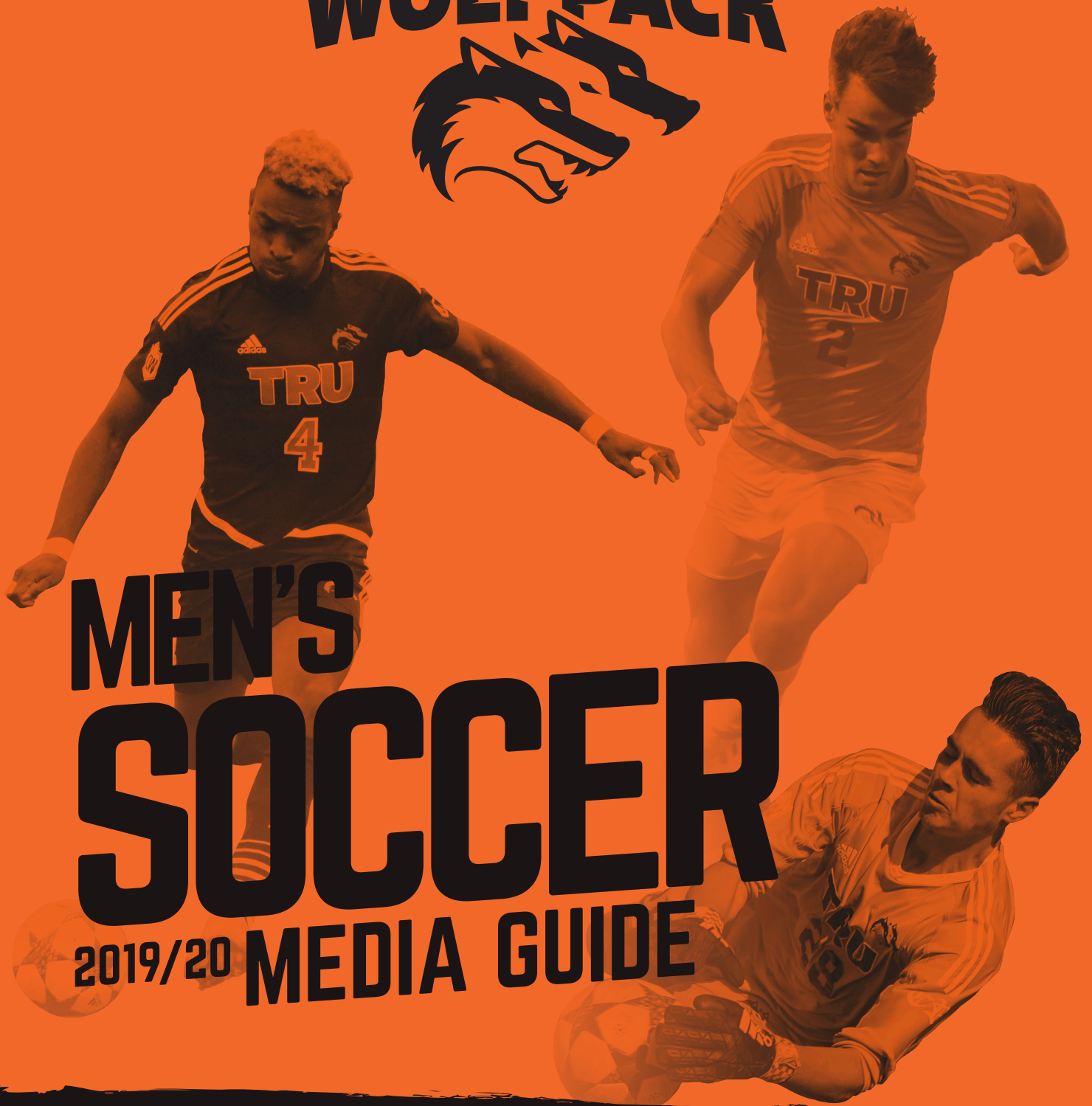

2019 TRU WOLFPACK **MEN'S SOCCER**



The most consistent team among the WolfPack U SPORTS family the last two seasons has been the men's soccer program. After joining U SPORTS and Canada West soccer six seasons ago, TRU and head coach John Antulov have racked up not only a U SPORTS bronze medal (2017-18) but also two straight Canada West bronze medals (2017-18 and 2018-19).

This year's squad has some major holes to fill after three of the program's top players (Mitch Popadynetz, Thomas Lantmeeters and Finlay McPhie) graduated.

"Replacing those three players is huge," Antulov said. "I think we have brought in players that could definitely meet our needs. Those are huge holes to fill not only skills-wise but in the area of leadership as well, both on and off the field. We have brought in some quality players to fill those holes."

Antulov has brought in players from not only Europe, but NCAA Division II and college transfers from PACWEST as well. "The good thing is that these players approached us about playing here. The success we've had over the last couple of years has really afforded us the luxury of being fairly selective of players we want to have here. These are guys who we think can really benefit our program. That includes a lot of young kids from Kamloops and the Interior. These are players we think can come in and do a job."

Canada West second team all-star Jan Pirretas Glasmacher (Barcelona, Spain), Josh Banton (London, England), James Fraser (Penticton, BC) and Justin Donaldson (Kamloops, BC) will all be expected to take bigger roles on the WolfPack this year. Banton played PDL soccer this summer in Victoria before he, Glasmacher, Fraser, Popadynetz and McPhie joined the Saskatchewan Selects to play some exhibition CPL contests in Saskatoon in July and August.

Jackson Gardner (Chilliwack, BC) took over as the starting keeper with the WolfPack in his rookie campaign. He has returned for his sophomore season. A player to watch is defender Adam Swanson (North Vancouver, BC) who is returning after missing last season recovering from a serious knee injury.

COACHING STAFF



JOHN ANTULOV HEAD COACH

Antulov is in his 13th season with the WolfPack—the last six as head coach. He was named to the position in June, 2014. He is a CSA National “A” Licence coach and is also a BC Soccer Learning Facilitator. He is the former head coach of the Kamloops Youth Soccer Association. Antulov was born and raised in Kamloops and played professionally for the Vancouver 86’ers. He played university soccer at Simon Fraser University and was also an assistant coach with them. He runs the Vancouver Whitecaps Kamloops Academy.

TIM HUTTON ASSISTANT COACH

Hutton is into his sixth year as an assistant coach with the WolfPack and has coached for 18 seasons. He is arguably the best player ever to wear a soccer uniform at Cariboo College/ University College of the Cariboo/TRU. Hutton played here in the mid-80’s. He also played six seasons (1993-99) for the Kamloops Heat in the Pacific Coast Soccer League. Hutton coaches in the Vancouver Whitecaps Kamloops Academy in his spare time. Both of his children (Jodi and Kyle) have been members of the WolfPack soccer program in the past.



PETER SOBERLAK ASSISTANT COACH

Soberlak is into his third year as assistant coach with the WolfPack soccer team. He has also spent 13 seasons as the Sports Psychology Consultant with the TRU athletic program. Peter was named The TRU WolfPack Athletic Performance Advisor in January 2018. He was the mental performance coach for the Kelowna Rockets for three seasons and spent two years in the same role for the Kamloops Blazers. Peter is a former pro hockey player (first round NHL draft pick for the Edmonton Oilers in 1987) and played five years in the American Hockey League. He played four seasons in the Western Hockey League for the Kamloops Blazers and Swift Current Broncos. He is married to Amy and has two children Jake (9) and Cole (5).



BRANDON MENDEZ ASSISTANT COACH

After taking a year off from coaching to play out his athletic eligibility (2017-18), Mendez is into his third year as an assistant coach. He also co-coached the Kamloops Wolfpack of the Pacific Coast Soccer League's Premiere Division for a second straight season. He is an alum of the WolfPack soccer program and a graduate of the Respiratory Therapy degree program at TRU. He also coaches in the Whitecap Academy program and growing up, he was a volunteer coach at Rubens Academy in Calgary. Mendez is married to Kelsie and they have a daughter, Peyton Katalayna (4).



HEE-YOUNG CHUNG ASSISTANT COACH

Chung is into his second year as an assistant coach with the WolfPack. He returned to Kamloops in 2018 after spending a few years working in Calgary, Alberta. He played for the WolfPack and the University College of the Cariboo (2002-2004 and 2007). Chung played two seasons at the University of Victoria (2005-06). He helped coach the Kamloops WolfPack in the Pacific Coast Soccer League Premier division for the second straight summer with Brandon Mendez.



DINO BERNARDO MANAGER

Bernardo returns to the program after serving as manager of the University College of the Cariboo Sun Demons from 1998-2000. Bernardo is very involved in the community and is on the Kamloops Sports Council and Kamloops Downtown Business Association. He was formerly the President and GM of the Kamloops Broncos Junior Football team. He and fellow soccer alum Chris Monteleone own the Commodore Restaurant. His coaching philosophy is: "hard work will always beat out talent that doesn't work hard." Bernardo has been involved as a player and organizer of the Kamloops Men's Soccer League for 25 years. He likes being involved in university athletics because it gave him some of his best friends and life connections. "I want to help others achieve this and help them to become better humans along the way," Bernardo says.

1 JACKSON GARDNER

**Chilliwack, BC
(Sardis Secondary)
6'1" Goalkeeper
2nd year (Business)
Age: 18**

Jackson was a finalist for the TRU Athletics "Newcomer of the Year" award after starting nine matches, having a record of 5-3-1 with two shutouts. He gave up 11 goals (fourth best in the Canada West) and had a goals against average of 1.22 (also fourth best in the league). He was the MVP of the Provincial Cup Final in 2017 and conceded the least amount of goals in the BC Soccer Premier League that year, conceding only twelve goals in fifteen matches. He also went two years without giving up a goal in grades 11 and 12 at Sardis Secondary in Chilliwack, BC. Jackson enjoys many sports, having also played volleyball in middle school, though soccer has always been his passion. He is a big fan of the Chelsea FC and says their Champions League win in 2012 was his favourite moment in sports history. Jackson chose to attend TRU because he says the men's soccer team is clearly destined for success and he wants to be a part of it.



2 JAN PIRRETAS GLASMACHER (YAN PEER-ET-TAS GLASS-MASH-ER)

6'3" Defense
3rd year (Business)
Age: 21**

Jan was a second team Canada West all-star in 2018 after being chosen to the 2017 Canada West "all rookie" team. He has started all 29 career Canada West matches he has been involved in. Jan is one of four team captains on the WolfPack in 2019-20. Jan scored three goals last season and added two assists while firing 31 shots (10 of them were on goal). He had one game winning goal for the 'Pack in 2018. Jan's father is Spanish and his mother is German, as a result, he was able to play for the German U-16 National team in 2014, which is his fondest sports moment. He spent two years (2014-16) with the Blackburn Rovers U-18 squad in England. The year previous (2013-14), he trained with the U-15 German National Team while playing club soccer with U.D. Cornelia (U-16) in Spain's top tier. He played matches with the Saskatchewan Selects of the Canadian Professional Soccer League this summer.



3 HARRY COLES

3rd year (Sport Event Management)
Age: 22**

Harry committed to the WolfPack in late July of 2017. He dressed and started in five matches last year before picking up an injury and has participated in nine career matches. Harry is no stranger to Kamloops as he played several exhibition games here in early July of 2017 with Moreton Academy of the United Kingdom. His team won eleven games and tied once. Playing in a U-18 international tournament in Barcelona, Spain is one of his fondest memories. His family is his greatest influence, especially his mother Alison who he says encouraged him to play soccer and gave him the opportunity to do so. Another great influence is his soccer coach and mentor Mick Murphy, who also encouraged his soccer career. Harry also enjoys playing golf and cricket. He enjoys music and his favourite bands are the Arctic Monkeys and the Rifles. His favourite movie is Ocean's Eleven and his favourite actor is Denzel Washington. Joshua committed to the WolfPack in late July of 2017. He has started in all 24 Canada West career matches that he has dressed for. Josh is one of four team captains on the 'Pack this year. He has scored four league goals (three in 2018). Joshua added 17 shots with eight of them on goal. Two of his goals last year were game winners. He was chosen for the 2017 Canada West All Rookie Team. Joshua played this past summer in the PDL (Premier Development League) for the Victoria Highlanders. He then joined the Saskatchewan Selects along with current teammates Jan Pirretas, James Fraser and alum Finlay McPhie and Mitch Popadynetz to play some exhibition matches in the Canadian Pro Soccer League. His greatest sports moment came on April 3, 2017, when he scored using a bicycle kick in a semifinal game that his team, Waltham Forest, won against Eton Manor. Josh hopes to become a psychologist after graduating university. Josh has played soccer, basketball, and rugby competitively, and participated in swimming and track and field during elementary and secondary school.



5 ADAM CALNE (CONN)

Adam committed to the WolfPack in November 2018 along with his longtime minor soccer teammate Denzel Marican. Both played most recently with Thompson Okanagan Football Club, where the captain of that squad is fellow TRU rookie Ethan Furlong. Adam was the first male player from Kamloops to play Thompson Okanagan Football Club for the full six years and was selected to play in the Okanagan Valley high school all-star game in 2017. In his second year with TOFC, he scored a goal which put his team into the playoffs. Adam's father, uncle, aunt and grandfather all played university rugby. His favourite number is two, his favourite color is blue, he enjoys hip-hop music and his other interests include mountain biking, skiing and kiteboarding. His dream job would be physiotherapist. He dressed for five matches in 2018 and started twice. Scott's brother-in-law is former WolfPack great Ryan Glanville, and Scott has also played soccer with Ryan's brother, TRU alum Sean Glanville, in Williams Lake. Scott was a member of Team BC in 2015 and was a member of the European Football School's Euro Tour team in 2014. He loves soccer because of the freedom and allowance for creativity, but enjoys many sports. His greatest sports moment was scoring in the last minute of a zone match in 2013, sending his team to the provincial championships. Something most people don't know about Scott is that he plays the guitar. His biggest influence is Lionel Messi, who risked everything to pursue his dreams. He had 53 shots on goal in 2018 (third most in Canada West), adding five goals and three assists with one of his goals being a game winner. Justin currently has 18 goals in his time with the WolfPack and would love to add to that tally this season. Justin has finished his Early Childhood Diploma and is now enrolled in the Business program, majoring in Human Resource Management and minoring in Project Management. Justin was a member of Team Canada, competing in martial arts. He is also a competitive sporting clay shooter, hunter and fisherman. One of Justin's greatest sports moments came in high school when he was able to play alongside his brother, former PACWEST player Zach Donaldson-Hall. Age: 20**

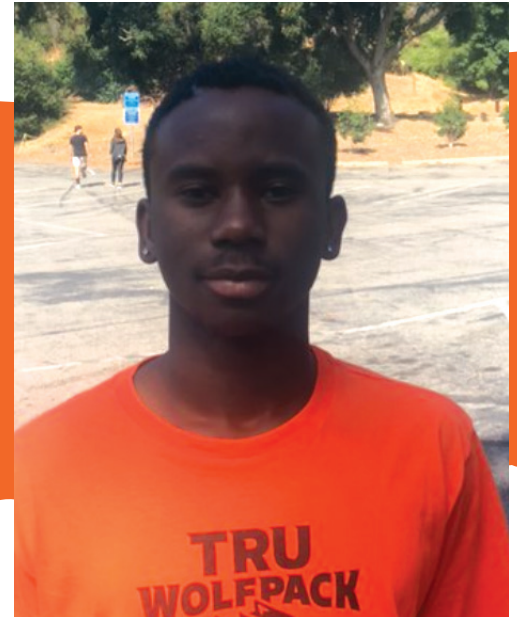

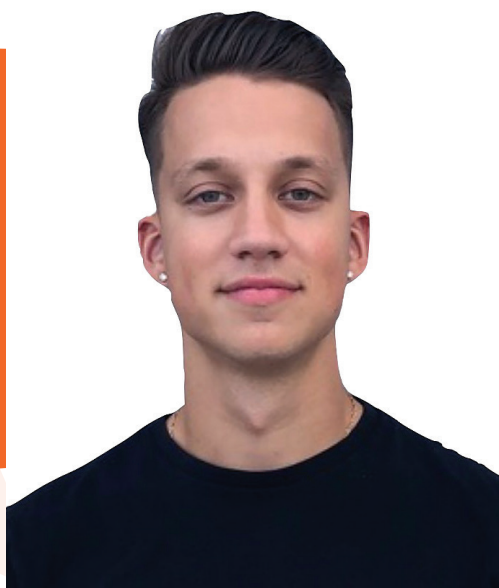

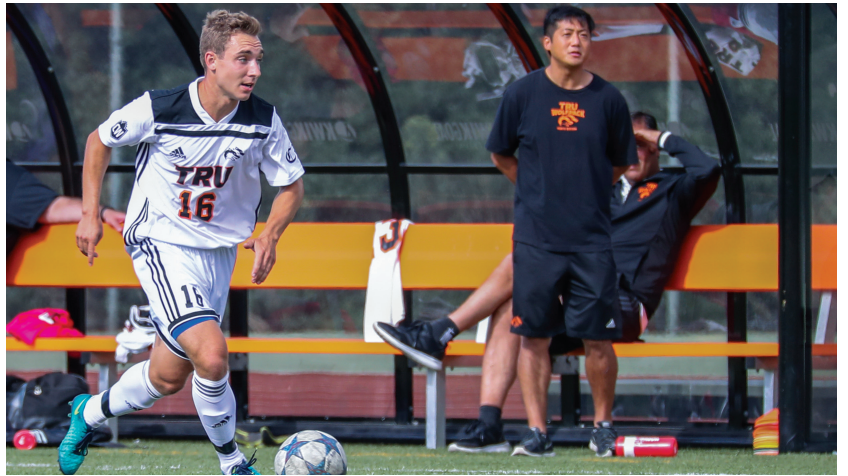
