THE CITADEL BY THE #S

1ST ON 3RD — The Bulldogs lead the SoCon in third down Conv. on both sides of the ball. The Bulldogs are 4th nationally at 53.2 percent (33/52) on offense and 22nd nationally and leading the SoCon on defense at 31.6 percent (12/38).

- **25** Consecutive weeks in the FCS polls for The Citadel, a program record. The Bulldogs are No. 17 in this week's FCS Stats Poll and No. 17 in the FCS Coaches' Poll.
- **2** National rank in rushing offense (333.2 ypg) for The Citadel in 2017. The Bulldogs rushed for 331 yards in the win at ETSU and led the nation in the category in 2016 at 348.2 yards per game.
- **208** Total yards allowed by the Bulldogs against ETSU. The second-fewest allowed in 15 games under Brent Thompson. The Bulldogs allowed only 229 the week before at PC.
- **7** Consecutive touchdowns scored by the Bulldogs in the 48-7 win against Presbyterian on Sept. 9. The Citadel punted on its opening possession, then scored on the ensuing seven possessions until kneeling the game out in the closing minute.
- **9** # of Bulldogs who have scored touchdowns already this season. QB Dominique Allen is the only Bulldog with multiple TDs. Twelve different Bulldogs scored TDs last season, ten on offense.
- **9-1** Bulldogs record under Brent Thompson when they rush for 300+ yards. Only loss was at North Carolina in 2016.
- **3** Passing touchdowns for Jordan Black and rushing TDs for Dominique Allen in the win over Presbyterian. Black was the first Citadel player to throw for three TDs against an FCS in a game since 2009. Allen's three rushing TDs were a career high.
- **16** National rank in total defense (293.3 ppg) for The Citadel through four games in 2017. The Bulldogs have also allowed only 39 total points after the first quarter in four games.
- **40** Total offensive snaps for Presbyterian in the 48-7 Bulldog win.
- **500** Current # of program wins by The Citadel. The program is 500-549-32 all-time and won its 500th game at ETSU on Sept. 17. The program is in its 108th season in 2017.

2017 STORYLINES

- The Citadel enters 2017 off its second straight Southern Conference championship and backto-back berths in the FCS Playoffs, marking the first time in program history with back-to-back conference titles and the first time the Bulldogs made consecutive playoff appearances.
- The Citadel tied the Southern Conference record with eight conference wins in 2016, a feat accomplished only six times before, and finished unbeaten in conference play for the first time in program history. Only the Citadel (2016) and Wofford (2003) have been 8-0 in SoCon play among current league members.
- Head Coach Brent Thompson, now in his second season, broke The Citadel's record for most wins by a first-year head coach going 10-2, blasting past the previous record of six that had stood since 1916.
- The Bulldogs are picked second in the 2017 Southern Conference Preseason Poll behind Wofford. Samford was picked third and Chattanooga fourth.

STRETCH OF SUCCESS

- Citadel Football is enjoying one of the most successful stretches in program history. Dating back to the end of the 2014 season, the Bulldogs finishing with a 3-1 stretch, The Citadel is 25-7 overall and 18-2 in SoCon play.
- The Bulldogs have been ranked for 24 consecutive weeks, a program record.

SCHEDULE

- HURRICANE IRMA displaced the Bulldogs for a weekend and forced the Sept. 9 game against Presbyterian to be moved to Clinton, S.C. The Bulldogs spent five days on the road, returning to campus on a Tuesday night and returning to play ETSU in Johnson City on Friday. The Citadel had a home game moved for Hurricane Matthew in 2016.
- The Bulldogs go 5 weeks (35 days) between home games because of Hurricane Irma, then play their final four home games in the span of 29 days.
- The Bulldogs face three new head coaches in

- 2017, Tommy Spangler (PC), Tom Arth (Chattanooga), Clay Hendrix (Furman).
- The Citadel faces the top four picks (excluding The Citadel) in the SoCon Preseason Poll in four consecutive weeks. The Bulldogs travel to Samford on Sept. 30 to begin the four-game stretch.
- The Bulldogs face Clemson on Nov. 18 and Alabama in 2018, meaning the Bulldogs face the two teams that have played for the CFP Championship in each of the last two season...in the next two season.

BRENT THOMPSON

2nd Season | The Citadel Record: 13-3

Brent Thompson was named The Citadel's 25th head football coach on January 19, 2016, and in his first year led the Bulldogs to unprecedented heights while authoring one of the best seasons in Southern Conference history.

Thompson's first season in charge featured a program-record 10-game winning streak, a single-season school-record six road victories, only the seventh 8-0 conference record in 84 years of SoCon football, a second consecutive conference championship, a No. 6 national seed in the FCS Playoffs and the first home playoff game in 24 years. He was named Southern Conference Coach of the Year for the 10-2 campaign that resulted in the first time in program history with back-to-back playoff appearances. Thompson

shattered The Citadel's record for wins by a first-year head coach of six that had stood for 100 years and was the second coach in conference history to win eight SoCon games in his first season while becoming the only first-year head coach to lead the Bulldogs to the FCS Playoffs.

Thompson produced three All-Americans, two Academic All-Americans, the Southern Conference Defensive Player of the Year, the Southern Conference Jacobs Blocking Award winner and 11 All-Southern Conference Performers in 2016. In addition, The Citadel claimed eight SoCon player of the week accolades, one SoCon Student-Athlete of the Week and one conference player of the month.

The Bulldogs ranked first in FCS with an average of 348.2 rushing yards per game, the second-highest single-season total at The Citadel, marking only the third time in school history and the first time since 1994 the Bulldogs led FCS in rushing. The Citadel also ranked first in FCS with a nation-low 3.3 tackles for loss allowed per game and finished the season ranked first in the Southern Conference in 11 total team categories while ranking in the top-10 in FCS in 12 different team categories.

Thompson's approach to developing a complete team was on display in his first season in charge. The Bulldogs ranked seventh in FCS in pass defense, led by SoCon interception champion Dee Delaney, and eighth in the country in total defense, improving by more than 50 yards from the previous season to allow only 302.7 yards per game. The Bulldogs also ranked first in the Southern Conference with only 30 touchdowns allowed in 12 games, an average of 2.5 per game. Special teams played a crucial role in The Citadel's success with a dangerous return game, led by SoCon punt return champion DeAndre Schoultz, clutch kicking and one of the best coverage units in the conference.

Thompson served as the Bulldogs' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks/B-Backs coach for his first two seasons in Charleston. In three seasons calling plays, his physical rushing attack has produced 37 individual 100-yard rushing games, including a single-season program-record 14 in 2015, and has ranked first or second in FCS in rushing yards per game each year. In addition, The Citadel tied a single-season school record with five games of at least 400 rushing yards in 2016.

In 2015, The Citadel earned a co-Southern Conference championship behind a then-school-record-tying six SoCon wins and finished 9-4 overall after advancing to the second round of the NCAA FCS Playoffs for only the second time in school history. The Bulldogs, who finished the season with a conference-best +117 scoring margin that included a +100 margin in SoCon play, earned the program's first road playoff win with a 41-38 victory at Coastal Carolina in the first round of the playoffs.

In The Citadel's 23-22 win at South Carolina, B-Back Tyler Renew piled up a career-high 174 rushing yards, the most allowed at home by South Carolina since 2006 when Doak Walker Award winner and Heisman Trophy finalist Darren McFadden rushed for 219 yards. Renew's total was higher than five teams' rushing totals against the Gamecocks in 2015. The next week, at Coastal Carolina, the Bulldogs broke a school record with four 100-yard rushers and piled up 524 rushing yards, the most in an NCAA Playoff game since 2012 and the second-highest single-game rushing total in FCS in 2015 behind The Citadel's 535 yards in the season opener. Renew and offensive lineman Sam Frye were named All-Americans, and Frye and fellow offensive lineman Kyle Weaver earned All-Southern Conference honors. In addition, offensive lineman Tyler Davis and B-Back Evan McField earned spots on the All-Southern Conference Freshman Team.

As a team, the Bulldogs broke school records for all-purpose yards, total offense yards and rushing yards. The Citadel led the Southern Conference and ranked second in FCS with an average of 346.9 rushing yards per game, an average of 17.21 yards per completion and allowing 0.62 sacks per game. The Bulldogs also led the SoCon with 5.70 yards per rush and 41 rushing touchdowns. Quarterback Dominique Allen led the Southern Conference and tied for 17th in FCS, second among quarterbacks, with 13 rushing touchdowns. Allen also ranked third in the SoCon in points responsibility with 104, fifth with 953 rushing yards, seventh with an average of 140.3 yards of total offense per game and eighth with an average of 6.0 points scored per game.

In his first year at The Citadel, Thompson was instrumental in the development of Aaron Miller as the senior ranked second in the Southern Conference with 1,080 rushing yards, the highest total by a Bulldog since 1998, and finished the regular season 31st in the nation and second among quarterbacks. The B-back combination of Renew and Isiaha Smith rushed for 1,352 yards and 10 touchdowns.

Thompson came to Charleston after coordinating the offense at Lenoir-Rhyne from 2010-13. Operating out of the triple option offense, Thompson's attack was tops in rushing in Division II in 2013, averaging 370.9 yards per game, and set the NCAA record for all divisions in rushing yards in a season with 5,563 while advancing to the Division II National Championship Game and a 13-2 overall record. In 2012 Lenoir-Rhyne compiled 4,515 yards on the ground and finished second in the nation in rushing at 376.2 per game. The Bears also had their highest output of total offense in a season (430.6 ypg) since 1994 and averaged 35.2 points per game. In 2011 Thompson guided Lenoir-Rhyne to nearly 400 yards of offense per game (397.0 ypg) while the squad averaged 33.6 points per outing. The Bears also ranked third in the nation in rushing (287.1 ypg), and quarterback Major Herron was named to the all-league first team. In his first season at L-R,

Thompson headed up a Bear attack in 2010 that averaged more than 400 yards of total offense for the first time in 18 years and led Division II in rushing at 319.5 yards per game. Thompson went to Lenoir-Rhyne after serving as an assistant coach at Bucknell for seven seasons. In 2009, Thompson served as the Bison's offensive coordinator in addition to his duties as recruiting coordinator and offensive line coach. Thompson started his tenure at the Lewisburg, Pa., school as the wide receivers coach in 2003. As quarterbacks and fullbacks coach in 2004, Thompson mentored quarterback Daris Wilson to first-team All-Patriot League honors. Prior to Bucknell, Thompson coached the 2001 and 2002 seasons at Northeastern where he oversaw the running backs and was the team's video coordinator. In 2002, Thompson helped lead the Huskies to the Atlantic 10 championship. Thompson coached All-American L.J. McKanas, who broke the school's career rushing record and was second in the nation in that category in 2001.

Thompson, a 1998 graduate of Norwich with a degree in peace, war and diplomacy, was a two-year letterman as a defensive back on the football squad. He began his coaching career at Dickinson in the fall of 1998 as a graduate assistant and worked with the outside linebackers before serving as the wide receivers coach at Stony Brook in 2000.

A native of Poughkeepsie, New York, Thompson is married to the former Tiffany Lebengood. The couple has three-year-old twin daughters Harper and Emma.

Bulldogs Edge Mercer in Opener on Late FG, 24-23

MACON, Ga. – The 15th-ranked Citadel football team opened the 2016 season with a 24-23 win over Southern Conference foe Mercer on Thursday evening inside Five Star Stadium.

The Bulldogs (1-0, 1-0 SoCon) wasted no time in the season opener as Tyler Renew took it 70 yards to the house on the second play of the game to give The Citadel a 7-0 lead after a successful PAT.

On the next drive, Mercer (0-1, 0-1 SoCon) took over on the 28-yard line and Kevin Graham promptly sacked the Bears' John Russ and forced a fumble to then give the Bulldogs the ball back on the Mercer 21-yard line. It was the first forced fumble of the sophomore's career. Five plays later, Cam Jackson found the end zone from eight yards out to make it a 14-0 Bulldog lead less than two minutes into the game.

With 7:44 left in the first quarter the Bears got on the board, kicking a 26-yard field goal to make it a 14-3 game. The Citadel answered on its next drive thanks to a 29-yard touchdown run by Reggie Williams with 5:46 left in the first quarter. The five-play, 75-yard drive gave the Bulldogs a 21-3 lead.

The last score of the quarter came with 3:08 left on a 38-yard Mercer touchdown run. The scoring through the first 15 minutes of play would end there with The Citadel boasting a 21-10 lead and 169 rushing yards.

The Bears added another field goal and touchdown in the second quarter to make it a 21-20 game heading into the half.

Mercer took its first lead of the game in the third quarter after an 11-play, 46-yard drive resulted in a 47-yard field goal to make it a 23-21 deficit for the Bulldogs with 10:10 remaining. That was the only score of the game for either team in the third quarter, keeping the score 23-21 heading into the fourth.

Neither team was able to get much of anything going in the fourth quarter until kicker Cody Clark was able to give the Bulldogs the lead and seal the win with 2:20 left in the game. The graduate student nailed a 35-yard field goal to give The Citadel a 24-23 win and Brent Thompson his first win as a head coach. Coach Thompson is the first head coach in The Citadel's history to defeat a Southern Conference opponent on the road in his coaching debut.

Renew recorded his fourth 100-yard rushing game in the last five games and finished tonight's game with 146 yards on the ground. With the win, The Citadel improved to 57-12-3 in season openers against non-FBS competition and 58-48-3 overall in season-opening games.forcing Samford to settle for a field goal. The kick got away cleanly but hit the upright and bounced back to clinch the win for the 'Dogs.

Bulldogs Best Mercer in Opener on Late FG, 24-23

MACON, Ga. – The 15th-ranked Citadel football team opened the 2016 season with a 24-23 win over Southern Conference foe Mercer on Thursday evening inside Five Star Stadium.

The Bulldogs (1-0, 1-0 SoCon) wasted no time in the season opener as Tyler Renew took it 70 yards to the house on the second play of the game to give The Citadel a 7-0 lead after a successful PAT.

On the next drive, Mercer (0-1, 0-1 SoCon) took over on the 28-yard line and Kevin Graham promptly sacked the Bears' John Russ and forced a fumble to then give the Bulldogs the ball back on the Mercer 21-yard line. It was the first forced fumble of the sophomore's career. Five plays later, Cam Jackson found the end zone from eight yards out to make it a 14-0 Bulldog lead less than two minutes into the game.

With 7:44 left in the first quarter the Bears got on the board, kicking a 26-yard field goal to make it a 14-3 game. The Citadel answered on its next drive thanks to a 29-yard touchdown run by Reggie Williams with 5:46 left in the first quarter. The five-play, 75-yard drive gave the Bulldogs a 21-3 lead.

The last score of the quarter came with 3:08 left on a 38-yard Mercer touchdown run. The scoring through the first 15 minutes of play would end there with The Citadel boasting a 21-10 lead and 169 rushing yards.

The Bears added another field goal and touchdown in the second quarter to make it a 21-20 game heading into the half.

Mercer took its first lead of the game in the third quarter after an 11-play, 46-yard drive resulted in a 47-yard field goal to make it a 23-21 deficit for the Bulldogs with 10:10 remaining. That was the only score of the game for either team in the third quarter, keeping the score 23-21 heading into the fourth.

Neither team was able to get much of anything going in the fourth quarter until kicker Cody Clark was able to give the Bulldogs the lead and seal the win with 2:20 left in the game. The graduate student nailed a 35-yard field goal to give The Citadel a 24-23 win and Brent Thompson his first win as a head coach. Coach Thompson is the first head coach in The Citadel's history to defeat a Southern Conference opponent on the road in his coaching debut.

Renew recorded his fourth 100-yard rushing game in the last five games and finished tonight's game with 146 yards on the ground. With the win, The Citadel improved to 57-12-3 in season openers against non-FBS competition and 58-48-3 overall in season-opening games.forcing Samford to settle for a field goal. The kick got away cleanly but hit the upright and bounced back to clinch the win for the 'Dogs.

Bulldogs Handle Newberry in Opener, 31-14

CHARLESTON, S.C. —Citadel running back Cam Jackson's 74-yard touchdown run in the third quarter broke open a one-score game and lifted the Bulldogs to a 31-14 win over Newberry on Saturday night in the season opener.

The Citadel (1-0) controlled the first half, but led only 14-7 at the break. Newberry threatened to tie the game in the third before Jackson took a pitch from quarterback Dominique Allen and raced up the left sideline to put the game out of reach behind a Bulldog defense that allowed only 42 yards in the opening half.

Second-year head coach Brent Thomson improved to 2-0 in openers at The Citadel. His team didn't finish in the first half, but the veterans stepped up in the second half to put the opener out of reach.

Jackson finished with 110 yards on only nine carries. Allen added 91 yards on 16

Jackson became the 12th Bulldog to eclipse 2,000 yards for his career on his long touchdown run in the third. He has 2,058 career yards is the career leader in yards per carry, a # he helped tonight averaging 12.2 yards per carry. He didn't factor into over 240 yards of offense for the Dogs in the first half, but picked his moment to swing the opener of his senior year in the right direction.

The defense gave the Bulldogs the ball back plenty, forcing three turnovers and a few short fields on three-and-outs. Newberry was only 3-of-10 on third-down Conv.

Sophomore Ja'Lon Williams disrupted Newberry's passing game all night, finishing with 4.0 tackles for loss and a sack. The Bulldogs had six tackles for loss and held Newberry to only 55 offensive plays, holding almost a 10-minute advantage in time of possession.

The Citadel struck first, marching 75 yards on 12 plays as Grant Drakeford sparked the offense. Drakeford broke loose from 29 yards out for the game's first touchdown. Brandon Rainey had a 12-yard run on the drive and quarterback Dominique Allen found Cam Jackson for seven yards on third down to keep the drive alive.

The Bulldogs looked poised to jump out by two scores, but a fourth-down attempt from inside the five was ruled just short of the marker. A replay challenge didn't change the mark and Newberry took over inside its own five.

Newberry's Will Elm intercepted Allen on the ensuing possession to set up a 1-yard TD run by the Wolves' Darius Clark to knot the score at 7-7. The Bulldogs managed just 46 yards of offense in the first half, 42 on one play.

The Bulldog defense set up The Citadel's next score. The Citadel kept Newberry backed up inside its own five following a 46-yard punt by Noah Cannon. The Citadel capitalized with an 11-play, 45-yard drive sparked by Jordan Black. Black dove in from 1-yard out to give The Citadel a 14-7 lead at the half.

Following Jackson's third-quarter blow, Black came back on and led a 10-play, 80-yard drive, highlighted by a 37-yard completion to Raleigh Webb and a 6-yard touchdown pass to Josh LeBlanc, the first TD reception of his career.

The Bulldogs rushed for 374 yards and had 454 yards of offense in the win. Newberry had only 276 yards of total offense and was under 250 until the final drive.

Junior Aron Spann III helped the defensive cause in the fourth quarter, running a post route with a Newberry wide receiver for his first interception of the season. Freshman Wally Wilmore grabbed one in the closing seconds to ice the game away.

No. 13 Bulldogs Roll Past Presbyterian, 48-7

CLINTON, S.C. – Dominique Allen had three rushing touchdowns and fellow-quarterback Jordan Black had three passing touchdowns – on three attempts - to lead The Citadel to a 48-7 win over Presbyterian on Saturday at Bailey Memorial Stadium.

The game was originally scheduled to be played in Charleston, but was moved to Clinton midweek due to the threat of Hurricane Irma.

The Citadel (2-0) roared to a 35-7 halftime lead, scoring touchdowns on seven consecutive possessions, to grind down Presbyterian (0-2). The Bulldogs held the ball for over 40 minutes, racking up 536 yards of offense and 435 rushing yards. When The Citadel threw, the execution and production could not have been better. Black finished 3-for-3 for 89 yards. All three completions were touchdowns. Allen completed his only pass for 15 yards.

The Bulldogs punted on their opening possession and did not punt the rest of the day, reeling off seven-straight TD drives all of at least 52 yards and four longer than 10 plays. After a 1-play touchdown drive by PC, the Bulldog defense forced three punts and an interception over the Blue Hose' next four drives as the offense put the game out of reach.

Freshman running back Brandon Rainey had 48 yards on The Citadel's first scoring drive, capped by a 1-yard TD drive by Dom Allen. Rainey finished with a career-best 70 yards on 17 carries.

PC answered the Bulldogs' opening touchdown in one play. Running back Torrance Marable ripped off a 76-yard touchdown run on the first play of the ensuing drive to tie the game, 7-7. A 21-yard run by Raleigh Webb set up the Bulldogs on the next Citadel possession inside the five. Sophomore Lorenzo Ward plunged in from five yards out as The Citadel quickly regained the lead, 14-7, late in the first.

After back-to-back Allen-led scoring drives, Black came on to find Webb for a 57-yard touchdown pass. Webb broke free behind the PC secondary and raced up the left hash for The Citadel's longest pass play to-date.

Black found running back Rod Johnson for The Citadel's next score. Johnson snuck out of the backfield to the goalpost and snagged a touch pass from Black to push the lead to 28-7, capping a6-play, 74-yard drive. The Citadel added another score just before the half to push the lead to 35-7, capitalizing on a Kailik Williams' interception, his first of the season.

Allen added a third one-yard TD run in the second half and Black found Rainey from 14 yards out for the game's final score. Black's legs created the final score, escaping trouble and buying time as Rainey drifted open near the sideline.

Black finished with 102 yards rushing on 12 carries. Allen added 57 yards on 16 carries. Junior Grant Drakeford had seven carries for 84 yards on the day.

The Bulldogs got six tackles from Myles Pierce on a day where the defense spent little time on the field. PC ran only 40 plays. Freshman John Wesley Whiteside came up with a late interception to set off a wild celebration on the Bulldog sideline.

PC had just over 100 yards offense until its final two possessions, ending on downs inside the 10 and on the late pick. PC quarterbacks combined to go 11-of-221 for 108 yards and two interceptions.

The Bulldogs open Southern Conference play next Saturday at ETSU. Kickoff is at 1 p.m. at ETSU's new Greene Stadium.

Big Second Half Lifts Citadel Past ETSU, 31-25

JOHNSON CITY, Tenn. - The Citadel Bulldogs scored 21 unanswered points on their first three drives of the second half to rally past ETSU for a 31-25 win in their Southern Conference opener on Saturday at William B. Greene Stadium.

The Citadel (3-0, 1-0 SoCon) trailed 17-7 after ETSU (1-2, 0-1) added a field goal to its halftime leadto open the second half. The Bulldogs would score touchdowns on their ensuing three possessions to take a 28-17 lead. The Buccaneers cut the lead to three with a touchdown and a conversion, but a stop by The Citadel defense on 4th-and-2 with just over two minutes remaining sealed the win.

The Bulldogs were displaced earlier this week by Hurricane Irma, had a home game moved last weekend, and lost a recent teammate in a car accident. The week was among the toughest in the career of Head Coach Brent Thompson, but his team persevered.

The Bulldogs overcame a couple of miscues on special teams including a botched snap and a shanked field goal to rally from a 10-point deficit. The defense held ETSU to eight yards on two possessions after a field goal by the Buccaneers opened the second half. In the meantime, The Citadel offense reeled off touchdown drive of 75, 66, and 43 yards to completely change the game.

Running back Grant Drakeford rushed for 93 yards on nine carries and wide out Raleigh Webb had touchdowns on his only two touches of the game - one run and one pass. The Bulldogs held ETSU to 26 yards rushing and had four sacks in the win.

ETSU struck first after the Bulldogs turned it over on their first possession, when a snap on the punt hit the up man and the Buccaneers took over at The Citadel 22. Austin Herink found Vincent Lowe on the next play for 22 yards and the game's first score to give ETSU a 7-0 lead.

The Bulldogs answered right back with an 11-play, 75-yard drive capped by a 10-yard touchdown run by Brandon Rainey. All 75 yards came on the ground as the Bulldogs tied the

ETSU capitalized on a short field just before half as Henrik found Drake Powell on a slant from eight yards out to put the Bulldogs down 14-7 at the break, despite outgaining ETSU 221-81 in the opening half.

ETSU opened the second half with a 7-play, 45-yard drive to take a 17-7 lead on a 47-yard field goal by J.J. Jerman. Jajuan Stinson's 18-yard run sparked the drive, moving the Bucs into Citadel territory quickly.

The Bulldogs controlled the next 20 minutes, seizing control of the game.

Dom Allen's 1-yard touchdown run capped a 14-play, 75-yard drive on The Citadel's first possession of the second half. Brandon Berry, in his first action of the season, gave the Bulldogs a burst with 23 punishing yards on six carries on the drive.

A sack by Ja'Lon Williams and Russell Hubbs set up the next Citadel drive. Drakeford's 11-yard run set up the Bulldogs inside the ETSU 20. A perfectly executed reverse to Raleigh Webb for a 7-yard touchdown run early in the fourth gave The Citadel a 21-17 lead.

Allen found Webb for a 28-yard touchdown on the Bulldogs' next possession to add to the lead. Webb broke free up the seam and reeled in a perfect one-hand catch to make it 28-17, The Citadel

ETSU would not go away, Stinson scored on a 4-yard touchdown run with 5:15 to play as the

The Bulldogs lost for the first time in SoCon play under Brent Thompson and the first time since their regular season finale at Chattanooga in 2015.

The Bulldogs went just 2-of-5 in the red zone after starting the season 12-of-14. Empty trips inside the 1 (3rd Qtr.) and inside in the 10 in the 4th kept the Bulldogs from rallying.

Samford's Fast Start Too Much For Bulldogs, 35-14

BIRMINGHAM, Ala. – No. 23 Samford (3-2, 1-1 SoCon) built a 21-0 lead in the opening six minutes and fought off No. 8 Citadel in the second half for a 35-14 win on Saturday afternoon at Seibert Stadium.

Samford quarterback Devlin Hodges completed two touchdown passes of over 60 yards in the opening half to spark the Bulldog offense early. The Citadel had its opportunities in the second half to cut into the Samford lead, but was held on downs twice inside the Samford 10-yard line.

Hodges Completed 21-of-26 passes for 323 yards and three touchdowns, including two in the opening three minutes and another 63-yarder to TaDarryl Marshall in the second quarter as the Bulldogs built a 35-0 lead. The Citadel scored twice, including on the opening drive of the second half, but two empty trips inside the Samford 10-yard line kept The Citadel from threatening late.

"It was too big of a hole for us to dig out of," Citadel head coach Brent Thompson said afterward. "We just did things that aren't typical for us. We didn't tackle very well. We gave up big plays, and we didn't come out ready to play football. They are very athletic and a very good football team, but we should've been ready to play."

Sophomore quarterback Jordan Black sparked the Bulldogs to two touchdown drives, punching it in from 1-yard out in the middle of the second quarter following a Kailik Williams' interception. Williams snagged a Hodges overthrow and raced up the left sideline, bumped out as he dove for the pylon to spark The Citadel, cutting the lead to 35-7.

The Citadel opened the second half with an impressive drive to cut into the lead. Brandon Rainey's 8-yard touchdown run capped a Jordan Black led drive that looked a little more like the Bulldog offense that entered the game as the nation's No. 1 rushing offense. The 12-play, 78-yard drive took over six minutes off the clock and cut the lead to 35-14 mid-third quarter.

An offsides penalty, and coming up six inches short on a fourth down attempt, kept things from getting very interesting the final half of the fourth, as the Bulldogs came up empty twice inside the Samford 10.

"We had the ball in the red zone and we just couldn't score," Thompson said of the Bulldogs' rally. "I thought we responded better in the second half, but still when we had opportunities to put points on the board, we didn't. We put ourselves in bad situations and had to go for touchdowns instead of field goals."

Black finished 5-of-11 passing for 136 yards, a career high. He also rushed for 60 yards and a touchdown. Brandon Rainey ran for 59 yards on 18 carries.

Williams led The Citadel defense with 11 tackles, an interception, and a tackle for loss.

Kelvin McKnight finished with six receptions for 97 yards and a touchdown. He also caught a flea flicker on the Bulldogs' second snap to quickly shorten the field for Samford.

Samford had nine tackles for loss as a defense, led by 12 tackles from Ahmad Gooden who had two TFLs.

The Citadel returns home for the first time in five weeks on Saturday as Mercer visits Johnson Hagood Stadium for The Citadel's SoCon home opener. Kickoff is at 2 p.m. for Parents' Day.
