### SERIES NOTES: LSU Leads 29-8

• LSU leads the series 29-8 dating back to the first meeting during the 1975-76 season, but five of Tulane's eight wins over LSU have come in the last six matchups. Tulane is 5-1 over the Lady Tigers in the last six seasons, including three-straight wins before then-16th ranked LSU notched the 63-35 win in New Orleans during the 2013-14 season. The Green Wave answered that defeat with wins the last two seasons.

• LSU won 17-consecutive games over Tulane from the 1975-76 season to the 1994-95 season when the Green Wave snapped the streak with a 57-50 win in Baton Rouge, which was also Lisa Stockton's first year at Tulane. The Green Wave went on to the first round of the NCAA Tournament that year.

• Fifteen of the matchups between the two squads have been played after the first of the year, though 15 of the last 17 games have been played before Jan. 1. LSU owns an 8-2, record over Tulane in games played in December.

• The two teams played 22 consecutive seasons, from 1979-80 until 2000-01 before taking a two-year hiatus. The series picked back up again in 2003-04 and this will be the 14th-straight meeting between LSU and Tulane.

• While LSU holds the 15-4 advantage in games played at the PMAC, Tulane has won the last three meetings in Baton Rouge. LSU's last home win was on Nov. 24, 2008.

**Media Credentials**

All requests for working press, photo and broadcast credentials for 2016-17 home basketball games should be made to Jennifer Rodrigues at jrodrigues@lsu.edu. Single-game credentials must be requested no later than NOON the day before the game. All credentials which cannot be mailed are left at the will-call media table inside the Northeast Corridor entrance of the Maravich Center. The press parking lot will be in Lot 300 on North Stadium Drive next to the Broussard Training Room.

**Press Work Area**

The Press Room is located in the Northeast Corridor of the Maravich Center.

**Post Game Interviews**

Post Game Interviews, including coaches and players from both teams, will be held in the Interview Room approximately 10 minutes following the game. The Interview Room is located in the LSU Basketball Practice Facility.

**Game Information**

Game Information will be provided on press row. Quarter stats will be distributed after each quarter, and complete books will be available approximately 20 minutes after the game. LSU also provides real time statistics through its touch-screen stat iPads and live stats are also available through [www.LSU.StatBroadcast.com](http://www.LSU.StatBroadcast.com).

**Radio Lines**

Courtesy phone lines and ISDN lines are installed on press row for visiting radio broadcasts for Southeastern Conference teams. Other teams wishing to broadcast a game must contact Chris Blair of the LSU Sports Radio Network at (225) 578-1882.

**Photographers**

LSU will follow NCAA and SEC rules regarding the media representatives photographing the game. Photographers are limited to working the designated space along the end line of the playing court. No credentials will be issued to freelance photographers, cutline writers, and equipment carriers. Photographers will not be permitted to shoot from the sidelines. All photographers must remain seated on the floor in areas directly in front of fans on the baseline. Videotaping from a kneeling position will not be permitted.

**Wireless Internet Access**

Wireless internet access is available in the press room and on press row of the Maravich Center. Wireless information is located on the top of the flip card on game day.

**Postgame in the PMAC**

Nikki Fargas and players will be in the media room of the practice facility after the game, following the NCAA cooling-off period and courtside radio postgame show.

The visiting coach and a key player (up to the visiting SID's discretion) will be available in the media room prior to LSU.

To reach the media room, take the Northwest Corridor portal (where the LSU team enters the floor). When reaching the multi-purpose room and the glass doors, turn right. Before reaching the steps, turn left and then take a right down the first hallway to the double wood doors and enter the media room. LSU marshalls will help direct you to the area. You can also enter from the outside of the PMAC to the right of the media entrance.

Nikki Fargas knows success and what it takes to be successful. Entering her sixth season at the helm of the Lady Tiger Basketball program in 2016-17, Fargas vows to place the Lady Tigers back into national prominence.

"We're going to do everything in our power to make sure that LSU Women's Basketball is back at that elite level, that we are competing for SEC championships, and that we are positioning ourselves to cut down nets," said Fargas.

Fargas has produced a trio of 20-win seasons and an overall record of 99-73 in six seasons at LSU. Her 99 victories ranks her as the second-winningest Lady Tiger basketball coach in school history in terms of total wins, just behind legendary coach Sue Gunter. In her first five seasons, LSU has secured four NCAA Tournament appearances highlighted by back-to-back trips to the NCAA Sweet 16, and 18 victories over ranked opponents.

Fargas, who won national championships as both a player and an assistant coach at Tennessee and turned UCLA into a national power in just three years, has that combination of outstanding in-game coaching ability and tremendous recruiting competence. In addition, Fargas has been a leader off the court in the Baton Rouge community, helping the Lady Tigers connect with the city of Baton Rouge while donating their time and efforts to making a difference. She and her Lady

Tigers were heavily involved in assisting residents and local church communities following the devastating flood in August 2016 that impacted thousands of people in the area.

In the classroom, LSU has been a shining example of the definition of student-athlete. The Lady Tigers have recorded a perfect score of 100 in graduation success rate released by the NCAA during three seasons under Fargas. For players who have exhausted their eligibility at LSU, Fargas boasts a 100-percent graduation rate. Over the last five years, the Lady Tigers have earned 18 SEC Academic Honor Roll accolades.

Well respected in coaching circles, Fargas has twice been selected by the USA Women's Basketball Committee to serve as an assistant coach for USA National Teams. In the summer of 2012, she became the first coach in LSU history to serve on a USA U18 team staff since the squad's inception in 1988. That team claimed the gold medal at the FIBA Americas Championship. In the summer of 2013, most of that group reunited to lead the USA U19 National Team to a gold medal at the FIBA World Championships in Lithuania. Fargas is the only coach in LSU history to claim multiple USA gold medals during her tenure as Lady Tiger head coach.

Fargas has been a part of a championship and winning pedigree at every level of her career and owns an impressive 576-174 record as a player, graduate assistant, assistant

coach and head coach dating back to her freshman season at Tennessee. She played, coached and studied under one of the game's greatest figures, the legendary Pat Summitt at Tennessee and she assisted Women's Basketball Hall of Famer Debbie Ryan at Virginia.

Widely recognized as one of the nation's top assistant coaches during stints at Tennessee and Virginia, Fargas took over at UCLA in 2008. In three years with the Bruins, she turned around a UCLA program that had won only one NCAA Tournament game in the nine years prior to her arrival. Fargas led the Bruins to a 72-26 (.735) overall mark, reached the NCAA Tournament twice and finished second in the Pac-10 Conference in both 2010 and 2011.

Off the court, Fargas is a passionate crusader for breast cancer awareness. She and Tennessee head coach Holly Warlick founded the non-profit organization, Champions for a Cause. Since 2007, they have raised over \$300,000 through Cruisin' for a Cause, a long-haul motorcycle adventure to raise dollars and awareness for a cure for breast cancer.

Fargas, was raised in Oak Ridge, Tenn., by her mother, Jean Caldwell. She and her husband Justin Fargas are the proud parents of a four-year-old daughter, Justice Simone Fargas.

NEW ORLEANS, La. – The LSU women's basketball team dropped a 67-63 decision to the Tulane Green Wave at Devlin Fieldhouse Monday evening.

Sophomore guard Jenna Deemer returned to her hometown of New Orleans and led LSU in scoring for her third consecutive game with 19 points, tying her season high. Deemer was 5-of-10 from the field and a perfect 3-of-3 on three-point shots and 6-of-6 from the charity stripe.

Senior Akilah Bethel and freshman Shanice Norton also scored in double digits with 10 points apiece. Bethel led the team in rebounding for the second-straight game with seven boards. She also dished out a team-high three assists and forced three steals. Junior Alexis Hyder led the way with four steals and registered seven points and three rebounds.

After leading almost the entire first half, LSU struggled offensively in the second half. Tulane opened the half with a 6-0 run and led by as many as 14 points in the third quarter after outscoring the Lady Tigers 18-4 in the third quarter. LSU rallied and was able to close the gap to eight points with one minute left on the clock. The Lady Tigers went on a 9-5 run and was down by just four points, 65-61, with 11 seconds remaining on the clock as Norton hit the basket and was fouled on the shot for the and-one. LSU was forced to foul and Tulane added two points off free throws before Norton hit the last layup for LSU for the eventual 67-63 loss.

LSU outscored Tulane 26-16 in the fourth quarter and Deemer and Norton combined for 21 of LSU's 26 points. The Lady Tigers were 23-of-56 from the field and 13-of-16 from the free-throw line. Tulane was 22-of-54 from the field and 19-of-25 from the free-throw line. Tulane hit 14-of-19 free throws in the second half, and outrebounded LSU in the game, 37-32.

Kolby Morgan and Leslie Vorpahl led the Green Wave in scoring with 18 and 16 points, respectively. Morgan also hauled in 11 rebounds for a double-double.

LSU jumped out early in the game with two quick baskets by Rina Hill and Akilah Bethel and the only time Tulane led in the first half was a two-point lead (6-4) with 7:37 left in the first quarter. The Lady Tigers' largest lead in the first half was nine points. Tulane rallied late in the half and tied the score at 33 off a three pointer by Vorpahl before the squads took to the locker room for the intermission.

The stats were very even in the first half. Both teams hit 13-of-28 shots from the field in the first half and both hit five free throws. LSU was 5-of-8 from the line and Tulane was 5-of-6 from the line. Tulane posted a 17-16 rebounding advantage and the Green Wave turned the ball over one more time than LSU.

Deemer missed the TCU game last Sunday with the same illness that sidelined her for 12 games at the end of the 2015-16 season. She will be evaluated on a daily basis and her status for games will be day-to-day.

**Neubert May Get Debut Soon**

Tatum Neubert, who transferred from Oregon and sat out the 2015-16 season, may soon have her debut in the Purple and Gold. Neubert suffered a knee injury that required surgery over the summer and has been working through her rehab with the athletic training staff in hopes of returning to the court this month. Neubert has been working more with the team in practices as of late, and is being evaluated for a timeframe to suit up for game action. Neubert played 23 games for Oregon during the 2014-15 season, and her last game action was on Feb. 26, 2015 against California.

**Moncrief Earns LSWA Honor**

For her efforts in leading the LSU women's basketball team to a 67-61 come-from-behind win over TCU, junior guard Raigyne Moncrief was named Louisiana Sports Writers Association (LSWA) Player of the Week. Moncrief scored a season-high 22 points in the win over the Horned Frogs that helped the SEC maintain the advantage in the 2016 SEC/Big 12 Challenge. She also led LSU with a season-best five assists and five steals. The speedy guard, whose five steals resulted in four buckets for LSU, did not commit a single turnover in 36 minutes of action.

A native of Ft. Lauderdale, Fla., Moncrief has scored in double figures in the last six-straight games and is the first Lady Tiger this season to score 20 or more points. The 22 points tied for the second-highest scoring effort of her career.

## Lady Tigers Claw Their Way To Victory

In five of the eight games this season, the Lady Tigers have been down at the half, and in three games, they have rallied to claw their way to victory. LSU was down two at the half in wins over Wake Forest and TCU, and had a five-point deficit at the half against NC State. Last season, LSU trailed at the break 19 times and was 2-17 in that span.

## Lady Tigers Take Second In Paradise Jam

Thanks to a game-winning 3-pointer by Raigyne Moncrief with four seconds remaining in the game against NC State, the Lady Tigers finished the event with a 2-1 record and a second-place showing in the Island Division at the Paradise Jam. LSU defeated UTEP (78-45) and NC State (59-58) and lost to Kansas State (69-54) in the tournament that featured three-straight days of competition in the U.S. Virgin Islands.

## Moncrief &amp; Jackson Pick Up Tourney Hardware

Junior Raigyne Moncrief and sophomore Chloe Jackson were named to the Paradise Jam all-tournament team after leading LSU to a 2-1 record and a second-place finish in the Island Division. Jackson averaged 14.0 points and 6.3 rebounds over the three days, while Moncrief averaged 11.0 points and 3.3 rebounds. Jackson posted a double-double versus UTEP with 14 points and 10 rebounds. It was her first career double-double. Moncrief led the way with nine assists and scored in double figures in all three contests.

## Moncrief Hits Game Winner

It was just her second career 3-pointer made, but it was one that is sure to be remembered by the redshirt junior and her teammates. Down by two to NC State in the final game of the Paradise Jam - and with her coaches screaming, "all we need is a TWO" - Moncrief took the defensive rebound from Ayana Mitchell that followed a missed NC State free throw, raced down the court and pulled up for the 3-pointer with four seconds remaining in the game to power LSU to a 59-58 win. Prior to that 3-pointer, Moncrief had been 1-of-15 from behind the arc for her career.

## Mitchell Logs First Career Double-Double

While most people will remember the heroics of Raigyne Moncrief taking it upon herself to go for the win and not the tie against NC State, redshirt freshman Ayana Mitchell had one of the best games of her short career against the Wolfpack. Mitchell, who did not start the third quarter and remained in the locker room to be evaluated following a late second quarter injury, recorded her first career double-double in leading LSU in points (14) and rebounds (16) against NC State. She had two key defensive rebounds in the final minute of the game that contributed to the win. One of her boards led to her getting fouled and sinking two free throws to pull LSU within three points with 48 seconds left in the game. With six seconds left, she grabbed the defensive rebound on a missed NC State free throw and fed the ball to Raigyne Moncrief who raced down the court and scored the game-winning 3-pointer.

## Jackson Registers First Double-Double

Sophomore transfer Chloe Jackson logged her first career double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds against UTEP in the first round of the Paradise Jam. She also led the team in assists with five, and tied for the team lead with Shanice Norton with five steals.

## Lady Tigers Off To Best Start Since 2009-10

With the win over Rice, LSU opened the season at 3-0 for the first time since the 2009-10 season when the Lady Tigers rolled off nine-straight victories to start the season. On Sunday, UConn dashed LSU's hopes of a 4-0 start with a win at the PMAC.

## Hill Rejoins Lineup

Senior Rina Hill missed the first three games of the season because of a hip injury she suffered late in the exhibition contest against LeMoyne-Owen. She was cleared to play against UConn and logged a rebound and an assist in 15 minutes of action against the Huskies. Hill is the only Lady Tiger to have started all 31 games last season. Prior to the season opener against LA Tech, she had never missed a game in a career that spans 96 contests at LSU.

Hill had a very steady Paradise Jam showing, coming in off the bench. She was LSU's third-leading scorer for the tourney with an average of 9.0 points per game, but she was the team's top shooter over the three days. She hit 68 percent (13-of-19) of her shots from the field.

Hill made her first start of the season against TCU and scored four points in 37 minutes of action. She recorded two steals and three rebounds in the win.

**Hyder Snaps Scoring Streak**

Senior Alexis Hyder ran her double-digit scoring streak to 12 games (8 were in 2015-16) before snapping the streak in the first round of the Paradise Jam. Hyder was held to just nine points in 24 minutes on the court by UTEP in LSU's 78-45 win over the Miners.

**Anybody's Night**

After getting to the point last season where LSU was down to just six scholarship players, it is nice to have a full roster of players who can contribute on any given night. Such was the case in the first five games of the season. LSU had a different leading scorer in each of the first five games. Chloe Jackson led the way in her season debut with 19 points against LA Tech. Against Wake Forest, Ayana Mitchell dropped in a team-leading 16 points, and Alexis Hyder led LSU with 15 points versus Rice. Raigyne Moncrief turned it up against UConn and scored 15 points, and in the first round of the Paradise Jam, Shanice Norton led the way with 15 against UTEP.

**Up Next**

The Lady Tigers will play three of their next four games at home to close out the month of December and the non-conference schedule. LSU will welcome thousands of elementary school children to the PMAC for the annual "Field Trip" game on Wednesday, Dec. 14, at 11 a.m., when Sam Houston State travels to Baton Rouge. The Lady Tigers will make their only trip of the month when they travel to Myrtle Beach, S.C., to face North Carolina on Dec. 18. The final two games will bookend the Christmas break when LSU hosts Little Rock on Dec. 21 and Alabama State on Dec. 28.

**Four Ink With Lady Tigers**

Jailin Cherry, Raven Farley, Dekeriyia Patterson and Khayla Pointer signed National Letters of Intent on Nov. 10 & 11 to join the Lady Tiger program for the 2017-18 season.

Farley, a 6-4 forward from Elizabeth, N.J., is the highest-rated player in this signing class. She is tabbed as a five-star prospect by HoopGurlz, which also ranks her No. 19 overall in this class, and fifth nationally at her position. Farley will be the first New Jersey-native on a Lady Tiger Basketball roster. She played her junior season at Queen of Peace High School after transferring from The Patrick School. She averaged 15 points and 10 rebounds in 2015-16 after opening the season on the Naismith Trophy Girls Basketball Player of the Year Watch List.

A four-star prospect according to HoopGurlz, Pointer is a 5-7 guard from Marietta, Ga., and Fargas' niece. She signed with LSU out of Holy Innocents' Episcopal School. As a junior, she averaged 15.2 points, 6.0 rebounds, 6.1 assists and 7.1 steals.

Cherry, a 5-9 guard from Pascagoula, Miss., averaged 14 points and 19 rebounds a game last season as a junior at Pascagoula High School. She also averaged six assists and five steals per game in 2015-16.

Patterson, a 5-9 guard from Ft. Myers, Fla., prepped at Dunbar High School where she averaged 17.1 points, 2.6 rebounds, 3.7 assists and 2.3 steals per games as a junior for the Tigers. She has amassed 1,064 points, 177 steals and 207 assists heading into her senior season.

**What Is HUSH?**

You might hear or see HUSH this season, and it's certainly not something we want our fans to do during our games. We want them rowdier than ever this year. Actually, HUSH is an acronym that the team came up with and means that they have made a commitment to play Hungry, United, Selfless and with Heart.

**Preseason Polls**

After having a tough season due to injuries last year, LSU was picked 11th in the SEC by league coaches, and 12th by members of the media in the preseason. The Lady Tigers, down to just seven scholarship players through much of the league season last year, were 3-13 in the SEC and ended the year 13th, behind Alabama and ahead of Ole Miss.

**Hill On SEC Leadership Council**

Senior Rina Hill is recognized not only as a leader for the Lady Tigers, but also for the SEC. She is a member of the SEC Women's Basketball Leadership Council, which provides student-athletes with additional opportunities to engage with campus leaders and Conference office staff.

**Takeaways From UConn Loss**

While the outcome certainly was not what LSU wanted, there were some positives that can be taken away from the loss to No. 3 UConn. The game got away from the Lady Tigers in the second quarter that UConn outscored LSU, 28-11. In that period, UConn was 5-of-7 from three-point range and 9-of-9 from the free-throw line. LSU came out and continued to fight in the second half and held UConn to just 30 points, its lowest total in the second half this season, but the deficit from the second quarter was too much to overcome. The Huskies scored 48 vs Florida State and 40 vs Baylor in the second half. LSU also forced UConn to turn the ball over 20 times - the most this season, and logged 16 steals - the highest for a UConn opponent this year. The Huskies were lethal from behind the arc, hitting 14-of-26 treys and they also converted 18-of-21 free throws, while LSU was 0-of-4 from three-point range and 9-of-17 from the line.

**Mitchell Set Career High Against Wake Forest**

Redshirt freshman Ayana Mitchell set a career high with 16 points against Wake Forest, though her career is fairly short in the Purple and Gold. She scored 14 points in the season opener against Wake Forest last year. She played two more games in 2015-16 before being sidelined the remainder of the season with a back injury.

**Hyder Adds Another Double-Double**

Senior Alexis Hyder had 15 points and 10 rebounds against Wake Forest for the 11th double-double of her career at LSU. She posted 10 last season after transferring from North Texas. In her two seasons at North Texas, she logged

13 double-doubles (10 as a freshman in 2012-13) to bring her true career total to 26.

**Jackson Scores 19 in Lady Tiger Debut**

Sophomore transfer Chloe Jackson led LSU in the win over LA Tech with 19 points on a 7-of-14 effort from the field and a 4-of-6 mark from the free-throw line. Jackson, who started the game, transferred from NC State and sat out the 2015-16 season. This was her first game action since Nov. 21, 2014. She missed a majority of the 2014-15 season with a foot injury.

**Aifuwa Out For the Season**

True freshman center Faustine Aifuwa is out for the year after suffering a knee injury in LSU's closed scrimmage at the end of October. Aifuwa is expected to have surgery prior to Thanksgiving.

**Moncrief & Mitchell Start in First Game Back in Lineup**

Junior Raigyne Moncrief and freshman Ayana Mitchell were back in the lineup after missing all but three games last season with injuries. Moncrief had knee surgery and Mitchell had back surgery, both in November 2015. Moncrief and Mitchell both started in the win over LA Tech. Moncrief had 15 points, three assists and four rebounds and Mitchell had eight points and four boards.

**True Freshmen See Early Action**

Guard Jaelyn Richard-Harris was the first true freshmen to see court action in the season opener against LA Tech, coming into the game late in the first quarter. Richard-Harris logged 13 minutes and hit three free throws and grabbed three rebounds. Center Yasmine Bidikuindila came into the game midway through the second quarter and tallied one rebound in seven minutes of action.

**Hyder is LSU Grad**

Head coach Nikki Fargas boasts a 100% graduation rate for student-athletes who have completed their eligibility with the program. For the second-straight season, the Lady Tiger roster has a current graduate as Alexis Hyder earned her bachelor's degree in sports administration commerce in spring 2016. She is currently working on a minor in business administration. Last season, Anne Pedersen was a graduate who ultimately earned her master's degree in kinesiology in August 2016, a feat she accomplished in five and a half years.

**Trio In Rio**

Two former Lady Tigers, Seimone Augustus (2002-06) and Sylvia Fowles (2004-08), earned their third Olympic Gold medals this summer in Rio. The duo helped the United States extend its streak to 49-consecutive Olympic victories as USA Basketball claimed its sixth-straight gold medal. With the trio of golds for Augustus and Fowles, LSU and UConn are the only two women's basketball programs to boast multiple players with three or more Olympic gold medals.
