# MAURICE DRAYTON

HEAD COACH | 3RD SEASON THE CITADEL, '98

Former Bulldog cadet-athlete and defensive coordinator Maurice Drayton currently serves as the head football coach at The Citadel. The announcement was made by former Director of Athletics Mike Capaccio on Dec. 14, 2022.

"We are very excited to have Maurice back at The Citadel," said Capaccio. "We conducted a very thorough search and it was clear that Maurice was the best person for this position. He understands what it takes to be a cadet-athlete at The Citadel, and also understands what it takes to be successful on the field."

Across two seasons at the helm, Drayton orchestrated immense strides for the program, ending his second campaign holding claim to the Silver Shako (vs. VMI), the Big Dog Bowl (vs. Wofford) and the inaugural Lowcountry Boil Bowl, a recently-created trophy designed to enhance a longtime local rivalry with crosstown adversary Charleston Southern. Additionally, four players -- P James Platte, LS Nathan Tokar, QB Johnathan Bennett & KOR Braylon Knauth -- scored All-SoCon honors for their stellar performances on the season.

Statistically, the Bulldogs consistently maintained pace with high-level competition, concluding the regular season ranked first within the SoCon in tackles-for-loss allowed (4.0 per game), second in rushing offense (175.1 yards per game) and time of possession (31:11) and third in passing defense (203.5 yards per game), third-down conversion percentage (.379) and third-down defense (.345).

Notably, however, The Citadel special teams anchored the team throughout the year, logging a division-best eight blocked kicks while the punting unit punished opposing offenses off the leg of five-time All-American James Platte, who closed the season second within the FCS and fifth nationally behind a 47.3 yards per punt average.

A former standout player and defensive coordinator, Drayton returned to The Citadel after spending the previous seven seasons working in the NFL. He most recently served as the assistant special teams coordinator for the Las Vegas Raiders. Drayton also acted as the special teams coordinator in Green Bay in 2021, assistant special teams coordinator for the Packers from 2018-20, and assisted with special teams for the Indianapolis Colts in 2016-17.

In his final season in Green Bay, Drayton worked with newcomer punter Corey Bojorquez, who finished with the highest gross punting average (46.5 avg.) in a season (min. 35 punts) in franchise history. He also saw K Mason Crosby set a new franchise record with a streak of 24 consecutive field goals made from 2019-2021.

Drayton's first season with the Colts saw him guide Pat McAfee to his second Pro Bowl after leading the league with a 49.3 yard average. Additionally, he helped Adam Vinatieri register his 19th and 20th 100-point seasons, extending his NFL record.

"I want to thank Gen. Walters, Mike Capaccio and the entire committee for giving me this opportunity. I made the decision several years ago to take the road less traveled, and it allowed me to meet people that have remained loyal.

"I believe in the divine power of God and that has moved in the minds of those who extended the invitation to return home. For me and my family, Moncks Corner, Charleston and The Citadel will always be home. I am prepared to assist in taking our school to the next level."

Drayton served as The Citadel's defensive coordinator from 2014-15, helping the Bulldogs to the 2015 Southern Conference Championship. The 2015 defense led the conference with 31 takeaways, 11 fumble recoveries, 10 passing TDs allowed and a 36.5 opponent third-down conversion percentage. The defense also ranked third in the FCS with 20 interceptions, including five returned for touchdowns.

All-in-all, Drayton spent 14 seasons at The Citadel as a player or coach prior to taking over the helm as head coach ahead of the 2023 campaign. He earned his bachelor's degree in physical education in 1998 and his master's in education in 2007.

As a player, Drayton was a two-year starter at cornerback and finished his career with 145 tackles, 17 pass break-ups and three interceptions.

After completing his eligibility in 1998, Drayton spent the next seven seasons as a member of the Bulldog coaching staff. He began as a graduate assistant/secondary coach, before spending the 2000 season coaching the tackles/tight ends. He also worked with the wide receivers (2001) and outside linebackers (2002), before spending the 2003-05 seasons coaching the secondary, special teams and serving as the recruiting coordinator.

Drayton spent the 2006 season as the defensive coordinator for the Seinajoki (Finland) Crocodiles of the European Football League. He spent 2007 as an assistant principal and assistant coach at Goose Creek High School.

Drayton joined the staff at South Carolina State in 2008, coaching the defensive backs and special teams. In his two seasons in Orangeburg, Drayton helped SCSU capture a pair of Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) titles.

Drayton spent the 2010-11 seasons as the assistant head coach, special teams coordinator and wide receivers coach at Coastal Carolina.

He would serve as the secondary coach for former Bulldog head coach Ellis Johnson at Southern Miss in 2012 before working with the defense and special teams with the Montreal Alouettes of the Canadian Football League in 2013.

A native of Moncks Corner, S.C., Drayton and his wife are the proud parents of two children.

### NOTABLE NOTES

### **DRAYTON DELIVERS**

Maurice Drayton guided the Bulldogs to a five-win improvement from year one to year two, the largest season-to-season victory bump for any head coach in program history. Further, the team's three-victory surge in SoCon competition matches HC Mike Houston's 2015 squad, which collected six league wins en route to a SoCon Championship before later advancing into the second round of the FCS Playoffs.

### TRIPLE THREAT

In the SoCon kickoff at Samford, The Citadel managed to score a touchdown during all three phases of the game -- offense, defense & special teams, a first for the program since hosting Chowan on Sept. 4, 2010. In the more recent matchup against Samford, the Bulldogs found the end zone on three offensive occasions -- two receiving scores for JGB plus a Quentin Hayes rushing TD -- while tacking on a pair of scoop 'n scores to round out the triple play, the first courtesy of Sayre Smothers on a 31-yard recovery for a defensive TD with the second coming via a 59-yard return from Bradlee Jones on a botched fake field goal.

### **NEVER GONNA GIVE YOU UP**

The Citadel offense has continuously evolved under third-year head coach Maurice Drayton, improving across a variety of categories thus far into his tenure; however, arguably the most significant adjustment has come in the form of ball control. Through the first six games of the campaign, the Bulldogs have surrendered just five turnovers, good for the 12th-best mark in the FCS and the top position amongst SoCon brethren. Comparably, The Citadel coughed up 16 turnovers last year (48th nationally, first league-wide) while giving up a grand total 21 during Drayton's first run back in 2023 (95th in FCS, seventh within the SoCon).

### #DISRUPTOR

Defensive end Chris Benton has defined The Citadel pass rush across the opening slate of the season, logging a pair of sacks against Samford -- both solo takedowns -- with two QB hurries followed up by another set at Gardner-Webb -- one solo, two assists. Currently, the junior ranks 28th within the FCS for the category as well as third overall league-wide. As a unit, the Bulldogs' defensive front has proven difficult for opposing offenses to properly deal with in terms of penetrataion, racking up 2.17 sacks per game en route to the No. 32 position on the FCS leaderboard as well as third conference-wide while also logging 5.8 tackles-for-loss per game, good for 44th nationally and sixth amongst league opponents.

### THAT TRACKS

The continued success of third-year mainstay Bradlee Jones both in the secondary and on special teams has many potential attributions, but the most reasonable explanation boils down to an unteachable quality -- pure speed, an advantage the junior has leveraged into multiple recognitions with The Citadel Track & Field team. Currently, Jones serves as the reigning SoCon champion in a trio of speed-centric events: the 60m (indoor), 100m (outdoor) and 200m (outdoor), scoring the league's Most Outstanding Track Performer honors for his effort. Additionally, he holds the program record in the 100m dash as well, clocking a 10.31 mark at the East Coast Relays in early May.

### AN OFFICER, A GENTLEMAN & A QUARTERBACK

Air Force standout QB Quentin Hayes serves as the first incoming transfer from a fellow service academy since former VMI tailback Alex Ramsey joined the Bulldogs as a graduate prior to the 2021 campaign. A statistical leader for the Falcons last year under center, Hayes compiled a strong 4-2 record across his six starts and 10 total appearances during the 2024 season, logging a team-best 455 yards with three touchdowns through the air on 25-of-43 passing while netting 466 yards on the ground on 126 carries for another seven scores.

### MILITARY DISCIPLINE

In spite of the mascot, The Citadel has managed to avoid the doghouse often thus far into the season, ranking first FCS-wide with 3.00 penalties per game while sitting fourth nationally with just 30.50 penalty yards per game. Notably, the Bulldogs opened the 2025 campaign against No. 1 NDSU with zero penalties, a first for the program since 2014 against then-No. 1 Florida State.

### JONESING FOR A NEW RECORD

Late during the Bulldogs' 2025 SoCon kickoff at Samford, Bradlee Jones found himself the beneficiary of a Melvin Ravenel forced fumble midway through a botched fake field goal, scooping and scoring for a 59-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown. Notably, the 59-yard distance serves as the second longest fumble recovery for a TD in program history, falling 11 yards short of matching Vincent Hill's 70-yard score at Florida State in 2005.

### STARTING OFF ON THE RIGHT (OR LEFT) FOOT

A monumental effort from graduate student James Platte provided the Bulldogs a dynamic edge in terms of field position throughout last season, capping the year with a program-best 47.1 punting average -- good for the top mark in the SoCon and third-best within the FCS -- with 18 punts breaking the 50-yard mark while a total 17 pinned opposing teams inside the 20-yard line. Thus far into the 2025 campaign, the stud boot has continued his usual antics, averaging 47.3 yards per punt -- good for fourth nationally and first within the SoCon -- with nine coffin corners inside the 20-yard line and 13 sailing over 50 yards.

### POUND THE ROCK

Following back-to-back 300-yard-plus rushing performances against Chattanooga (336) and Valdosta State (355), the Bulldogs' ground game has turned the corner after a slow start to the campaign. In spite of the early-season setbacks, The Citadel still ranks as one of the top rushing attacks in the FCS, sitting at 12th nationally and first within the SoCon behind a 214.2 yards per game mark. Individually, the triple threat of Cobey Thompkins (271 yards), Quentin Hayes (264 yards, three TDs) and Garrison Johnson Sr. (209 yards, four TD) has given opposing defenses fits, especially when factoring in the downhill nature of redshirt freshman Sebastien 'Bash' Boyle (202 yards, three TDs) as well.

### POSSESSION IS NINE-TENTHS OF THE LAW

After narrowly missing the mark during Drayton's first season at the helm, the 2024 campaign saw The Citadel offense return to averaging 30:00 minutes of possession or more on the year, with the Bulldogs ranking inside the top five nationally for the category in seven of the past 10 seasons. In spite of a rough start for the third-year head coach in the statistic (three sub-30:00 games of first four), the past two contests has generated a noteworthy rebound for the Bulldogs, swinging the season average back above the midpoint position to 30:04, a first for the campaign

### WHEN OPPORTUNITY KNOCKS...

Bolstered by a five-turnover performance at Samford, The Citadel currently boasts a 0.33 turnover margin on the year, good for the 40th-best mark nationally and third overall in the SoCon. Of particular note, all seven turnovers -- four interceptions and a trio of fumble recoveries -- on the season have come from different Bulldogs, including Camden Gray, Lee Alexander and Tyrik McDaniel & Cale Williams for the former category and Nikolas Mirabella, Sayre Smothers plus Bradlee Jones on the latter, the final of two of which concluded with an end zone visit.

### THE CALM COMES BEFORE THE STORM

Despite a banner year for the special teams unit in 2024, including an FCS-best eight blocked kicks, the Bulldogs had been stymied thus far into the season; however, J'hari Mosley and punt return team shook the proverbial monkey off the team's back against VSU, snuffing out the initial Blazers kick early in the first.

- Eight SoCon teams are in action on Saturday. League-leading Mercer is on a bye this week.
- Mercer is ranked 16th in the AFCA Top 25 poll and 20th in the Stats Perform poll.
- Mercer is tied for first in FCS football in sacks with 24. The Bears are fourth in nation tackles for loss per game (8.3).
- Western Carolina received votes in the AFCA and Stats Perform poll. ETSU and Furman each got votes in the AFCA poll.
- Wofford hosts Furman for the 99th meeting between the two programs. The Terriers are looking for their third straight win in the series. The two squads have split the last six meetings overall. Wofford comes into the game with three touchdowns on special teams, while Furman has three scores on defense.
- The 48th installment of the Rail Rivalry between ETSU and Chattanooga takes place this week. The Mocs have won the last five meetings, with the Bucs last winning in 2018, 17-14, in Johnson City. The game features the top two players in rushing yards in the SoCon in Chattanooga's Justus Durant (448) and ETSU's Devontae Houston (423).
- Samford has won the last three meetings against VMI. The Keydets last win over the Bulldogs was in 2021.
- The Citadel and Western Carolina each come into Saturday's game with a loss in the month of October. The Catamounts have won four of the last five meetings between the top programs, with the Bulldogs' win coming in 2022 in Cullowhee. The Citadel is the least penalized team in FCS football as they average only three per game.
- Furman's Joshua Stoneking leads FCS football in sacks (10.5) and tackles for loss per game (2.42).
- •The conference boasts four of the top 11 passing offenses in the country. Western Carolina (335.9), Samford (294.2), Mercer (278.2) and Furman (267.5) are ranked second, fifth, eighth and 11th, respectively.
- VMI's Owen Sweeney and Western Carolina's James Tyre both have six receiving touchdowns this season, which ties them for seventh-best in the country in the category.

### • The SoCon prides itself on quality and depth.

• Eight of the nine current SoCon football members have participated in the FCS Playoffs with seven different schools receiving bids since 2016.

- The league has had a different champion in each of the last six years.
- Overall, current SoCon football members have combined for 53 total FCS playoffs appearances.
- The SoCon has had seven Walter Payton Award winners, two Buck Buchanan Award winners and five Eddie Robinson Award winners.
- Sixty-six former SoCon players and coaches have been enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame, with App State's Armanti Edwards and Marshall's Randy Moss serving as the most recent inductees from the league in 2024.
- Former SoCon player James Bradberry, who played cornerback for Samford from 2012-15, was a part of the Philadelphia Eagles' Super Bowlwinning squad in February.
- The SoCon broadcasts all of its home games on ESPN+ and has an over-the-air television network that will air six games in five southern states in 2025.
- The SoCon has been playing Division I FCS football since the 1982 season. The NCAA created two subdivisions for Division I football beginning in 1978 with the creation of I-A (now FBS) and I-AA (now FCS). The SoCon was shifted from I-A to I-AA along with the Ivy League and Southland Conference following the 1981 season, joining the Mid-Continent, Big Sky, MEAC, SWAC, OVC, and Yankee conferences, along with a number of independents, as I-AA participants.
- The 2024 season was the 103rd of Southern Conference football. The SoCon is the fourth-oldest NCAA Division I college athletic association.
