Named second team All-Colonial Athletic Association wide receiver in 2010 ... one of the Tigers' co-captains ... finished career with 3,499 all-purpose yards, third on Towson's all-time list ... caught 106 passes for 1,397 yards in career, 17th on Towson's career list ... had 92 career kickoff returns for 2,030 yards, second-highest totals in school history ... explosive wide receiver who gave Tigers a "big play" threat ... has tremendous speed and quickness ... had three consecutive seasons in which he has accumulated 1,000 all-purpose yards or more ... was a freshman "red shirt" in 2006 ... missed 12 career games due to injuries ... co-winner of 2009 Tiger Award, presented to the student-athlete who best exemplifies a Towson University football player.

**2010 SEASON:** Starter in 10 of 11 games at wide receiver ... finished second in the CAA with 129.8 all-purpose yards per game ... averaged 21.6 yards per kickoff return, seventh in the CAA ... Tigers' second-leading receiver who caught 29 passes for 559 yards and six touchdowns ... led CAA with 19.3 yards per catch ... second in CAA in touchdown receptions ... ranked seventh in CAA with 50.8 receiving yards per game ... had a career high 221 all-purpose yards in season opener at Indiana ... caught a 64-yard touchdown pass against the Hoosiers ... helped Tigers to a five-overtime win over Coastal Carolina with two touchdown receptions ... caught 25-yard TD pass in fifth overtime to lead Tigers to win ... caught a 59-yard touchdown pass at #1 Villanova ... also had a seasonal long 44-yard kickoff return against Villanova ... had five catches for 110 yards, including a 62-yard TD, at Columbia ... had four receptions for 33 yards against Rhode Island ... caught a 64-yard touchdown pass at New Hampshire in season finale ... led CAA in all-purpose yards for most of the season ... set school record with 39 kickoff returns as a senior.

**2009 SEASON:** Appeared in nine games at wide receiver with five starts ... missed first two games due to broken hand ... tied for team lead with 28 receptions for 286 yards and one touchdown ... tied Towson single season record with 33 kickoff returns ... ranked fourth in the Colonial Athletic Association with 33 kickoff returns for 744 yards and a 22.4 average ... had 1,046 all-purpose yards in nine games, third in the CAA ... broke Towson single game record with seven kickoff returns against New Hampshire ... had seven kickoff returns for 110 yards against UNH ... returned six kickoffs for 130 yards, including a seasonal long 49-yard kickoff return against Delaware ... had five kickoff returns for 106 yards against Villanova ... returned two kickoffs for 78 yards at Rhode Island ... had four kickoff returns for 99 yards at James Madison ... a 38-yard return at Morgan State ... had one reception for seven yards at Morgan ... led Tigers to a 36-28 victory at Rhode Island with four catches for 91 yards and a touchdown

... gave Tigers a quick 6-0 lead when he caught a 78-yard TD pass from Peter Athens on the second play of the game ... had three receptions for 52 yards against Delaware ... caught five passes for 24 yards at Northeastern ... had four receptions for 54 yards at #5 William & Mary ... caught four passes for 27 yards against Villanova.

**2008 SEASON:** Appeared in 12 games at wide receiver ... led Tigers with 1,000 all-purpose yards ... caught 45 passes for 527 yards ... Tigers' second-leading pass receiver ... had 20 kickoff returns for 443 yards ... returned four punts for 30 yards ... only Tiger receiver with two 100-yard games ... caught 8 passes for 112 yards against Northeastern ... had career high 9 catches for 110 yards at New Hampshire ... caught 2 passes for 57 yards in win over Morgan State, including a 40-yard catch in fourth quarter to help Tigers run out the clock ... caught 10-yard TD pass at Richmond ... helped Tigers to 31-24 win over Columbia by returning 4 kickoffs for 111 yards ... had 60-yard kickoff return in fourth quarter to set up game-winning TD ... had 162 all-purpose yards against Northeastern ... had 36-yard kickoff return in win over Rhode Island ... picked up 162 all-purpose yards at New Hampshire ... had season high 174 all-purpose yards in finale against James Madison ... caught 6 passes for 97 yards against JMU.

**2007 SEASON:** Played in season opener against Central Connecticut ... had four catches for 25 yards ... suffered season-ending dislocated ankle injury in fourth quarter.

**AT COURTLAND H.S.:** Played wide receiver and defensive back ... led Cougars to a 9-3 record ... set school career records with 11 touchdown catches and receiving yards (856) ... caught passes thrown by Jeremy Gardner, a Tiger teammate ... named to All-District, All-Region and All-State teams at wide receiver and defensive back ... blocked an extra point in overtime to preserve Courtland's

35-34 win over Grafton in a Region 1 semifinal game ... played as a return specialist ... sprinter and long jumper on the track team ... played basketball at Courtland.

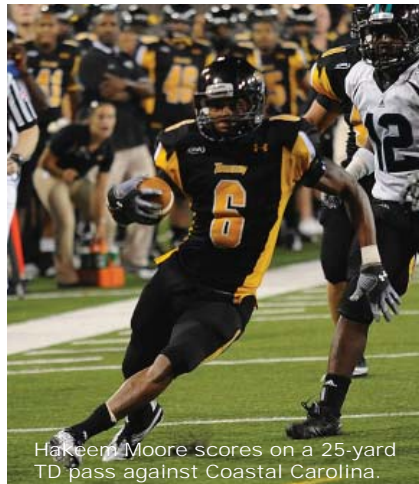

# Hakeem Moore, Towson University

**MOORE ALL-PURPOSE YARDAGE:** Over the last four seasons, senior wide receiver **Hakeem Moore** has provided "moore" all-purpose yards than any one else on the Tiger roster ... In the opener at Indiana, he accumulated a career high 221 all-purpose yards ... At Richmond, he went over the 3,000-yard mark for career all-purpose yardage ... The CAA all-purpose yardage leader for most of the season, he averaged 129.8 yards per game ... Junior **Jonathan Grimes** of William & Mary leads the CAA with 132.6 all-purpose yards per game ... Grimes' season has been extended into the NCAA FCS playoffs ... In his career, he went topped the 100-yard all-purpose mark in 18 games.

**MOORE BIG PLAYS:** During the Tigers' 2010 season, wide receiver **Hakeem Moore** provided the Tigers with a number of big plays ... He had five pass receptions of more than 50 yards ... Four of his six TD receptions were 59 yards or more ... He averaged 19.3 yards per catch, a mark that led the CAA ... Moore was also explosive as a kickoff return specialist ... While averaging 21.6 yards per kickoff return, he nearly broke three for touchdowns ... He had six kickoff returns of more than 30 yards this season.

**HAKEEM JOINS CENTURY CLUB:** In the Tigers' loss to Rhode Island, wide receiver **Hakeem Moore** became the 19th player in Towson history with 100 career receptions ... Despite missing 12 career games due to injuries, Hakeem finished his career with 106 catches for 1,397 yards and eight touchdowns ... He ended his career in 17th place on Towson's career pass receiving list.

**HAKEEM FINISHES 3rd IN ALL-PURPOSE YARDS:** With 3,499 all-purpose yards in his career, **Hakeem Moore** ended his career in third place on the Tigers' career list of all-purpose yardage leaders ... In his final college game, he moved from seventh place to third place ... At New Hampshire, he passed **Tony Vinson** (3,367), **Noah Read** (3,387), **David Meggett** (3,403) and **Brian McCarty** (3,435) on the all-time list ... Moore is the ninth Tiger to accumulate more than 3,000 all-purpose yards in a career.

Most of the Tigers' all-purpose yardage leaders were running backs, including all-time rushing leader **Jason Corle** (1996-99) ... Corle's 5,382 all-purpose yards are well ahead of anyone else ... Former All-American wide receiver **Mark Orlando** (1991-94) is second on the list with 4,095 career all-purpose yards.
