



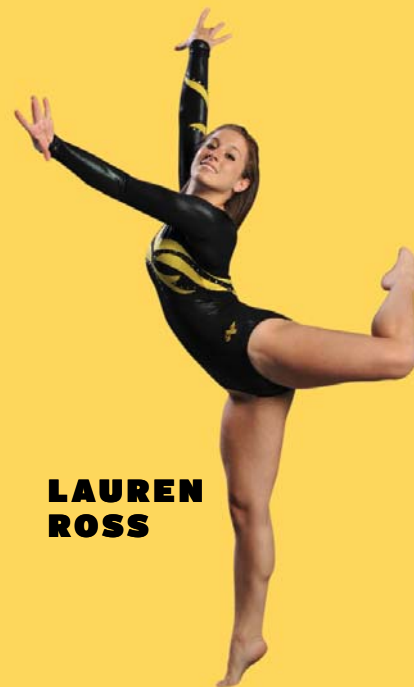

## Vicki Chlisczyk

Head Coach  
York University, '98  
3rd Season (38-6)  
2011-2012 ECAC Coach of the Year

In her first two seasons as the Tigers' head coach, Vicki Chlisczyk was named as the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) Coach of the Year twice. She led the Tigers to

a combined 38-6 record.

Last season, the Tigers finished as ECAC runners-up to Pennsylvania by the narrowest of margins as Penn came from behind to win the title by 0.025 points.

With Towson re-joining the East Atlantic Gymnastics League (EAGL) this season, Coach Chlisczyk is focused on returning the Tigers' program to NCAA regional competition.

The Tigers, who have qualified for NCAA regionals 14 times since 1987, have not competed as a team at an NCAA regional meet since the 2000 season.

With that goal in mind, the former University of Maryland assistant coach has upgraded the Tigers' schedule significantly again this season.

Towson is joining George Washington, Maryland, New Hampshire, North Carolina, NC State, Pittsburgh and Rutgers in the EAGL. A charter member of the EAGL, the Tigers competed in the EAGL from 1996 to 2004.

"This is a very positive move for our program," says Chlisczyk. "It will enable us to compete against very strong competition.

"Our goal is to qualify for NCAA regionals," she says. "Most of the EAGL schools go to regionals. If we want to improve our results, we need to compete against stronger teams."

Although it will be a challenge, Coach Chlisczyk (pronounced Cull - liss - chick) has already proven that she isn't someone who is afraid of a challenge.

When she was named as the Tigers' head gymnastics coach in June of 2010, she became the successor to Dick Filbert, the Tigers' highly-successful coach for 28 years and the 1990 National Coach of the Year. The winningest coach in school history, Filbert retired after the 2010 season. During his tenure, he led the Tigers to 491 victories and 14 conference titles.

A native of Milton, Ontario, Canada, Chlisczyk was named as only the fourth head coach in the 43-year history of the program.

In her first season as the Tigers' coach, she led the team to an eye-opening 18-1 record. She also guided the Tigers to championships at the Temple University Invitational and the Cornell Big Red Invitational as well as Towson's own Shelli Calloway Memorial Invitational.

Along the way, she also coached the Tigers to impressive wins over a pair of East Atlantic Gymnastics League (EAGL) opponents, George Washington and Rutgers.

Although the Tigers came up short in their quest to win a seventh straight Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC) championship, she was honored as the ECAC Coach of the Year.

Last season, the Tigers had a 20-5 record and earned their best Regional Qualifying Score (R.Q.S.) in six years. Their 194.130 R.Q.S. was only eight spots away from earning a berth in the NCAA regionals.

In addition, she coached Kacy Catanzaro, the NCAA Southeast Regional Gymnast of the Year and one of the top gymnasts in the history of the program.

She also worked with one of the best senior classes in school history, a class that also included Alyssa Dittman, Avis Hixon, Lindsay Poplaski and Kady Sullivan. Four of the Tigers' five graduating seniors finished their careers with more than 1,000 points.

During her five seasons as an assistant coach at Maryland, she was the Terrapins' balance beam coach and also assisted in all aspects of the program. For the first four years, she served as an assistant coach to Bob Nelligan, who guided the Terps'

program for 31 seasons.

In her final season at Maryland, she was an assistant coach for Brett Nelligan, who succeeded his father as the Terrapins' head coach.

"Vicki was a tremendous asset to our team in many ways, but especially her contributions to our balance beam team," said Bob Nelligan, who hired Coach Chlisczyk in 2005. "Our work on the beam came a long way in large part to her efforts.

"When she first arrived at Maryland, I was impressed," he added. "She quickly gained the team's respect because of her dedication, fairness and support."

A 20-year member of the Milton Springers Gymnastics Club in Milton, Ontario, Canada, Chlisczyk was a competitive gymnast for 12 years. She competed in the Provincial Championships for ten consecutive years and she made such an impact on her club team that the Milton Springers Gymnastics Club established an award in her name.

The "Vicki Chlisczyk Award for Dedication" is presented at the end of each season to the club's most dedicated athlete.

Chlisczyk graduated from York University in North York, Ontario, Canada with a B.A. degree in Philosophy.

After graduation, she moved to the United States to begin her gymnastics coaching career.

In 2001, she joined the staff at the renowned Woodward Gymnastics Camp, a summer gymnastics camp in Woodward, Pa. During her nine years of coaching at Woodward, she served as a Program Director and a member of the Master Staff. In her role at Woodward, she managed a staff of 30 coaches that trained 200-300 gymnasts each week.

At Woodward, she worked with gymnasts from virtually every level while scheduling and organizing all class and clinic activities. She also hired, trained and evaluated staff members while developing and presenting instructional clinics to the staff and visiting coaches. In addition, she presented and attended numerous coaching and spotting clinics and seminars.

Coach Chlisczyk began her collegiate coaching career in 2002-03 when she served as a volunteer assistant coach at Western Michigan University. She assisted in train-





ing in all four events and worked with all aspects of the Broncos' program.

While she was serving as a volunteer assistant at Western Michigan, she also worked as a team coach at Branch Gymnastics Club in Battle Creek, Michigan. In two years at Branch Gymnastics Club, she worked with gymnasts from Level 4 through 10. In addition to performing spotting duties on all four events, she developed, organized and implemented daily workouts on all four events. She also developed and managed strength and condition-

Assistant Coach

3rd Season

A native of Forest Hill, Md. who coached at Harford Gymnastics Club for 12 years, Becky Schaller is starting her third season as a member of the Tigers' coaching staff.

In 2010, she was a part-time assistant coach for the Tigers. Prior to last season, she

joined the program on a full-time basis.

"Becky is a very knowledgeable coach who did a tremendous job at Harford Gymnastics Club," said Coach Vicki Chlisczyk. "She is well-respected in the gymnastics community. Having Becky on our staff has been an asset to the program."

The former Becky Robinson, she was one of the top scholastic gymnasts in the state of Maryland while competing for Harford Gymnastics Club. A competitor at Harford from 1985 to 1995, she was the United States Association of Independent Gymnastics Clubs (USAIGC) national all-around champion in 1992.

A two-time USA Gymnastics Level 10 national qualifier, she was the national champion on floor exercise in 1992. An Elite National Qualifier who won national championships on bars (1991) and beam (1993), she graduated from Fallston High School in 1995.

She attended Michigan State University on a full scholarship. A four-year standout for Coach Kathie Klages, she was an all-arounder who helped the Spartans post a 27-3 record and finish second in the Big Ten Conference as a freshman.

As a sophomore, she was a member of a team that posted an 18-13 record and won the USA Gymnastics NIT championship. In her junior season, she helped the Spartans post a 23-6 record.

During her career, she was one of the Spartans' top vaulters and bar workers. She had a career high 9.90 on vault and a 9.85 on bars. She also had a career best 9.90 on beam and her career high all-around score was 38.675.

She graduated from Michigan State in 1999, earning her Bachelor of Science degree in Kinesiology. As a senior, she was a medical intern with USA Gymnastics Team Physician Dr. Larry Nassar.

She also served as a counselor at the Michigan State Gymnastics Camp. She was also the optional coach at the Great Lakes Gymnastics Camp for a year.

After graduating from Michigan State, she returned to Maryland and joined the staff at Harford Gymnastics Club. From 1999 to 2003, she was Assistant Optional Coach and Compulsory Coach.

In 2003, she was promoted to Head Optional Coach where she coached for Teresa (Arnold) DiMauro, a former Tiger gymnast and a member of the Towson University Athletics Hall of Fame.

As the Tigers' assistant coach, she has aided the staff in skill development and routine construction as well as the creation of practice plans. She also helped the team by analyzing videos of prospective student-athletes.

Coach Schaller resides in Forest Hill with her husband, Chris, a former lacrosse player at Michigan State and Penn State. He earned a degree in Engineering from Penn State. They are the parents of two sons.



ing activities for Levels 9 and 10 gymnasts.

In 2005, she joined the staff at Maryland and made an immediate impact on the program. In her first year with the Terrapins, they posted a 16-12 record and finished fifth in the East Atlantic Gymnastics League.

In 2009, the Terps earned a berth in the NCAA Southeast Regionals where they finished sixth. In Bob Nelligan's final season as head coach, Maryland was ranked in the top 25 for most of the year.

In 2010, Coach Chlisczyk was named as the EAGL Assistant Coach of the Year as she helped Maryland earn a second straight NCAA Southeast regional appearance.

During her tenure at Maryland, she coached an impressive group of beam workers, including Abigail Adams, '11 who was the 2009 EAGL co-champion on balance beam.

In addition to her experience working the summer camp at Woodward's, Coach Chlisczyk has also coached at several other collegiate gymnastics summer camps.

For three years, she worked for Coach Gail Goodspeed at the University of New Hampshire's Gymnastics Camp. She was also part of Coach Mark Stevenson's staff at North Carolina State University's Gymnastics Camp for two years.

Coach Chlisczyk, whose parents and brother still reside in Ontario, has conducted her own gymnastics camps at Towson the last three summers.

# BACK TO THE EAGL

Even though **Vicki Chlisczyk** is starting her third season as the head coach of the Tigers' gymnastics program, it may feel like this is her first year.

The Tigers have a team where half the gymnasts are newcomers and they have a new conference affiliation.

Graduation cost the Tigers five outstanding gymnasts, including **Kacy Catanzaro**, the NCAA Regional Gymnast of the Year.

As a result, Chlisczyk has a roster which includes one senior, two juniors, four sophomore and seven freshmen.

In addition, two of the Tigers' most experienced gymnasts, senior **Britney Russell** and junior **Alexa Davis**, are recovering from injuries.

In an obvious understatement, Chlisczyk says "We are going to be very, very young. I could envision our team using freshmen in 21 of our 24 routines. We do have a very good group of freshmen. All they need is experience.

"Most of the freshmen have looked strong in the pre-season," she adds. "I know that we have a lot more depth in every event."

Towson's new conference affiliation is actually an old one. The Tigers, who competed in the ECAC for the last eight seasons, are returning to the East Atlantic Gymnastics (EAGL). Towson was a charter member of the EAGL and will join George Washington, Maryland, New Hampshire, North Carolina, North Carolina State, Pittsburgh and Rutgers in the EAGL lineup.

Towson is replacing West Virginia in the EAGL after WVU joined the Big 12 Conference.

"This is a very positive move for our program," says Chlisczyk, who was the ECAC Coach of the Year in her first two seasons as the Tigers' coach. "It will enable us to compete against very strong competition.

"Our goal is to qualify for NCAA regionals," she says. "Most of the EAGL schools go to regionals. If we want to improve our results, we need to compete against stronger teams."

The Tigers' lone senior, Russell is a question mark due to off-season foot surgery. In her career, she has been a solid three-event performer, competing on vault, beam and floor.

She earned first team All-ECAC honors on floor exercise as she finished third on floor at the ECAC Championship Meet with a 9.85 score. Last season, she averaged 9.72 on vault and 9.83 on floor exercise.

"Britney could be very important to our team this season," says Chlisczyk. "When she is healthy, she can help us in two events. We are hoping she can return to full strength after her foot injury.

"She is our most experienced gymnast and our only senior," adds the coach. "We are looking for positive leadership from Britney."

The ECAC Rookie of the Year in 2011, Davis missed almost all of the 2012 season due to elbow surgery. An outstanding performer in the all-around two years ago, she was limited to competing on beam in the final three meets of last season.

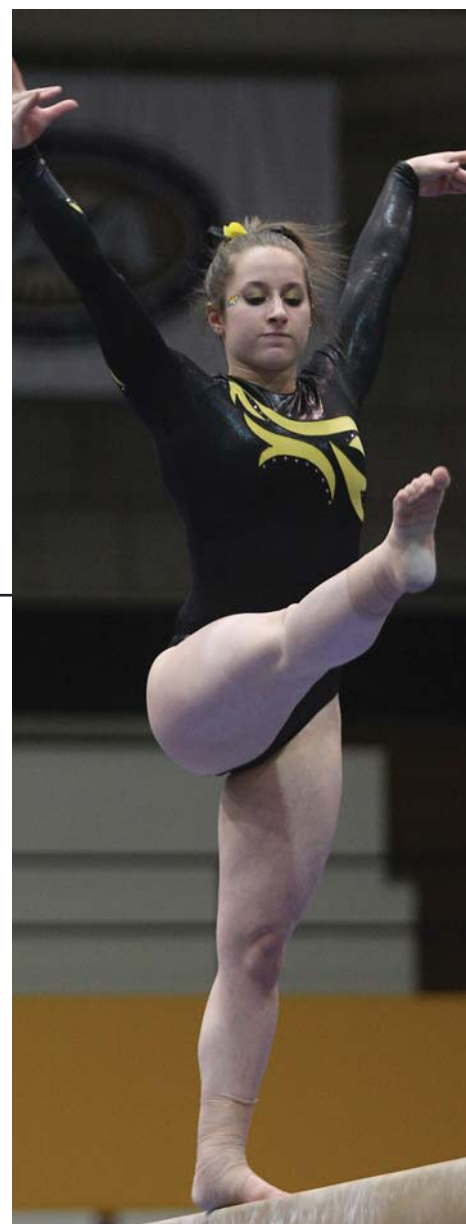
As a freshman, she was a first team All-ECAC selection on floor exercise. One of the Tigers' top all-around performers, she was named as the ECAC Rookie of the Week.

"Alexa came back in phenomenal shape," says Chlisczyk. "She has had a long road back from her elbow surgery and she has worked very hard. If she is healthy, it would be quite a boost for our team because she would be one of our best all-around performers. We're going to have to wait and see how much Alexa can help us."

Junior **Macalla Curtis** returns as the Tigers' only other upperclassman. For the past two seasons, she has been one of the team's most reliable performers on the uneven bars. However, she may play a larger role this season.

"Macalla has worked very hard," says Chlisczyk. "She has made a lot of progress and could work her way into our beam lineup and our floor lineup."

Sophomore **Samantha Lutz** is coming off an impressive freshman season in which she was named as

ECAC Rookie of the Week.

Last season, Lutz was part of bars lineup in every meet. She also competed on floor in six meets. She averaged 9.67 on bars and had a seasonal high score of 9.80.

"Sammy should help us in several events," says Chlisczyk. "She could anchor our bar lineup. She could also be part of our beam lineup and contribute on floor. She has added a new tumbling pass on her floor routine and that will help improve her scores."

Another sophomore, **Janis Konkle**, also returns. Last season, she competed on vault, beam and floor for the Tigers. She was one of the Tigers' most consistent performers on beam and earned second team All-ECAC honors. She competed on beam in every meet and vaulted seven times. She also competed on floor in six meets.

"Janis has learned a new vault and we are hoping she can give some help there," says the Tiger coach. "She is such a solid beam worker and her consistency has helped us. She has a new floor routine and we're anxious to see how she performs."

Sophomores **Lauren Ross** and **Nicolette Vignola** also return to the Tigers for their second college seasons. Ross and Vignola are coming off promising freshman seasons.

Ross competed on vault and beam as a freshman.

She was part of the vault team in five meets and was very consistent. She had a 9.62 average and her seasonal high was a 9.65 score. She competed on beam in every meet and averaged a 9.53 on the season, third on the team. She had a seasonal high 9.75 score.

"Lauren made tremendous strides over the summer and she came back in excellent shape," says Chlisczyk. "She has performed well in all four events. We're counting on her to be part of our lineup on vault, beam and floor. She could also help out on bars."

Vignola, who made the team as a walk-on last year, was a big surprise for the Tigers last season. She competed on floor in two meets and averaged 9.60. She could also have a bigger role this season.

"Nicolette is a very hard worker," says the Tiger coach. "She has done very well in the pre-season and she could contribute on vault, beam and floor. Her

floor routine should be even better this year because she has added some difficulty to her routine."

While the Tigers have seven veterans returning, the balance of the roster is comprised of seven freshmen, a group that excites Chlisczyk.

"This is a very talented group that will lead us into the EAGL," says Chlisczyk. "They have the talent to lead our program. All they need is the experience. They are all going to get a chance this season."

It is possible that the Tigers will use three of their newcomers as all-arounders, **Abby Griswold**, **Katie Sassa** and **Lydia Thompson**.

A native of Monson, Mass., Griswold was a Level 10 gymnast who competed for Daggett's Gymnastics Club. A three-time national qualifier, she finished third in the state in the all-around last year.

"Abby should make an immediate impact as an all-



around performer," says Chlisczyk. "She is very consistent and does a very clean bar routine. She is also solid on beam and she is a strong tumbler on floor exercise."

A native of Havre de Grace, Md., Sassa is also a four-year Level 10 gymnast who competed for Silvia's Gymnastics Club in Pennsylvania. Last year, she qualified for nationals and won the Pennsylvania state championships on vault, beam and floor. She also won the regional title on vault and was fifth in the all-around.

"Katie is a super tumbler," says the Tiger coach. "Her vault will be one of the best in the EAGL. She is also very consistent on bars and beam. We're expecting her to make an immediate impact and contribute as an all-around."

A product of Harford Gymnastics Club in Bel Air, Md., Thompson was the Level 10 state champion on floor and in the all-around. A four-time Level 10 regional qualifier, she had a career best 9.50 score on floor exercise.

"Lydia is another freshman who will make an impact in the all-around," adds Chlisczyk. "She has a new vault that rocks and she has a very clean bar routine. Her consistency on beam is tremendous."

The Tigers will also be counting on four other newcomers, including **Erin Odom**, **Rebecca Osmer**, **Vicki Vesecky** and **Samantha Ward**.

A native of Whitehouse, Texas, Odom was a three-year Level 10 gymnast at Texas East Gymnastics Club. The state champion vaulter in 2009, she helped her club team finish as national runners-up in 2011. She qualified for Junior Olympics twice.

"Erin is a powerful vaulter and she could contribute on vault, beam and floor," says Coach Chlisczyk. "She is a very good dancer and her tumbling skills are nice and clean. She has been hindered by injuries but we feel she will help us this season."

Osmer gives the Tigers an experienced performer on bars. A product of Atwater, Cal., she is returning to competitive gymnastics for the first time in four years.

A Maryland resident for the last two years, she trained at Docksidiers Gymnastics Club.

"Rebecca could really give us a lift on bars," says Chlisczyk. "She is very solid and she has a huge Tkatchev release. She should be part of our lineup on bars."

A product of Apex Gymnastics Club in Virginia, Vesecky was the Level 9 state champion in the all-around and she also won the regional championship on bars. As a senior at Loudoun County High School, she led the Raiders to their first state championship and finished first in the district in the all-around.

"We are looking for Vicki to help us out on bars and beam," says Chlisczyk. "She is very clean on bars and her consistency on beam will help."

A native of Clinton, Md., Ward joins the Tigers' program after competing as a Level 10 gymnast at Unique Sports Academy for the last four years. Last year, she was Maryland State Level 10 champion on the balance beam.

"Sam gives us quality depth," says the Tigers' coach. "She could compete as an all-around or she might just help out on vault and beam. Sam has been very impressive in the pre-season."

Chlisczyk adds, "Even though we are going to be very young, our depth will be much better than the recent past. Our vault lineup should be strong and our bars team will be better. On beam, I feel that we can go 10-deep. Floor could be a question mark. We lost five of our six best floor routines from last year."

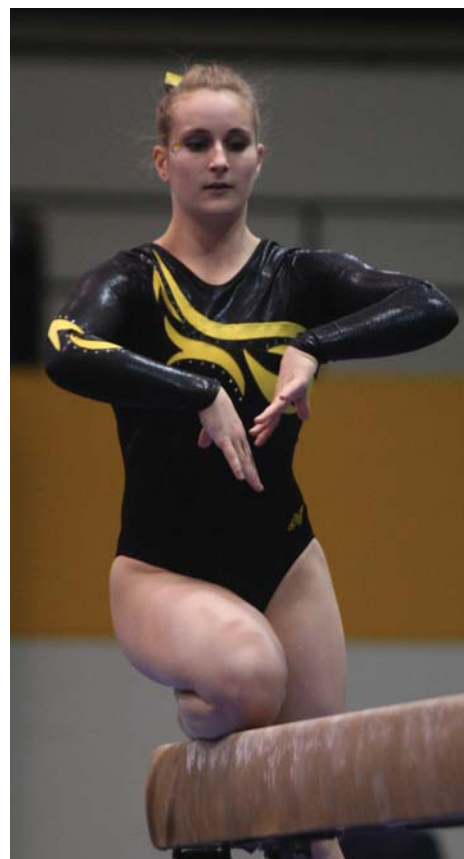
In their first season as members of the EAGL, the Tigers will be competing against a much tougher schedule than they have in recent years.

Towson's schedule includes five teams that are ranked in the pre-season Top 25, including No. 10 Michigan, No. 16 Penn State, No. 22 North Carolina State, No. 23 Minnesota and No. 24 West Virginia.

"We won't have a 20-5 record like we did last year," predicts Chlisczyk. "I am pretty sure of that. But, we will be better because of the competition we are facing."

"This is all about our Regional Qualifying Score (R.Q.S.)," she adds. "Last year, we finished the season only eight spots away from earning a regional bid."

The Tigers' schedule includes four home meets before Towson closes out its first EAGL season at the EAGL Championship Meet at North Carolina on March 23.

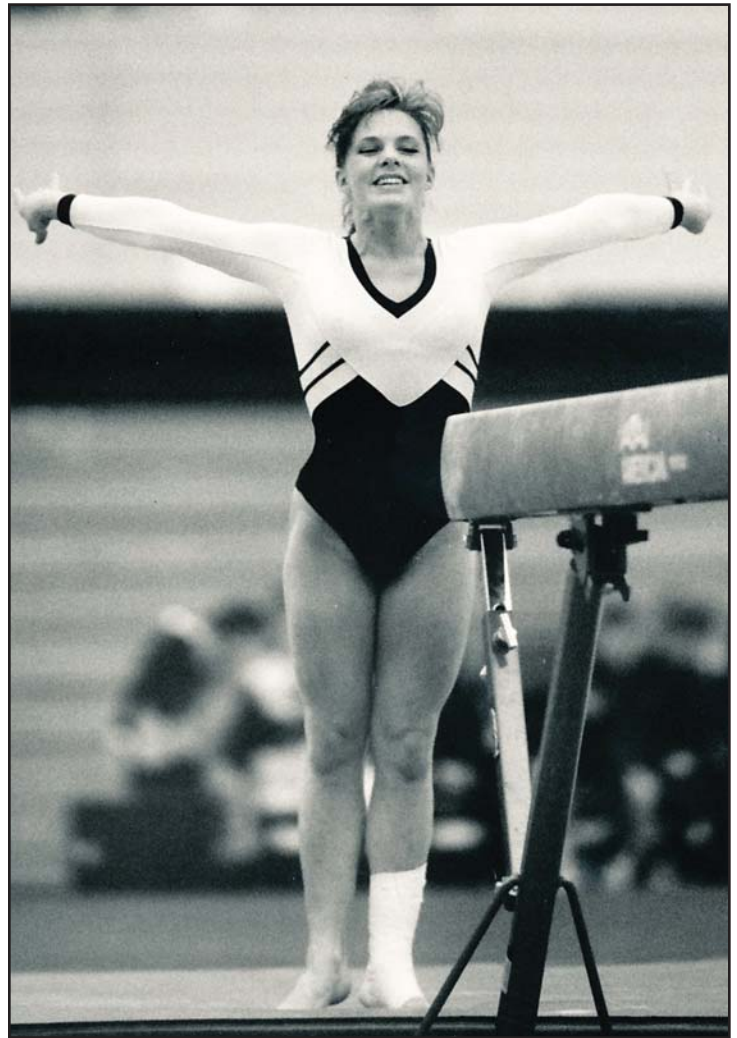

# EAST ATLANTIC GYMNASTICS LEAGUE

The East Atlantic Gymnastics League (EAGL) became a reality on July 31, 1995, when eight universities banded together to form a union solely for the purpose of showcasing women's gymnastics on the East Coast.

The league presently consists of the University of Maryland, University of North Carolina, and North Carolina State University of the Atlantic Coast Conference; University of Pittsburgh and Rutgers University of the Big East Conference; George Washington University of the Atlantic 10 Conference; the University of New Hampshire of the America East Conference and Towson University of the Colonial Athletic Association.

Since the EAGL was founded, there has been very little fluxuation of conference membership.

The eight charter members remained unchanged from 1996 to 2004 when Towson left the EAGL to rejoin the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC). Towson was replaced by George Washington in the league's lineup.

The EAGL remained the same from 2005 to 2012 when West Virginia departed the EAGL due to WVU's new all-sports affiliation with the Big 12 Conference.

When WVU left the EAGL, Towson returned to the league that it left in 2005.

In August 1996, the NCAA Council accepted the EAGL as an official affiliated member of the NCAA.

In 1995, the Tigers won their seventh ECAC title in eight years by capturing the championship at Pittsburgh.

From 1987 to 2012, Towson University has been the dominant team in the Eastern College Athletic Conference (ECAC), winning 14 of a possible 17 championships.

The Tigers were members of the ECAC for two different stretches. From 1987 until 1995, the Tigers competed in the ECAC and won eight championships in nine years.

In 2010, the Tigers won their sixth consecutive ECAC title and they had to come from behind to pull out the win. Senior **Alise McDonald** led the Tigers by winning the all-around and the vault.

The 2010 ECAC title sent Coach **Dick Filbert** and Assistant Coach **Lynda Filbert** into retirement with another ECAC championship.

In their first nine years of ECAC domination, the

Tigers had 56 gymnasts earn All-ECAC notice. Eight gymnasts, including **Lori Salindong, '90, Stephanie St. Angelo, '90, Carri Scott, '91, Tandy Knight, '91, Anne Sugden, '91, Julie Heilman, '92, Wendy Weaver, '92, Gabby Linarducci, '93, and Janine Spezio, '93** were members of ECAC championship teams four years in a row.

From 1987 to 1995, Towson had 20 individual ECAC champions. Salindong (1988), Knight (1989) and Linarducci (1991) were ECAC all-around champions.

Linarducci, the 1993 ECAC Gymnast of the Year, won the all-around and bars title in 1991, the beam title in 1992 and the floor title as a senior. In her career, Sugden was the ECAC bars champion twice (1988 and 1989) while sharing the beam title in 1991.

Salindong, Sugden and Weaver share the rare distinction of earning All-ECAC honors four times. Linarducci, Spezio, St. Angelo, Knight, Scott, **Joy Rudy** and **Kim O'Keefe** were named All-ECAC three times.

The Tigers' streak ended in 1994 when New Hampshire edged the Tigers for the championship.

In 1995, the Tigers won the title they had lost in 1994. Towson set a school and meet record with a 194.075 score, beating defending champion New Hampshire by nearly three points.

In 2005, Towson University returned to the ECAC and celebrated its return by winning its ninth title. In a meet at James Madison University, the Tigers posted a 194.525 team score to edge Rhode Island for the title. **Christina Ghani** led the way by winning the all-around and finishing first on floor.

In 2006, the Tigers won their second title in a row by edging William & Mary for the championship. Led by Ghani and **Jess Hannah**, who were one-two in the all-around, the Tigers posted a 191.275 team score to nip the Tribe. Ghani also tied for first on vault.

In 2007, **Decelia Willacy** led Towson to a 193.650 team score by winning the all-around (38.85). Senior **Stacie Hogan** won the ECAC title on floor and Ghani took first place on vault.

With Ghani, the two-time ECAC Gymnast of the Year on the sidelines with an injury, the Tigers used a team

effort to win the 2008 title. Towson won the meet with a 193.950 score. **Annikka Almenoksa** led the Tigers to the title by winning the all-around (39.15). She also took first on beam (9.925), tying a school record. McDonald won the ECAC vault championship with a 9.85 score.

Honored as the ECAC Gymnast of the Year prior to the meet, Willacy was fourth on vault (9.775), second on beam (9.875) and third in the all-around (38.975). **Cristina Lindo** and Willacy were named as All-ECAC picks for the fourth straight year.

Since 1984, there have been 31 ECAC Championship Meets. Towson has won 14 titles while New Hampshire and William & Mary have won four each.

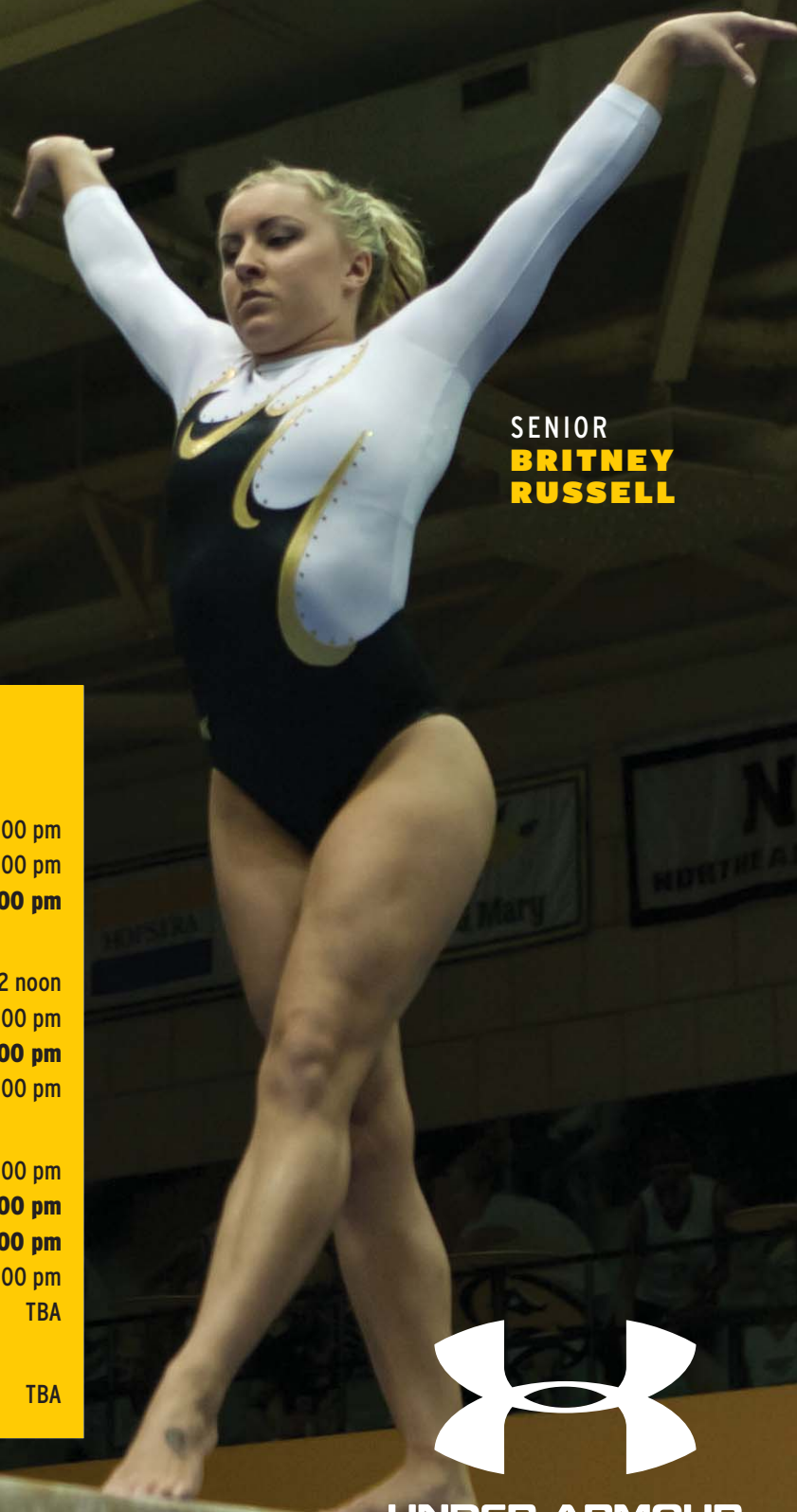
