STORY LINES

► The Tigers return to Unitas Stadium to take on Elon for Military Appreciation. Kickoff is set for 2 p.m.

► Towson is in the midst of a six-game losing streak. It is the longest losing streak since the 2010 season. The Tigers went 0-5 during the month of October and marks the fourth time since joining Division I in 1987 that Towson went winless during the month of October.

► The Tiger offense has failed to score a touchdown in back-to-back games. The last time the Towson reached the endzone was when Deshaun Wethington scored on a one-yard touchdown run with 1:44 left in the third quarter against Dartmouth on Oct. 15.

► Turnovers have been the story for the Tigers this season as they turned the ball over five times against Delaware and are -11 in turnover margin on the season.

**Scouting Elon**

The Phoenix enter the game with an overall record of 2-6 and a 1-4 mark in CAA play.

Elon has lost four in a row and is coming off a 27-3 road loss at Albany.

The Phoenix last win was a 27-10 win over then-No. 8 William & Mary.

Elon is averaging just 269.2 yards per game of total offense. They are gaining 113.5 yards a game on the ground.

On the defensive side, Elon is giving up 390.9 yards a game, with 216.1 yards coming on the ground.

During the Phoenix four-game losing streak, they have allowed over 200-yards rushing in three of the four games.

Malcolm Summers leads the ground attack with 398 yards on 88 carries. He is one of three running backs with two rushing touchdowns on the season.

Quarterback Dennis Thompson took over as the starting quarterback in the second game of the season. He is 117-for-218 for 1,112 yards and two touchdowns. He has also thrown six interceptions.

Jeremiah Bridges in the main target with 21 catches for 252 yards and a touchdown. Cole Taylor has 19 receptions and a touchdown, while Corey Joyner has 18 catches.

Chris Blair leads the defense with 62 tackles and seven pass break-ups.

Khalil Moore and Malcolm Galloway each have two interceptions.

- Saturday's game will mark the first CAA game that will not be broadcast. The Tigers have appeared on Comcast SportsNet in each of their first five CAA games.
- The Tigers and Phoenix are meeting for just the sixth time. Towson holds a 4-1 advantage in the season, but Elon won last year's meeting 17-13.
- Each of the last three games with the Phoenix have gone down to the final minutes. All three games were one possession games and decided by a total of 13 points.
- Running back Shane Simpson scored the lone touchdown for the Tigers, scoring from 49 yards out in the first quarter.
- The Tigers offense is in a touchdown drought over the past two games. The offense has failed to reach the endzone in the last nine quarters.
- Safety Monty Fenner forced another fumble against Delaware and now has forced a team-high three fumbles on the season. Fenner is also tied for second on the team with 51 tackles.

Last Year vs. Elon

The wind and rain played a factor in the Tigers 17-13 loss to the Phoenix. Shane Simpson rushed for a 47-yard touchdown in the first quarter before leaving the game with injury.

Offensive Touchdown Drought

The Tigers offense is in one of the longest touchdown droughts in recent history. Towson has not scored an offensive touchdown since Deshaun Wethington scored with 1:44 left in the third quarter against Dartmouth on Oct. 15.

Winless October

The Tigers experience their fourth winless month of October since joining the FCS ranks in 1987. Towson also went winless in October in 1991, 2001 and 2010.

Simpson Earns CAA Honor

Kick returner Shane Simpson was named the CAA Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 24 after returning a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown. He became the second Tiger to take a kick back 100 yards, joining David Meggett who did it against Northeastern in the 1988 season opener.

Simpson Ties NCAA Record

Redshirt freshman Shane Simpson tied the NCAA record when he returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown against New Hampshire. In college, the longest return you can have is 100 yards.

Paye Gets Second INT

Redshirt freshman Keon Paye recorded his second interception of the season. He is tied with fellow redshirt freshman Justice Pettus-Dixon for the team lead. The freshman duo has combined for four of the team's five interceptions on the season.

Five-Straight Losses

Towson is in the midst of a five-game losing streak. It is the longest such streak since the 2010 season.

Under 300 Yards

The Tigers defense held New Hampshire to 271 yards of offense. It is the second-straight game the defense has held its opponent

No Offensive Scoring Drives

The game against New Hampshire marked the first time the offense did not put together a scoring drive since September 6, 2014 at West Virginia. It is also the first time it happened against an FCS opponent since November 6, 2010.

Wethington Goes Over 100

True freshman Deshaun Wethington had a career day against Dartmouth. He ran for 145 yards and a touchdown on 27 carries. It was a career high for yards and carries, while the TD was the first of his career. He is the first true freshman to rush for over 100 yards since Darius Victor ran for 105 yards against Fordham in 2013. He is also the third different Tiger running back to go over 100 yards in a game this season.

Dessenberg One Reception Shy of Record

Wide receiver Andre Dessenberg hauled in 12 passes against Dartmouth. The 12 receptions were just one shy of the single-game record.

The performance by Dessenberg and Summers against Dartmouth marked the first time since 2008 that a Tiger receiver had at least 10 catches in a game. David Newsom recorded 12 receptions against Richmond on September 13, 2008.

Pair With Double Digit Receptions

The performances by Andre Dessenberg and Christian Summers marked just the second time in school history the Tigers have had two receivers with double digit receptions. The only other time it happened was on September 23, 2006 against Hofstra when Demetrius Harrison had 11 receptions and Eric Yancey had 10.

Pair of 100 Yard Receivers

Saturday's game marked the second time in the Rob Ambrose that a pair of receivers had over 100 yards in the same game. The other time it happened was against New Hampshire in 2013 when Spencer Wilkins had 153 yards and Leon Kinnard added 102.

100 Yards on the Ground and in the Air

The Tigers offense had a 100-yard rusher and 100-yard receiver for the first time this season, and the first time since October 31, 2015 against Delaware. In that game, Marquel Dickerson rushed for 102 yards, while Christian Summers had 133 receiving yards.

Knudson Throws for Over 300

Quarterback Ellis Knudson threw for 305 yards on 29 completions against Dartmouth. It was his second 300-yard passing game of the season and became the first QB to have multiple 300-yard passing games in a season since Peter Athens had three 300-yard passing games in 2013.

Over the last five years, Rob Ambrose has led Towson football to 40 wins, a pair of CAA championships and two NCAA FCS playoff appearances. Heading into his eighth season at the helm of the Tiger football program in 2016, Ambrose has his sights set on a return to the NCAA FCS National Championship game.

The 2015 Tigers returned to their winning ways as they put together a four-game winning streak en route to a 7-4 season. The defense carried the way as they recorded the first shutout over Delaware, and put together a streak of seven-straight scoreless quarters.

Coming off an NCAA FCS Championship game appearance the year before, the Tigers battled a plethora of injuries during the 2014 season. However, for the second straight year, a Tiger was selected in the NFL Draft. Just one year after running back Terrance West was selected by the Cleveland Browns in the third round, cornerback Tye Smith went in the fifth round of the 2015 NFL Draft to the Seattle Seahawks.

You don't have to look very far back to find Ambrose's impact in the wins and losses column. In 2013, he guided the Tigers to a magical season as Towson reached the NCAA FCS championship game by beating No. 9 Fordham, No. 2 Eastern Illinois and No. 3 Eastern Washington in consecutive weeks. Towson finished the campaign with a 13-3 record; the 13 wins were a school record.

Ranked second in the final NCAA FCS polls, Towson won the Lambert/Meadowlands Award as the top FCS team in the East. The Tigers were also honored as the ECAC FCS Team of the Year.

During the 2012 season, Ambrose led the Tigers to a 7-4 record against an extremely difficult schedule. The Tigers lost to a pair of nationally-ranked FBS programs in Kent State and LSU. But, Towson finished the season with a 6-2 CAA record as the Tigers shared the league title.

In 2011, just his third season as the Tigers' head coach, Ambrose guided Towson to one of the most dramatic turnarounds in college football history. Only one season removed from a 1-10 record, the 2011 team became the "Turnaround Tigers" by going 9-3. Their 7.5-game improvement was the most dramatic improvement in NCAA Division I history.

Towson posted a 9-2 regular season record, beat six nationally-ranked teams and won the CAA championship outright with a 7-1 record

in 2011. The Tigers also made their first appearance in the NCAA FCS playoffs, becoming the first program to earn playoff berths at the Division III, Division II and FCS (I-AA) levels.

Once the season ended, Ambrose was honored as the 2011 CAA Coach of the Year, the AFCA District Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year. In January 2012, he was the recipient of the Eddie Robinson Award as the top coach in FCS football.

The UConn years (2002-08)

Ambrose joined the staff at UConn as the Huskies grew from an NCAA Division I-AA program into a major college contender. During his seven seasons in Storrs, Connecticut, the Huskies were 49-36 with just two losing seasons. UConn made three bowl appearances in five years, debuted in the AP national rankings at 16th, and won a share of the Big East title in 2007.

Joining the staff as the quarterbacks coach, Ambrose played a major role in the development of Dan Orlovsky, the first UConn quarterback to play in the NFL as a fifth-round draft pick by the Detroit Lions. In 2008 as the offensive coordinator, Ambrose coached Donald Brown, an All-American and the 2008 BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year. Brown led the nation with 2,083 yards on 367 carries and became the first UConn player to be selected in the first round of the NFL draft.

His first head coaching job – Catholic (2001)

Ambrose left Towson after the 2000 season to become the head coach at Catholic University, a Division III program in Washington, D.C. In one year at Catholic, Ambrose led the Cardinals to a 3-7 record.

As a Tiger assistant (1992-2000)

In nine years as a Tiger assistant, the team went 54-36 with only two losing seasons. Ambrose started as a student-assistant before being promoted to wide receivers coach in 1993, offensive coordinator in 1997 and then to associate head coach in 2000.

He coached four All-Americans in running back Tony Vinson, quarterback Dan Crowley, and wide receivers Mark Orlando and Jamal White. Vinson led the nation in rushing yards (2,016), all-purpose yards (2,073) and points

scored (138) in 1993. Vinson went on to be a fifth-round draft pick of the San Diego Chargers. Orlando earned All-America notice by catching 55 passes for 1,223 yards and 12 touchdowns.

In 1999, Towson led the nation in passing yardage, averaging 381.2 passing yards per game.

His collegiate playing career

As a player at Towson, Ambrose started his career as a quarterback but moved to wide receiver as a sophomore. In 1990, he caught four passes for 20 yards. As a junior, he had four catches for 35 yards. Three of those receptions were touchdown passes from Dan Crowley. He caught an 11-yard TD pass at James Madison, a seven-yard TD toss at Liberty and a 14-yard TD pass against Hofstra. An injury in the spring before his senior year forced Ambrose to the sidelines.

The Ambrose family

The Tigers' coach is the son of one of the most successful high school football coaches in Maryland. His father, Tim, was the head coach at Middletown for 31 years and won 249 games, leading the Knights to 14 Monocacy Valley League championships. He retired in 2013, just in time to follow the Tigers' march to the NCAA championship game. The former athletic director at Middletown, he stepped down as football coach after the 2004 season. Coach Ambrose's brother, Jared, was an assistant football coach at Delaware for two years before joining the Tigers' staff. He is currently the program's offensive coordinator.

Ambrose and his wife, Melissa, have two children: Grace and Riley.
