STORY LINES

► Towson will wrap up an eight-game homestand this weekend with its second-straight CAA series at Schuerholz Park, taking on William & Mary from April 26-28 for three contests: 3 p.m. on Friday, 2 p.m. on Saturday and 1 p.m. on Sunday.

► Towson, coming off an 8-7 win over UMBC on Tuesday, has won its last two CAA series over Hofstra and Delaware to tie for fourth place in the league at 5-7, holding an 11-29 overall record. William & Mary, which split in its mid-week games with a win at George Mason and a loss at Richmond, is in eighth place in the CAA, coming into the weekend at 5-10 in-conference and 23-18 overall.

► Since 2015, the series between these two programs have seen W&M win two games and Towson take one, with the Tigers winning the last contest 6-1 on April 8, 2018. Playing nearly every year since 2001, William & Mary leads the all-time series 35-20.

Josh Seils earned his first-ever CAA Pitcher of the Week honor on March 18th. His award came after a stellar start vs. Fordham, picking up the win with eight scoreless innings and six strikeouts.

Stramara Named to NCBWA Stopper of the Year Watch List

Senior Dean Stramara is one of 75 players nationally to be selected to the 2019 NCBWA Stopper of the Year Watch List.

In 2018, he had the best ERA for Towson at 3.94 in 21 appearances, striking out 48 batters in 59.1 innings.

John Schuerholz Headlines First Pitch Dinner

Kicking off the 2019 season, Towson held its second annual First Pitch Dinner on February 2nd, at the Valley Mansion.

John Schuerholz, a Towson alum and member of the Baseball Hall of Fame, was the headline speaker for the event, MCed by Jay Rokeach, the PA announcer for the Miami Hurricanes baseball team. Local media personality Keith Mills held a question and answer session with Richie Palacios and Brady Policelli, former Tigers currently in the minors.

Almost 300 people in total attended the dinner, including Towson President Dr. Kim Schatzel and Athletics Director Tim Leonard.

Towson Predicted to Finish 9th in the CAA Preseason Poll

In the coaches preseason poll, Towson was predicted to finish ninth in the CAA in 2019. Towson got 13 points.

Elon is predicted to finish first with 57 points and four first-place votes, followed by a tie for second between UNC Wilmington and Northeastern.

Freshman Leading the Way

Javon Fields, a true freshman, has proven to be a top tier newcomer, currently leading Towson in several categories including hits (44), doubles (9), triples (4) and stolen bases (13). He had a 14-game bases reached streak snapped on March 30.

Towson is Traveling

The Tigers will be traveling quite a bit in 2019 with games scheduled in 10 different states, primarily up and down the East Coast.

Along with the home state of Maryland, states Towson will have games in this year includes California, Florida, Georgia, New York, North Carolina, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Virginia and West Virginia.

Coaching Staff Intact for 2019

Head coach Matt Tyner, in his second year, returns all assistant coaches for the 2019 season.

Miles Miller is back as the team's pitching coach in his second season, as is hitting coach Tanner Biagini and volunteer assistant Mickey Williard, the infield coach. Eric Franc is back, in his ninth season with the program, as the director of player development.

Two former players, Skyler Morris and Charlie Watters, will serve as student assistants. Three other students will serve in other roles: Isabelle Pardew is the director of baseball analytics, Emma Toth is the student manager and Jon Wancowicz is the bullpen catcher.

Stramara Approaching Pitching Top-10 Marks

Senior pitcher Dean Stramara is coming close to the top-10 in Towson history in numerous categories.

He stands with 139 career strikeouts, six away from tying for 10th all-time in that category with two former Tigers at 145: Brandon Gonnella (2011-14) and Derek Hasselhoff (1992-95).

Stramara has pitched in 53 games, seven away from tying for 10th at 60 with Drew Permison (2008-10) and Zach Umberger (2007-11).

When There is a Will, There is a Weyman

Gavin Weyman has been a rock as the Saturday starter in his last two appearances, going 3-0 with four earned run in 21 innings (1.71 ERA) in victories over Elon, Hofstra and Delaware, striking out 16 batters in that time.

Summer, Summer, Summertime

Numerous Towson players competed in summer ball, making their mark across the country.

Richard Miller had one of the best seasons, being named the Prospect League Mike Schmidt Player of the Year after hitting .373 with 17 home runs, 18 doubles and 48 RBI for the Springfield Sliders. Kody Reeser pitched in six games for the Danville Dans with a 3.64 ERA and 13 strikeouts in 12.1 innings.

Many Tigers suited up in the Cal Ripken Sr. Collegiate League in southern Maryland and northern Virginia. Trent Gast-Woodard hit .273 with 10 runs for the league's co-champion, the Baltimore Redbirds. Two Tigers played for the Silver Spring-Takoma Thunderbolts: Jake Pecilunas and Austin Weber combined for eight appearances and 30 strikeouts.

Gavin Weyman played for the Martinsville Mustangs in the Coastal Plain League, one of the top summer wooden-bat leagues, throwing 21.1 innings in four starts with 16 strikeouts.

The Perfect Game Collegiate Baseball League, based in New York, had two Tigers: Danny Madden had a 3.89 ERA and 35 strikeouts in 37 innings with the Elmira Pioneers while Noah Cabrera played in 45 games for the Oneonta Outlaws, hitting .280 with a home run and 20 RBI.

Dirk Masters was in the Southern Collegiate Baseball League with the Carolina Vipers, helping the team to a second place finish by hitting .284 with a home run and six RBI in 22 games.

After committing to Towson from Folsom Lake College, Jack Rotteveel hit .333 with four doubles and six RBI in 17 games for the Lincoln Pottery in the Great West League.

Oluwasayo Kintunde played in the Ripken Myrtle Beach League, playing for the Waccamaw Naturals.

Repine - CAA Rookie of the Week

Dallas Repine's near no-hit bid earned him CAA Rookie of the Week on April 22nd. He had seven no-hit innings in a victory over UMBC on April 16th.

Pair of Three-Year Starters Are Back

Two position players returning in 2019 have been primary starters in each of their first three years.

Richard Miller has been the main third baseman for Towson for three seasons, entering 2019 with 136 games played and 116 started.

Starting at 104 games mainly at catcher, Trey Martinez has made at least 29 starts in each of his first three years, playing in 119 games going into 2019.

Tom Flacco Joins the Baseball Team

Tom Flacco, the 2018 CAA Offensive Player of the Year for the Towson football team, comes to the diamond for the baseball team in 2019.

Flacco, a graduate of Rutgers University, was drafted in the 32nd round out of high school in 2014 by the Philadelphia Phillies, electing to attend Western Michigan to play football.

His brother, Michael, played in the minors from 2009-12 after being drafted in the 31st round by the Baltimore Orioles.

Maryland, My Maryland

Towson sports 12 players from the home state of Maryland, coming from all areas of the region.

In addition, two freshmen, Trent Gast-Woodard and Nick Brown, each are from the home city of Baltimore. Gast-Woodard and Brown each attended Archbishop Curley.

Time Zones Covered

Towson's roster covers all four time zones in the contiguous United States.

From the Pacific Time Zone comes three players from California: infielders Colin Conroy and Brad Powers plus catcher Jack Rotteveel. John Cranston, from Scottsdale, Arizona, represents the Mountain Time Zone while Louisiana native Travis Dowden represents the Central Time Zone.

Matt Tyner enters his second season as the head coach of the Towson University baseball team.

In his first year with the Tigers in 2018, Richie Palacios was named All-CAA Second Team, hitting .301 with eight home runs and 18 doubles, and was drafted in the third round by the Cleveland Indians, the highest Tiger drafted since 1988. Three players, Palacios, Billy Lennox and Colin Gimblet hit above .267 with multiple home runs and at least eight doubles.

"We are very excited for Matt to be our next head coach," said Director of Athletics Tim Leonard. "We had a very talented candidate pool and Matt stood out with his vision of turning this program into a contender. His success as a player and coach, as well as in the business sector, made him the ideal person to be the next head coach at Towson."

"First off, I want to thank God for this opportunity," said Tyner. "Secondly, I want to thank President Kim Schatzel and Athletic Director Tim Leonard for having the faith and the trust in me to guide the Towson University baseball program. I am very excited for this opportunity as it fulfills a life-long dream.

"I fully understand the responsibility that has been given to me and I will promise to uphold the Towson University values and mission statement to the best of my ability. I look forward to meeting everyone, including the members of my new team, the alumni, the administration and staff, and all of those fans of Tiger Athletics.

"The amount of support and level of

commitment that I have received from Tim and his staff continues to show me that Towson baseball has a bright future ahead. I look forward to hitting the ground running with my new team."

Tyner comes to Towson after spending the previous four seasons as the assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at the University of Richmond.

In his tenure as the team's hitting coach, the Spiders ranked at or near the top of the Atlantic 10 in several offensive categories.

This past season, Tyner helped run an offense that finished in the top five in the league in average (.280), hits (522) and doubles (103).

In 2016, Richmond ranked in the top 20 in the country with a .308 average, its highest in over a decade. The team also ranked 15th nationally in doubles (127), fourth in doubles per game (2.44) and 32nd in slugging percentage (.454).

Tyner's second season with the Spiders saw the team put up some of the best numbers in nearly a decade. The team led the conference with 57 home runs, while adding the most RBIs (337) since 2007.

Prior to his time in Richmond, Tyner spent two seasons as the head coach at Bellarmine University in Kentucky. He posted a 60-46 overall record and led the Knights to the GLVC championship in his second season.

He took over the program at Bellarmine

after completing two different stints as the top assistant at Butler. During his seven years in Indianapolis, Tyner also coached several youth teams, winning back-to-back under-17 national titles as an assistant for the Indiana Bulls.

A highly successful collegiate player in his own right, Tyner was a four-year starter for the University of Miami, where he helped lead the Hurricanes to three College World Series. A power hitting outfielder, Tyner was named the 1980 Baskin Robbins Player of the Year and tied the Miami home run record.

Tyner was selected by the Baltimore Orioles in the ninth round of the 1980 Major League Baseball Draft. He spent three years in the Orioles system, leading the entire organization in home runs in 1981 with 33, while hitting .301. His professional career came to a halt in 1983 after multiple surgeries for bone chips in his right elbow.

A native of Decatur, Illinois, Tyner completed his bachelor's degree in business communications at Concordia University's Indianapolis campus.

1988 Team Inducted into Towson Athletics Hall of Fame

The 1988 Towson baseball team was inducted as a "Team of Distinction" into the Towson Athletics Hall of Fame as part of the Class of 2018.

The 1988 Tigers were the first Towson men's team to earn a Division I postseason berth after winning the East Coast Conference Tournament.

Under head coach Mike Gottlieb, Towson finished 31-17-1. .645 is still the best winning percentage for a Towson baseball team in a single season, while 17 losses is the fewest amount in a season to date.

Four Towson players earned First Team All-Conference distinction that year: Kevin King (SS), who is in the Towson Athletics Hall of Fame as a player, Chris Nabholz (P), Mike Wlazlak (3B) and Robbie Smith (1B).

Towson Approaching 900th Program Victory

Since the first year of Towson baseball in 1980, Towson has amassed 885 victories as a program, fast approaching 900.

The program has three league titles in 1988, 1991 and 2013 in its history, all coming with appearances in the NCAA regionals.

Scouting William & Mary

William & Mary, picked to finish seventh in the CAA this season, has fallen in its last three conference series for a combined 1-8 in those games.

Standing second in the CAA with 10 home runs, senior catcher Hunter Smith is hitting .295 with 10 doubles and a team-best 32 RBI. Classmate Zach Pearson, in the infield, leads W&M in batting average at .324 and doubles with 12, holding 27 RBI. One other person has 10 doubles: sophomore infielder Matt McDermott bats .222 with 25 RBI.

The likely rotation is led by junior right-hander Wade Strain with a 3-3 record, a 4.11 ERA and 49 strikeouts in 57 innings. Senior southpaw Bodie Sheehan is 3-2 with a 3.18 ERA and 38 strikeouts while freshman left-hander Zach Tsakounis has a 4-2 record, striking out 41 with a 3.80 ERA.

About Schuerholz Park

Named in honor of Towson alum John Schuerholz and his father, Schuerholz Park, next to the Student Union building, underwent some changes for the 2019 season, including the addition of Bermuda grass and new DuraEdge infield material.
