Bye Week: #25/24 Arizona State and Utah

- BYU. Houston, Iowa State and Texas Tech give the Big I2 four teams with 4-0 starts to the season for the first time since 2015.
- The Big I2 has four of the 20 undefeated FBS programs entering Week Six, tied for the second most of any conference.
- BYU and Iowa State are two of nine FBS teams with active win streaks of six or more victories.
- The Big I2 had three Conference games decided by three or fewer points in Week Five, one shy of its single-week record of four in Week 10 of the 2023 season.
- Big I2 QB Club: Five Big I2 signal callers rank in the top 20 in FBS in passing touchdowns, which ties for the most of any conference. Baylor's Sawyer Robertson (first), KU's Jalon Daniels (tied for second), Utah's Devon Dampier (tied for ninth), TCU's Josh Hoover (tied for ninth) and TTU's Behren Morton (tied for ninth) have combined to throw 66 touchdowns.
- Big I2 QB Club: Four of the IO Power Four QB's with 350 yards or more of total offense in Week Five were KU's Jalon Daniels (first - 500 yards), UC's Brendan Sorsby (second - 440 yards), Baylor's Sawyer Robertson (fifth - 399 yards), and ASU's Sam Leavitt (10th - 353 yards).
- Arizona State's eight consecutive wins over Big I2 opponents, including the 2024 Big I2 Football Championship, mark the longest such streak among all Power Four programs.
- Big I2 defenses have tallied 46 interceptions this season, which are the most of any FBS conference.

Conference News & Notes

- Utah's John Henry Daley's six-and-a-half sacks lead the nation and are one-and-a-half sacks more than second place.
- The Big I2 Conference will publicly provide player availability reports for all Conference games this season at BigI2Sports.com/FBReporting, beginning three days prior to kickoff.
- Baylor, Cincinnati, Kansas and Utah all eclipsed 525 vards of offense last week, no other FBS conference had more than one program achieve the feat.
- Jordyn Tyson has caught a touchdown in all five games this year, the longest streak by an Arizona State player to begin a season since Keith Poole in 1996 (six). The last Big I2 player with a longer such streak was Oklahoma's CeeDee Lamb in 2019 (six).
- Texas Tech has a +130 first-half point differential this season (133-3), by far the best in the FBS (Oregon is second at + 104). The last Big I2 team to be this dominant in the first half through four games of a season was Baylor in 2014 (+140).
- Arizona's Genesis Smith and BYU's Tanner Wall represented the Big I2 on the 2025 Allstate AFCA Good Works Team. Established in 1992 by the College Football Association, the Allstate AFCA Good Works Team recognizes the extra efforts made off the field by college football players and student support staff who go the extra mile for those in need.

College Football Playoff (CFP) Selection Process

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is the event that crowns the national champion in college football. The CFP Selection Committee ranks the top 25 teams at the end of the season, and the I2 playoff participants consist of the five highest-ranked conference champions, plus the next seven highest-ranked teams. The four highest ranked conference champions will be seeded one through four and receive a first-round bye. The schools seeded five through eight will host those seeded nine through I2 in first-round games. The quarterfinals and semifinals rotate annually among six bowl games – the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, Vrbo Fiesta Bowl, Capital One Orange Bowl, Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl Game presented by Prudential and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. This year's quarterfinals will take place on December 3I, 2025, and January I, 2026, while the semifinals will be January 8-9, 2026. The College Football Playoff National Championship will be Monday, January 19, 2026, at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami.
