




PREVIOUSLY IN TEXAS TECH SOFTBALL

The Highlights:

- The Red Raiders home opening weekend was one for the record books. Tech averaged over 1,600 fans each game while tying the record for runs in a game (24) twice and breaking the record for hits (24), home runs (8) and RBI (24) in a game. Tech also threw the first consecutive no-hitters in program history thanks to Terry and Canady.



- Mihyia Davis is having an All-American season through the first part of the season. The senior outfielder is hitting .511 from the leadoff spot and also leads the country in stolen bases (25) and is second in hits (45) and runs (42) while making spectacular plays in center field. Davis also recorded her first multi-homer game this past weekend.



- Kaitlyn "KT" Terry has been arguably the team's best player through the first 26 games of the season. She leads the team with a .574 batting average, which is also second best in the country, and also has a 1.32 ERA which is third best in the Big 12. Terry has found her role in the two-hole for Tech's offense.



- NiJaree Canady was named the Big 12 pitcher in back-to-back weeks after her second no-hitter of the season. Canady is now the first Red Raider to throw three no-hitters in their career and has allowed just three hits and one run (unearned) in her last 25.1 innings pitched. Canady also has 4 shutouts to her credit, 4th most in the NCAA and is 45 K's away from 1,000 for her career.



- The offense has been on fire. Tech is top 5 in the country in batting average (.415), doubles (58), hits (270), homers (53), on-base percentage (.499), RBI (257), scoring (10.50 runs per game), slugging (.773), runs (273) and stolen bases (72).

ADDITIONAL HEADLINES

NAME A BETTER DUO:

The duo of NiJaree Canady and Kaitlyn Terry has been second to none this season. The stars threw an exclamation point on this claim when they threw back-to-back no-hitters and were named the Big 12 Pitcher and Player of the Week, respectively, after dominating performances in the Jeannine McHaney Memorial Classic.

Terry is batting .574 in 61 at-bats with an ERA of 1.33 in 53.0 innings pitched with an 11-0 record in the circle. No other two-way player is close to her batting average and only one has a better ERA.

After resting during the summer and most of the fall, Canady has looked back to form. The senior's velocity is ramping up and she allowed just three hits in last 25.1 innings pitched and is 45 strikeouts away from 1,000. Her highlight performance was a 13-strikeout performance against TAMU-CC in which she threw the second no-hitter of her Texas Tech career.

BACK TO HER OLD WAYS:

Mihyia Davis has been running and gunning the past few weeks and now leads the country in stolen bases with 25. The senior won the NFCA Golden Spikes award her freshman season and has had 20+ stolen bases each of her last four years. She finished with 27 last year, good for third most in program history for a single season and her 25 so far this year is already sixth in program history.

DOUBLES, HOMERS AND RBI - OH MY:

Mia Williams currently leads the team in doubles (11), RBI (39) and tied for the lead in homers (10). Her doubles number is sixth most in the country and has 76 total bases on the season, putting her top 10 in the country and first in the Big 12.

1's AND 2's:

Tech was ranked No. 2 in the country for the third straight week and saw Taylor Pannell, NiJaree Canady and Kaitlyn Terry receive a No. 2 ranking in their respective positions according to Softball America.

Tech ranks No. 1 in the Big 12 in several categories (see the table to the left) and Mia Williams was ranked the No. 1 second baseman in the country.

.350 or better, thanks:

Every Red Raider who has taken 45+ at bats is hitting over .350 on the season. More specifically, hitting .367 or better. Last season, Tech had six players finish with a batting average above .300 - the current pace the Red Raiders are hitting at is hard to sustain for a full season, but not impossible.

THE FORGOTTEN ARM:

Lefty Samantha Lincoln has been as good as anyone on the pitching staff so far this season. She missed a few starts this past weekend trying to get healthy, but has a 1.81 ERA and has 25 strikeouts to just five walks while holding opponents to a .177 batting average. The Sophomore is a perfect 4-0 on the season and will look to continue to be a big role in this pitching staff with conference play arriving.

ALL THREE PHASES:

The Red Raiders are not just one part of the game, they are tops in all three phases. Tech ranks No. 3 in scoring (10.50), No. 4 in ERA (1.34) and No. 3 in the Big 12 in fielding percentage (.972).

RUN-RULE WINS & SHUTOUTS:

The Red Raiders are already up to 17 run-rule victories this season. The program record is 20 and they had 14 all of last season.

A new program record for shutouts in a season was set last year as Tech had 26 shutout victories. They have nine already this season.

POWER:

Gerry Glasco loves the long ball and made that a point of emphasis when putting together the 2026 roster. Well he did a good job as Tech has hit 53 home runs and rank No. 5 in the country and No. 1 in the Big 12. Tech hit just 60 all of last season and are on pace to break the program record of 74 in season set in 2023.

NEW DIGS:

Rocky Johnson Field got a face lift this offseason that includes new shading, new speakers, updated outfield wall padding and new lights. The project helps enhance the fan experience greatly and make the ball park look bigger and better.

PRO IN THE DUGOUT:

Gerry Glasco has experience coaching in the pro leagues, but assistant coach Kayla Kowalik is the pro on the team. An All-American at Kentucky, Kowalik has been stellar in the new AUSL for the Blaze. She was the 2025 AUSL All-Star Cup Champion and hit an otherworldly .452 in 9 games of the All-Star Cup.

THE LUBBOCK NATIVE:

This past weekend, Lubbock-native Makayla Garcia (the Red Raider who stole home against UCLA) recorded her first two hits of the season against TAMU-CC. Her first was a two-run home run, the first homer of her career and the long ball that tied the program record for home runs in a game. Her second hit was a double which would mark the 23rd hit of the day and break the program record for hits in a game. Garcia's legend in Lubbock is well known and continues to grow.

LINEUP COMBINATIONS:

Gerry Glasco has used 23 different lineups in 26 different games this season after using 57 different lineups in 68 different games last season.

The NiJa Effect

Entering the 2025 season, Texas Tech softball had been to six regionals and never advanced beyond that. It was a program that seemed to be in a constant state of rebuild with a few good seasons here and there but never much consistency.

Then comes NiJaree Canady. The two-time NFCA National Pitcher of the Year and 2025 Big 12 Pitcher of the Year completely flipped the trajectory of the program in just one season. Yes, she had help and has a great coaching staff around her, but the influence on the sport of softball that she's had in Lubbock and around the country is unmatched.

On road trips, Canady would be asked for autographs by opposing team fans, kids on spring break who traveled to that game to watch her play and people - young and old - sporting her jersey. Before 2025, Texas Tech softball had a few loyal fans, but not anything crazy. Now, she can't walk five feet without someone asking for a picture or autograph and she handles it all with grace, composure and is humble as can be.



GERRY GLASCO

HEAD COACH · 2nd SEASON · Illinois '80 · Crab Orchard, Illinois

Gerry Glasco was named the head coach of the Texas Tech Softball program on Thursday, June 20, 2024.

In Glasco's first season in Lubbock he led Tech to its most successful season ever. The Red Raiders finished with a 54-14 record, the most wins in a single season, while hosting their first ever Regional, advancing to the Super Regional round for the first time ever and eventually making their first Women's College World Series appearance where they finished as National Runners-Up. Glasco also led Tech to its first ever Big 12 Regular Season Title and Postseason Championship in his inaugural season.

The team broke 22 program records during the historic 2025 season and had 10 players earn All-Big 12 honors, the most in program history. Among those student-athletes was Big 12 and National Pitcher of the Year NiJaree Canady who became the first 1st Team All-American in Red Raider softball history. Glasco also earned Big 12 Coach of the Year honors after going 20-4 in conference play, also a program best.

Known for his great recruiting, Glasco has brought in the No. 1 transfer portal class in the country ahead of the 2025 season and again this past summer ahead of the 2026 season.

Glasco previously led the Louisiana softball program where he built the Ragin' Cajuns into a perennial top-25 team that boasted an impressive .773 winning percentage (300-88) during his seven-year tenure. Louisiana captured five Sun Belt Conference regular-season titles under Glasco and was selected to an NCAA Regional in all six eligible seasons (excludes COVID-shortened 2020 campaign), advancing to the Super Regional round in 2023.

Glasco, who coached the previous nine seasons prior to Louisiana in the Southeastern Conference, is considered one of the nation's top offensive coaches and recruiters. He helped lead Georgia to a pair of final four finishes at the Women's College World Series, assisted in Texas A&M's rise in the SEC culminating with a trip to Oklahoma City in 2017 and served as associate head coach at Auburn in fall 2017.

Glasco's résumé includes achievements at all levels of softball. He has coached 17 All-Americans, 29 All-SEC honorees, 37 All-Sun Belt performers, 10 All-Big 12 performers and 52 All-Region selections. As a collegiate coach, he has been a part of 12 NCAA Tournament appearances, six NCAA Super Regionals and three Women's College World Series. He also engineered three championships in the National Pro Fastpitch League, most recently in 2019 with USSSA Pride, and a national championship at the 18U level in travel ball. During his tenure at Louisiana, the Ragin' Cajuns have continued their streak of consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances and 40-win seasons, both streaks at 24 straight seasons following the 2023 season.

Glasco's most momentous occasion to date with Louisiana occurred in the 2023 season when the Ragin' Cajuns captured a berth into the NCAA Super Regional round - realizing the accomplishment for the first time in his tenure - following a Championship Sunday doubleheader sweep of rival LSU at Tiger Park in Baton Rouge.

He directed one of the program's best seasons ever in 2019 as Louisiana recorded its first 50-win season since 2012 (with only four defeats entering NCAA postseason play), swept the Sun Belt Conference's regular season and tournament championships, boasted a Top 10 national ranking for 10 consecutive weeks leading up to postseason play, turned in only the second undefeated Sun Belt mark in program and conference history, established a school-record 29-game win streak and posted a Top 10 national finish in nine statistical categories.

Glasco and his staff continued building momentum in the COVID-19 shortened 2020 season, leading the program to its first Top 10 finish in the major national polls since 2014. The Ragin' Cajuns scored ranked wins over Louisiana State, Oklahoma State, Texas and Florida (twice) in addition to two victories over Ole Miss, leading the squad to a No. 1 ranking in the lone RPI ranking of the year.

During the 2021 season, Louisiana reached 40 wins in the regular season by winning 25 of the final 29 games. Glasco steered the squad to repeat honors as Sun Belt regular season and tournament champions highlighted by an 11-1 record, regular season and tournament combined, against the league's other three NCAA Tournament participants (Texas State, Troy and South Alabama). The Ragin' Cajuns advanced to Championship Sunday of an NCAA Regional for the third time under Glasco's watch, extending the program's streak of reaching the final round of a regional to 13 consecutive appearances.

The 2022 season marked the debut of Glasco's 2021 recruiting class, which was ranked No. 1 by Extra Inning Softball and included the No. 4-rated recruit in pitcher Sam Landry and the No. 15-ranked prospect in Louisiana native Maddie Hayden. Glasco directed and mentored a lineup that featured at most two upperclassmen and as many as five freshmen, and developed them into a championship and NCAA Tournament team - despite the youthfulness, advancing to Championship Sunday of the NCAA Clemson Regional.

The Ragin' Cajuns continued to thrive under Glasco's guidance in 2022, placing a conference-high nine players on the All-Sun Belt team, recording a program-record .351 season batting average and generating the most home runs in Glasco's tenure (82).

During the 2023 season, Louisiana collected its fourth consecutive Sun Belt Conference regular season and tournament championships under Glasco's guidance, posted the program's first 50-win season since 2019 (50-16, 22-2 SBC) and advanced to the Super Regional round of the NCAA Tournament. The Ragin' Cajuns also continued impressive streaks of consecutive Sun Belt series won (now 81 straight) and consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances (now 24 straight) and attained a No. 9 RPI rating and Top 20 rankings across all major national polls.

Louisiana ended the regular season with 43 wins against a Top-10 rated strength of schedule (which finished at No. 7) facing Top 100 RPI competition in 38 out of 56 games overall and captured marquee road wins over UCF (no-hitter), LSU and Florida (three-hit shutout). Individually, Karly Heath and Mihya Davis earned NFCA All-American accolades and Davis was awarded the NFCA's Golden Shoe Award after leading the D1 softball ranks with 52 stolen bases.

The Crab Orchard, Illinois, native has raised the level of offensive production of each team he's been associated with since his collegiate coaching career began. He coached at Georgia from 2009-2014 and at Texas A&M from 2015-2017.

Glasco helped Georgia to a 282-92 mark as the team hovered near the top of the NCAA and SEC rankings in almost all offensive categories and set over 20 team offensive records during his six-year stay. The Bulldogs belted 85 home runs his first season (up from 26 the previous season) and later led the SEC in home runs during his final two seasons.

Georgia captured the program's first SEC Tournament championship (2014) and twice reached the final four of the Women's College World Series (2009, 2010) with Glasco on staff.

In three seasons at Texas A&M, Glasco restructured the offense and helped guide the Aggies' rise to the top of the SEC, culminating with a third-place finish in 2017. His clubs tallied 465 extra-base hits, including 213 home runs, and scored 6.1 runs per game. In his final two seasons, the Aggies were the SEC's home run leaders in regular season conference play.

Eight offensive records were broken under Glasco's watch at Texas A&M, highlighted by the 2016 season when the Aggies broke school records for runs scored (429); on base percentage (.437); RBI (401); total bases (852); and OPS (.988).

Glasco spent seven seasons as the assistant softball coach at Johnston City (Illinois) High School before taking his first collegiate job at Georgia. In his last season, he led the junior high team to a state title.

During his time at Johnston City High, Glasco founded the Illinois Southern Force Softball organization and served as the head coach of the Southern Force Gold from 2001-2008. The team finished in the Top 20 four times at ASA Gold Nationals and won the 2004 18U Gold National Championship. That year, Glasco and his staff were named the National Coaching Staff of the Year by the NFCA for travel softball.

Glasco and wife Vickie have three daughters who have shared their father's passion for the sport: Tara (Archibald), who is currently the associate head coach for him here at Texas Tech, Erin and the late-Geri Ann who was named Gatorade National Player of the Year her senior year of high school, SEC Freshman of the Year and played both at Georgia and Oregon.

Glasco is a 1976 graduate of Crab Orchard (Illinois) High School, where he lettered in baseball and basketball. He graduated from the University of Illinois with a bachelor's degree in agricultural economics in 1980.


