TIGERS OPEN CAA SCHEDULE AGAINST DEFENDING NATIONAL CHAMPIONS:

Towson and Villanova are meeting for the seventh time in a series that Villanova leads by a 4-2 margin ... Since losing back-to-back meetings to Towson in 2005 and 2006, the Wildcats have won three games in a row ... After edging Towson by two points in 2007 and three points in 2008, third-ranked Villanova rolled to a 49-7 victory over Towson at Johnny Uinitas® Stadium last November ... The victory was the Wildcats' fourth consecutive win on their way to

the NCAA FCS championship ... In the win over the Tigers, Villanova rushed for 282 yards and sprinted to a 35-0 halftime lead ... Playing only the first half, quarterback **Chris Whitney** completed six of seven passes for 93 yards and two touchdowns ... Whitney also ran for 21 yards on four carries and caught a 13-yard touchdown pass from **Matt Szczer**.

In 2008, the Tigers nearly upset 6th-ranked Villanova as record-setting quarterback **Sean Schaefer** tried to lead them to a win before Villanova held on for the victory ... Schaefer completed 35 of 47 passes for 326 yards and four touchdowns ... His fourth TD pass of the game pulled Towson to within 34-31 with 5:12 left in regulation ... However, Villanova marched 63 yards in 11 plays, running out the final 5:12 off the clock as the Wildcats pulled out the victory, all but clinching a berth in the NCAA FCS playoffs.

In 2007, Villanova held off a late Tiger comeback to edge Towson, 14-12 ... Defensive back **John Dempsey** made the biggest play for the Wildcats when he deflected a potential game-tying two-point conversion pass with 52 seconds left ... Dempsey's defensive play came moments after Schaefer had completed a 7-yard TD pass to **Demetrius Harrison**.

The Tigers' only win at Villanova was a 21-13 victory in 2006 ... Schaefer had another big day against the Wildcats, completing 35 of 45 passes for 324 yards and two touchdowns ... The first two meetings in the series were one-sided contests ... In 2004, the Wildcats handed the Tigers a 41-6 loss ... In 2005, Towson stunned Villanova, 40-19, at Johnny Uinitas® Stadium as the Tigers raced to a 24-0 lead in the second quarter ... In 2004, the teams met for the first time and the Wildcats rolled to a 41-6 victory.

TIGERS VS. DEFENDING NATIONAL CHAMPIONS: Playing in the Colonial Athletic Association has given the Tigers plenty of chances to play the defending national champions ... Since 2004, the Tigers have played the reigning national champions four times ... In 2004, the Tigers played at Delaware, the 2003 NCAA FCS champions ... The Blue Hens came from behind to pull out a 21-17 victory ... Delaware's win over the Tigers came in its home opener when the Blue Hens were celebrating their national title ... In 2005, the Tigers played at James Madison when the Dukes were national champions ... In the final game of the 2005 season, the Dukes dealt the Tigers a 55-14 loss ... Last season, the Tigers faced top-ranked Richmond, the defending national champions ... Despite taking a shocking 14-13 in the third quarter, the Tigers lost to the Spiders, 42-14.

TIGERS VS. NUMBER ONE-RANKED TEAMS: For the third year in a row, the Tigers will be playing a team that is ranked number one in NCAA FCS ... In the 2008 season finale, the Tigers hosted top-ranked James Madison University and lost to the Dukes, 58-27 ... In 2009, the Tigers hosted number one-ranked Richmond at Johnny Uinitas® Stadium ... After throwing a mild scare into the Spiders by taking a 14-13 lead in the third quarter, the Tigers dropped a 42-14 decision to Richmond.

Only the fourth head coach in Towson football history, Rob Ambrose is no stranger to the Tiger football program. A 1993 Towson graduate, he started his coaching career while he was still a student.

From 1992 to 2000, he served as a member of the Towson coaching staff. He was the Tigers' Wide Receivers Coach from 1992 to 1996. In 1997, Coach Gordy Combs promoted him to Offensive Coordinator. In 2000, he earned the title of Associate Head Coach.

Coach Ambrose left his alma mater after the 2000 season and became the head coach at Catholic University. After one year at Catholic, he joined the coaching staff at the University of Connecticut where he worked for Coach Randy Edsall.

Coach Ambrose spent seven seasons on the UConn staff as the program moved from NCAA Division I-AA status to NCAA Division I-A classification. Ambrose spent four years as the Quarterbacks Coach at UConn and three years as the Offensive Coordinator.

During that time, he helped UConn compile a 49-36 record with the first three Bowl Game appearances in school history. In 2004, UConn beat Toledo in the Motor City Bowl, 39-10. In 2007, UConn faced Wake Forest in the Meineke Car Care Bowl and lost to the Demon Deacons. In his final season at UConn, the Huskies earned a berth in the International Bowl in Toronto. Ambrose coached the Huskies to a win over Buffalo even though he had already been named as the new coach at Towson.

A native of Middletown, Md., Ambrose is the son of Tim Ambrose, one of the winningest high school coaches in the state of Maryland. He played for his father at Middletown High School. His younger brother, Jared, was an assistant coach at Delaware for two years and is part of the Tigers' coaching staff this season. He is the Tigers' Tight Ends Coach.

He was named as the Tigers' head coach on December 27, 2008.

QUOTING ROB AMBROSE

On facing Villanova: "This is going to be quite a challenge for us. Villanova is one of the best teams in NCAA FCS and they should be in the conversation when the national championship contenders are discussed. Last year, we were so impressed by Villanova. They have everything you need to win. In fact, after the game last year, I said 'that team could be the national champion.'"

On the Tigers' memorable victory over Coastal Carolina: "Anyone who attended that game got their money's worth. That's for sure. It's quite an achievement for our team to come from behind against a quality opponent like we did. Coming back and winning in five overtimes shows that hard work pays off. We have learned how to finish. It was a great experience for our players and the University community. Our players wanted that win so badly. They told me they would play all night if it meant we would win. I am very proud of our team. Most of all, it shows that this year's team is not last year's team."

On the play of Quarterback Chris Hart: "He is learning more and more with each snap. Considering we had about 90 snaps against Coastal Carolina, he got a lot of chances to learn in that game. His game management is getting better but he knows he can play better than he has."

On the play of Defensive Back Jordan Dangerfield: "Jordan has had quite an impact on our team. He loves to hit and he has raised the physical ability of our defensive backs. He has taught our defensive players how to hit hard. It's getting to the point where any receiver we play knows he is going to get hurt. He really played a great game against Coastal Carolina."

On the 2010 season: "I have told our team that we have 'a good news, bad news' situation. The good news is that we are a better football team. The bad news is that we still have a way to go.' We are making progress. Last year was a learning experience. We are no longer coaching the attitudes of our players. They understand what it takes to be competitive on a consistent basis against great competition. Most of our guys did a great job working in the weight room in the off-season. As a result, our players are much stronger this season."

TIGERS' COMEBACK: In the dramatic 47-45 five-overtime win over Coastal Carolina last Saturday night, the Tigers overcame a 14-point deficit in the fourth quarter to send the game into overtime ... A two-yard touchdown pass from **Chris Hart** to **Tom Ryan** with 25 seconds left in regulation completed the comeback ... It marked the first time since October 31, 1992 that the Tigers overcame a 14-point fourth quarter deficit to win ... In 1992, the Tigers trailed by 33-13 in the fourth quarter at Indiana (Pa.) as they scored 22 points in the final six minutes to edge IUP, 35-33 ... In 2006, the Tigers staged another impressive comeback when they rallied from a 30-19 deficit to beat Hofstra, 33-30.

TIGERS' LONGEST GAME EVER: Here are leftover notes from the Tigers' memorable five-overtime game against Coastal Carolina on Saturday evening.

- The 5 overtime periods were one shy of the NCAA FCS record for OT's in a game.
- The teams combined for 42 points in regulation and 50 points in the overtimes.
- It was the second-highest score in UConn Stadium history.
- In the 5 overtimes, the Tigers ran 19 plays for 103 yards and three touchdowns.
- In the 5 overtimes, the Tigers ran the ball 18 times for 78 yards and two touchdowns.
- The Tigers' only pass play in the overtimes was a 25-yard TD pass from **Chris Hart** to **Hakeem Moore** in the 5th overtime.
- In the 5 overtimes, Coastal Carolina ran 22 plays for 74 yards.
- **Tremayne Dameron** of Towson ran for 44 yards on 9 carries and scored two touchdowns in the overtime periods.
- In the overtimes, **Justin Durham** of Coastal Carolina and the Tigers' **Nick Wallace** each kicked 2 field goals ... Durham kicked a 42-yard field goal in the first overtime and a 43-yarder in the fourth OT ... Wallace booted a 34-yarder in the first OT and a 27-yarder in the fourth OT.
- Both kickers, Durham and Wallace, missed conversion attempts in the second overtime, extending the game to a third overtime period.
- Neither team was penalized in the 41 overtime plays.

TOWSON, VILLANOVA PLAYED TOUGH NCAA FCS SCHEDULES IN 2009:

Both Villanova and Towson played two of the toughest NCAA FCS schedules last season ... Villanova's opponents had a 111-55 (.685), tops in the nation ... The Tigers' opponents in 2009 had a combined record of 71-51 (.582) ... Towson's schedule was rated as the 6th-toughest schedule ... Villanova and Towson were 2 of 5 Colonial Athletic Association teams who were ranked in the top ten ... William & Mary, an NCAA FCS semi-finalist, had the second-toughest schedule (.632) ... Delaware was third (.609) ... Richmond was the fifth CAA team whose schedule was ranked in the top ten ... The Spiders played the 10th-toughest schedule.

YOU GOTTA HAVE HART: In their first two games of the season, the Tigers showed they have plenty of heart - quarterback **Chris Hart** ... A transfer from Georgia Military Institute, Hart has played very well to date ... Making his first start for the Tigers, he rushed for

a game high 123 yards on 16 carries at Indiana ... While averaging 7.7 yards per carry, he set a school record for rushing yards in a game by a Tiger quarterback ... After rushing for 79 yards against Coastal Carolina, Hart is the fifth-leading rusher in the Colonial Athletic Association ... In addition to his success on the ground, Hart has completed 29 of 56 passes for 320 yards and six touchdowns ... While averaging 261.0 yards of total offense per game, he ranks second in the CAA ... He also leads all CAA quarterbacks with six TD passes.

In the win over Coastal Carolina, he threw four touchdown passes ... In

11 games last season, Tiger quarterbacks threw only nine TD passes.

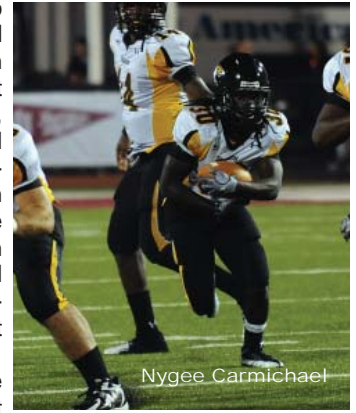

TIGER OFFENSE COMES TO LIFE: In the Tigers' first two games of the season, their offense has been operating at a very high level ... The Tigers have scored 64 points and they rank third in the Colonial Athletic Association with 32.0 points per game ... Averaging 381.0 yards of total offense, the Tigers rank fourth in the CAA ... Last year, the Tigers averaged only 251.1 yards of total offense per game ... The Tigers have also outgained their opponents in back-to-back games ... At Indiana, the Tigers rolled up 392 total yards while the Hoosiers had 360 yards of offense ... The Tigers' 392 yards of total offense was more yardage than they gained in any of their 11 games last year ... It was the most yards of total offense since the Tigers had 402 yards in a 34-31 loss at Villanova on November 15, 2008 ... In their win over Coastal Carolina, the Tigers had 370 yards of offense while the Chanticleers had 363 yards ... The Tigers have also controlled time of possession in both games ... The Tigers are second in the CAA while averaging 33:45 time of possession to date ... Towson's red-zone offense has also been very efficient ... The Tigers have scored eight times in nine trips into the red zone.

RUSH HOUR: In the Tigers' two games this season, they have rushed for 442 yards on 101 attempts, an average of 4.4 yards per attempt ... Averaging 221 yards per game, the Tigers are fourth in the Colonial Athletic Association in rushing yardage ... After running for 227 yards in their season opener at Indiana, the Tigers picked up 215 rushing yards in their five-overtime win over Coastal Carolina ... The Tigers' 227 rushing yards at Indiana were the most they've had since they ran for 231 yards on 40 carries against Delaware on October 17, 2009 ... However, it marked only the third time in the last 50 games (dating back to 2005) that the Tigers had 200 yards rushing ... The only other 200-yard game during that stretch was a 214-yard performance at William & Mary on September 29, 2007.

The Tigers, who have topped the 200-yard rushing mark in back-to-back games, accomplished the feat for the first time since September 21 and 28, 2002 ... On Sept. 21, the Tigers ran for 222 yards in a wild 56-42 win over Brown ... On Sept. 28, they rushed for 209 yards in a 42-10 victory at Holy Cross.

Quarterback **Chris Hart**, who ran for 123 yards at Indiana, leads the Tigers with 202 yards on 38 carries ... He is the fifth-leading rusher in the CAA ... Sophomore **Tremayne Dameron**, who rushed for 107 yards against Coastal Carolina, has 135 yards on 40 carries and has scored two touchdowns ... He is ninth in CAA rushing.

A pair of "red shirt" freshmen, **Nygee Carmichael** and **B.J. Greening**, have also seen action ... In two games, Carmichael has run for 73 yards on 16 carries, a 4.6 average ... Greening has carried the ball six times for 32 yards, a 5.3 average.

GETTING THEIR KICKS: When **Justin Durham** made both of his field goal attempts in overtime for Coastal Carolina last week, it extended a rather strange streak ... Opposing place kickers have now made 16 consecutive field goal attempts against the Tigers, a streak that dates back to 2008 ... This season, opposing kickers are five-for-five ... Last year, opposing kickers made all ten field goal attempts ... Ironically, the last kicker to miss a field goal attempt was All-CAA kicker **Joe Marcoux** of Villanova, who missed a 24-yard kick against the Tigers on November 15, 2008.

FOUR-YEAR STARTERS AT CORNERBACK: The Tigers have plenty of experience at the cornerback positions ... **Jeremy Gardner** and **Ollie Thomas** have been starters since their freshman seasons ... A native of Spotsylvania, Va., Gardner had his freshman and sophomore seasons cut short by injuries ... Last year, he started

all 11 games and made 64 tackles, third on the team ... In his career, he has played in 31 games and started 30 of them ... He has 136 tackles in his career with 12 pass break-ups and two interceptions.

Thomas, who has started 25 games in a row, has played in all 36 games of his career and has made 29 starts ... In his career, Thomas has 148 tackles with 13 pass break-ups ... The lone interception of his career came in the Tigers' 31-24 win over Columbia in 2008 ... It was an interception in the end zone that saved the Tigers' win.

2010 Tiger Football Game Notes

MOORE ALL-PURPOSE YARDAGE: Over the last two seasons, senior wide receiver **Hakeem Moore** has become "moore" of a playmaker each week ... In the Tigers' season opener at Indiana, he accumulated a career high 221 all-purpose yards ... At Indiana, he caught two passes for 63 yards ... In the second quarter, he caught a 64-yard touchdown pass ... He also returned six kickoffs for 158 yards ... Against Coastal Carolina, he had three catches for 106 yards and two touchdowns.

After two games, he leads the Colonial Athletic Association with 185 all-purpose yards per game.

In 2009, he accumulated 1,046 all-purpose yards in nine games, third

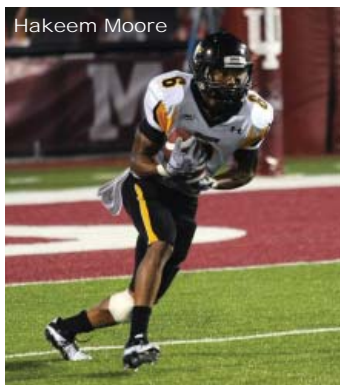
in the CAA ... He had 744 yards on kickoff returns, 286 yards on pass receptions and 14 yards on punt returns ... In 2008, he had 1,000 all-purpose yards in 12 games with 443 yards on kickoff returns and 527 pass receiving yards in addition to 30 yards on punt returns ... The Fredericksburg, Va. native has caught 82 passes in his career for 838 yards and five touchdowns.

In the Tigers' 36-28 win at Rhode Island last year, he had a huge impact ... On the second play of the game, he caught a sideline pass and raced 78 yards for a touchdown, giving Towson a quick 6-0 lead ... He also returned two kickoffs for 78 yards and had a seasonal high 168 all-purpose yards ... He set his career high with 174 all-purpose yards against James Madison in the 2008 finale.

In 2007, he suffered a season-ending leg injury in the Tigers' season-opening win over Central Connecticut ... He caught four passes for 25 yards against Central Connecticut.

MANY HAPPY RETURNS: If the Tigers return a kickoff for a TD this year, odds are that **Hakeem Moore** will accomplish the feat ... In 2009, he tied a school record with 33 returns ... He had 744 return yards and was third in the Colonial Athletic Association with a 22.4 average ... He had 3 returns of 40 yards or more ... His career long is a 60-yarder in a win over Columbia in 2008 ... In his career, Moore has returned 61 kickoffs for 1,388 yards, a 22.8 average.

FLORIDA NATIVES COME NORTH: Last year, Towson had no players on the roster from Florida ... In 2010, five natives of the Sunshine State are Tigers ... Sophomore defensive back **Jordan Dangerfield** (Royal Palm Beach), freshman tackle **Drew Bellamy** (Cottdonale), freshman receiver **Justen Davis** (Tampa), junior quarterback **Chris Hart** (Bradenton, Fla.) and freshman kicker **D.J. Soven** (Weston) are first-year Floridians on the Tiger roster.

The Tigers have the most transfers from the University of Maryland ... Senior defensive back **Chris Sheahin** and senior place kicker **Nick Wallace** both left the Terrapins to transfer to Towson.

TIGERS' COACHING STAFF RETURNS INTACT: When **Rob Ambrose** became the Tigers' head coach prior to the 2009 season, there were plenty of new faces on the coaching staff ... Of the Tigers' ten assistant coaches, four of them were retained from the previous staff ... Offensive Line Coach **John Donatelli** is the dean of the Tiger staff ... In his 14th year as a Tiger assistant coach, Donatelli coached with Ambrose when he was the Tigers' Offensive Coordinator.

Defensive Coordinator **Matt Hachmann** came to Towson from Lafayette where he coached for eight years and worked with the linebackers ... **Brian Fleury**, a Towson grad who was the Defensive Coordinator at Sacred Heart for three years, serves as the Secondary Coach ... **Canute Curtis**, a former All-American linebacker at West Virginia and a six-year NFL veteran, is the Defensive Line Coach ... Kosmakos and Johnson complete the defensive staff.

On the offensive side, **John Kaleo** is the Quarterbacks Coach after spending two seasons as the Offensive Coordinator at Iona ... **James Vollono**, a member of the staff at North Carolina, coaches the running backs and works with special teams ... Tight Ends Coach **Jared Ambrose** joined the Towson staff after two years at Delaware ... Donatelli and Gary round out the offensive staff.

The Tigers' ten coaches graduated from eight schools ... Three coaches (Rob Ambrose, Fleury, Kosmakos) are Towson graduates ... Gary and Kaleo attended Maryland ... NEEDING SPECIAL TEAMS TO BE MORE SPECIAL: The Tigers have been focusing on improvement on their special teams this season ... Coach **Brian Fleury**, the Tigers' Special Teams Coordinator, says that the Tiger special teams have a goal of "ending the drought" this season ... The Tigers have not had a kickoff or punt return for a touchdown since 1998 (**Josh Corle** did return a blocked punt for a touchdown in 2005) ... **Dennis Cliggett** was the last Tiger to return a punt for a touchdown ... He returned a punt 71 yards for a TD in a win over Fordham on September 26, 1998 ... There have been 12 punt returns for touchdowns in the 41-year history of Tiger football ... **Maurice Sydnor, '97** was the last Tiger to return a kickoff for a touchdown when he scored on an 84-yard return against Butler on September 9, 1995 ... There have only been five kickoff returns for touchdowns in 41 years of Tiger football ... Strangely enough, all of those kickoff returns for touchdowns occurred during a ten-year period from 1985 to 1995 ... Three players accounted for those five kickoff returns for TD's ... In 1985, **Mike Barth, '86** became the first Tiger to return a kickoff for a TD when he went 96 yards in a win over American International ... Former All-American **David Meggett, '89** had two kickoff returns for touchdowns in his career ... In 1988, he returned a kickoff 100 yards for a TD in the season opener against Northeastern ... Later in the season, he had an 84-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in a win at Howard ... In 1995, Sydnor had an 89-yard kickoff return for a TD in the opener against Butler ... In 1995, he ran 86 yards for a TD against Charleston Southern ... Towson is 5-0 when a Tiger player returns a kickoff return for a touchdown.

FORMER PROS ON THE TIGER COACHING STAFF: Quarterbacks Coach **John Kaleo**, Defensive Line Coach **Canute Curtis** and Defensive Line Assistant **Konstantinos Kosmakos** bring pro football experience to the Tiger coaching staff.

Kaleo, an outstanding quarterback at Maryland, enjoyed a very productive 14-year career playing the Arena Football League ... In his career, he played for ten different teams and compiled a 78-62 record as a starting quarterback ... In 2003, he led Tampa Bay to the Arena Football League title ... In his career, he completed 2,929 passes in 4,880 attempts (60%) while passing for 35,335 yards ... He threw 581 touchdown passes and ran for 59 TD's.

Coach Curtis was a linebacker for the Cincinnati Bengals for six years ... A sixth round draft pick, he played in 70 career games with 15 starts ... In his career, he made 101 tackles with three quarterback sacks ... The 2002 season was his final NFL season and it was his best ... He appeared in all 16 games and started 11 times ... Curtis finished ninth on the Bengals with 51 tackles.

Coach Kosmakos is still an active player with the Baltimore Mariners of the American Indoor Football Association ... He has played offensive center for the Mariners the last two seasons ... Coach Kosmakos helped

the Mariners win the 2010 AIFA championship.

DEPTH AT QUARTERBACK: Last season, the Tigers had a very unsettled situation at quarterback ... They entered the season with five quarterbacks, four of whom had never played in a college game ... In 2009, first-year freshman **Pete Athens** opened the season as the Tigers' starting quarterback in the first seven games ... He led the Tigers to a 2-4 record in the games he finished ... However, he suffered a season-ending knee injury against Delaware ... Knee surgery sidelined him for the rest of the season and the Spring Season ... After the injury to Athens, four different quarterbacks played in the final five games of the season ... **Tommy Chroniger, Blair Peterson** and **Brian Potts** all started games while **Jeremy Jayne** saw action in three games ... Coach Ambrose says, "Any time you have to use five quarterbacks in a season, the results are not going to be good."

Ibia made 52 tackles in ten games last season ... He also had a team-leading 11.5 tackles for lost yardage ... In his career, Ibia has made 106 tackles, including 16 for lost yardage ... He had a career high 10 tackles against Coastal Carolina last week ... The only two Tiger football players to be named to the ESPN The Magazine Academic All-America® University Division Football team are defensive back **Aaron Bates** (1993) and wide receiver **Adam Overbey** (2000) ... Bates earned second team honors while Overbey was a first team selection.

OVERTIME STREAKS END ON SAME DAY: Entering last week's action, Weber State and Towson had two of the longest streaks in NCAA FCS without playing an overtime game ... Weber State had gone 93 games without going to overtime while Towson had played 86

games without playing an overtime contest.

Ironically, both teams had their streaks end last week and both teams made up for lost time ... Weber State played four overtime periods before beating Northern Colorado, 50-47 ... Meanwhile, the Tigers edged Coastal Carolina in five overtimes, 47-45.

TIGER DEFENSIVE SCORING STATISTICS WERE MISLEADING: In 2009, the Tiger defense played much better than its scoring defensive statistics would indicate ... According to the Colonial Athletic Association statistics, the Tigers were 11th in the CAA, allowing 36.5 points per game ... Towson surrendered 402 points in 11 games ... However, the Tiger defense was not been on the field for some of those points.

In reality, the defense allowed 338 points in 11 games, a more respectable number ... Towson allowed 64 points while the defense was on the sidelines ... Tiger opponents returned five interceptions and two kickoffs for touchdowns ... Opponents also had one fumble return for a touchdown ... In addition, Towson surrendered 2 safeties and two defensive two-point conversions (Morgan, James Madison).

In the season opener at Indiana, the Tigers gave up another touchdown on an interception return ... In the third quarter, **Matt Ernest** intercepted a pass and returned it 56 yards for a touchdown to give Indiana a 48-14 lead.

PENALTY-FREE GAME IN 2009: Although records are not kept on this, Towson and Richmond may have played the most penalty-free game in Colonial Athletic Association history on October 31, 2009 ... In the entire game, there was only one penalty called ... After a penalty-free first half, Richmond was penalized for roughing-the-passer in the third quarter ... But that was it ... For the first time in school history, Towson played a penalty-free game ... Towson's previous low had been one penalty for 10 yards in a 1990 contest at Delaware State.

MARYLAND TIGERS: There is a very strong Maryland flavor to the Tigers' roster this season ... Of the 85 players on the Tigers' roster, 48% of them are natives of Maryland ... There are 41 Marylanders on the roster while New Jersey has 12 products on the squad ... Ten Tigers are natives of the state of Virginia.

The Maryland flavor even extends to the Tigers' coaching staff ... While Coach **Rob Ambrose** is a native of Middletown, Md., seven of his assistant coaches are also from Maryland ... **Jared Ambrose** (Middletown, Md.), **John Donatelli** (Baltimore, Md.), **Brian Fleury** (Frederick, Md.), **Derrick Johnson** (Upper Marlboro, Md.), **John Kaleo** (Annapolis, Md.), **Konstantinos Kosmakos** (Phoenix, Md.) and **James Vollono** (Kensington, Md.) are Maryland natives who played high school football in the state.

Even **Matt Hachmann** and **Guilian Gary** have ties to the state of Maryland ... Hachmann, a native of Queens, N.Y., was the Director of Operations for the University of Maryland's football program in 1999 ... Coach Gary is a 2002 graduate of Maryland who finished his career as one of the top receivers in the history of Terrapin football ... He caught 113 passes for 1,552 yards and 13 touchdowns at Maryland.

CHRONIGER BROTHERS: Sophomore **Tommy Chroniger** and "red shirt" freshman **Ben Chroniger** are the tenth set of brothers who are teammates on the Towson roster ... Tommy is a versatile athlete who has played a number of positions while Ben is a defensive end.

When junior linebacker **Danny Collins** was a freshman, his older brother, **Ryan Collins**, was a senior tight end ... The other brothers who have been teammates at Towson include: **Jeff** and **Kurt Beathard** (1984-85), **Randy** and **Rick Bielski** (1976-78), **Greg** and **Jeff Boller** (1979-81), **Alfred** and **Michael Cicere** (1971), **Chris** and **John Gunnels** (1989), **Mike** and **Pat Mangum** (1977), **Gabe** and **Jim Moro** (1977), and **Bob** and **Stu Remeto** (1971).

In the Tigers' 47-45 five-overtime win over Coastal Carolina, he made a huge defensive play when he broke up a pass on a two-point conversion try by Chanticleer quarterback **Zach MacDowall** ...

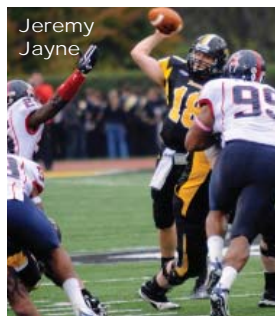

the Tigers with 588 yards rushing, averaging 3.3 yards per carry ... He caught 19 passes for 105 yards ... He posted the first 100-yard game of his career with 126 yards on 28 carries at Morgan ... Dameron led the Tigers to a 36-28 win at Rhode Island with three touchdowns.



Last week, he led the Tigers to a 47-45 win over Coastal Carolina in five overtimes ... He had the second 100-yard game of his career as he ran for 107 yards on 29 carries ... He also scored two touchdowns, both in overtime.

Unlike last year, the Tigers have depth at running back ... Sophomore **Dominique Booker**, the team's second-leading rusher with 218 yards, averaged 4.0 yards per carry ... A pair of "red shirt" freshmen, **Nygee Carmichael** and **B.J. Greening**, have also seen action.

INJURIES HINDERED TIGER OFFENSE: The Tigers experienced an incredible number of injuries during the 2009 season ... Almost all of the injuries occurred on the offensive side of the ball ... On the offensive line, the Tigers had 11 different players start games ... After quarterback **Pete Athens** was hurt, the Tigers used four quarterbacks in the last five games ... During the first five games, the Tigers averaged 17.4 points and 277.6 total yards per game ... During the last six games, those marks fell to 10.2 points and 229.0 yards per game.

TIGERS' NEW LOOK: In 2009, the Tigers unveiled new uniforms with black helmets ... The helmets have the Tiger head logo on each side with gold and white stripes down the middle ... Towson wore white helmets from 1969 to 2003 and gold helmets from 2004 to 2008 ... The uniforms were designed by **Under Armour**, a Baltimore-based company.

IMPROVED KICKING GAME: With the addition of three kickers, the Tigers' kicking game should be vastly improved this year ... Senior **Nick Wallace** transferred from Maryland and was impressive in the pre-season ... The 2006 Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Rookie of the Year while kicking for Indiana of Pa., Wallace made 11 of 13 field goal tries and 30 of 33 conversions ... A native of Frederickburg, Va., he set a school record, kicking four field goals in one game.

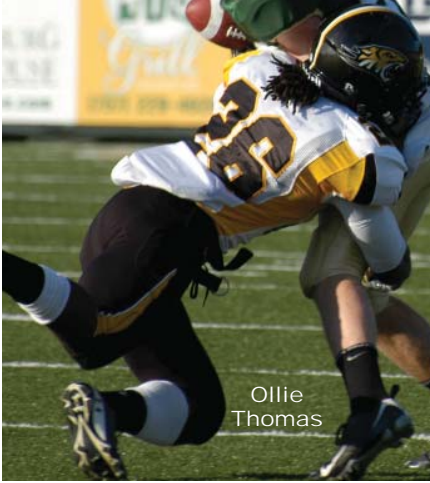

He was also named to the District 2 Academic All-America® University Division Football team, selected by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA) ... In 35 career games, Ibia has made 106 tackles, including

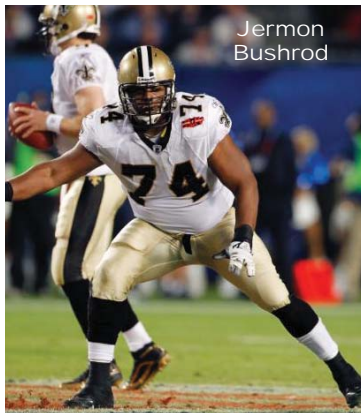
17 for lost yardage.

Moore is a two-year starter at wide receiver who has accumulated more than 1,000 all-purpose yards the last two years ... He was also part of an offense which led the NFL by averaging 31.9 points per game ... With the help of Bushrod, the Saints allowed only 20 sacks in 16 regular season games ... In the Super Bowl, he was matched up

against the Colts' All-Pro **Dwight Freeney** ... A four-year starter at Towson, Bushrod (2003-06) was an all-conference lineman who was drafted by the Saints in the fourth round of the NFL draft.

Former Tiger linebacker **Joe Vitt** (1974-77) has been the Saints' Assistant Head Coach since 2006 ... Vitt has also coached with the Rams, the Packers, the Seahawks and the Colts in his 30-year NFL coaching career ... Coach Vitt has an annual Crab Feast in Ocean City, Md. in June to raise money for the Tiger football program.

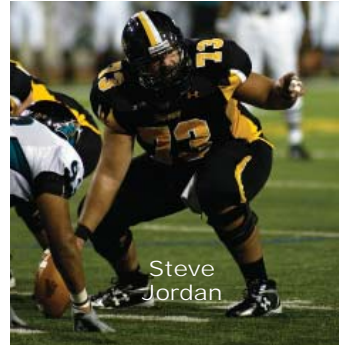

When the Tigers visit Villanova, Offensive Line Coach **John Donatelli** will have the unique opportunity to start the same five guys on the offensive line in three straight games.

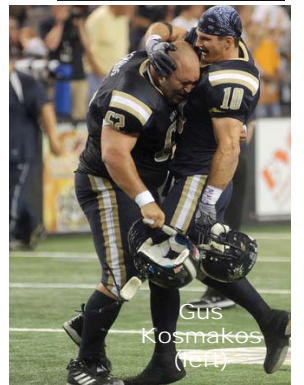

2010 Towson University Football Game Notes

Sept. 2 - Indiana 51, Tigers 17

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. – For the second year in a row, the Tigers opened their season with a monumental challenge, facing a Big Ten Conference team on the road. In the opener, the Tigers faced Indiana University before a crowd of 35,242 in Memorial Stadium.

Although they didn't pull off the upset, they did throw a mild scare into the Hoosiers.

After spotting them a 17-0 first quarter lead, the Tigers came to life offensively in the second quarter before dropping a 51-17 decision.

Comparing this year's opener to last season's 47-14 loss at Northwestern, Coach **Rob Ambrose** admitted, "I feel much better than last year. At one point in the second quarter, we were down by ten points and we had all the momentum.

"For us to win a game like this, we have to catch some breaks and we can't turn the ball over," he added. "We didn't get any breaks. We forced two fumbles and didn't recover either one. We turned the ball over three times and they scored 21 points."

The Hoosiers were able to prevail in spite of an electrifying performance by Tiger quarterback **Chris Hart**. A transfer from Georgia Military College, Hart

sparked the Tiger offense by running for 123 yards on 16 carries while passing for 165 yards and two touchdowns.

With 123 rushing yards, he became the first Tiger quarterback ever to run for more than 100 yards in a game.

Senior quarterback **Ben Chappell** led the Hoosiers to a 17-0 first quarter advantage. He threw a 12-yard touchdown pass to **Ted Bolser** before **Darius Willis** raced 49 yards for another TD. A 24-yard field goal gave by **Nick Freeland** gave Indiana a 17-0 lead.

A 33-yard kickoff return by senior **Hakeem Moore** gave the Tiger offense its best field position of the game. After moving into Indiana territory for the first time, the Tigers elected to try for a first down when they were faced with a fourth-and-two at the Hoosiers' 45-yard line.

On fourth down, Hart kept the ball and ran to his left. Then, he cut across the field and sprinted towards the goal line. He was knocked out of bounds at the three-yard line. On second down, Hart threw a five-yard touchdown pass to sophomore **Tom Ryan**, giving the Tigers their first TD of the season. When senior **Nick Wallace** converted, the Tigers trailed by 17-7 with 12:21 left in the first half.

Hoping to seize the momentum, Coach Ambrose had Wallace try an on-sides kick. But, the Hoosiers weren't fooled and **Griffen Dahlstrom** fell on the ball at the Towson 46-yard line.

"In a game like this, we have to try to surprise them," said Ambrose. "I thought it had worked but they (the officials) gave them the ball."

Two plays later, Chappell threw a 41-yard touchdown pass to **Demarlo Belcher**, giving the Hoosiers a 24-7 lead.

The Tigers responded immediately. On third-and-four at their 36-yard line, Hart connected with Moore on a crossing pattern. He caught the ball at the Indiana 40-yard line and outraced three defenders to the end zone for a 64-yard TD. Wallace's kick cut the deficit to 24-14.

After forcing a Hoosier punt, Hart led the Tigers on another long drive. He ran for 32 yards during the march. When the offense stalled at the 23-yard line, Wallace came in to try a 40-yard field goal. He missed and the lead remained at 24-14.

With 1:45 left in the half, senior **Trea Burgess** capped off a 77-yard drive with a 12-yard TD run to give the Hoosiers a 31-14 edge.

The Hoosiers got another opportunity when the Tigers made a huge special teams error. Freshman punter **D.J. Soven** had the center snap go over his head. He retreated and picked the ball up and tried to punt. When he tried to punt, **Kevin Bush** blocked it, giving the Hoosiers a first down at the Towson 21-yard line.

After Chappell completed a 19-yard pass to Belcher, Willis scored on a two-yard run with 26 seconds left in the half, giving Indiana a 38-14 lead at the half. By scoring twice in the final 1:45 of the first half, Indiana grabbed a 24-point lead at intermission.

"Those two touchdowns before halftime really hurt us," said Ambrose.



"Indiana has a good offense and we can't help them like that."

On the first drive of the second half, the Tigers tried to convert a fourth down at their 39-yard line. When Hart was thrown for a loss, the Hoosiers took over. Moments later, Freeland's 41-yard field goal extended Indiana's lead to 41-14.

With 8:37 left in the third quarter, cornerback **Matt Ernst** intercepted a pass and returned it 53 yards for a TD and a 48-14 Hoosier lead.

Early in the fourth quarter, the Tigers put together their best drive of the game. They marched 72 yards in 13 plays before Wallace kicked a 29-yard field goal to cut the deficit to 48-17.

The Hoosiers completed the scoring when **Mitch Ewald** kicked a 32-yard field goal with 8:23 remaining in the game.

"One of the most encouraging things about this game was the fact that we didn't play scared," Ambrose added. "It is obvious that this is a much different team. Just looking at the faces of our players after the game, I can tell they were disappointed we didn't win."

The Tigers, who had 392 yards of offense, accumulated more yardage at Indiana than they did in any game last year. Towson outgained Indiana by 32 yards and ran 21 more offensive plays.

While Hart led Towson with 288 yards of total offense, Chappell completed 16 of 23 passes for 182 yards and two touchdowns. Willis ran for 102 yards and scored two TD's for the Hoosiers.

Ryan led the Tigers with 5 catches for 41 yards and a TD. Moore accumulated 221 all-purpose yards and caught 2 passes for 63 yards and a touchdown. He also returned 6 kickoffs for 158 yards.

Defensive back **Jordan Dangerfield** led the Tiger defense with 10 tackles. Senior cornerback **Ollie Thomas** added 8 tackles while junior linebacker **Chris Patterson** made 6 tackles.

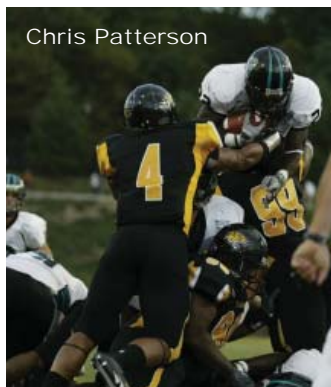

2010 Towson University Football Game Notes

Sept. 11 - Tigers 47, Coastal Carolina 45 (5 OT)

TOWSON, Md. – Overcoming a 14-point deficit in the final 9:40 of regulation, the Tigers (1-1) stunned Coastal Carolina (0-2), 47-45, in an epic five-overtime battle before a crowd of 8,990 at Minnegan Field at Johnny Unitas® Stadium.

With the teams tied at 39-39 after four overtimes, quarterback **Chris Hart** threw a 25-yard touchdown pass to senior **Hakeem Moore** on the

first play of the fifth overtime, giving the Tigers a 45-39 lead. Moments later, on the two-point conversion, Hart ran to his left, dropped the ball, picked it up on the bounce and ran into the end zone, giving the Tigers a 47-39 advantage.

But, the Tiger defense had to hold Coastal Carolina to pull out the win. Quarterback **Zach MacDowall** completed a five-yard touchdown pass to **Eric O'Neal**, pulling Coastal to within 47-45. Trying to tie the game for the seventh time, MacDowall's two-point conversion pass to **Jamie Childers** was broken up by safety

Jordan Dangerfield, securing a win for the Tigers in the longest game in school history.

The teams were just one overtime period away from tying the NCAA FCS record with a six-overtime contest.

"Anybody who was here sure got their money's worth," said Towson Coach **Rob Ambrose**. "I am really proud of our guys. We were not going to quit no matter how long this game went. They kept saying that wanted to keep playing. I love the way our guys play. We beat a very good football team tonight."

When Coastal took a 21-7 lead with 12:36 left on a 10-yard TD run by fullback **Racheed Gause**, no one was thinking overtime.

But, Hart's 57-yard pass to Moore set up a two-yard touchdown pass to tight end **James Oboh**, cutting the deficit to 21-14.

After forcing a punt, the Tigers took over at their own 30-yard line with 3:54 remaining. On fourth-and-four at the Coastal 39-yard line, Hart completed a pass to **Alex Blake** at the 32-yard line. Hart scrambled 12 yards to the Chanticleers' 20-yard line. Moments later, he ran to the two-yard line on an 18-yard scamper.

With 29 seconds left, Hart lofted a pass into the corner of the end zone where sophomore **Tom Ryan** leaped and grabbed it for a touchdown. When **Nick Wallace** converted, the game was tied at 21-21.

Tied at 21-21, the Tigers were playing in an overtime game for the first time since 2002 – a streak of 86 games.

During the course of the five overtimes, there were three or four times when it looked like the game was over.

"There were so many ebbs and flows in the overtime," said Coastal Carolina Coach **David Bennett**. "Playing a five-overtime game was uncharted territory for us. The unfortunate thing is somebody is going to win and somebody is going to lose."

On the Tigers' first overtime possession, Wallace kicked a 34-yard field goal to give them a 24-21 lead. On Coastal's drive, **Justin Durham** matched Wallace with a 42-yard field goal, tying the game at 24-24.

In the second overtime, MacDowall's one-yard run gave Coastal a 30-24 edge. But, the Tigers got a huge break when Durham missed the conversion kick.

On the Tigers' possession, **Tremayne Dameron** carried the load. Dameron, who ran for 107 yards on 29 rushes, ran the ball on five straight plays, scoring the game-tying TD on a two-yard run. All the Tigers needed was a conversion kick by Wallace to win the game. But, his kick hit the left upright and the game headed for a third overtime.

"When Justin missed his kick, I was afraid that would cost us the game," said Bennett. "Then, when their kicker hit the upright, I said to myself 'this is crazy.' Both guys had been making kicks and they missed at the same time. It shows you what a strange game this was."

With the score tied at 30-30, the Tigers went first in the third overtime. For the second straight drive, the Tigers kept the ball on the ground. On third-and-one at the 4-yard line, Dameron powered off left tackle for his second TD of overtime, giving the Tigers a 36-30 lead.

The rules stipulate that both teams must try for two-point conversions after the second overtime. Trying for two points, Hart threw to Moore. But, safety **Dominique Davenport** knocked the pass away, keeping the deficit at 36-30.

In the third overtime, Coastal scored on a 7-yard TD run by O'Neal. On the two-point conversion, MacDowall's pass to Childers was broken up by **Jeremy Gardner**, sending the game to a fourth extra period.

Neither offense generated a TD in the fourth overtime. Durham's 43-yard field goal gave Coastal a 39-36 lead before Wallace booted a 27-yarder, setting the stage for the Tigers' win in the fifth overtime.

Trailing by 7-0 at halftime, the Tigers scored a touchdown in the third quarter. Hart threw a 24-yard TD pass to Moore and the conversion kick tied the game at 7-7.

The Chanticleers responded with a 65-yard, 10-play drive to re-take the lead on a one-yard run by MacDowall. Early in the fourth quarter, Coastal marched 57 yards in ten plays to grab a 21-7 lead.

MacDowall completed 19 of 33 passes for 185 yards and one TD for Coastal. He also ran for 57 yards on 18 carries with two TD's. O'Neal led the running game with 69 yards on 19 carries with a pair of touchdowns. O'Neal also had six receptions for 38 yards and one TD.

In leading the Tigers to the win, Hart accounted for 234 yards of total offense. He completed 13 of 21 passes for 155 yards and four TD's. Hart also ran for 79 yards on 22 carries.

Linebacker **Chris Patterson** led the Tiger defense with a career high 12 tackles while defensive tackle **Yaky Ibia** had ten tackles, including one for lost yardage.

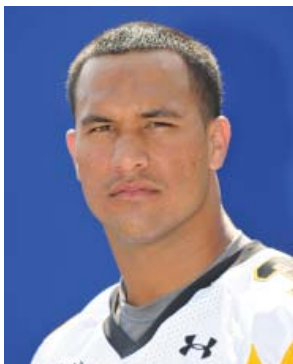
