EASTERN MICHIGAN STORYLINES, STREAKS AND SIDEBARS

SAN ANTONIO, Texas -- The Eastern Michigan University women's basketball team continues its five-game road trip this weekend, Nov. 25-27, in San Antonio, Texas, at the UTSA Thanksgiving Classic.

EMU soars south with a 2-2 record after falling on the road to Wake Forest, 89-61, Nov. 20. Tulane enters the weekend with a 2-1 record, most recently beating Southern Miss, 86-67, at home. Meanwhile, Northern Colorado travels to the tournament with a 3-1 ledger and has won its past three games.

Neither WEMU nor Eagle All-Access will be making the trip to the Lonestar State to broadcast EMU's time at the UTSA Thanksgiving Classic. Fans wanting to follow the Eagles can find live stats links at EMUEagles.com/livestats.

ROBINSON EMBRACING HER NEW ROLE: After spending her first two seasons serving as the Eagles back-up point guard and amassing just 376 minutes of playing time, **Micah Robinson** has embraced her new role in her junior season. Taking on the responsibilities of the Green and White's primary ball handler, Robinson has thrived while starting all four of Eastern's games this season. Averaging a team-high 35.5 minutes per game, Robinson has scored 43 points, tying her career point total coming into the season. Additionally, the Ann Arbor product has posted career-highs in free throws (14), field goals (14), and rebounds (26).

MELVA SMITH ADDED TO THE ROSTER: Just two weeks after wrapping up her collegiate volleyball career at Eastern Michigan, senior **Melva Smith** has joined the women's basketball team and will travel to San Antonio, Texas with the team this week. A 6-foot-2 forward, Smith adds to the Eagles' size and depth in the post.

FRED CASTRO

HEAD COACH ~ FIRST SEASON AT EMU
OKLAHOMA, 2004

Fred Castro was named as the eighth Head Women's Basketball Coach at Eastern Michigan University, May 5, 2016, by Vice President/Director of Intercollegiate Athletics Heather Lyke. Castro will start his first season at EMU in 2016-17.

A rising star in the coaching world, the 36-year old Castro has spent the past 15 years climbing the ranks from student manager to now the eighth head coach in EMU program history. During his career, he has worked tirelessly to learn and has held nearly every position within a women's basketball program including serving as offensive coordinator, recruiting coordinator, video coordinator, and travel coordinator.

Castro has been a part of 10 squads that have participated in the postseason since the 2001-02 campaign, including a pair of trips to the NCAA Tournament Final Four. In 15 years of coaching, his teams have combined to post a 317-171 record (.650 winning percentage) and eight seasons of 20-or-more victories.

Castro comes to Ypsilanti following a three year stint in Seattle as an assistant coach with the Huskies, in which Washington posted a 69-35 record and a trip to the 2016 NCAA Tournament Final Four. He worked with the guards and acted as the team's offensive coordinator as the Huskies defeated 14 top-25 programs during his tenure.

A storybook 2015-16 campaign saw Washington post a 26-11 record and the program's first Final Four appearance. Dealing with a short bench due to injuries, the Huskies utilized a six-woman rotation as it tore through the NCAA Tournament, including beating No. 4 Stanford, 85-76, to win the South Regional. Washington finished the year ranked in the top 50 in 11 statistical categories including: free throws made (521 - 6th), free throw percentage (78.0% - 6th), three-pointers made (271 - 17th) and rebounds (1,437 - 23rd).

Castro tutored USBWA All-America honoree Kelsey Plum, who was fourth in the nation in scoring at 25.9 points per game, while leading the country in total points with 960. In addition to her scoring prowess, Plum averaged 3.7 rebounds and 4.2 assists, while leading the nation in both free throws made (266) and attempted (299). The junior guard broke the Washington record for points in a season, while also setting the Pacific-12 Conference record for career free throws made.

Castro's guards saw success in 2014-15 as he coached Plum and Jazmine Davis through a record-breaking season. Plum finished her season ranked seventh in the nation in scoring and second in free throws made. Additionally, she set UW single-season records in 30-point games (7), free throws made (207) and percentage (89.6%), single season scoring (746 points), and points in a game with 45 against Oklahoma. Davis completed her senior season with the Dawgs as the UW all-time leader in six categories including points, three-point field goals and free throws made. She also became the first four-time All-Pac-12 player in UW history.

In his first year with the program, Washington earned a trip to the quarterfinals of the Postseason WNIT. The Huskies finished 20-14, including 10-8 in the Pac-12. The Dawgs defeated five teams that were ranked at some point during the season, including an upset of then-No. 3 Stanford at Alaska Airlines Arena in front of a nationally televised audience. The win ended the 58-game road conference winning streak of the Cardinal.

On the recruiting trail, Washington national prominence continued to improve with the 2016 recruiting class ranked 16th-best in the country. Castro inked a McDonald's All-American in 2015 class, while UW's 2014 incoming group was ranked in the top-25 nationally.

He arrived at Washington from the University of Tulsa where he served as assistant coach and recruiting coordinator from 2011-13. When Castro arrived at Tulsa, the Golden Hurricane were coming off just five wins, but in 2013 they won the Conference USA Tournament title and advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

Castro helped put together a pair of top-50 recruiting

classes at Tulsa, while also assisting with on-floor coaching, including practice planning, player development and scouting. His final recruiting class was ranked 39th nationally and fourth amongst mid-majors.

In 2012, Castro was first invited to the Nike Villa 7 Clinic for the top 30 assistant coaches in the country. He attended the clinic yearly from 2012-15.

In addition to Castro's duties at Tulsa, he worked as an advance scout for the WNBA's Atlanta Dream.

Castro worked as an assistant coach at the University of Albany during the 2010-11 season. He was responsible for on-the-floor coaching, game scouting, recruiting, game scheduling and served as the liaison to academic and athlete support services. Castro helped coach the Great Danes to their first winning season since becoming a Division I program in 1999.

Prior to his stint at Albany, Castro was an assistant coach at Mercer University for two seasons (2008-10), where he helped coach the second-best turnaround in the country during the 2008-09 season with a 17-13 record, improving from the 2007-08 season by 12 wins, and earn the No. 2 seed in the Atlantic Sun Conference a year later.

Castro was an advance scout for the WNBA's Minnesota Lynx in 2009-10.

Previously, Castro was an assistant men's basketball coach at Rogers State University, an NAIA program in the Sooner Athletic Conference, during its inaugural season in 2007-08 where they went 20-11.

He also held various positions for the University of Oklahoma women's basketball program from 2001-07, including video/travel coordinator (2005-07), volunteer coach (2004-05) and manager/scout team player (2001-04). While with the Sooners, Castro was part of six consecutive NCAA Tournament teams, including a Final Four squad in 2002 and back-to-back Sweet Sixteen teams. Oklahoma captured four Big 12 Conference Tournament championships and three regular-season crowns as well during his time on campus.

Castro, who hails from Denton, Texas, is a graduate of Oklahoma with a bachelor's degree in aviation, and was an instructor in the Aviation Department in 2004-05.

He and his wife, Cindy, have a daughter, Aliya (7) and a son, Alonzo (1).

EMU AGAINST THIS WEEKEND'S OPPONENTS ALL-TIME: Eastern Michigan has met Tulane once previously ahead of this weekend's meeting, while the Green and White and Northern Colorado will meet for the first time in program history. EMU's lone meeting with TU came back in the 2012 at the Tulane Holiday Tournament. There, the Green Wave handed the Eagles a 71-65 setback, Dec. 29. Four players reached double figures in scoring for EMU, while **Natachia Watkins** posted a double-double with 17 points and a team-high 12 rebounds.

EAGLES VERSUS THE AMERICAN: The Eagles are 7-7 against the American Athletic Conference in program history. EMU boasts winning records versus South Florida (3-0), Tulsa (1-0), UCF (1-0), while trailing in the all-time series with Cincinnati (1-4), SMU (0-1), and Tulane (0-1). Meanwhile, Eastern sits even at 1-1 against Temple.

TAKING ON THE BIG SKY: While Eastern Michigan has never squared off against Northern Colorado on the hardwood, EMU has taken on Big Sky Conference opponents eight times previously. The Eagles are 3-5 against the Ogden, Utah based league all-time. EMU has been most successful versus Weber State, going 2-1 against the Wildcats. The Eagles have also split against North Dakota (1-1), while EMU is winless versus Northern Arizona (0-1) and Idaho State (0-2).

EMU AND THE IN-SEASON TOURNAMENT: The Eagles have fared extremely well in there last four in-season tournaments. The Eagles are 6-2 in those contests with an average margin of victory of 5.9 points a contest.

In 2013-14, EMU went 2-0 at the Seawolves Holiday Classic in Stony Brook, N.Y., Dec. 21-22. The following season, Eastern Michigan posted a 2-0 mark at the Hotel Encanto Thanksgiving Classic in Las Cruces, N.M., Nov. 28-29. Last year, the Eagles split a pair of games at the Air Force Tournament. Most recently, the Green and White turned in a 1-1 record at the Donna Murphy Classic in Morehead, Ky, Nov. 12-13. There, EMU topped Georgia State, 69-59, before falling to Morehead State, 78-73.

RACKING UP THE REJECTIONS: Through the first four games, the Eagles have registered 16 blocks, a mark that ranks them top in the league and 69th nationally. The Green and White average 4.0 rejections per game, a mark that would rank second all-time if the Eagles can keep up that pace this season.

ROAD WARRIORS: Eastern Michigan opens the season with just one home game in its first seven contests. Since beginning play in 1976-77, EMU holds a 207-288 record when playing away from its home court. This season, the Green and White are 1-2 in games away from Ypsilanti.

RUNNIN' THE FLOOR: Through three games, the Eagles have showcased their ability to get out in transition and take advantage of numbers, as EMU has outscored opponents 43-16 in fastbreak points this season.

SPARKING THE EAGLES OFF THE BENCH: Junior **Sasha Dailey** has been lights out this season, coming off the bench for the Eagles. Dailey is averaging 22.5 points, 7.5 rebounds, two steals, and just under an assist per game through EMU's first four contests. The Toledo, Ohio native has led the Eagles to a 115-95 advantage in bench scoring.

CASHING IN ON SECOND CHANCE OPPORTUNITIES: The Eagles have totaled 179 rebounds through three games, including 67 boards that came on the offensive end of the floor. EMU has made the most of its second chance opportunities, cashing them in for 55 points.

LAST TIME OUT: Eastern Michigan opened a five-game road trip Sunday, Nov. 20, against the Demon Deacons of Wake Forest University at Lawrence Joel Veterans Memorial Coliseum in Winston-Salem, N.C. The Eagles could not keep pace with the Demon Deacons' hot shooting, eventually falling 89-61.

Four players reached double figures in scoring for the Eagles. Junior **Sasha Dailey** led the way with a team-high 15 points, while also adding two steals. Fellow junior **Micah Robinson** added 13 points, seven rebounds, and five assists to fill up the stat sheet. Meanwhile, senior **Sheyna Deans** and **Phillis Webb** added 10 apiece.

ON THE HORIZON: The Eagles round out their five-game road trip Tuesday, Nov. 29, against Incarnate Word. After wrapping up play at the UTSA Thanksgiving Classic, Nov. 27, the Green and White take on the Cardinals at 5:30 p.m. CT inside the McDermott Convocation Center.

CLIMBING THE RANKS: Senior **Phillis Webb** came into her final season ranked 21st in Eastern Michigan history with 509 rebounds. This season, Webb has grabbed 23 boards, moving her into 20th-place with 532 caroms. **Nikki Knapp** holds the program record with 802 career rebounds, while Webb is 19 boards behind **Traci Parsons** for 19th-place on the all-time list.

WEBB WORKING TOWARDS 1,000 POINT MARK: Senior **Phillis Webb** stands 272 points short of the 1,000-point mark in her final season donning the Green and White. Webb amassed 677 points for her career through her first three seasons, and has scored 57 points so far this year. If Webb eclipses four-digits, she will become the 21st player in program history to score at least 1,000 points during their career.

POST PRODUCTION: After relying on the scoring from its guards in the first two games of the year, the Green and White received some lofty production from its posts in an 18-point win over Ferris State, Nov. 16. Redshirt junior **Ashley Nickens** and freshman **Becca Turney** combined for 17 points, 16 rebounds, five blocks, one steal, and one assist. Previously, EMU's bigs had combined for just eight rebounds, two points, and two blocks.



TURNERY TAKES CHARGE: Freshman **Becca Turney** had a career-day in EMU's 68-50 victory against Ferris State, Nov. 16. The 6-foot-3 center grabbed a career-best 12 rebounds, while posting five blocks and a steal to go along with five points. With a dozen boards, Turney tied the season-high for the Eagles, while her five rejections rank tied for seventh-most in single-game history at EMU.

NICKENS TURNS IN CAREER DAY: Redshirt junior **Ashley Nickens** came into the home opener against Ferris State, Nov. 16, having played just three minutes this season. Against the Bulldogs, Nickens registered 12 points, four rebounds, and an assist, all of which were career-bests, in a career-high 22 minutes of action.

BLOCK PARTY: The Eagles posted a season-high seven blocks in their 68-50 win over Ferris State, Nov. 16. Freshman **Becca Turney** led the rejection effort with a career-high five blocks on the day, the seventh-most in EMU single-game history. Additionally, Turney's denials are tied for the second-most in Convocation Center history.

50+ ON THE GLASS: In the past two games, the Eagles have grabbed a combined 113 rebounds. The Green and White grabbed a season-high 57 against Morehead State, Nov. 13, and fell one short of that mark, Nov. 16, versus Ferris State. EMU has posted back-to-back 55+ rebound efforts for the first time in more than 20 years.

WINNING HIS DEBUT: **Fred Castro**, the ninth women's basketball coach in program history, became the fifth coach at EMU to win their first game in their Eagle debut with a 69-59 victory over Georgia State, Nov. 12. Here's how Eastern Michigan's eight previous head coaches fared in their first game:

OWNING THE GLASS: Eastern Michigan grabbed a season-high 57 rebounds, Nov. 13, in a loss to Morehead State. The total marked the most by the Eagles since the Green and White tallied 60 rebounds against Ohio, Jan. 13, 2016. Of EMU's 57 boards, 28 of them came on the offensive end, the most since Eastern set the single-game team rebounding record with a 71-rebound effort against Marygrove, Nov. 30, 2013. In that game, the Eagles corralled 31 offensive rebounds.

HOME COURT ADVANTAGE: The Eagles have racked up a solid home-court advantage inside the friendly confines of the Convocation Center since the doors opened during the 1998-99 campaign. Eastern Michigan has won 73 of the last 97 home games dating back to the 2008-09 season. The Green and White have won 68.2 percent of the contests played in the building, piling up a 167-78 all-time mark.

TRIPLE THE DOUBLE-DOUBLES: In Sunday's loss to Morehead State, the Eagles did something they have done just twice since the 1999-00 campaign - with three players collecting double-doubles in the same game. Junior **Sasha Dailey** led the way with 29 points and a career-high 12 rebounds for the first double-double of her career, while seniors **Phillis Webb** and **Sheyna Deans** also posted double figures in both points and rebounds. Webb scored 16 points and grabbed 10 rebounds for the fifth double-double of her tenure, tying her for 12th all-time. Like Dailey, Deans posted the first double-double effort of her career, tying a career-high with 16 points and adding a career-best 10 boards. Together, the trio became the first Eagles to accomplish the feat since **Olivia Fouty** (12 p/10 r), **Natachia Watkins** (21 p/14 r), and **Paige Redditt** (21 p/13 r) did so against Miami, Feb. 4, 2012.

DAILEY GOES OFF: Junior **Sasha Dailey** provided a spark off the bench for the Eagles over the weekend at the Donna Murphy Classic. After recording 18 points, six rebounds, and a steal against Georgia State, Nov. 12, Dailey turned in one her best games to-date, Nov. 13. The Toledo, Ohio product erupted for 29 points with a career-high 12 rebounds for the first double-double of her career against Morehead State.

WEBB NAMED MVP IN WIN OVER GEORGIA STATE: At the conclusion of EMU's 69-59 win over Georgia State, Nov. 12, senior **Phillis Webb** was named the game's Most Valuable Player by the Morehead State Athletic Department. Webb scored a career-high 24 points on 9-of-12 shooting, including a 2-of-3 showing from deep.

LEVINE'S HELPING HAND: In her EMU debut, freshman **Esabelle Levine** split time running point with junior **Micah Robinson** and showed the ability to be the orchestrator of the Eagle offense. Levine dished out a team-best six assists, while turning the ball over just twice, in EMU's win over Georgia State, Nov. 12. In addition to finding an open teammate, Levine knocked down three triples for a total of nine points to help stretch the floor.

12 TEAMS, 12 LEAGUES: The Eagles' 12-game non-conference schedule pits the Green and White against institutions from 12 different leagues. Eastern Michigan will face off against member schools of the Ohio Valley, Sun Belt, GLIAC, ACC, American, WAC, Southland, Horizon League, Atlantic-10, MAAC, Big Ten, and Mountain West. Collectively, the Eagles hold a combined record of 140-133 against the 12 conferences.

GREEN AND WHITE DOWN LAWRENCE TECH IN EXHIBITION GAME: Eastern Michigan outlasted Lawrence Tech, 74-54, in its lone exhibition game, Nov. 6. Senior **Sheyna Deans** led a balanced offense for the Eagles. Deans scored a game-high 20 points, while adding 10 rebounds, three assists, three steals, and one block in a stat-stuffing performance. Freshman **Esabelle Levine**, senior **Phillis Webb**, and junior **Tori Easley** added nine points apiece. Meanwhile, junior **Micah Robinson** dished out a game-high seven assists to go along with seven points and four rebounds.

YOUTH ON THE COURT AND ON THE SIDELINES: Since becoming the head man for the Eagles, Fred Castro has assembled one of the youngest coaching staffs in the nation. Castro and assistant coaches **Adam Call**, **Abi Olajuwon**, and **Cassandra Callaway** have a combined average age of 30.75 years, making them the fifth-youngest coaching staff in the nation. McNeese is home to the youngest staff in the nation with an average age of 27.25 years, while Columbia (27.75) and High Point (28.7) rounded out the top-three.

IN SEARCH OF A SCORER: EMU returns just 30.3 percent of the scoring from last season's squad, leaving the Eagles in search of a consistent point-scorer. Senior **Phillis Webb** and **Sheyna Deans** will be looked upon heavily while freshman adjust to the collegiate level. The Green and White also return juniors **Tori Easley**, **Sasha Dailey**, and **Micah Robinson** who are poised to have career years, while **Ashley Nickens** is eligible after transferring from Cincinnati ahead of the 2015-16 campaign.

YOUTH MOVEMENT: The Eagles roster is made up of five returners and seven newcomers and has combined to play just 4,635 minutes coming into the season, the least of any team in the Mid-American Conference. Senior **Phillis Webb** is the most experienced player on Eastern's roster, having played a total of 2,342 minutes through her first three seasons. Additionally, Webb has played more than twice as many minutes as Sasha Dailey (1,114 minutes), the second-most experienced Eagle on the roster.

35TH YEAR IN MAC: The 2016-17 season marks the 35th season Eastern Michigan will compete as a member of the Mid-American Conference. Having been a member of the Cleveland, Ohio based league since the 1981-82 campaign, the Green and White have compiled a 266-317 record against conference opponents all-time.

COACHING DEBUT: The 2016-17 season marks the first as a head coaching for EMU bench boss, **Fred Castro**. A rising star in the coaching world, the 36-year old Castro has spent the past 15 years climbing the ranks from student manager to now the eighth head coach in EMU program history. During his career, he has worked tirelessly to learn and has held nearly every position within a women's basketball program, including serving as offensive coordinator, recruiting coordinator, video coordinator, and travel coordinator.

WELCOMING A NEW FLOCK INTO THE FOLD: Head Coach **Fred Castro** bolstered the Eagles' lineup with a strong incoming class featuring several key freshmen and two talented transfers. **Nailah Mitchell**, **Esabelle Levine**, **Corrione Cardwell**, **Jayla Russ**, and **Becca Turney** make up the freshman class, while **Danielle Minott** and **Lorraine Enabulele** join the Eagles from Syracuse and Kansas, respectively. While Minott and Enabulele have to sit out this season due to NCAA transfer rules, the deep freshmen class will be looked upon to contribute right away.

Thanks to the addition of EMU Athletics' own production trailer, the Eagles' men's and women's basketball games will all be provided to more than 99 million homes across the world. Fans will be able to access these games online at WatchESPN.com, on smartphones and tablets via the WatchESPN app and streamed on televisions through Amazon Fire TV and Fire TV STick, Apple TV, Chromecast, Roku, Xbox 360, and Xbox One.

EAGLES MAKE POSTSEASON FOR NINTH TIME: While their Mid-American Conference Tournament Championship run fell short, the Eagles 2015-16 season run earned them an invite to the WNIT. The Green and White made its ninth postseason appearance in program history. Eastern Michigan upended Saint Mary's, 74-73, in the first round on a putback by **Chanise Baldwin** with 3.7 seconds remaining to advance to the second round. The Eagles' season came to a close with an 85-81 loss to Texas Christian despite a late rally by the Green and White.

CASTRO AND STAFF SIGN TOP RECRUITING CLASS IN THE MAC: Eastern Michigan University Head Women's Basketball Coach **Fred Castro** announced the signing of his inaugural recruiting class of four high school seniors to National Letters of Intent Wednesday, Nov. 9. The Eagles inked **Courtne Lewis** (Belton, Mo.-Belton), **Autumn Hudson** (Richwood, Ohio-North Union), **RayJon Harris** (Euclid, Ohio-Euclid), and **Juanita Agosto** (Seattle, Wa.-Garfield).

Since arriving in Ypsilanti in May, Castro and his staff have hit the recruiting trail hard, securing the top-ranked recruiting class in the Mid-American Conference and 58th overall according to prospectnation.com. EMU's group features four nationally ranked recruits, including one four-star and one three star according to prospectnation.com.

MOREHEAD, Ky. (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University women's basketball team opened the 2016-17 season with a 69-59 win over Georgia State University Saturday night, Nov. 12, at the Donna Murphy Classic. The Eagles (1-0, 0-0 MAC) led by as many as 21 points, while Fred Castro picked up his first career win as a head coach.

Offensively, senior **Phillis Webb** paced the Eagles, scoring a career-high 24 points on 9-of-12 shooting. Webb also added six rebounds, four steals, and two assists to round out her stat line. Junior **Sasha Dailey** also reached double figures, notching 18 points and six rebounds. Freshman **Esabelle Levine** finished the day 3-of-6 from deep for nine points to go along with six assists and a steal in her EMU debut.

As a team, the Green and White connected on 43.9 percent of its field goals, including converting 6-of-15 shots from beyond the arc. Meanwhile, the EMU defense forced Georgia State to commit 23 turnovers on 10 steals. The Eagles turned the Panthers' miscues into 22 points.

The Eagles rallied around their aggressive defense and transition game in the first quarter, forcing five Georgia State turnovers over the first five minutes of play to jumping out to a 7-3 lead. With the Panthers charging back out of the media timeout senior **Sheyna Deans** corralled her own and kicked out to Dailey for the triple. The next time down the floor, GSU cashed in from the charity stripe to cut EMU's lead to two, 10-8. EMU came right back with an answer, moving the ball around the outside before Levine knocked down a three to extend the Eagles' lead. The late surge by the Green and White put Eastern in front, 17-11, through one quarter of play.

In the second quarter, the Eagles pushed their lead to as many as 16, but a 7-0 run by the Panthers pulled GSU within nine, 29-20 as the teams approached the midway mark. From there, EMU's defense locked in again, holding the Panthers without a field goal for more than three minutes, while Dailey led an 8-2 run. Scoring six points over the course of a two minute stretch, Dailey pushed Eastern's lead 15. The Panthers rallied in the closing minutes, outscoring the Eagles, 9-0, to cut EMU's edge to 37-31 at halftime.

Georgia State came out of halftime hot, using an early run to pull within four, 35-31, but the Eagles responded with five minutes of shutdown defense. The Green and White held the Panthers without a basket and forced five turnovers over a four minute span to force and GSU timeout with 4:30 to play in the third quarter. Offensively, the Webb, Dailey, and juniors **Tori Easley** and **Micah Robinson** scored to give EMU a 14-point cushion.

Out of the timeout, GSU scored but Webb provided the answer, banking in a jumper from the free throw line. EMU went shot-for-shot with the Panthers to close out the third frame with a 57-46 advantage.

The Panthers scored first in the final quarter before EMU went on a 12-0 run to get out to its largest lead of the game, 69-48, with four minutes to play. A pair of baskets and a free throw cut the score to, 69-53, in favor the Eagles with just over three minutes to play.

From there, Georgia State shrunk Eastern's advantage to as few as 10 but the Eagles stood strong, eventually coming away with a 69-59 victory.

At the conclusion of the game Webb was named the Most Valuable Player by the Morehead State athletic department.

MOREHEAD, Ky. (EMUEagles.com) – Three double-doubles were not enough to lift the Eastern Michigan University women's basketball team past Morehead State University Sunday afternoon, Nov. 13, at the Donna Murphy Classic. Despite a late comeback that pulled the Eagles (1-1, 0-0 MAC) within three late in the fourth quarter, EMU fell, 78-73.

A trio of upperclassmen led the way for Eastern Michigan, becoming the first trio since Feb. 4, 2012, to post double-doubles in the same game. Junior **Sasha Dailey** scored a game-high 29 points, while also grabbing a career-high 12 rebounds for the first double-double of her career. Senior **Sheyna Deans** also picked up the first double-double of her career, tying a career-high with 16 points and grabbing a career-best 10 rebounds. Meanwhile, senior **Phillis Webb** picked up the fifth double-double effort of her EMU tenure with 17 points and 10 rebounds.

As a team, the Green and White shot just 28.6 percent from the floor, while MSU converted field goals at a 40.6 clip. Free throw shooting kept EMU within striking distance throughout the game, as the Eagles converted 25-of-33 attempts from the charity stripe. Defensively, Eastern held a 57-44 advantage on the glass. The 57 boards marked the most by EMU since Jan. 13, 2016 when Eastern grabbed a season-high 60 caroms against Ohio University.

From the opening tip, Morehead State used its speed and physical play to dictate the pace of the game. MSU broke off an 8-0 run over the first 2:19 of action, while forcing the Green and White into three turnovers. Taking a timeout to regroup, Eastern came out of the break and drew a MSU foul, giving EMU possession under its own basket. Deans provided the spark off the bench, sinking a three on the inbound before taking it to the basket to pull EMU within six, 11-5. Corraling the defensive rebound, Deans ran the floor ultimately laying it in for two. After a free throw, the offenses on both sides stalled. EMU went 0-for-9, while MSU went 0-for-8 over a 4:27 span. The Green and White broke through after freshman **Rebecca Turney** secured a steal and Deans hit a triple to level the score at 11. Morehead State regained the lead with a jumper, ending a five-minute scoring drought but junior **Micah Robinson** sank a mid-range shot from the baseline to even the score at 13.

MSU ran out to a 21-19 lead in the second quarter, at which point the Green and White offense began to attack the rim. Driving to the hoop, Eastern opened up the mid-range game and worked its way to the free throw line to take a 28-23 edge. Heading into the media timeout with five, Morehead State closed the quarter on a 6-3 run, leaving the score tied at 34 at halftime.

11 unanswered points by Morehead State helped begin the third quarter force EMU to burn a timeout with 4:43 remaining. Eastern connected on just 10 percent of its shots (2-for-20) in the period, while Morehead State shot at 69.2 clip, allowing MSU to hold a 59-44 edge with 10 minutes to play.

The Green and White staged a comeback in the fourth quarter, making its way to the free throw line and taking it to the MSU defense. Eastern went 10-of-10 from the line in the final period, while outscoring Morehead State, 29-19, but came up short. Webb hit a layup with 1:34 left in regulation to cut MSU's lead to 70-67, but Morehead converted clutch free throws down the stretch to hand EMU the 78-73 setback.

YPSILANTI, Mich. (EMUEagles.com) – The Eastern Michigan University women's basketball team opened its 2016-17 home schedule with a 68-50 non-conference victory over Ferris State University Wednesday afternoon, Nov. 16, inside the Convocation Center.

The Eagles (2-1, 0-0 MAC) were led offensively by junior **Sasha Dailey** who had a game-high 28 points and nine rebounds, finishing just shy of a double-double. Redshirt junior **Ashley Nickens** scored her first points as an Eagle, finishing with a career-best 12, while junior **Micah Robinson** was the other EMU player in double figures with 10. Freshman **Becca Turney** had a career game as well, finishing with career-highs in both rebounds and blocks, tallying 12 and five, respectively. Turney's five rejections were the most by an Eagle this season and tied for seventh-most in single-game history. Additionally, she is just the second Eagle to record five or more blocks in a game since 2003.

As a team, EMU was fierce on the defensive end, totaling seven blocks, and 11 steals, which turned into 24 of EMU's 68 points. The Eagles held the Bulldogs without a double-digit scorer as well. Offensively, EMU out-scored FSU by a 44-28 margin in the paint and 40-25 off the bench.

Eastern started out with the first six points of the contest with three points each from Robinson and Dailey, but the Bulldogs rattled off five straight of their own to make it 6-5 at the seven minute mark. A layup from Dailey and back-to-back buckets from Nickens made the tally 12-9 into the media timeout.

Out of the break, EMU went on a 9-2 run to jump ahead 21-11 at the 2:30 mark. Dailey contributed five points on the run, including the first three-ball of the game for the Eagles. FSU responded toward the end of the first with 7-2 run of their own to cut the score to 23-18 at the end of one.

The Bulldogs hit a pair of shots to begin the second to make it a three-point game, but Turney laid one in right after to stop the bleeding and make the score 25-20 with just under nine minutes until the half.

Both offenses went cold for the next two plus minutes, keeping the five point game until 6:20 when a Nickens layup and Dailey three-pointer made it 30-22. EMU and FSU traded baskets the rest of the way, and at the half, Eastern led by seven, 36-29.

After the break, Eastern held Ferris State without points until the eight minute mark and without a field goal until 7:30 to go. Meanwhile, EMU only got a pair of buckets themselves and led 42-32 at the under seven minute point.

The lead remained at 10 until about 3:30 when Eastern began to pull away. Dailey free throws, followed by a layup by Robinson got things started. Then, after two more buckets from Dailey, Eastern found themselves up 52-37.

After an Eastern timeout with a minute left, junior **Tori Easley** nailed a shot to give Eastern its biggest lead, 54-37. FSU then hit a three at the buzzer to make it 54-40 into the fourth quarter.

Eastern got one free throw to start the final frame, but Ferris State hit another three and got a free throw to cut their deficit to 11. The Eagles responded immediately, rattling off the next eight points on layups from four different players, and extending the lead to 61-44 with three minutes to play.

With the 17 point lead, the Eagles coated down the stretch, leading by as many as 20, and finishing with the 18-point win, 68-50.

The Eagles could not keep pace with the Demon Deacons' hot shooting, eventually falling 89-61.

Four players reached double figures in scoring for the Eagles. Junior **Sasha Dailey** led the way with a team-high 15 points, while also adding two steals. Fellow junior **Micah Robinson** added 13 points, seven rebounds, and five assists to fill up the stat sheet. Meanwhile, senior **Sheyna Deans** and **Phillis Webb** added 10 apiece.

As a team, the Eagles converted just 35.9 percent (23-of-64) of their shots from the floor, while the Demon Deacons knocked down 50.0 percent (34-of-68) of their attempts. Three-point shooting fell in favor of WFU as well, as Wake Forest outshot Eastern 57.1-20.0 from distance.
