INTERVIEWS: Media can contact the Office of Athletic Media Relations by calling 410-704-4972 at least one day in advance to avoid interfering with practice and classes.

CREDENTIALS: Requests for credentials should be made by calling 410-704-4972 at least 48 hours prior to the game. They may be picked up at will call on the day of the game, beginning one hour before tip-off. Photo credentials are only issued to accredited photographers on assignments (photographers are only permitted to shoot from the baselines).

PARKING: Requests for parking passes should be made at the same time as credential requests. If requests are not made, parking may not be guaranteed.

RADIO: Towson provides phone lines (POTS and ISDN) for radio broadcasts at a cost of \$75.00 per line or whatever the visiting station's institution charges.

POST-GAME INTERVIEWS: Following the game, post-game interviews will take place in media room of SECU Arena. Ideally, the visiting coach and players will attend first.

Reid Geckeler

Head Coach • Fourth Season
Georgetown, '93

A talented group of guards and more help and experience inside are what await head coach Niki Reid Geckeler as she enters her fourth season on the Tiger bench.

The 2015-16 season saw the Tigers continue to take steps forward under Reid Geckeler's watch. Junior guard Raven Bankston led the team and finished second in the CAA in scoring (15.5 ppg) en route to earning Third Team All-Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) honors. Freshman guard Sianni Martin got her Tiger career off to a flying start and was named the CAA Rookie of the Week three times. In addition senior guard Dominique Johnson scored the 1,000th point of her career and broke the school record for career and single-game three-pointers under Reid Geckeler's tutelage. However, the success did not just lie with the guards as freshman forward Brittany Tarr became the first Tiger rookie since the 2007-08 season to grab at least 100 rebounds in her first year. As a team, the Tigers finished second in the CAA while averaging 8.4 steals per game. Eight Tigers recorded at least 10 steals on the season.

Reid Geckeler and the Tigers continued to battle and improved throughout the 2014-15 season. During Reid Geckeler's tutelage, LaTorri Hines-Allen finished second in the CAA in scoring and rebounding while earning First Team All-CAA honors. Hines-Allen led the CAA with 14 double-doubles under Reid Geckeler's watch. In addition, Breonn Hughey earned CAA All-Rookie honors after leading the team and finishing fourth in the CAA while averaging 4.4 assists per game.

Reid Geckeler led the Tigers to their first CAA Tournament win since the 2008-09 season. She coached a Tiger squad that set the school record for three-pointers in a single-game (12) and single-season (186).

During the 2013-14 season, Reid Geckeler saw improvement from the Tigers throughout the season. She guided Tanisha McTiller, who finished her career as the second leading scorer in program history to First Team All-CAA honors and CAA All-Defensive squad honors. McTiller led the CAA in scoring (19.4 ppg) as a senior. Reid Geckeler also guided forward Hines-Allen to Second Team All-CAA honors. Hines-Allen finished with 14.1 points and 8.4 rebounds per game.

Reid Geckeler, who led Howard University to back-to-back 20-plus-win seasons and three post-season tournament appearances, was named the ninth coach in Towson University women's basketball history in April, 2013.

Prior to Reid Geckeler's first season with the Bison in 2008-09, Howard won just four games. In 2011-12, Reid Geckeler compiled a 24-9 mark, tying the program's all-time record for wins in a season. She amassed 85 career wins at Howard, including 44 in her final two seasons alone. Under her guidance, the Bison earned their first ever preseason WNIT berth and went to the postseason WNIT twice (2011, 2012) and the 2013 Women's Basketball Invitational (WBI). Those were the first three postseason bids in program history.

She coached the 2010 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Rookie of the Year and the 2011 MEAC Player of the Year, Saadia Doyle, as well as three first team all-league honorees. In her final two seasons, two of her players ranked in the top 15 and three ranked in the top 35 in the nation statistically, in points per game, assist/turnover ratio and assists per game. Her teams were in the top 15 in the country in scoring defense in 2012 (14th - 53.0 ppg) and 2013 (sixth - 50.3 ppg).

Reid Geckeler is committed to her student-athletes' academic success as well. At Howard, she had a 100 percent graduation rate and eight student-athletes earned spots on the MEAC All-Academic team. In addition seven players graduated magna cum laude.

Prior to her tenure at Howard, Reid Geckeler served an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Georgetown (1996-2002; 2004-08) and as an assistant and associate head coach at Fordham (1995-96; 2002-04) where she coached a combined 11 conference all-academic team selections and one Rhodes Scholar finalist.

While at Georgetown, she signed the No. 6 recruiting class in the country in 2007-08 - a group that led the Hoyas to three NCAA Tournament berths. She also signed Katrina Wheeler, the first McDonald's All-American women's basketball player to attend Georgetown. Reid Geckeler guided Rebekkah Brunson, the Big East Rookie of the Year in 2001, who went on to play for the Minnesota Lynx, in the WNBA. Her 1999-2000 recruiting class was also ranked in the top 30. At Fordham, Reid

Geckeler signed a top 50 recruiting class in 2003-04.

Reid Geckeler, a 1993 graduate of Georgetown University with a bachelor's degree in psychology, was a four-year starter at point guard for the Hoyas. She served as team captain and led Georgetown to the 1992-93 Big East Conference co-championship and a berth in the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen. Geckeler finished her career as a Hoya ranked in the top 10 for 3-point field goals made, 3-point field-goal percentage, assists and games played.

Reid Geckeler is married to Timothy Geckeler, a former football player at Rutgers, and they have seven-year old daughter, MaKenzie.

Erin Dickerson

**Associate Head Coach &

2nd season
Northwestern, '09**

Erin Dickerson has added to her title entering year two on the Towson University women's basketball staff. Head coach Niki Reid Geckeler named Dickerson the associate head coach and recruiting coordinator for the program in the summer of 2016.

In her first year on the bench for the Tigers, Dickerson was responsible for the development of the guards. A trio of Tiger guards experienced plenty of success under Dickerson's tutelage. Raven Bankston earned Third Team All-Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) accolades after ranking second in the league while averaging 15.5 points per game. Sianni Martin was named the CAA Rookie of the Week three times, while Dominique Johnson scored the 1,000th point of her career and broke the school record for career three-pointers.

Dickerson was also responsible for working with the stretch forwards last season. Under her watch, Brittany Tarr became the first Tiger freshman since Dovile Miliauskaitė in 2007-08 to pull down at least 100 rebounds in her rookie campaign. Dickerson also served as the team's defensive coordinator.

Dickerson played a key role in the Tigers' incoming recruiting class that includes a pair of talented incoming freshmen this season from New York in Etalyia Vogt and Nukiya Mayo, and the #16 junior college prospect in the country, Mary Cuevas.

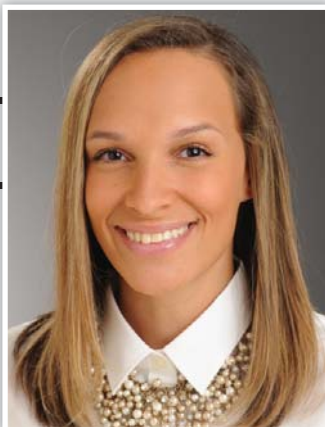
Dickerson came to Towson after spending two years as an assistant coach at Illinois State. There she worked with the guards and was responsible for the point and shooting guards during practice, film and individual workouts. She communicated regularly with prospective student-athletes, parents and coaches for recruiting purposes. Dickerson recruited three of the five recruits signed by head coach Barb Smith, including a junior college All-American and the 36th ranked point guard prospect in the nation. She worked with the strength and conditioning coach on the team's weekly workouts and assisted in day-to-day operations.

Before joining the Illinois State staff, Dickerson spent three years at La Salle. She joined the Explorers' program as an assistant coach and in her second year added the responsibilities of recruiting coordinator to her job title. In her role as the recruiting coordinator, she evaluated, organized and communicated regularly with prospective student-athletes, parents and coaches. In addition to her recruiting work, she supervised basketball staff expenses and assisted the head coach in the day-to-day operations. Dickerson worked with the Explorers' guards, created scouting reports and acted as the academic performance coordinator for the team.

Dickerson began her coaching career at Furman after graduating from Northwestern. There she worked with the guards, assisted the head coach in day-to-day operations, created scouting reports, managed monthly schedules for the players and authored a monthly newsletter for recruits, parents and alumnae. Dickerson also managed the annual summer camp program.

Dickerson earned her bachelor of science in education and social policy in learning and organizational change in 2009 from Northwestern University. While in Evanston, she was a four-year scholarship athlete and letterwinner on the women's basketball team. She was a three-year captain, a senior award winner and graduated ranked in the top 10 in Northwestern history in minutes played. She also finished her career ranked in the top 10 in three point percentage in the Big Ten and in the top 10 in three point field goals made in the Big Ten.

Dickerson joined Northwestern from one of the top high school programs in the country, Whitney Young High School, in Chicago. There she was an Adidas All-American, Street and Smith's Honorable Mention All-American and was the 33rd ranked point guard in the country.



Sidney Raikes

**Assistant Coach • 1st season
Coppin State, '95**

Sidney Raikes, who spent the previous eight seasons as an assistant coach at Coppin State University, was named an assistant coach for the Towson University women's basketball program in the summer of 2016.

Raikes recently completed his eighth season with the Eagles. He was responsible for recruiting, scouting and player development, along with practice and game preparation. Last season, Raikes helped guide the Eagles to the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Championship game while Janelle Lane earned Third Team All-MEAC accolades. Under Raikes' tutelage Genesis Lucas earned a spot on the MEAC All-Rookie Team during the 2014-15 season while Larrisa Carter was named the MEAC Rookie of the Year in 2011. Coppin State also won the MEAC Championship game during Raikes' first season when the Eagles went 20-12.

Prior to his time at Coppin State, Raikes served as an assistant coach for the girls basketball team at Woodrow Wilson High School in Camden, New Jersey. He helped Woodrow Wilson win four consecutive Olympic National Conference Championships and three straight South Jersey Group 3 titles. During the 2005 season, Raikes and Woodrow Wilson won a state championship, a New Jersey Tournament of Champions title, a South Jersey Group 3 Championship and an Olympic National Conference Championship, while earning the number one ranking in the state.

Raikes is a graduate of Coppin State, who earned his degree in criminal justice in 1995. Raikes was a star on the basketball court for the Eagles. He led Coppin State to a four-year record of 80-39 overall and a 56-8 mark in MEAC play. Coppin State went 47-1 in MEAC action during Raikes' final three seasons. The Eagles captured three straight MEAC regular season titles and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in 1993 and the NIT in 1995.

Raikes ranks sixth all-time in scoring at Coppin State with 1,412 career points and is one of only 20 1,000 point scorers in program history. He also ranks second in career history with 233 steals. Raikes earned all-conference honors three times in his career, he was a second team selection in 1993 and a first team pick in 1994 and 1995.

Brian Davis

Assistant Coach • 1st season
Tennessee Tech, '07

Brian Davis, who spent the previous seven seasons as an assistant coach at Hampton University, was named an assistant coach for the Towson University women's basketball program in the summer of 2016.

Davis helped the Pirates find plenty of success during his time in Hampton, Virginia. Hampton won 20 plus games in five of the seven seasons Davis spent on the bench. The Pirates won five straight Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Championships and advanced to the NCAA Tournament in each of those seasons. Davis and Hampton also made a post-season appearance in 2014-15 as they advanced to the second round of the WNIT.

At Hampton, Davis was responsible for the guard development of the Pirates. Under his guidance Malia Tate-DeFreitas was named the MEAC Rookie of the Year and was a two-time MEAC Player of the Year honoree. Tate-DeFreitas ranked 11th in the nation in scoring (21.3 points per game) as a sophomore and 16th as a junior (21.4 ppg). Tate-DeFreitas and Jericka Jenkins both earned First Team All-MEAC honors multiple times under Davis' tutelage. Jenkins was among the nation's leader in assists per game, averaging seven helpers or better in each of her final two seasons.

During his coaching career, Davis had eight players sign professional contracts. He has also served as a WNBA Combine coach for the past three years which was directed by Dee Davis.

Prior to his time at Hampton, Davis served as the assistant basketball and football coach at Sparkman High School in Harvest, Alabama. During his time, the Sparkman girls' basketball team recorded back-to-back 20-win seasons and made two appearances in the state championships.

Davis earned a degree in multidiscipline studies from Tennessee Technological University in May of 2007. Davis completed his masters in sports administration from Hampton University in the spring of 2016.

While at TTU, Davis played football and was a starter at defensive back in his final two seasons. He tallied 184 tackles, nine interceptions and two touchdowns on punt returners in his career. Davis also got his coaching career started while in his hometown of Huntsville, Alabama, serving as an assistant coach for the 13-and-under AAU Huntsville Heat squad.

Davis is married to his wife, Tierra.



Cheyenne Curley

Director of Operations
3rd season
Howard, '13

Cheyenne Curley, the backbone of the Tigers' day-to-day operations, returns for her third season as the Tigers' director of basketball operations.

Curley handles all of the traveling, scheduling, equipment purchases and more for the Tigers.

Curley joined the Tigers from San Diego City College, where she assisted with on-the-floor coaching during practice and maintained the availability of required sports gear and equipment. She performed administrative and managerial functions and acted as a liaison between the head coach and the players.

While coaching at San Diego City College, Curley was also working as a residential care worker/supervisor at Varsity Team Inc. There she supervised troubled foster youth in a residential facility. Curley helped keep records on individual children of daily observations, behavior, activities and medications administered. She led youth independent living skills training and used her knowledge to provide counseling or therapy for mentally disturbed, delinquent or handicapped children.

Further, Curley was a coach/camp coordinator at the I9 Sports program. There she assisted in the planning and organization for youth sports programs. She facilitated and developed the curriculum for camps throughout the year. Curley also instructed and coached youth teams in different sports and provided instruction in general skills of the sports.

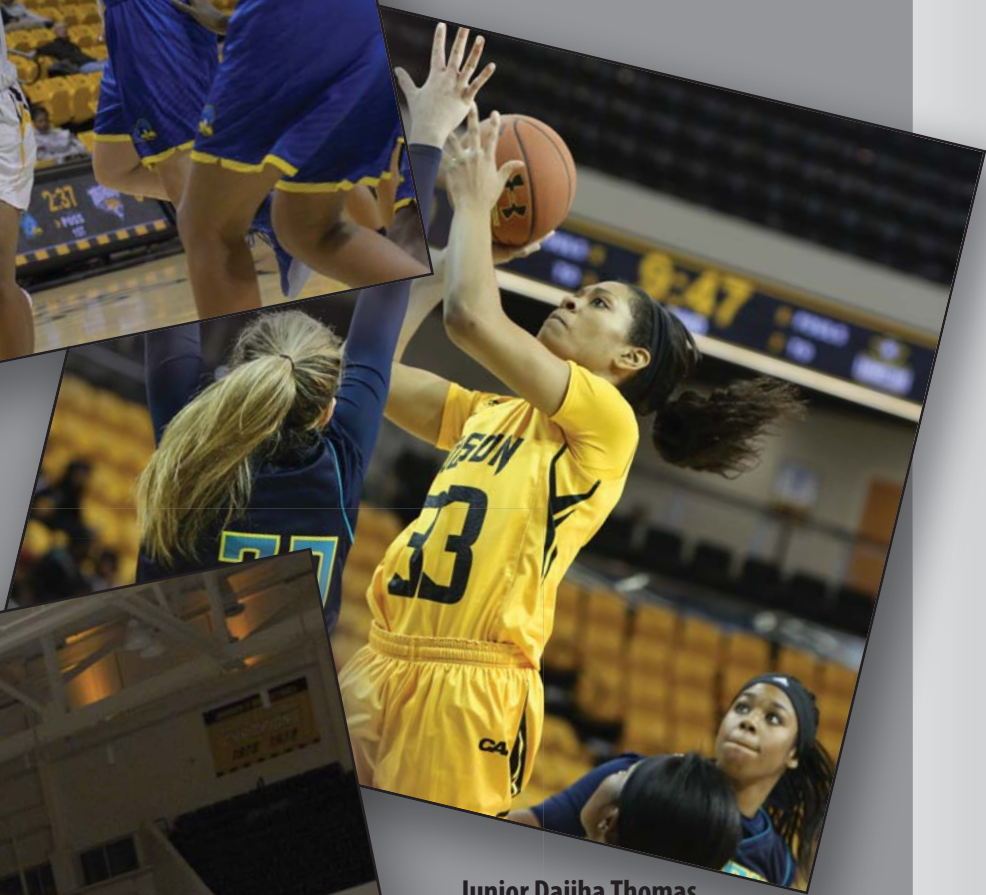
Curley earned a bachelor's of science degree from Howard University in sport management in May of 2013. At Howard, she played basketball for Reid Geckeler. Curley was a four-year starter at point guard who led the Bison to two seasons with 20 or more wins. She helped Howard reach the MEAC Championship game twice and in both of those seasons, the Bison advance to the postseason. Curley's play helped Howard earn its first ever Preseason WNIT invitation. Curley led Howard to 24 wins as a junior, which tied the program record for single-season victories. She was ranked in the top 25 in the nation for steals per game and assists per game during her career. She was a team captain who finished her career ranked second in career assists and steals at Howard. She also set the single-season assist record for the Bison. She was named the Howard University Female Athlete of the Year for 2012-13.

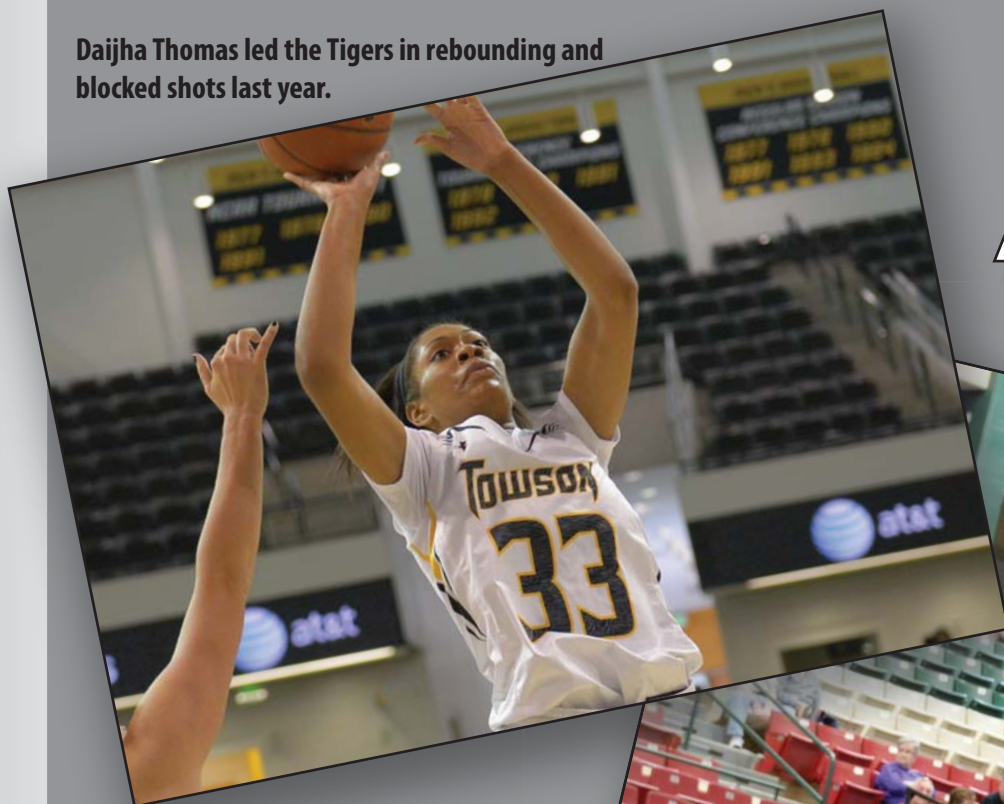

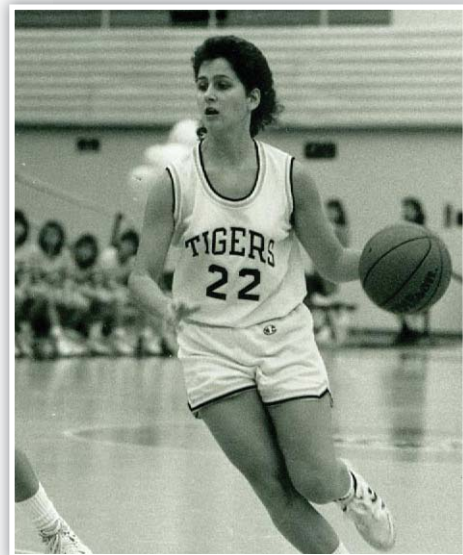

Tiger Women's Basketball Makes History

Imagine a March Madness without seeing schools like Tennessee, UConn., La. Tech., Old Dominion, USC or Purdue. Imagine a time when ten players on the court seemed new and exhilarating. Imagine wearing a blouse and skirt instead of tanktops and shorts. In 1969 in Towson, Maryland, this fantasy world was a reality.

The story really begins in 1967. Women's basketball had just adopted the five-player rule that the men were using. Previously, the women played a six-player game, three on offense and three on defense. Towson had five newcomers show up for tryouts. These two events would catapult the Tigers into women's basketball history.

Around the same time, Carol Eckman, the head women's basketball coach at West Chester University (then West Chester State) was pushing to get women's basketball more recognition at the national level. In May of 1969, her hard work became a reality as 16 teams from around the nation were chosen to form the first women's national basketball tournament at West Chester State. Towson was one of the chosen teams.

While Towson was anything but a powerhouse in any collegiate sport at the time, the non-scholarship women's basketball team was turning heads with impressive play and back-to-back winning seasons. A "first-ever" win over the University of Maryland, College Park put Towson on the map. In 1969 when the committee was looking to include a school from the state of Maryland, Towson became the obvious choice.

"TSU [program] comes from a long line of dedicated players," said former player and co-captain of the '69 team Fran Buckless. "[These were] Players who just asked for a chance to play together, so they could show you what they could do."

An invitation to the first National Tournament for women would give Fran and her teammates exactly that, a chance to show what they could do.

Unlike today, there were no budgets for travel, hotels, or even uniforms. For the tournament, the team needed to bring with them two uniforms, an away and a home jersey. The team only had one jersey and that was a navy blue top and skirt with gold numbers. To satisfy the needs for the tournament, the team bought generic black skirts and a white top. On the bus trip to West Chester the team passed the time by sewing their numbers on the white tops. The team also purchased shoes that were replicas of the 1968 women's Olympic team.

Upon their arrival in West Chester, the Tigers were informed they were to face Southern Illinois in the first round. Lynchburg, Ohio State, Purdue, Southern Connecticut, University of Kentucky, University of Iowa, Iowa Wesleyan, Central Michigan, Ball State, Western Carolina, and West Chester State rounded out the field.

A devastating 30-point loss to Southern Illinois knocked the Tigers into the Consolation bracket. Knocked down but not defeated, the Tigers went on to beat Ball State, Central Michigan and lastly Purdue in the finals of the consolation bracket. Purdue, as many basketball fans know, was the 1998-99 NCAA women's basketball champions.

West Chester won the overall Title as Women's Collegiate Basketball Champions of 1969.

"The 1969 tournament represented the golden years for women's basketball," explained former assistant coach Ellen Eason. "No scholarship athletes, all participants were there because of the love of the game. The coaches and managers were not paid, but assumed the role of coach because they cared about opportunities for women athletes to play."

The 2000 women's basketball NCAA Final Four was held in the First Union Center in Philadelphia, Pa., just miles away from West Chester University. Only 31 years after the Tigers made the trip to West Chester, the women's tournament had returned to its birthplace. To honor the original 16 teams, a display case was set up in the First Union Center for coaches and fans alike.

Coaching the '69 Tigers was Margo Verkruzen, a 1990 selection to the Tiger Hall of Fame. She coached field hockey ('62-'72), volleyball ('62-'79), and softball ('70-'83), as well as basketball ('62-'75). At her induction, they spoke about many of her accomplishments as a coach including the 1973 basketball team that she led to the Maryland State Championship. Left out and clearly forgotten was the 1969 team that set the standard for women's basketball today.

"Margo was a pioneer in Women's Athletics," said Eason. "She had a vision of things to come for women as athletes. She devoted her professional career to enhance the opportunities for women in sport to compete at the highest level and sought administrative support for all the women's programs at Towson."

To make sure the team members are not forgotten as well, here is a list of the players that helped make history: Marion Klein, Maurine Elliott, Geraldine Moran, Regina Rodman, Jennifer Thomas, Pamela Plummer, Kathy Burdekin, Linda Conn, Fran Buckless, Sue Hartman, Bonnie Peverill, Kathy Snyder, and Louise Lears. Assistant coach Ellen Eason is still teaching at Towson. She is currently the Assistant Dean of Health.

"We had a great deal of pride in ourselves and in our school," explains Buckless. "We played with dedication, courage, and confidence in ourselves and each other. Our motto[s] were 'Together' and 'Refuse to be Beaten.'"

In 1969, one team's togetherness and refusal to be beaten earned them a place in the history books and paved the way for a brighter future for today's women's basketball players.
