**FWAA SUPER 11 AWARD:** The Texas Tech Athletics Communications office was honored this summer by the Football Writers Association of America as one of its 2025 Super 11 Award recipients. The Super 11 Award is presented annually to the best-performing College Sports Communicators departments in the NCAA Division I Football Bowl Subdivision. This is the third time since the FWAA unveiled the award in January of 2009 and the second time in as many years that Texas Tech has been recognized as the university previously claimed the award in 2013. 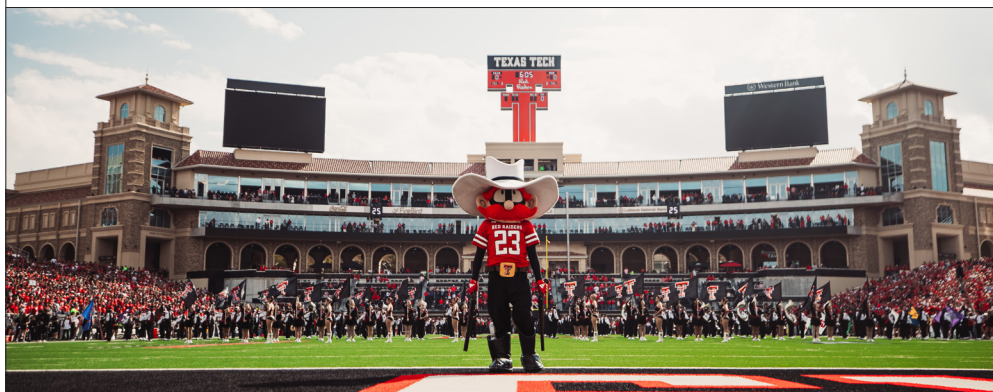

## SOUTH END ZONE & WOMBLE FOOTBALL CENTER



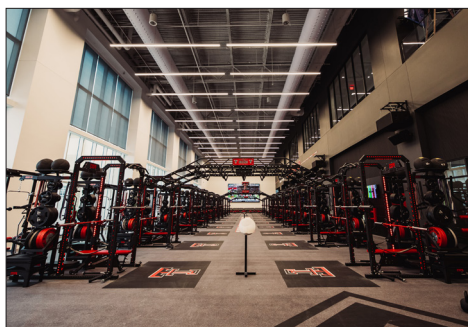
### DUSTIN R. WOMBLE FOOTBALL CENTER, THE NATION'S LARGEST CONTIGUOUS FOOTBALL FACILITY

Texas Tech officially opened the South End Zone and Dustin R. Womble Football Center project during the 2024 season, featuring more than 340,000 combined square feet of space with a blend of world-class modern design and technology elements with Spanish Renaissance architecture well known to Texas Tech supporters. The \$242 million project marks the largest contiguous football facility in the country, connecting the South End Zone Building to the Womble Football Center and the Sports Performance Center, which opened in 2017 as Texas Tech's indoor football practice facility and indoor track and field venue.



### UNMATCHED PLAYER AMENITIES

The entire facility significantly upgraded the amenities provided to the Red Raiders on a daily basis, notably with a two-story players' lounge, the "Uncommon Man" barber shop, a state-of-the-art hydrotherapy recovery suite and a primary 12,000-square-foot locker room located in the Womble Football Center. Texas Tech also maintains an 85-player gameday locker room in the south end zone located not far from a gameday lounge for recruits during pregame and then letterwinners after kickoff. The Red Raiders' main locker room is located in the Womble Football Center, which includes space for 120-plus athletes and modern primary designs from Hollman that are fully ventilated and contain USB charging ports and DreamSeat technology. The Womble Football Center also features a letterwinners lounge, giving former players direct access to the facility to watch practice from a balcony overlooking the outdoor practice fields.



### PLAYER DEVELOPMENT & RECOVERY

- The second floor of the Womble Football Center features the revolutionary 4,500-plus square foot multi-purpose Patrick Mahomes II Walkthrough Area designed for large-scale indoor team strategy implementation, instruction and technique evaluation only a few steps from the team meeting space and position rooms. The space includes a 25-by-20 yard turf surface in front of a 70-foot wide by 10.5-foot high LED screen that is the largest in both college football and the NFL for walkthrough areas. The LED screen will allow Texas Tech's coaches to simulate an opponent's formation and scheme, giving the Red Raiders real-time feedback through advanced technology during game preparations on the turf field.
- Texas Tech now boasts a 15,000-square-foot, two-level weight room, one of the largest in college football. The weight room area is located in the southwest corner of the Womble Football Center, giving the Red Raiders direct access into the Sports Performance Center and the outdoor practice fields.
- Joey McGuire and his staff moved into their new coaches' offices on the second floor of the South End Zone Building, giving them a stunning view overlooking Cody Campbell Field at Galaxy Stadium. The office location places McGuire and his staff steps from each position room and the skybridge connected to the Womble Football Center where offensive and defensive breakout rooms are located as well as a team meeting space and the state-of-the-art Patrick Mahomes II Walkthrough Area on the second level.
- Since his arrival, Joey McGuire has stressed the need for recovery. The Red Raiders have just that now with a Cryotherapy machine, red-light technology devices and multiple sleep deprivation and hydrotherapy beds located both in a state-of-the-art training room and in a recovery room located just off the locker room. Texas Tech also utilizes five plunge pools, two in a spa area with direct access to the locker room and three others in the sports medicine area. The sports medicine area also includes it's own doctors wing for team physicians.

## GARY PETERSEN FIELD CLUB

The Red Raiders enter Galaxy Stadium each gameday through the Gary Petersen Field Club, a 12,000-square-foot premium space that is among the first of its kind in college football. It is one of several new premium areas as Texas Tech has added 17 new luxury suites to go along with 500 club and lodge box seats and two spacious party decks. Texas Tech now boasts 102 premium suites throughout Galaxy Stadium to go along with more than 2,500 club and lodge box seat options. The Red Raiders now enter behind the south goal post prior to kickoff each Saturday, trailing the Masked Rider in one of college football's greatest traditions. Fans in the field club get a premium look at this each gameday as the Red Raiders will touch the iconic Masked Rider saddle before being welcomed by a line of supporters moments before kickoff.



## NEW TECHNOLOGY

In addition to the large-scale construction, Texas Tech also enhanced its gameday experience as part of the project, adding nine LED displays through Daktronics as well as a state-of-the-art sound system by Clair Audio, a national leader in large venue audio production. The added LED displays include the main videoboard on the north end of the stadium, expanding it to 37-feet high by 136-feet wide in size with 10-millimeter pixel spacing for excellent image clarity and contrast. Texas Tech also constructed two new video displays atop its South End Zone Building measuring 28-feet high by 48-feet wide, featuring content zoning abilities that are already a staple of the north end zone videoboard. All three new videoboards feature 10mm pixel pitch, providing every fan in the 60,000-plus seat stadium with the highest resolution display in college football.

## MORE THAN \$500 MILLION RAISED

The South End Zone Building and Womble Football Center closed The Campaign for Fearless Champions, one of the most-successful fundraising initiatives in university history that raised more than \$500 million to transform Texas Tech's athletic facilities across every sport, while also pouring resources into the student-athlete experience through scholarship endowments and the creation of the J.T. and Margaret Talkington Office of Student-Athlete Development.



## THE BEST GAMEDAY EXPERIENCE

Texas Tech previously enhanced the atmosphere inside Galaxy Stadium prior to the 2023 season with a new Musco LED lighting system to go along with a state-of-the-art playing surface from Hellas. The lighting system provides Texas Tech with the ability to utilize choreographed patterns designed to music during its pregame entertainment, in-between quarters and after touchdowns. The lighting system has already greatly enhanced the in-game fan experience, especially under the Galaxy Stadium lights where the Red Raiders have traditionally boasted one of the nation's top homefield advantages.

## THE ICONIC DOUBLE T SCOREBOARD

The 2024 season marked the return of the iconic Double T scoreboard, a landmark on the Texas Tech campus since 1978. As part of the project, Texas Tech constructed a new Double T scoreboard atop the new South End Zone Building, using the same dimensions as its previous model but placing it at a much higher elevation. The new Double T Scoreboard is now 115 feet off the ground at its peak, giving students and alumni stunning views at various locations throughout campus.

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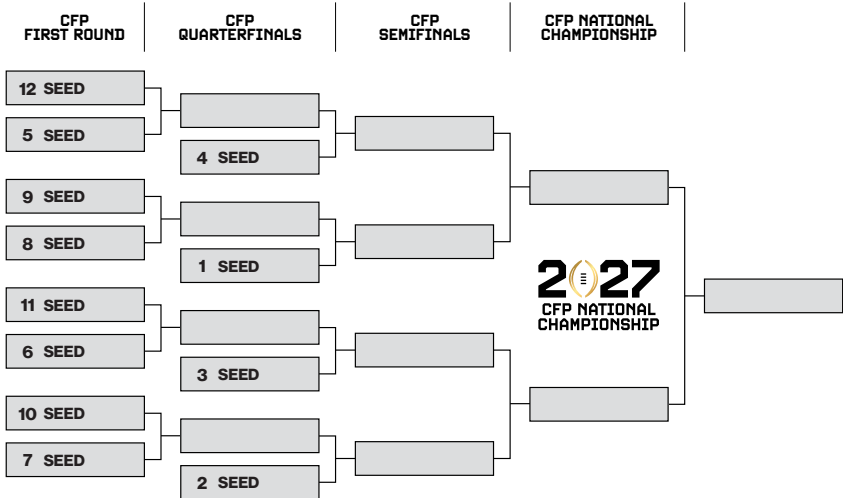
COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF, BOWL BREAKDOWN

COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF SELECTION PROCESS

The College Football Playoff (CFP) is the competition that crowns the true national champion in college football. The format of the CFP is built on a 12-team bracket. The 12 participating schools are the conference champions from the Atlantic Coast Conference, Big Ten Conference, Big 12 Conference, Southeastern Conference and the highest-ranked team from the American, Conference USA, Mid-American Conference, Mountain West, Pac-12 Conference and Sun Belt Conference, along with the next seven highest-ranked teams. The University of Notre Dame will be included in the playoff if it is ranked among the top 12 teams in the final CFP rankings. Four CFP First-Round games are played on host campuses, followed by the CFP Quarterfinals and CFP Semifinals, which rotate annually among six bowl games – the Goodyear Cotton Bowl Classic, Vrbo Fiesta Bowl, Capital One Orange Bowl, Chick-fil-A Peach Bowl, Rose Bowl Game presented by Prudential and the Allstate Sugar Bowl. The CFP National Championship will be on Monday, January 25, 2027, at Allegiant Stadium in Las Vegas, Nevada. For additional information on the CFP, visit CollegeFootballPlayoff.com.
