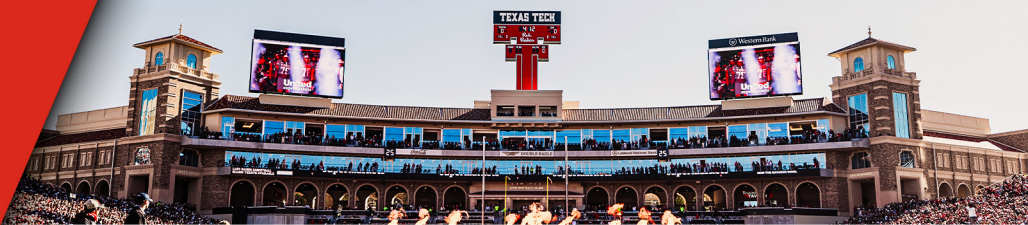

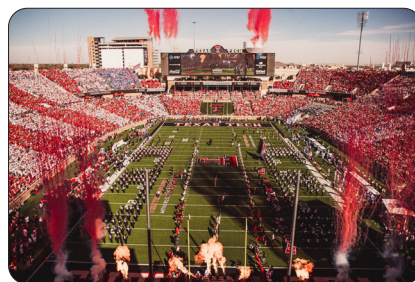

RED RAIDERS HOST UCF IN HOME FINALE

Texas Tech will look to secure its seventh 10-win season in school history on Saturday when hosting UCF in its home finale at Jones AT&T Stadium. The Red Raiders enter their Senior Day matchup against the Knights sporting a 9-1 record, their best start since 2008, placing the Red Raiders deep in the Big 12 title race. A victory on Saturday would only strengthen Texas Tech's Big 12 Championship Game and CFP aspirations, as it is one of three teams tied atop the Big 12 standings with one loss, along with BYU (5-1) and Cincinnati (5-1).



GET HIM TO NYC: J-ROD FOR HEISMAN

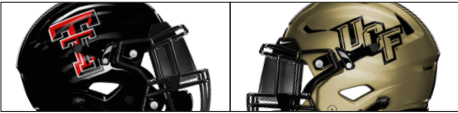
Talk about Heisman moments — Jacob Rodriguez' highlight-reel interception last weekend against No. 7 BYU might just be one that earns the senior linebacker a trip to New York City. Rodriguez, who added 14 tackles and a fumble recovery in the top-10 victory, has now been responsible for eight takeaways in Big 12 play alone. He joins former Buffalo standout Khalil Mack (2013) as the only FBS players since 2005 to record at least five forced fumbles, three interceptions and two fumble recoveries in a single season.



THE NATION'S MOST DOMINANT TEAM

Texas Tech is the only team in the country with multiple wins over teams ranked in the top 15 of the initial College Football Playoff rankings after last weekend's 29-7 victory over No. 7 BYU. It was Texas Tech's ninth victory by 20 or more points this season, which easily leads the FBS and matches the most in school history. Texas Tech currently ranks second nationally in average margin of victory as the Red Raiders are outscoring opponents in wins to the tune of 33.2 points this season, which trails only Utah (36.4) among schools with at least six wins.

SERIES NOTEBOOK

INSIDE THE SERIES

- This will be the second-ever meeting between Texas Tech and UCF as the two schools first met late in the 2023 season with the Red Raiders prevailing with a 24-23 victory. UCF also traveled to Jones AT&T Stadium for that matchup as the Red Raiders are not slated to visit Orlando until the 2027 campaign, the final year in the Big 12's current four-year scheduling matrix.
- UCF led 14-0 early before the Red Raiders tied it up at halftime and ultimately won when E'Maurion Banks blocked a game-tying extra point with 5:30 remaining in regulation.
- Tahj Brooks ran for 182 yards, a career high at the time, while Behren Morton threw for two touchdowns to lead Texas Tech to its third consecutive victory to reach bowl eligibility. Brooks scored a 13-yard touchdown to give the Red Raiders a 21-14 lead late in the third quarter, while Gino Garcia connected on a 51-yard field goal with 6:13 remaining in regulation. Morton finished with 256 passing yards on 21-of-34 passing.
- The Red Raiders are 5-9 all-time against schools from the state of Florida, as this will be the first matchup versus a school from the Sunshine State since the 2023 first meeting against UCF. Prior to that, Texas Tech had not faced a school from the state of Florida since the Red Raiders downed Florida International, 54-21, in 2021.

TEXAS TECH-UCF CONNECTIONS

- Texas Tech senior defensive lineman Lee Hunter will be more than familiar with UCF after playing the last three seasons with the Knights. Hunter, who earned his bachelor's degree in general studies from UCF, combined for 131 tackles, 21.5 tackles for loss, and 5.0 sacks over his three seasons in Orlando. He was a two-time All-Big 12 recipient while at UCF, earning honorable mention accolades as a sophomore in 2023 and then second team honors as a junior a year ago. Hunter had one tackle when facing the Red Raiders in the 2023 matchup against UCF.
- Texas Tech has four players who hail from the state of Florida in wide receiver Roy Alexander (Fort Myers), cornerback Dontae Balfour (Starke), wide receiver Reggie Virgil (Apopka) and offensive lineman Hunter Zambrano (Weston).

- Among the two coaching staffs, Texas Tech offensive line coach Clay McGuire will have some familiarity with the defensive scheme on the other side as he and UCF defensive coordinator Alex Grinch were on the same Mike Leach staff at Washington State from 2015-17. Grinch was the defensive coordinator and secondary coach for the Cougars for those three seasons, while McGuire was in a similar role as Washington State's offensive line coach. Texas Tech Associate A.D. for football administration, Antonio Huffman, was also part of that Washington State staff during that span as Director of Football Operations.

UCF CAREER NOTABLE OUTINGS

- In the two years since Texas Tech and UCF last faced each other, much has changed on the Red Raiders' roster. Texas Tech has 11 players remaining on its roster who participated in the 2023 victory over the Knights, including five starters in quarterback Behren Morton, wide receiver Coy Eakin, linebackers Jacob Rodriguez and Ben Roberts and safety Brenden Jordan.
- Texas Tech returns four players who had five or more tackles in that 2023 matchup, a group led by Jacob Rodriguez, who had 12 stops to go along with a quarterback hurry and pass breakup. Ben Roberts also had six tackles in the win, while Chapman Lewis and Brenden Jordan both had five stops.
- Morton threw for 256 yards and two touchdowns in the victory as he completed 21-of-34 passes with only one interception. Eakin was tied for the team high with four receptions in the win, finishing with 41 yards. Morton's two touchdowns both came in the red zone as he connected with Drae McCray on a 15-yard strike early in the second quarter and then tight end Mason Tharp from 19 yards out just before halftime.

THE LAST MATCHUP

LUBBOCK, Texas (AP) - Tajh Brooks ran for a career-high 182 yards while powering a game-clinching drive after E'Maurion Banks blocked a potential tying extra-point kick, and Texas Tech rallied for a 24-23 victory over UCF.

Behren Morton threw for two touchdowns in the home finale as the Red Raiders (6-5, 5-3 Big 12) won their third consecutive game in a battle for bowl eligibility. In coach Joey McGuire's debut last season, Texas Tech won its final four games, including a Texas Bowl victory over Mississippi.

UCF (5-6, 2-6) couldn't hold a 14-0 lead, didn't get any points from inside the Texas Tech 5-yard line by letting time run out before halftime and settled for a short field goal on fourth-and-3 when trailing by a touchdown early in the fourth quarter. Despite all that, the Knights were a PAT away from a tie after John Rhys Plumlee's 71-yard touchdown pass to Javon Baker with 5:30 remaining.

Colton Boomer had made 85 consecutive PATs when a leaping Banks in the middle of the line got a hand on the kick to keep the Red Raiders in front 24-23.

The Red Raiders then ran off the final 5 1/2 minutes behind Brooks, who carried eight times for 34 yards in the nine plays before Morton kneeled down twice.

Morton had a first-down pass during the drive, and the clincher was a 4-yard run from Brooks on second-and-3 with 1:16 remaining. Brooks scored the go-ahead touchdown on a 13-yard run late in the third quarter.

The Red Raiders, who will finish with a winning record in consecutive seasons for the first time since 2008-09 under the late Mike Leach, got even with Morton's scoring tosses of 15 yards to Drae McCray and 19 yards to Mason Tharp.

Brooks won the battle of two of the nation's top 10 running backs by beating his previous career best of 170 against

Baylor last month. Brooks has at least 100 yards in eight of the past nine games. Harvey finished with 78 yards, ending a five-game run of at least 100 yards that was the longest at UCF since 2007.

LUBBOCK, Texas (AP) - For Oklahoma State, 1997 had been a dream season and it was coming into the Texas Tech game fresh off a 30-7 whipping of Oklahoma. All of this meant that Texas Tech came into Stillwater as the underdog, but the Red Raiders, who had beaten OSU, 30-3 at Texas Stadium in 1996, weren't buying it.

In fact, as Tech linebacker Ty Ardoin raced towards the Oklahoma State end zone after intercepting a Tony Lindsay pass to put the Raider's seal on a 27-3 victory, the cold day in Stillwater closely resembled a warmer one a year earlier in Dallas.

"We showed the will to win even when people wanted to count us out," Texas Tech defensive end Montae Reagor said. "We're going to play hard no matter what and that's something we all can take pride in."

In the first half, two members of Tech's highly touted freshman class played key roles to help the Red Raiders take a 10-0 lead. Antwan Alexander picked off a Lindsay pass at the Texas Tech 15 to keep the Cowboys off of the scoreboard in the first quarter. Classmate Ricky Williams rushed for 30 og his 91 yards on Tech's first touchdown drive which Williams capped himself with a two-yard run for six.

Tony Rogers kicked his second field goal of the day, this one from 34 yards, in the third quarter to give the Red Raiders a 13-0 lead. OSU began to grab momentum at the end of the third. Facing a fourth down on Tech's five-yard line, OSU opted for a field goal to spoil the shutout.

Jonathan Hawkins took a squib kick on the ensuing kickoff, bringing it back for 73 yards before being forced out at the Oklahoma State five-yard line. Following a penalty, Adrian Ervin went 20 yards for the touchdown on the next play.

"It was a great game on both side of the football," Texas Tech coach Spike Dykes said. "Just a very complete game. I really thought the line of scrimmage on both sides of the ball was the difference in the game."

RED RAIDER NOTEBOOK

THIS WEEK IN THE TOP-25 POLLS

■ Texas Tech can expect to move up at least one spot this week in the College Football Playoff rankings after appearing at No. 8 last week in the committee's initial top-25 unveiling. The Red Raiders, who knocked off No. 7 BYU this past weekend, were ranked in the CFP poll for the first time since the new format debuted in 2014.

■ Texas Tech moved up to No. 8 this week in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls following its win over BYU. This is the fourth week this season Texas Tech has ranked in the top 10 as the Red Raiders were previously as high as No. 7 prior to their loss at Arizona State, their highest appearance in either poll since late in the 2008 season.

■ The Red Raiders have been ranked inside the top 25 of both major polls every week thus far this season. Texas Tech entered the 2025 season ranked inside the top 25 of both major polls for the first time since 2008 as the Red Raiders were No. 23 in the Associated Press poll and No. 24 in the AFCA coaches poll. Texas Tech was previously ranked No. 24 in the 2023 AFCA preseason poll before falling out after a season-opening loss at Wyoming.

■ It was the first time the Red Raiders had appeared in the Associated Press poll since Sept. 23, 2018, when Texas Tech was No. 24 nationally after starting its season 3-1 overall with wins over Lamar, Houston, and at No. 15 Oklahoma State, and the lone loss coming in the opener to Ole Miss.

RED RAIDERS GOING FOR WIN NO. 10

■ Texas Tech will be looking to reach 10 wins for the seventh time in program history and the first time since 2008 on Saturday with a win over UCF. The Red Raiders finished with 10 wins during the 1932, 1938, and 1976 seasons and then had 11 victories during the 1953, 1973, and 2008 campaigns. Both totals are in reach as Texas Tech's final two opponents in UCF and West Virginia, are a combined 8-11 this season and 3-10 in Big 12 play.

■ With a win over the Knights, Joey McGuire would become the sixth head coach in program history to lead the Red Raiders to a 10-win season, joining Pete Cawthon (1932, 1938), DeWitt Weaver (1953), Jim Carlen (1973), Steve Sloan (1976) and Mike Leach (2008).

WHERE TEXAS TECH'S START RANKS...

■ Texas Tech's win over BYU marked the eighth time in school history the Red Raiders have opened a season with a 9-1 record or better and the first time since their memorable 2008 campaign. The lone loss this season came at Arizona State on Oct. 18 without starting quarterback Behren Morton.

■ Texas Tech has only started three seasons since joining the Southwest Conference in 1960 with a 9-1 record or better. The Red Raiders were 9-1 to start both the 1973 and 1976 seasons under Jim Carlen and Steve Sloan, respectively, while Mike Leach's 2008 squad started the season with 10 consecutive victories. Texas Tech captured at least a share of a conference title in two of those seasons as the SWC co-champion in 1976 and the Co-Big 12 South Division champion in 2008.

■ Texas Tech has reached its 10th win by at least its 11 game in each of the Red Raiders' previous six 10-win seasons in program history. The Red Raiders closed the 1938 regular season at 10-0 overall before falling to St. Mary's (Calif.) in the Cotton Bowl for their lone loss.

TEXAS TECH TO HONOR 20-PLUS SENIORS

■ Texas Tech will recognize 20-plus seniors prior to kickoff Saturday who will possibly play their final game inside Jones AT&T Stadium. The list of seniors being honored this weekend includes several mainstays for the Red Raiders, including quarterback Behren Morton, linebacker Jacob Rodriguez and Bryce Ramirez, and outside linebacker Charles Esters III, among others. Texas Tech's Senior Day recognition will take place prior to kickoff Saturday as each Red Raider will be joined on the field by his family as well as head coach Joey McGuire and his wife, Debbie.

ULTIMATE GOAL: GET TO ARLINGTON

■ Texas Tech began this season with the ultimate goal of finding its way to AT&T Stadium in Arlington, the site of the Big 12 Championship game. The Red Raiders took an important step in that journey with their win last weekend over BYU, pushing Texas Tech to 6-1 and tied with the Cougars and Cincinnati atop the Big 12 standings. BYU and Cincinnati still have a game against each other, which is set for Nov. 22 in Cincinnati.

■ With a win Saturday over UCF, Texas Tech would tie its school record for most conference wins in a season that was set originally in 1976 (7-1) and tied again in 2008 (7-1). The Red Raiders could break the record with wins over both UCF and West Virginia to close the regular season.

■ This is only the fourth time since the Red Raiders joined the Big 12 in 1996 and the second time in as many years that Texas Tech has finished with six or more conference wins. Prior to last season, Texas Tech had only two seasons with six or more Big 12 victories, which came during the 2005 (6-2) and 2008 (7-1) seasons under Mike Leach when the conference maintained an eight-game league schedule.

■ Prior to joining the Big 12 in 1996, Texas Tech finished with six or more league wins in the Southwest Conference only twice, which came during a 7-1 campaign under Steve Sloan in 1976 and a 6-1 mark under Jim Carlen in 1973. The Southwest Conference rotated between a seven and eight-game format throughout Texas Tech's tenure from 1960-95 as the Red Raiders won five or more games 10 times.

■ With the win over Kansas State, Texas Tech secured its fourth-consecutive season with a winning conference record for the third time since joining the Big 12 Conference in 1996. The Red Raiders previously enjoyed a seven-year span with an above-.500 league record under Spike Dykes from 1991-97, which covered Texas Tech's late tenure in the Southwest Conference and the beginning two years as a Big 12 member. Texas Tech also went four-straight seasons with a winning SWC record from 1967-70 under JT King and Jim Carlen.

THE NATION'S TOP TRANSFER CLASS

Texas Tech landed On3's top transfer portal class following the 2024 season as Joey McGuire and his staff signed 21 transfers to add to an already-talented list of returners. The class, which also ranked in the top five nationally by ESPN, The Athletic and 247Sports, delivered 10 players who were ranked among the top-100 portal entrees by one of the four publications.

TEXAS TECH DOMINANT OVERALL

- The Red Raiders have been dominant in their nine victories this season, winning all nine games by at least 22 points while outscoring opponents, 421-126, overall. Texas Tech currently ranks second nationally in average margin of victory as the Red Raiders are outscoring opponents in wins to the tune of 33.2 points this season, which trails only Utah (36.4) among schools with at least six wins. The Utes were downed, 34-10, by the Red Raiders to start Big 12 play.
- Texas Tech's nine wins by at least 22 points are the most by a Big 12 team in a single season since Texas had the same amount on its way to appearing in the BCS Championship in 2009. The league record is 10 wins by at least 22 points, which was set by Oklahoma in 2008.
- Texas Tech's six Big 12 wins this season by at least 22 points are tied for the most in league history, which had been accomplished five times previously by Nebraska (1996, 1997), Kansas State (2002), Oklahoma (2003) and Texas (2005).
- Texas Tech is the only team in the country with nine or more wins by 20 or more points this season. In fact, the Red Raiders have the same number of Big 12 wins (6) by 20 or more points as No. 1 Ohio State and No. 2 Indiana have for the entire season. Texas Tech's total number of Big 12 wins alone by at least 20 points are more than the other five schools ranked ahead of the Red Raiders in the first CFP poll in No. 3 Texas A&M (4), No. 4 Alabama (2), No. 5 Georgia (4), No. 6 Ole Miss (3) and No. 7 BYU (3).

FROM A HISTORICAL PERSPECTIVE...

- This is only the second time in school history the Red Raiders have won nine or more games in a season by 20 points, as the Red Raiders also did so in 1953 on their way to an 11-1 campaign. In its history, Texas Tech had only three other seasons with seven or more wins by at least 20 points.
- The Red Raiders have won at least 10 games in each of their previous two seasons with eight or more wins by 20-plus points. Texas Tech finished 10-2 in 1932, its eighth year as a football program, and then was 11-1 overall in 1953.
- Texas Tech's current average points margin of 29.5 points would rank second in school history. That record dates back to 1953, when Texas Tech outscored opponents to the tune of 29.6 points per game. Since joining the Southwest Conference in 1960, Texas Tech's highest average point differential is a 20.6 margin from 2005.
- Texas Tech's previous 6-0 start - all by wins of at least 20 points - marked the first time since the 1953-54 seasons the Red Raiders won six-straight games by at least that margin. Texas Tech closed the 1953 season with five-straight wins by 20 or more points and then opened the 1954 campaign with a 41-9 victory at Texas A&M and a 33-7 win over West Texas State. The Red Raiders set the Texas Tech single-season record with nine victories in 1953, coming by 20 points.

NOTES

- Texas Tech and West Virginia will meet for the 15th time on Nov. 29 and the 14th time as Big 12 Conference members in a back-and-forth series that is tied at 7-7 overall. Texas Tech leads the series at 7-6 since West Virginia joined the Big 12 prior to the 2012 season.
- The Red Raiders have won five of the past six games in the series with the lone setback coming in their last trip to Morgantown in 2023. The Mountaineers frustrated Texas Tech's offense on their way to a 20-13 victory that season. The Red Raiders responded with 52-15 rout in the regular-season finale a year ago, their second-largest win all-time in the series.
- Since the Mountaineers joined the Big 12 in 2012, Texas Tech and West Virginia have traditionally played several close games with seven of those 13 decisions determined by one possession and one more by only 11 points. The Red Raiders are 3-4 against West Virginia in one-possession games with wins in two of the last three occurrences.
- This will be the fourth time the two school have faced each other in the month of November as the Red Raiders are 2-1 in those games historically. Texas Tech has traveled to Morgantown during the final month of the season only once, which came in 31-26 loss in 2015.
- The only other meeting between the two schools outside the Big 12 era came in the 1938 Sun Bowl where West Virginia edged the Red Raiders, 7-6, in front of 12,000 fans in El Paso. It was the first of now 41 bowl appearances for the Red Raiders, who rank among the top 25 teams all-time in postseason trips.

NOVEMBER GOOD TO TECH UNDER MCGUIRE

- The month of November has been good for the Red Raiders under Joey McGuire as Texas Tech is a combined 11-3 over his four seasons. That is a drastic improvement for a Texas Tech program that was a combined 10-31 (.244) during the month over the previous 11 seasons.
- Texas Tech finished 3-1 over the final month of the season in each of McGuire's first three seasons. The Red Raiders are already 2-0 in November following wins at Kansas State and over No. 7 BYU, with only a visit from UCF and a trip to West Virginia remaining on the schedule.
- Joey McGuire is 11-3 during the month of November, which is the highest winning percentage for a Texas Tech head coach in regular-season games in November or December through his first four seasons. McGuire is one of four head coaches in program history with 10 or more wins in regular season games in November or December, joining the likes of Pete Cawthon (11-5), Dell Morgan (11-4-1) and DeWitt Weaver (13-4-1).
- Texas Tech's 1-3 record in November since the start of the 2022 season leads the Big 12 among programs that have been in the conference each year during that span.

THE SCHEDULE THUS FAR...

- Texas Tech is the only school with multiple wins over teams currently in the top 15 of the initial College Football Playoff rankings as the Red Raiders have already defeated No. 7 BYU and No. 13 Utah. Texas Tech also has a win over an eight-win Houston team that is receiving votes in both the Associated Press and USA Today Coaches polls.
- The only real criticism the Red Raiders have received so far this year is regarding their non-conference schedule. As a reminder, two other current top-15 teams in No. 9 Oregon and No. 12 Oklahoma, faced two of Texas Tech's non-conference opponents this season with both winning by a smaller margin of victory. Oregon topped its in-state rival Oregon State, 41-7, on Sept. 20 in Eugene, one weekend after the Red Raiders downed the Beavers, 45-14, at home. Oklahoma, meanwhile, shut out a Kent State program, 44-0, that was blown out by the Red Raiders, 62-14, in week two.
- Texas Tech's only loss came after a final two-minute drive led by Arizona State quarterback Sam Leavitt, who led the Sun Devils to their 11th-consecutive win versus a Big 12 opponent when he started. Texas Tech turned to redshirt freshman Will Hammond, who was making his second career start.

- Dating back to joining the Southwest Conference in 1960, Texas Tech has opened conference play with a 2-0 record as a result of road wins only once previously, which came during its memorable 1976 season. The Red Raiders shared the Southwest Conference title that season with a 7-1 league record, finishing 10-2 overall under Steve Sloan.
- The Red Raiders, who closed last season with November road wins at No. 10 Iowa State and Oklahoma State, were in the midst of their longest conference road winning streak since 1996-97 until their loss at Arizona State. Texas Tech closed the 1996 campaign with three-consecutive Big 12 road wins over Kansas, Texas A&M and Oklahoma before beginning league play a year later with a victory at Baylor.
- Texas Tech went 3-1 overall during October, their best record in the month since the Red Raiders were 2-1 under Kliff Kingsbury in 2018.

HOME SWEET HOME

- Texas Tech is a perfect 6-0 this season inside the friendly confines of Jones AT&T Stadium, where the Red Raiders are now 21-5 under Joey McGuire since his hiring prior to the 2022 campaign. Texas Tech is 13-4 at home against Big 12 opponents under McGuire and an impressive 8-1 during non-conference play.
- The Red Raiders boast the highest home winning percentage among Big 12 schools during that span, besting the likes of BYU, Kansas State, TCU and Utah.
- This is the 14th time in program history and the third time in a four-year span that Tech has hosted seven games in a season, continuing its recent trend of prioritizing home games. The Red Raiders are slated to host seven home games in two of the next three seasons with 2027 being the lone exception.
- With a victory over UCF, Texas Tech would finish with a win in every home game for the first time since 2008 and the 12th time in history. The Red Raiders have been perfect at home five times total since joining the Southwest Conference in 1960, which came during the 2008, 2005, 1995, 1973 and 1965 seasons.

ROAD TESTED

- Texas Tech secured its third win away from home at Kansas State, improving the Red Raiders to 3-1 in road games this season. The 43-20 victory over the Wildcats followed a 34-10 victory at previously-No. 16 Utah and then a 35-11 win at Houston with the lone loss coming at Arizona State.
- With its win over Kansas State, the Red Raiders locked in three Big 12 road wins in the same season for the first time since 2008 when Texas Tech won at Kansas State, Texas A&M, and No. 19 Kansas.
- The loss at Arizona State snapped a four-game winning streak for the Red Raiders in Big 12 road games dating back to the end of the 2024 season. The Red Raiders, who closed last season with November road wins at No. 10 Iowa State and Oklahoma State, were in the midst of their longest conference road winning streak (no neutral sites) since Texas Tech closed the 1996 campaign with three-consecutive Big 12 road wins over Kansas, Texas A&M and Oklahoma before beginning league play a year later with a victory at Baylor.



RED RAIDERS IN ONE-POSSESSION GAMES

- Texas Tech has ranked among the nation's most successful teams in one-possession games since hiring Joey McGuire in 2022. The Red Raiders are 13-5 in such games under McGuire — a drastic improvement for a program that went a combined 13-20 in the seven seasons prior to his arrival. Texas Tech was 4-0 in one-possession games during McGuire's debut season in 2022, followed by a 3-3 mark in 2023 and a 6-1 record last year.
- The Red Raiders, who have dominated opponents with nine wins by at least 20 points this season, dropped their lone one-possession game of the year at Arizona State, a 26-22 loss that came after a final two-minute drive from the Sun Devils.
- Among teams nationally with at least eight one-possession games since 2022, Texas Tech leads the Big 12 for winning percentage, besting the likes of Houston (13-6, .684), BYU (12-6, .667) and West Virginia (10-6, .625). Texas Tech is ninth nationally for winning percentage in one-possession games during that same stretch.
- Texas Tech is an impressive 8-1 at home in one-possession games under McGuire with the lone loss coming early in the 2023 season to No. 13 Oregon. The Red Raiders are 5-4 on the road, including three wins this past season at Arizona, Iowa State and Oklahoma State. Texas Tech also won a one-possession game at Iowa State in 2022 and at Kansas in 2023.

THE HOTTEST TICKET IN TOWN

- Texas Tech sold out of season tickets for the third-consecutive season in early May as Red Raider fans purchased more than 33,000 season passes for the 2025 campaign. This total does not include seats reserved for Texas Tech's student body, either. Texas Tech also sold out its entire premium seating inventory in all areas of Jones AT&T Stadium, which includes more than 100 luxury suites and 1,600 club seats.
- Texas Tech has added more than 14,000 season tickets since Joey McGuire's hiring in November 2021. Texas Tech previously sold 28,000 season tickets for McGuire's debut season in 2022, which, like this year's total, ranks among the top-10 highest season ticket counts in program history.
- Texas Tech has played in front of a sold-out crowd in five of its first six home games of the season as 60,229 fans were on hand for the Arkansas-Pine Bluff, Kent State, Oregon State, Kansas and BYU wins. Texas Tech currently has less than 1,000 tickets remaining for this weekend's game against UCF as of Monday morning.

- Texas Tech is currently averaging 60,128 fans a game this season, which is on pace to easily snap the single-season school record of 58,934 fans that were on hand over six games in 2014. With only one non-sellout this season, Texas Tech is filling Jones AT&T Stadium at 99.8 percent capacity, which is second in the Big 12 and ranks 12th overall in the FBS.

THE BIG 12 LEADER IN BOWL APPEARANCES

- Texas Tech secured its 43rd bowl appearance in its history and fifth in as many years with the win over Kansas, which leads all active Big 12 Conference teams. Texas Tech ranks tied for 20th nationally in all-time bowl appearances as the Red Raiders have one more than fellow Big 12 member BYU and two more than West Virginia.
- Texas Tech is currently in the midst of its longest bowl streak since its 2000-10 stretch, primarily under Mike Leach. That 11-year run represents the only time in program history that Texas Tech has made the postseason in five consecutive seasons. This is the third time in program history the Red Raiders have reached a bowl game in four-straight years as Texas Tech also did so from 1993-96 under Spike Dykes.
- Joey McGuire joins Leach as the only head coaches in program history to lead the Red Raiders to a bowl appearance in each of his first four seasons. Texas Tech is 2-1 in bowl games under McGuire after topping Ole Miss in the 2022 TaxAct Texas Bowl and Cal in the 2023 Independence Bowl, while falling this past season to Arkansas in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl.

- Texas Tech will continue to recognize the hometowns of every student-athlete on its roster this season with a special decal on the back of each gameday helmet. The decal will feature a throwback Masked Rider logo with the area code associated with each student-athlete's hometown as part of an initiative started in 2022 by head coach Joey McGuire.

THE BRAND NUMBER



Here at Texas Tech, there is only one available jersey number that is protected: No. 3. The jersey represents the player or players who best represent the core tenets of "The Brand," which represents Texas Tech's daily quest to be the "toughest, hard-working, most competitive team in the country."

The Red Raiders have two players wearing the jersey this season in returning linebacker Bryce Ramirez and wide receiver Coy Eakin. Ramirez was awarded the jersey prior to the 2023 season in recognition of his determination and leadership in response to a catastrophic leg injury suffered the year before at N.C. State.

Eakin, meanwhile, is coming off his best season as a Red Raider as he caught 49 passes for 652 yards and a team-leading seven touchdowns as only a sophomore this past season. He has 85 catches now for his Red Raider career, totaling 1,068 yards and nine touchdowns in 27 games. Eakin finished as Texas Tech's third-leading receiver this past season, trailing only departed senior Josh Kelly and returning senior Caleb Douglas. Eakin will move to Kelly's previous spot in Texas Tech's inside receiver position beginning this spring under new offensive coordinator Mack Leftwich.

In addition to representing the standards of "The Brand," the No. 3 jersey is designated to honor the life of the late Luke Siegel, who passed in August 2021 after inspiring countless others across the nation with his fighting spirit in the wake of a golf-cart accident. The No. 3 represented Siegel's favorite number.

DEGREES EARNED

HEAD COACH JOEY MCGUIRE

THE HALL OF FAMER

■ There likely isn't a power conference football program in the state of Texas with better ties to its high school coaches than at Texas Tech as McGuire hired six members of his charter coaching staff who have ties to the Texas High School Coaches Association (THSCA). McGuire, himself, is already a legend at the prep level as a member of the THSCA Hall of Honor and the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame.

■ McGuire, owner of three state titles as head coach of Cedar Hill High School in the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex, was inducted into the THSCA Hall of Honor (THSCA) in 2020 and then the Texas High School Football Hall of Fame in 2022 in the months after accepting the Texas Tech position. McGuire is still an avid speaker at the annual THSCA Convention and regularly hosts clinics for high school coaches each year.

NOT THE ONLY COACH IN THE FAMILY

■ Texas Tech has a second member of the McGuire family on its sidelines this season with Garret McGuire joining the staff as running backs coach. The younger McGuire previously played under his father at quarterback at Cedar Hill High School before enjoying four years as a backup quarterback at Baylor. He joined the coaching profession immediately after, serving as an offensive assistant with the NFL's Carolina Panthers (2021-22) and then as the wide receivers coach for Nebraska the past two seasons (2023-24).

■ Garret isn't the only McGuire building an impressive career, either, as Raegan McGuire is a fashion designer for AMUR in New York City. Her designs have been worn by several high-profile figures, including Natalie Biden, the granddaughter of President Joe Biden, as well as Taylor Swift during her spring 2023 Eras Tour.

AN NFL FRONT OFFICE

■ Under McGuire, Texas Tech's personnel department resembles an NFL front office, a first-in-its-kind approach in the world of college football. Texas Tech's personnel department is overseen by James Blanchard, who began the rise of the general manager role in college football soon after joining McGuire in Lubbock as his first hire after accepting the Texas Tech position.

■ Few, if any, general managers across college football have the autonomy Blanchard enjoys under McGuire. Blanchard and his staff are responsible for identifying every prospect Texas Tech ultimately offers a scholarship opportunity, allowing McGuire and his coaching staff to prioritize player development and opponent scouting, especially during the season.

■ The setup has helped Texas Tech land several of the nation's top recruits, especially in the lucrative footprint of the state of Texas. The Red Raiders began McGuire's tenure with a 2023 class that ranked as high as No. 23 by Rivals, its highest recruiting record in more than a decade. Texas Tech followed with another highly-rated class in 2024, which led the Big 12 and again ranked as high as No. 23 overall nationally.

■ For McGuire, the Red Raiders have consistently prioritized recruiting the top high school talent in Texas, leaning into his staff's ties to the high school coaches throughout the state. Texas Tech has complemented that approach with several additions via the transfer portal where McGuire and his staff have delivered successful results via the likes of All-Big 12 selections like linebacker Jacob Rodriguez, wide receiver Josh Kelly, tight end Jalin Conyers and defensive back C.J. Baskerville, among others. Texas Tech landed On3's top transfer portal class this offseason as McGuire and his staff landed 21 newcomers to an already talented roster.



THE BRAND

The core tenant under McGuire revolves around The Brand, which stands for his desire that the Red Raiders be the "toughest, hardest-working, most-competitive team in the country." On his final interview for the Texas Tech position, McGuire described his vision for the Red Raider program using The Brand, which President Lawrence Schovanec said "describes West Texas."



WHAT'S NEXT!

Step into any Texas Tech practice and the phrase "What's Next" is one you'll hear early and often. No matter if something good or bad happens on the field, McGuire and his staff stress a "What's Next!" mentality, emphasizing that the focus should be on the next play or rep. And for reference, the phrase is always a statement, never a question, as evidenced by its exclamation point at its end.



TAKE THREE UNIVERSITY

McGuire, a defensive coach at heart, heavily utilizes the phrase "Take Three" as a program. The phrase has transformed into a rallying cry from the defense with in-house video production signaling "one," "two" or "three" each time the Red Raiders create a takeaway. McGuire, prior to each game, regularly wears a t-shirt designed for the defense that says "Take Three University."





THE UNOFFICIAL HOME OF THE THSCA

Since his hire as Texas Tech's head coach, Joey McGuire has made it a point to brand the Red Raiders the "unofficial home of the Texas High School Coaches Association." Already a Hall of Famer, himself, McGuire has hired a staff filled with experience at both the collegiate and high school levels, with five assistant coaches who have previous ties to the THSCA as well as a slew of support staff members.

That list includes associate head coach and special teams coordinator Kenny Perry (Bowie, Halton City and Sam Houston H.S.), offensive coordinator Mack Leftwich (Kirkland H.S.), offensive run game coordinator Josh Cochran (Lindale H.S.), offensive passing game coordinator Justin "Juice" Johnson (Plano West and Berkner H.S.) and defensive line coach Zarnell Fitch (Lincoln H.S.). Five support staff members also have THSCA experience in assistant defensive backs coach Jah'Shawn Johnson (Ennis H.S.), assistant linebackers coach Taylor Young (Richardson H.S.), Director of Player Personnel Brian Nance (Temple H.S.), Director of Player Development Dave Martin (Cedar Hill) and assistant strength coach Brandon Stevenson (Midland Christian and Lake County Christian H.S.).

Texas Tech defensive coordinator Shiel Wood and senior defensive analyst Jack Teachey, meanwhile, both have experience at the high school level on the East Coast.

SUCCESS IN BIG 12 PLAY

- Texas Tech has ranked among the most-consistent Big 12 programs during Joey McGuire's three-plus seasons as head coach, winning 22 conference games in that span. Dating back to Texas Tech's acceptance into the Southwest Conference in 1960, McGuire is one of two head coaches in history to have 20 or more league wins in his first 34 games. Jim Carlen was also 20-14 at the same point in his tenure, which spanned the 1970-74 seasons. Steve Sloan also had a strong league record early in his tenure, finishing 15-8 overall in Southwest Conference play during his three seasons from 1975-77.
- McGuire has returned the Red Raiders to being one of the Big 12's most competitive teams as Texas Tech was 5-4 in each of his first two seasons and then 6-3 in 2024. Prior to his debut 2022 season, Texas Tech had not recorded a winning conference record since 2009 as the Red Raiders were a combined 36-71 (.336) in the 12 years before McGuire's arrival with no seasons of at least a .500 record.
- In fact, the Red Raiders are joined by Kansas State as the only two Big 12 programs to boast an above-.500 conference record in each of the past three seasons, regardless of league affiliation.
- Prior to his arrival, Texas Tech had finished with at least five conference wins in three-straight years only once in its history from 1995-97 while transitioning from the Southwest Conference to the Big 12. That stretch coincided with a seven-year period with a winning conference record from 1991-97.

NEWS & NOTES ON MCGUIRE...

- McGuire is only the second head coach in program history to lead the Red Raiders to bowl games in each of his first four seasons, joining the late Mike Leach, who pushed Texas Tech to a bowl game in each of his 10 seasons.
- Texas Tech has hit the 40-point mark 18 times during McGuire's tenure as the Red Raiders are a perfect 18-0 in those games during his three-plus seasons.
- There is defense in West Texas as Texas Tech is 23-1 overall under McGuire when holding opponents to 25 or fewer points. Texas Tech has limited its opponents to 25 or fewer points 16 times during Big 12 play under McGuire and has done so in each of its two bowl victories.
- Texas Tech has now six Big 12 wins for a second-consecutive season, marking the fourth time the Red Raiders have done so since joining the league in 1996. McGuire joins Mike Leach to lead the Red Raiders to multiple seasons of six or more conference wins after he did so twice during his tenure from 2000-09.

JACOB RODRIGUEZ, THE TAKEAWAY KING

Jacob Rodriguez has established himself as one of the nation's top players, not only for his tackling ability for his ability to create turnovers for the Red Raider defense. Rodriguez, the Big 12 Preseason Defensive Player of the Year and an All-American candidate, has had his hand in 18 takeaways over his career, including eight already in Big 12 play this season. The Red Raiders are 12-1 in games that he creates a takeaway, with the one loss coming at Wyoming in 2023 on a play where he forced and recovered a fumble. Rodriguez, who is now one of the FBS all-time leaders in forced fumbles, joins former Buffalo standout Khalil Mack (2013) as the only FBS players since 2005 to have at least five forced fumbles, three interceptions and two fumble recoveries all in the same season.

DEFENSIVE NOTEBOOK

RODRIGUEZ NOT ALONE IN TAKEAWAYS

- For as good as Jacob Rodriguez has been in creating takeaways during his career, he's not alone on the Red Raider roster. Between not only Rodriguez but also fellow linebacker Ben Roberts and edge linebacker David Bailey, Texas Tech has three of the nation's active leaders in career forced fumbles as the trio has combined for 29 entering this weekend. Texas Tech is the only school in the FBS boasting two players with seven or more career forced fumbles, let alone three.
- Rodriguez ranks second in the FBS with 13 career forced fumbles, including four from this season alone. He trails only Buffalo's Red Murdock, who has already snapped the NCAA FBS record with 17 forced fumbles of his own. Bailey is tied for third nationally with nine forced fumbles in his career, followed by Roberts and five others in a tie for eighth overall with seven.
- Rodriguez is the FBS leader with seven forced fumbles already this season as he's knocked loose five in the past four games alone. He scored off one of those, returning his own forced fumble 69 yards for a touchdown against Oklahoma State. He previously had another key forced fumble at Utah before adding an interception to help seal the victory late in the fourth quarter.
- His seven forced fumbles this season rank tied for seventh since the NCAA began tracking the category beginning with the 2000 season. He is already tied for fourth in Big 12 history for single-season forced fumbles, trailing only Derrick Johnson of Texas (9 in 2004), Texas Tech's own Dwayne Slay (8 in 2005) and Jayshon Sykes of Colorado (7 in 1999).

THE NATION'S TOP DEFENSIVE PLAYER

- Joey McGuire often refers to Jacob Rodriguez as the "quarterback of the defense." It's a fitting description for Rodriguez, who was a standout high school quarterback at Wichita Falls Rider High School and later signed with Virginia to play offense. Rodriguez has adapted that quarterback mentality into becoming the nation's top inside linebacker, both in his ability to stop the run and also assist in coverage.
- Rodriguez enters this week as the highest-graded inside linebacker with at least 200 snaps by Pro Football Focus as he's grading out at 93.5 overall. That grade ranks tied second nationally among all defensive players, trailing only Miami's Rueben Bain Jr. (93.8). Rodriguez leads the country (all positions) with a 95.3 grade in rush defense, while his 92.7 leads all linebackers and ranks second among all positions.



“TAKE THREE DEFENSE” AMONG NATION’S BEST

■ “Take three” has long been the mantra of Joey McGuire, dating back to his days leading Cedar Hill High School in the Dallas-Fort Worth metroplex. The phrase describes Texas Tech’s continual goal to force at least three takeaways per game, which McGuire credits as greatly increasing his team’s chances to walk away with a victory.

■ The Red Raiders have reached the “take three” mark in four of seven games in Big 12 play and each of the past two weeks, finishing with three forced turnovers at Utah and Houston and then at home versus BYU. The Red Raiders, who forced a season-high five takeaways at Kansas State, are 11-1 under Joey McGuire when “taking three” and is 27-3 when leading or tied in the turnover margin.

■ Texas Tech leads the Big 12 and is third in the FBS with 23 takeaways this season, trailing only SMU (26) and Southern Miss (25) nationally. The Red Raiders are also tied for fourth nationally at plus-11 in the turnover margin, including a plus-6 margin the past two weeks alone.

CAN’T RUN ON US

■ Texas Tech enters this weekend as the FBS leader for rushing defense, as the Red Raiders are giving up only 73.8 yards per game on the ground this season. That is a significant improvement from a year ago, when Texas Tech ranked 73rd nationally after surrendering 152.1 rushing yards per game.

■ Texas Tech is coming off another strong performance against BYU as the Cougars finished with only 67 yards, including only 35 from the Big 12 leading rusher in LJ Martin.

■ Utah, which currently ranks third in the FBS with 267.1 rushing yards per game, was limited to only 101 yards to open Big 12 play, while Houston managed only 103 yards. Of the total versus Utah, 28 yards came on its final drive after the Red Raiders had already put the game away with a 34-10 lead.

■ Texas Tech followed those two performances by only giving up 47 rushing yards versus Kansas, the fewest by a Big 12 opponent since Baylor was limited to only 17 yards on the ground midway through the 2023 season. The Red Raiders previously only allowed eight rushing yards in their win over Oregon State, the fewest rushing yards since Texas Tech stuffed Kansas State to negative-12 yards in the first-ever Big 12 game to open the 1996 season.

■ The Texas Tech record for rushing defense average was set in 1964 when the Red Raiders gave up 115.6 yards per game. Texas Tech’s best rush defense during the Big 12 era came in 1998 when the Red Raiders allowed only 118.9 yards per game.

THE NATION’S SACKS LEADER

■ Texas Tech made splash after splash across college football this offseason with the signing of the top transfer portal class in the country. The loudest splash, however, came in early April with the signing of outside linebacker David Bailey, who committed to join the Red Raiders after three seasons at Stanford and is considered a potential NFL first-round selection next spring.

■ Bailey has lived up to his billing as he enters this week as the FBS leader with 11.5 sacks already this season. Bailey has found the quarterback at least once in eight of 10 games this season, combining for 9.0 sacks during Big 12 play alone,

which also leads the FBS. Michigan’s Derrick Moore is the only other FBS player to record seven or more sacks against conference opponents as he has 8.5 to barely trail Bailey.

■ Bailey moved into sole possession of sixth place on the Texas Tech single-season chart with his sack at Kansas State. He enters this weekend’s trailing both Aaron Hunt (2001) and Pete Robertson (2014) by a half sack for fourth in program history and then Brandon Williams (13.0) by 1.5 sacks for third place. Brandon Sharpe set the Texas Tech single-season record previously with 15.0 sacks in 2009.

■ Bailey currently leads the FBS with 66 total pressures, according to Pro Football Focus, with 13 of those coming against Houston, earning him the publication’s National Defensive Player of the Week honors. Bailey has 16 more pressures than any other as he’s followed by Miami’s Rueben Bain Jr. (50), New Mexico’s Keyshawn James-Newby (50), Miami of Ohio’s Adam Trick (49) and his teammate Romello Height (45).

■ Bailey matched his career high with 3.0 sacks against Kansas and followed with 2.0 at Arizona State and 1.0 sack at Kansas State, giving him 26.0 for his career. Bailey ranks third among active FBS players for career sacks, trailing only Trey Moore of Texas (30.5) and Akheem Mesidor of Miami (26.5).

STRENGTH IN THE MIDDLE

■ The middle of Texas Tech’s defensive line received a significant boost with the signing of Lee Hunter, Skyler Gill-Howard and A.J. Holmes Jr. this offseason. That trio alone has combined for 344 tackles, including 63.0 for a loss and 22.0 sacks, forming one of the top interior defensive line units, possibly in college football.

■ Texas Tech’s front is as impressive as the Red Raiders have boasted in recent years, with PFF’s Max Chadwick ranking the defensive line third nationally entering the 2025 season behind only Clemson and Alabama. Prior to his injury, Gill-Howard was among the highest-rated interior linemen in the FBS, ranking second with an 88.2 overall grade followed by Holmes Jr., who is 14th currently at 81.3 overall.

WOOD EXPERIENCED IN TURNING AROUND DEFENSES

- Shiel Wood is in his first season as Texas Tech's defensive coordinator and inside linebackers coach, bringing a reputation of immediately improving defenses from stops at Army (2021), Troy (2022), Tulane (2023) and Houston (2024).
- Wood's defenses have ranked inside the top 35 for total defense in all four seasons since he was first named co-defensive coordinator at Army in 2021. In addition, opposing offenses have averaged less than 23.0 points per game against Wood's defenses since his promotion to play-caller at Army in 2021. Texas Tech, meanwhile, has not allowed less than 25.0 points per game since 2009.
- Wood has built a reputation for immediately improving defenses, particularly through turnovers. Both his defenses at Troy and Tulane ranked in the top 10 nationally for takeaways as his defenses are averaging 22.3 takeaways per season over the past four years. His defenses have increased their takeaway total from the previous year in each of his last three stops as a defensive coordinator. Texas Tech surpassed that average against BYU as the Red Raiders are third nationally with 23 takeaways this season.
- Wood has certainly impressed early in his tenure after inheriting a Red Raider defense that surrendered 34.8 points per game a year ago. Texas Tech has seen immediate returns on his hiring as the Red Raiders enter this weekend ranked in the top-15 nationally for rushing defense (1st), takeaways (3rd), scoring (3rd), and total defense (9th).

GETTING TO THE QUARTERBACK

- One of Texas Tech's biggest weaknesses defensively a year ago was its ability to get to the quarterback. The Red Raiders have already proven to be much-improved in that area with the addition of outside linebackers David Bailey and Romello Height as well as defensive tackles Lee Hunter, A.J. Holmes Jr., and Skyler Gill-Howard. Texas Tech is currently ranked as the top-ranked defense by Pro Football Focus with a 96.7 overall grade and the nation's best pass rushing unit (91.8).
- The edge-rushing duo of Bailey and Height has more than paid dividends for the Red Raiders thus far as they have combined for 17.5 sacks and 111 pressures alone. The duo ranks among the top players in college football with Bailey credited with a 92.5 overall grade followed by Height at 92.4, which ranks third and tied for fourth nationally among those with 200 defensive snaps.
- Texas Tech set a school record with nine sacks in the win over Kansas, snapping the previous mark of eight that was set in a 1993 win at SMU. It remains tied for the most sacks by an FBS team this season, joining six others. In addition, it was the fifth time in Big 12 history that a conference team notched 9.0 or more sacks and was the first since Oklahoma had the same total in a 2020 victory over Kansas.
- Texas Tech has already surpassed its sacks total from a year ago with 29.0 on the season, which ranks tied for 10th in the FBS and leads the Big 12 entering this weekend. The Red Raiders have recorded 19.0 of their 28.0 sacks during Big 12 play, which is tied for the eighth-highest total in college football. This is currently the fourth-highest sack total for Texas Tech since 2005.

ROBERTS OFF TO GREAT START

- Ben Roberts heads into this weekend with 250 tackles already in his career and is yet still a junior. Roberts has a long way to reach the Texas Tech career list, but the successful start has put the thought in reach over the next two seasons as he is more than halfway to reaching Ryan Aycock for 10th all-time in program history. Aycock, a member of this year's Texas Tech Hall of Fame class, compiled 338 tackles as a Red Raider safety from 2000-03.
- Roberts ranks tied for 12th nationally and sixth among players currently at a power-conference school with his 250 tackles since the 2023 season alone. The only active Big 12 player with more tackles during that span than Roberts is Oklahoma State linebacker Bryan McCoy, who has combined for 271 stops between his time at Akron and with the Cowboys.
- Among players nationally listed as a junior or younger, Roberts is second for career tackles as his 250 stops trail only Oregon's Dillon Thieneman (255). Roberts leads the likes of Anthony Hill Jr. of Texas (243) and Ohio State's Caleb Downs (232) entering this weekend.
- Roberts picked off the second pass of his career at Kansas State, one of five takeaways in Texas Tech's first road win in the series since 2008. He also stepped in front of a pass for an interception as a redshirt freshman in 2023 at West Virginia.

FINDING THE END ZONE

- Texas Tech has three defensive touchdowns this season and two in as many weeks after Jacob Rodriguez returned his own forced fumble 69 yards against Oklahoma State, followed by John Curry's 10-yard fumble return at Kansas State. Texas Tech shares the Big 12 lead alongside Kansas State and UCF with three defensive touchdowns this season and ranks tied for seventh nationally.
- Texas Tech has now scored three defensive touchdowns in consecutive seasons under Joey McGuire. Skyler Gill-Howard had Texas Tech's other defensive touchdown as he returned an interception 55 yards in the non-conference win over Kent State early in the season.





MORTON AGAINST OTHER RETURNING QBs

There was a misconception this offseason that Behren Morton isn't among the top returning quarterbacks in college football. The senior gunslinger, fully healthy for the first time since his redshirt freshman season, is coming off a gritty 2024 campaign where he threw for 3,335 yards and 27 touchdowns to only eight interceptions. In fact, he is one of only six quarterbacks nationally to return this season after throwing for at least 3,000 yards and 20 touchdowns a year ago with eight or fewer interceptions.

OFFENSIVE NOTEBOOK

WINNING IS THE NAME OF THE GAME

- In the second episode of the Texas Tech documentary series "The Brand," Behren Morton details how he wants to be best remembered - a winner. Since the start of the 2023 season, Texas Tech is 20-4 in games Morton starts and does not depart due to injury, which includes a 14-3 mark during Big 12 play.
- During that span, Morton has departed four games due to injury, leaving the Kansas State loss in 2023 and the TCU road trip in 2024 at halftime with the Red Raiders locked in a one-possession game. He departed both the Big 12 opener at Utah just after halftime with the Red Raiders leading 10-3 at the time and then again against Kansas with Texas Tech enjoying a 21-0 lead at the time.
- Texas Tech has won each of its last 10 games Morton has started as the Red Raiders closed the 2024 regular season with back-to-back wins over Oklahoma State and West Virginia before opening this year with a 6-0 record. Morton pushed that streak to 10-straight games last weekend versus BYU.
- Since becoming Texas Tech's primary starting quarterback beginning with the Houston win in 2023 - the fifth game of that season, Morton has missed four starts during that span, sitting out the road trip to BYU in 2023, the AutoZone Liberty Bowl in 2024 and then against both Arizona State and Oklahoma State this season. The Red Raiders are only 1-3 in those games with the lone win coming against Oklahoma State.
- Overall, Morton has helped lead the Red Raiders to 22 wins over his 31 career starts, marking the most for a Texas Tech quarterback since Graham Harrell pushed the Red Raiders to a combined 28 victories in his three seasons as a starter from 2006-08. Harrell was inducted into the Texas Tech Ring of Honor already this season and will join the National Football Foundation College Football Hall of Fame in December. Kliff Kingsbury also led the Red Raiders to 24 wins as a starter from 1999-02, as he and Harrell represent the two-winningest quarterbacks for Texas Tech in the Big 12 era.

MORTON OFF TO A STRONG START

- Behren Morton has combined to throw for 1,969 yards and 16 touchdowns to only four interceptions this season, despite playing only three full games to this point. In fact, Morton has combined to play roughly only 22 quarters thus far as he departed the season opener versus Arkansas-Pine Bluff midway through the second quarter before leaving at halftime versus Kent State and then after the third quarter against Oregon State, all due to large leads. He departed both the Utah and Kansas wins due to injury.

- Even with limited time, Morton enters this week among the FBS passing leaders, ranking in the top 30 nationally for passing efficiency (9th), yards per pass attempt (10th), passing yards per completion (12th) and passing yards per game (28th). He has led a Red Raider offense that is 10th with 479.9 yards of total offense a contest and 17th in the FBS with 286.9 passing yards per game.

MORTON IN THE RECORD BOOK

- Morton became only the fifth player in Texas Tech history to reach 8,000 career passing yards against BYU, joining a list that includes Graham Harrell, Kliff Kingsbury, Patrick Mahomes II and Seth Doege. Morton now has 8,178 passing yards over 41 games as a Red Raider entering Saturday's tilt with UCF.
- With a strong finish to the season, Morton could end his Red Raider career ranked as high as fourth on Texas Tech's all-time passing chart. Seth Doege currently ranks fourth as he totaled 8,646 passing yards over his career after leading the Red Raider offense from 2009-12. His total is separated by 468 yards from Morton to this point.
- Morton has found the end zone 16 times through the air this season as he now has 65 scoring tosses over his career after throwing for two touchdowns at Kansas State and one versus BYU. He enters this weekend in fifth place all-time in program history as he needs four more touchdown passes to match Doege for fourth place in program history. Morton could potentially move into fifth on the career completion chart this weekend as he trails Potts by 17 attempts.

THE OFFENSIVE STANDARD

Texas Tech has long been considered the offensive standard since the Red Raiders moved to a passing attack in 2000. PLENTY OF DEPTH AT QUARTERBACK

- Joey McGuire has raved about his depth at quarterback since the start of preseason camp with two talented backups in Will Hammond and Mitch Griffis, who have both led teams to wins during their respective careers. Texas Tech will need that depth the rest of the year with Griffis as the primary backup to Behren Morton after Hammond was ruled out for the season.
- Hammond was in the midst of his third career start and second of the season when he suffered an injury during the second quarter of Texas Tech's victory over Oklahoma State. He had thrown for 680 yards and seven touchdowns to that point on 69-of-109 passing (63.3 percent), while also ranking as Texas Tech's third-leading rusher with 43 carries for 299 yards and five touchdowns. He is only the fifth Texas Tech quarterback to rush for five or more touchdowns in a season during the Big 12 era, joining Zebbie Lethridge (1995-97), B.J. Symons (2003), Graham Harrell (2008), Patrick Mahomes II (2015-16), and Donovan Smith (2022).
- Hammond gave McGuire more reason to brag in the Big 12 opener at Utah as the redshirt freshman completed 13-of-16 passes for 169 yards and two touchdowns in the second half in place of an injured Behren Morton. The performance earned Hammond not only Big 12 Freshman of the Week honors but also one of the league's top offensive accolades.
- Griffis is in his first season as a Red Raider after a year away from football. He previously was a captain and starter at Wake Forest where he threw for 1,957 yards and 15 touchdowns over 10 starts from 2020-23. Griffis relieved Hammond against the Cowboys, throwing for 172 yards and a touchdown on 9-of-13 attempts, while also rushing for another score.

REPLACING TECH'S ALL-TIME RUSHER

- Texas Tech has filled its void at running back this season following the graduation of Tahj Brooks, who departed as the school's all-time leading rusher after back-to-back 1,500-yard rushing seasons. He snapped the Texas Tech career rushing record previously set by Byron Hanspard, while finishing fourth all-time on the Big 12 rushing chart with 4,557 yards.
- The Red Raiders have not slowed down with the sophomore tandem of J'Koby Williams and Cameron Dickey, who have combined to outpace Texas Tech's rushing output from a year ago. Texas Tech has combined for 1,930 rushing yards and 22 touchdowns on the ground this season, a steady improvement from a year ago when the Red Raiders had 1,593 rushing yards and 17 touchdowns at the same point.
- The duo has combined for 1,469 rushing yards and 16 touchdowns this season alone, with Dickey carrying 157 times for 867 yards and 11 scores, while Williams has added 602 yards and five touchdowns on 105 carries of his own. Texas Tech is one of only five FBS programs with multiple players with 600 rushing yards this season, joining the likes of Jacksonville State, Michigan, Indiana, and Arkansas. It is only the ninth time since 1956 that Texas Tech has had multiple 600-yard rushers in the same season.
- One of the two has hit the 100-yard rushing mark in each of Texas Tech's last two games as Williams put together his second 100-yard performance this season after going for a career-high 135 yards at Kansas State. Dickey followed by rushing for 121 yards and a touchdown this past weekend in the win over BYU, his second 100-yard outing this year.

DICKEY PLACES HIS NAME IN RECORD BOOK

- Cameron Dickey placed his name in the Texas Tech record book against Kansas after rushing for 263 yards and two touchdowns in the win. It marked the fifth-highest single-game rushing total by a Red Raider in school history and the most since Byron Hanspard set the Texas Tech record with 287 yards against Baylor in 1996.
- Dickey's performance remains the most single-game rushing yards in the FBS this season and the most for a Big 12 rusher since Iowa State's Abu Sama went for 276 yards on Nov. 25, 2023, at Kansas State. As a team, the Red Raiders rushed for 372 yards, their most since racking up 453 yards on the ground against Louisiana early in the 1997 season.
- Dickey enters this weekend as the Big 12 leader for both rushing touchdowns (11) and total touchdowns (12), ranking in the top-15 nationally in both categories. He is tied for 10th in the country with his 12 total touchdowns, while his 11 rushing touchdowns are tied for 11th overall. Dickey is also the Big 12 leader and ranks 14th nationally with 867 rushing yards already this season as he is 133 yards from recording the 14th different 1,000-yard season in school history.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD

- Texas Tech enters this weekend ranked fourth in the FBS for scoring offense as the Red Raiders are averaging an impressive 42.1 points per game this season. The Red Raiders currently trail only Indiana (44.5), North Texas (44.4), and Tennessee (43.6) for average scoring.
- Since moving to a spread offense in 2000, the Red Raiders are averaging 35.9 points per game, the fourth-highest clip during that span behind only Oklahoma (38.2), Boise State (37.8) and Oregon (37.5). Texas Tech, which set a school record with 45.1 points per game in 2015, has averaged at least 30.0 points per game in all but three of those seasons.

IT STARTS UP FRONT

- Texas Tech entered the 2025 season with one of the most experienced offensive line units in the country with a combined 165 career starts between its list of newcomers and returners. In fact, Texas Tech entered the season with the fourth-most combined career starts in the FBS. The added experience has paid off as Texas Tech is the 11th-highest graded pass blocking team in the country, according to Pro Football Focus.



■ The Red Raiders have used the same starting five up front in Howard Sampson, Will Jados, Sheridan Wilson, Davion Carter, and Jacob Ponton in all 10 games this season. Texas Tech enters week 12 as one of only 12 FBS programs that have started the same offensive line in every game this year.

BIG PLAY THREATS ALL AROUND

■ When Mack Leftwich took over as Texas Tech's offensive coordinator, he stated he wanted his version of the Air Raid offense to be more 50-50 in terms of play calls, focusing heavily on running the football and capitalizing on big plays in the passing game. The Red Raiders have done just that as Texas Tech enters this week as the only team in the country to throw for at least 2,700 yards this season, while also rushing for 1,900 or more yards.

■ Texas Tech shares the FBS high with 69 offensive plays already this season that have gone for at least 20 yards. The Red Raiders have capitalized on 47 passing plays of that distance this year, which ranks second in the FBS behind only Ole Miss (52), while their 22 explosive rushing attempts are tied for the fifth-highest total in the country.

■ Texas Tech has two of the most-explosive players in the country in running backs Cameron Dickey and J'Koby Williams, who have combined for 25 plays of at least 20 yards this season. Williams leads the team with 13 explosive plays (6 rushing, 7 receiving), while Dickey has 12 of his own (10 rushing, 2 receiving), making Texas Tech one of only five FBS programs with multiple players with 12 or more on the season.

PLENTY OF OPTIONS AT RECEIVER

■ The Red Raiders have proven to be among the deepest teams at wide receiver so far this season as Texas Tech shares the FBS lead with five players with at least 300 receiving yards this season in Caleb Douglas (594), Coy Eakin (460), Reggie Virgil (435), tight end Terrance Carter Jr. (378) and running back J'Koby Williams (300). Texas Tech is also one of only three schools nationally with four players with at least four touchdown catches this season, as Douglas, Carter and Virgil share the team high with five, followed by Eakin with four.

LEFTWICH TAKES OVER OC DUTIES

■ Texas Tech has a new offensive coordinator for the first time in Joey McGuire's tenure following the departure of Zach Kittley to accept the head coaching position at Florida Atlantic. In his place, McGuire landed Mack Leftwich, who had quickly developed into one of the fastest-rising offensive playcallers in college football following successful stints at both Incarnate Word and Texas State.

■ Leftwich arrived at Texas Tech following two seasons at Texas State where he developed one of the nation's top offenses as the Bobcats led the Sun Belt Conference and ranked in the top 15 nationally for total offense and scoring during the 2023-24 campaigns. Texas State's success offensively pushed the Bobcats to their first two bowl appearances in school history and 16 combined victories.

■ Leftwich inherited a Texas State offense that ranked 110th in the country for scoring at only 21.1 points per game prior to his arrival in 2022. He quickly changed that narrative, however, as Texas State used a balanced attack to average 36.7 points

■ Texas Tech had three different players eclipse 100 yards receiving versus Oregon State in Eakin (123), Williams (116) and Carter Jr. (102). It marked the first time Texas Tech boasted three 100-yard receivers in the same game since Jakeem Grant, Bradley Marquez and DeAndre Washington did so versus Baylor in 2014.

■ Texas Tech's balance was also on display against Houston, marking the first time since last year's regular-season finale against West Virginia, where the Red Raiders featured a 300-yard passer in Behren Morton, a 100-yard rusher in J'Koby Williams and a 100-yard receiver in Caleb Douglas.

MCGUIRE ON FOURTH DOWNS

■ Much has been said about Joey McGuire's aggressive approach to fourth downs over his four seasons. Even with an evolved approach last season, Tech has been among the most active teams in the country in going for it on fourth down 131 times, which ranks as the fifth-highest total since 2022. Tech ranks third in the Big 12 and tied for 25th nationally with a 58.8 percent fourth-down percentage (77-of-131) since 2022.

■ The Red Raiders are a combined plus-161 over Joey McGuire's four seasons in the plus/minus scale, which is determined based on the result of Texas Tech's ongoing drive or points scored by an opponent on a failed attempt. Texas Tech is currently plus-34 this season.

■ Texas Tech has attempted at least one fourth-down conversion in all but six games under McGuire, with three of those in 2024 and two others this year at Utah and against Kansas.

per game in 2023 and then 36.5 points in 2024, easily its highest two single-season averages since the Bobcats joined the FBS level in 2012.

■ Leftwich coached the quarterback position in each of his five seasons at Incarnate Word, helping identify three of the best in program history in Jon Copeland (2018-19), Cameron Ward (2020-21) and Lindsey Scott Jr. (2022). Ward, the No. 1 pick in the 2025 NFL Draft after finishing his career at Miami, combined for 6,908 passing yards and 71 touchdowns during his two seasons, which remain the most in school history.

MCGUIRE ERA DRAFT PICKS

■ Five Red Raiders have heard their names called during the NFL Draft during Joey McGuire's tenure (2022-pres.). Most recently, the Las Vegas Raiders drafted offensive lineman Caleb Rogers in the third round (98th overall) in the 2025 Draft, and in the sixth round, the Cincinnati Bengals selected the Red Raiders' all-time leading rusher, Tahj Brooks. Defensive back Dadrion Taylor-Demerson went in the fourth round in 2024, followed by rush end Myles Cole going in the seventh round to Jacksonville. During Tech's first spring offseason under McGuire, the Red Raiders had only one draft pick, but it came quickly, as the Raiders made Tyree Wilson the highest-drafted defensive player in school history at No. 7 overall.

THREE-TIME SUPER BOWL CHAMPION

■ Patrick Mahomes II became the first Red Raider in school history to win three career Super Bowls after he helped lead the Kansas City Chiefs to a 25-22 overtime victory over the San Francisco 49ers in Super Bowl LVIII in 2024. It was the second-straight Super Bowl title for the Chiefs and their third in five years. Mahomes guided Kansas City to its third consecutive Super Bowl appearance last season but was denied a threepeat by the Philadelphia Eagles.

■ With his first Super Bowl win (2020) over the San Francisco 49ers, Mahomes was named Super Bowl MVP at only 24 years of age, making him the youngest player in NFL history to earn Super Bowl MVP honors.

FIRST ROUND DRAFT PICKS

■ Texas Tech currently has three first-round NFL Draft picks active heading into the 2025 NFL season. In addition to Patrick Mahomes II being the 10th overall pick by the Kansas City Chiefs in 2017, and while maybe not known for its defense in recent years, the two others include linebacker Jordyn Brooks and defensive end Tyree Wilson.

■ The Miami Dolphins selected Jordyn Brooks 27th overall in the 2020 draft and has since moved on to the Miami Dolphins. Meanwhile, Tyree Wilson was the seventh overall selection in the 2023 draft, making him the highest-drafted defensive player in program history.

COME-FROM-BEHIND WINS

The victory over Cincinnati at home on Sept. 28 marked the 27th time since 2000, and fourth time under Joey McGuire, that the Red Raiders overcame a double-digit deficit to win. Below is a listing of Tech's come-from-behind wins during that span:

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTEBOOK

KP KNOWS KICKERS

■ Texas Tech has ranked among the most-accurate teams in the country for field goals under special teams coordinator Kenny Perry, the past four seasons, despite often splitting duties between multiple kickers. This year is no different, with Stone Harrington and Upton Bellenfant combining to find the uprights on 22-of-25 attempts.

■ Texas Tech currently shares the FBS high with 22 successful field goals this season alongside Hawaii, which is a perfect 22-of-22 overall. The Red Raiders lead the country with 25 total attempts this season, one more than Arizona State in second place.

■ Texas Tech needs one more successful field goal to already match the single-season school record of 23 that was set in 2013. The Red Raiders are three attempts from matching the single-season record for tries that was set in 1998.

■ Bellenfant is a perfect 6-for-6 on field goal attempts this season, while Harrington is now 16-for-19 overall. Bellenfant has made each of his six field goals from within 40 yards, while Harrington's three misses are from 40-plus yards. He is also 5-for-8 overall from 40 yards or longer this year. Harrington moved into a tie for 10th all-time in single-season history against BYU with his 16 field goals.

■ Harrington recorded a memorable performance at Utah, where he was 2-for-2 on field goal attempts, which included a 58-yarder just before halftime. It marked the second-longest field goal in program history, trailing only the 62-yard attempt Jonathan Garibay connected on as time expired in Texas Tech's victory over Iowa State in 2021.

■ Harrington is now a two-time Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week honoree after earning the accolade following Texas Tech's wins at Houston and Kansas State. He connected on a successful 55-yarder to send the Red Raiders to halftime versus the Wildcats, making him the first player in Texas Tech history and one of four FBS players this season to find the uprights on multiple successful field goals from 55 yards or longer. He previously connected on three of Texas Tech's five field goals at Houston, a new single-game record.

■ Harrington set a Texas Tech single-game record with five successful field goals versus BYU. Harrington found the uprights from 47 yards to give Texas Tech its first points in the win and then connected again from 27, 39, 29 and 34 yards the rest of the way. His five field goals snapped the previous Texas Tech single-game record of four that was set 13 times previously. Harrington is one of only four FBS kickers this season to make five or more field goals in a game, joining the likes of Alex McPhearson of Auburn, David Olino of Illinois and Ethan Sanchez of Houston.

■ Needless to say, Perry knows the right buttons to push at the kicker position. In fact, his kickers have made 81.5 percent of their field goal attempts since he became a quality control analyst at SMU in 2020. He has already developed two of the top kickers in program history in Garcia and Trey Wolff since joining Joey McGuire's charter staff at Texas Tech in 2022.

EXPLOSIVENESS IN RETURN GAME

■ Coy Eakin has found another role in recent weeks as he's taken over as the primary punt returner. Eakin has made eight returns since moving into the role at Houston, totaling 121 yards at a 15.1 average. He had a 36-yard return at Arizona State, marking the third consecutive week he's brought back a punt of at least 30 yards. He also had a 30-yard return against Houston and another 36-yard return versus Kansas.

■ Eakin currently does not meet the minimum number of punt returns to enter the NCAA stat rankings. If he did, however, his 15.1 yards per return average would rank seventh nationally and lead the Big 12.

■ Texas Tech has also been boosted by J'Koby Williams on kick returns in recent weeks as he has four returns for 207 yards (51.8) average, which included a 99-yard return for a touchdown to kick off the Oklahoma State win. It was the first opening kickoff returned for a touchdown by a Red Raider since Keke Coutee went 92 yards versus Baylor in 2017. Williams was named the Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Week for his efforts.

BURGESS AMONG NATION'S TOP PUNTERS

■ Jack Burgess was singled out by Joey McGuire during a preseason press conference, praising him for his offseason work and a notable 5-yard distance improvement he had observed. He's been called on to punt only 34 times this season as he's averaging 43.9 yards per attempt with 17 that have been downed inside the 20.

SWAT PATROL

■ Texas Tech has blocked 14 kicks in the four seasons under Joey McGuire and special teams coordinator Kenny Perry, which leads the Big 12 Conference since 2022 and ranks tied-sixth nationally since 2022.

■ Texas Tech enters this weekend as the FBS leader with five blocked kicks already this season, all on punt returns. The Red Raiders have got their hands on a punt in two of the past three weeks as Oliver Miles III and A.J. McCarty both have two blocks this season, while Mikal Harrison-Pilot has the other.

■ A.J. McCarty got his hands on two punts against Kent State, marking the first time a Big 12 player had blocked a pair of kicks since Oklahoma State's Korie Black did so in 2023 against Central Arkansas. The performance marked the first time Texas Tech had blocked multiple kicks in the same game since the Red Raiders traveled to New Mexico in 2010.

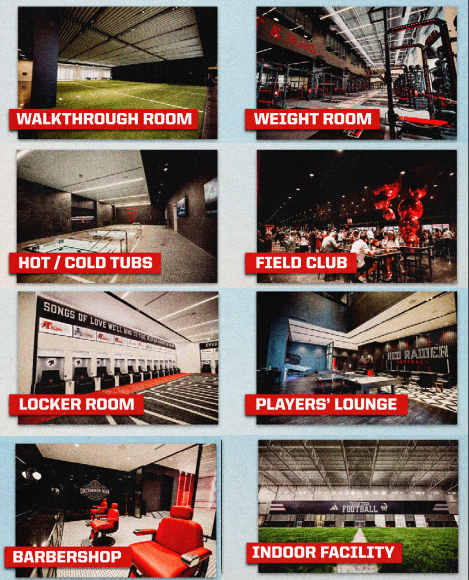
THE HOME OF TEXAS TECH FOOTBALL



SOUTH END ZONE & WOMBLE FOOTBALL CENTER

- Texas Tech moved into the South End Zone and Dustin R. Womble Football Center in 2024, which features more than 340,000 combined square feet of space with a blend of world-class modern design and technology elements with Spanish Renaissance architecture well known on the Texas Tech campus. The \$242 million project marks the largest contiguous football facility in the country, connecting the south end zone building to the Womble Football Center and the Sports Performance Center, which opened in 2017 as Texas Tech's indoor football practice facility and indoor track and field venue.
- Joey McGuire and his staff's offices are on the second floor of the south end zone building, giving them a stunning view overlooking Cody Campbell Field at Jones AT&T Stadium. The office location places McGuire and his staff steps from each position room and the skybridge connected to the Womble Football Center where offensive and defensive breakout rooms are located as well as a team meeting space and a state-of-the-art walkthrough area on the second level.
- The Womble Football Center is a two-story building that maintains its football strength and conditioning, sports medicine and equipment areas on the main level as part of the new layout. The Red Raiders' main locker room is located in the Womble Football Center, which includes space for 120-plus athletes and modern primary designs from Hollman that are fully ventilated and contain USB charging ports and DreamSeat technology for every player.
- The second floor of the Womble Football Center features a revolutionary 4,500-plus square foot multi-purpose walkthrough area designed for large-scale indoor team strategy implementation, instruction and technique evaluation only a few steps from the team meeting space and position rooms. The space boasts a 25-by-20 yard turf surface in front of a 70-foot wide by 10.5-foot high LED screen that will be the largest in both college football and the NFL for walkthrough areas. The LED screen will allow Texas Tech's coaches to simulate an opponent's formation and scheme, giving the Red Raiders real-time feedback through the advanced technology during game preparations.

- Texas Tech now boasts a 15,000-square-foot, two-level weight room, one of the largest in college football. The weight room area is located in the southwest corner of the Womble Football Center, giving the Red Raiders direct access into the Sports Performance Center and the outdoor practice fields.
- The entire facility significantly upgraded the amenities provided to the Red Raiders on a daily basis, notably with a two-story players' lounge, the "Uncommon Man" barber shop, a state-of-the-art hydrotherapy recovery suite and a primary 12,000-square-foot locker room located in the Womble Football Center.
- The Red Raiders enter Jones AT&T Stadium each gameday through the Gary Petersen Field Club, a 12,000-square-foot premium space that is among the first of its kind in college football. It is one of several new premium areas as Texas Tech has added 17 new luxury suites to go along with 500 club and loge box seats and two spacious party decks.
- The opening of the South End Zone Building to Jones AT&T Stadium officially closed The Campaign for Fearless Champions, one of the most-successful fundraising initiatives in university history that raised more than \$500 million to transform Texas Tech's athletic facilities across every sport, while also pouring resources into the student-athlete experience through scholarship endowments and the creation of the J.T. and Margaret Talkington Office of Student-Athlete Development.
- In addition to the large-scale construction, Texas Tech also enhanced its gameday experience as part of the project, adding nine LED displays through Daktronics as well as a state-of-the-art sound system by Clair Audio, a national leader in large venue audio production. The added LED displays include the main videoboard on the north end of the stadium, expanding it to 37-feet high by 136-feet wide in size with 10-millimeter pixel spacing for excellent image clarity and contrast. Texas Tech also constructed two new video displays atop its south end zone measuring 28-feet high by 48-feet wide, featuring content zoning abilities that are already a staple of the north end zone videoboard. All three new videoboards feature 10mm pixel pitch, providing every fan in the 60,000-plus seat stadium with the highest resolution display in college football.

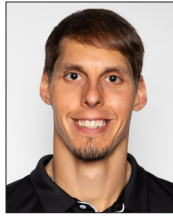

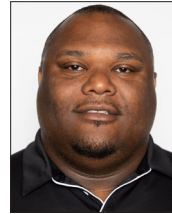
