**TIGERS SEEK FIRST-EVER WIN OVER NEW HAMPSHIRE:** Since the Tigers joined Colonial Athletic Association Football in 2004, no team has been tougher on the Tigers than New Hampshire ... Towson and New Hampshire are playing for the seventh time ... UNH leads, 6-0 ... In the four CAA games, UNH's average margin of victory has been 39.25 points ... UNH is averaging 55.8 points per game against Towson ... The teams met for the first time in 1980 when Towson was an NCAA Division II program ... The first two games went down to the wire:

**1980: UNH 10, Towson 6:** UNH intercepted 6 passes en route to a 10-6 win at Towson ... **Curt Collins** gave UNH a 7-0 lead when he scored on a 9-yard run ... The Tigers pulled to within 7-6 when future NFL All-Pro punter **Sean Landeta** kicked two field goals ... His 51-yard field goal on the final play of the half set a school record ... But, **Rusty Foster's** 23-yard field goal clinched the win ... UNH held Towson to 22 yards rushing.

**1981: UNH 31, Towson 29:** In a wild game, **Curt Collins** caught a 10-yard TD pass from **Denis Stevens** with 11 minutes left as the unbeaten Wildcats avoided a major upset with a 31-29 win ... UNH came into the game as the number two-ranked team in NCAA Division I-AA and built a 24-7 third quarter lead ... Reserve quarterback **Joe Anderson** rallied the Tigers, who scored 22 points in 8 minutes to take a 29-24 lead on a 10-yard TD pass to **Brian O'Neal** ... Anderson completed 12 of 25 passes for 178 yards and 2 touchdowns.

**2004: UNH 62, Towson 24:** All-American **Ricky Santos** threw five TD passes in the first half as the Wildcats built a 45-3 halftime lead and cruised to a 62-24 win in snowy Durham ... Santos completed 12 of 21 passes for 166 yards while **David Ball** had 4 TD receptions ... **Andrew Goldbeck** completed 28 of 50 passes for 319 yards and a TD for Towson.

**2005: UNH 62, Towson 21:** For the second straight year, **Ricky Santos** led UNH to a one-sided win ... The #3 Wildcats raced to a 27-7 halftime lead ... Santos completed 23 of 33 passes for 422 yards and 3 touchdowns and ran for 2 TD's ... In 2 career games against Towson, he completed 35 of 54 passes (.648) for 588 yards and 8 TD's.

**2008: UNH 42, Towson 14:** In a strange game, the Tigers controlled the clock for more than 40 minutes and outgained UNH by a 446-434 margin ... But, the #10 Wildcats used four big plays to hand the Tigers a 42-14 loss ... **Ryan Hinds'** 74-yard interception return for a TD gave UNH a 7-0 lead ... UNH exploded for 28 points in the last 11:09 of the first half to take a 35-7 lead ... Quarterback **R.J. Toman** completed 20 of 26 passes for 292 yards and 4 TD's ... **Sean Schaefer** completed 34 of 48 passes for 309 yards for Towson while **Hakeem Moore** caught 9 passes for 110 yards.

**2009: UNH 57, Towson 7:** The #6 Wildcats exploded for 30 points in the first 7:44 of the game on their way to a 57-7 win ... After a **Chad Kackert** TD run gave UNH an early lead, the Wildcats scored 23 points in just 97 seconds ... An 8-yard TD pass from **Kevin Decker** to **Scott Sicko** put UNH up by 14-0 ... Then, a bad center snap on a punt resulted in a safety for a 16-0 lead ... **Sean Jellison** returned the free kick 81 yards for a TD to make it 23-0 ... On the first play after the kickoff, **Dino Vasso** had a 31-yard interception return for a TD ... **Ryan McGuinness** added a 96-yard interception return for another TD ... UNH intercepted 6 passes ... Towson's lone highlight was a 24-yard TD pass from **Peter Athens** to **Alex Blake**.

**TIGERS SEEK SEASON-ENDING WIN:** For the first time since the 2003 season, the Tigers are not playing their final regular season game against James Madison ... Towson has lost its last six season finales against JMU ... The Tigers' last win in a season finale was a 27-9 victory at Georgetown in the final game of the 2001 season.

**2nd season**

Only the fourth head coach in Towson football history, Rob Ambrose is no stranger to the Tiger football program. A 1993 Towson graduate, he started his coaching career while he was still a student.

From 1992 to 2000, he served as a member of the Towson coaching staff. He was the Tigers' Wide Receivers Coach from 1992 to 1996. In 1997, Coach Gordy Combs promoted him to Offensive Coordinator. In 2000, he earned the title of Associate Head Coach.

Coach Ambrose left his alma mater after the 2000 season and became the head coach at Catholic University. After one year at Catholic, he joined the coaching staff at the University of Connecticut where he worked for Coach Randy Eadsall.

Coach Ambrose spent seven seasons on the UConn staff as the program moved from NCAA Division I-AA status to NCAA Division I-A classification. Ambrose spent four years as the Quarterbacks Coach at UConn and three years as the Offensive Coordinator.

During that time, he helped UConn compile a 49-36 record with the first three Bowl Game appearances in school history. In 2004, UConn beat Toledo in the Motor City Bowl, 39-10. In 2007, UConn faced Wake Forest in the Meineke Car Care Bowl and lost to the Demon Deacons. In his final season at UConn, the Huskies earned a berth in the International Bowl in Toronto. Ambrose coached the Huskies to a win over Buffalo even though he had already been named as the new coach at Towson.

A native of Middletown, Md., Ambrose is the son of Tim Ambrose, one of the winningest high school coaches in the state of Maryland. He played for his father at Middletown High School. His younger brother, Jared, was an assistant coach at Delaware for two years and is part of the Tigers' coaching staff this season. He is the Tigers' Tight Ends Coach.

He was named as the Tigers' head coach on December 27, 2008.

**QUOTING ROB AMBROSE**

**On the loss to Maine:** "I know we are making progress. I see it every day. Last year, we were getting destroyed in these CAA games. We were getting manhandled physically. This year, we're not winning the fight – but we are in the fight. We're in the fight with a chance to win, so I know there is progress."

**On New Hampshire:** "Looking at New Hampshire on film, I can tell that they have some of the best players in the CAA at their positions. I am not sure how they've lost any games. Coach (Sean) McDonnell has his program rolling. Whenever they have players graduate, it seems like they have someone all set to take their place. That's how you go to the playoffs six years in a row. They don't rebuild. They just reload. We'll go up there and just play the game six seconds at a time and see how it turns out."

**On the Tigers' quarterback situation:** "We told our players that this is more adversity that we need to deal with. It's something you can't really anticipate. We can't lose sight of what the objective is here. We are constantly evaluating and we are looking to see how people respond to adversity. We will go with Bart (Blanchard) and Brian (Potts) in the last two games. I know they will be fully prepared for this opportunity."

**On the play of Defensive Back Jordan Dangerfield:** "Jordan has had quite an impact on our team. He loves to hit and he has raised the physical ability of our defensive backs. He has taught our defensive players how to hit hard. It's getting to the point where any receiver we play knows he is going to get hit hard."

**On the play of Hakeem Moore:** "Hakeem could be the poster child for a team player. It's been exciting to watch his growth as a player and a person over the last two years. 'Hock' doesn't care how many how passes he catches or how often he has to block. He just wants to help his team be successful. He's an emotional player but he has learned to focus his enthusiasm. Good things happen when we get him the ball."

**On the Tiger seniors:** "We are grateful for the efforts and sacrifices that this group of seniors has put forth in the name of Towson University football. Their prideful efforts will be remembered for years to come. We are looking forward to having them return to campus to invest in the old and newer traditions of Tiger football."

**TIGERS AGAINST RANKED TEAMS:** For sixth time this season, the Tigers will be playing a Colonial Athletic Association team that is ranked when they face New Hampshire ... As members of the CAA, the Tigers get to play nationally-ranked teams on an almost-weekly basis ... In September, the Tigers faced #1 Villanova and lost, 43-7 ... On Oct. 2, the Tigers dropped a 27-14 decision to #8 Massachusetts ... On Oct. 9, the Tigers hosted #7 James Madison and nearly pulled off an upset before losing, 17-13 ... Last month, they lost to #16 Richmond ... Earlier this month, the Tigers fell to #5 Delaware, 48-0 ... In the season finale, the Tigers face #14 New Hampshire.

In 2009, the Tigers played nearly half of their games against ranked teams ... The Tigers have lost 17 straight games against ranked teams ... The Tigers' last win over a ranked team was a 23-21 victory over #14 Richmond on Oct. 6, 2007.

Since 2004, the Tigers have won four games against nationally-ranked opponents - wins over Delaware are half of that total.

Towson's best win over a ranked team was a 35-31 victory over #5 Delaware in 2005 ... In that game, **Nick Williams** scored the game-winning TD with 38 seconds left at Unitas Stadium ... In 2006, Towson beat two teams that were ranked 25th in the nation ... Quarterback **Sean Schaefer** threw a school record-tying five touchdown passes in a wild 49-35 win at #25 Delaware ... Later in the season, the Tigers handed #25 Richmond a 31-7 loss in Virginia.

In the last three years, the Tigers have played the number one team in the nation three times ... In 2008, the Tigers played James Madison in the season finale when the Dukes were #1 ... JMU won, 58-27 ... Last year, the Tigers hosted top-ranked Richmond and lost, 42-14 ... In September, Towson faced #1 Villanova, the defending national champion ... Villanova handed the Tigers a 43-7 loss.

# 2010 Towson University Football Game Notes

**TURNOVERS TELL THE TALE:** Like most coaches, **Rob Ambrose** stresses the importance of turnovers ... However, turnovers have been very costly this season ... In back-to-back losses to Richmond and Rhode Island, Towson turned the ball over four times, a season high.

Last week, two interception returns for 117 yards lifted Maine to a 28-18 win over the Tigers.

The four turnovers against URI led to 17 points that were key to the Rams' 30-20 win ... At Richmond, the Spiders scored 10 points off Tiger turnovers in a 28-6 victory.

Ironically, in back-to-back games in October, the Tigers did not have any turnovers against #8 Massachusetts and #7 James Madison.

After cutting their ratio to minus-2 in mid-October, the Tigers are now minus-11.

The Tigers have turned the ball over 19 times and generated 8 turn-

overs ... The Tigers have turned the ball over on 12 interceptions and 7 fumbles ... The Tigers' 19 turnovers have resulted in 85 points ... The Tigers have scored 24 points off the 7 turnovers they have generated.

When the Tigers didn't turn the ball over in back-to-back games in October, it marked the first time that they played consecutive turnover-free games since the final game of the 2001 season and the opening game in 2002 ... In the 2001 finale at Georgetown, the Tigers didn't turn the ball over in a 27-9 win ... In the 2002 season opener, the Tigers played turnover-free football in a 49-28 win over Morgan State.

In the first ten games, the Tigers have recovered six fumbles and intercepted two passes ... Linebacker **Donte Blakey** and defensive tackle **Marcus Valentine** has each recovered two fumbles ... Blakey now has five fumble recoveries in his career.

Valentine's first fumble recovery resulted in a touchdown against Massachusetts in early October ... After senior cornerback **Jeremy Gardner's** sack against quarterback **Kyle Havens** forced a fumble near the end zone, Valentine picked up the ball at the three-yard line and cruised into the end zone for the Tigers' first defensive touchdown in nearly four years.

Defensive back **Nick Oates** and linebacker **Chris Patterson** have the Tigers' interceptions ... Oates had an interception at Columbia while Patterson picked off a pass against James Madison.

**TIGERS PLAY BEFORE LARGEST CROWDS:** In the 2010 season, the Tigers have played before two of their largest crowds ever ... In fact, two of the top five crowds to watch the Tigers have seen them this season ... In the season

opener at Indiana, a crowd of 35,242 saw the Tigers lose to the Hoosiers at Memorial Stadium, 51-17 ... Two weeks ago, the Tigers played Delaware in front of 21,603, the fifth-largest crowd to watch the Tigers ... In fact, seven of the top ten crowds to watch the Tigers have seen them play at Delaware Stadium.

**OPPONENTS' HAVE MADE 30 OF LAST 32 FIELD GOAL ATTEMPTS:** Dating back to the 2008 season, opposing place kickers have made 30 of their last 32 field goal attempts against the Tigers ... Last week, **Brian Harvey** made two field goals to continue the success ... Two weeks ago, **Mike Perry** of Delaware had a rare miss against Towson when his 21-yard field goal attempt hit the left upright in the first quarter ... He bounced back to make a 29-yard field goal and a 22-yarder ... **Louis Feinstein** of Rhode Island and **Wil Kamin** of Richmond converted all three of their field goal attempts to continue the rather unusual streak.

Opposing kickers have made 19 of 21 field goal attempts against Towson this season ... Opposing place kickers had converted 19 straight field goal attempts until **Ben Hopewell** of James Madison missed a 46-yard field goal on the final play of the first half in the Dukes' win over the Tigers on Oct. 9 ... In 2009, opposing kickers made all eight field goal attempts ... In 2010, place kickers made their first eight field goal attempts until Hopewell's miss.

Prior to Hopewell, the last place kicker to miss a field goal attempt against the Tigers was **Joe Marcoux** of Villanova ... Marcoux missed a 24-yard field goal try in the Wildcats' 34-31 victory over Towson on Nov. 15, 2008.

**A PAINFUL LOSS:** For only the fourth time in the last four years, the Tigers will be playing a football game without cornerback **Ollie Thomas** in the lineup ... The Tigers' senior co-captain suffered a season-ending broken leg injury while returning a punt on the fifth play of the Tigers' loss at Richmond on Oct. 23 ... On the punt return, Thomas broke his leg in two places, ending his career.

Thomas, who made his 30th consecutive start at Richmond, played in 41 career games and made 34 starts ... In his career, Thomas had 169 tackles with 17 pass break-ups ... The lone interception of his career came in the Tigers' 31-24 win over Columbia in 2008 ... It was a fourth quarter interception that stopped a drive and saved the win.

As a senior, he was seventh on the team with 34 tackles ... In 2009, he made 47 tackles, ninth on the team ... He may have had his best season as a sophomore in 2008 ... The Oxon Hill, Md. native made 57 tackles to rank fourth on the team ... He led the Tigers with 9 pass breakups ... In his career, Ollie had 14 kickoff returns for 288 yards ... He returned five punts for 38 yards.

Against Rhode Island, wide receiver **Hakeem Moore** wore Thomas' #26 jersey as a tribute to his teammate.

**YAKY IBIA EXCELS ACADEMICALLY AND ATHLETICALLY:** Senior defensive tackle **Yaky Ibia** has a very good chance to become the third Tiger football player named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America® University Division Football team ... A pre-season All-Colonial Athletic Association pick, he is an Actuarial Science major with a 3.51 G.P.A.

Last month, Ibia was named as a semi-finalist for the NFF's Campbell Trophy ... He was one of 28 semi-finalists from NCAA FCS football.

In 2009, he was named to the FCS ADA Academic All-Star team and earned a berth on the District 2 All-Academic team ... A native of Nigeria, Ibia made 52 tackles in ten games last season ... He also had a team-leading 11.5 tackles for lost yardage ... In his career, Ibia has played in 43 games and he has made 144 tackles, including 28.5 for lost yardage ... He had a career high 10 tackles against Coastal Carolina ... The only two Tiger football players to be named to the ESPN Academic All-America® University Division Football team are defensive back **Aaron Bates** (1993) and wide receiver **Adam Overbey** (2000) ... Bates earned second team honors while Overbey was a first team selection.

**YAKY IBIA NAMED TO ESPN DISTRICT 2 ALL-ACADEMIC TEAM AGAIN:** For the second year in a row, defensive tackle **Yaky Ibia** of the Tigers has been named to the ESPN District 2 All-Academic team and will be a candidate for ESPN Academic All-America® University Division honors ... The ESPN Academic All-America® football team is selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) and will be announced on Tuesday, November 23.



The All-Academic District 2 team is comprised of NCAA Division I football players at both the Football Championship Subdivision (FCS) and the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) levels ... Student-Athletes must carry a 3.30 cumulative G.P.A. to be eligible ... District 2 includes all schools in New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Delaware, Maryland, Washington, D.C. and West Virginia.

An Actuarial Science major with a 3.51 G.P.A., Ibia is a three-year starter who was named to the Pre-Season All-CAA team this past summer ... A native of Calabar, Nigeria, his family resides in Reston, Va. ... Ibia is one of 24 Scholar-Athletes named to the District 2 team.

Ibia is one of five CAA players on the District 2 team ... Quarterback **Pat Devlin**, tight end **Zach Reed** and wide receiver **Mark Mackey** of Delaware join running back **Angelo Babbaro** of Villanova on the District 2 All-Academic team.

Towson University is one of 15 schools represented on the District 2 team ... Delaware and Robert Morris each placed three players on the team ... Bucknell, Navy and Penn State were each represented by two players.

Duquesne, Lafayette, Maryland, Monmouth, Pennsylvania, Princeton, St. Francis (Pa.), Towson, Villanova and West Virginia each placed one representative on the team.

**TIGERS ON THE RUN:** In the Tigers' ten games this year, they have rushed for 1,315 yards on 358 attempts, an average of 3.7 yards per attempt ... Averaging 131.5 rushing yards per game, the Tigers are ranked seventh in the Colonial Athletic Association.

Amazingly enough, the Tigers' ten-game total already represents their highest single season total since 2005 ... In the 2005 season, Towson ran for 1,499 yards in 11 games, an average of 136.3 yards per contest.

By averaging 3.7 yards per carry, the Tigers are running the ball at the same pace that they were in the 2005 season.

After their first two games of the year, the Tigers were averaging 221 yards per game, fourth in the CAA ...

The Tigers ran for 227 yards in the opener at Indiana and picked up 215 rushing yards in their five-overtime win over Coastal Carolina ... The Tigers' 227 rushing yards at Indiana were the most they've had since

they ran for 231 yards on 40 carries against Delaware on Oct. 17, 2009 ... But, it marked only the third time in the last 50 games (dating back to 2005) that the Tigers had 200 yards rushing ... The only other 200-yard game during that stretch was a 214-yard

effort at William & Mary on Sept. 29, 2007.

For the Tigers, it marked the first time they had 200 rushing yards in back-to-back games since Sept. 21 and 28, 2002 ... On Sept. 21, 2002, the Tigers ran for 222 yards in a 56-42 win over Brown ... On Sept. 28, 2002, they ran for 209 yards in a 42-10 win at Holy Cross.

Former quarterback **Chris Hart**, who had two 100-yard games this season, leads the Tigers with 518 yards on 113 carries ... Averaging 4.6 yards per carry, Hart was the sixth-leading rusher in the CAA at the time when he left the team ... Sophomore **Tremayne Dameron**, who had 107 yards against Coastal Carolina, has 377 yards on 100 carries with five touchdowns ... Sophomore **Dominique Booker**, who ran for a career high 74 yards against James Madison, has run for 267 yards on 63 attempts ... He is averaging 4.3 yards per carry.

Injuries have taken their toll on the Tigers' running game ... **Nygee Carmichael**, a "red shirt" freshman, appeared in six games before he suffered a broken leg ... He is out for the season ... Carmichael ran for 139 yards on 36 carries this season ... He also caught six passes for 50 yards out of the backfield ... Another "red shirt" freshman, **B.J. Greening**, sustained a neck injury after playing in four games ... He is also out for the season.

Sophomore **Ryan McLean** has been the beneficiary of the injuries ... He has played in the last three games and has carried the ball eight times.

**MOORE ALL-PURPOSE YARDAGE:** Over the last three seasons, senior wide receiver **Hakeem Moore** has become "moore" of a playmaker each week ... In the Tigers' opener at Indiana, he accumulated a career high 221 all-purpose yards ... At Indiana, he caught two passes for 63 yards, including a 64-yard TD pass ... He returned 6 kickoffs for 158 yards ... Against Coastal Carolina, he had 3 catches for 106 yards and 2 touchdowns.

At Villanova, he caught 3 passes for 73 yards and a touchdown ... He returned 3 kickoffs for 68 yards, giving him 141 all-purpose yards against the Wildcats ... At Columbia, he caught five passes for 110 yards and a touchdown ... He also had three kickoff returns for 74 yards ... He had 184 all-purpose yards against the Lions.

In the loss at Richmond, he went over the 3,000-yard mark for career all-purpose yardage ... He had 137 all-purpose yards against Rhode Island to re-take the Colonial Athletic Association lead in all-purpose yards per game.

The CAA all-purpose yardage leader, he averages 129.5 yards per game ... Junior **Jonathan Grimes** of William & Mary is second in the CAA (128.3) while **Andrew Pierce** of Delaware has a 122.1 average.

Moore is tenth in the CAA with 46.9 receiving yards per game ... In ten games, he has 26 catches for 469 yards and five touchdowns ... He is averaging 18.0 yards per catch, tops in the CAA.

In addition, Moore is 7th in the CAA in kickoff return average ... He has 37 kickoff returns for 800 yards and a 21.6 average.

In 2009, he accumulated 1,046 all-purpose yards, third in the CAA ... In 2008, he had 1,000 all-purpose yards with 443 yards on kickoff returns and 527 receiving yards in addition to 30 yards on punt returns ... The Fredericksburg, Va. native has caught 103 passes in his career for 1,307 yards and 7 touchdowns ... Against Rhode Island three weeks ago, he caught the 100th pass of his college career ... He became the 19th player in Towson football history with 100 career receptions.

After catching 5 TD passes in the first four games of the year, he has been held without a touchdown pass in the last six games ... Over the last six games, he has 13 receptions for 109 yards.

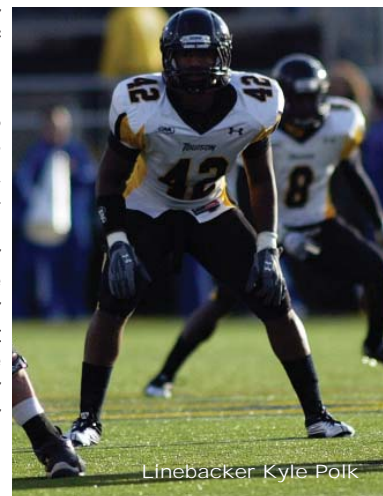

**POLK HONORED BY CAA:** Freshman linebacker **Kyle Polk** of the Tigers was named as the CAA Rookie of the Week two weeks ago ... A first-year freshman, Polk led the Tiger defense in a 30-20 loss to Rhode Island ... Making his sixth start of the year, Polk recorded a game-high 13 tackles, including two sacks and three tackles for lost yardage ... He also broke up a pass ... His 13 tackles were a career high and helped the Tiger defense hold URI to 74 rushing yards and 256 yards of total offense, both seasonal lows for Tiger opponents this season ... The only first-year freshman who starts for the Tigers, Polk is seventh on the team with 46 tackles in nine games ... With 5.5 tackles for lost yardage, Polk is fourth on the team ... Polk is the first Tiger football player to be named as CAA Rookie of the Week since quarterback **Peter Athens** earned the honor on Sept. 21, 2009 after leading the Tigers to a win over Coastal Carolina ... Polk also earned honorable mention as an NCAA FCS linebacker from the College Football Performance Awards web site two weeks ago.

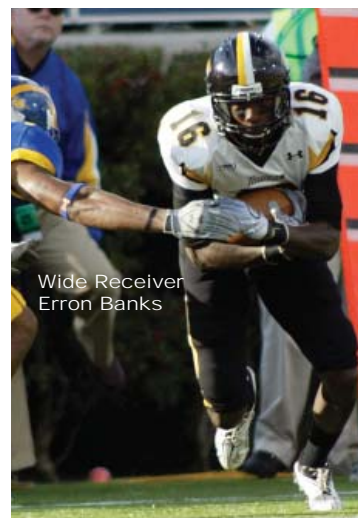
#8 Massachusetts used a 385-263 edge in total yardage to hand the Tigers a 27-14 loss ... Against

In ten games, he leads the Tigers with 90 tackles ... Dangerfield is eighth in the Colonial Athletic Association with an average of 9.4 tackles per game.

He also leads all CAA defensive backs in tackles ... Dangerfield is second in the CAA with two forced fumbles ... He has also broken up five passes to lead the team.

In ten games this season, he has been the Tigers' tackle leader five times ... He has posted ten or more tackles in four games, including 11 tackles at Delaware.

In his first game as a Tiger, he had a team high 10 tackles at Indiana ... In the Tigers' 47-45 five-overtime win over Coastal Carolina, he made

a huge defensive play when he broke up a pass on a 2-point conversion try by Chanticleer quarterback **Zach MacDowall** in the fifth overtime, ending the longest game in Towson history.

At Columbia, he tied for the team lead with 9 tackles ... He also had 9 tackles against Massachusetts ... He had a career high 13 tackles at Richmond ... He made 10 tackles against James Madison ... Two weeks

ago, Dangerfield made nine tackles against Rhode Island.

At Hofstra in 2009, he played in all 11 games with one start ... He had 23 tackles and led the team with two interceptions for 54 yards.

**SLOW STARTERS:** In their ten nine games this year, the Tigers have been slow starters ... In fact, the Tigers' offense has scored only 10 points in the first quarter.

Against UMass, the Tigers scored a defensive touchdown for the Tigers' first points in the first quarter this year ... **Marcus Valentine** recovered a fumble and returned it three yards for a touchdown.

Towson has been outscored by 80-17 in the opening period.

Three weeks ago, the Tigers scored their first offensive touchdown in the first quarter when **Chris Hart** threw a 56-yard touchdown pass to **Alex Blake**.

The Tigers have also struggled in the second quarter and they have been outscored by an 101-41 margin.

**RYAN EXPRESS:** Sophomore **Tom Ryan** has bolstered the Tigers' wide receiving corps by returning from a knee injury after missing four games ... Since coming back, he has caught 14 passes for 166 yards ... He also caught a two-point conversion pass against Maine ... Ryan, who caught 7 passes for 77 yards against Rhode Island, is the Tigers' third-leading receiver with 26 receptions for 245 yards

and two touchdowns despite missing four games ... In his career, he has 44 catches for 435 yards and two touchdowns ... He has also done well returning punts and has an 11.3 average.

**OVERTIME DROUGHT ENDS WITH MARATHON:** Prior to their September 11 game against Coastal Carolina, the Tigers had gone 86 games without playing an overtime contest ... However, the Tigers' streak came to an end when they hosted Coastal Carolina ... When the Tigers overcame a 21-7 fourth quarter deficit to send the game into overtime, the streak came to an end.

The Tigers made up for lost time by playing five overtime periods against Coastal ... The Tigers pulled out a 47-45 victory in the fifth overtime ... It was the longest game in school history and one period shy of tying the NCAA FCS record for overtimes in a game.

After scoring 42 points in regulation, the teams combined for 50 points in the overtime periods ... A 25-yard TD pass from **Chris Hart** to **Hakeem Moore** and a two-point conversion run by Hart in the fifth overtime lifted the Tigers to victory.

The Towson-Coastal Carolina game is the longest NCAA Division I football game played this year ... The only longer game was Whittier's 42-39 win over Puget Sound in six overtimes on Sept. 25.

It was the Tigers' first overtime game since 2002 when they lost to Cornell, 34-31 ... Towson is 5-2 all-time in overtime games ... The Tigers' previous longest game was a 3-OT win at Marist in 1996.

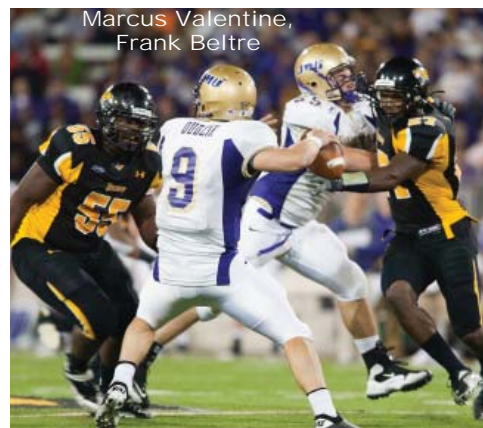

**ALIVE AND KICKING:** Senior **Nick Wallace** has been a welcome addition to the Tiger football team as a transfer from Maryland ... The 2006 Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Rookie of the Year while kicking for Indiana (Pa.), he made 11 of 13 field goal tries and 30 of 33 conversions.

In ten games as a Tiger, Wallace has made 9 of 14 field goal attempts and has scored 40 points ... Wallace is tied for fifth in the CAA for points by a kicker ... With 9 field goals in 10 games, he is tied for second in the CAA ... By making 64.1% of his field goal attempts, he is fourth in the CAA ... Wallace made two pressure-packed field goals in the overtime periods against Coastal Carolina ... He has had three games in which he has kicked two field goals this season ... He also had two field goals against James Madison and Rhode Island.

Wallace has been a very reliable kicker inside 40 yards ... He has made 9 of 11 field goal attempts of less than 40 yards ... He has also been a very valuable member of the Tigers' kickoff team ... He is averaging 58.4 yards per kickoff and has one touchback ... Tiger opponents are averaging only 19.7 yards per kickoff return ... Last year, Tiger opponents averaged 24.4 yards per kickoff return and two kickoff returns went for touchdowns.

**HANGING WITH MR. SOVEN:** Although freshman punter **D.J. Soven** is averaging 33.6 yards per punt, he has been very effective ... He has had great "hang time" on his punts ... Only 12 of his 48 punts have been returned ... There have been 21 fair catches on his punts ... Opponents are averaging only 2.9 yards per punt return ... The Tigers' opponents have returned 12 kicks for 35 yards ... The longest return was a 13-yard return by **Kevin Bush** of Indiana in the opener.

Towson leads the CAA in punt coverage, allowing 0.6 yards per punt.

At Delaware, Soven had a career high 10 punts for 295 yards and a 29.5 average ... He also booted a career long 53-yard punt ... Delaware called for a fair catch on five punts ... Soven's 10 punts were one shy of the single game school record.

Tight end **Jalan Dudley**, cornerback **Jeremy Gardner**, tight end **Ryan Hanley**, defensive tackle **Yaky Ibia**, quarterback **Jeremy Jayne**, wide receiver **Hakeem Moore**, guard **Chris Ritter**, defensive back **Chris Sheahin**, place kicker **Nick Wallace** and safety **Ray White** will be wearing a Towson uniform for

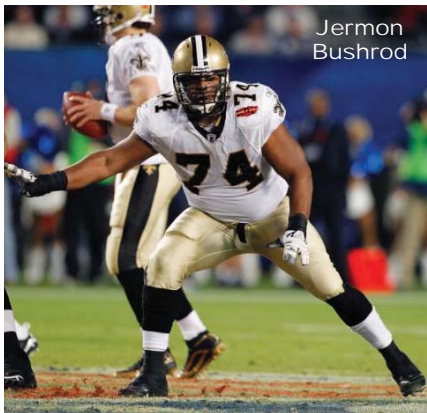


the final time against UNH ... **Brian Duker**, a student assistant coach for the last four years, will also be taking part in his final Tiger football game.

**SUPER SAINTS:** When the New Orleans Saints won Super Bowl XLIV by beating the Indianapolis Colts, 31-17, there was a very strong rooting interest on the Towson University campus ... With the help of two former Tiger football players, the Saints won their first-ever Super Bowl championship by upsetting the Colts.

Offensive tackle **Jermon**

**Bushrod**, a starter in 18 games for the Saints, did a great job blocking all season while helping the Saints offense average 403.8 yards of offense per game, tops in the National Football League ... He was also part of an offense which led the NFL by averaging 31.9 points per game ... With the help of Bushrod, the Saints allowed only 20 sacks in 16 regular season games ... In the Super Bowl, he was matched up against the Colts' All-Pro



**Dwight Freeney** ... A four-year starter at Towson, Bushrod (2003-06) was an all-conference lineman who was drafted by the Saints in the fourth round of the NFL draft.

Last week, with the Saints scheduled for a bye, Bushrod returned to his alma mater and watched the Tigers drop a 28-18 decision to Maine ... A native of King George's, Virginia, Bushrod was a four-year starter at tackle for the Tigers from 2003 to 2006 and earned all-conference honors three times.

Former Tiger linebacker **Joe Vitt** (1974-77) has been the Saints' Assistant Head Coach since 2006 ... Vitt has also coached with the Rams, the Packers, the Seahawks and the Colts in his 30-year NFL coaching career ... Coach Vitt has an annual Crab Feast in Ocean City, Md. in June to raise money for the Tiger football program.



**FATHER KNOWS BEST:** Sophomore fullback **Billy Stup** is the son of former Tiger defensive tackle **Bill Stup** (1985-88) ... The Stups are the fifth father/son combination to play for Towson ... **Dannie Ross** (1969-1971) and **Dannie Ross Jr.** (1995-98) were the first ... The other two-generation Tigers are **Joe Vitt** (1974-77) and **Joey Vitt** (1998), **Bill Kluttz** (1972-74) and **Jesse Kluttz** (2003-05), and the Meehans, **Ron Meehan** (1977-80) and **Ryan Meehan** (2003-06).

# 2010 Towson University Football Game Notes

Sept. 2 - Indiana 51, Tigers 17

**BLOOMINGTON, Ind.** – For the second year in a row, the Tigers opened their season with a monumental challenge, facing a Big Ten Conference team on the road. In the opener, the Tigers faced Indiana University before a crowd of 35,242 in Memorial Stadium.

Although they didn't pull off the upset, they did throw a mild scare into the Hoosiers.

After spotting them a 17-0 first quarter lead, the Tigers came to life offensively in the second quarter before dropping a 51-17 decision.

Comparing this year's opener to last season's 47-14 loss at Northwestern, Coach **Rob Ambrose** admitted, "I feel much better than last year. At one point in the second quarter, we were down by ten points and we had all the momentum.

"For us to win a game like this, we have to catch some breaks and we can't turn the ball over," he added. "We didn't get any breaks. We forced two fumbles and didn't recover either one. We turned the ball over three times and they scored 21 points."

The Hoosiers were able to prevail in spite of an electrifying performance by Tiger quarterback **Chris Hart**. A transfer from Georgia Military College, Hart



sparked the Tiger offense by running for 123 yards on 16 carries while passing for 165 yards and two touchdowns.

With 123 rushing yards, he became the first Tiger quarterback ever to run for more than 100 yards in a game.

Senior quarterback **Ben Chappell** led the Hoosiers to a 17-0 first quarter advantage. He threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to **Ted Bolser** before **Darius Willis** raced 49 yards for another TD. A 24-yard field goal gave by **Nick Freeland** gave Indiana a 17-0 lead.

A 33-yard kickoff return by senior **Hakeem Moore** gave the Tiger offense its best field position of the game. After moving into Indiana territory for the first time, the Tigers elected to try for a first down when they were faced with a fourth-and-two at the Hoosiers' 45-yard line.

On fourth down, Hart kept the ball and ran to his left. Then, he cut across the field and sprinted towards the goal line. He was knocked out of bounds at the three-yard line. On second down, Hart threw a five-yard touchdown pass to sophomore **Tom Ryan**, giving the Tigers their first TD of the season. When senior **Nick Wallace** converted, the Tigers trailed by 17-7 with 12:21 left in the first half.

Hoping to seize the momentum, Coach Ambrose had Wallace try an on-sides kick. But, the Hoosiers weren't fooled and **Griffen Dahlstrom** fell on the ball at the Towson 46-yard line.

"In a game like this, we have to try to surprise them," said Ambrose. "I thought it had worked but they (the officials) gave them the ball."

Two plays later, Chappell threw a 41-yard touchdown pass to **Demarlo Belcher**, giving the Hoosiers a 24-7 lead.

The Tigers responded immediately. On third-and-four at their 36-yard line, Hart connected with Moore on a crossing pattern. He caught the ball at the Indiana 40-yard line and outraced three defenders to the end zone for a 64-yard TD. Wallace's kick cut the deficit to 24-14.

After forcing a Hoosier punt, Hart led the Tigers on another long drive. He ran for 32 yards during the march. When the offense stalled at the 23-yard line, Wallace came in to try a 40-yard field goal. He missed and the lead remained at 24-14.

With 1:45 left in the half, senior **Trea Burgess** capped off a 77-yard drive with a 12-yard TD run to give the Hoosiers a 31-14 edge.

The Hoosiers got another opportunity when the Tigers made a huge special teams error. Freshman punter **D.J. Soven** had the center snap go over his head. He retreated and picked the ball up and tried to punt. When he tried to punt, **Kevin Bush** blocked it, giving the Hoosiers a first down at the Towson 21-yard line.

After Chappell completed a 19-yard pass to Belcher, Willis scored on a two-yard run with 26 seconds left in the half, giving Indiana a 38-14 lead at the half. By scoring twice in the final 1:45 of the first half, Indiana grabbed a 24-point lead at intermission.

"Those two touchdowns before halftime really hurt us," said Ambrose.

"Indiana has a good offense and we can't help them like that."

On the first drive of the second half, the Tigers tried to convert a fourth down at their 39-yard line. When Hart was thrown for a loss, the Hoosiers took over. Moments later, Freeland's 41-yard field goal extended Indiana's lead to 41-14.

With 8:37 left in the third quarter, cornerback **Matt Ernst** intercepted a pass and returned it 53 yards for a TD and a 48-14 Hoosier lead.

Early in the fourth quarter, the Tigers put together their best drive of the game. They marched 72 yards in 13 plays before Wallace kicked a 29-yard field goal to cut the deficit to 48-17.

The Hoosiers completed the scoring when **Mitch Ewald** kicked a 32-yard field goal with 8:23 remaining in the game.

"One of the most encouraging things about this game was the fact that we didn't play scared," Ambrose added. "It is obvious that this is a much different team. Just looking at the faces of our players after the game, I can tell they were disappointed we didn't win."

The Tigers, who had 392 yards of offense, accumulated more yardage at Indiana than they did in any game last year. Towson outgained Indiana by 32 yards and ran 21 more offensive plays.

While Hart led Towson with 288 yards of total offense, Chappell completed 16 of 23 passes for 182 yards and two touchdowns. Willis ran for 102 yards and scored two TD's for the Hoosiers.

Ryan led the Tigers with 5 catches for 41 yards and a TD. Moore accumulated 221 all-purpose yards and caught 2 passes for 63 yards and a touchdown. He also returned 6 kickoffs for 158 yards.

Defensive back **Jordan Dangerfield** led the Tiger defense with 10 tackles. Senior cornerback **Ollie Thomas** added 8 tackles while junior linebacker **Chris Patterson** made 6 tackles.

# 2010 Towson University Football Game Notes

Sept. 11 - Tigers 47, Coastal Carolina 45 (5 OT)

**TOWSON, Md.** – Overcoming a 14-point deficit in the final 9:40 of regulation, the Tigers (1-1) stunned Coastal Carolina (0-2), 47-45, in an epic five-overtime battle before a crowd of 8,990 at Minnegan Field at Johnny Unitas® Stadium.

With the teams tied at 39-39 after four overtimes, quarterback **Chris Hart** threw a 25-yard touchdown pass to senior **Hakeem Moore** on the

first play of the fifth overtime, giving the Tigers a 45-39 lead. Moments later, on the two-point conversion, Hart ran to his left, dropped the ball, picked it up on the bounce and ran into the end zone, giving the Tigers a 47-39 advantage.

But, the Tiger defense had to hold Coastal Carolina to pull out the win. Quarterback **Zach MacDowall** completed a five-yard touchdown pass to **Eric O'Neal**, pulling Coastal to within 47-45. Trying to tie the game for the seventh time, MacDowall's two-point conversion pass to **Jamie Childers** was broken up by safety

**Jordan Dangerfield**, securing a win for the Tigers in the longest game in school history.

The teams were just one overtime period away from tying the NCAA FCS record with a six-overtime contest.

"Anybody who was here sure got their money's worth," said Towson Coach **Rob Ambrose**. "I am really proud of our guys. We were not going to quit no matter how long this game went. They kept saying that wanted to keep playing. I love the way our guys play. We beat a very good football team tonight."

When Coastal took a 21-7 lead with 12:36 left on a 10-yard TD run by fullback **Racheed Gause**, no one was thinking overtime.

But, Hart's 57-yard pass to Moore set up a two-yard touchdown pass to tight end **James Oboh**, cutting the deficit to 21-14.

After forcing a punt, the Tigers took over at their own 30-yard line with 3:54 remaining. On fourth-and-four at the Coastal 39-yard line, Hart completed a pass to **Alex Blake** at the 32-yard line. Hart scrambled 12 yards to the Chanticleers' 20-yard line. Moments later, he ran to the two-yard line on an 18-yard scamper.

With 29 seconds left, Hart lofted a pass into the corner of the end zone where sophomore **Tom Ryan** leaped and grabbed it for a touchdown. When **Nick Wallace** converted, the game was tied at 21-21.

Tied at 21-21, the Tigers were playing in an overtime game for the first time since 2002 – a streak of 86 games.

During the course of the five overtimes, there were three or four times when it looked like the game was over.

"There were so many ebbs and flows in the overtime," said Coastal Carolina Coach **David Bennett**. "Playing a five-overtime game was uncharted territory for us. The unfortunate thing is somebody is going to win and somebody is going to lose."

On the Tigers' first overtime possession, Wallace kicked a 34-yard field goal to give them a 24-21 lead. On Coastal's drive, **Justin Durham** matched Wallace with a 42-yard field goal, tying the game at 24-24.

In the second overtime, MacDowall's one-yard run gave Coastal a 30-24 edge. But, the Tigers got a huge break when Durham missed the conversion kick.

On the Tigers' possession, **Tremayne Dameron** carried the load. Dameron, who ran for 107 yards on 29 rushes, ran the ball on five straight plays, scoring the game-tying TD on a two-yard run. All the Tigers needed was a conversion kick by Wallace to win the game. But, his kick hit the left upright and the game headed for a third overtime.

"When Justin missed his kick, I was afraid that would cost us the game," said Bennett. "Then, when their kicker hit the upright, I said to myself 'this is crazy.' Both guys had been making kicks and they missed at the same time. It shows you what a strange game this was."

With the score tied at 30-30, the Tigers went first in the third overtime. For the second straight drive, the Tigers kept the ball on the ground. On third-and-one at the 4-yard line, Dameron powered off left tackle for his second TD of overtime, giving the Tigers a 36-30 lead.

The rules stipulate that both teams must try for two-point conversions after the second overtime. Trying for two points, Hart threw to Moore. But, safety **Dominique Davenport** knocked the pass away, keeping the deficit at 36-30.

In the third overtime, Coastal scored on a 7-yard TD run by O'Neal. On the two-point conversion, MacDowall's pass to Childers was broken up by **Jeremy Gardner**, sending the game to a fourth extra period.

Neither offense generated a TD in the fourth overtime. Durham's 43-yard field goal gave Coastal a 39-36 lead before Wallace booted a 27-yarder, setting the stage for the Tigers' win in the fifth overtime.

Trailing by 7-0 at halftime, the Tigers scored a touchdown in the third quarter. Hart threw a 24-yard TD pass to Moore and the conversion kick tied the game at 7-7.

The Chanticleers responded with a 65-yard, 10-play drive to re-take the lead on a one-yard run by MacDowall. Early in the fourth quarter, Coastal marched 57 yards in ten plays to grab a 21-7 lead.

MacDowall completed 19 of 33 passes for 185 yards and one TD for Coastal. He also ran for 57 yards on 18 carries with two TD's. O'Neal led the running game with 69 yards on 19 carries with a pair of touchdowns. O'Neal also had six receptions for 38 yards and one TD.

In leading the Tigers to the win, Hart accounted for 234 yards of total offense. He completed 13 of 21 passes for 155 yards and four TD's. Hart also ran for 79 yards on 22 carries.

Linebacker **Chris Patterson** led the Tiger defense with a career high 12 tackles while defensive tackle **Yaky Ibia** had ten tackles, including one for lost yardage.

Sept. 18 - #1 Villanova 43, Tigers 7

**VILLANOVA, Pa.** – Facing the defending national champs in their home opener is not how any team would like to open its league schedule. But that was the challenge that the Tigers faced when they played Villanova in their first Colonial Athletic Association game of the year.

In pre-game ceremonies, the top-ranked Wildcats celebrated their NCAA FCS title as the players received their championship rings.

Then, the Wildcats (2-1, 1-0) continued the celebration when the game started, handing the Tigers (1-2, 0-1) a 43-7 loss before a crowd of 12,111 at Villanova Stadium.

The Villanova defense limited the Tigers, who came into the game averaging 381.0 yards per game, to a total of 180 yards and forced two turnovers. Towson had only eight first downs in the game.

The Tigers scored their only touchdown with 9:36 left in the third quarter when graduate student quarterback **Bart Blanchard** threw a 59-yard touchdown pass to senior **Hakeem Moore**. It was Moore's fourth TD catch of the season. In the second half, Blanchard relieved **Chris Hart** and completed 12 of 16 passes for 144 yards and a TD.

"Villanova is good, Villanova is big and you can't make any mistakes against them," said Coach **Rob Ambrose**. "To Coach **(Andy) Talley's** credit, he has made some subtle changes on his defense even though he has most of his players back. They may have the toughest defense in the country this year.

"I am sure that Villanova will be a strong contender for another national title," he added.

Senior quarterback **Chris Whitney** enjoyed another fine day for the Wildcats. While playing a little more than half of the game, the first team All-CAA pick completed 9 of 12 passes for 115 yards and 2 TD's. He also ran for 44 yards on 14 carries and scored 2 more TD's.

"I thought we defended them better than we did last year," Ambrose added. "However, to defend that offense, you need to tackle well. We didn't. There were several times where we had Whitney trapped in the backfield and we missed a tackle and he made a play. I guess I should be happy with our progress. Last year, we didn't get near him."

The Wildcats, who beat Towson by 49-7 on their way to the 2009 national championship, controlled the game from the start as they rolled to their 12th consecutive win over an NCAA FCS opponent.

After the Tigers forced a punt on the opening possession of the game, the Tigers had to punt from their 28-yard line. Freshman **D. J. Soven** came in to punt but he never got the chance. The center snap sailed way over his head and into the end zone, resulting in a safety to give Villanova a 2-0 lead with 7:46 left in the first quarter.

"We have a first-year punter and first-year snapper," said Ambrose. "The sad thing is that if D.J. looked up, he would have seen that he could have run back to the line of scrimmage and punted."

Senior All-American **Matt Szczur** returned the ensuing free kick 39 yards to the Tiger 37-yard line. Then, Whitney directed a 37-yard, 5-play drive for the first touchdown of the game. Whitney capped off the drive when he scored on a 9-yard run with 5:52 left in the first quarter. **Nick Yako's** conversion made it a 9-0 advantage.

The Wildcats broke the game open in the second quarter, scoring 27 unanswered points and taking advantage of a pair of Tiger turnovers.

With 9:42 left in the first half, senior **Aaron Ball**, who ran for 100 yards on only 8 carries, broke loose for a 57-yard touchdown run, giving the Wildcats a 16-0 lead.

A 44-yard kickoff return by Moore gave the Tigers good field position. But, on the first play, linebacker **Marquis Kirkland** intercepted a pass and returned it to the Tiger 48-yard line. Two plays later, Szczur took the direct snap and threw a 44-yard TD pass to **Dorian Wells** in the end zone, upping the lead to 22-0. The extra point try was wide right.

Whitney led another touchdown drive late in the half. The Wildcats marched 60 yards on 9 plays. On third down at the 22-yard line, Whitney scrambled out of pressure and threw a 22-yard TD pass to Wells, extending the lead to 29-0 after Yako's extra point.

With 1:26 left in the half, the Wildcats received another great scoring opportunity. Freshman **Keenan Malone** recovered a fumble by Hart at the Tigers' 34-yard line. Six plays later, Whitney threw his second touchdown pass, a 17-yard screen pass to **Angelo Babbaro** with 41 seconds left in the half. That gave Villanova a 36-0 lead at halftime.

In a dominant half, the Wildcats held Towson to 35 yards of offense. Villanova ran up a total of 281 yards, including 122 rushing yards.

On the first possession of the second half, Blanchard came into the game. When he was sacked at the Towson four-yard line, Soven was forced to punt from his own end zone. His 33-yard punt gave the Wildcats a first down at the Tigers' 37-yard line. Six plays later, Whitney scored his second TD on a one-yard run, giving the Wildcats a 43-0 lead with 10:33 left in the third quarter.

A 19-yard kickoff return by **Justin Harris** gave the Tigers possession at their 32-yard line. After Blanchard completed a 9-yard pass to tight end **Ryan Hanley**, he completed a long pass to Moore, who caught the ball at the Wildcats' 30-yard line and outraced several Villanova defenders for a 59-yard touchdown. When **Nick Wallace** converted, the Tigers trailed by 43-7 with 9:36 left in the quarter.

With Talley substituting liberally, the Tigers had their most impressive drive late in the third period. A punt backed the Tigers up at their own five-yard line, but Blanchard directed a nice drive. They marched to the Wildcats' nine-yard line where they stalled. Wallace attempted a 26-yard field goal that appeared to be good. But, the officials ruled that it missed and the 86-yard, 15-play drive netted no points.

While Ball led Villanova by rushing for 100 yards, the Wildcats ran for 243 yards on 52 carries. The Tigers had 17 rushing yards on 28 attempts.

Sophomore **Erron Banks** led the Tigers with a career high 5 catches for 32 yards while Moore caught 3 passes for 73 yards and a TD.

Safety **Jordan Dangerfield** led the Tigers with 7 tackles while **Frank Beltre** and linebacker Donte Blakey also had seven tackles.

# 2010 Towson University Football Game Notes

Sept. 25 - Columbia 24, Tigers 10

**NEW YORK, N.Y.** – Although wide receiver **Hakeem Moore** caught another long touchdown pass and accumulated 184 all-purpose yards, the Tigers (1-3) couldn't control Columbia quarterback **Sean Brackett** as the Lions (1-1) dealt the Tigers a 24-10 non-conference loss at Robert Kraft Field at Lawrence Wien Stadium.

During most of the first half, the Tiger defense put a lot of pressure on Brackett. However, as the game wore on, he did a great job avoiding the pressure and improvising plays. Taking away the four sacks for 24 yards, he ran for 113 yards on 13 carries.

After taking a 7-3 halftime lead, the Lions controlled the second half and pulled away for a 24-10 win.

"Hats off to Coach (**Norries**) **Wilson** and his coaching staff," said Towson Coach **Rob Ambrose**. "Their players played very hard and they earned themselves a win."

The two defenses controlled the play for the first quarter as neither team mounted a scoring threat. In the first quarter, the two teams combined for just five first downs and only 119 yards of total yards.

As the first quarter ended, Columbia was on the move. An 18-yard run by Brackett on the final play of the quarter gave Columbia a first down at the Tigers' 44-yard line. But, the Lions' drive was halted when sophomore defensive end **Matt Morgan** sacked Brackett at the Lions' 47-yard line, forcing a 53-yard punt by **Greg Guttas**.

Starting at their own 20-yard line after the touchdown, the Tigers put together their best drive of the first half. On the first three plays, **Nygee Carmichael** picked up 18 yards on three carries. After **Tremayne Dameron**

picked up 16 yards on a pair of runs, **Bart Blanchard** hooked up with Moore for a six-yard gain at the Lions' 42-yard line. Two plays later, Blanchard completed a 16-yard pass to Moore as the Tigers moved to the Columbia 20-yard line.

On third down at the 18-yard line, Blanchard threw a short pass to Carmichael, who squirmed to the 11-yard line, just one yard short of a first down. Rather than go for the first down, Coach Ambrose sent senior **Nick Wallace** into the game to try a 28-yard field goal. When he connected, the Tigers owned a 3-0 lead with six minutes left in the first half. The Tigers' drive was 69 yards in 14 plays and took 7:40 off the clock, more than half the second quarter.

Brackett led a Columbia response with an impressive drive of its own. Sidestepping the Tigers' pass rush, Brackett completed four pass attempts for 69 yards on the drive.

At the Tigers' 19-yard line, Brackett avoided a heavy rush, moved to his left and fired a 19-yard touchdown pass to running back **Zach Kourouma** along the sideline. Kourouma made it to the end zone for a touchdown that gave the Lions a lead. When **Luke Eddy** converted, Columbia had a 7-3 lead with 2:14 left in the first half.

On their first possession of the second half, the Lions extended their lead. On their opening play of the second half, a 38-yard run by senior **Leon Ivery** gave the Lions a first down at the Tigers' 27-yard line. Five plays later, Ivery scored on a five-yard touchdown run to put Columbia ahead by 14-3.

Midway through the third quarter, junior defensive back **Nick Oates** intercepted a pass by Brackett at the Tigers' 38-yard line. It was the Tigers' first interception of the season and the first pickoff of Oates' career.

Two plays later, quarterback **Chris Hart** threw a deep pass that Moore caught at the Columbia 30 yard line. Moore avoided two tackles and scored his fifth touchdown of the year. His 62-yard TD catch was his fourth reception of more than 50 yards in the first four games of the year and cut the Tigers' deficit to 14-10.

However, that was all the offense the Tigers generated the rest of the game.

On the opening play of the fourth quarter, sophomore **Nick Gerst** capped off an 80-yard, 11-play drive by scoring on a five-yard TD run to give Columbia a 21-10 advantage.

With 8:46 left, Eddy's 37-yard field goal completed the scoring.

In the final minutes, the Tigers drove to the Columbia 16-yard line where they gave up the ball on downs. With 1:24 left, **Calvin Otis** intercepted a pass in the end zone, extinguishing the Tigers' hopes.

For the Tigers, Blanchard, a transfer from The Citadel, made his first start at quarterback. He completed 13 of 20 passes for 89 yards.

Hart, who started the Tigers' first three games, also saw extensive action in reserve against the Lions. He completed 9 of 14 passes for 155 yards and one TD. Each quarterback threw one interception.

"We are not looking to rotate quarterbacks," explained Coach Ambrose. "Chris Hart won the job in the pre-season. But, we cannot be successful if we are turning the ball over. No quarterback can play for us if he keeps turning the ball over. Each one brings something different our offense.

"We need to take care of the ball if we are going to be win," he added. "If you have a nationally-ranked team with a roster full of All-Americans, you can overcome three or four turnovers. That's not us. We need to play error-free football."

Sophomore **Erron Banks** and Moore each caught five passes for the Tigers. Banks had five receptions for 53 yards while Moore had five catches for 110 yards and a touchdown.

Moore has now caught 13 passes for 352 yards and five touchdowns. He is averaging 27.1 yards per reception. He also has 695 all-purpose yards in four games and leads the CAA with 173.8 all-purpose yards.

"Hakeem is doing a great job for us," says Ambrose. "He has really grown as a player and a person."

Sophomore **Kyle Moore**, a transfer from Minnesota, caught four passes for 41 yards in his most extensive action for the Tigers.

Brackett led the Lions' offense by completing 11 of 15 passes for 157 yards and one touchdown. He also ran for 89 yards on 17 carries.

Sophomore safety **Jordan Dangerfield** led the Tiger defense with eight tackles while sophomore **Matt Morgan** had a career high six tackles, including two sacks.

The Tigers sacked Brackett four times as **Yaky Ibia** and **Marcus Valentine** also recorded sacks.

# 2010 Towson University Football Game Notes

Oct. 2 - #8 Massachusetts 27, Tigers 14

**TOWSON, Md.** – Overcoming three first half turnovers, a 14-7 deficit and an upset-minded Tiger squad, #8 Massachusetts (4-1) shut down Towson in the second half as the Minutemen pulled out a 27-14 CAA victory at Minnegan Field at Johnny Unitas® Stadium.

Although the Tigers won the turnover battle, the Minutemen dominated the second half as they shut out the Tigers after intermission. UMass turned the ball over three times and the Tigers converted two turnovers into touchdowns.

“For us to beat a team like this, we need to force turnovers and we can’t turn the ball over,” said Towson Coach **Rob Ambrose**. “We forced three turnovers and we didn’t turn the ball over. As a result, we were in said ballgame.

“I am annoyed and I am angry we lost,” he added. “UMass is an awesome offensive team and they are incredibly talented and deep. We wanted to control the clock and keep their offense on the sideline. Unfortunately, we couldn’t do that. Our defense did a great job.”

Led by senior linebacker **Donte Blakey**, who made a career high 11 tackles, the Tiger defense slowed down an offense that was averaging 461 total yards and 30.2 points per game. The Minutemen had 385 yards of total offense against Towson.

After punting on their first possession, the Minutemen marched 67 yards on 12 plays to take a 7-0 lead midway through the first quarter. Tailback **Jonathan Hernandez** capped off the drive with a one-yard run around the left end, giving the Minutemen a 7-0 lead.

A 37-yard kickoff return by **Hakeem Moore** gave the Tigers excellent field position at their 43-yard line. Quarterback **Chris Hart**, making his first appearance as a punter, boomed a 48-yard punt that backed up the Minutemen at their own seven-yard line.

Two plays later, quarterback **Kyle Havens** was sacked by blitzing cornerback **Jeremy Gardner**. Gardner’s tackle forced a fumble which defensive tackle **Marcus Valentine** picked up at the three-yard line and carried into the end zone for a touchdown. When **Nick Wallace** converted, the game was tied at 7-7 with 4:25 left in the first quarter.

Late in the first quarter, the Tigers got another break when **Shane Viveiros** muffed a punt which was recovered by **Doug Shaw** at the UMass 23-yard line. On the next play, tailback **Dominique Booker** broke off a 14-yard run, giving Towson a first down at the nine-yard line. Three plays later, the Tigers faced a fourth down-and-goal at the one-yard line. But, the UMass defense rose to the occasion, stopping Booker short of the goal line.

Before the UMass defense finished celebrating their goal line stand, they had to go back on the field. On the first play, Hernandez fumbled at the five-yard line. When linebacker **Trevor Walker** recovered, the Tigers had the ball at the UMass five-yard line.

On the next play, Hart threw a sideline pass to sophomore **Alex Blake**. Blake got a great block from wide receiver **Erron Banks** and strolled into the end zone for a five-yard TD. With 13:22 left in the first half, the Tigers owned a 14-7 lead over the Minutemen.

Midway through the second quarter, Havens completed a 24-yard pass to tight end **Emil Igwenagu**, moving UMass to the Towson 35-yard line. **Caleb Violette’s** 33-yard field goal cut the deficit to 14-10.

Another great punt by Hart pushed UMass back to the 3-yard line with 3:26 left. Running a no-huddle offense, Havens moved UMass down the field quickly. Completing 6 of 7 passes for 73 yards, Havens directed a 97-yard, 11-play drive that put the Minutemen ahead, 17-14. With 29 seconds left, Havens faked a ball spike to stop the clock, held on and threw a 10-yard touchdown pass to senior **Anthony Nelson**.

“Our last drive of the first half was a key for us,” admitted Havens. “That set the tone for the rest of the game. We played a very good defense tonight. They hit hard and really came after us.”

In the third quarter, a 44-yard pass to junior **Julian Talley** set up Violette’s second field goal, a 23-yarder, giving UMass a 20-14 lead.

In the fourth quarter, tailback **John Griffin** got warmed up. A first team All-CAA selection last season, Griffin led the Minutemen on a 60-yard touchdown drive, giving UMass a 27-14 lead with 13:55 left. On the 60-yard drive, Griffin picked up 50 rushing yards on five carries. He scored his fifth touchdown of the season on a five-yard run.

Griffin ran for 117 yards on 21 carries to lead the UMass running game which accumulated 191 yards against the Tigers.

Trying to get back into the game, the Tigers moved deep into UMass territory in the final minutes of the game. **Nygee Carmichael** caught a 30-yard pass from Hart, giving Towson a first down at the UMass 10-yard line. But Hart was sacked and the drive stalled.

“This was a great win on the road for us against a very good Towson football team,” said UMass Coach **Kevin Morris**. “When we fell behind in the first half, nobody panicked. It shows the character of our team that we responded as well as we did.”

Linebacker **Tyler Holmes** led UMass with a career high 18 tackles and one sack. UMass limited the Tigers to 11 first downs, 130 rushing yards and 263 yards of total offense.

Booker led the Tigers with 46 yards on 10 carries while Carmichael added 38 yards on 8 attempts. Hart, who alternated at quarterback with **Bart Blanchard**, completed 5 of 9 passes for 69 yards and a TD.

Carmichael was the Tigers’ top receiver with 3 catches for 44 yards. Moore caught three passes for 35 yards against the Minutemen. The CAA leader in all-purpose yards, Moore had 152 all-purpose yards against UMass. He returned five kickoffs for 104 yards.

While Blakey had 11 tackles against UMass, Gardner also made 11 tackles with a sack and a forced fumble. Walker also had a career best 11 tackles and recovered a fumble.

“Against UMass, everyone saw the growth of our team,” added Ambrose. “We were playing a team that rolled up 37 points at Michigan. I’m sure they came in here thinking they were going to score 60 points. But, they escaped with a win. Our football team got better tonight.”

# 2010 Towson University Football Game Notes

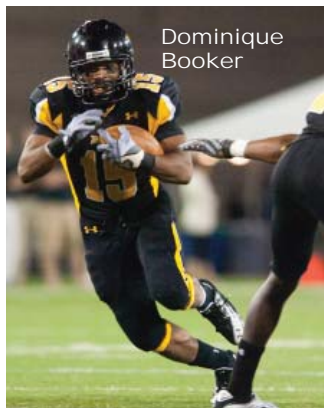
Oct. 9 - #7 James Madison 17, Tigers 13

**TOWSON, Md.** – Facing an NCAA FCS top ten team for the third time in four weeks, the Tigers (1-5, 0-3) nearly pulled off an upset but #7 James Madison University (4-1, 1-1) held on to deal the Tigers a 17-13 Colonial Athletic Association loss before a crowd of 9,049 at Minnegan Field at Johnny Unitas® Stadium.

The Dukes, who received national notoriety in September with an upset win over #20 Virginia Tech, took a 14-3 lead in the first quarter. But they had to stop a Tiger drive at their 24-yard line in the final minutes to clinch the victory.

The Tigers played turnover-free football for the second game in a row. They also held the Dukes to 181 rushing yards and did not allow a touchdown after the first quarter.

"We are really glad to get out of here with a win," said a relieved **Mickey Matthews**, the JMU coach. "Towson is a much-improved football team. If they don't turn the ball over, they will be in every game for the rest of the year."



"Coming in here, we knew this would be a very physical game and it was," Matthews added. "I thought we played pretty well. Towson came out and played very hard."

With the Dukes clinging to a 14-13 lead late in the third period, they staged their most important drive of the game. Starting at their one-yard line, the Dukes marched to the Towson three-yard line. On third-and-goal, JMU tried a trick play. Tailback **Scott Noble** took a handoff and ran to his left. He stopped and threw a pass into the end zone to a wide open **Kerby Long**. But, Long slipped and the pass fell incomplete.

Moments later, freshman **Ben Hopewell** kicked a 21-yard field goal, upping the lead to 17-13 with 9:36 left in the game. On the drive, the Dukes drove 94 yards on 17 plays and ran 7:07 off the clock.

Trailing by 17-13, the Tigers mounted a drive of their own. Quarterback **Chris Hart** ran for a first down at the JMU 47-yard line on third down. Facing fourth-and-13 at midfield, Hart completed a 15-yard pass to **Erron Banks** for a first down at the 35-yard line. A 10-yard run by **Tremayne Dameron** moved the ball to the Dukes' 25-yard line.

However, the Tigers couldn't get any closer. On third down, Hart tried to connect with **Hakeem Moore** in the end zone. But **Vidal Nelson** broke up the pass. On fourth down, Hart threw to Banks across the middle but safety **Jonathan Williams** knocked the pass down.

JMU took possession at its 24-yard line with 3:42 left. The Dukes nailed down the win by running out the clock.

"I don't have any magic words," said Towson Coach **Rob Ambrose**. "We lost, they won and I am unhappy."

Ambrose was happy with his team's effort. He said, "We are getting better each week. Our kids are playing harder and smarter and it is paying off."

The Tigers surprised the Dukes on their opening drive as they marched deep into JMU territory. A 26-yard pass from Hart to **Alex Blake** gave the Tigers a first down at the Dukes' 33-yard line. An 18-yard scramble by Hart moved the ball to the 18-yard line. However, the drive stalled at the 6-yard line. Senior place kicker **Nick Wallace** gave the Tigers a 3-0 lead when he booted a 23-yard field goal with 9:24 left in the opening period.

The Tigers' lead was short-lived. Midway through the period, JMU struck quickly to take a 7-3 lead. After taking possession at their 32-yard line, the Dukes needed only two plays to score. On first down, quarterback **Drew Dudzik** scrambled for 24 yards to the Towson 44-yard line. On the next play, **Dudzik** lofted a pass into the end zone where **Dae'Quan Scott** outjumped defensive back **Ollie Thomas** and made a great catch for a 44-yard TD. Hopewell's extra point gave JMU a 7-3 lead with 5:19 left in the first quarter.

Over the final minutes of the quarter, penalties took their toll on the Tigers. A penalty on the kickoff backed up the Tigers at their 12-yard line. When they punted, a fair catch interference penalty gave JMU a first down at the Towson 29-yard line.

With the Dukes facing third-and-three at the nine-yard line, Dudzik threw an incomplete pass to tight end **Brian Barlow** in the end zone. But, safety **Jordan Dangerfield** was called for a personal foul on the play, costing the Tigers five yards. When Coach Ambrose voiced his displeasure, he was penalized for unsportsmanlike conduct.

Moments later, Dudzik scored from one yard away and the Dukes led, 14-3.

Late in the half, the Tigers cut their deficit to 14-10 with an impressive 59-yard, four-play drive. When Hart completed a 25-yard pass to Moore, the Tigers were at the Dukes' 31-yard line. After a 10-yard pass to Blake, sophomore **Dominique Booker** broke loose for a 21-yard touchdown run. When Wallace converted, the Tigers trailed, 14-10, with 2:55 left in the half.

On their first drive of the second half, the Tigers moved the ball impressively. A 25-yard run by Booker gave the Tigers a first down at the JMU 38-yard line. After converting a third down at the 25-yard line, the drive stalled. Wallace kicked a 38-yard field goal to pull the Tigers to within 14-13. But the Tigers couldn't get any closer.

Booker led the Tigers by rushing for a career high 74 yards on 15 carries with one TD. Hart ran for 72 yards on 14 attempts. The Tigers ran for 167 yards against one of the top defenses in NCAA FCS.

Senior **Jamal Sullivan** led JMU by running for 88 yards on 26 carries while Noble ran for 55 yards on seven attempts.

Hart completed 8 of 24 passes for 92 yards against the Dukes. Blake was the Tigers' top receiver with a career best four catches for 49 yards. Moore was held to two receptions for 29 yards.

Dudzik completed 12 of 22 passes for 136 yards and one touchdown. He threw one interception.

Moore came into the game as the CAA leader with 169.4 all-purpose yards per game. However, he was held to a seasonal low 36 all-purpose yards.

Junior linebacker **Pat Williams** led the Dukes with 14 tackles.

Sophomore defensive end **Frank Beltre** led the Tigers' defense. He made a career high 13 tackles, including 1.5 tackles for lost yardage. Linebacker **Donte Blakey** had 12 tackles, setting a career best. Linebacker **Trevor Walker** added ten tackles while Dangerfield matched his career high with ten tackles.

# 2010 Towson University Football Game Notes

Oct. 23 - #16 Richmond 28, Tigers 6

**RICHMOND, Va.** – It was Dedication Day at the University of Richmond's brand new E. Claiborne Robins Stadium and the 16th-ranked Spiders celebrated with a 28-6 Colonial Athletic Association victory over the Tigers before a sell-out crowd of 8,700.

The injury-riddled Spiders forced four turnovers and stopped the Tiger offense on downs once.

"Richmond deserves all the credit in the world," said Towson Coach **Rob Ambrose**. "They have had an avalanche of injuries and they came out and played hard and smart. After last season, we are very aware of how injuries can affect your preparation.

"This was a very hard-hitting game between two physical teams," he added. "When you play that kind of game, the game is usually decided by turnovers and penalties. It was very physical out there and we have some injuries too. Richmond doesn't have the market cornered on injuries."

The Spiders ran the ball 50 times for 237 yards en route to the win. **Kendall Gaskins** led UR with 16 carries for 100 yards and one TD.

The Tigers had a very rough first quarter as they fell behind, 12-0. They turned the ball over twice and lost senior cornerback

**Ollie Thomas** to a broken leg. On Richmond's first punt of the game, Thomas caught the ball at the 33-yard line and returned it to the 40-yard line where he was injured.

A 19-yard pass from **Chris Hart** to **Erron Banks** moved the Tigers into Richmond territory. On fourth down at the UR 42-yard line, Hart lined up in punt formation. He took the snap and threw a pass to Banks, who was tackled immediately by **Darius McMillan** and the Spiders took over at their own 40-yard line.

Richmond immediately cashed in. A 37-yard pass from **Montel White** to **Tre Gray** moved the ball to the Tiger 7-yard line. Two plays later, **Jovan Smith** ran through several tackles and scored on a 7-yard TD run to give Richmond a 6-0 lead. However, the lead stayed at 6-0 when **Marcus Valentine** blocked **Wil Kamin's** conversion attempt.

On the kickoff, the Spiders got a big break. Senior **Hakeem Moore** returned the kickoff to the 25-yard line where **Wayne Pettus** met him with a jarring tackle. Moore fumbled and linebacker **Eric McBride** recovered the fumble and ran it to the Towson 14-yard line.

From the three-yard line, White lofted a pass in the end zone for tight end **Kevin Finney**. Although **Jordan Dangerfield** tipped the pass, Finney caught the rebound for a TD. Kamin's conversion attempt was no good and the Spiders had a 12-0 advantage.

A sack by junior **Tremayne Graham** forced a Hart fumble near midfield. Defensive end **Brandon Scott** recovered at the 50-yard line, setting up another excellent scoring chance for the Spiders.

A 22-yard drive to the 28-yard line set up Kamin for another kick. He redeemed himself with a career long 45-yard field goal, giving Richmond a 15-0 lead with 12:32 left in the half.

The Tigers got a break with five minutes left in the half. Kamin, who came in to punt, fumbled the snap. He scooped up the ball and tried to run. Sophomore **Romale Tucker** tackled him at the UR 28-yard line.

But, the Tigers couldn't take advantage. **Nick Wallace** tried a 44-yard field goal. When his kick went wide left, the Spiders still led by 15-0.

With 50 seconds left in the half, a nine-yard punt return by **Justin Rogers** gave the Spiders a first down at the Towson 42-yard line. One play later, White was intercepted by **Jeremy Gardner** at the Towson 21-yard line. Gardner returned the ball to the Richmond 48-yard line. However, the Tigers were penalized for roughing the passer. So,

instead of the Tigers having the ball at the UR 48-yard line, the Spiders had a first down at the Towson 27. Kamin booted a 39-yard field goal on the last play of the half to give Richmond an 18-0 lead at halftime.

Midway through the third quarter, the Spiders drove inside the Towson 20-yard line. Kamin's third field goal of the game, a 30-yarder, upped the lead to 21-0.

A 56-yard pass from Hart to sophomore **Alex Blake** set up the Tigers' only touchdown of the game and gave them a first down at the Spiders' 12-yard line. Sophomore **Tremayne Dameron** scored on a 5-yard run with 1:58 left in the third quarter. But Wallace missed the conversion kick.

On their next possession, the Spiders put the game out of reach when they marched 83 yards in nine plays. On the second play of the drive, Smith took a direct snap and raced 45 yards to the Towson 37-yard line before cornerback **Corey Ford** knocked him out of bounds. With 12:06 remaining in the game, Gaskins scored on a six-yard run. Kamin's kick gave the Spiders a comfortable 28-6 advantage.

On their next possession, the Tigers drove to the Richmond 46-yard line where safety **Colin Pehanick** intercepted a **Bart Blanchard** pass to end the threat. With 5:58 left, Kamin's 53-yard punt pinned the Tigers back at their own 2-yard line. The Tigers responded with their best drive of the game. The Tigers reached the Richmond four-yard line but Graham intercepted a pass by Blanchard in the end zone, ending the 94-yard, 16-play drive with 18 seconds left.

While the Spiders ran for 237 yards, the Tigers had 128 rushing yards. Hart ran for 82 yards on 18 carries.

Hart and Blanchard combined to pass for 186 yards. Hart threw for 154 yards. Blanchard passed for 32 yards and was intercepted twice.

Banks had four receptions for 60 yards while Ryan caught four passes for 46 yards.

Linebacker **Trevor Walker**, linebacker **Donte Blakey** and Dangerfield and Blakey each made 13 tackles to lead the Tiger defense. It was a career high for all three Tigers.

Moore had 85 all-purpose yards at Richmond, passing the 3,000-yard mark for all-purpose yards in a career. He now has 3,039 all-purpose yards in 29 career contests.

# 2010 Towson University Football Game Notes

Oct. 30 - Rhode Island 30, Tigers 20

**TOWSON, Md.** – Although quarterback **Chris Hart** ran for 100 yards and threw for a career high 204 yards, the Tigers (1-7, 0-5) couldn't overcome 4 turnovers and dropped a 30-20 CAA decision to Rhode Island (3-5, 2-3), ruining Homecoming at Johnny Unitas® Stadium.

While posting their first win over Towson since 2004, the Rams scored 17 points off Tiger turnovers.

"I don't care if you're coaching midget football or coaching in the NFL, you cannot turn the ball over four times and expect to win," said Towson Coach **Rob Ambrose**. "We kept fighting to try and get back in the game. I know we are getting better but mistakes are killing us."

The Tigers, who piled up 378 yards of total offense, held the Rams

to 262 total yards. Led by linebacker **Kyle Polk**, the defense limited the Rams to 74 rushing yards on 46 attempts. Polk had a career high 13 tackles as the Tigers made 10 tackles for lost yardage.

The Rams were the recipients of great field position in the first quarter, thanks to a pair of turnovers. On the Tigers' first possession, Hart was sacked by defensive tackle **Mike Sheard**. He fumbled and **Matt Hansen** recovered at the Tiger 32-yard line. But,

Polk tackled **Travis Hurd** for an 8-yard loss, helping to force a punt.

On the fifth play on the next possession, Hart completed a pass to **Error Banks**. But, **Willie McGinnis** forced a fumble and recovered at the Towson 29-yard line. Given a second chance, the Rams cashed in on their good fortune. Aided by a penalty, the Rams drove inside the Tiger 10-yard line. On second down, **Ayo Isajola** ran for a 3-yard touchdown. **Louis Feinstein's** conversion kick gave URI a 7-0 lead.

On their next possession, the Tigers wasted no time tying the game. On third down from the 44-yard line, Hart threw a perfect 56-yard TD pass to sophomore **Alex Blake**. **Nick Wallace's** kick tied the game.

Then, it was the Rams' turn to commit a turnover. A bad snap over the head of quarterback **Steve Probst** resulted in a fumble which **Donte Blakey** recovered at the Rhode Island 44-yard line.

A 15-yard pass to Blake gave Towson a first down at the URI 11-yard line. But, the Tigers stalled and Wallace kicked a 28-yard field goal to give the Tigers a 10-7 lead with 12:01 remaining in the half.

Later in the quarter, the Tigers drove into URI territory. Hart scrambled for 17 yards and a first down at the URI 25-yard line.

Replacing Hart for one play, quarterback **Bart Blanchard** and fullback **Tyler Wharton** collided on a handoff and the ball came loose. **Jarrold Williams** recovered at the URI 25-yard line to stop the drive.

"That was a key play in the game," said URI Coach **Joe Trainer**. "They were in control and they were moving the ball. Towson may have been on its way to a ten-point lead. But that fumbled exchange was a huge change in momentum. It was a great break for us."

Coach Ambrose explained, "We always take Chris out of the game after a long run. We want him to catch his breath and re-focus. Earlier in the year, we noticed his tendency to have trouble after a long run."

The Rams responded with their best drive of the game, marching 75 yards in 10 plays for the go-ahead touchdown. A 4-yard TD pass from Probst to tight end **Joe Migliarese** to put URI up by 14-10.

After the URI defense forced a punt, the Rams took over at their own 40-yard line with 2:38 left in the half. For the second straight drive, the Rams moved quickly upfield. A 25-yard pass to freshman **Ramadan Abdullah** and a 21-yard pass to **Anthony Baskerville** gave URI a first down at the Towson 11-yard line. Four plays later, Isajola scored his second touchdown of the game on a one-yard run with 37 seconds left to give URI a 21-10 advantage at the half.

Early in the third quarter, the Tigers tried to cut into their deficit. They drove from their own 18-yard line to the Rams' 21. On a quarterback

keeper, Hart ran for two yards before McGinnis forced a fumble that linebacker **Joseph Harris** recovered at the Rams' 24-yard line.

After getting a fourth turnover, URI drove 69 yards in 9 plays to the 7-yard line. Feinstein's 24-yard field goal upped the lead to 24-10. After stopping the Tigers on fourth-and-one at their 35-yard line, the Rams had great field position. Feinstein's seasonal long 38-yard field goal gave URI a 27-10 edge.

Down by 27-10, the Tigers marched 65 yards to the URI 11-yard line. Wallace's second field goal, a 28-yarder, cut the deficit to 27-13.

Four minutes later, Hart capped off a 63-yard drive by dashing around left end for a 34-yard TD with 6:46 left to make it 27-20.

The Tiger defense forced a punt. But, **Steve Edger's** clutch 59-yard punt gave the Tigers the ball at their 13-yard line with 4:12 left.

"We were concerned when they got the ball at their 12-yard line late in the game," said Trainer. "That quarterback (Hart) is such a threat. He's a running quarterback who can pass. You don't see that much."

A five-yard run by **Dominique Booker** got the drive going but the Tigers faced fourth and one at the 21-yard line. Hart misfired on a pass to **Tom Ryan** and URI took over. With 1:05 left, Feinstein put the game out of reach with a 21-yard field goal to give the Rams a 30-20 lead.

"This was a game of mistakes and we made fewer mistakes," said Trainer.

Ambrose added, "We know we're getting better but we can't make so many mistakes. We have a lot of injuries and we used two running backs who aren't healthy. They are toughing it out to help the team."

Hart led the Tigers by rushing for 100 yards on 18 carries with a TD. He completed 19 of 39 passes for a career best 204 yards and a TD. Booker added 57 yards on 10 attempts as Towson ran for 174 yards.

Ryan had a career high 7 catches for 77 yards. Senior **Hakeem Moore**, who wore #26 as a tribute to injured teammate **Ollie Thomas**, caught 4 passes for 33 yards to become the 19th player in Towson history with 100 career receptions. A senior cornerback and a Tiger co-captain, Thomas suffered a career-ending broken leg at Richmond.

Making the first start of his career, sophomore linebacker **Brian Boateng-Botwe** had a career high 11 tackles.

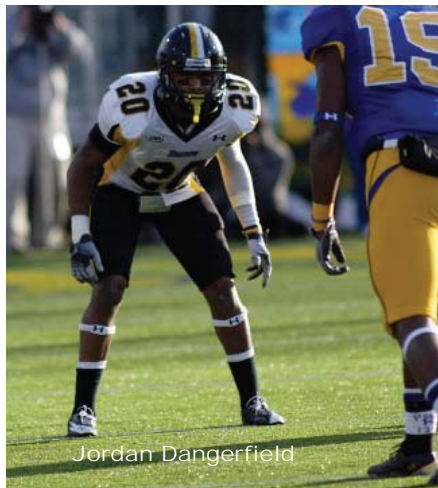

# 2010 Towson University Football Game Notes

Nov. 6 - #5 Delaware 48, Tigers 0

**NEWARK, Del.** – Facing the number one-ranked defense in NCAA FCS on the road proved to be a daunting task for the Tigers as #5 Delaware (8-1, 5-1) shut down their offense en route to a 48-0 Colonial Athletic Association shutout over Towson (1-8, 0-6) before a Homecoming crowd of 21,603 at Delaware Stadium.

The Blue Hens, who came into the contest as the top-ranked scoring defense allowing 9.1 points per game, posted their second shutout of the year, improving their defensive average to 8.1 points per contest.

The UD defense, which was allowing 93.7 rushing yards and 259.1 total yards per game, held the Tigers to 80 yards rushing and 158 yards of total offense. The Tigers managed only eight first downs.

"I am not much of a prognosticator," admitted Towson Coach **Rob Ambrose**. "But, I've seen a lot of very good football teams this season so I think I can say this - Delaware has a very good chance to play deep into the playoffs. That defense is so good. I think their back seven is all seniors and it's hard to

beat that kind of experience."

The Blue Hens, who had outscored opponents by 67-3 in the first quarter this season, continued its season-long first quarter domination against the Tigers. In the opening period, Delaware held Towson to one first down and 18 yards of offense while taking a 7-0 lead.

On the opening drive of the game, the Blue Hens marched deep into Towson territory. On the third play of the drive, quarterback **Pat Devlin** completed a 35-yard pass to **Phillip Thaxton** at the Towson 27-yard line. Facing fourth down at the Tiger 24-yard line, Devlin completed a 12-yard pass to **Nihja White**, moving the ball to the 12-yard line.

However, the Tiger defense held and forced UD to settle for a field goal try. When junior **Mike Perry's** 21-yard field goal attempt hit the crossbar, the game remained scoreless.

On their first drive, the Tigers picked up a first down when quarterback **Bart Blanchard** completed a pass to **Erron Banks**. But, the Blue Hens forced the first of ten Tiger punts.

Devlin directed an efficient 72-yard, 9-play drive to give the Blue Hens a 7-0 lead. On the march, Devlin completed 4 of 5 passes for 54 yards. He gave UD the lead when he scored on a five-yard touchdown run with 4:09 left in the first quarter.

Despite the Tigers' offensive struggles, the defense played well into the second quarter, forcing punts on the next three possessions.

"I give a lot of credit to our defense," said Ambrose. "They did a good job against a very solid, consistent offense. We had a few chances to pick up a loose ball and we couldn't do it.

"Our defense was on the field a long, long time," he added. "They kept us in the game until they got fatigued."

Late in the second quarter, **Andrew Pierce** broke loose for a 24-yard touchdown run off right tackle, capping a 59-yard, 7-play drive to give the Blue Hens a 14-0 lead with 2:27 left in the half.

After the Delaware defense forced another punt, the Blue Hens received another excellent scoring chance. Punting from the Towson 28-yard line, **D.J. Soven** made a touchdown-saving play. After the center snap went over his head into the end zone, he retreated, picked up the ball, avoided a tackler and punted to the Towson 38-yard line. Although he received credit for only a 10-yard punt, he saved the Tigers from giving up a lot of points.

Delaware cashed in on its great field position. Helped by a personal foul penalty, UD moved into field goal range. With 12 seconds left, Perry kicked a 29-yard field goal, giving UD a 17-0 lead at halftime.

Playing without suspended quarterback **Chris Hart**, the Tigers had only 58 total yards and two first downs in the first half.

"Of course, it was difficult without Chris Hart," said Ambrose. "We knew we could do some things schematically. But, we had trouble executing. We must have dropped five passes."

On their first drive of the second half, the Blue Hens marched 58 yards in only 5 plays, taking a 24-0 lead on Pierce's 12th touchdown of the year, a 3-yard run. On the next possession, UD upped its lead to 27-0 when Perry capped off a 44-yard drive with a 22-yard field goal.

Midway through the third quarter, the Tigers staged their best drive of the game. With sophomore **Brian Potts** and Blanchard alternating at quarterback, the Tigers reached the UD 34-yard line. On fourth down-and-five, **Anthony Walters** intercepted Blanchard's pass that was intended for **Tom Ryan** and returned it to the Delaware 47-yard line.

Two plays later, tailback **Leon Jackson** burst up the middle and outran the Tigers for a 63-yard TD, giving UD a 34-0 edge.

In the fourth quarter, Delaware extended the lead to 41-0 by marching 61 yards in 11 plays. Devlin capped off the drive with a six-yard TD pass to White. Playing before a number of NFL scouts, Devlin completed 29 of 38 passes for 318 yards and a TD. He also ran for 25 yards on seven carries and one TD.

With less than five minutes remaining, the Blue Hen reserves added an insurance score. With 2:07 left, **Walter Davis** scored on a ten-yard run to complete a 72-yard, 6-play drive.

Jackson led UD by running for 88 yards on 11 carries with a TD. Pierce, the top rusher in the CAA, picked up 79 yards on 16 carries with 2 touchdowns. Delaware rushed for 241 yards on 44 attempts.

Making his third start of the season, Blanchard completed 10 of 24 passes for 59 yards.

**Dominique Booker** led the Tigers by running for 35 yards on 10 carries. Banks was the Tigers' top receiver with a career high six catches for 34 yards. **Hakeem Moore**, the CAA leader in all-purpose yardage, had 107 all-purpose yards against Delaware, significantly less than his seasonal average of 138.1 yards per game.

Safety **Jordan Dangerfield** led the Tigers with a game high 11 tackles. Cornerback **Jeremy Gardner** added 9 tackles while linebacker **Donte Blakey** had 8 tackles, including 2 tackles for lost yardage.

# 2010 Towson University Football Game Notes

Nov. 13 - Maine 28, Tigers 18

**TOWSON, Md.** – Hoping to send their seniors out with a win in their final home game at Unitas Stadium, the Tigers (1-9, 0-7) outplayed Maine (4-6, 3-4) for most of the game but fell to the Black Bears, 28-18, in a Colonial Athletic Association game before a crowd of 5,347.

The Tigers had 21 first downs while Maine had 14. Towson had 304 yards of offense while Maine had 248 yards. But, it wasn't enough.

In a contest that was filled with penalties, two interceptions were the deciding plays in the game.

With the Tigers leading by 7-6 in the third quarter, they had the ball at the Maine 17-yard line and were threatening to add to their lead. But, linebacker **Mark Masterson** intercepted a tipped pass at the 16-yard line and returned it to the Towson two-yard line. On the next play, tailback **Pushaun Brown** scored on a 2-yard run to give the Black Bears a 13-7 lead with 13:18 left in the third quarter.

The other interception came with 6:17 left in the game. Defensive tackle **Marcus Valentine** had just recovered a fumble at the Towson 33-yard line. With the Tigers trying to overcome a 19-10 deficit, corner

back **Trevor Coston** intercepted a pass and returned it 35 yards for a touchdown, giving the Black Bears a 26-10 advantage.

"We haven't been getting many turnovers this season," said Maine Coach **Jack Cosgrove**. "But we were grateful to get them today. Those two plays gave us two touchdowns and that was the difference. We are just happy to come down here and get a win."

Both teams were penalized profusely. There were a total of 22 penalties for 229 yards. Maine was penalized 10 times for 122 yards while Towson had 12 penalties for 107 yards.

Towson Coach **Rob Ambrose** observed, "It is very rare to see a football game played where there are more than 20 penalties. Even though it was equally balanced between both teams, it seems like an abnormally high number to me."

After a scoreless first quarter, Maine took a 3-0 lead on a 21-yard field goal by **Brian Harvey** to cap off a 53-yard, 8-play drive that was helped by 2 Tiger penalties. When Maine had a third down at the Tigers' 2-yard line, defensive end **Frank Beltre** tackled Brown for a 2-yard loss, forcing Maine to settle for a field goal and a 3-0 lead.

In the second quarter, it was Towson's turn to take advantage of a Maine penalty. After moving from their own 19-yard line, the Tigers had to punt from the 50-yard line. But, a personal foul penalty on Maine negated the punt and gave Towson a first down at the Maine 35-yard line. When quarterback **Bart Blanchard** threw a 30-yard pass to tight end **Cory Kirby**, the Tigers were at the 5-yard line. On the next play, **Tremayne Dameron** scored to give Towson a 7-3 lead with 6:57 left in the half. Dameron's TD run capped off an 81-yard, 11-play drive.

The Black Bears came right back to pull within 7-6 on their next possession. A 32-yard kickoff return by **Derrick Johnson** gave Maine a first down at its own 44-yard line. After the Black Bears reached the Towson 17-yard line, the Tiger defense held and Harvey kicked a 31-yard field goal with 5:04 left in the half.

In the final minutes of the half, the Tigers made a bid to add to the lead. A 22-yard pass from Blanchard to **Tom Ryan** helped them reach the Maine 22-yard line. With 47 seconds left, senior **Nick Wallace** missed a 39-yard field goal try and the lead was 7-6 at the half.

It marked the first time this year that the Tigers had a halftime lead.

On the opening drive of the second half, the Tigers were the beneficiaries of two personal fouls and an unsportsmanlike conduct penalty on the Maine bench. Thanks to the 42 penalty yards, the Tigers reached the Black Bears' 17-yard line.

That's when Masterson made his game-changing interception that led to the touchdown that put Maine ahead to stay.

Late in the third quarter, the Black Bears marched 54 yards in 5 plays to extend the lead to 19-7. Quarterback **Chris Treister** scored

on a one-yard touchdown run. But, he was injured and left the game.

**Warren Smith** replaced him as Maine went for a 2-point conversion. His pass was intercepted by **Jeremy Gardner** and the attempt failed.

On Towson's next drive, Blanchard completed four straight passes for 44 yards to reach the Maine 23-yard line. When the drive stalled, Wallace kicked a 36-yard field goal, cutting the deficit to 19-10.

After the kickoff, the Black Bears staged a time-consuming drive into Towson territory. But Valentine's fumble recovery gave Towson the ball at its 33-yard line. On the next play, Coston's 35-yard interception return for a TD put Maine ahead, 26-10.

Towson responded with an efficient drive. A 20-yard pass to tight end **Mike Evans** moved the ball to the 14-yard line. With 2:18 left, Dameron kept the Tigers' hopes alive, scoring on a 1-yard run. When Blanchard completed a conversion pass to Ryan, the deficit was cut to 26-18.

After the Tiger defense used three time outs and forced a punt, **Jordan Waxman** placed a perfect punt at the three yard line.

Before the Tigers could start a drive, another penalty killed their hopes. An offensive holding call in the end zone resulted in a safety and clinched Maine's 28-18 win.

"We wish we could have sent our seniors out on a winning note," said Ambrose. "We left too many points on the field. We need to play more disciplined.

"I know we are making progress," he added. "Last year, we were getting destroyed. We were getting manhandled physically. This year, we're not winning the fight – but we are in the fight. We're in the fight with a chance to win."

Blanchard led Towson by completing 22 of 40 passes for 209 yards. Banks had a career high 9 catches for 77 yards. Dameron ran for 76 yards on 19 carries and 2 TD's and caught 4 passes for 14 yards.

Beltre led the Tiger defense with 13 tackles to match his career high. The defense made 9 tackles for lost yardage and recorded 2 sacks.

Defensive tackle **Yaky Ibia**, one of 18 seniors honored in pre-game ceremonies, made 5 tackles, including 2.5 tackles for lost yardage.

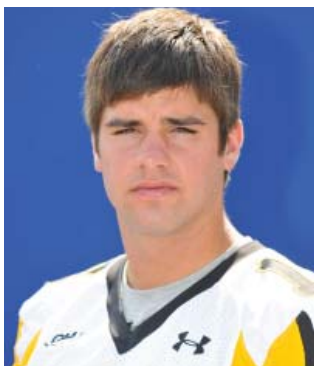

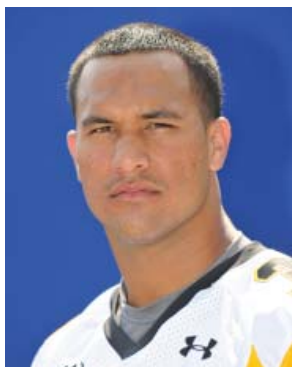

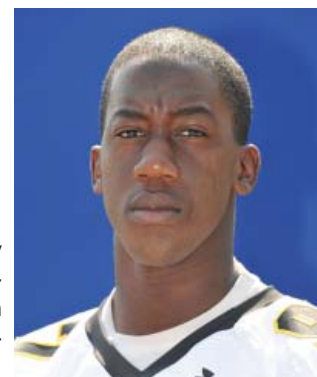
