Interviews after games on the road will be conducted based on the post-game policy of that institution.



Scouting Richmond

The Spiders enter the weekend with an overall record of 3-1 and an 0-1 mark in conference play.

UR is coming off a 38-31 victory over #23 Colgate.

The Spiders put up 475 yards of offense, while holding Colgate to just 251 total yards and 57 yards through the air.

The Spiders possess the league's top passing offense (317.8 ypg), as well as the league's top defense (262.8 ypg).

The contest will match the league's top two passing offenses. The Spiders are averaging 317.8 yards per game through the air, while the Tigers are averaging 254.0 yards through the air.

UR quarterback Kyle Lauletta leads the CAA with 1,271 yards and 10 touchdowns through four games. He has thrown for over 300 yards in three of the four games this season.

Freshman Xavier Goodall leads the rushing attack with 201 yards and two touchdowns. He is taken over the top spot after Gordon Collins was lost to injury.

Wide receiver Brian Brown leads the conference with 27 catches for 460 yards and four touchdowns.

Winston Craig leads the team with four sacks, while Tafon Mainsah has a team-high three interceptions.

Justin Rubin has forced a pair of fumbles on the season.

- ► The Tigers have had success following a bye under Rob Ambrose. The Tigers are 5-2 with an extra week to prepare for an opponent.
- ▶ The Tigers are facing ranked opponents in back-to-back weeks since November 2014.
- ► Senior running back Darius Victor rushed for 115 yards against Villanova. It was his first 100-yard rushing game of the season, and 14th of his career.
- ▶ Victor did not reach the endzone against the Wildcats, ending his streak of scoring a touchdown in six-straight games.
- ► The Tiger defense did not force a turnover for the first time in nine games against Villanova. The last time the Tigers did not have a turnover in a game, they followed it up by returning three turnovers (2 interceptions, 1 fumble) for touchdowns over the next two weeks.
- ▶ Wide receiver Andre Dessenberg caught five passes for a career-best 91 yards against Villanova. His 46 yard reception in the first quarter tied for his longest catch of his career.

Knudson Throws for 300

Quarterback Ellis Knudson came off the bench to throw for 301 yards in the victory over Saint Francis. It marked the first 300-yard passing game for a Tiger since Peter Athens threw for 301 yards against Fordham in the opening round of the 2013 FCS Playoffs.

Fewest Completions With 300 Yards

Quarterback Ellis Knudson completed only 10 passes in throwing for 301 yards. It was the fewest completions ever by a Tiger QB throwing for 300 yards. He is just the second FCS quarterback since Charleston Southern's Brooks Combs in 1998 to throw for over 300 yards on 10 completions.

Ryder Earns CAA Specialist Honor

After averaging 49.4 yards on seven punts, Jake Ryder was named the CAA Specialist of the Week. He started the season with a 68 yard kick down to the five-yard line, and also added kicks of 61 and 50 yards. Three of the punters were downed inside the 20.

Victor Adds to TD Total

Senior running back Darius Victor scored a pair of touchdowns in the season opener to raise his career total to 36. It was also the 19th time in the last 24 games that he has scored at least one touchdown. It is also the ninth multi-touchdown game in his career.

Simpson Sets Return Record

Redshirt freshman kick returner Shane Simpson set a new single-game record with 229 kickoff return yards against USF. He broke the old record of 211 set by Lyrics Klugh in 2015.

The Towson offense ran 90 plays in the season opener against USF. The 90 plays are the most since running a school record 101 plays against Lehigh in 1999.

Ball Control Offense

The Tigers offense controlled the clock against USF. Towson held the ball for 37:40. TU held the ball for at least 8:45 in each of the four quarters.

Wethington Runs Hard

True freshman Deshaun Wethington made the most of his opportunity in his collegiate debut as he rushed five times for 31 yards against South Florida. His 12 yard run to pick up a first down tied for the longest run of the day by a Tiger.

Distance Traveled for Opener

This season marks the furthest trip ever taken by the Tigers to play a season opener. Towson will travel 961.4 miles to Tampa, Florida. This supplants the 723 miles to Evanston, Illinois for the 2009 season opener against Northwestern.

Covering the East Coast

Towson will log some miles up and down the East Coast from its season opener to regular season finale. The Tigers head south to Tampa, Florida for the opener, while closing out the regular season in Kingston, Rhode Island. The difference in mileage from the two places is 1,286.1 miles.

The #VitoExpress will be making stops up and down the East Coast in 2016. The senior will make his next stop in Robins Stadium on Oct. 1.





Head Coach 8th Season • Towson, '93



The 2015 Tigers returned to their winning ways as they put together a four-game winning streak en route to a 7-4 season. The defense carried the way as they recorded the first shutout over Delaware, and put together a streak of seven-straight scoreless quarters.

NCAA FCS National Championship game.

Coming off an NCAA FCS Championship game appearance the year before, the Tigers battled a plethora of injuries during the 2014 season. However, for the second straight year, a Tiger was selected in the NFL Draft. Just one year after running back Terrance West was selected by the Cleveland Browns in the third round, cornerback Tye Smith went in the fifth round of the 2015 NFL Draft to the Seattle Seahawks.

You don't have to look very far back to find Ambrose's impact in the wins and losses column. In 2013, he guided the Tigers to a magical season as Towson reached the NCAA FCS championship game by beating No. 9 Fordham, No. 2 Eastern Illinois and No. 3 Eastern Washington in consecutive weeks. Towson finished the campaign with a 13-3 record; the 13 wins were a school record.

Ranked second in the final NCAA FCS polls, Towson won the Lambert/Meadowlands Award as the top FCS team in the East. The Tigers were also honored as the ECAC FCS Team of the Year.

During the 2012 season, Ambrose led the Tigers to a 7-4 record against an extremely difficult schedule. The Tigers lost to a pair of nationally-ranked FBS programs in Kent State and LSU. But, Towson finished the season with a 6-2 CAA record as the Tigers shared the league title.

In 2011, just his third season as the Tigers' head coach, Ambrose guided Towson to one of the most dramatic turnarounds in college football history. Only one season removed from a 1-10 record, the 2011 team became the "Turnaround Tigers" by going 9-3. Their 7.5-game improvement was the most dramatic improvement in NCAA Division I history.

Towson posted a 9-2 regular season record, beat six nationally-ranked teams and won the CAA championship outright with a 7-1 record



in 2011. The Tigers also made their first appearance in the NCAA FCS playoffs, becoming the first program to earn playoff berths at the Division III, Division II and FCS (I-AA) levels.

Once the season ended, Ambrose was honored as the 2011 CAA Coach of the Year, the AFCA District Coach of the Year and was a finalist for the Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year. In January 2012, he was the recipient of the Eddie Robinson Award as the top coach in FCS football.

The UConn years (2002-08)

Ambrose joined the staff at UConn as the Huskies grew from an NCAA Division I-AA program into a major college contender. During his seven seasons in Storrs, Connecticut, the Huskies were 49-36 with just two losing seasons. UConn made three bowl appearances in five years, debuted in the AP national rankings at 16th, and won a share of the Big East title in 2007.

Joining the staff as the quarterbacks coach, Ambrose played a major role in the development of Dan Orlovsky, the first UConn quarterback to play in the NFL as a fifth-round draft pick by the Detroit Lions. In 2008 as the offensive coordinator, Ambrose coached Donald Brown, an All-American and the 2008 BIG EAST Offensive Player of the Year. Brown led the nation with 2,083 yards on 367 carries and became the first UConn player to be selected in the first round of the NFL draft.

His first head coaching job – Catholic (2001)
Ambrose left Towson after the 2000 season to become the head coach at Catholic University, a Division III program in Washington, D.C. In one year at Catholic, Ambrose led the

Cardinals to a 3-7 record.

As a Tiger assistant (1992-2000)

In nine years as a Tiger assistant, the team went 54-36 with only two losing seasons. Ambrose started as a student-assistant before being promoted to wide receivers coach in 1993, offensive coordinator in 1997 and then to associate head coach in 2000.

He coached four All-Americans in running back Tony Vinson, quarterback Dan Crowley, and wide receivers Mark Orlando and Jamal White. Vinson led the nation in rushing yards (2,016), all-purpose yards (2,073) and points scored (138) in 1993. Vinson went on to be a fifth-round draft pick of the San Diego Chargers. Orlando earned All-America notice by catching 55 passes for 1,223 yards and 12 touchdowns.

In 1999, Towson led the nation in passing yardage, averaging 381.2 passing yards per game.

His collegiate playing career

As a player at Towson, Ambrose started his career as a quarterback but moved to wide receiver as a sophomore. In 1990, he caught four passes for 20 yards. As a junior, he had four catches for 35 yards. Three of those receptions were touchdown passes from Dan Crowley. He caught an 11-yard TD pass at James Madison, a seven-yard TD toss at Liberty and a 14-yard TD pass against Hofstra. An injury in the spring before his senior year forced Ambrose to the sidelines.

The Ambrose family

The Tigers' coach is the son of one of the most successful high school football coaches in Maryland. His father, Tim, was the head coach at Middletown for 31 years and won 249 games, leading the Knights to 14 Monocacy Valley League championships. He retired in 2013, just in time to follow the Tigers' march to the NCAA championship game. The former athletic director at Middletown, he stepped down as football coach after the 2004 season. Coach Ambrose's brother, Jared, was an assistant football coach at Delaware for two years before joining the Tigers' staff. He is currently the program's offensive coordinator.

Ambrose and his wife, Melissa, have two children: Grace and Riley.
