## STORY LINES

Towson is competing in a postseason event for the second time in three years.

Towson advanced to the quarterfinals of the CIT Tournament in 2014.

The winner of the Oakland-Towson game will return to the court March 29 to take on the Louisiana Tech-ETSU winner.

This will be Towson's sixth postseason game as a Division I program. The Tigers are 2-3 all-time. Towson has competed in the NCAA Tournament (1990 & 1991) and the CIT Tournament (2014).

Towson hasn't lost three straight games this season.

This will be Towson's first meeting against a Horizon League school since 1992 when it played Youngstown State.

Towson has played three teams in the Vegas 16: Old Dominion, ETSU and Northern Illinois. ODU and Towson used to be members of the CAA together.

The CAA had the nation's ninth-best RPI, which was the best in conference history.

# PAT SKERRY

Head Coach  
5th Season • Tufts, '92



When Pat Skerry was announced as the 13th men's basketball head coach at Towson University on April 5, 2011, he took over a program that had endured 15-straight losing seasons.

The gritty Medford, Massachusetts native needed only two seasons to make everyone know he was the right man for the job.

After winning just one game during his first season, Skerry led the Tigers to an 18-13 record in 2012-13. Not only was it the first winning season since 1995-96, it was also the largest single-season turnaround in NCAA Division I history.

The achievement did not go unrecognized by his peers as Skerry was selected as the CAA Coach of the Year. He became the first coach to receive that honor since Terry Truax earned back-to-back Big South Conference Coach of the Year honors in 1992-93 and 1993-94.

The success continued during the 2013-14 season as the Tigers won a Division I record 25 games. This includes winning their first two postseason games as a Division I program in the CollegeInsider.com Tournament.

The 2013-14 season saw the Tigers end the year ranked 84th in the RPI, marking the first time Towson finished the season in the Top 100. The Tigers also received their first votes in the national polls when they were receiving votes in the *Associated Press* Top 25 poll.

The successful season was made even more special with the opening of SECU Arena. The Tigers opened the building with a 72-45 victory over Navy on Nov. 8 in front an arena-record crowd of 4,262. Less than one week later, Towson defeated Temple, 75-69, on their new home floor.

The Tigers finished their first season in SECU Arena with a 15-1 record.

The staple of success during the Skerry era has been defense and rebounding. In each of the past three seasons, the Tigers have led the CAA in field goal percentage defense and rebounding. Individually, Towson has also had the conference double-double leader over that span.

Skerry has done an outstanding job of mixing in transfers to his recruiting classes. In his first season, Skerry landed Georgetown transfer Jerrelle Benimon. In his two seasons at Towson, Benimon led the conference in scoring and rebounding. He was twice named the CAA Player of the Year, while also earning All-America honors following his junior season.

Skerry's first recruiting class at Towson was ranked as the best in the CAA and sixth among all non-BCS schools, according to CBS Sports.

Hardwork is not just limited to the court under Skerry. Since taking over as head coach, the team GPA raised to 2.881. Since the Fall of 1999, five of the top seven semester GPA's have occurred under Skerry's watch. During the 2014-15 academic year, the men's basketball team had five players with at least a 3.0 GPA during the fall semester, and six players with a 3.0 during the spring semester.

A true family man in every sense of the word, Skerry manages his time as head coach with his time at home with his family. This is even more important for Skerry, whose youngest son, Owen, is on the autism spectrum.

Skerry has used his platform as a head coach and teamed up with Georgia Tech assistant coach Tom Herrion to start Autism Awareness in college basketball.

What started as two guys with an idea three years ago, has turned into a national event where hundreds of coaches where the prominent blue puzzle piece pin.

The effort put forth by both Skerry and Herrion were recognized this year as the duo was honored with the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) Guardians of the Game Service Award.

Since taking over as head coach, Skerry has mentored 12 players that were honored as all-conference, all-rookie, all-defense or all-academic by the CAA.

Benimon is the most recognizable name in the group. The two-time CAA Player of the Year was also twice named to the all-defensive team. He also became the third Tiger to earn All-America honors when he was selected honorable mention by the *Associated Press*.

Junior John Davis joined the list this past season after earning third-team honors, while sophomore Mike Morsell was selected to the freshman team.

Under Skerry, the Tigers have had at least one player on the all-academic team, including having two players following the 2012-13 and 2014-15 seasons. Senior Timajh Parker-Rivera became the second two-time honoree last season.

Skerry took over at Towson after spending one season as an assistant coach at Pittsburgh. In his lone season, he helped the Panthers capture the BIG EAST regular season championship with a 28-6 record.

During his tenure at Pitt, he once again helped refill the talent pool for the Panthers as they added one of the Top 15 recruiting classes in the country according to ESPN.com, including two of the Top 60 incoming players.

Skerry played collegiately at Tufts from 1989-92 where he was a two-time team captain and garnered All-New England honors. As a point guard, he recorded a school-record 650 assists during his career - a mark that still ranks as the 17th best in NCAA Division III history. His 198 assists in 1990-91 is a Tufts single-season record. He also is fifth on the school's career steals list with 95.

Skerry earned both of his collegiate degrees from Tufts, earning his bachelor's degree in psychology in 1992 and his master's degree in education in 1995.

Pat and his wife, Kristen, have two sons, Ryan and Owen.



### Tonight's Game

Towson meets Oakland for the first time in program history in the third of four games of the Vegas 16. The winner advances to Tuesday's semifinals against the survivor of the Louisiana Tech-ETSU game at 11:30 p.m. ET.

### On the Air

The game will be televised live on CBS Sports Network. Dave Ryan (play-by-play) and Jordan Cornette (color) will call the action. Courtney Alexander will serve as the sideline reporter.

### Skerry on the Radio

### Vegas 16

The Vegas 16 is a single-elimination, eight-team postseason basketball tournament. The event will begin on Monday, March 28, with the quarterfinals and continue with the semifinals on Tuesday, March 29 and the final on Wednesday, March 30. All games will be televised on CBS Sports Network. The Vegas 16 field includes six 20-win teams. The tournament also has the second best average RPI of the four non-NCAA tournaments: NIT (84), Vegas 16 (123), CBI (161) and CIT (169). The other half of the bracket features Tennessee Tech, Old Dominion, UCSB and Northern Illinois.

### Postseason Experience

John Davis, Walter Foster and Timajh Parker-Rivera played in each game of the CIT in 2014. Parker-Rivera averaged 6.0 points and 6.3 rebounds. Davis averaged 4.0 points and 5.7 rebounds and Foster contributed 2.0 points and 2.0 rebounds. In a win over ETSU, Parker-Rivera had seven points and nine rebounds while Davis had eight rebounds in 12 minutes.

### Last Time Out

Towson dropped a 71-60 decision to Northeastern on Sat., March 5 in the CAA quarterfinals in Baltimore. William Adala-Moto notched his seventh double-double of the season (18 points, 11 rebounds). Mike Morsell added 16 points and Timajh Parker-Rivera

finished with 11 rebounds. Northeastern shot 61 percent in the second half.

### Bouncing Back

Towson is 9-2 following losses. The Tigers had an eight-game winning streak following losses ended when Northeastern beat them in the CAA tournament. Towson hasn't lost three consecutive games all season.

### Morsell sets SECU Scoring Record

Sophomore Mike Morsell set a SECU Arena scoring record when he poured in 34 points in the Tigers' 99-82 victory over William & Mary last Saturday. It was the first 30-point effort by a Tigers' player since Jerrell Benimon in 2013 and the second-most by a CAA player this season. Morsell finished 11-of-17 from the floor, including 4-of-7 from 3-point range.

### 20-20 Vision

William Adala Moto and John Davis scored 22 points each against Delaware. Davis (21) and Mike Morsell (24) did the same thing during the Tigers' 101-97 overtime win over Delaware.

### 5 in Double Figures

The Tigers are 5-1 this season when placing five players in double figures.

### One of the Best Seasons In School History

**Scouting Oakland**

Members of the Horizon League, the Golden Grizzlies are ranked 24th in the latest College Mid-Major top 25 poll... Oakland leads the nation in scoring (86.3). This marks the seventh time Oakland has made the postseason in the last eight years. The Golden Grizzlies made NCAA tournament appearances in 2010 and '11, and competed in the CollegeInsider.com Postseason tournament (CIT) in 2009, '12, '13 and '15. Oakland will be making its eighth overall postseason appearance, earning an NCAA tournament bid in 2005.

Bob Cousy and Wooden Award Finalist Kay Felder leads the way for the Golden Grizzlies. He was named the Horizon League Player of the Year and leads the country with 9.3 assists per game, and ranks fifth in the NCAA by scoring 24.2 points per game.

Felder engineers the nation's top scoring

The Golden Grizzlies scored 100 points or more five times this season and made 638 free throws, third in the country, and nine shy of setting a new single-season school record.

The Golden Grizzlies reached 20 wins for the first time in four seasons and for the fifth time since becoming Division I in 1999-00.

The Golden Grizzlies have four other players averaging double figures: Jalen Hayes (13.9 ppg. & 8.8 rpg.), Percy Gibson (11.3 & 6.4), Martez Walker (10.7 ppg.) and Max Hooper (10.5). All of Hooper's 105 made field goals have been 3-pointers.

Oakland has three players that have made at least 40 3-points. Felder has made 68 and Nick Daniels has made 43. The Golden Grizzlies have seven players averaging at least 20 minutes. They have won their last four games following losses.

**CAA Excellence**

Five teams won 20 or more games (UNCW, Hofstra, James Madison, Towson and W&M)... Eight teams had 16 wins. It was the first time in the 31-year history of the CAA that it had at least eight teams with at least 16 wins. The CAA compiled a 75-44 record in non-conference play this season.

**Battle for Greater Baltimore**

Towson finished a perfect 4-0 in the Battle For Greater Baltimore after a 69-61 victory over Morgan State, an 81-77 overtime victory over Coppin State, a 65-54 win over Loyola and a 91-65 win over UMBC. Over the last three seasons, Towson is 12-1 against schools in the state of Maryland.

**Non-Conference Highlights**

• Towson enjoyed a regular season winning streak of at least six games for the third straight season.

• Towson's 75-54 win over George Mason was its first over the Patriots in Towson since 1992, a span of 10 games. To put that into perspective, no current member of the men's basketball team was alive the last time the Tigers defeated GMU in Towson.

• Sophomore Byron Hawkins made all six of his field goal attempts against FDU, going 6-for-6 and 3-for-3 from 3-point distance. Hawkins found his shooting touch in the Charleston Classic as he averaged 19.0 points over the three games. He hit 7-of-10 three pointers on his way to a career-high 28 points against Ole Miss, then followed it up with 24 points against Bradley. For the tournament, Hawkins made 10 3-pointers.

**Fantastic Foster**

Walter Foster blocked a career best seven shots against Drexel on Jan. 16. It was the third most in a game in Towson history. He has also blocked five shots in a game twice (Loyola & Delaware). Foster scored a career-high 15 points on 6-of-9 shooting against Sacred Heart. He established career highs in rebounds (14) in the win over Loyola. He has two double-doubles this season. Foster led the CAA in blocked shots (1.5).

**Davis Back In The Groove**

After missing most of the preseason with an injury, John Davis has scored 20 or more points three times this season and posted three double-doubles. He had two against Northeastern (20 points, 11 rebounds on 1-23-16 & 18 pts, 10 rebs on 2-11-16) and one against UNCW (16 points, 11 rebounds). He scored a season-high 22 points against Delaware on Jan. 14. He made a career-best five 3-pointers en route to tallying 21 points against Delaware on Jan. 30.

**Leaders of the CAA**

Towson leads the CAA in rebounding margin (+7.3), offensive rebounds (14.4), blocked shots (4.7), rebounding (39.3) and offensive rebounding percentage (.390). The Tigers are second in scoring defense (66.8) and field goal percentage defense (41.7).

**Nationally-Speaking**

Towson is ranked among the top 50 nationally in several categories through Mar. 20. The Tigers are fifth in offensive rebounding (14.4), 22nd in rebounding margin (+7.3), 28th in total blocks (149), 43rd in rebounds per game (39.4) and 44th in blocked shots per game (4.7).

**Comeback Tigers**

Towson rallied from a 12-point first-half deficit to defeat William & Mary, 76-69 on 12-31-15. Even though it lost 40-37, Towson rallied from a 10-point 2nd half deficit to tie Charleston in the final seconds. The Tigers also rallied from a 10-point first half deficit to beat Drexel, 77-70 on 1-28-16.

**Locking Down Defensively**

Towson has some great stretches of defense this season:

- George Mason scoreless for 5:27 of the 1H
- Loyola scoreless for 4:04 of the 2H
- William & Mary scoreless for 6:11 of 2H.
- UMBC without a basket for 9:10 of the 1H.
- Held three consecutive opponents below 20 points in the first half: Drexel (12), Charleston (18) and Northeastern (19).
- In home losses, Towson held Charleston to eight points over the final 13 minutes and Northeastern to seven points over the last 11 minutes.

**What a Debut**

Junior Arnaud William Adala Moto had one of the most impressive debuts in a Towson uniform. The junior scored 28 points against La Salle and tied Gary Neal (2005) for the most points scored in their Towson debut.

**Bright Light Bliss**

The Tigers are 6-2 in TV games this season, having won five straight contests under the bright lights.

**Tigers Hit Offensive Glass**

The Tigers pulled down a season-high 20 offensive rebounds against Delaware on Jan. 30 and Northeastern on Feb. 11. The Tigers have grabbed at least 15 offensive rebounds 12 times this season. The Tigers have four players ranked among the CAA top 11 in offensive rebounding: Timajh Parker-Rivera (3rd, 2.9), Walter Foster (4th, 2.4), William Adala-Moto (5th, 2.3) and John Davis (11th, 1.9).

**The 700 Club**

Towson has three players with at least 700 career points: Timajh Parker-Rivera (749), John Davis (785) and William Adala-Moto (811).

**Parker-Rivera Leaving Mark at TU**

Senior Timajh Parker-Rivera has been a part of 75 wins during his career. TJ is the winningest player in Towson's Division I history surpassing Devin Boyd, who won 74 games for the Tigers from 1988-1993. Parker-Rivera is also eighth in school history in rebounding (683) and sixth in blocked shots (127). Next up for Parker-Rivera to pass in rebounding is Larry Witherspoon's total of 694 and blocked shots is Junior Hairston's mark of 129. He has also played in 131 career games, which is the most in Towson history. He will become the fourth player in TU history to start 100 games.

**Awesome Adala-Moto**

For the season, he averaged 13.9 points and 8.4 rebounds in the CAA. He has seven double-doubles this season. Adala-Moto has scored 20+ points five times this season. He has led Towson in rebounding in four of its last five games.

**Tigers Add 3 Signees**

Towson added three players to their recruiting class with the signing of a trio of three-star athletes. Guards Justin Gorham and Zane Martin, and forward JJ Matthews have signed to join the Tigers beginning with the 2016-17 season.

**Magnificent Morsell**

Sophomore Mike Morsell has scored in double figures 21 times this season. He scored a career best 34 points in a 99-82 victory over William & Mary. He drained 24 points in a 101-97 overtime against Delaware. He made four 3-pointers each against W&M and Delaware. He also scored 20 points in a win over George Mason.

### **Josh Ivory**

**2015-16:** Saw action in 30 games and made three starts ... Scored a career-high 11 points on 4-of-7 shooting on Senior Night against James Madison ... Six of his 11 made 3-pointers this season were against James Madison ... Handed out a season-high three assists against Rio Grande.

### **Byron Hawkins**

**2015-16:** Played in 30 games and made 29 starts ... Was second on the team and 12th in the CAA in scoring (13.4 ppg.) and 12th in free-throw percentage (77.8%) ... Hawkins was 13th in the CAA in 3-pointers made per game (1.9) ... He led the Tigers in scoring eight times, assists 12 times and steals seven times ... He scored in double figures 23 times ... Scored a career-high 28 points against Ole Miss in the Charleston Classic ... That started a stretch in which he scored 20 or more points in three of Towson's four games ... He scored 24 against Bradley and 20 against Coppin State ... He scored 23 points in a road win against Drexel ... He made at least two 3-pointers in a game 17 times ... Made a career best seven 3-pointers against Ole Miss ... He's had three games this season in which he's attempted at least 10 free throws (Coppin State, James Madison and Drexel) ... He handed out a season best five assists against Delaware.

### **Jordan McNeil**

**2015-16:** Saw action in 32 games and made two starts ... Scored in double figures twice this season ... He scored 14 points against Gallaudet and 12 points against UNCW ... In two starts, McNeil averaged eight points in 19.5 minutes ... Made 16 3-pointers ... He led the Tigers in steals three times.

### **Walter Foster**

**2015-16:** Saw action in 28 games and made five starts ... In addition to averaging 5.8 points and 4.9 rebounds, Foster led the CAA in blocked shots per game (1.5) ... Foster posted three double-doubles this season ... He scored 10 points, grabbed a career best 14 rebounds and blocked five shots in a win over Loyola ... Foster scored in double figures six times ... He's also grabbed 10 or more rebounds four times ... Foster has three games in which he blocked at least five shots, including a career best seven against Drexel ... Foster led Towson in blocked shots 13 times ... He was also fourth in the CAA in offensive rebounds per game (2.4) ... Scored a season-high 15 points against Sacred Heart.

### **John Davis**

**2015-16:** Saw action in 32 games making 28 starts ... He was one of four Towson players who averaged double figures with 10.3 points per game ... Davis ranked 17th in the CAA in rebounds per game (5.5) and 11th in offensive rebounds per game (1.9) ... Davis scored in double figures 15 times ... He scored 20 or more points three times ... Season-high was 22 points against Delaware ... Two of his three double-doubles were against Northeastern ... Third double-double was against Northeastern ... He made a career best five 3-pointers in a win against Delaware ... In two games against Delaware, Davis averaged 21 points ... Davis grabbed at least six rebounds 16 times ... ### **Timajh Parker-Rivera**

During the season, Parker-Rivera became the all-time program leader in victories (75) and games played (131) ... Parker-Rivera is sixth all-time in blocked shots (127) and seventh in rebounding (683) ... He scored in double figures eight times ... Scored a season-best 13 times four times (Gallaudet, Delaware, Elon and James Madison) ... Clinched a Towson victory at Elon by blocking a shot with five seconds remaining that preserved Towson's two-point advantage ... He had one double-double against Gallaudet (13 points, 13 rebounds) ... Parker-Rivera grabbed double-digit rebounds four times, including 11 each against William & Mary and Northeastern in the CAA Tournament ... Grabbed at least six rebounds in game 23 times ... Finished with at least three blocks in a game five times ... Led Towson in rebounding seven times, steals 11 times and blocked shots 15 times.

### **Mike Morsell**

**2015-16:** Played in 32 games and made 30 starts ... A third-team All-CAA selection, Morsell scored in double figures 23 times ... Morsell was 14th in the CAA in scoring (12.7) and assists per game (2.5) ... Morsell was tied for 13th in the CAA in steals per game (1.0) ... He scored a career high 34 points on 11-of-17 shooting in a win over William & Mary ... That 34-point total was a SECU Arena scoring record ... He scored 20 or more points three times ... Also scored 24 points against Delaware, including banking in the go-ahead 3-pointer with 38 seconds remaining in the overtime victory ... # **After Another Turnaround, Towson Men's Basketball Headed In Right Direction**

The Towson University men's basketball program is familiar with epic turnarounds. After recording a 1-31 record during the 2011-12 season, the 2012-13 Tigers completed an all-time NCAA best single-season turnaround when they went 18-13.

While it may not have been a record-breaking effort, the 2015-16 season made for another bounce-back performance. Towson went from a 20-loss team in 2014-15 (12-20 overall) to a 20-win team in 2015-16 (20-11 regular season). The Tigers earned the No. 3 seed in the Colonial Athletic Association tournament with an 11-7 conference mark but were eliminated after a 71-60 loss to Northeastern during the quarterfinal round March 5.

"Well, we don't want any more turnarounds," head coach Pat Skerry said. "It's a credit to the players. The whole thing. We touched on it last year ... do we have guys that are interested or committed?"

A key addition to the Tigers' young roster was redshirt junior forward Arnaud William Adala Moto. After sitting out the 2014-15 season in accordance with NCAA transfer rules, Adala Moto earned second-team All-CAA honors during his first year with Towson, which he said required some upfront adjustment to his playing style.

"This has been a learning experience," Adala Moto said. "For myself, this is my first year playing in this league -- I thought it was less physical, and so I had to adjust my game and limit my turnovers. I think, as a team, we're still growing, and we're glad to have mostly everybody back. We put in a lot of work last year to be in this position, and I expect us to put in more work in the offseason, so that we can do better."

Adala Moto paced the team with 13.6 points per game -- good for 10th best in the CAA -- and brought down 8.2 rebounds per game, good for third most in the CAA. During Towson's loss to Northeastern, Adala Moto led the team with 18 points, but he and the rest of the Tigers were virtually nonexistent in the paint.

No other team in the CAA went to the free-throw line as often as Towson did during the regular season, as the team attempted 802 free throws in 31 games. About 24.5 percent of the Tigers' points during the regular season came from the free-throw line, but against Northeastern, the Tigers only attempted eight free throws and made just three. For Skerry, that number was baffling.

"We just couldn't get to the foul line for whatever reason," Skerry said. "Obviously, they played some zone, but probably half the year we saw some zone and still got to the foul line. We just couldn't get to the foul line tonight -- we'll forever wonder why."



If the Tigers are superstitious, they can look forward to the conference tournament moving out of their own backyard in Baltimore. After winning just one game during the last three seasons at Royal Farms Arena, Skerry said he is looking forward to the tournament moving to Charleston, S.C., starting next year.

"I love living in Baltimore, but I'll be happy to see the tournament go to Charleston," Skerry said. "We've had some tough luck here."

Going forward, the Tigers will look to continue building on the momentum from their success this season. In addition to Adala Moto, who will return for his senior season, a lot of Towson's success came from the maturation of the team's young core group of players. Sophomores Byron Hawkins and Mike Morsell will stand to benefit from another year of experience.

Hawkins emerged as a much-needed point guard this season after the departure of Four McGlynn, who transferred to Rhode Island during the offseason. Hawkins contributed 13.4 points per game for the Tigers and recorded an assist-to-turnover ratio of about two-to-one. Morsell earned third-team All-CAA honors after averaging 12.7 points and 4.2 rebounds per game.

"This group's been really fun to coach," Skerry said. "We have a good core back, and that's exciting. They played hard all year and had good chemistry, great to be around."

What started as a grassroots, word-of-mouth effort among several dozen Division I coaches wearing a pin on their lapel has grown into Coaches Powering Forward for autism awareness weekend. Anyone watching games on television the next three days will witness the college basketball family supporting the effort. More than 300 coaches, as well as broadcasters

and referees are expected to participate.

"This is an awareness game," Skerry said. "My wife and I hope it will become an acceptance game as people learn more and more about it."

Skerry's son, Owen, is seven years old. When he was 18-20 months, Skerry's wife, Kristen, felt he had not reached several benchmarks that their older son, Ryan, had met at the same age. Skerry was an assistant at Pittsburgh at the time.

"I was probably in denial for a while, but she hit the ground running," Skerry said. "You just have to work at it every day, kind of like trying to get your team better."

Skerry understands that challenge well. He was named head coach at Towson in April 2011 and has lifted the Tigers from the ashes. In his first season, the program snapped a Division I record 41-game losing streak. It was their lone victory. The following season, 2012-13, he led the Tigers to the best turnaround in the nation. They finished with an 18-13 record - their first winning season in almost 20 years.

As Skerry built the program his wife handled the daily responsibilities of raising the family.

"She's a rock star," Skerry said. "I think for me personally, he's the toughest kid I know. If he's sick or hurt you can't tell. He's got to grind it out. He's big into routine. It's a spectrum, so it's a wide range. He's not fully verbal and that's the biggest challenge."

In February 2013, Skerry and his wife decided they wanted to raise awareness for autism. With the help of a sorority on campus, he and his staff wore a pin on their suit coat lapel during a game with UNC - Wilmington. Afterward, one of the sorority representatives asked Skerry how they could make a greater impact.

From there, this weekend was born.

Autism Speaks and the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) became involved and the event blossomed. In 2014, there were 82 Division I coaches and broadcasters involved. Syracuse met Duke on ESPN that year and Jim Boeheim and Mike Krzyzewski wore the pin which instantly increased visibility. Last year, it mushroomed to 250 participants. Skerry hopes that one day there will be a preseason game, similar to the Coaches vs. Cancer game held each December to raise money and awareness.

According to autismspeaks.com, 1 in 42 boys in the United States is on the autism spectrum. The occupational therapy and speech therapy autistic children need can cost up to \$60,000 per year, which is affordable for a D1 basketball coach but not the average person.

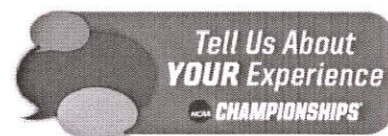
"I can't look you in the eye and tell you that if I never had a son who had autism that I would be doing this," Skerry said. "But I get pumped up about it when I'm watching games around the country over the weekend."

Towson is 18-10 this season and 9-6 in the Colonial Athletic Association. The Tigers play host to Elon on Saturday. One seed planted on that campus four years ago has grown into a three-day nationwide event that brings autism to the forefront while encouraging parents who live with the challenges of autism.

"The hardest thing for most parents is you have to approach it day by day," Skerry said. "The thing that scares most parents is what happens after you're gone. Can he get a job? can he be on a team? can he get married?"

Autism awareness pins have added meaning for two college basketball coaches

This weekend, on the lapels of more than 250 college basketball coaches around the country, you'll notice a pin. The pin is blue and in the shape of a puzzle piece. It is intended to raise awareness as well as money for Autism Speaks, the world's leading science and advocacy organization for autism.

For most coaches, it's a nice little thing to be able to do without all that much effort: Wear a pin, raise some money, speak about the importance of autism awareness, hope it gets a few people talking about America's fastest-growing behavioral disorder, do something good for the world. On to the next thing.

But for Pat Skerry, the head coach at Towson University in Maryland, and Tom Herrion, an assistant at Georgia Tech and former head coach at College of Charleston and Marshall, that little pin is about much more.

It's about the life they live every day having a son with autism.

Herrion's only child, Robert, seemed developmentally behind with his speech as a toddler. At first, doctors thought he just had delayed development. Nothing to worry about. But Herrion and his wife weren't comfortable with that diagnosis. Robert, who is 10 now, later was diagnosed as being on the autism spectrum as a toddler, and that's a key point Herrion wants people to know: Early intervention is a key.

“None of us are prepared for that,” Herrion said. “When you’re told your son has a disorder or in some other instances a disease or a handicap of some sort, so much goes through your mind. All of us want our children to live the proverbial perfect life. You get that news, and it’s a punch to the gut. But then you regroup and put another game plan in motion.”



Skerry can remember when his younger son, Owen, was 18 months old. Just like Herrion, Skerry and his wife knew things were developmentally behind with their son. Skerry thought it was his hearing. They needed to get his ears checked. His wife pushed the family to look deeper.

“It was a sense of relief for my wife, like she expected it, and then we had to get after it and get early intervention,” Skerry said.

And this is the point of this weekend’s college basketball-wide push to get people talking about autism, and why coaches such as Villanova’s Jay Wright, Arizona’s Sean Miller, Duke’s Mike Krzyzewski and Syracuse’s Jim Boeheim will be sporting the Autism Speaks pin: to encourage people to think about and research the behavioral disorder that affects an astounding one in 68 children.

Because one of the keys in helping children with autism is to diagnose it as early as possible. And early diagnosis can help ease the symptoms of a developmental disorder with no cure and no known cause.

Now Owen is 7 years old with a huge smile and a passion for collecting hundreds of DVDs.



“That DVD aisle at Target is like Disneyland for him,” Skerry said. His tantrums have abated. Now he can sit still in a classroom for 30 minutes at a time. Speech therapy in Baltimore County schools has helped him become more talkative. Sticking to a routine is vitally important to him.

“He’s one of the most energetic, enthusiastic young men,” Skerry said of his son. “He has some weaknesses and deficiencies. He has some social inhibitions. He’s not a great communicator with kids his own age. If you watched him you’d wonder, is there something wrong with him?”

The relationship between Skerry and Herrion is unique in all of college hoops. The two knew each other growing up in Massachusetts. They were in college at the same time -- Herrion at Merrimack and Skerry at Tufts. They coach at summer basketball camps together. When Herrion got the College of Charleston job, he hired Skerry as his assistant. They are best of friends, and so are their wives. And when each of their families got the news of a child having autism, they used each other as shoulders to lean on.

“We talk about it all the time,” Skerry said. “To have a friend in the business that shares something outside of basketball, you don’t have to explain every little thing you’re dealing with.”

And so this is the third year the two coaches have teamed up for the event with Autism Speaks. It’s about awareness for autism but also awareness for the struggles of families who have autistic children. Some health insurance plans don’t pay for autism treatment. Getting good services can cost a family some \$60,000 a year.

And so little blue pins on the lapels of a couple hundred suits of college basketball coaches this weekend may not seem like much to you. But it’s huge for these two coaches.

“It’s an awareness game, but what I hope we can really stir up as the awareness grows is that it becomes an acceptance game,” Skerry said. “Autism is here. There’s many people on the spectrum that provide great things in society. Being accepting of people with autism is really, really important. It’s not a team we necessarily asked to be on, but we’re on the team now.”

# Adala Moto impresses Towson teammates with his work ethic, makes immediate impact

**T**his past summer, Arnaud William Adala Moto hit the courts often in anticipation of his redshirt junior campaign for the Towson men's basketball team. But rather than just playing H-O-R-S-E or lazily taking shots, Adala Moto carried a notebook with a written plan for each trip.

One day, the goal was to sink 80 of 100 free throws. The next day, the forward tried to make 70 of 100 3-pointers.



Adala Moto hasn't needed the notebook much since the season began. But the Cameroon native's determination to improve his game has remained unchanged.

"Before practice, depending on who we're playing and if we're expecting to see a zone, I'm putting an emphasis on stuff like floaters or finishing around the basket or driving," Adala Moto said after Tuesday's practice. "That's the little stuff. For shooting free throws, I want to make sure that my footwork is right. It's those tiny details."

Adala Moto's work ethic has made a favorable impression with teammates like junior forward John Davis, who is no slouch in the practice department.

"I know some guys like me, I may go to the gym and work on my game and know what I need to work on," he said. "But he comes to the gym and says, 'I need to do 100 of this and 100 of that.' He has it written down in his book. So it's just amazing to me to see how he's so organized and what he wants to do to fine-tune his game. He already knows what he has to do. ... He's definitely a blessing for me because he motivates me to do more."

Adala Moto, who prefers to be called William, is slated to make his 16th start in 17 games when the Tigers (11-5 overall and 2-1 in the Colonial Athletic Association) travel to James Madison (11-5, 1-2) on Saturday.

After transferring from Wake Forest, Adala Moto has made an immediate impact in his first year at Towson. He leads the team in rebounding (7.3 per game), is tied with senior forward Timajh Parker-Rivera for the team lead in steals (16 each), and ranks second in scoring (14.2 per game). He has scored 10 points or more in 11 straight contests and has been a boon for coach Pat Skerry.

"He is the hardest worker I've ever been around," Skerry said. "It's almost like you've got to shut him down sometimes. He wants to be back in the gym. He's the first guy at shoot-arounds, first guy in film, first guy on the practice court. He's a really good teammate."

Adala Moto played in 64 games and started in 30 in his first two years with the Demon Deacons, but chose to transfer after the 2013-14 campaign for a chance to play in the NCAA tournament.

After considering George Washington and Davidson, Adala Moto settled on the Tigers after watching how Jerrelle Benimon blossomed in two seasons since moving from Georgetown.

The 6-foot-6, 246-pound Adala Moto and 6-8, 245-pound Benimon — who is playing in the Chinese Basketball Association — have similar builds, but Skerry said they have their differences. Skerry said he specifically wants Adala Moto to seize control of games as Benimon did for Towson.



"We want him to physically assert himself a little more consistently," Skerry said. "When he carries the ball in transition and attacks the rim with crisp decisions, he's really difficult [to stop]. He's athletic and strong and good at getting to the foul line. I think once in a while, when he experiments or gets cute with a move, then there's mixed results. But he's a difference guy. He's got great talent, and we want to give him the ball in different positions on the floor and let him make plays. When he does that, other guys feed off of him."

Adala Moto, who doesn't mind the comparisons to Benimon, agreed with his coach and said he's trying to strike a balance between looking for his shot and keeping his teammates involved.

"I try to do whatever I can to help the team win," he said. "I don't care if that's scoring, rebounding, guarding. That's why I'm here, try to help the team win and do everything I can. I just try to be a versatile player."

For a player of his size, Adala Moto is surprisingly adept at handling the ball. In Thursday night's 76-60 thumping of UNC-Wilmington, the Tigers used Adala Moto to dribble the ball and break the Seahawks' vaunted full-court press. Adala Moto led all scorers with 20 points on a career-high 13 free throws in 14 attempts and grabbed eight rebounds, and UNCW coach Kevin Keatts said Adala Moto's versatility makes him a valuable asset.

"He's a great pick-up for Pat," Keatts said. "He's a mismatch problem because you can play him at the 3, you can play him at the 4. He's physical, and the tough thing about [Adala] Moto is, he makes his free throws."

Like any collegiate player, Adala Moto, who is majoring in economics, harbors dreams of playing basketball professionally. But he said he isn't looking at anything beyond what he can do to help the Tigers reach the NCAA tournament for the first time since 1991.

"Right now, the ultimate goal is to win the CAA," he said. "That's why I transferred here to Towson. I want to win the CAA and go to the NCAA tournament. After that, whether I play overseas or in the NBA or in the D-League, I don't really know."

# Year Round Commitment to Basketball Paying Dividends for Towson's Byron Hawkins

Maryland's Prince George's County, like much of the Washington D.C. area, produces some of the best talent in college basketball. Most of that talent has come through one of the region's many esteemed AAU Basketball Programs. One in particular, the highly regarded DC Assault, has produced players who are attending colleges across the country -- including Towson guard Byron Hawkins.

After arriving at Towson as a freshman during a rebuilding season in 2014-15, Hawkins has emerged this season as the lynchpin in the Tigers' offense. The 6-foot-1, 175-pound sophomore point guard said the style in which he plays the game is largely due to his background as a Prince George's County native.

"Most P.G. County players are pretty versatile," Hawkins said. "They can shoot it and drive it, or they can dribble and shoot. When you talk about New York guard(s), most New York guards can dribble extremely well, but they can't shoot. I feel like the P.G. County and [D.C., Maryland and Virginia] type of kids are pretty versatile and can do it all, and some have great fundamentals. ... That's still what I'm trying to achieve and trying to perfect, but I feel like that's my game."

The starting five on the 2013-14 Assault team all went on to play for Division I programs. In addition to Hawkins, guard Melo Trimble (Maryland), forwards Donte Grantham (Clemson) and Rashard Kelly (Wichita State) and center Chinanu Onuaku (Louisville) are all making contributions to their respective teams.

As is the case with many elite AAU programs, these results came at the cost of a year-round commitment from their players. Counting tournament play, practices and camps, many AAU players in the region do not see much of an offseason.



Hawkins said that since his aspirations to play basketball at an elite level began at 10, he hasn't known another way to play the game.

"You give up your whole summer," Hawkins said. "You get August, maybe a couple days in August to yourself. Other than that, you're traveling; you're in tournaments. It's pretty much the same [in college] now. You're here during the summer working out the whole time. You get about 20 days in August, but that's the sacrifice you have to be willing to make to really want to be good at this game. It all pays off in the end somehow, some way. Whether it be in basketball or your job, you really [have to] have the discipline to stay focused on something."

Some younger players can be overwhelmed by the busy schedule such a commitment demands.

"There's always going to be a lull through all of that," Hawkins said. "You're just going and going. Eventually, you're going to have a moment when you feel like you can't go anymore."

For Hawkins, he almost reached that moment when he first arrived at Towson for summer school shortly after graduating from Clinton Christian. But he said he was able to avoid burnout with help from his teammates and his mother, who provided emotional support.

Towson head coach Pat Skerry said Hawkins arrived under a less-than-ideal circumstance, as a talented player with a great work ethic, but not much of a supporting cast. Towson graduated four starters in 2014, right before Hawkins arrived.

"I believe that point guard is the hardest position on the floor," Skerry said. "He kind of got thrown into a difficult situation. It was a young team. He didn't have great veteran leadership around him. So his numbers were pretty good, but with mixed results. Now, he's doing a great job of not turning it over, and obviously his shooting percentage has gone up, which, to me, is because he's taking good shots."

During the 2014-15 season, Hawkins shot 33.8 percent from the floor and averaged 7.3 points per game. He was also one of two players on the team with a positive assist-to-turnover ratio at plus-1.11.

Through the first 16 games this season, the sophomore guard has made 43.2 percent of his field goals and is averaging a team-high 14.4 points per game to go along with a plus-1.7 assist-to-turnover ratio.

Aside from Hawkins' improved offensive output, Skerry said he wanted to see the guard develop more physical strength during the offseason. Hawkins quickly answered. As he has done since the age of 10, Hawkins began his offseason shortly after the 2014-15 season ended.

"Right after we lost in the playoffs, I was back in the gym," Hawkins said. "I always stay consistent, stay in the gym, and I was really working on my body. I feel stronger out there, more confident definitely."



## Timajh Parker-Rivera: A legacy of winning

His numbers might not jump out when you look at a box score, but there is no denying that Timajh Parker-Rivera's impact on a game is as big as anybody else's out on the floor. The 6-foot-7, 215-pound senior forward was Towson head coach Pat Skerry's first four-year recruit and he's achieved success like very few who have ever put the team's uniform on.

With 14 regular season games and a postseason remaining Parker-Rivera has a chance to become the winningest Division I player in Towson history. He is also about to be the most played player and will finish high up on the list in games started.

Ten wins is what Parker-Rivera needs to have more victories than any other player since it moved up to Division I in 1979. He's also only four games away from playing more than anybody else and his 83 career starts is eighth all-time. And it does not quite matter to him what he is asked to do out on the court, as long as his team is winning.

"I think it comes from me just wanting the best for us as a team," Parker-Rivera said. "When you give [what's best for the team over what's best for your stats] it's easier for your team to win... I'm fine with taking a back role as far as personal stats and all of the glorifications. As long as we're winning I'm happy."

Parker-Rivera does the dirty-work. He won't appear anywhere near the top of the all-time scoring lists, but he's ninth all-time with 575 rebounds and seventh with 110 blocks. He can keep opposing teams out of the paint with his defense, cut their



possessions short or extend his own team's possession with his rebounding and find the open man with his vision and passing from the inside out.

"A lot of his contributions don't always show up in stat sheets, but he's kind of a model teammate," Skerry said. "He does what he's supposed to do. He gives you defense and rebounding and energy... When he plays well the guys feed off his success."

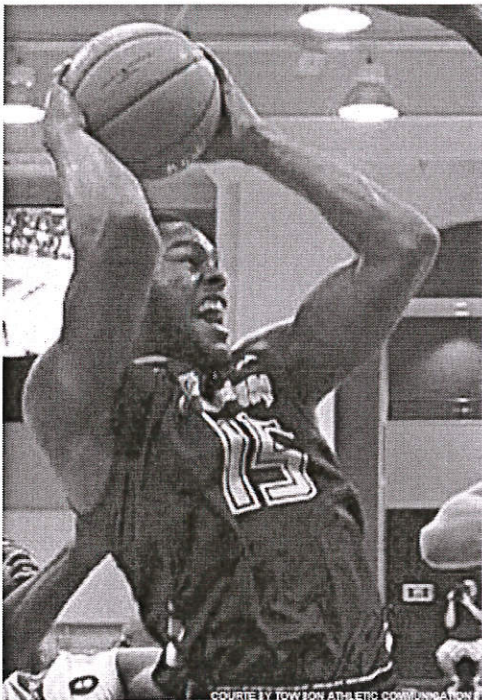
It's almost a thankless job, but Skerry described Parker-Rivera as a tone-setter and somebody who does "a great job of leading by example." Parker-Rivera said that he feels that when he is giving it his the guy who is spelling him off the bench knows that if they don't match what he is doing then they will have a short period of time before Skerry makes another substitution.

"It's my role to rebound and give energy and give everything I can even if it's not scoring," Parker-Rivera said. "If I rebound, the person who is coming in for me is thinking they have to rebound to stay on the court."

Skerry said that now in Parker-Rivera's senior year he often talks about him leaving a legacy; bringing up the number of wins in a career by a player, possibly winning a CAA title and going to the NCAA tournament.

Midway through his senior season, Parker-Rivera has won 66 games. The most any player has ever won is 75, achieved by five players – Tom Caldwell, Matt Campbell, John James, Patrick Manning and Andrew Mason – who played from 1990 to 1994. Parker-Rivera is also a part of the greatest turnaround in NCAA history.

Parker-Rivera was winning a Connecticut High School State Championship with St. Joseph in Milford, CT in the spring of 2011. Towson was finishing a miserable 1-31 season; their worst in program history.

As the No. 2 ranked high school basketball recruit in Connecticut, Parker-Rivera had some options of where he go to college to play basketball. But Skerry was persistent recruit him. Parker-Rivera remembers Skerry and his assistants continuing to come out to see him, sitting down in his home with his mother and talking to them at the dinner table. He said all of those interactions "made me feel welcome." And combined with Towson breaking ground on SECU Arena and the program coming off a rough season, he saw the "opportunity for me to build something for myself."

"I could have went to another school or 'bigger school' but people already left their stamps there," Parker-Rivera said. "But Towson needed something new and something fresh."



He was part of that something new and something fresh. In his first year Parker-Rivera was one of the first guys off the bench, playing in all 31 games and averaging 15.3 minutes per contest. He finished third on the team with a 44.6-percent field goal percentage and was third in rebounding and blocks per minute; a very productive freshman campaign for his role.

That year, Towson went 18-13 and the 17.5-game turnaround was the biggest in NCAA history, surpassing the 17-game turnarounds completed by Mercer (2002-03) and UTEP (2003-04). Their 13-5 conference record was second in the CAA, just one game behind regular season-winner Northeastern.

"I didn't know how many [wins] we needed for the biggest turnaround, but I knew once we started gelling we had a chance to be pretty good," Parker-Rivera said. "It meant a lot for us to perform well that year. It was definitely a good experience and a good start for where this program his going."

That first year Parker-Rivera learned what it took to compete having to compete in practice against Jerrelle Benimon, who played a season in the NBA D-League and even saw time with the Utah Jazz in 2015; and against 6-foot-9, 245-pound center Bilal Dixon, who started for Big East member Providence before transferring to Towson.

"Every day I had to play against them in practice and work hard to get on the court," Parker-Rivera said. "You have to give 110-percent every time and it's a hard thing to do. I work hard in everything I do on and off the court."

The next season, after Dixon's graduation, Parker-Rivera was put in the starting lineup, starting all 36 games, made 53.6-percent of his shots from the floor, was second on the team in rebounds, tied for the lead in blocks and the team won a Division I program-record 25 games. Their 25-11 record and 13-3 conference record again finished second in the CAA.

With the loss of four key seniors from the 2013-14 season, Towson took a slight step back last year to a 12-20 season last year, but this year, with Parker-Rivera entrenched in a leadership role as the only fourth-year senior, who has a ton of game experience in a Towson uniform and has proven he knows what it takes to be a part of a winning program, the Tigers already have 11 wins with two months to go and are right in the mix with the top teams in the conference.

And as long as he keeping rebounding and defending, he has a great chance to add onto his legacy and become a champion and the winningest player in the program's Division I history.

"It would mean a lot to go out as the winningest player in Towson history and leave my stamp on this program," he said. "This program is me. It built me and raised me."



# Mike Morsell Emerging As Towson's 'Closer'

During the 2014-15 season, the Towson University men's basketball team lost 20 of 32 games. While it's easy to call any losing campaign a "rebuilding year," that title only makes sense when the needs of the program are addressed.

A component missing from the Tigers' roster was a closer -- somebody who could take over the offense late during close games -- as 11 of the Tigers' 20 losses last season were decided by five points or fewer.

Towson sophomore shooting guard Mike Morsell finds that role to be quite doable. During the 2015-16 season, Morsell has consistently been one of the Tigers' top offensive threats. In a game against Colonial Athletic Association rival Delaware Jan. 30, Morsell hit a late 3-pointer in what proved to be the decisive blow during the Tigers' 101-97 overtime win.

Head coach Pat Skerry said Morsell's emergence as a clutch shooter was something the coaching staff knew would help replace one of the many roles former Towson star Jerrelle Benimon played from 2012-14.

"He's a guy we expect big things from," Skerry said of Morsell. "We rode him the last dozen games of the year last year. He's had good games this year, and now he's starting to play at a more consistent level. ... You got to have a couple of closers that win you games. We weren't



good last year -- we couldn't close games. Two years ago, we had this guy named Benimon who closed a lot of games for us."

The win against Delaware capped a strong seven-day stretch for the Tigers, when they recorded three of their six wins in January. In those three victories, Morsell averaged 18.3 points while the Tigers won by an average margin of six points.

"He had a good week, and I've always been excited about Mike," Skerry said. "He's a confident kid. He plays with great energy. He plays both ends of the floor for us. He's made big shots. He'll take big shots. I think that's closer to what we expected coming into the season -- certainly if he's that consistent moving down the stretch."

"I think, in this league, you got to have a couple of closers, one or two closers to help you get over the hump, because everybody's so good in the guts of a game."

Morsell embraces the closer role after contributing during the latter part of his freshman year in 2014-15. Last season, Morsell scored in double figures in three of the team's final four games.

During the overtime period against Delaware, Morsell scored nine of the Tigers' 18 points.

"I wanted the ball at the end of the game," Morsell said. "Last year, I made a lot of big shots down the stretch, and that's kind of my role right now, to make big plays and make big shots at the end of the game. Against Delaware, I hit a few big shots, a couple threes down the stretch."

As a sophomore, the 6-foot-5, 190-pound Morsell feels there are more opportunities to contribute to the Tigers' offense as a bigger guard.

"This offseason, I focused on getting bigger and stronger," Morsell said. "Last year, I was getting pushed around and posted up on a lot. Coach Skerry is really big on rebounding and just being real gritty on the offensive and defensive ends. So you need to be strong and play big."

Skerry said the combination of Morsell's talent and size at such a young age has made him a special type of offensive weapon.

"We think he's arguably our most talented guy," Skerry said. "He's the youngest guy in our program. His body developed a lot this offseason, and he's now 210, 212 pounds and 6-foot-5 at the two-guard with a 71-[inch] reach. He can shoot it, get fouled, get on the glass. He's capable of being good defensively."

Going into the final month of the regular season, Morsell hopes his contributions late in games will once again make him a force during the latter part of Towson's schedule. The difference now? The Tigers entered February in second place in CAA conference standings.

"We're definitely more confident [this year]," Morsell said. "Last year, we didn't really have an identity. Now, this year, we've beat some of the best teams. We really think we can win the whole thing this time."

# Towson men bounce back with 76-60 CAA win over UNC Wilmington

**D**uring the Colonial Athletic Association's first men's basketball coaches conference call of the season Tuesday morning, Towson's Pat Skerry joked that he hadn't suffered a defeat like the one Hofstra administered in Saturday's 90-58 rout since his elementary school days when he challenged an older classmate to a fight.

On Thursday night, it was the Tigers who asserted their will and dominated visiting UNC Wilmington, 76-60, before an announced 1,381 at SECU Arena.



Towson, which improved to 11-5 overall and 2-1 in the CAA, pounded the Seahawks by going to its strengths. The Tigers entered the game leading the conference in rebounding margin (plus-6.8) and rebounds per game (40.9), and controlled the glass against UNCW, 43-25.

The defense, which also entered tops in the league allowing 65.0 points per game, forced the CAA's top offense into season lows in points and shooting percentage (32.8 percent).

"We got back to playing Towson basketball," Skerry said. "We held them to 32 percent shooting and were plus-18 on the glass. That's who we are, and we got back to doing that."

The Tigers converted 48.8 percent (21 of 43) of their shots from the floor, made 29 of 36 free throws (compared to UNCW going 15-for-19 from the foul line) and scored 30 points in the paint. They also had 16 assists, including a game-high five from sophomore shooting guard Mike Morsell, who chipped in 17 points and a game-best nine rebounds.

"We're sharing the ball well," said sophomore point guard Byron Hawkins, who finished with 16 points, six rebounds and three assists. "We're finding the open man on the back side. ... We were finishing. So that's just great."

Redshirt junior forward Arnaud William Adala Moto led all scorers with 20 points with the bulk coming on a career-high 13 free throws in 14 attempts. Adala Moto, who also collected eight rebounds, said he wanted to take advantage of UNCW's tendency to foul.

"We just had to take care of the ball and be aggressive going to the rim," he said. "So I was just really going to attack the rim and finish strong and make my free throws."

Motivated by Saturday's 32-point loss, the Tigers opened the game hot, scoring eight of the contest's first 10 points.

After a jumper by redshirt junior guard Denzel Ingram snapped a 3-minute, 42-second drought for UNCW, Towson embarked on a 12-2 run to enjoy its largest advantage of the first half — 20-6 with 11:12 left.

The closest the Seahawks got was within eight points after a pair of free throws by redshirt junior guard Chris Flemmings trimmed their deficit to 30-22. But the Tigers responded with six consecutive points for a 36-25 lead at halftime.

Midway through the second half, UNCW made a charge to narrow the gap to 54-49 after a three-point play from redshirt junior center C.J. Gettys. But Towson scored the next six points and was never seriously threatened thereafter.



Ingram paced the Seahawks (9-5, 1-2) with 18 points, while Flemmings and freshman guard C.J. Bryce contributed 10 points each.

But UNCW was unable to establish its traditional full-court press because the players missed so many shots from the floor, coach Kevin Keatts said.

"I thought they did a good job of clogging driving lanes, but I think we missed a lot of shots," he said. "We got a lot of shots early that just didn't go for us and rimmed out. Not to take away from Towson's defense because they're obviously the best defensive team in our league as far as getting stops. But I thought we were equally as bad missing open shots as they were defending them."

**Notes:** With Hofstra's 72-61 loss at the College of Charleston, the Tigers are tied with the Pride, Charleston, William & Mary and Elon for second place in the CAA. Northeastern is the only undefeated team in the conference with a 3-0 mark. ... Towson's win snapped a three-game losing streak to UNCW and a five-game skid at home against league opponents. ... Adala Moto has scored 12 points or more in each of his past 11 contests.

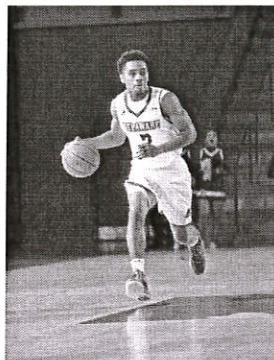


# Towson takes charge late, hands Hens 8th straight loss

NEWARK - Delaware successfully battled to stay in the basketball game Thursday night at the Carpenter Center.

It was winning that proved too difficult for the Blue Hens.

Up three with just under five minutes left, Delaware couldn't finish the task as Towson took charge late for a 79-77 Colonial Athletic Association victory in front of 1,727.

"We were so close," Delaware senior forward Marvin King-Davis said after the Hens' eighth straight defeat. " . . . We missed too many free throws. Too many offensive rebounds [by Towson] and turnovers at the wrong time."

The Tigers answered King-Davis' basket that inched the Hens ahead 62-59 with Mike Morsell's 3-pointer. When Cazmon Hayes drilled a jumper to make Delaware's lead 64-62, Morsell drained another 3-pointer to

give Towson a lead it never relinquished.

Towson scored on 11 of 12 possessions and made enough free throws while building an eight-point lead. Even Kory Holden's desperation heave from well past halfcourt at the buzzer couldn't save Delaware (5-11 overall, 0-5 CAA). The Hens hadn't even led in the second half of their last six games.

Delaware is just one of two CAA teams with a losing record (Drexel is the other) and is the only one without a league victory.

Holden poured in 29 points and King-Davis posted his eighth double-double with 19 points and 11 rebounds. Hayes had 14 points, including 12 in the first half, and Anthony Mosley scored 11.

"It's almost impossible to play a perfect game but we kind of gotta play a perfect game," said Holden.

The CAA's worst-shooting team at 38.9 percent coming in, Delaware was 28-for-61 (45.9 percent) from the field and shot 50 percent in the second half.

"That's monumental for us," coach Monte Ross said.

But that couldn't overcome poor free-throwing shooting – 16-for-27 (59.3 percent). Junior forward Maurice Jeffers continued to struggle, going 1-for-7 from the floor and 2-for-8 at the line.

Delaware also got zero points from its bench and was outrebounded 48-40 by Towson, which had a CAA-best plus-7.2 rebound margin entering the game.

"Our margin for error is very, very slim," Ross said.

Towson improved to 12-6, 3-2.

Wake Forest transfer William Adala Moto had 22 points and 15 rebounds for the Tigers and guard John Davis also scored 22.

Fatigue likely played a part in Delaware's inability to close it out. The Hens have just six recruited scholarship players and they were the only ones who played until walk-ons Curtis McRoy and Sean Locke saw last-minute action.

The back-and-forth game featured 11 ties and 20 lead changes. Towson led 34-33 at halftime.

"We played tough," King-Davis said. "We were more fluid on offense. I feel like we shot a little better tonight. We got to the cup a little better tonight."

# Exposure to others' struggle has lasting impact on Towson's Walter Foster

Towson men's basketball coach Pat Skerry is proud of how Walter Foster has grown during his time with the Tigers.

It is not just that the junior forward has become a formidable defensive presence, which he certainly has. Skerry also sees a young man who demonstrates increased maturation when it comes to keeping a lid on his feelings on the court while making strides in his pursuits off it.

"I think Walt is so much more in control of his emotions," said Skerry, in his fifth season at Towson. "He just understands the game better, and his academics are better. That is the fun part about coaching, seeing guys grow and develop."

Foster's mother, Agetsha, certainly has had a hand in her only son's — Foster has two sisters — development. Growing up in Atlanta he could see how his father, also named Walter, struggled with substance abuse.



Instead of shielding her son from the realities associated with addiction, Agetsha made it a point to make sure he developed an education and appreciation for what the elder Walter, and many others, deal with. That meant being part of a captive audience as men and women shared their struggles at a local Salvation Army.

"My father, unfortunately, (struggled with substance abuse) when I was growing up," said Foster. "My mother sometimes made me sit in on meetings and listen to what people had to say and why some of them went toward drugs, left their families and stuff like that."

Foster said he has a nice relationship with his father, currently living with Walter's grandfather, and visits him when he is back in Atlanta.

It has been through organizations such as the Salvation Army and Special Olympics that Foster has been able to help the less fortunate. He spent part of his Christmas break distributing gifts to underprivileged children, which was an especially gratifying experience.

"It is a really nice feeling helping people out," he said. "It makes me feel very good to do something like that for kids and I know how much of an impact it can have on them."

Foster has had quite an impact on the court this season. Averaging about 23 minutes per game the Tigers' sixth man headed into Thursday's game at College of Charleston registering 6.5 points and 5.8 rebounds while pacing the CAA in blocked shots with 1.8.

The 6-8, 235-pound Foster has been a shot-blocking machine of late. He established a career high with seven blocks against visiting Drexel on Jan. 16, the third-most in team history. That effort eclipsed his previous career high of five, which he accomplished twice including the previous game at Delaware.

"My teammates are great at setting up other players for me to get a block on the weak side," said Foster, who averaged 0.9 blocks last season. "I like defense more than offense. I would rather block a shot than get a bucket because it gives my team extra energy."

Between his defensive prowess and upbeat demeanor Foster is creating plenty of positive energy for Towson. It has not always been that way, however. He often easily got upset at his teammates or otherwise displayed his emotions when things were not going well.

"I would say maturity is the biggest thing," he said when asked about the difference from a year ago. "Last year I used to get mad at my teammates and I did not know how to talk to them when I was angry. This year I feel like I am better at talking to them about things that I think they should be doing on the

court."

That change for the better plays into his experience in the classroom. A communications major, Foster has learned not only to better present himself when speaking to others, whether it is his fellow Tigers or anybody else, but also how non-verbal communication can sometimes be deafening.

"My classes are very interesting and I have learned a lot," said the aspiring real estate agent. "Even if it is non-verbal communication you have to be able to read people and get involved with people, so I have been working on that. On the basketball court I try to be a leader as far as showing people what to do. I feel that I still need to work at talking to others and making sure that everybody is doing what they are supposed to do."

On and off the court Foster seems to have developed a sense with what he is supposed to do.

"He has really grown up a lot since he has been here and I am proud of him for that," said Skerry.
