**Scouting William & Mary**

The Tribe enter the weekend with an overall record of 4-5, and a 2-4 mark in conference play.

WM has won two of their last three games and is coming off a 14-9 road victory at Stony Brook.

The Tribe are averaging 336.7 yards of offense, with 152.9 yards coming on the ground. The defense is giving up 362.7 yards a game, including 295.8 on the ground.

Quarterback Steve Cluley has thrown for 1,647 yards and eight touchdowns on 153-of-259 passing. He has also thrown 11 interceptions.

He has also rushed for 165 yards and four touchdowns.

Running back Kendell Anderson leads the ground attack with 718 yards and six touchdowns.

DeVonte Dedmon has a team-high 33 receptions for 500 yards and five touchdowns. Daniel Kuzjak is second on the team with 26 catches for 308 yards and two scores.

Stephen Lubnow leads the defense with 70 tackles, while Nate Atkins has recorded 61 stops.

Corey Parker and Aaron Swinton each have three interceptions. Swinton returned one interception 63 yards for a touchdown.

Kick returner Shane Simpson was named the CAA Special Teams Player of the Week on Oct. 24 after returning a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown. He became the second Tiger to take a kick back 100 yards, joining David Meggett who did it against Northeastern in the 1988 season opener.

### Simpson Ties NCAA Record

Redshirt freshman Shane Simpson tied the NCAA record when he returned a kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown against New Hampshire. In college, the longest return you can have is 100 yards.

### Paye Gets Second INT

Redshirt freshman Keon Paye recorded his second interception of the season. He is tied with fellow redshirt freshman Justice Pettus-Dixon for the team lead. The freshman duo has combined for four of the team's seven interceptions on the season.

### Five-Straight Losses

Towson is in the midst of a five-game losing streak. It is the longest such streak since the 2010 season.

### Under 300 Yards

The Tigers defense held New Hampshire to 271 yards of offense. It is the second-straight game the defense has held its opponent under 300 yards of offense. Last season, Towson held Delaware and Maine to under 300 yards in back-to-back games.

Redshirt freshman kick returner Shane Simpson set a new single-game record with 229 kickoff return yards against USF. He broke the old record of 211 set by Lyrics Klugh in 2015.

That was the question everyone was asking in the season opener. The answer, true freshman Aidan O'Neill. He was not listed on any roster as he arrived on campus just a few days before the Tigers took off for the season opener.

### JPD With the INT

Justice Pettus-Dixon got the start at corner in his collegiate debut at USF. On just the eighth play of his career, Pettus-Dixon stepped in front of a pass for his first career interception. He would also add a pair of solo tackles.

### Wallace Does a Little of Everything

Sophomore Diondre Wallace was all over the field in the opener at USF. The linebacker led the way with 14 tackles, including 10 solo stops. He also added two tackles-for-loss, a sack and forced a fumble.

### Fourth Down Conversions

Towson Head Coach Rob Ambrose has never been afraid to roll the dice. That was evident by him going for it six times in the season opener against USF. The Tigers were able to convert five of the six attempts, including converting a 4th-and-8 and a 4th-and-9.

### It's a Fake

The Tigers executed a fake punt to convert a 4th-and-9 from their own territory in the second half. Emmanuel Holder took the short snap and picked up 10 yards and the first down.

### 90 Plays

The Towson offense ran 90 plays in the season opener against USF. The 90 plays are the most since running a school record 101 plays against Lehigh in 1999.

### Ball Control Offense

The Tigers offense controlled the clock against USF. Towson held the ball for 37:40.

TU held the ball for at least 8:45 in each of the four quarters.

### Wethington Runs Hard

True freshman Deshaun Wethington made the most of his opportunity in his collegiate debut as he rushed five times for 31 yards against South Florida. His 12 yard run to pick up a first down tied for the longest run of the day by a Tiger.

### Distance Traveled for Opener

This season marks the furthest trip ever taken by the Tigers to play a season opener. Towson will travel 961.4 miles to Tampa, Florida. This supplants the 723 miles to Evanston, Illinois for the 2009 season opener against Northwestern.

### Covering the East Coast

Towson will log some miles up and down the East Coast from its season opener to regular season finale. The Tigers head south to Tampa, Florida for the opener, while closing out the regular season in Kingston, Rhode Island. The difference in mileage from the two places is 1,286.1 miles.

Head Coach

8th Season • Towson, '93



Over the last five years, Rob Ambrose has led Towson football to 40 wins, a pair of CAA championships and two NCAA FCS playoff appearances. Heading into his eighth season at the helm of the Tiger football program in 2016, Ambrose has his sights set on a return to the NCAA FCS National Championship game.

The 2015 Tigers returned to their winning ways as they put together a four-game winning streak en route to a 7-4 season. The defense carried the way as they recorded the first shutout over Delaware, and put together a streak of seven-straight scoreless quarters.

Coming off an NCAA FCS Championship game appearance the year before, the Tigers battled a plethora of injuries during the 2014 season. However, for the second straight year, a Tiger was selected in the NFL Draft. Just one year after running back Terrance West was selected by the Cleveland Browns in the third round, cornerback Tye Smith went in the fifth round of the 2015 NFL Draft to the Seattle Seahawks.

You don't have to look very far back to find Ambrose's impact in the wins and losses column. In 2013, he guided the Tigers to a magical season as Towson reached the NCAA FCS championship game by beating No. 9 Fordham, No. 2 Eastern Illinois and No. 3 Eastern Washington in consecutive weeks. Towson finished the campaign with a 13-3 record; the 13 wins were a school record.

Ranked second in the final NCAA FCS polls, Towson won the Lambert/Meadowlands Award as the top FCS team in the East. The Tigers were also honored as the ECAC FCS Team of the Year.

During the 2012 season, Ambrose led the Tigers to a 7-4 record against an extremely difficult schedule. The Tigers lost to a pair of nationally-ranked FBS programs in Kent State and LSU. But, Towson finished the season with a 6-2 CAA record as the Tigers shared the league title.

In 2011, just his third season as the Tigers' head coach, Ambrose guided Towson to one of the most dramatic turnarounds in college football history. Only one season removed from a 1-10 record, the 2011 team became the "Turnaround Tigers" by going 9-3. Their 7.5-game improvement was the most dramatic improvement in NCAA Division I history.

Towson posted a 9-2 regular season record, beat six nationally-ranked teams and won the CAA championship outright with a 7-1 record

in 2011. The Tigers also made their first appearance in the NCAA FCS playoffs, becoming the first program to earn playoff berths at the Division III, Division II and FCS (I-AA) levels.

Once the season ended, Ambrose was honored as the 2011 CAA Coach of the Year, the AFCA District Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year. In January 2012, he was the recipient of the Eddie Robinson Award as the top coach in FCS football.

**The UConn years (2002-08)**

Ambrose joined the staff at UConn as the Huskies grew from an NCAA Division I-AA program into a major college contender. During his seven seasons in Storrs, Connecticut, the Huskies were 49-36 with just two losing seasons. UConn made three bowl appearances in five years, debuted in the AP national rankings at 16th, and won a share of the Big East title in 2007.

Joining the staff as the quarterbacks coach, Ambrose played a major role in the development of Dan Orlovsky, the first UConn quarterback to play in the NFL as a fifth-round draft pick by the Detroit Lions. In 2008 as the offensive coordinator, Ambrose coached Donald Brown, an All-American and the 2008 BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year. Brown led the nation with 2,083 yards on 367 carries and became the first UConn player to be selected in the first round of the NFL draft.

**His first head coaching job – Catholic (2001)**

Ambrose left Towson after the 2000 season to become the head coach at Catholic University, a Division III program in Washington, D.C. In one year at Catholic, Ambrose led the Cardinals to a 3-7 record.

**As a Tiger assistant (1992-2000)**

In nine years as a Tiger assistant, the team went 54-36 with only two losing seasons. Ambrose started as a student-assistant before being promoted to wide receivers coach in 1993, offensive coordinator in 1997 and then to associate head coach in 2000.

He coached four All-Americans in running back Tony Vinson, quarterback Dan Crowley, and wide receivers Mark Orlando and Jamal White. Vinson led the nation in rushing yards (2,016), all-purpose yards (2,073) and points

scored (138) in 1993. Vinson went on to be a fifth-round draft pick of the San Diego Chargers. Orlando earned All-America notice by catching 55 passes for 1,223 yards and 12 touchdowns.

In 1999, Towson led the nation in passing yardage, averaging 381.2 passing yards per game.

**His collegiate playing career**

As a player at Towson, Ambrose started his career as a quarterback but moved to wide receiver as a sophomore. In 1990, he caught four passes for 20 yards. As a junior, he had four catches for 35 yards. Three of those receptions were touchdown passes from Dan Crowley. He caught an 11-yard TD pass at James Madison, a seven-yard TD toss at Liberty and a 14-yard TD pass against Hofstra. An injury in the spring before his senior year forced Ambrose to the sidelines.

**The Ambrose family**

The Tigers' coach is the son of one of the most successful high school football coaches in Maryland. His father, Tim, was the head coach at Middletown for 31 years and won 249 games, leading the Knights to 14 Monocacy Valley League championships. He retired in 2013, just in time to follow the Tigers' march to the NCAA championship game. The former athletic director at Middletown, he stepped down as football coach after the 2004 season. Coach Ambrose's brother, Jared, was an assistant football coach at Delaware for two years before joining the Tigers' staff. He is currently the program's offensive coordinator.

Ambrose and his wife, Melissa, have two children: Grace and Riley.

After the Wildcats extended their lead on an interception return for a touchdown, Shane Simpson took the ensuing kickoff 100 yards for a touchdown.

It was the first kickoff return for a touchdown for Towson since Derrick Joseph went 90 yards against Villanova in 2013.

Simpson also became the second Tiger to return a kick 100 yards for a touchdown, joining David Meggett who did it in the 1988 season opener against Northeastern.

Penalties also played a role for the Tigers as they committed six penalties, wiping points off the board and ending drives.

Simpson added 53 yards on 14 carries, while catching two passes for four yards. Deshaun Wethington added 47 yards on six carries.

Andre Dessenberg led the receivers with seven catches for 65 yards. He now has at least seven catches in each of the last three games.

Bryton Barr led the defense with eight tackles, while Chris Tedder had seven tackles and a sack.

Keon Paye intercepted his second pass of the season on the first play of the second quarter.
