### A DIFFERENT LEAGUE

- The Big 12 Conference placed five programs in the final College Football Playoff's Top 25 rankings. Three programs were ranked in the top 15 with Texas Tech (4th), BYU (12th) and Utah (15), who have all been featured in every CFP ranking this season. Arizona (17th) moved up eight spots in two weeks, and Houston (21st) finished with its highest ranking of the season.
- Texas Tech won the 2025 Edward Jones Big 12 Football Championship, 34-7 over BYU, to claim its first-ever Big 12 football title. The match-up between the Cougars and the Red Raiders was the Conference's first championship game between two one-loss teams since 2019.
- The sellout crowd of 85,519 at AT&T Stadium for the Edward Jones Big 12 Football Championship was the largest crowd ever at a Power Four football championship game.
- The Conference has had 12 different teams defeat an AP Top 25 opponent this season, which is the most among all FBS conferences and the most in Big 12 history.
- Texas Tech became the second team in the CFP era to win all 12 of its regular season games and its conference championship game by 20 or more points, joining the 2013 Florida State Seminoles.
- Since the beginning of the 2024 season, BYU has posted an overall record of 22-4. It marks the fourth-best record in FBS over the last two seasons.
- Utah became bowl eligible for the 18th time in 21 seasons under head coach Kyle Whittingham, who will lead the Utes in the Las Vegas Bowl in his final game as head coach.

## CONFERENCE NEWS &amp; NOTES

- The Trust & Will Holiday Bowl will feature Arizona taking on SMU, which will be a return to Snapdragon Stadium for the Wildcats who beat San Diego State in 2023 in the first game ever played at the venue.
- The Cougars will remain in Houston to play LSU in the Kinder's Texas Bowl at NRG Stadium. Houston will compete for its 10th win of the year after a five-win turnaround during the regular season, which is the fourth-largest win increase in FBS from the 2024 season.
- Arizona State is the first Big 12 team to compete in the Tony the Tiger Sun Bowl since Oklahoma in 2009. A win by the Sun Devils in El Paso would mark the program's 20th win over consecutive seasons for just the third time ever.
- Making a bowl appearance for a fifth consecutive season, TCU will face USC in the Valero Alamo Bowl on the 10th anniversary of the Horned Frogs' historic comeback victory over Oregon in the bowl game.
- Cincinnati will square off with Navy in the AutoZone Liberty Bowl in Memphis after increasing its win total in each of the past two seasons. The Bearcats have now advanced to the postseason 12 times in the last 17 seasons and own a 10-12 all-time record in bowl games.
- BYU's Bear Bachmeier is one of three FBS players this season with at least 2,300 passing yards and 10 rushing touchdowns with four or fewer interceptions.

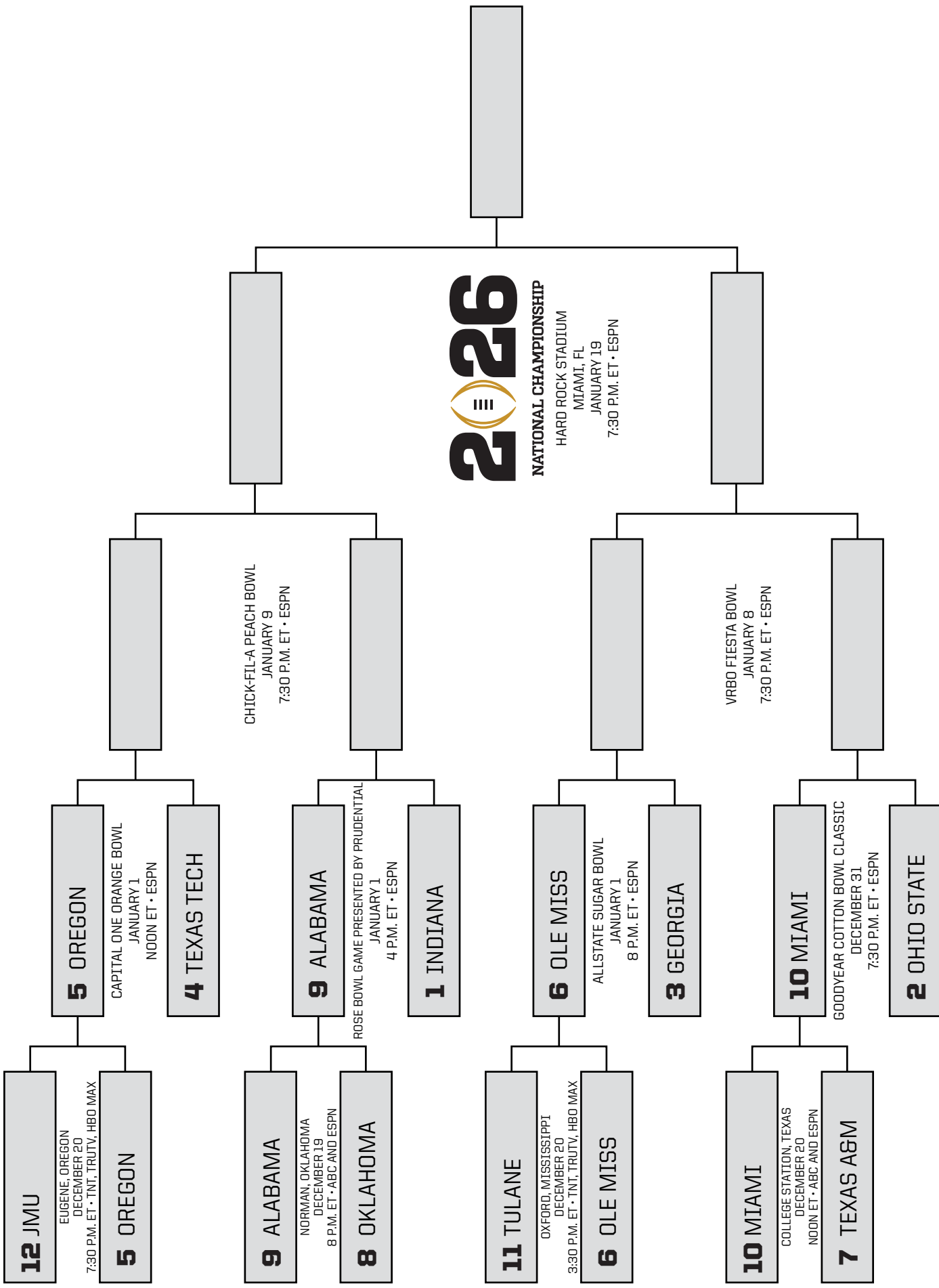

#### All-Big 12 Honors Notebook:

- LJ Martin was selected as Offensive Player of the Year after a decorated season in the backfield. He is on pace to become just the third Cougar in the last 30 years to finish in the top 10 nationally in rushing yards, sitting in 12th with 1,229 yards entering Saturday's game.
- Jacob Rodriguez is Texas Tech's first-ever Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year. The Heisman Trophy contender is the first FBS player in 20 years to have five forced fumbles, two fumble recoveries and four interceptions in the same season.
- After being selected as Big 12 Preseason Newcomer of the Year in July, Devon Dampier completed the 2025 season as the Conference's Offensive Newcomer of the Year. He was selected as the quarterback on the All-Big 12 Third Team and helped lead the Utes to a 10-win season.
- David Bailey was voted Defensive Newcomer and Defensive Lineman of the Year by the league's coaches. The senior defensive end enters Saturday's Edward Jones Big 12 Football Championship with a nation-leading 12.5 sacks, which ranks fourth most in Texas Tech history.
- After becoming the first true freshman to start at quarterback in BYU history, Bear Bachmeier led the Cougars to an 11-1 record and a berth in Saturday's Edward Jones Big 12 Football Championship. The Big 12 Offensive Freshman of the Year is the only FBS player this season with at least 2,500 passing yards, 10 rushing touchdowns with four or fewer interceptions.
- Wendell Gregory earned defensive freshman honors for Oklahoma State after starting all 12 games on the edge, tallying 27 tackles, 12 of which were for a loss, four sacks and a forced fumble. Gregory tied the Big 12 freshman record with three sacks in the Cowboys' season opener.
- The Big 12 Special Teams Player of the Year, punter Palmer Williams from Baylor, averaged 46.93 yards per punt this season. He tallied at least one punt of 50 yards or more in seven of his 12 appearances this season, and only one of his attempts resulted in a touchback.
- Spencer Fano was selected as the Offensive Lineman of the Year after helping the Utah offense pave the way to the second-most rushing yards in school history at 3,237, which ranks second in FBS. Fano was also part of a unit that only allowed 11 sacks, ranking eighth nationally.
- BYU head coach Kalani Sitake was voted the Chuck Neinas Big 12 Coach of the Year after guiding the Cougars to an 11-1 record and a Big 12 Football Championship appearance. Since the beginning of the 2024 season, BYU has posted an overall record of 22-3. It marks the fourth-best record in FBS over the last two seasons.
- Sawyer Robertson, the 2025 Big 12 Scholar-Athlete of the Year, was not only a leader on the field as one of the nation's leaders in every major passing statistic, but he also boasts a 3.72 GPA as a Marketing major. Robertson is the third player in Baylor history to receive the award and the first since Dillon Doyle in 2022. The senior finished his Baylor career with 599 completions, 7,616 passing yards and 68 career touchdowns, which all rank in the top five in program history.

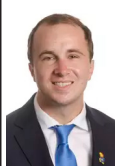

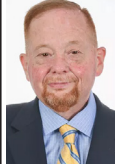
