Conference News & Notes

- The Big I2 has six non-conference wins versus Power Four opponents this season, which are the second most of any FBS conference.
- For the second time in three weeks, FOX's Big Noon Kickoff will visit a Big I2 campus on Saturday for the Texas Tech-Utah match-up in Salt Lake City. The Red Raiders and Utes are part of a Big I2 tripleheader on FOX this Saturday that will also feature Arizona State at Baylor and North Carolina at UCF.
- Texas Tech has the nation's highest scoring offense at 58.0 points per game with BYU (48.0 ppg), Utah (45.7 ppg) and TCU (45.0 ppg) giving the Big I2 four teams in the top I5.
- Big I2 QB Club: The Conference duo of Texas Tech's Behren Morton and Baylor's Sawyer Robertson have combined to tally the top three single-game passing performances in college football this season. Morton threw for an FBS-leading 464 yards versus Oregon State on Saturday, while Robertson threw for 440 against SMU and 419 versus Auburn.
- Big I2 QB Club: The Conference has three QB's ranked in the top seven nationally in passer rating: TTU's Behren Morton (2nd - 2I3.7), UC's Brendan Sorsby (5th - I94.4) and TCU's Josh Hoover (7th - I87.2).
- The Conference is home to four of the top IO scoring defenses in the nation through Week Three. The league is led by No. I BYU at I.5 points per game with Utah (8th), UCF (9th) and Arizona (IOth) rounding out the quartet.
- The Big I2 was a perfect 8-0 on Saturday, posting its second undefeated day this season. It marks the first time the Conference has posted two undefeated Saturdays in non-conference play in the same season since 20I2.

Conference News & Notes

- Half of the Big I2's I6 programs are undefeated entering Week Four.
- The Big I2 Conference will publicly provide player availability reports for all Conference games this season at BigI2Sports.com/FBReporting, beginning three days prior to kickoff.
- The Big I2 has I2 different touchdown runs of at least 50 yards this season. That is the most by any FBS conference through Week 3 of a season since the 2018 season.
- Three FBS teams have not allowed a point in the first half of games this season and all three play in the Big I2 (BYU, Texas Tech & UCF). Texas Tech (I23) is also the only FBS team with more than IOO points scored in the first half this season.
- Cincinnati's Brendan Sorsby became the first quarterback in Big I2 history to throw five touchdowns in one quarter in the Bearcats' win over Northwestern State last week.
- Against Samford, Baylor's Bryson Washington had his sixth career game with at least II5 rushing yards and multiple rushing touchdowns, which leads all active FBS players.
- Arizona's Genesis Smith and BYU's Tanner Wall represented the Big I2 on the 2025 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. Established in I992 by the College Football Association, the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team recognizes the extra efforts made off the field by college football players and student support staff who go the extra mile for those in need.

College Football Playoff (CFP) Selection Process

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is the event that crowns the national champion in college football. The CFP Selection Committee ranks the top 25 teams at the end of the season, and the I2 playoff participants consist of the five highest-ranked conference champions, plus the next seven highest-ranked teams. The four highest ranked conference champions will be seeded one through four and receive a first-round bye. The schools seeded five through eight will host those seeded nine through I2 in first-round games. The quarterfinals and semifinals rotate annually among six bowl games – the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, Vrbo Fiesta Bowl, Capital One Orange Bowl, Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl Game presented by Prudential and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. This year's quarterfinals will take place on December 31, 2025, and January 1, 2026, while the semifinals will be January 8-9, 2026. The College Football Playoff National Championship will be Monday, January 19, 2026, at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami.
