LUBBOCK, Texas (AP) — Behren Morton threw for 201 yards and four touchdowns before exiting the game following a sack in the second quarter, and No. 23 Texas Tech routed overmatched FCS member Arkansas-Pine Bluff 67-7 in the opener for both teams Saturday night.

The Red Raiders led 47-0 at halftime coming off their first preseason Top 25 ranking since 2008, and the game was shortened to a pair of 8-minute quarters following a 90-minute weather delay that hit at the break.

Morton came up limping after Tayvon Hardwick came off the edge and hit Morton low, tweaking the senior's lower right leg. Hardwick was penalized for roughing the passer.

Morton took the next snap and handed off to J'Koby Williams, who ran 5 yards for a TD and a 37-0 lead.

He was still in uniform when he returned to the sideline before halftime, and coach Joey McGuire said in a radio interview at the break that Morton was OK. He completed 16 of 18 passes.

Will Hammond replaced Morton and led two more scoring drives as the Red Raiders put up points all eight times they had the ball before halftime with six touchdowns and two field goals.

Hammond ran 64 yards for a touchdown on the fifth play of the second half and threw for a score. Terrance Carter had two TD catches.

UAPB avoided the shutout on Christian Peters' 7-yard touchdown pass to Ellis Stewart in the fourth quarter. The Golden Lions were outgained 392-52 in the first half, when Peters was 9 of 19 for 39 yards with an interception and their leading rusher was Za'Marion Webber with 9 yards on eight carries.

The game duration was 4:43 after experiencing a 1-hour, 28-minute lightning delay that began during halftime. When play resumed at 10:10 p.m., the two teams played an eight-minute third quarter and an eight-minute fourth quarter.

Texas Tech's 67 points were the 10th-most points scored all-time in a single game. It was the most points scored in a game since the Red Raiders scored 66 versus North Texas in 2024.

LUBBOCK, Texas (AP) — Behren Morton threw for three touchdowns, big defensive tackle Skyler Gill-Howard returned an interception 55 yards for a score and No. 24 Texas Tech blew out another overmatched opponent, beating Kent State 62-14 on Saturday.

Cameron Dickey had two rushing TDs and Reggie Virgil added two receiving scores as the Red Raiders (2-0) led 48-0 at halftime, one point better than the margin at the break a week ago in a 67-7 victory over FCS member Arkansas-Pine Bluff.

Morton started Saturday and was 18 of 26 for 258 yards while playing only the first half.

Dru DeShields threw for a touchdown and ran for a score in the fourth quarter for the Golden Flashes (1-1), who ended a 21-game losing streak with a 21-17 victory over Merrimack in their opener.

Kent State had negative total yards until Gavin Garcia ran 38 yards on a screen pass on its sixth possession early in the second quarter. Two plays later, Gill-Howard took his interception the other way for a 38-0 lead.

The 290-pounder from Northern Illinois, part of Texas Tech's highly touted transfer class, made the catch behind the line of scrimmage and scored untouched after Lee Hunter applied quick pressure and A.J. Holmes Jr. tipped the pass.

The Red Raiders scored on their first 14 possessions of the season, all 11 against Arkansas-Pine Bluff and the first three against Kent State. Jack Burgess' first punt this year came late in the first quarter.

Third-string running back Adam Hill was the first to 100 yards rushing for the Red Raiders this season. He had 127 yards on 16 carries, all in the second half. In fact, all 206 of his yards have come after halftime, with the outcome no longer in doubt. The blowouts have limited the action for the top two backs, Dickey and J'Koby Williams.

LUBBOCK, Texas (AP) – Behren Morton threw for 464 yards and four touchdowns, J'Koby Williams had a scoring catch and a run and No. 21 Texas Tech beat Oregon State 45-14 on Saturday night in a weather-delayed game. Play was stopped for 2 1/2 hours just 2 1/2 minutes into the game.

Cameron Dickey added a short TD run to help the Red Raiders improve to 3-0 for the first time in coach Joey McGuire's four seasons.

Oregon State's Maalik Murphy threw touchdown passes in the waning minutes to Bryce Caufield and Karson Boschma. The Beavers are 0-3 for the first time since 2011.

Morton's TD passes were 38 yards to Coy Eakin, 61 yards to Caleb Douglas, 30 yards to Williams and 23 yards to Terrance Carter.

Tech led 28-0 at halftime, 45-0 through three periods and outgained Oregon State 534 yards to 164 through three periods.

Eakin's score came on the third play after play resumed following the delay.

Upton Bellenfant kicked a 21-yard field goal.

Oregon State adjusted to the continued absence of veteran deep snapper Dylan Black after four poor snaps last week helped doom the Beavers in their 36-27 loss to Fresno State. Regular center Van Wells snapped to punter AJ Winsor, who lined up only 7-8 yards behind center and got kicks away quickly. His first two carried only 29 and 23 yards, but he finished averaging 39.6. Murphy took two quick kicks for 36 and 34 yards.

Morton played three periods for the first time this season. He has 923 yards passing and 11 TD passes heading into Big 12 play.

Texas Tech has shutout its opponent through the first three quarters in each of its first three games this season. The Red Raiders are outscoring their opponent a combined 123-0 in the first half, a combined 154-0 over the first three quarters, and 174-35 overall in three games this season.

Texas Tech scored on its opening drive; the Red Raiders have started all three games in 2025 with touchdown drives.

SALT LAKE CITY (AP) — Backup quarterback Will Hammond stepped into a stagnant Texas Tech offense in the third quarter and put together four scoring drives to lead the 17th-ranked Red Raiders to a 34-10 win over No. 16 Utah on Saturday.

Hammond threw for 169 yards and two touchdowns and rushed for 61 yards. He entered the game in relief of Behren Morton, who was ruled out after sustaining an injury during the Red Raiders' (4-0, 1-0 Big 12) opening drive of the third quarter. Morton was ruled out after the hit with his team leading 10-3. He threw for 142 yards and two INTs before exiting.

The offense didn't skip a beat in Morton's absence. If anything, it revved up.

Utah QB Devon Dampier threw for 162 yards and two interceptions. The Utes (3-1, 0-1 Big 12) were held to 263 total yards and committed four turnovers.

Texas Tech opened the scoring early in the first quarter on a 1-yard touchdown run from Cameron Dickey, who finished the day with 67 yards and two scores. Stone Harrington's career-long 58-yard field goal extended the Red Raiders' lead to 10-0 late in the second quarter.

The Utes struggled to answer. Utah had turnovers on back-to-back first-half drives and a 69-yard TD pass from Dampier to Jackson Bennee called back on an ineligible receiver penalty.

After Wayshawn Parker scored on a 5-yard run to cut the deficit to 13-10 with 10:22 left in the fourth quarter, the Utes' defense unraveled. The Red Raiders reeled off three straight TDs to secure the win.

Hammond's first touchdown pass – a 24-yarder to Terrance Carter Jr. – restored a double-digit lead. Dickey put the Red Raiders up 27-10 with 3:41 remaining when he took a handoff, squeezed his way through a scrum of players and popped out the other side for a 24-yard touchdown run.

Dampier threw an interception on Utah's ensuing drive, which led to Hammond's spot-on strike to Reggie Virgil for a 21-yard score.

Texas Tech forced four turnovers; its most in a single game since facing Cal in the 2023 Independence Bowl.

Utah attempted two fourth downs, and Tech held them both times.

Texas Tech exploded for 24 points in the fourth quarter in its 34-10 win. Utah entered the game allowing 8.3 points per game, 8th-best in the nation. The most points the Utes allowed in a single season was 10 to UCLA in week one.

HOUSTON (AP) – Behren Morton threw for 345 yards and a touchdown, J'Koby Williams ran for two scores and No. 11 Texas Tech improved to 5-0 with a 35-11 victory over previously unbeaten Houston on Saturday night.

It's the first time the Red Raiders have won their first five games since opening the 2013 season 7-0 and is the eighth 5-0 start in school history.

Texas Tech (5-0, 2-0 Big 12) has dominated through its first five games, winning each contest by at least 24 points and outscoring opponents 243-56.

Conner Weigman threw for 71 yards with an interception in the first half for Houston (4-1, 1-1) before going to the locker room late in the second quarter with an apparent injury and not returning.

The Red Raiders were up by 6 late in the first quarter after three field goals when Morton found Cameron Dickey on a short pass and he juked two defenders and ran untouched for a 69-yard touchdown. The 2-point conversion failed to leave Tech up 15-3.

Jacob Rodriguez intercepted Weigman's and returned it to the Houston 25 early in the second quarter. Texas Tech cashed in five plays later when Williams scored on a 5-yard run that made it 22-3.

Zeon Chriss-Gremillion took over after Weigman exited and scrambled for 11 yards on his first play before throwing a 64-yard touchdown pass to Amare Thomas on his second about 90 seconds before halftime. He connected with Stephon Johnson on the 2-point conversion to cut the lead to 25-11.

Chriss-Gremillion threw for 93 yards with an interception and led the Cougars with 59 yards rushing.

Texas Tech missed a field goal at the end of the second quarter before hitting one from 29 yards in the third to push the lead to 28-11.

The Red Raiders missed a field goal from 53 yards later in the third before the second TD by Williams early in the fourth on a 1-yard run left Texas Tech up 35-11.

LUBBOCK, Texas (AP) — Cameron Dickey ran for a career-high 263 yards and two long touchdowns, Will Hammond scored twice after replacing injured quarterback Behren Morton and No. 9 Texas Tech beat Kansas 42-17 on Saturday night.

Dickey sprinted 71 yards on the first offensive play for the Red Raiders and added a 55-yard TD run early in the fourth quarter. With co-lead back JKoby Williams slowed by an injury, Dickey had 21 carries, another career best.

Tech (6-0, 3-0 Big 12) had 372 yards rushing and recovered from a malaise after Morton's injury in the school's first game as an AP top 10 team since 2013.

A 21-0 Texas Tech lead was down to four points at the break when the Jayhawks (4-3, 2-2) scored on three of their first four possessions after Morton appeared to injure his lower right leg on a sack in the second quarter. He didn't return.

Hammond threw an interception and the Red Raiders punted on his other three possessions before halftime. But the redshirt freshman ran 20 yards for a touchdown on the first drive of the second half.

Dickey's second long TD put Texas Tech up 35-17, and Hammond's 10-yard run finished the scoring. Hammond had 61 yards rushing.

It's the third time Hammond has come on with Morton not returning this season. Morton hyperextended his right knee in a 67-7 victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff in the season opener and was sidelined in a 34-10 win over Utah after taking a hard hit to the head.

Jalon Daniels threw for 228 yards and two touchdowns for Kansas, which dropped to 1-12 in Lubbock and has lost 24 of 26 meetings with the Red Raiders.

The Jayhawks had all the momentum with the way they finished the first half after Morton's injury. They couldn't sustain it. Kansas punted on its five possessions after the break.

The Red Raiders gave up some big pass plays to help Kansas get back in the game, but still sacked Daniels eight times. David Bailey had three of them. Tech had a ninth sack on backup Cole Ballard in the final seconds.

TEMPE, Ariz. (AP) — Raleek Brown bulled in for a 1-yard touchdown run with 34 seconds left and Arizona State rallied after blowing a 12-point, fourth-quarter lead to hand No. 7 Texas Tech its first loss of the season, 26-22 on Saturday.

The Red Raiders (6-1, 3-1 Big 12) labored most of the afternoon without starting QB Behren Morton (knee), finishing with 276 total yards after averaging an FBS-best 558.8 through the first six games.

Will Hammond showed his mettle after failing to move Texas Tech's offense through three quarters, orchestrating two late scoring drives. The freshman scored on a 1-yard run and, after Texas Tech's defense held, found Reggie Virgil on a 12-yard touchdown pass.

Hammond put the Red Raiders up 22-19 by running it in for the 2-point conversion — after a holding call on Arizona State on the first attempt — but left too much time on the clock.

The reigning Big 12 champion Sun Devils (5-2, 3-1) started the final drive from their 25 with two minutes left and quickly moved down the field. Sam Leavitt completed 5 of 7 passes for 61 yards on the drive and benefited from a pass interference call on Texas Tech's Brice Pollack to set up Brown's TD run.

The Red Raiders reached Arizona State's 28 on its final drive, but Hammond's desperation heave into the end zone was swatted down.

Texas Tech followed No. 2 Miami, No. 5 Mississippi and No. 10 LSU to become the fourth top-10 team to lose this weekend.

Texas Tech was without defensive tackle Skyler Gill-Howard, who had season-ending ankle surgery this week, and the Sun Devils took advantage by racking up 394 total yards against one of the nation's best defenses. Arizona State had a hard time finishing drives, settling for four field goals by Jesus Gomez, but came through at just the right time.

Leavitt threw for 319 yards and hit Jordyn Tyson on a 2-yard touchdown pass in the third quarter after missing last week's game against Utah with a foot injury. The Sun Devils appeared to be headed toward a devastating loss after giving up two late touchdowns, but Leavitt rallied them.

LUBBOCK, Texas (AP) — J’Koby Williams returned the opening kickoff 99 yards for a touchdown and took a short pass 26 yards for a score on Texas Tech’s first play, jump-starting the No. 14 Red Raiders’ 42-0 victory over Oklahoma State on Saturday.

Jacob Rodriguez returned a fumble 69 yards for a TD as Texas Tech (7-1, 4-1 Big 12) bounced back from its first loss, a 26-22 defeat at 24th-ranked Arizona State that dropped the Red Raiders out of the top 10. It was Texas Tech’s first Big 12 shutout since beating Baylor 28-0 in 2005.

After lightning delayed the start for 30 minutes, Williams’ return came on the first kickoff since school officials banned the yearlong tradition of fans throwing tortillas on kickoffs. The Red Raiders were penalized twice on kickoffs in their previous home game for objects thrown on the field in violation of a rule the Big 12 approved in August.

Texas Tech blocked a punt on the first possession for the Cowboys (1-7, 0-5), leading to Williams’ TD on a screen from Will Hammond, who started a second consecutive game in place of the injured Behren Morton.

Third-stringer Mitch Griffis replaced Hammond in the second quarter after Hammond appeared to injure his lower right leg on a run. Morton changed from street clothes to his uniform at halftime but only had to watch as Griffis threw a touchdown pass and ran for a score in the third quarter.

Oklahoma State was limited to 182 yards in a seventh consecutive loss since beating lower-division Tennessee-Martin in the opener. The Cowboys have three shutout losses of at least 42 points since 2022.

Rodriguez’s 11th career fumble recovery — second among active FBS players — never touched the ground. The senior linebacker ripped the ball out of the arms of Sesi Vailahi in the middle of the line of scrimmage and ran untouched for the score.

The Cowboys are searching for solutions at quarterback in a second consecutive lost season. Sam Jackson V made his third start as the third different starter after opening the season at receiver. He was replaced by Noah Walters, who didn’t join the team until after the 69-3 loss to Oregon in Week 2.

Griffis kept Morton on the bench by leading a scoring drive for a 35-0 lead on Texas Tech’s first possession of the second half. Griffis lost 3 yards on a fourth-and-1 keeper on his first play replacing Hammond. His first full possession ended with a punt

MANHATTAN, Kan. (AP)— Behren Morton threw for 249 yards and two touchdowns in his return from an injury, J’Koby Williams ran for 135 yards and a score, and No. 13 Texas Tech romped past sloppy, mistake-prone Kansas State 43-20 on Saturday.

Cameron Dickey also had a touchdown run for the Red Raiders (8-1, 5-1 Big 12), who forced five turnovers while snapping an eight-game losing streak against the Wildcats (4-5, 3-3) with their first win in Manhattan since the 2008 season. Texas Tech is off to its best start in conference play since that year, when Mike Leach guided the team to the Cotton Bowl.

Avery Johnson threw for 199 yards and a touchdown while running for 86 and two more scores. But Kansas State’s quarterback also threw two interceptions and was responsible for a late fumble that Texas Tech returned for a touchdown. Along with the slew of turnovers, the Wildcats also were 0 for 4 on fourth down.

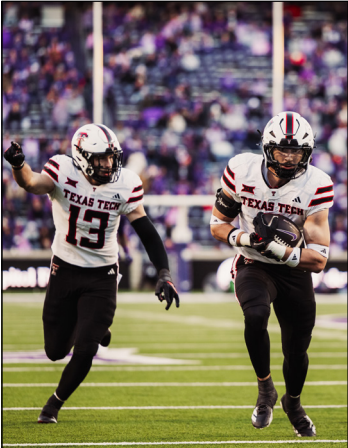
Morton, who had been out of the lineup with a leg injury, opened the game with an interception of his own. But Johnson threw a pick right back, and it was the beginning of a messy first half in which both failed on fourth down, Kansas State lost a fumble and Texas Tech nearly did the same.

The Red Raiders eventually made Kansas State pay for its mistakes, though.

They turned a fumble by Jayce Brown into a touchdown to take a 9-7 lead. They turned a three-and-out late in the first half into a 55-yard field goal. And they turned another fumble, this time from Garrett Oakley on the fourth play of the second half, into a 41-yard run by Williams that silenced the crowd and gave Texas Tech a 19-7 lead.

Johnson tried to answer with his second TD run for Kansas State, but Texas Tech’s offense kept on going. Stone Harrington drilled another field goal and Caleb Douglas hauled in a short touchdown throw to make it 29-14 heading into the fourth quarter. Texas Tech’s defense took care of the rest.

After the Wildcats scored with 12:44 to go, the Red Raiders stopped the 2-point try to keep it a two-score game. Later in the quarter, they stuffed Johnson for a loss on fourth down near midfield. And when the Texas Tech offense fumbled the ball right back, the Red Raiders again stopped the Wildcats on fourth down with less than 6 minutes to go. Tech linebacker John Curry returned Johnson’s fumble for a touchdown with 4:52 left to put the game away.

LUBBOCK, Texas (AP) — Stone Harrington kicked a school-record five field goals and standout Texas Tech linebacker Jacob Rodriguez had two takeaways as the No. 9 Red Raiders beat No. 8 BYU 29-7 on Saturday, holding the previously-undefeated Cougars to a season-low 255 total yards in a game with Big 12 and playoff implications. Behren Morton passed for 216 yards and threw a 9-yard touchdown to Caleb Douglas while Cameron Dickey ran for 121 yards and a 1-yard score for Texas Tech (9-1, 6-1 Big 12, No. 8 CFP), which played in its first top-10 matchup since 2008. BYU (8-1, 5-1, No. 7 CFP) had never played in such a game, though the teams could meet again in the Big 12 championship game in four weeks in Arlington, Texas at AT&T Stadium.

Harrington kicked field goals of 47, 39, 34, 29 and 27 yards. Rodriguez, the FBS leader with seven forced fumbles, had an interception midway through the third period leading to Harrington's fourth field goal. He recovered a backward pass late in the fourth quarter that set up Harrington's final kick. Tech has gone from ranking 121st last season in the FBS allowing 34.8 points per game to fifth at 13.2 going into Saturday, and lowering that to 12.6. BYU snapped a 10-game winning streak dating back to last season. The Cougars avoided their first shutout since 2017 when Bear Bachmeier threw a 6-yard touchdown pass to Chase Roberts midway through the fourth quarter. The Cougars went into the game third in the FBS in turnover margin at plus-1.25. They lost two fumbles, threw an interception and muffed a punt. Bachmeier was 23 of 38 passing for 188 yards. The true freshman also had two turnovers, the interception and backward pass for a fumble. The Cougars went into play averaging 36.3 points and 434 yards per game. Its previous low offensive output this season was 332 yards in the 27-3 win over Stanford on Sept. 6.

Linebacker Jacob Rodriguez struck the Heisman Trophy pose again after the first offensive touchdown of his career, Reggie Virgil scored three times and No. 8 Texas Tech routed UCF 48-9 on Saturday.

The Red Raiders (10-1, 7-1 Big 12, No. 6 CFP) stayed on track for a shot at their first Big 12 championship in their regular-season home finale, reaching 10 victories for the first time since going 11-2 under the late Mike Leach in 2008.

The Golden Knights (4-6, 1-6) didn't pick up a first down until they trailed 21-0 and dropped to 0-4 on the road. UCF had a season-low 52 yards rushing against the nation's No. 1 run defense.

Just as he did after a highlight-reel interception last week in a 29-7 win over BYU in a top-10 matchup, Rodriguez lifted one leg and extended an arm while surrounded by teammates after scoring on a 2-yard run in the wildcat.

Rodriguez, who scored touchdowns on fumble recoveries this season and last against Oklahoma State, set up Vigil's third TD for a 35-2 lead with his fourth interception this season.

Virgil's first two scores came on the first two carries of his career in the second quarter, a 5-yarder early and a 30-yard sprint that ended with him hopping and skipping into the end zone. Cameron Dickey also had two rushing TDs.

Behren Morton threw for 149 yards and the 8-yard score to Virgil before getting replaced by Mitch Griffis late in the first half. Morton is playing through a leg injury, and original backup Will Hammond is out for the season with a knee injury.

UCF's first points came on a safety when Texas Tech left tackle Howard Sampson was called for holding in the end zone.

All 10 of Texas Tech's wins this season have been decided by at least 20 points, most by any DI team. The only Big 12 team with more 20-point victories in a season was Oklahoma (11 in 2008, 10 in 2003).

The Red Raiders finished the regular season undefeated (7-0) at home for the first time since 2008 (7-0). It matches the all-time record for most home wins in a single season, being the fourth time (1965, 2005, 2008, 2025).

MORGANTOWN, W.Va. (AP) — Behren Morton threw for 310 yards and three touchdowns, linebacker Jacob Rodriguez scored his second offensive TD in as many games, and No. 5 Texas Tech beat West Virginia 49-0 on Saturday in the Red Raiders’ final tuneup before the Big 12 championship game.

Texas Tech (11-1, 8-1 Big 12, No. 5 CFP) had already clinched a spot in the title game against No. 11 BYU in Arlington, Texas, when Arizona State lost to Arizona on Friday night. But the Red Raiders had plenty of motivation, needing a win over the Mountaineers to continue their trajectory toward at least hosting a first-round home game in the College Football Playoff.

Texas Tech was dominant from the start, scoring touchdowns on four of their first five drives.

Unlike two weeks ago when he scored on a short run against UCF, Rodriguez didn’t strike a Heisman pose after taking a direct snap and rushing for a 1-yard TD on Texas Tech’s first offensive series. His other TD this season came on a 69-yard fumble return.

Just before halftime, Rodriguez, who began his college career as a quarterback at Virginia, lined up in the wildcat again from the West Virginia 1. He threw a pass intended for Terrance Carter that the Mountaineers’ Ben Cutter intercepted in the back of the end zone.

Morton showed no mobility problems while playing through a leg injury that prompted him to wear a boot during the team’s bye week. Morton threw TD passes of 19 and 4 yards to Caleb Douglas and 4 yards to Cameron Dickey. Morton, who was replaced by Mitch Griffis early in the third quarter, completed 25 of 32 passes. Douglas had five catches for 127 yards.

Freshman Scotty Fox Jr., the fourth starting quarterback for West Virginia (4-8, 2-7) this season due to injuries, was replaced in the third quarter by Max Brown. Brown’s first completion as a Mountaineer was followed by a 67-yard interception return by Texas Tech’s Amier Boyd. That set up the first of Micah Hudson’s two TD catches from Lloyd Jones III.

The Red Raiders advance to the championship game for the first time in school history. In their 30th season in the league, they’ve never won a Big 12 title.

The Mountaineers didn’t get a first down until their sixth offensive series midway through the second quarter and were held to 180 total yards, including 37 on the ground.

ARLINGTON, Texas (AP) —

Texas Tech defeated BYU, 34-7, on Saturday to claim their first Big 12 Conference title and are going to the College Football Playoff for the first time.

Rodriguez had 13 tackles and Ben Roberts overcame an early injury scare with two interceptions in the second half when Tech (12-1, No. 4 CFP) forced four turnovers while holding BYU to a season-low 200 total yards. The two linebackers have both played more than 40 games for a defense transformed by additions in the transfer portal.

Behren Morton, who made his 35th start but didn't play in Tech's only loss this year at Arizona State, threw two TDs to Coy Eakin and Stone Harrington kicked four field goals.

The only losses by BYU (11-2, No. 11 CFP) are to the Red Raiders, including 29-7 in Lubbock four weeks ago. The Cougars, who likely needed to be in the top 10 for a playoff spot, won't move up when the final CFP rankings come out Sunday.

Roberts got his first interception with about 3 1/2 minutes left in the third quarter when he reached up and deflected a pass by true freshman Bear Bachmeier. On the next play, Cameron Dickey took a direct snap and ran untouched 11 yards for a touchdown and a 21-7 lead after a 2-point conversion.

Harrington, who kicked a school-record five field goals against BYU last month, missed a 49-yard field goal attempt after Roberts jumped a route to make a one-handed interception in the fourth quarter.

Midway through the first quarter on BYU's opening drive, Roberts was down on one knee at the end of a play. He came in and out of the game until halftime, then had a huge impact after that.

The Cougars avoided a slow start this time, going 90 yards in 14 plays on their opening drive for a 7-0 lead on LJ Martin's 10-yard TD run. But they had only 24 more yards before halftime, and 110 the rest of the game. They trailed 26-0 in Lubbock before their only touchdown midway through the fourth quarter.

Roberts is the first player with multiple interceptions in one of the 24 Big 12 championship games. He almost had another one, but that deflection on a fourth-down play gave the ball back to the Red Raiders.

Tech went ahead to stay on Eakin's incredible leaping 33-yard TD catch early in the second quarter that made it 10-7. He reached up with both hands to snag the ball, and got a foot down while twisting and lunging into the end zone. He had a 28-yard catch-and-run score in the fourth quarter after Romello Height's fumble recovery.

MIAMI GARDENS, Florida (AP) — Matayo Uiagalelei caused a fumble to set up an Oregon touchdown, Jordan Davison rushed for two scores and the fifth-seeded Ducks silenced No. 4 Texas Tech’s offense for a 23-0 win in the College Football Playoff quarterfinal at the Orange Bowl on Thursday.

Dante Moore threw for 234 yards and Atticus Sappington kicked three field goals for Oregon (13-1), which will play either No. 1 Indiana or No. 9 Alabama in the Peach Bowl — a CFP semifinal — on Jan. 9.

The Peach Bowl winner will be back in Miami Gardens for the national title game on Jan. 19.

Texas Tech — which finished at 12-2 — came into the day second nationally in points per game (42.5) and fifth nationally in yards per game (480.3) but got nothing going. The Red Raiders turned the ball over four times, were stopped on fourth downs three other times and had four three-and-outs.

Tech quarterback Behren Morton — who finished 18 of 32 passing for just 137 yards — was stripped by Uiagalelei early in the third quarter in Red Raiders territory. Uiagalelei rumbled deep into the red zone and Davison scored one play later to make it 13-0.

Morton threw a red-zone interception early in the fourth quarter and a fourth-down stop from their own 30 midway through the fourth quarter doomed whatever comeback chances existed for the Red Raiders. Davison plunged in from the 1 with 16 seconds left to cap the scoring.

It was the sixth quarterfinal under this 12-team tournament format that started last year — there were two others coming later Thursday — and the sixth time that the team coming off an extended break lost to a team that played a first-round game.

In 2024, Boise State (against Penn State), Arizona State (against Texas), Georgia (against Notre Dame) and Oregon (against Ohio State) all went out in the quarterfinals after first-round byes. Miami added to that list Wednesday night, beating Ohio State in a quarterfinal at the Cotton Bowl. In those six games, including Thursday, the team with the bye has held the lead for less than five minutes — combined — of regulation.
