Nine of the 11 American Athletic Conference teams begin non-conference play this weekend as the 2016-17 season tips off.

UConn begins the season ranked No. 3 in the AP and No. 1 in the USA Today coaches' poll. USF and Temple received votes in both polls while Tulane received votes in the USA Today preseason poll.

UConn was chosen as the unanimous favorite to win The American. Junior guard Kia Nurse was named the Preseason Player of the Year. The Huskies tip off the regular season on the road against No. 12/12 Florida State in the opening game of the 2016 College Hoops Tip-Off Marathon on Monday, Nov. 14 at 6 p.m. ET on ESPN2.

The season begins on Friday for seven American Athletic Conference teams. Two others, Tulane and Houston, will make their season debut on Saturday and Sunday, respectively. SMU kicks off the action for The American with a 12:30 p.m. ET matchup against Texas State Friday in Dallas.

Three American teams play home games on opening day. In addition to SMU hosting Texas State, East Carolina welcomes Greensboro College to Greenville, N.C. (5:30 p.m. ET), while Memphis hosts Missouri State at 8 p.m. ET.

## Welcome to The American

The American welcomes two new coaches to the conference in Katie Abrahamson-Henderson (UCF) and Travis Mays (SMU).

## Nurse Named to Nancy Lieberman Watch List

UConn junior Kia Nurse was named to the 2017 Nancy Lieberman Watch List on Oct. 25. The award recognizes the top point guard in women's NCAA Division I college basketball. Candidates exhibit the floor leadership, play-making and ball handling skills of Hall of Famer Nancy Lieberman.

## The American - Well Represented in Rio

The American was well represented in the Olympic Games in Rio this summer with Geno Auriemma (UConn) and Jamelle Elliott (Cincinnati) serving as coaches for USA Basketball. Current Husky Kia Nurse was a member of the Canadian women's national team.

## Four Straight for UConn

UConn won an unprecedented fourth national championship last season. With the title, Geno Auriemma became college basketball's all-time leader in national championship with 11, surpassing John Wooden.

## Postseason Just as Nice

Five American Athletic Conference women's basketball teams were selected for postseason play in 2015-16. UConn and USF were each selected for the NCAA Tournament while Memphis, Tulane and Temple were chosen for the WNIT. The Owls advanced to the WNIT Quarterfinals.

Stiff Non-Conference Action Awaits American Teams  
USF will play in the inaugural Play4Kay Tournament in Las Vegas in December. The field includes 2016 Final Four participant Oregon State. The Bulls will also host Louisville at the Sun Dome in late January.

Memphis' non-conference schedule features SEC, Big Ten and Big 12 members Illinois, Kansas, Arkansas and Vanderbilt. The Tigers play host the Commodores at Elma Roane Fieldhouse in late December.

UConn's non-conference slate includes 10 games against 2016 NCAA Tournament teams. The Huskies will again play in the prestigious Jimmy V Classic, this time vs. Texas at Mohegan Sun Arena, home of the 2017 American Women's Basketball Championship.

Tulane will face SEC foes Vanderbilt, LSU and Mississippi State this year, and will host ACC member NC State in mid-December.

## Fantastic Four

Four players from The American (UConn's Breanna

Stewart, UConn's Moriah Jefferson, UConn's Morgan Tuck, USF's Courtney Williams) were selected in the first round of the 2016 WNBA Draft.

## Three the Hard Way

The UConn trio of Breanna Stewart, Moriah Jefferson and Morgan Tuck were selected with the first three picks of the 2016 WNBA Draft. It marked the first time in WNBA history the top three selections came from the same school.

## Williams Makes History

Courtney Williams became the first player in USF history to be chosen in the first round of the 2016 WNBA Draft.

## Cardoza Leads U18 National Team

Temple head coach Tonya Cardoza was selected as a court coach for the 2016 USA Basketball U18 National Team.

## International Competition

Houston, Memphis and Tulsa each participated in foreign tours this summer. The Cougars played exhibition games in Costa Rica while the Tigers traveled to four different cities (Madrid, Toledo, Valencia, Barcelona) during their 10-day foreign tour of Spain. Tulsa traveled to Dominican Republic in August and played exhibition games against the Dominican National Team.

## UCF (0-0, 0-0 American)

- UCF enters its first season under head coach Katie Abrahamson-Henderson.
- The Knights are the only team in the American Athletic Conference to return all five of their starters from a year ago.
- Leading the way is senior Zykira Lewis, who joined the program's top five all-time career scorers last season.
- UCF outrebounded its opponents in all but seven matchups last year and ranked 21st in the country in rebounds per game (42.7).

## EAST CAROLINA (0-0, 0-0 American)

- Thirteen of the Pirates' 29 regular season games this season come against teams that earned NCAA or NIT bids last season.
- Head coach Heather Macy collected victory No. 100 at East Carolina last season in the 80-62 win over Eastern Washington on Nov. 27. With 106 wins, Macy ranks third in Pirates history and stands four behind Catherine Bolton and 20 away from Sharon Baldwin-Tener for the top two spots in program history.
- East Carolina had at least one player record a double-double in all but seven games last season, which included a streak of 13-straight contests from Nov. 27 through Jan. 20.

- USF has made 12 postseason tournament appearances and had four NCAA Tournament berths in Head Coach Jose Fernandez's 16 seasons.
- Last season, Laksa scored a career-high 38 points against SMU (Jan. 7), the second-most points scored in a single game by any player in the American Athletic Conference history.

- Junior Kolby Morgan will return as the league's top scorer, averaging 17.2 points per game last season. The American Second Team All-Conference selection made program history last year, becoming the first Green Wave player to surpass 1,000 career points in her first two seasons.
- Senior Leslie Vorpahl was the league's top assist contributor a year ago. Vorpahl's 5.4 assists per game ranked 35th in the nation in 2015-16.

- Cincinnati was efficient from the free-throw line last season, knocking down 71.8 -percent of its attempts which ranked third-best in the American Athletic Conference.

- Serithia Hawkins returns as she led the Cougars in multiple categories last season including points, steals, and rebounds, while starting 28 games and appearing in all 30.
- Hawkins was one of three players to be unanimously selected to the 2015-16 American All-Freshman team.
