THE FAST BREAK

- ▶ The Tigers open their 15th appearance in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) Tournament with today's contest against No. 7 William & Mary.
- ▶ This will be the fifth time the Tigers open the tournament as the 10th seed.
- ▶ It is the first time the Tigers and the Tribe are facing off in CAA Tournament action.
- ▶ Junior guard **Raven Bankston** finished the regular season ranked second in the CAA in points per game (15.4) and steals per game (2.4).
- ▶ Freshman forward **Brittany Tarr** has made the most

of her opportunities since being inserted into the starting line-up. After just missing a double-double on Wednesday, Tarr is now averaging 10.2 points and 8.0 rebounds per game in her last five contests.

- ▶ Towson has 251 steals this season. It is the most steals by a Tiger squad since the 2010-11 team had 288 swipes.
- ▶ Today's game will match the top two teams in the CAA for steals per game against each other.
- ▶ Bankston is 104-of-125 from the charity stripe this season. It marks the fifth straight year that the Tigers have a player with at least 100 made free throws.

SCOUTING THE TRIBE

- The Tribe enter the CAA Tournament having lost two straight following a 74-64 defeat to Elon last Wednesday. **Marlena Tremba** led William & Mary with a game-high 25 points in that contest.
- On the season, William & Mary is paced by **Alexandra Masaquel** who is averaging 13.7 points and 7.4 rebounds per game.
- Tremba is second to Masaquel while averaging 13.4 points per game. She has also knocked down a team-high 61 three-pointers.
- **Jenna Green** pilots the offense and has dished out 113 assists.

SERIES HISTORY

- Towson gets its third look of the season at William & Mary today.
- It will be the 29th meeting all-time between the Tigers and the Tribe.
- William & Mary holds a 17-11 edge in the series and has won three straight following a 78-65 win when the two squads met at the end of February in Williamsburg.
- **Alexandra Masaquel** led the Tribe with 28 points in that game while **Brittany Tarr** had a career-high 21 points for the Tigers.

IN THE CAA TOURNAMENT

- This is the Tigers' 15th appearance in the CAA Tournament.
- It will be Towson's fifth time as the 10th seed for the CAA postseason action (5th-2, 6th-1, 7th-3, 8th-2, 9th-1, 10th-5, 11th-1).
- The last time the Tigers were the 10th seed was the 2005-06 season. That year, the tournament was hosted by George Mason and the Tigers fell to No. 7 Drexel, 61-46.

TARR TIME

- Towson freshman forward **Brittany Tarr** has made the most of her opportunities especially since being inserted in the starting line-up on Feb. 14 against College of Charleston.
- Tarr finished with nine points and nine rebounds in the regular season finale against Drexel.
- In the five games she has started this season, Tarr is averaging 10.2 points per game while shooting 43.1% from the field. She has also pulled down a team-best 8.0 rebounds per game during that stretch and has added eight blocks.

SWIPE SHOW

- Players in today's game will want to keep a firm grip on the ball as the top two teams in the CAA for steals per game meet.
- William & Mary enters the tournament averaging a league best 9.5 steals per game while Towson is second while averaging 8.7 steals per game.
- In two meetings this season, the two squads combined for 42 steals (Towson-20, Tribe-22).
- William & Mary has four players ranked in the top 13 for steals per game. That group is led by **Bianca Boggs** (1.9 spg), who ranks third in the league.
- The Tigers have two players ranked among the top players in the league. That duo is led by junior guard **Raven Bankston** who is second in the league while averaging 2.4 steals per game.

LENDING A HELPING HAND

- The Tigers did a good job of distributing the basketball against Northeastern on Feb. 28.
- Towson had 16 assists on 26 made baskets in that game.
- Leading the charge was redshirt sophomore guard **Raine Bankston** who had seven assists for the second straight game. Bankston's sister, junior guard **Raven Bankston** and freshman guard **Sianni Martin** each dished out three assists in the contest.
- On the season, the Tigers have six players with 10 or more assists and three of those players have 50 or more. Raine Bankston has 64 assists while senior guard **Dominique Johnson** has 60 helpers.

I'LL TAKE THAT

- The Tigers recorded eight steals in the regular season finale against Drexel.
- Five Tigers posted at least one steal in the game as junior guard **Raven Bankston** led the way with three steals.
- It was the 20th time this season the Tigers have recorded more steals than their opponent in a game.
- The Tigers' 251 steals are the most by a Tiger squad since the 2010-11 team had 288 swipes.
- Eight Tigers have recorded 10 or more steals this season. Bankston leads the team with 69 steals.

MAKING HISTORY

- Towson senior guard **Dominique Johnson** reached career milestones in three separate categories in mid-January.
- Johnson's three-pointer with 8:23 to go in the fourth quarter against Elon gave her 35 triples this season.
- It also raised her career total to 191 three-pointers made. That broke **Mia Chapman's** (1999-03) school record of 190 career three-pointers.
- Johnson also dished out a team-high four assists against Elon on Jan. 15.
- That raised her season-total to 39 helpers and her career total to 300 career assists.
- Johnson is the 10th player in program history to record 300 career assists.
- In addition, at Delaware on Jan. 17, Johnson played in the 100th game of her career.

THE BIG 1-0-0-0

- Towson fans saw the second Tiger player of the season record their 1,000th career point.
- Junior guard **Raven Bankston** hit a pair of free throws with 46 seconds to play in the Jan. 15 game against Elon which gave her 1,000 points for her career. Bankston reached the 1,000th career point mark in just 53 career games.
- Senior **Dominique Johnson** recorded her 1,000th career point with her jumper with 3:47 left in the first quarter at North Florida.
- She became the 16th member of the 1,000 career point club at Towson.

The Tigers had beaten the Engineers in both previous regular season meetings ... Shawn Steward led all scorers with 22 points, making 8 of 21 shots and nailing all six free throw attempts ... Lehigh held the Tigers to 34 percent shooting in the first half while hitting 23 of 31 free throw attempts ... Cindy Phillips led the Tigers with 16 points while Denise Marrara added 17 points and eight rebounds.

1984 East Coast Conference Tournament Quarterfinals at Rider

The Tigers defeated host Rider by 79-55 in the quarterfinal round of the ECC Tournament with strong efforts from Cindy Phillips and Norma Kelly ... The Tigers never trailed in the game and forced 22 Rider turnovers ... Phillips led all scorers with 25 points, including a perfect 11-for-11 from the free throw line ... Kelly added 22 points and led the Tigers with 11 rebounds ... Rider had four players score in double figures while Towson had a 45-28 rebounding advantage.

1984 East Coast Conference Tournament Semifinals at Rider

Cindy Phillips scored a game-high 26 points as the Tigers advanced to the ECC Championship Game with a 59-53 victory over American ... Phillips scored 20 of her 26 points in the second half as the Tigers overcame a four-point deficit in the second period ... With their 18th victory of the season, the Tigers set a new school record for wins in a single season.

1984 East Coast Conference Tournament Championship at Rider

Cindy Phillips hit a pair of free throws with 10 seconds remaining as the Tigers won their first ECC Championship with a 61-58 come-from-behind victory over Delaware in the ECC Championship Game at Rider ... Phillips, who was named as the Tournament's Most Valuable Player, scored 11 points, including a seven-for-eight effort from the foul line ... Denise Marrara led the Tigers with 11 rebounds as Towson held a 44-39 rebounding advantage over the Blue Hens.

1985 East Coast Conference Tournament Quarterfinals at Towson

Julie Atkinson scored a season-high 17 points as the defending ECC champion Tigers beat Drexel by 72-65 to advance to the ECC semifinals ... The Tigers led by a 24-18 margin with 9:08 remaining in the first half before the Dragons scored eight straight points to take a 26-24 lead with 4:17 remaining in the period ... Trailing by 33-31 at the start of the second half, the Tigers rallied to regain the lead on a lay-up by Michele Whitt and led by as many as 12 in the second half ... The Tigers outrebounded Drexel by a 58-39 margin despite committing 22 turnovers.

1985 East Coast Conference Tournament Semifinals at Towson

Led by 20 points from Stacey Cangenello, Lafayette ended Towson's reign as the ECC champions with a 71-61 victory over the Tigers at the Towson Center ... Cangenello also had five steals in the victory ... Ruth Ann Holter led the Tigers in the loss with 19 points.

1986 East Coast Conference Tournament Quarterfinals at Rider

Despite a tournament-record 35 points from Debbie Oraczewski, the Tigers were eliminated from the ECC Tournament with an 84-79 quarterfinal loss to Rider ... Oraczewski made 14 of 25 shots from the floor to break the previous single-game mark of 31 points ... However, Rider countered by having all five starters score in double figures ... 2000 AMERICA EAST Tournament First Round at Vermont

For the second straight year, the Tigers faced Boston University in the opening round of the AMERICA EAST Tournament ... However, the Terriers overcame a 17-point half-time deficit to upset the seventh-seeded Tigers by an 84-69 margin to record the first-ever win by a #10 seed in tournament history ... Led by 18 first-half points from Shniece Perry and a pressure defense which forced 15 Terrier turnovers, the Tigers led by 49-32 after the first half ... Niki Reid Geckeler will bring a youthful, energetic squad, who will look for continued improvement, into her third season on the Tiger bench.

Reid Geckeler and the Tigers continued to battle and improved throughout the 2014-15 season. During Reid Geckeler's tutelage, LaTorri Hines-Allen finished second in the Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) in scoring and rebounding while earning first team All-CAA honors. Hines-Allen led the CAA with 14 double-doubles under Reid Geckeler's watch. In addition, Breonn Hughey earned CAA All-Rookie honors after leading the team and finishing fourth in the CAA while averaging 4.4 assists per game.

Reid Geckeler led the Tigers to their first CAA Tournament win since the 2008-09 season. She coached a Tiger squad that set the school record for three-pointers in a single-game (12) and single-season (186).

During the 2013-14 season, Reid Geckeler saw improvement from the Tigers throughout the season. She guided Tanisha McTiller, who finished her career as the second leading scorer in program history to first team All-CAA honors and CAA All-Defensive squad honors. McTiller led the CAA in scoring (19.4 ppg) as a senior. Reid Geckeler also guided forward LaTorri Hines-Allen to second team All-CAA honors. Hines-Allen finished with 14.1 points and 8.4 rebounds per game.

Reid Geckeler, who led Howard University to back-to-back 20-plus-win seasons and three post-season tournament appearances, was named the ninth coach in Towson University women's basketball history in April, 2013.

HEAD COACH NIKI REID GECKELER

Prior to Reid Geckeler's first season with the Bison in 2008-09, Howard won just four games. In 2011-12, Reid Geckeler compiled a 24-9 mark, tying the program's all-time record for wins in a season. She amassed 85 career wins at Howard, including 44 in her final two seasons alone. Under her guidance, the Bison earned their first ever pre-season WNIT berth and went to the post-season WNIT twice (2011, 2012) and the 2013 Women's Basketball Invitational (WBI). Those were the first three postseason bids in program history.

She coached the 2010 Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (MEAC) Rookie of the Year and the 2011 MEAC Player of the Year, Saadia Doyle, as well as three first team all-league honorees. In her final two seasons, two of her players ranked in the top 15 and three ranked in the top 35 in the nation statistically, in points per game, assist/turnover ratio and assists per game. Her teams were in the top 15 in the country in scoring defense in 2012 (14th - 53.0 ppg) and 2013 (sixth - 50.3 ppg).

Reid Geckeler is committed to her student-athletes' academic success as well. At Howard, she had a 100 percent graduation rate and eight student-athletes earned spots on the MEAC All-Academic team. In addition seven players graduated magna cum laude.

Prior to her tenure at Howard, Reid Geckeler served as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Georgetown (1996-2002; 2004-08) and as an assistant and associate head coach at Fordham (1995-96; 2002-04) where she coached a combined 11 conference all-academic team selections and one Rhodes Scholar finalist.

While at Georgetown, she signed the No. 6 recruiting class in the country in 2007-08 - a group that led the Hoyas to three NCAA Tournament berths. She also signed Katrina Wheeler, the first



McDonald's All-American women's basketball player to attend Georgetown. Reid Geckeler guided Rebekkah Brunson, the Big East Rookie of the Year in 2001, who went on to play for the Minnesota Lynx, in the WNBA. Her 1999-2000 recruiting class was also ranked in the top 30. At Fordham, Reid Geckeler signed a top 50 recruiting class in 2003-04.

Reid Geckeler, a 1993 graduate of Georgetown University with a bachelor's degree in psychology, was a four-year starter at point guard for the Hoyas. She served as team captain and led Georgetown to the 1992-93 Big East Conference co-championship and a berth in the NCAA Tournament Sweet Sixteen. Geckeler finished her career as a Hoya ranked in the top 10 for 3-point field goals made, 3-point field-goal percentage, assists and games played.

Reid Geckeler is married to Timothy Geckeler, a former football player at Rutgers, and they have five-year old daughter, MaKenzie.

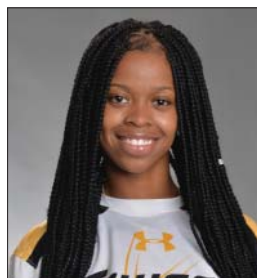

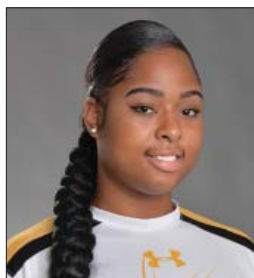
