GAME NOTES

BATTLE FOR THE OVC: With the bye week behind them, the Tennessee State football team is set for their second straight Big South-OVC contest as they will take on the UT Martin Skyhawks on the road this Saturday. Both teams come into Saturday night's matchup having received votes in the Top 25.

SERIES INFORMATION: This will be the 32nd matchup between TSU and UTM with the Tigers holding an 18-14 advantage. The Skyhawks have won both matchups against George after defeating the Tigers 20-3 last season, and 41-20 in 2021. TSU last took down the Skyhawks in the spring of 2021 in a 26-24 win.

The UAPB transfer leads TSU with 30 tackles and his 10.0 tackles per outing leads the league. He tallied back-to-back 10 tackle games after recording 11 against UAPB and 12 against GWU.

- a 55-yard TD reception, followed by Dayron Johnson who hauled in a 35-yard grab, and Trenton Gillison (20 yards).
- 9: The number of punts that Tiger punter Jackson Foster has landed inside of the 20-yard line. Forster is in a three-way tie in the Big South-OVC with his nine punts inside the 20. Foster has punted 22 times for 832 yards and has a long of 51.
- 1: The number of career touchdown receptions Da'Shon Davis now has in his career. The 5th year senior caught his first career TD on a 55-yard pass from Draylen Ellis in the win over GWU. Davis has four catches for 86 yards this season.

TIED AT THE TOP: Just two teams sit at 1-0 in the newly formed Big South-OVC as TSU and SEMO both have 1-0 records in the league. Just four teams have played a league matchup thus far, while six teams have yet to play, including UTM who will open their conference slate against the Tigers.

STAYING READY: After starting 10 games at QB last season, senior quarterback Draylen Ellis who entered this season as the backup was thrust into action against GWU after Deveon Bryant exited the game in the second quarter due to injury. The second-year TSU QB finished the game 16-of-28 through the air with one touchdown pass. The TD pass marked his first since he threw three against ElU on October 22nd of last season. Ellis put TSU in a position to kick a game-winning field goal to take down GWU.

OFF THE BYE: The Tigers are 3-5 coming off their bye week since the 2014 season. TSU is 1-1 in their last two contests coming off a bye week. The Tigers fell to Lane College in OT after last season by week.

CAREER DAY: TSU kicker James Lowery had a career day in the win against GWU. Lowery entered the day with a career-long FG of 43 yards that he set against Mississippi State in 2021 and would go on to break that record not once, but twice in the win. Lowery connected on a 49-yard field goal midway through the fourth quarter followed by his 50-yard game-winning FG with nine seconds left. The Florida native finished with nine points, while also being named the MVP of the game, and the Big South-OVC Special Teams Player of the Week.

TAKING THE OVER: Known for his explosive ability in the return game, TSU wide receiver Dayron Johnson has also shown the consistent ability to rack up receptions and receiving yards from his slot position. With four catches for 46 yards against GWU, the fourth-year WR has now gone over 100 receiving yards in each season he has played. He has hauled in nine passes for 107 yards through three games. The Tennessee native finished with 118 yards in 2019, 263 in the spring of 2021, and 311 in the fall of 2021. Johnson's 58 career receptions for 799 yards lead the TSU WR room.

ROAD WARRIORS: Saturday's game against UTM will be the first of two straight-away games for the Tigers. TSU will head to Kennesaw, Ga., to take on Kennesaw next Saturday after traveling to Martin this week. The Tigers will have one more set of back-to-back road games late in the season as they will travel to Charleston, S.C., and Charleston, Ill., on November 4th and 11th for games against Charleston Southern and Eastern Illinois.

MEET YOU IN THE BACKFIELD: The Tiger defense has recorded 5.0 tackles for loss or more in each of their first three games to start the season. TSU finished with 6.0 against Notre Dame, followed by a season-high 8.0 against Arkansas Pine Bluff. Brandon Fisher's defense logged 5.0 in their last game against GWU. Terrell Allen leads the team with 3.0 TFLs, followed by Chris Walker with 2.0 and Jalen Bell with 2.0.

WEEK 3 BY THE NUMBERS

16: The number of wins that TSU has in the John Merritt Classic. TSU won the first event in 1999, as they beat Alabama State 41-8.

43,836: The number of the combined attendance from all 23 John Merritt Classics. The Classic has drawn 20,00+ fans on 11 separate occasions. 31,119 fans watched the first John Merritt Classic in 1999, which is the highest amount among John Merritt Classics. The Tigers packed 11,553 fans into Hale Stadium for last year's JMC.

379: The number of total yards the TSU offense finished with against UAPB. The Tigers showcased a balanced attack with 195 passing yards and 184 rushing yards in the contest. TSU's 379 yards are the most in a game since last season's 394 yards against Eastern Illinois on October 22, 2022.

10: The number of wins Eddie George now has in coaching career. Saturday's victory was the 10th of George's young career as his team defeated UAPB to win the Southern Heritage Classic. George won five games in his first season in 2021, followed by four last year.

THE JOHN MERRITT CLASSIC: It's the annual game that brings out the barbecue grills, fish fries, and fellowship. It's a community revival of sorts and a North Nashville family reunion wrapped in one — the John Merritt Classic. Though it brings thousands from across the city and region to Tennessee State University, it all started years ago with one man, John

Merritt, the coach who took Tennessee State to its highest level of football in the program's history. Affectionately known as "Big John", Merritt dominated and revolutionized the game of football during his coaching career, compiling a record of 172-33-7 at TSU and 232-65-11 overall. His former players and the Big Blue Nation still remember Merritt's signature cigar smoke after wins.

TSU IN THE JOHN MERRITT: The Tigers have played in the John Merritt Classic 23 times dating back to the first event in 1999. The Tigers are 16-7 in the event. TSU won the first six John Merritt Classics from 1999-2004. The Tigers took down Alabama A&M three years in a row, followed by wins over Prairie View A&M, South Carolina State, and AAMU. TSU's first loss in the classic came in 2005 to AAMU, as they would drop three in a row to AAMU from 2005-2007. The Tigers fell in last year's JMC 28-27 to Lane College in overtime.

NEW BEGINNINGS: For the first time in 35 seasons, the TSU football team will be playing in a new conference. Saturday's game marks the first Big South-OVC game for the Tigers after the OVC and Big South joined forces this past offseason to become a joint conference. With the release of the 2023 joint football schedule, it was announced that the partnership between the two conferences would exist through the 2026-27 season.

BIG CAM: 5th-year defensive lineman Cameron Stewart played in his 40th career game this past Saturday against UAPB, and the big man in the middle had one of his best career outings, as he tallied six tackles (three solo, three assists). The Chattanooga native has seven tackles this season and is on pace for one of his better seasons. Stewart had a career-high 12 tackles, 2.5 sacks, and 1.5 TFLs last season.

QB1: With two starts under his belt, including a win against UAPB in a well-managed game, the Tigers seemed to have found their starting quarterback in 6th-year man Deveon Bryant. "I think he separated himself tonight," stated Eddie George. "When he led us down on the 99-yard drive, he had confidence". Bryant had a well-managed game against UAPB as he finished 14-of-19 through the air with 174 yards, while also tacking on 80 rushing yards. The Illinois native has passed for 217 yards and has accumulated 109 rushing yards in two games.

GROUND AND POUND: The Tigers are one of two teams in the newly formed Big South-OVC that have two players with 100+ rushing yards after two weeks of play. Jalen Rouse (119) ranks 5th in the league, while Deveon Bryant (109) is 9th in the Big South-OVC rankings. Lindenwood is the other team with two 100+ yard rushers.

TEU: TSU tight end Trenton Gillison had a breakout game for the Tigers in their win against UAPB on Saturday. The first-year Tiger and former Michigan State / Youngstown State product hauled in five passes for 57 yards. Gillison's five receptions are the most by a TSU TE since October 2, 2021, when Rodell Rahmaan hauled in five passes at Austin Peay. TSU TEs caught a combined 11 passes last season and will look to surpass that number this season as they have six TEs on the roster.

NEW RIVALRY.... WE SHALL SEE: The Southern Heritage Classic was first played in 1990 to enhance the rivalry between TSU and JSU, two HBCU regional powers. There have been 31 games played all-time in the classic, with 29 between TSU and JSU. Tennessee State is 17-14 all-time in the Southern Heritage Classic. UPAB will be just the fifth team to compete in the SHC after JSU could not appear in 1991, 1993, and now being out of the picture for at least the next two years. TSU took on Mississippi Valley State in 1991, and Grambling State in 1993, both of which resulted in losses. TSU won the first matchup vs. JSU in 1990 23-14. JSU won last year's meeting 16-3.

WEEK 2 BY THE NUMBERS

- 6: The number of current TSU players that played in the 2019 TSU vs. UAPB matchup. Dayron Johnson, Kenyon Garlington, Fondren Hollis III, Josh Green, and Cameron Stewart all saw playing time for the Tigers. Monroe Beard III was a freshman for UAPB at the time and recorded two tackles and a sack against TSU. Hollis III recorded his first career stop, while Josh Green had one tackle. Johnson returned two kickoffs for 37 yards.
- 23: The number of players that made their TSU debut against Notre Dame this past Saturday. The breakdown includes four true freshmen, three redshirt freshmen, and 16 transfer players.
- 8: The number of kickoff return yards TSU allowed against ND, which currently leads the Big South-OVC. James Lowery had two attempts, with the first being a 65-yard touchback to start the game. Lowery's second attempt was fielded at the four-yard line, but not before ND's Devyn Ford was leveled by Zachery Drake who forced a fumble which was recovered by freshman Sammy Taylor at the 12-yard line.
- 5: The number of receivers that caught a pass against ND. Eight total players showcased their hands as three running backs also hauled in a pass. The Tigers were able to show off their deep WR room as Da'Shon Davis, Chayil Garnett, Delanie Majors, Karate Brenson, and Dayron Johnson all had receptions.
- 271: The number of passing yards Draylen Ellis needs to hit 6,000 in his career. Ellis is currently 9th in FCS active passing leaders with 5,729 passing yards. The Mississippi native tallied 1,811

yards through the air in his first season as a Tiger, and 3,894 in two seasons at Austin Peay.

FIVE IS ALIVE: Dayron Johnson made the most of his return to the field after missing the 2022 season with a leg injury. The electric return man showcased his skills to the nation as he logged a 58-yard kick return in the second quarter to set the Tigers up in great field position. The Springfield native tallied 76 yards on two returns for an average of 38 yards. The 76 yards now give Johnson 1,207 kick return yards. His average of 23.21 yards ranks fourth in school history.

INSTANT START: Tennessee State had six transfers that earned starts in their first game against Notre Dame. Jeremiah Josephs, Jalen Bell, and Monroe Beard III all started on the defensive side of the ball, while Aarion Harvey, Nicholas Green, and Trenton Gillison all got the starting nod on offense. Josephs, Beard, and Bell combined for 18 tackles, with Josephs leading the team with nine, followed by Beard with seven. Both of Bell's tackles were for loss.

BEHIND THE LINE: In a game that did not showcase much offensively for the Tigers, there was one defensive statistic that stood for TSU against ND, as the Tigers finished with six tackles for loss to the Fighting Irish's five. Jalen Bell finished with two TFLs in his Tiger debut, while Josh Green, Ahmad Nelson, Bryce Phillips, and Terrell Allen all tallied one TFL.

LOCAL FRESHMAN IMPACT: On the first play of his collegiate career, Eriq George, an MBA product took down Sam Hartman for no gain as the QB scrambled up in the pocket. He was met by the freshman DE who was coming off the right side from a two-point stance. George would go on to finish with four solo tackles, as he was one of four true freshmen to see playing time, all of which are from the Nashville area. Ensworth product Sammy Taylor recovered a fumble at the 12-yard line for TSU, while Overton product Delanie Majors hauled in his first reception. Jason Hoath Jr., who played at both Columbia and Page also made his debut, seeing a significant number of snaps on special teams.

1K WATCH: Junior running back Jalen Rouse is on pace to hit 1,000 yards rushing this season as he enters his second year as the full-time starter. Rouse crossed the 800-yard mark threshold against ND as he tacked on 28 yards to give him 808 for his career. The Georgia native logged just 167 yards in his first two seasons, before rushing for a career-high and team-leading 613 yards in 2022.

WEEK 1 BY THE NUMBERS

- 356: The number of combined tackles between Josh and James Green. Josh Green is the current team leader with 225 career tackles, while James ranks third on the team with 131 tackles under his belt.
- 207: The number of yards head coach Eddie George rushed for against Notre Dame in 1995. George's three touchdowns helped Ohio State defeat the Fighting Irish 45-25.
- 39: The number of players from Tennessee that are on the roster this year after having 35 in 2022. 26 of those players are local products that played their high school ball in Nashville.
- 17: The number of players on TSU's roster who have already completed their bachelor's degrees.
- 14: The number of FBS transfers on TSU's roster. The Tigers picked up two SEC transfers this summer in defensive back Tyler Jones (Missouri) and wide receiver Lucien Brunetti (Tennessee). Former Michigan State product Trenton Gillison arrives from the Big Ten and is expected to contribute in big ways this season.

TSU IN SEASON OPENERS: TSU is 51-31-4 in season openers dating back to the 1933 season. The Tigers' largest margin of victory in a season opener came in 1966 when they took down North Carolina A&T 58-0 to open the season. John Merritt's team would finish that season 10-0 and take down Muskingum 34-7 in the Grantland Rice Bowl. TSU's 55-19 loss to Middle Tennessee to open 1987 is the worst opening-day loss that the Tigers have suffered. TSU has posted 17 shutout wins in season openers since 1933, with the last one coming in the 2016 opener as the Tigers shutout Arkansas-Pine Bluff 44-0.

THE BIG STAGE: Tennessee State is 1-5 against FBS teams dating back to 2006. The Tigers have taken on Vanderbilt twice, Georgia State, Middle Tennessee Twice, and Mississippi State in that span. The Tigers picked up their first-ever FBS victory in the 2017 season opener as they defeated Georgia State. The Tigers have dropped their last four games against FBS opponents including two in the Eddie George area, a 49-6 loss to MTSU last season, and a 55-10 loss in 2021.

OUT EAST: The Tigers will play three games in the Eastern time zone this season. The last time TSU played in the Eastern Time Zone was in the 2021 season opener against Grambling State in Canton Ohio, as Eddie George made his coaching debut in a 16-10 loss. After opening up the season against Notre Dame in South Bend, the Tigers will also travel to Charleston S.C., and Kennesaw, Ga., for their others games in the Eastern Time Zone.

KEEPING IT 100: The Tennessee State defense has four players with 100+ career tackles heading into 2023, with three more players on the brink of reaching the century mark. Josh

Green leads the team with 225, followed by Monroe Beard III who transfers into TSU with 141 career tackles that he tallied at Arkansas-Pine Bluff. James Green has notched 131 tackles, while Jalen Bell made 113 stops at Mississippi Valley State before transferring to TSU for his final year. Terrell Allen (87), Kenyon Garlington (77), and Jeremiah Josephs (70) will all took hit the 100 mark this season.

ELITE EIGHT: Eight true freshmen have made the travel roster for the season opener and will look to make their college debuts live on NBC against Notre Dame. Hadine Diaby (OL), Delanie Majors (WR), Jason Hoath Jr. (TE), and Ryder Hagan (QB) represent the offense, while Eriq George (DL), Terrence Carpenter (DL) and Sammy Taylor (LB) made the flight as defensive freshmen. Kicker Ahmed Mohammed will also travel as the backup kicker.

OLD HEADS: With redshirt years, injury redshirts, and extra years of eligibility from Covid, teams across the country have an abundance old 5th, 6th, and even 7th-year players. TSU has a combined 25 guys that are in their 5th-7th year of playing college football. James Green leads the in years in college football as he enters his 7th season. When James was a freshman at TSU in 2017, the current TSU freshmen were in the 6th grade. The Tigers have 10 6th years guys and 14th players in their 5th season.

OVC PRESEASON SELECTION: The Tigers received 57 points in the poll, a promising position for Eddie George as he enters his third year as head coach. Last season, TSU recorded a 4-7 overall record and a 2-3 standing in the OVC.

Adding to the optimism, six players from George's squad have been selected to the Conference's Preseason Watch List.

2023 SEASON PREVIEW

SCOUTING THE OFFENSE

In the second year of Coach Eddie George's tenure, TSU's offense faced challenges, taking a step back in terms of performance. The team's scoring average dwindled to 18.27 points per game, while they were outscored 272-201 in total. Their offensive statistics positioned them at the 5th spot in the Ohio Valley Conference (OVC) for total offense, achieving an average of 314.1 yards per game. Additionally, they secured the 6th rank in total touchdowns, amassing a mere 23. Their offensive efforts yielded 1,459 rushing yards and 1,997 passing yards.

The upcoming season anticipates the return of senior quarterback Draylen Ellis as the starting quarterback. Ellis made his mark in his first season at TSU, passing for 1,807 yards and eight touchdowns. Notably, he garnered four rushing touchdowns and 55 ground yards. With a cumulative career record of 5,705 passing yards and 41 touchdowns, Ellis's remarkable performance earned him a unique position on the Big South-OVC Watch List. Backing up Ellis is Deveon Bryant, in his fifth season. Bryant concluded the previous season with one passing touchdown and one rushing touchdown, with 531 passing yards and three touchdowns to his credit. His ground game included 269 yards and five touchdowns. True freshman Ryder Hagan and Youngstown State transfer Demeatric Crenshaw, an All-MVFC honoree in 2021, are also poised to make their presence felt.

Jalen Rouse, a fourth-year running back, is expected to see the bulk of the carries this season. He secured 613 yards and two touchdowns from his ground efforts across 11 games last season. Additionally, he showcased his versatility with 12 receptions for 158 yards and a touchdown. Rouse has rushed 780 yards in his career. Supporting the running back position are Tre Boone III, with 59 career rushing yards, and Jordan Gant, who registered 92 yards from just 18 attempts in his freshman year. JUCO transfer Antwone Parker, boasting an imposing 6'1", 225-pound stature, has impressed in training camp, presenting an intriguing prospect for fans. Red-shirt freshman Craig Cunningham adds to the depth.

With the departure of key players, including JJ Holloman, the Tigers are on the lookout for new play makers in the receiving department. Second-year Tiger Karate Brenson is expected to emerge as a favorite target for Ellis. Having secured 25 receptions for 329 yards and a score, Brenson showcased his potential in 2022. Dayron Johnson, with 49 career catches accounting for 465 yards and three touchdowns, is set to make a return after missing the previous season due to an ACL injury.

Gerand Turner, entering his fourth season, is expected to assume a more significant role in the wide receiver position. Having played in 10 games, Turner accumulated 15 receptions for 264 yards. Da'Shon Davis, entering his fifth season, caught 19 passes for 210 yards in the previous season. Chayil Garnett, transitioning from quarterback to wide receiver, is a notable addition, showcasing promise in his new role along with his 6'2" stature.

Coach George introduced several new transfers and freshmen to the wide receiver lineup, enhancing the team's versatility. Canen Adrian, who arrived from Blinn in the spring, excelled in the slot during fall camp. With 28 receptions for 338 yards from his junior college experience, Adrian is a promising addition. Solomon Dunn, a transfer from East Tennessee State, boasts a 6'4" frame and is anticipated to make his mark on the outside. Avery Williams returns after an injury sidelined him in the previous season. Williams, a Nashville native, impressed the coaching staff after playing three seasons at Chattanooga. True freshman 3-star Delanie Majors, noted for his blazing speed, and Amar Gist are expected to bring fresh energy to the team.

To bolster their tight end roster, the Tigers expanded their room to accommodate six players, including a mix of transfers and freshmen. Noteworthy among them is Trenton Gillison, poised to take on the role of the top tight end. Gillison, with experience from 37 career games at Michigan State and Youngstown State, caught 21 passes for 231 yards. Austin Yankowy, a transfer from Bethune-Cookman, and former Montgomery Bell Academy player Joshua Meriwether are also expected to contribute. True freshman Jason Hoath Jr., part of the travel squad, provides further depth.

Chazan Page stands as the sole returning starter on the offensive line. His performance in all 11 games last season demonstrated his reliability. The arrival of junior college transfer Nicholas Green positions him as the starting left tackle. Darrell Branch and Alex Valbuena gained substantial playing time as guards during camp. Jamari Freeman is set to play right tackle, while Romello Watson's can play both guard and tackle. Providing depth are Kennedy Wilbert, Austin Peay transfer Aarion Harvey, and true freshman Hadine Diaby.

SCOUTING THE DEFENSE

Transitioning to the defensive aspect, Coach Brandon Fisher aspires for his defensive unit to maintain its formidable reputation from last year. Several talented transfers and freshmen have enhanced the roster. Notably, four defensive players from the team earned spots on the Big South-OVC Watch List, drawing attention from the conference. The Tigers showcased outstanding pass defense last season, allowing fewer than 200 yards per game (190.1). Moreover, they claimed the second-best position in total defense, permitting 363.5 yards per game.

Replacing key players in the defensive line, who moved on to FBS and graduation, proved to be a success for TSU. First-Team All-OVC defensive end Terrell Allen, returning for his second season, emerged as a pivotal player. With 36 tackles, he led the team in tackles for loss (12.0) and sacks (4.5). Chris Walker, boasting 50 tackles, 15.5 tackles for loss, and four sacks in three seasons, complements Allen on the opposite end. Cameron Stewart, now in his 5th season, joins Jalen Bell, a transfer from Mississippi Valley State, in the interior. Bell, an All-SWAC honoree, has notched impressive statistics, including 113 tackles, 26.5 for loss, and 12 sacks across 31 games.

The defensive line introduces three newcomers, each expected to contribute. True freshman Eriq George showcased his potential during fall camp. Juco transfer Lathun Snipes and DII transfer Zion Morris also displayed promise. Snipes, with 48 tackles and 3.5 sacks from two years at Butte College, and Morris, with 21 tackles and two sacks at Sewanee, offer added depth. Additionally, Emmanuel Baez, returning after missing the previous season, is set to enhance the defensive end position.

The linebacking core is led by 7th-year player James Green, who missed the last season but brings his experience from 38 career games. Former UAPB All-American linebacker Monroe Beard III, arriving in the spring, further solidifies the middle linebacker position. Ahmad Nelson, Ken Andrews, and Brent Rowe provide valuable depth.

The secondary showcases the leadership of 6th-year safety Josh Green. With 225 career tackles and nine interceptions, Green stands as the team's current leader in these categories. Grad transfer Jeremiah Josephs and 6th-year player Kenyon Garlington are instrumental in their roles. Garlington, expected to start at nickel, returns after missing the previous season. Boogie Trotter, with substantial experience from the previous season, adds to the team's defensive strength. Dion Villers and Missouri transfer Tyler Jones provide backup at Safety.

The cornerback position boasts four skilled players with extensive experience. Bryce Phillips, an All-OVC Second Team performer, excelled last season with 35 tackles and 10 pass breakups. Fondren Hollis III, equipped with 25 games over four seasons, steps into a significant role at corner. Darius Harper, contributing two interceptions, including a pick-six, in the 2022 season finale, offers depth. Jashon Watkins, who played seven games with 21 tackles, and Jalen McClendon, who demonstrated proficiency in his first two seasons, are poised to make an impact.

SCOUTING THE SPECIAL TEAMS

Jackson Foster steps in as punter, succeeding Kaleb Mosley. Foster's journey spans Western Michigan, Diablo Valley, and Nevada before joining TSU. The role of placekicker transitions to James Lowery, who previously served as the kickoff specialist for three seasons. Lowery is 2-of-2 in his career, with a long of 43 yards. Freshman Ahmed Mohamed is slated to back up Lowery. Carson Buchanan, returning for his 4th season, maintains the long snapper position, while redshirt freshman Connor Ridderhoff offers support.

Dayron Johnson, returning after a season's absence, is positioned as TSU's premier return man. His track record includes 451 kick return yards and a score, along with 156 punt return yards in 2021. His career numbers reach 1,131 kick return yards over 50 attempts, averaging 22.62 yards per return. Boogie Trotter and Delanie Majors are additional contenders in the return game.



COACHING STAFF



EDDIE GEORGE HEAD COACH

Eddie George is entering his third season as the 22nd head football coach at Tennessee State University. He was appointed to this position on April 13, 2021.

During his inaugural season, George led the Tigers to a 5-6 overall record and secured spots for 10 players on the All-OVC team. In the following year, the Tigers finished with a 4-7 record and placed seven players on the All-OVC team.

George's college football journey began at Ohio State University, where he won the Heisman Trophy in 1995. In that remarkable season, he set a school record by rushing for 1,927 yards and scoring 24 touchdowns. He also showcased his versatility by catching 47 passes for 417 yards and an additional touchdown. He left Ohio State as the second-highest career rusher (3,768 yards) and third in rushing touchdowns (44), with a total of 4,284 all-purpose yards and 45 touchdowns.

In 1996, George was the first-round draft pick of the then-Houston Oilers. He earned the NFL Rookie of the Year award and went on to serve as the starting tailback for the Oilers/ Titans until 2003, impressively never missing a start. He achieved four consecutive Pro Bowl selections (1997–2000) and contributed to the Titans' appearance in Super Bowl XXXIV. Notably, George is one of only two NFL running backs to surpass 10,000 rushing yards without missing a start, alongside Jim Brown. His 130 consecutive regular season starts are second only to Walter Payton's 170.

In 2004, George signed a one-year contract with the Dallas Cowboys, starting eight games and finishing the season with 432 yards and four touchdowns. He officially retired in 2006, culminating his career with 10,441 rushing yards, 268 receptions, 2,227 receiving yards, and 78 touchdowns (68 rushing and 10 receiving).

After retiring from playing football, George has been involved in various endeavors, including acting, broadcasting, and business ventures.

Recognized for his exceptional contributions, George was inducted into the College Football Hall of Fame in 2011 and the Philadelphia Sports Hall of Fame in 2013. He is a member of Omega Psi Phi Fraternity, Inc., and holds a board position with Music City Baseball. Hailing from Philadelphia, George earned his bachelor's degree in Landscape Architecture from Ohio State in 2001, later completing an MBA from Northwestern in 2009. He is married to Tamara "Taj" George, and they are parents to two sons, Eriq and Jaire.

COORDINATORS



THERON AYCH OFFENSIVE COORDINATOR / OB

Aych has more than 20 years of experience coaching in the college ranks. Aych spent two seasons (2020-21) as the inside wide receivers coach at UTEP. He was there previously as assistant wide receivers coach in 2016. He spent the four years in between as wide receivers and tight ends coach at Arizona. This won't be Aych's first time to be an offensive coordinator. He held the position along with being assistant head coach at Angelo State from 2011-15 and was offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Mesabi Range (Minnesota) Community College in 1997. At Angelo State, he was named a finalist for the Division II AFCA Assistant Coach of the Year award. Aych, who played receiver at Northern State (1992-95), also had coaching stints at Houston (2000-02), Washington (2003) and Fort Scott (Kansas) Community College (1998-99).



BRANDON FISHER DEFENSIVE COORDINATOR

Entering his third season as defensive coordinator, Fisher brings over a decade of high-level NFL and collegiate coaching experience to the Tigers. Prior to TSU, Fisher spent time with Auburn (2020) and Southern Utah (2019) as the defensive coordinator. The son of former Houston Oilers/Tennessee Titans and St. Louis/Los Angeles Rams head coach Jeff Fisher, Brandon Fisher spent eight seasons aAs an NFL assistant coach. Fisher began his coaching career in 2010 as an offensive assistant for the Tennessee Titans. In 2011, Fisher held the position of assistant secondary coach with the Detroit Lions under Jim Schwartz and Gunther Cunningham. After one season, Fisher joined tzhe Rams as an assistant secondary coaching, a position he held for three seasons. Fisher was a two-year starter at Montana, playing in two FCS National Chamoionship Games and made 169 career tackles.



SPECIAL TEAMS/ DEFENSIVE SPECIALIST

Renowned as one of the most exceptional special teams players in NFL history, Burns boasts an impressive record of two Super Bowl victories with the Denver Broncos and a notable 13-year tenure in the NFL as a player. Following the conclusion of his playing career, Burns transitioned into a prominent NFL assistant role, specializing in coaching special teams. He has lent his expertise to teams including the Los Angeles Chargers, Washington Football Team, and the Broncos. Burns initially showcased his talents as a standout linebacker at Oklahoma State, which led to his selection by the Broncos in the seventh round of the 1994 NFL Draft.



COACHING STAFF / RECRUITING



JOSH CRAWFORD, RUNNING BACKS

A fromer SEC player at Vanderbilt, Crawford returned to TSU as the running backs coach in July of 2023. He brings a wealth of experience to the role. He returned to the Tigers after a year as an offensive graduate assistant at Utah, where he contributed to the Utes' 2022 Pac-12 Championship victory, primarily focusing on wide receivers and scouting. Earlier, he excelled as a graduate assistant at Tennessee State, closely collaborating with linebackers and coaching standout James Green. Crawford's coaching journey extends to roles at the Orleans Darkwa Youth Football Camp and Autauga Academy in Alabama.



SCOTT BAUMGARTNER, WIDE RECEIVERS

Baumgartner arrived at TSU in March of 2023, and brings a wealth of experience to the position. With a coaching career spanning over three decades, Baumgartner has traversed various institutions and roles. His tenure includes significant stints in the Mountain West Conference at UNLV, New Mexico, and Nevada, where he notably worked with running backs, wide receivers, and special teams. Prior to his time in the Mountain West, Baumgartner also honed his coaching prowess at Central Missouri State, West Valley College in California, and his alma mater, Pacific University.



ANTHONY LEWIS OFFENSIVE LINE

Lewis started his playing career at Cisco Junior College before joining Angelo State for the 2012 and 2013 seasons on the offensive line. He was a Don Hansen third-team All-Super Region Four selection and a first-team All-SUC selection in 2013. He helped the Ram offense break the ASU single-season record for total yards per game average with 457.9. Lewis helped pave the way for Kyle Washington to become the first player to pass for at least 2,000-yards and rush for at least 1,000-yards in a single season. In 2013, Lewis also helped ASU for the most rushing yards in a single season at 3,034 yards.the 1988 NFL Draft.



MICHAEL BREWSTER, TIGHT ENDS

Former Ohio State center Michael Brewster spent the previous two seasons as a quality control coach at the University of Cincinnati. Brewster joined former Ohio State teammate Marcus Freeman on UC's defensive coaching staff in 2020. He then moved to the offensive side of the ball in 2021.. Brewster started 49 consecutive games for the Buckeyes from 2008-2011. He was a freshman All-American, first-team All-Big Ten, first-team All-American, Rimington Trophy finalist and team captain who helped Ohio State win three Big Ten titles.



JOE BOWDEN, ASST. HEAD COACH / LINEBACKERS

A former Tennessee Titans linebacker and a nine-year NFL veteran, Bowden brings over a decade of coaching experience to Tennessee State. Bowden's coaching journey encompasses roles such as the defensive coordinator and linebackers coach at Missouri Baptist over the last four seasons, following his tenure as the inside linebackers coach for the San Francisco 49ers in 2016 and the assistant linebackers coach for the St. Louis Rams from 2012 to 2015. His coaching portfolio also includes stints at Central Oklahoma, in NFL Europe, and a completed internship with the Washington Football Team. Having earned All-America honors at Oklahoma, Bowden was selected in the fifth round of the 1992 NFL Draft by the Houston Oilers. During his time in the NFL, he was a teammate of Eddie George for several seasons.



CLYDE SIMMONS, DEFENSIVE LINE

A two-time All-Pro and Philadelphia Eagles Hall of Famer, Simmons played in the NFL for 15 seasons and led the league with 19 sacks in 1992. His 121.5 career sacks ranked 11th in NFL history at the time of his retirement, prior to spending the last decade in coaching. Simmons served as the defensive line coach for the Cleveland Browns in 2017-18, mentoring the No. 1 pick Myles Garrett before coaching the defensive lines at Missouri Baptist and Western Carolina. He also worked as an assistant defensive line coach with the St. Louis/Los Angeles Rams and held a coaching internship with the New York Jets. During his tenure with the Rams, Simmons coached the three-time Pro Bowl defensive tackle and the 2014 NFL Defensive Rookie of the Year, Aaron Donald, alongside defensive end Robert Quinn. Quinn notably set a single-season franchise record with 19 sacks in 2013. Simmons' contributions extended beyond coaching, as he earned a place on the Philadelphia Eagles 75th Anniversary Team and the Western Carolina Athletics Hall of Fame



RICHARD MCNUTT, DEFENSIVE BACKS

McNutt, who won a national championship as a player at Ohio State, brings over 15 years of collegiate coaching experience to Tennessee State. In his most recent role, McNutt excelled as the defensive backs coach at Southeastern University. Prior to this, he devoted four seasons as the co-defensive coordinator and secondary coach at Youngstown State, playing a pivotal role in guiding the Penguins to an appearance in the 2016 FCS National Championship Game. McNutt's coaching journey also encompasses successful tenures at institutions including Toledo, Kent State, Northern Illinois, and NC State. He additionally spent a productive season as part of the Cleveland Browns staff

2-MINUTE OFFENSE

OPENING KICKOFF: Bryant and Eastern Illinois recorded last-second, comeback victories on field goals last weekend. The Bulldogs rallied from a 13-3 deficit at Princeton to win 16-13 in overtime on ETHAN GETTMAN's 37-vard field goal. EIU came back from a 28-7 deficit to defeat McNeese, 31-28 on STONE GALLOWAY's 56-yard field goal with :20 seconds remaining.

1st DOWN: Two rushers gained more than 200 yards on the ground this past weekend, as Eastern Illinois' MJ FLOWERS rushed for a Big South-OVC record 272 yards against McNeese, while UT Martin's SAM FRANKLIN posted his second 200-yard rushing game in three weeks with 221 in the Skyhawks' 37-21 win at North Alabama. Franklin is averaging 202.33 rushing yards in his last three outings.

2nd DOWN: Tennessee State is looking for its second consecutive 2-0 start in conference games this weekend ... UT Martin is looking to open 1-0 in league play for the third-straight season. The match-up is part of the Sgt. York Trophy series contested between the three Tennessee-based OVC schools.

3rd DOWN: UT Martin has an Association-best 3-game win streak, and during that span, the Skyhawks are averaging 47.0 points, 566.33 yards of offense and 327.67 rushing yards, while allowing just 19.7 points and 372.33

4th DOWN: UT Martin entered the Top 25 rankings following Week 4, and is currently No. 22 in the Stats Perform poll. The Big South-OVC has had a member ranked every week of the 2023 season (including preseason).

ABOUT THE BIG SOUTH-OVC FOOTBALL ASSOCIATION

This is the first season of the Big South-OVC Football Association. On Feb. 22, 2022, the Big South Conference and Ohio Valley Conference announced the creation of an association of their football member institutions to begin with the 2023 NCAA Division I football season and have an initial term of at least four years. The unique agreement combines the two conferences' football membership to ensure NCAA championship access and stability for the multisport conferences. In creating the association, presidents from each of the multisport conferences pointed to the similarities of the OVC and the Big South, with their complementary geographies and intercollegiate athletic philosophies, as key to making this association possible. The first year is comprised of 10 members. Western Illinois will join the Association beginning with the 2024 season, while Bryant will depart after this season for CAA Football.
