GAME PREVIEW:

KIRKSVILLE, Mo. – The Truman Bulldog Football team will have a lot riding in their regular season finale on Saturday afternoon at McKendree. The two teams kick off at 1 p.m. from Leemon Field in Lebanon, Illinois.

The first thing Truman will look to avenge last year's 31-3 letdown on Senior Day in Kirksville at the hands of the Bearcats. Next, lock up their first outright conference championship since 1985 and third, position themselves inside the top 7 in the final NCAA Regional rankings for their first Division II Tournament appearance since 1994 and fourth overall.

Truman moved up to fifth in the latest regional rankings put out by the NCAA on Monday. The top seven after Saturday's regular season finale earn a spot in the Division II Football Playoffs that begin next week.

The Bulldogs claimed a share of the GLVC title and 27th conference championship with a 23-3 victory at Saint Joseph's on Saturday afternoon. It was the first piece of a league title by a Truman Football team since the 1988 season. Truman owned the ball for almost 13 minutes in the fourth quarter against the Pumas while sacking the SJC quarterback seven times during the victory.

In addition to all of that, it will be the 1,000th game played for the Truman Bulldogs in the history of the program. Truman has won 564 games, second most of any NCAA school in the state of Missouri and 10th among all Division II schools in wins. Truman's overall record is 564-401-34 (.581).

Jaden Barr continued his strong play at quarterback for Truman. Barr scored a pair of second half rushing touchdowns and threw another to Joey Schenck while controlling the pace of the game. In the last two games, Barr and the offense has had the ball 24 out of the possible 30 minutes in the final stanza. Barr has accounted for 26 touchdowns this season (16 passing and 10 rushing), which is the most since Matt Ticich was responsible for 30 in 2007.

McKendree is one of the hottest teams in the GLVC after a 35-17 win over Quincy for their fourth straight victory. Like Truman, the Bearcats feature a stingy defense that does not allow many yards or points. McKendree is first in Division II sacks, third in tackles for loss and ninth in opponent third down success.

A.J. Wentland has been the key for the McKendree defense. The senior has over 400 career tackles with a team-leading 132 this season (10.5 for loss and 2.5 sacks). The Bearcats have 49 quarterback sacks this season (4.9/game) for a total of 301 yards while allowing only 15 sacks for 80 yards.

Last year in Kirksville, McKendree outgained the Bulldogs 415 to 175 in their 31-3 victory over Truman. Senior quarterback Isaac Fisher led the attack with 78 yards on the ground and 196 through the air, he was 26-of-38 on the afternoon. Wentland registered 13 tackles and the defense held Truman out of the redzone for the entire game.

UP NEXT:

The NCAA Division II Football bracket will be announced on Sunday at 4 p.m. on NCAA.com. A Truman win would give the Bulldog resume a shot at their first tournament appearance in 22 years. Also, the GLVC will announce the all-conference team next week.

- Is fifth on Truman's coaching victories list with Jack Ball (1983-89) and Eric Holm (1990-94).
- Has had 38 players named all-conference with 13 first-team selections.
- Three All-America selections. Defensive back Richie Schumacher, punter Eric Phillips and kicker Derek Koon, all in 2010.
- Two Capital One/CoSIDA Academic All-District selections. Adam Reynolds (First Team – 2011), Garrett White (First Team – 2012).

- Has averaged 46 Honor Roll members (Squad members with at least a 3.0 cumulative GPA) over the last four seasons, including 53 following the 2012 season and 36 in 2013 in the GLVC when criteria was raised to a 3.30 GPA.
- The 22nd Head Coach of the Truman Bulldogs and the sixth coach to have also played and lettered for the Bulldogs. (Last was Eric Holm from 1990-1994).
- Lettered in 1978 and 1979 and was the team's leading rusher in 79 with 260 yards.
- Returned to Truman in 1990 as Defensive Coordinator/Linebackers Coach for Eric Holm.
- Bulldogs went 23-9 from 1990-1993 with two NCAA playoff appearances (1990 & 1992).
- Left Truman in 1993 to become head coach at Columbia's Hickman High School.
- In 13 years at Hickman, the Kewpies qualified for six Missouri Class Six playoffs and won the 2004 State Championship.
- In 10 of the 13 years, Hickman was ranked in the top 10 in Missouri's largest class and Nesbitt had 95 students receiving college scholarships with 42 being named to all-state teams.
- Was the 2004 Associated Press Missouri Coach of the Year, National Federation of High School Sports Regional Coach of the Year and a nominee for the NFHS National Coach of the Year Award.
- Returned to college ranks in 2006 as defensive coordinator and secondary coach at Central Methodist (Mo.) University.
- Joined Willie Fritz at the University of Central Missouri as co-defensive coordinator in 2007. Defense allowed 23.3 points and 378 yards per game in three seasons at Warrensburg.
- A 1980 graduate of Truman State University with a B.S. in Physical Education and a masters in Sports Administration in 1987 also from Truman.
- A 2010 inductee into the Missouri Football Coaches Association Hall of Fame and has been invited to speak at over 20 clinics throughout the Midwest.
- Wife Jackie and sons Ryan and Kellen.

HOT ROUTES:

WHAT'S AT STAKE SATURDAY:

- A victory would give the Bulldogs their first outright conference title and first undefeated conference slate since they went 5-0 in 1985.
- Truman has won seven conference games for only the fifth time in school history and one more win would tie the 1990 team record with eight league wins (8-1).
- The Bulldogs have had 20 undefeated conference seasons in their history since 1924.
- Truman has had nine overall wins in a season six previous times (1933, 1961, 1971, 1982, 1990 and 1992). The eight victories currently is a program high dating back to 2001.

SEASON SUPERLATIVES:

- Jaden Barr is sixth in single-season history with 26 touchdowns responsible for. It is the most since Matt Ticich had 30 in 2007. Ticich had five rushing TDs and 15 passing.
- Barr is two rushing touchdowns away from the record by a Truman quarterback held by Dusty Burk with 12 in 2002.
- Jordan Jorgenson has already broken the school record for punt return yards with 377, previous was held by Alfonso Pugh with 310 in 2008. He is second in punt returns with 30, the most since Albert Coker's 23 in 2008 with the record held by Eric Holm of 38 in 1978.
- Joey Schenck is tied for 10th with seven receiving touchdowns, the most since Coker in 2008 and four from the single-season high of 11 by Larry Tisdale in 1985.
- Ben Chaney's 141 interception return yards is third most in a single-season and most since Robert Gayden had 138 in 2012. The Truman record is 173 by Gary Evans in 1975.
- Sam Reeves is tied for fifth in tackles for loss in a season with 14 and 10th in quarterback sacks with 9.5. Patrick Blackwell has the TFL record of 17 in 2012 and Al Fulton has the sacks record of 12 in 1972.
- As a team, Truman's 467 punt return yards is second most in school history trailing the 2002 total of 490. They are four punt returns from the most in a year with 35, the record is 39 in 1978.
- The Bulldogs have broken the tackle for loss record in each of the past five seasons and have the top spot again this year with one game to go with 86. The previous high, set last year, was 79.
- The team sacks record was also eclipsed with 33 this year. The previous high was 28 in 2012.
- The 940 yards rushing by an opponent for a season is the sixth fewest overall and the least since 1,072 in 1981.
- The rushing yards per game average of 94.0 is the fifth fewest average overall and fewest since 83.5 in the 1982 season.
- The seven opponent rushing touchdowns is the fewest allowed since the 1961, 1972 and 1981 campaigns. The Bulldogs allowed 10 rushing TDs last year.
- The Bulldogs have had only two lost fumbles this season, both occurring in the first two games of the year. The record for fewest in a season is currently three in 1997.

YOUNG PUPS:

- The Bulldogs have had eight true freshmen make their debuts this season. They are running back Jordan Salima, receivers Drew Slager and Cam Nisbet, full back Hayden Holt, offensive lineman James Mitchell, defensive lineman Jake Floyd and defensive backs Lawrence Woods and Jordan Siegel.
- The top four leaders in total offense, Barr, Salima, Andy Satulla and Malique Robbins and five of the seven all-purpose yardage leaders are in either their first or second year playing.
- Of the 63 players that have taken the field this season 60% or 38 are listed as true freshmen, redshirt freshmen or sophomores.

BLOCK PARTY:

- The Bulldogs are second in Division II with five blocked punts this season. Central State (Ohio) leads the nation with six. Truman has blocked five kicks four previous times in a season, last being 2009.
- Two belong to redshirt freshman Taylor Manes (against Grand Valley St and Southwest Baptist) and one each by junior Jordan Brown (Midwestern St.) sophomores Jake Hays (Indianapolis) and Mitch Nicholls (Quincy).

CAREER MILESTONE WATCHES:

- Senior defensive back Austin Zoda is eighth on the all-time tackles list

with 309. He can pass Ricky Ruff (1986-88) with one, Tim Stull (1981-84) with two and Ludd Lienhard (1998-02) with six. Zoda is sixth in unassisted tackles with 162, one back of Dan Shelby (1980-82).

Senior Joey Schenck has 124 pass receptions and is ninth on the Truman career list. Next of the radar is John Busby's 125 catches from 1981-85. Schenck has 1,263 receiving yards, 25th among all receivers.

Junior Ben Chaney is fifth on the career interception return yards list with 160. Next up is Willie Byrd with 168 from 1973-76.

Junior place kicker Nick Dolezal has 18 career field goals which is ninth on the career list. Next up is 24 by Dave Austinson from 1981-82.

TARGETING:

Schenck has been targeted 57 times by Bulldog quarterbacks making 34 catches for 410 yards. Drew Slager has been thrown to 56 times; making 35 catches for 586 yards and two touchdowns.

A total of 15 receivers and backs have had passes their direction this season with 13 making receptions.

The 16 touchdown passes this season, all by Jaden Barr, is the most since the 2012 campaign.

MONEY PLAYS:

Slager leads Truman with 27 "Money" receptions. Those are plays that result in either a first down or touchdown. So 27 of Slager's 34 catches have resulted in first downs or touchdowns this year with 16 coming on third downs.

Jordan Salima and Jaden Barr have 35 rushes apiece that have resulted in first down or touchdowns.

GLVC GAMES:

Truman is 21-9 since joining the GLVC in 2013 and has outscored opponents by 256 points. The Bulldogs have held opponents to 94.6 yards rushing per game and have had 40 sacks more than opposing defenses.

In the first half of league games, Truman has outscored GLVC foes by 294 points (483-189) and has allowed 54 first quarter points in the 30 league games (1.4 points per quarter).

Of the nine GLVC losses, four have come in the final two weeks of the regular season.

This year, Truman has outscored their GLVC brethren 223 to 108 including a 55-14 spread in the first quarter. The Bulldogs have had 17 rushing TDs in conference games and allowed only one.

THIRD DOWNS:

This season, Truman has converted on third downs 43% of the time, up from 35% last season. In the first quarter of games, the success rate is 50% (21-of-42) while opponents in the first quarter is at 33% (12-of-36).

The offense has had 27 "three and outs" through 10 weeks, last year through the same span last year, the Bulldogs had 40 three and outs.

OTHER NUMBERS:

- The Bulldogs are ranked first in the GLVC in the following stat categories: Blocked Kicks (5), Blocked Punts (5), Fewest Penalties (50), Fewest Penalties per game (5.0), Fumbles Lost (2), Rushing Defense (94.0/game), Scoring Defense (18.3) and Turnovers Lost (9).

- Truman is one of three teams in Division II with nine turnovers this season and one of two teams with two fumbles lost.

- The Bulldog defense has allowed only five individual opponents in conference to rush over 100 yards since joining the GLVC in 2013 (a span of 36 games). Last year, Bubba Jenkins of Southwest Baptist has the most by an opposing back with 125 yards.

- Truman is eighth in Division II in Redzone defense, 15th in Rushing Defense and 13th in fewest penalties. Of the 50 flags against the Bulldogs this year, 17 were in the first two weeks.

POSITION/PLAYER NOTES:

Running Backs

Freshman **Jordan Salima** leads team with 659 yards on 192 rushing attempts. He has five rushing touchdowns and one TD receiving...he had one, 100-yard rushing game (125 vs. Lincoln) and is averaging 19.5 carries per game...third in receptions with 26 for 221 and two touchdowns...he has 13 kick returns for 381 yards (29.3/return) with a long of 76...was the GLVC Special Teams Player of the Week following the September 17th game against Missouri S&T and the GLVC Offensive Player of the Week following the September 24th game against Lincoln...currently ranked 50th in Division II in All-Purpose Yards/game (132.3) and 10th in Kick Returns (31.1).

Sophomore **Andy Satulla** has 192 yards on 52 attempts (3.7/carry) with two touchdowns...has three catches for 28 yards...longest rush of the season was 25 against Lincoln and most yards on the day was 54 also against the Blue Tigers...had a career best 172 yards last season against St. Francis and scored four touchdowns against William Jewell to earn GLVC Offensive Player of the Week honors.

Sophomore **Malique Robbins** has 53 carries for 199 yards and a long run of 18 against Saint Joseph's...had a season-high 52 yards on nine carries against the Pumas...has seven receptions for 52 yards...has 12 kick returns for an 18.2 yards per return average and a long of 40...single game high is 17 rushes for 77 yards against Lincoln.

Quarterbacks

Redshirt freshman **Jaden Barr** has started nine games (8-1 record) and has completed 142 of 244 passes (58%)...in the first quarter of games, Barr has completed 52-of-77 passes (67%)...he has 117 rushing attempts for 308 yards and a long of 24...has 10 rushing touchdowns and 16 passing TDs...single game highs, passing 270 yards (vs. William Jewell) rushing 78 (vs. Indianapolis)...longest pass is 60 yards against Missouri S&T...currently leads Truman in scoring with 60 points, the last QB to lead a season in scoring was Matt Ticich in 2006 and it has only happened two times since 1958 (Dusty Burk – 2002).

Sophomore **Randy Schroeder** has started seven games including the season opener against Midwestern State...his career high is 274 yards in a single game last year against Southwest Baptist on 23 completions and longest pass was 61 yards also against SBU.

Receivers

Senior **Joey Schenck** has been targeted 57 times with 34 receptions for 410 yards and seven TDs...longest reception this year is 42 yards against William Jewell...season high is 101 yards on nine catches against Southwest Baptist...ninth in career Top 10 in career receptions (124) and has 1,265 yards and 13 career touchdown receptions...has three career 100+ yard receiving games with a high of 157 against William Jewell in 2015.

Freshman **Drew Slager** has 35 catches for a team-leading 586 yards...is averaging 16.7 yards per catch and has 27 receptions for either a first down or touchdown...has 18 receptions on third down...have four catches over 40 yards including a long of 60 against Missouri S&T...season high is 90 yards against SBU and most catches is six against Malone and William Jewell.

Senior **Dalton Powell** has seven catches for 124 yards (17.7/catch) and a touchdown...Powell has been thrown to seven times in the last three games.

A total of 13 receivers have been targeted this year. Among the other notables are **Jordan Salima** with 26 catches for 221 yards and two touchdowns, junior **Kyle Spratt** with 10 receptions for 107 yards and two touchdowns, junior **Jordan Jorgenson** with 13 catches for 124 yards and a touchdown, freshman **Cam Nisbet** with three receptions for 40 yards and a long of 26 and three others by **Andy Satulla** and sophomore **C.J. Brown**.

The Bulldogs have 16 receiving touchdowns this year, up from seven a year ago.

Offensive Line

Three seniors are among the five starters on the offensive line including returning all-conference honoree in center **Brad Wellman**. He is joined by left tackle **Colby Dohrman** and right guard **Kyle VanNess**. Wellman has started the last 42 games at center.

Sophomore **Nick Verbeck** (Left Guard) and junior **Matt Kaysinger** (Right Tackle) fill out the starting line up on the line.

The line has allowed 21 quarterback sacks for 126 yards and 79 tackles for loss for 271 yards. The Bulldogs are fourth in the GLVC in sacks allowed with 2.2 per game.

Defensive Line

Redshirt freshman **Sam Reeves** leads Truman with 14.0 tackles for loss and 9.5 sacks...was the GLVC Defensive Player of the Week following a three sack performance against Saint Josephs...has 49 total tackles with a single-game high of eight against Southwest Baptist...He was one win away from qualifying for the Division II National Wrestling tournament at 197 pounds.

Junior **Isaiah Hinton** has 7.5 sacks and 9.5 tackles for loss...he had two sacks in Truman's win over SBU for 10 yards lost, including a fumble recovery...has single-game highs of six stops in three games this year.

Senior **Kyle Leckrone** has made 24 stops starting at tackle...he has 1.5 sacks and 2.0 tackles for loss.

Junior **Brett Judkins** has 28 tackles including 7.5 for loss and 3.5 sacks in 10 games...he had a key sack on third down against the University of Indianapolis late in the fourth quarter.

Sophomore **Jon Scheeler** has 33 total tackles with 9.0 for loss and 5.5 sacks...has had a sack in six of the 10 games this season...has been credited with three quarterback hurries.

Backers

Senior **Austin Zoda** is the team leader in tackles with 68 this year and is in the Truman Top 10 in that category. Zoda has 309 career stops...his single game high this season is 10 vs. Southwest Baptist and William Jewell and his career high is 15 against Grand Valley St. as a freshman...he has 12 career games of 10 or more tackles.

Junior **Ben Wellman** is fourth on the team with 52 tackles...he had his second 10+ tackle game in season opener against Midwestern St. (10)...Wellman has two QB hurries and 4.0 tackles for loss.

Junior **Jordan Brown** started as a true freshman and has played in 32 career games...is second on the team in tackles with 59...he has the most active tackles for loss for his career with 21.0...he has three interceptions with two being returned for scores...had three TFLs against Malone in week 2 and a season-high 11 stops in week 1 against Midwestern State.

Junior **Ben Chaney** has five career interceptions and the longest scoring play for the Bulldogs this season...Chaney's 97-yd INT return against Missouri S&T was the second longest return in school history...his two INTs this year have resulted in 141 return yards.

Junior **D'Anthony Knight** is tops on the team with 14 pass breakups...he has also been credited with a fumble force and recovery and picked off a pass against Indianapolis with an 18-yard return.

True freshman **Lawrence Woods** has made 19 tackles in nine games with a team leading three interceptions...he is also a key gunner on punts...a two-sport athlete will join the wrestling team following the season.

Senior **T.J. Fine** has 24 total tackles at corner back and picked off his first career pass in the endzone to kill a William Jewell scoring threat in week 8...has appeared in 41 games with 144 career tackles and is the active leader in 20 pass breakups.

Special Teams

Sophomore punter **Brock Rohler** is averaging 39.6 yards per punt (51 attempts) with a long of 61 at Missouri S&T...was the GLVC Special Teams Player of the Week following Truman's win over Lincoln in which he put all five of his punts inside the 20 yard line and 3 inside the 10...Rohler has 12 punts inside the 10 yardline this year...averages 56.1 yards per kickoff with six touchbacks.

Junior place kicker **Nick Dolezal** has converted on 7-of-11 field goal attempts with a long of 35 this year...he has made 30-of-32 point after attempts...for his career, he had made 18 of 25 FGs with a long of 43 and 57-of-64 PATs...his 18 FGs is ninth on Truman's career list and his 57 PATs is 10th on Truman's career PAT list.

Junior **Jordan Jorgenson** has returned 30 punts for 377 yards (12.6/return) with a long of 48 (against Malone)...Jorgenson also has two returns for 36 yards (against Lincoln and Southwest Baptist) and another for 18 yards (Missouri S&T)...his 377 return yards are the most by a Bulldog returner after passing Alfonso Pugh's 310 in 2002.



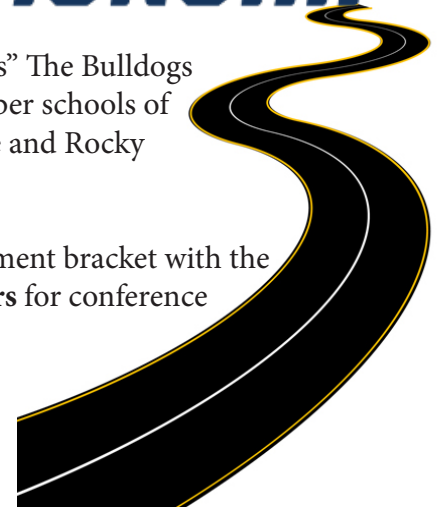
PATH TO THE

KIRKSVILLE, Mo. – The 14th-ranked Midwestern (Texas) State Mustangs scored 17 points in the second half and held on to down the Truman Bulldogs 31-19 in the 2016 season opener on Saturday night.

After the Bulldogs took a 13-7 lead in the second quarter, the Mustangs churned out scoring drives of 14 plays, 87 yards, 15 plays, 91 yards and 10 plays 89 yards to take command. Truman pulled to within nine on a Jordan Salima three-yard touchdown run but the two-point try failed. Midwestern State added a 32-yard field goal with 3:12 left to ice the game.

The Mustangs totaled 445 yards of offense on 150 yards rushing and 295 yards passing. Quarterback Quade Coward completed 24-of-38 passes with receiver Statron Jones catching nine passes for 120 yards.

Truman gained 255 yards on offense with red-shirt freshman quarterback Jaden Barr accounting for 110 yards through the air on 14-of-17 completions and another 33 on the ground on 15 attempts. Malique Robbins had 36 yards rushing and Salima added 30.

Post Game Notes:

The two teams combine for 26 accepted penalties totaling 225 yards. MSU was flagged 17 times for 133 while Truman was hit with nine fouls for 92 yards.

Time of possession was nearly even but MSU ran 21 more plays (83 to 62) than the Bulldogs. The Mustangs averaged 5.4 yards per play while Truman averaged 4.1.

Both teams had over 40 rush attempts. MSU gained 26 first downs to Truman's 13 and had five first downs via penalty.

Malique Robbins started the game with a 40-yard kick return and later Jordan Salima added a 33-yard kick return. Salima led Truman with 127 all-purpose yards.

Ben Wellman led the Truman defense with 10 stops and had two tackles for loss. Truman had nine TFLs for 27 yards on the night.

KIRKSVILLE, Mo. – Quarterback Jaden Barr threw five touchdown passes, one off the school record and the Bulldog defense stood tall as Truman routed Malone (Ohio) 35-3 in a non-conference game at Stokes Stadium on Saturday afternoon.

Barr used 11 different receivers and was 21-of-35 for 245 yards and five scores. It was the most TD passes by a Bulldog since Matt Ticich tossed five in a 2007 game against Missouri Western and one off Jake Czeschin threw six against Missouri S&T in 2004.

Barr's top target was freshman Drew Slager with six receptions for 73 yards including a 14-yard TD reception late in the third quarter and the longest reception of the game, a 33-yard strike on second and 19 on Truman's first scoring drive.

The Bulldogs rolled up 364 yards of total offense on 21 first downs and converted on nine of 17 third down attempts. They scored touchdowns on all three redzone opportunities.

The defense held the Pioneers to 254 yards with 72 on the ground and 182 in the air. Star running back Matt Blasiole, who had over 178 yards in Malone's week one win, was limited to 58 yards on 13 attempts. Quarterback John Iacucci was 16-of-28 for 182 yards and was sacked three times.

The special teams also shined. The Bulldogs recovered a pooch kickoff after going up 14-0 and converted the recovery for another TD for a 21-0 lead early in the second quarter. Punt returner Jordan Jorgenson averaged 18.3 yards per return with six for 110 and a 48-yard scamper that ended up setting the second touchdown on the afternoon.

Post Game Notes:

Jorgenson led Truman in all-purpose yards with 134, 24 receiving on one catch and the 110 yards on punt returns.

The defense registered 13 tackles for loss for 35 yards and three sacks. Ben Wellman led the squad with seven tackles followed by Ben Chaney with six. Wellman, Caleb Bischoff and Sam Reeves were also credited with quarterback hurries.

ROLLA, Mo. – The Truman Football team got big plays in all three aspects of the game and downed Missouri S&T in the Great Lakes Valley Conference opener 44-20 on Saturday night.

The Bulldogs went up 10-0 in the first quarter only to watch the Miners score twice in the second to take a 14-10 lead with 3:31 left in the half.

On the ensuing kickoff, Jordan Salima raced 76 yards down to the S&T 15 yard line. Andy Satulla took the first play from scrimmage into the endzone to reestablish the Truman lead just 20 seconds after the Miners went up.

Both teams were burning timeouts at the end of the half trying for the last possession. S&T ended up with the ball at their own one with a minute left to play. On a second and nine from the two, Dalton Major rumbled 15 yards and a pass from Tyler Swart to Braxton Graham aided by a personal foul pushed the ball out to midfield. Graham gained 16 yards and the Miners burned their final timeout with three seconds left to set up a final play from the Bulldog 38.

Swart launched the ball toward the endzone looking for the Hail Mary but Ben Chaney of the Bulldogs came down with it. Chaney and the defense set up the return and then won a foot race to the opposite endzone 97-yards away for the Bulldog touchdown. It was the second longest INT return by a Bulldog, the last a 98-yard return by Eric Sternberg against Southwest Baptist in 2007.

Quarterback Jaden Barr scored his second rushing touchdown of the game midway through the third quarter and the Bulldogs tacked on two more touchdowns in the fourth, one via special teams to win going away 44-20.

The Bulldogs averaged 43.2 yards per kick return and Salima finished with 267 all-purpose yards, the second most by a Truman performer since 1997 (Jeff Amundson 270 yards vs. Missouri Southern in 2004). Salima gained 83 yards on the ground on 28 carries and caught one pass for 11 yards. Truman finished with 333 yards of total offense and finished with 31 minutes plus of possession time.

Post Game Notes:

Joey Schenck caught three passes and now has 100 receptions for his career. He will enter the Bulldog top 10 in receptions with 19 more catches.

Drew Slager was targeted four times and made all four catches for 83 yards. On the season, Slager has been thrown to 14 times and has made 10 catches.

Brock Rohler averaged 44 yards per punt with a career long 61. Rohler had two of his four punts inside the 20 and one other for a touchback.

The Bulldogs were a +2 in turnovers to move their season mark back to even.

The 44 points scored was the most by the team since putting up 52 in a 2014 game at Southwest Baptist (16 games).

KIRKSVILLE, Mo. – The Truman defense pitched their first shutout in three seasons and freshman Jordan Salima had his first career 100-yard rushing game in the Bulldogs 37-0 victory over Lincoln (Mo.) University on Saturday night.

It was the first blanking of an opponent by the 'Dogs since a 2013 thrashing of Quincy (Ill.) University by a score of 33-0. Truman held the Blue Tigers to 197 yards of total offense including 49 net yards rushing on 29 attempts. Austin Zoda, Isaiah Hinton and Kade Young led the way with six tackles apiece while Zoda moved into the Truman career top 20 in tackles with 266.

Special teams were also a major key in the victory. Punter Brock Rohler was 5-of-5 in punts inside the 20 yard line including four inside the 10. He had a punt of 36 yards midway through the second quarter that was downed by Lawrence Woods at the Lincoln one that eventually led to a safety by Sam Reeves in the endzone to put Truman up 9-0.

Salima has 125 yards on 20 carries and his 28-yard run early in the second quarter broke the scoreless tie. He would add a 13-yard pass reception for a score with 2:11 left in the half and a three-yard run with 6:08 in the third quarter to finish with 196 all-purpose yards.

The Bulldogs pounded out 241 yards rushing after being held to -11 yards in the first quarter. Andy Satulla had a touchdown and 54 yards rushing and Felix Neboh added 64 with the longest play of the night, a 73-yard sprint for a score to cap things off in the fourth quarter.

Quarterback Jaden Barr was 16-of-24 for 148 yards with Salima catching eight passes for 53 and Drew Slager with four for 70.

Post Game Notes:

Truman rushed for 241 yards despite being held to a -11 in the first quarter. Both teams had negative yards rushing after the first 15 minutes with Lincoln at -10 yards.

Jordan Salima's 125-yard rushing game was the first by a Bulldog at home since 2014 (6 games). Salima caught all eight passes thrown his direction as well for 53 yards.

The Bulldog quarterbacks and receivers continued their strong start as eight of 12 passes were completed in the first quarter. This season, Truman has completed 27-of-37 passes (72%) in the first 15 minutes.

The eighth Bulldog true-freshman made his debut on Saturday night with defensive lineman Jake Floyd making a pair of tackles in the second half.

Brock Rohler joined Kevin Hollinger (1998) as the last Truman punter to have five punts in a game downed inside the 20.

Truman was 3-of-4 on fourth downs with a successful fake punt. Hayden Holt rumbled 28 yards on fourth and five in the third quarter.

Truman improved to 22-4-1 over Lincoln all-time and have won the last 21 games played.

Truman led 14-0 before the Greyhounds raced down the field using six plays and covering 80 yards in 52 seconds to get on the scoreboard with a touchdown with 10 seconds left in the first half.

To start the third, both teams traded three and outs but on the Greyhounds next possession, Malik Higgins took a screen pass and broke several tackles for an 80-yard touchdown to tie the game at 14 apiece.

It would remain like that until the first play of the fourth quarter. Quarterback Jaden Barr broke the plane of the endzone and scored to put the Bulldogs ahead 21-14.

On the next UIndy possession, QB Jake Purichia was picked off by D'Anthony Knight and Truman set up shop at the Greyhound 10. Barr tried to score on a draw play on third and goal but came up a yard short to bring on Nick Dolezal for an 18-yard field goal. Truman led 24-14 with 11:42 left.

UIndy would get a 37-yard field goal from Brad Schickel with 2:30 left to cut the lead down to seven.

UIndy took over will two timeouts left and 1:25 on the clock.

On third and goal, Purichia was forced out of the pocket and brought down for a sack of five yards by Brett Judkins. Following the sack, Purichia rushed to the line and spiked the ball only it was fourth down which gave Truman the turnover on downs with two seconds left.

Barr completed 15-of-26 for 156 yards and threw touchdown passes to Joey Schenck and Jordan Jorgenson. Jordan Salima had 23 rushes for 84 yards and Barr added 19 rushes for 78 yards.

Post Game Notes:

Truman had a season low two flags thrown against them during the game. Indianapolis had seven penalties called with five 15-yarders and a crucial spot foul on an illegal touching of an on-sides kick.

Joey Schenck was targeted a season high nine times and made six catches for 46 yards and one score. He went over 1,000 career receiving yards during the game.

It was the 70th game as Truman head coach for Gregg Nesbitt. Only five of the 21 previous Bulldog coaches have been on the sideline for more games than Coach Nesbitt. (Red Wade – 134, John Ware – 97, H.L. McWilliams – 82, Don Faurot – 79 and Jack Ball – 75).

Derrick Bryant's 17 tackles was the most by an opponent defender against the Bulldogs since Ben Carlson recorded 17 for Emporia State against Truman in 2012.

The Bulldogs snapped SBU's seven-game winning streak and also halted running back Bubba Jenkins' personal eight game streak of 100 or more yards rushing. Truman held Jenkins to a season-low 69 yards on 23 carries as the GLVC leading rusher came in averaging over 139 yards per game.

Truman led 14-0 after one on a three-yr TD pass from Jaden Barr to Joey Schenck and a 17-yard run by Barr. Jake Hays blocked a punt for a safety and Schenck caught a nine-yr pass for a score to put Truman up 23-0 at half.

The Bearcats got on the scoreboard with 2:17 left in the third but wasted an opportunity with a fumble at the Bulldog three yard line early in the fourth quarter. SBU added a 21-yard TD pass with 4:44 left but Truman jumped on the on-sides kick then later forced a fumble to pick up the win.

Post Game Notes:

• The Bulldogs forced the prolific SBU offense into seven punting situations in their first nine possessions. One punt was blocked for a safety and the other two possessions ended on downs and a missed field goal.

• Of the four other possessions for SBU, two were touchdowns and the other two fumbles.

• It was the third straight game by the Bulldogs without a turnover. They have gained the last eight turnovers since an interception thrown in Week 3 at Missouri S&T.

• Austin Zoda led Truman with 10 tackles and vaulted past five Bulldogs on the career tackles list.

• Jaden Barr completed all five passes in the first quarter and was 10-of-14 in the first half before finishing 18-of-25 and matching his season high in 245 yards passing.

• The Bulldogs were 4-of-7 in red zone opportunities while SBU had only two redzone possessions resulting in one touchdown.

• Isaiah Hinton had two of the four quarterback sacks.

• Sam Reeves finished with a season-high eight tackles with one sack and 1.5 tackles for loss.

• The Bulldogs had a 2 to 1 margin in possession time in the second half. Truman had the ball for nearly 11 minutes in the third quarter and 9:17 in the fourth. They finished with 35:53 compared to the Bearcats 24:07.

KIRKSVILLE, Mo. – Quarterback Jaden Barr tossed three touchdown passes and ran for another as the Truman Bulldogs remained perfect in Great Lakes Valley Conference action with a 31-24 victory over William Jewell (Mo.) College for homecoming.

Barr was 17-of-26 for 270 yards using three different receivers for scores. He ran the ball eight times for 44 yards and his two-yard power up the middle in the third quarter proved to be the difference in the contest.

The game got off to an auspicious start with Anthony Mullins returning the opening kickoff 99 yards to give the Cardinals the 7-0 lead. It was the first kickoff returned for a touchdown against the Bulldogs since the 2013 season.

The Bulldogs struck right back as Barr engineered an eight-play, 71-yard drive ending with Drew Slager catching an 11-yard TD pass. Barr hit Joey Schenk for 25 yards on third and nine to keep the drive going. Truman was 7-of-9 on third downs in the first half and Slager made the most of his six catches. The freshman caught six for 65 yards with five of the catches going for first downs and the other for a score.

Jordan Salima caught a screen pass and raced 42-yards on the next Truman possession to put the Bulldogs up 14-7.

Truman grinded out the halftime clock with a 17-play, 67-yard drive resulting in a 35-yard field goal by Nick Dolezal with 52 seconds left in the second quarter. The Bulldogs were three of four on third down during the possession including Slager's 12-yard reception on third and 11.

After forcing Truman to punt from their own endzone, Jewell converted on a fourth and nine at the Truman 12 then Strauss hit Bulla Graft for a three-yard pass with 50 seconds left to cut the lead down to seven.

KIRKSVILLE, Mo. – Quarterback Jaden Barr had three rushing touchdowns as the Truman Bulldogs remained perfect in Great Lakes Valley Conference play with a 38-28 victory over rival Quincy on Saturday night at Stokes Stadium.

Barr scored on two straight possessions late in the first half as Truman grabbed control of the game. He rode the backs of the offensive line on fourth and one from the two and broke the plane of the endzone line to put Truman up 21-14 then after a Ben Chaney interception return scored from 12-yards out to send Truman into the locker room up 28-14.

The Hawks and more specifically receiver Eric Poindexter remained a thorn in the Truman defense. Poindexter earlier caught a five and then 60 yard TD pass in the first half then scampered 69 yards early in the third quarter to cut Truman's lead to 28-21.

Truman was able to grind out the fourth quarter clock, holding the ball for nearly 11 of the 15 minutes in the final stanza and 32 minutes of the game.

Barr and Salima each had 72-yards rushing on the night and Truman grounded out 162 yards overall. Barr completed 13-of-30 for 159 yards but tossed a pair of interceptions.

Quincy had their turnover problems as well. Robbie Kelley threw for 311 yards and four touchdowns but had three ill-timed interceptions. Two of the three INTS occurred late in the first half, the first by Austin Zoda that was returned 32 yards and the second by Chaney returned 44 yards. Lawrence Woods got the final one with 2:08 left in the game to seal the victory.

Post Game Notes:

- The victory was the 37th for Head Coach Gregg Nesbitt tying him for fifth on the all-time coaching list with Jack Ball (1983-89) and Eric Holm (1990-94).
- Eric Poindexter's 217 yards receiving was the most by an opposing receiver since Brandon Green had 223 by Grand Valley State. The four TD passes by Robbie Kelley matched Tommy Corwin's 4-TD day against the Bulldogs in 2011.
- Brock Rohler averaged 42.3 per punt on six attempts with four inside the Quincy.
- Jordan Brown led Truman with 10 tackles with 1.5 sacks and 2.0 tackles for loss. He also added 1 pass breakup and 1 QB hurry.
- Truman held the ball for 32:44, with 10:56 in the fourth quarter. It was the first time this season that Quincy lost the time of possession in a game.
- Mitch Nicholls blocked the fifth punt this year by the Bulldogs and set up the first touchdown of the game. The last time Truman blocked five punts in a season was 2009.

RENSELAER, Ind. – The Bulldog Football team grabbed a piece of a conference title with a dominating second half performance and a 23-3 victory over Saint Joseph's (Ind.) College on Saturday afternoon.

Truman took a 10-3 lead into the locker room on a 33-yard field goal by Nick Dolezal in the first quarter and a nine-yard pass reception by Joey Schenck early in the second. The Pumas got their points on a 25-yard field goal late in the half from Marcin Gawlak.

The Bulldogs thought they had extended their lead by seven more at the end of the half but Jaden Barr's Hail Mary attempt was ruled incomplete after a mad scramble in the endzone.

The Pumas tried an onsides kick to start the third quarter but the ball failed to go the required 10 yards. Truman couldn't convert that possession into points but Brock Rohler pinned the Pumas at their own four following the punt.

Sam Reeves picked up one of his three sacks on third down to force a deep punt that was returned by Jordan Jorgenson 23 yards to the SJC 24. Jorgenson broke the single-season Truman record in Punt Return yards with four returns on the day for 82 yards and a long of 32.

One play later, Barr broke up the middle and raced for the left pylon to beat the Pumas defenders into the endzone to give Truman a 17-3 advantage with 10:35 left in the quarter.

The Bulldog defense stifled the Pumas the rest of the game accumulating seven sacks and 11 tackles for loss. SJC finished with only 221 yards of total offense, 79 coming on two plays.

Barr did not need to complete a pass in the second half. Truman finished the game with 50 rushing attempts for 186 yards after only nine rushing yards in the first 30 minutes. Malique Robbins added a spark when he carried the ball five of his nine times on a four minute, 50 second time consuming drive in the third quarter. Robbins finished with nine carries for 52 yards.

Barr capped off the game with his second rushing TD with four minutes left to play from eight yards out. He was 8-of-18 for 141 yards.

Post Game Notes:

- Both teams had nine yards rushing at the half but Truman finished with 186 on the game and the Pumas 32.
- SJC had 221 yards of total offense with 137 coming in the first half.
- Five of the seven sacks by the Bulldogs occurred in the second half.
- Truman controlled the ball for nearly 13 minutes in the fourth quarter and attempted three passes in the second half.
- Game time was a crisp 2:26, the fastest this season.
- The Bulldogs improved to 8-0 and 32-7 in Coach Nesbitt's tenure when leading at the half and have scored first in eight of the 10 games.
