CONFERENCE NEWS & NOTES

- Week Two will see the Big 12 play six games against Power 4 opponents; two contests apiece against the ACC, Big Ten and SEC.
- The Big 12 Conference will welcome FOX's Big Noon Kickoff to the campus of Iowa State for Saturday's rivalry game versus Iowa.
- Big 12 teams went 8-0 on Saturday, winning by an average of 38.5 points. It's the only time in the last 40 years that any FBS conference has gone undefeated, in eight or more games, with an average margin of victory of 35+ points on any single day.
- The Big 12 is a combined 63-0 against FCS programs since the start of 2019. It is the only FBS conference to be undefeated against FCS schools during that time.
- Half of the top 10 winningest active coaches in FBS are from the Big 12; Willie Fritz (third), Rich Rodriguez (fifth), Mike Gundy (seventh), Lance Leipold (seventh) and Kyle Whittingham (ninth).
- Big 12 QB Club: Baylor's Sawyer Robertson led all FBS quarterbacks with 419 passing yards in Week One while ISU's Rocco Becht leads the FBS this season with a 261.26 passer rating.
- Big 12 QB Club: The Big 12 continues to lead all FBS conferences in passing yards (4,255), passing touchdowns (42) and touchdown-to-interception ratio (14.0).
- The Big 12 is home to the only two programs who play 11 games against Power 4 opponents this season; Baylor and TCU.
- The Big 12 won two non-conference games by 30 points or more over major conference opponents in the same week for the first time since 1999.

CONFERENCE NEWS & NOTES

- BYU (69) and Texas Tech (67) had two of the nation's three highest point totals last week.
- Four of the seven FBS teams with 600+ yards of total offense in Week One are from the Big 12; Kansas (631), West Virginia (625), Texas Tech (608) and BYU (606).
- The Big 12 Conference will publicly provide player availability reports for all Conference games this season at Big12Sports.com/FBReporting, beginning three days prior to kickoff.
- Big 12 players have combined to average 7.8 scrimmage yards per touch this season, the best mark of any conference (excludes Independents).
- Four Conference programs were ranked in this week's AP Top 25 with four more receiving votes, including BYU as the top team receiving votes.
- The Big 12's offensive performances in Week One also included explosive plays on the ground. Six Big 12 teams ranked in the top 12 nationally in running plays of 10 or more yards, led by national leader BYU with 17. Kansas, West Virginia, K-State, Texas Tech and Iowa State rounded out the Conference members in the top 12.
- The Conference enters its second year of its partnership with TuneIn, the world's leader in live audio, for Big 12 Radio. The 24/7 Conference-branded audio station, is streaming to fans across the United States. The station includes Big 12 weekday sports talk, extensive Saturday game-day coverage, Big 12 school content and music programming. Additionally, listeners can access a 'Game of The Week' featuring gameday coverage from their Big 12 school's local play-by-play broadcast team.

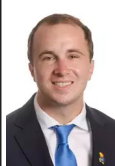

College Football Playoff (CFP) Selection Process

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is the event that crowns the national champion in college football. The CFP Selection Committee ranks the top 25 teams at the end of the season, and the 12 playoff participants consist of the five highest-ranked conference champions, plus the next seven highest-ranked teams. The four highest ranked conference champions will be seeded one through four and receive a first-round bye. The schools seeded five through eight will host those seeded nine through 12 in first-round games. The quarterfinals and semifinals rotate annually among six bowl games – the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, Vrbo Fiesta Bowl, Capital One Orange Bowl, Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl Game presented by Prudential and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. This year's quarterfinals will take place on December 31, 2025, and January 1, 2026, while the semifinals will be January 8-9, 2026. The College Football Playoff National Championship will be Monday, January 19, 2026, at Hard Rock Stadium in Miami.
