GREEN WAVE HOSTS TULSA IN 2011 CONFERENCE USA OPENER

The Tulane Green Wave football team (1-0, 0-0 C-USA) continues a two-game home stand this Saturday at the Louisiana Superdome when it hosts Conference USA rival Tulsa (0-1, 0-0 C-USA) in the 2011 league opener for both squads.

The Green Wave won its opener last week against Southeastern Louisiana on its home field and will look to jump to a 2-0 record for the first time since 2002 and also begin the season with a 1-0 C-USA mark for the first time since 2005.

Saturday's game will be broadcast live on Cox Sports Television (CST).



TULANE REMEMBERS 9/11 ON EVE OF 10TH ANNIVERSARY

This Sunday marks the 10th anniversary of the 9/11 attacks on the United States and Tulane University will mark the occasion with a day of remembrance prior to Saturday's game against Tulsa.

Saturday will be "First Responders Day" with a special pre-game presentation honoring all First Responders in the city of New Orleans and a fire truck that responded to the 9/11 attacks will be on the field during pregame with the First Responders.

Saturday is also high school band day and nine high schools will join the Tulane marching band in several pregame performances, including a version of TAPPS, Amazing Grace and America the Beautiful prior to the national anthem.

KELLEY WASTES LITTLE TIME BURSTING ON THE SCENE

True freshman **Robert Kelley** wasted little time inserting his name into the Tulane record book. Kelley set a Tulane single-game kickoff return yardage record in his collegiate debut, tallying 213 yards on seven returns and was named the Conference USA and Louisiana Special Teams Player of the Week. Kelley returned the game's opening kick-off 66 yards and then posted returns of 27, 28 and 51 yards. He surpassed the former mark of 171 established by Jeff Lignon on Oct. 26, 1996, against Southern Miss and his 213 yards was the third-best single game effort in C-USA history.

How big was his performance? In 12 games last season, Tulane registered just three kick-off returns of 30-plus yards. Kelley almost equaled that number in the opener.

NOTING THE GREEN WAVE

Tulane's 47 points against the Lions were the most by a Green Wave team in a season opener since the 1998 team hung 52 on Cincinnati in a 52-34 win on Sept. 5, 1998, at Nippert Stadium in Ohio. The win over the Bearcats helped springboard Tulane to its magical 12-0 season which saw the Green Wave win the C-USA title and defeat BYU in the Liberty Bowl.

Freshman **Matthew Bailey** gave the Green Wave special teams a boost with a pair of blocked kicks against the Lions. Bailey tipped a Beau Mothe offering following the first possession of the second half and stuffed another following the Lions' next drive. Bailey's punt block was Tulane's first since Bubba Terranova did so at East Carolina on Oct. 9, 2004.

• Nineteen Tulane players made their collegiate debuts last Saturday: sophomores **Jacob Davis** (WR), **Mike Henry** (OL); redshirt-freshmen **Taylor Bullock** (FB), **Sean Donnelly** (OL), **Steven Funderburk** (LB), **Andre Robinson** (LB), **Adam Skidmore** (OL), **Kenny Welcome** (DT) and **Carlos Wilson** (WR); and true freshmen **Matthew Bailey** (LB), **Danté Butler** (RB), **Robert Kelley** (RB), **Brandon LeBeau** (WR), **Michael Pierce, Jr.** (DE), **Xavier Rush** (WR), **Sam Scofield** (DB), **Justyn Shackelford** (WR), **Evan Tatford** (TE), **Renaldo Thomas** (S).

• TU's 10 true freshmen that earned playing time last week are tied for the eighth-most in the nation. Texas (18) played the most rookies, while defending national champion Auburn (13) was second, Virginia (12) Clemson (12), Ohio State (12) and Tennessee (12) tied for third, while Wyoming (11) is seventh and Tulane is tied with Cal (10), North Carolina (10), Arkansas (10), Louisville (10), Indiana (10) and Kent State (10).

• Tulane head coach **Bob Toledo** will coach his 40th game at Tulane this Saturday against Tulsa. Toledo is the 13th coach in the 117-year history of the Tulane football program to coach in at least 40 games. The Southeastern La. game marked his 195th career game as a head coach.

• Sophomore defensive tackle **Julius Warmlesley** tallied his first career sack in the third quarter against Southeastern La. and finished the game with a team-best three sacks. Warmlesley became the first Tulane player to post 3.0 sacks in a game since **Antonio Harris** had 3.0 against Southeastern Louisiana on Sept. 22, 2007.

• Several Tulane players will look to extend their double-digit starting streaks this week, including juniors DE **Austen Jacks** (13), MLB **Trent Mackey** (13), FS **Shakiel Smith** (13) and CB **Ryan Travis** (13).

• The Green Wave returns 49 letterwinners, including 17 starters (7-offense; 7-defense; 3-special teams), and features 28 newcomers for the 2011 campaign.

• Tulane opens its 37th season of playing its home games inside the Superdome and will host six home contests inside the 'Dome this season.

SCOUTING THE GOLDEN HURRICANE

• Tulsa opened the 2011 season last week with a 47-14 loss at top-ranked Oklahoma. The Golden Hurricane is coming off a 10-3 season, including a victory over Hawai'i in the Sheraton Hawaii Bowl. Last season, Tulsa was 3-3 on the road in 2010, including 2-2 in C-USA play.

Senior quarterback **G.J. Kinne**, the 2010 Conference USA Offensive Player of the Year, completed 18-of-33 attempts for 271 yards and two touchdowns and he also ran 14 times for 46 yards.

Sophomore running back **Trey Watts** ran 10 times for 47 yards against the Sooners to lead the Tulsa rushing attack.

Junior h-back **Willie Carter** caught five passes for 135 yards and was one of eight Golden Hurricane players to haul in a reception against the Sooners.

Defensively, linebacker **Cornelius Arnick** registered 18 tackles (11 solo), while defensive back **Milton Howell** and linebacker **Shawn Jackson** added 13 and 12 tackles, respectively.



SERIES & NOTES:

- Saturday's game marks the eighth all-time meeting between Tulane and Tulsa and the Golden Hurricane leads the overall series 6-1.
- TU's only win in the series came during the inaugural meeting between the teams in 1968. The Green Wave topped the Golden Hurricane 25-15 at Tulane Stadium.
- Tulsa enters Saturday's contest riding a six-game win streak in the series and holds a mark of 2-1 in New Orleans.
- The Golden Hurricane is 6-0 against the Green Wave since becoming a Conference USA member in 2005.
- The inaugural meeting between Tulane and Tulsa as Conference USA members was originally slated to be played in New Orleans in 2005, but Hurricane Katrina devastation of New Orleans forced the game to be played at Malone Stadium in Monroe, La.

THE COACHES:

Tulane: Bob Toledo (San Francisco State, 1968) is in his fifth season as the head coach of the Green Wave. Toledo has a 14-35 mark at Tulane and a career record of 92-103 in 17 years as a Division I head coach. He became the 37th head coach in school history on Dec. 11, 2006, and has coached in 13 bowl games, including seven traditional New Year's Day bowls.

His previous head coaching stint was at UCLA (1996-2002), where he led the Bruins to two Pac-10 titles, a school-record 20-game win streak, two final top-10 national rankings and was twice named the Pac-10 Coach of the Year.

Tulsa: Bill Blankenship (Tulsa, 1979) is in his first season as the head coach at Tulsa and the 2011 campaign marks his inaugural season as a collegiate head coach. He has a 0-1 overall record.

Blankenship spent the past four years as an assistant coach for the Golden Hurricane. He returned to his alma mater in January 2007 to coach the wide receivers. In 2008, Blankenship was named special teams coordinator and in 2009 added the responsibilities of running backs coach as well. In 2010, Blankenship served as senior associate head coach, running backs coach and special teams coordinator.

THIS-N-THAT ABOUT TULANE AND TULSA

A win against Tulsa would...

- Give Tulane's **Bob Toledo** his 15th victory at Tulane and his 93rd overall
- Give TU consecutive wins to open the season for the first time since 2002
- Snap a string of six straight losses against Tulsa
- Give Tulane a 1-0 record in C-USA play for the first time since 2005 (SMU)

A loss against Tulsa would...

- Drop Tulane to 1-1 on the season for the second straight year
- Extend TU's losing streak to seven straight against the Hurricane
- Drop Tulane to 0-1 in league play for the sixth consecutive year
- Give Tulane its third straight loss in C-USA play dating back to 2010

TIES THAT BIND

- TU's redshirt-sophomore kicker **Ryan Rome** and junior safety **Devon Walker** were high school teammates of Tulsa junior WR/KR **Damaris Johnson**, who hails from Norco, La. Together the trio helped Destrehan High School to a state title in 2008.
- Tulane offensive line coach **Mark Hutson** served in the same capacity at Tulsa from 2000-02 under then head coach **Keith Burns**.
- Green Wave Director of Athletics **Rick Dickson** played football and baseball and graduated from Tulsa in 1976 and later served as the director of athletics in the early 1990s.

TULANE VS. C-USA'S PRIVATE SCHOOLS

- Tulane is one of four private schools among Conference USA's 12 members, including Rice, SMU and Tulsa, and Saturday's game marks the 58th overall meeting for Tulane against its brethren. The Green Wave sports an all-time mark of 27-30-1 against the trio of academic schools, including a record of 15-17-1 vs. Rice, 11-7 against SMU and 1-6 vs. Tulsa.

The Green Dream

In an effort to raise awareness and continue the fight against cancer, Maggie Edwards, the mother of Tulane junior long snapper John Edwards, has created the "Green Dream" initiative for the 2011 football season.

Maggie wants to help children with cancer while also inspiring the Tulane Green Wave football players to bring their "A-game" this season. She has pledged to donate \$10 for every Tulane touchdown, \$5 for every field goal, and \$10 for every interception in the upcoming football season to the Tulane Cancer Center's Pediatric Oncology Patient Relief Fund.

Maggie is going to bring a large poster to every home game on which she will display a running total of her personal commitment to date. "It's been my experience that inspiration is contagious," said Edwards, a breast cancer survivor who is proud and candid about the constant care she received from her son during her battle with the disease. Additionally, the Green Wave will host one of Tulane's pediatric cancer patients for each of the six home games during the upcoming 2011 season. The lucky boys and girls will serve as honorary team members for the day, meeting the Green Wave football players, cheer on the field during the team's entrance, participating in the coin toss, etc.

Volunteers from the Tulane Cancer Center and the Tulane Hospital for Children will also be on hand at the first home game to take donations from fans who are inspired like Maggie to give to the cause.

RUNNING BACK BY COMMITTEE

• Tulane spread the ball around against the Lions in the opener as six Green Wave running backs carried the ball at least twice. **Albert Williams** earned the start and carried the ball 12 times for 72 yards and a touchdown, while sophomore **Orleans Darkwa** carried 10 times for 34 yards and a score. Freshman **Robert Kelley** carried the ball just twice for 12 yards, but found the endzone for his first career touchdown.

Sophomore **Jamar Thomas** earned four totes for 11 yards, while junior **Stephen Barnett** carried three times for eight yards and freshman **Dante Butler** earned two carries for eight yards.

GRIFFIN DOES NOT PLAY FAVORITES IN SEASON OPENER

• Junior quarterback **Ryan Griffin** didn't play favorites when it came to the passing game last week against Southeastern La. Griffin directed a passing game that saw nine players catch at least one pass. Senior **Joe Kemp** led the Wave with four receptions for 83 yards, while sophomore **Wilson Van Hooser** and freshman **Justyn Shackelford** each had two receptions. Van Hooser finished with 64 yards and a score, while Shackelford had 24 yards.

Junior **Ryan Grant** caught just one pass but it was a 27-yard touchdown, while **Matt Marfisi**, **Stephen Suchy**, **Orleans Darkwa**, **Carlos Wilson** and **Trent Mackey** each grabbed one reception. Mackey took his three-year grab near the goal line into the endzone for his first career touchdown.

PICK YOUR POISON

• Each of the Green Wave's six touchdowns last week were scored by a different player, including three by running backs on the ground (**Albert Williams**, **Orleans Darkwa**, **Robert Kelley**) and three by two receivers (**Ryan Grant**, **Wilson Van Hooser**) and one by a converted linebacker to fullback (**Trent Mackey**), giving the Tulane balance both on the ground and in the air.

KYLE DAVIS MAKES THE MOST OF HIS FIRST COLLEGIATE START

• With senior safety **Taylor Echols** sidelined for the Southeastern La. game with an injury, sophomore **Kyle Davis** stepped in and earned the first start of his career. Davis responded with a career-best 11 tackles (six solo) and added one pass break-up on the day.

GREEN WAVE D-LINE COMES ON LATE

• By halftime of Tulane's season opener last week, the Wave's defensive line had combined for just one tackle for lost yardage- a sack by senior DE **Dezman Moses**.

By the time final whistle blew, the group has rebounded with eight stops behind the line of scrimmage, a total of seven sacks and a combined 21 stops.

Defensive ends **Moses** and junior **Austen Jacks** each finished with five stops, while **Jacks** joined **Moses** in the sack column. In the interior, sophomore **Julius Warnsley** was credited with five stops, including three sacks, while senior **Cedric Wilson** added three stops and senior **Chris Asumnu** chalked up a pair of tackles. Senior **Josh Smith** posted his name on the stat sheet with one assisted tackle.

SPECIAL TEAMS REPORT

• **Kickoff Return:** Tulane true freshman **Robert Kelley** returned seven kickoff returns for a school record 213 yards.

• **Kickoff:** Tulane surrendered 224 yards on eight returns, or 28 yards per return and gave up a long of 46 yards.

• **Punt Return:** Sophomore **Derrick Strozier** averaged 24.5 yards on two punt returns, including a career-high 44-yard return in the fourth quarter.

• **Punt:** Sophomore **Jonathan Ginsburgh** punted six times and averaged a 43.7 yards per clip. He put three attempts inside the 20-yard line and had one touchback. TU's punt team gave up just 7.5 yards on four returns.

• **Punt Block:** **Matthew Bailey** blocked two punts last week. His second blocked punt resulted in a safety as the ball rolled out of the endzone. The 2-point defensive play was the second in as many games for the Green Wave dating back to last year as then-senior **Justin Adams** tackled a Marshall running back in the endzone in last year's season finale in Huntington, W.Va.

• **FG/PAT:** Sophomore kicker **Cairo Santos** converted all six PAT attempts and knocked down his only field goal attempt, a 36-yarder on TU's opening possession.

GRIFFIN OFF TO A STRONG START

• Junior quarterback **Ryan Griffin** tied a career high with three touchdown passes during the win against Southeastern Louisiana. He accomplished the feat twice as a redshirt-freshman in 2009 and two more times last season. His three scoring strikes gives him 26 for his career, which moves him into a tie with **Nickie Hall** (1977-80) for eighth place in Tulane history.



WAVE TRIO RECEIVES PRESEASON ATTENTION FROM NATIONAL MEDIA

• The Green Wave begins the 2011 campaign with three of its players receiving notice on the national watch lists, including sophomore **Orleans Darkwa** (Doak Walker), junior linebacker **Trent Mackey** (Rotary Lombardi) and junior **Ryan Grant** (Biletnikoff).

All three players scored a touchdown in the season opener last week.

Darkwa is the third Tulane running back since 2007 to be named to the Doak Walker Award Watch List, joining Matt Forte (2007) and Andre Anderson (2008, 2009). Darkwa was named a third team Freshman All-American by Phil Steele Publications after rushing for a Tulane freshman record 925 yards and scoring 11 touchdowns.

Mackey led Tulane in tackles with 124 a year ago and was named to the All-Conference USA second team and selected as the Louisiana Newcomer of the Year. Grant caught 33 passes for 515 yards and four touchdowns, including the game-winner against Rice.

WAVE RUNNERS

• The Green Wave returns 61 percent of its scoring from last year, including sophomore placekicker **Cairo Santos**, who led the team in scoring with 71 points, sophomore running back **Orleans Darkwa**, who was second with 68 points and junior receiver **Ryan Grant**, who was sixth with 24 points. Three of players who reached the scoreboard return as well.

• Tulane returns 80 percent of its rushing attack, including sophomore **Orleans Darkwa**, who led the team in rushing with 925 yards and 11 touchdowns.

• The Green Wave returns the bulk of a secondary that was tough against the pass, ranking first among Conference USA teams in pass defense, giving up just 194.6 yards per game, and ranking 28th in the nation. The secondary also contributed eight interceptions, 30 pass breakups, five forced fumbles and made five fumble recoveries.

• Tulane's offensive line returns three starters in senior guard **Harris Howard**, junior guard **Zach Morgan** and junior right tackle **Eric Jones**. These three linemen have started a combined 43 games during their career.

DYNAMIC DARKWA LOOKING TO TOP LAST YEAR'S PERFORMANCE

• Sophomore running back **Orleans Darkwa** established a new single-season rushing total by a freshman running back last season with 925 yards on 184 carries and also set a new single-season rushing TD total by a freshman with 11, which tied for the second-most in one season by any Tulane back. He eclipsed former Tulane great **Mewelde Moore's** mark of 860 yards set in 2000 and **Jamaican Darte's** freshman rushing touchdown total of 10 set in 1995.

Last year, he was the No. 2 rusher in C- USA and the top freshman running back in C-USA, and was also first among non-automatic qualifying schools and ranked fourth nationally

Darkwa earned third team Freshman All-America honors from Phil Steele publications and received honorable mention Freshman All-America honors by CollegeFootballNews.com. He was named to the All-Conference USA Second Team and All C-USA Freshman Team.

DO-IT-ALL MACKAY EMERGES AS ONE OF THE NATION'S TOP LINEBACKERS

• Junior middle linebacker **Trent Mackey** begins his second season at Tulane with several preseason honors, including being a member of the Rotary Lombardi Watch List and he was selected to the 2011 Conference USA Preseason First Team.

Last year, Mackey was one of the nation's leaders in tackles in his first season in a Green Wave uniform. He started every game and logged 124 tackles (63 solo), ranking third among C-USA players and 17th nationally. Mackey ranked among the nation's top-20 the entire season, including two weeks at No. 1. He notched 10+ plus tackles in eight of 12 games, including a career-best 17 vs. Army.

MOSES LOOKING TO LEAD THE GREEN WAVE TO THE PROMISE LAND

• Senior defensive end **Dezman Moses** made an immediate impact during his first season in a Tulane uniform a year ago. Moses was named to Phil Steele's All-Conference USA second team and was an honorable mention All C-USA selection by the league's head coaches. He registered 51 tackles (22 solo), including 11.5 stops for lost yardage, four quarterback sacks, three forced and one fumble recovery, four pass breakups and seven hurries. He Ranked 10th among C-USA players in tackles for loss (1.00 per game) and was ninth with sacks per game (.44) in the league. In just his second game, was named C-USA Defensive Player of the Week after posting six stops with 1.5 sacks among 2.5 tackles for loss (-10) at Rutgers.

SANTOS LOOKING TO BUILD ON LAST YEAR'S PERFORMANCE

- Sophomore placekicker **Cairo Santos** played in all 12 games in 2010 and paced the team with 71 points after connecting on 13-of-16 field goal tries (.813) and 32-of- 33 PATS (.970), and kicking off 57 times for 3,366 yards (59.1 avg.). He posted the most field goals made by a C-USA freshman.

For his efforts, Santos was named to the All C-USA Freshman squad and received honorable mention All C-USA recognition.

As a rookie, Santos placed his name in the Tulane single season record book, including third for field goal percentage, seventh for points and 10th for field goals made.

GRANT HOPES TO PICK UP WHERE HE LEFT OFF LAST SEASON

- Junior **Ryan Grant** returns as Tulane's top receiver after catching 33 passes for 515 yards and four touchdowns a year ago. Grant emerged near the midway point of the season and caught three or passes in six of TU's final seven games.

His coming out party was a six-reception effort at Tulsa. From there, he accounted for 30 receptions in his final six games, including a career-best eight receptions in the season finale at Marshall.

He caught the longest pass of his career with a 73-yard game-winning touchdown strike from **Ryan Griffin** against Rice last season.

TU'S RETURNING DEFENSIVE STARTERS LOOK TO MAKE FOR A STINGY UNIT

- The Tulane defense returns a balance of seven starters with three returners on the defensive line in seniors **Chis Asumnu** and **Dezman Moses** and junior **Austen Jacks**, two returning linebackers in the junior tandem of **Trent Mackey** and **Darryl Farley** and a pair in the secondary in junior cornerback **Ryan Travis** and junior safety **Shakiel Smith**.

Asumnu Moses and Jacks combined for 130 tackles, including 18 stops for lost yardage and 8.5 sacks, along with five forced fumbles, four fumble recoveries and one interception.

Mackey and Farley accounted for 175 stops with 10 tackles for lost yardage and 2.5 sacks. The duo was responsible for four forced fumbles, one fumble recovery and one interception.

Travis and Smith each ranked among the top five leaders in tackles. Travis posted 67 stops for fourth place and added three forced fumbles and four pass break-ups, while Smith was third in tackles with 90 and grabbed three interceptions.

WAVE OFFENSE RETURNS SOLID NUCLEUS OF STARTERS

- Tulane returns seven key players on offense, including quarterback **Ryan Griffin**, running back **Orleans Darkwa**, receivers **Ryan Grant** and **Joe Kemp** and three offensive linemen in guards **Harris Howard** and **Zach Morgan** and tackle **Eric Jones**.

Griffin completed 60 percent of his passing attempts and finished the season with 2,371 yards and 14 touchdowns, while Darkwa ran for a Tulane freshman record 925 yards and scored 11 touchdowns.

Grant proved to be a big-play receiver down the stretch, hauling in 33 receptions for 515 yards and four touchdowns, while Kemp grabbed 14 passes for 154 yards and one score, the game-winner at Rutgers.

Howard started 11 of 12 games, while Jones was the starter in 10 of 11 contests and Morgan earned starting assignments in nine of 11 contests.

SPECIAL TEAM TRIO AIMS FOR CONSISTENCY THIS SEASON

• The Green Wave returns three special teams contributors from last season in placekicker **Cairo Santos**, punter **Jonathan Ginsburgh** and long snapper **John Edwards**. Santos made quite a splash as a rookie kicker last season, hitting 13-of-16 field goals and 32-of-33 PATs, while Ginsburgh, also a first-year freshman in 2010, handled all the punting duties and posted a 40-yard average. He booted a career-long 73-yard effort at Rutgers, which was the seventh longest in school history.

Edwards earned honorable mention All C-USA honors last season after handling snapping duties for all 71 punts and 16 field goals tries.

TULANE SCHEDULE FEATURES SCHOOL FIRSTS, HEAVY HITTERS

• For the first time in school history, Tulane will play 13 regular season games, but will not have a bye week this season, which gives the team 13 straight weeks of games. The only other time Tulane has played 13 games in one season was in 2002 when the Green Wave played 12 regular season games and downed Hawaii in the ConAgra Hawaii Bowl.

• The Green Wave will play non-conference opponents from the Atlantic Coast Conference, the Big East Conference, the Western Athletic Conference and one independent. Tulane will face off against seven bowl teams, including Army (Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl), East Carolina (Military Bowl), Hawaii (Sheraton Hawaii Bowl), SMU (Bell Helicopter Armed Forces Bowl), Syracuse (New Era Pinstripe Bowl), Tulsa (Sheraton Hawaii Bowl) and UTEP (New Mexico Bowl).

KEMP(ER) FI! TU'S JOE KEMP SPENDS SIX WEEKS TRAINING WITH THE MARINES

• This past summer, senior receiver **Joe Kemp** spent six weeks training with the Marines but it wasn't for football or college- it was to serve his country.

During the months of May, June and part of July of 2011, he underwent training to become a United States Marine Corps Officer at the Marine Corps Base in Quantico, Va. Kemp's participation was part of Officer Candidate School. All candidates have to go through an intense, three-month acceptance process that takes into account grade-point average, character and conduct, among other criteria.

Kemp is scheduled to be commissioned as a second lieutenant in the Marines on July 8, 2012 – the same day his girlfriend, Tulane student-trainer Abby Harris, also gets commissioned as a second lieutenant in the Navy.

• When Tulane takes the field in the opener against Southeastern Louisiana, a pair of new assistant coaches will dot the roster, but won't be strangers to the Louisiana Superdome.

Rickey Bustle, the former head coach at Louisiana-Lafayette and long-time offensive coordinator at Virginia Tech will serve as the quarterbacks coach, while **John Hendrick**, a former assistant coach at South Florida, will oversee the defensive line and special team units.

Bustle became familiar with the Superdome as the offensive coordinator at Virginia Tech when the Hokies battled Florida State for the BCS National Championship in the 2000 Sugar Bowl Classic. He was also a member of Virginia Tech's staff that won the 1995 Sugar Bowl Classic.

Hendrick played at Pittsburgh and was a member of the Panther's team that won the 1982 Sugar Bowl Classic.

• **Wendell Beckwith's** cousin, Darry Beckwith, starred at LSU and is a current member of the San Diego Chargers.

• Former Green Wave standout **Andrew Nierman**, a four-year starter from 2007-10, begins his first season as a graduate assistant on the TU coaching staff.

• Tulane 2011 roster features a pair of identical twins in **Kendrell** (#23) and **Kendrick Washington**. Both players play the same position (cornerback) and are the height (5-9).

• Freshman Michael Pierce, Jr. knew a lot about Tulane before he ever arrived on campus. • Redshirt-sophomore **Alex Lauricella's** uncle, Hank, was an All-America football player at Tennessee.

• Juniors **Chris Asumnu** and **Emmanuel Aluko** were also prep teammates at Houston's (Texas) Alief Elsik High School.

• **Sam Scofield's** grandfather, John, played football at Tulane in 1954. The younger Scofield was a member of the 2005 Lafayette Little League team that reached the U.S. semifinals of the Little League World Championship.

• **Chris Asumnu** brings a talented athletic lineage to Tulane. His sister, Gloria, was a multi All-America track athlete for the Green Wave, while his brother, Stanley, played both football and basketball at Tennessee and is a member of the Rio Grande Valley Vipers of the NBA Developmental League.

• Offensive line coach **Mark Hutson** has spent 17 years in collegiate coaching. However, he is most noted for scoring a touchdown on a Fumblerooski in the 1988 Orange Bowl against Miami (Fla.). As an All-America guard at Oklahoma against Miami in the fourth quarter of the Orange Bowl, Hutson picked up the ball after Sooners quarterback Charles Thompson had taken the snap and laid it on the ground and rambled 29 yards for a touchdown. However, OU lost the game for the national championship 20-14.

• Tulane receivers coach **Thomas "TD" Woods** completed his collegiate career at Tennessee as the Volunteers' single-season and career receiving leader. Woods was a two-time All-Southeastern conference selection.

• Tulane linebacker coach **Doug Colman** spent five seasons in the NFL as a linebacker. Colman played with the

AFC Champion Tennessee Titans in 1999 and played in Super Bowl XXXIV against the St. Louis Rams and was awarded the game ball for the "Music City Miracle" against the Buffalo Bills in an AFC Playoff game. His father Wayne, who also played linebacker in the NFL, was a member of the New Orleans Saints and both father and son wore No. 59 during their professional careers.  San Francisco State, 1968



- Named the 37th head coach in the 116-year history of the Tulane football program on Dec. 11, 2006.
- Has a 14-35 record at Tulane.
- Led Tulane to its biggest win in 10 years with the Wave's 17-14 road win at Big East Conference member Rutgers on Oct. 2, 2010.
- Sports an overall record of 92-103 in 18 seasons as a collegiate head coach.
- Coached in his 150th game on Sept. 29, 2007, against No. 2 LSU, his 175th game on Oct. 10, 2009, vs. Marshall and his 185th vs. Houston on Sept. 25, 2010. Will coach in his 200th game against Syracuse on Oct. 8, 2011.
- Despite a 4-8 record during his first season at Tulane, Toledo still managed to lead the Wave into the national spotlight. Under his offensive philosophy, senior tailback Matt Forté rushed for a school record 2,127 yards, the seventh-best single season total in NCAA history, and he became the 12th player to surpass the 2,000-yard rushing plateau in a single year. Forté earned numerous All-America honors, including second team All-America honors, and was among the contenders for the Heisman Trophy, the Doak Walker and Maxwell Awards, and was named the national player of the week twice in his lone season under Toledo.
- Has more than 30 years of collegiate coaching experience to the Green Wave football team, including head coaching stints at Cal Riverside (15-6 with two championships from 1974-75), University of the Pacific (14-30 from 1979-82) and UCLA (1996-2002). He has coached in 13 bowl games during his career, including seven of the traditional New Year's Day bowls.
- Spent seven years (1996-2002) as the head coach at UCLA where he compiled a 49-32 record overall. The Bruins produced a school-record 20-game winning streak, plus two Pac-10 titles, one Rose Bowl appearance and non-conference victories over Texas (twice), Alabama (twice), Michigan, Ohio State and Texas A&M.
- Under Toledo, UCLA went 10-2 in 1998, climbing to No. 2 in the national polls. The Bruins finished the regular season ranked fifth nationally in scoring offense (40.5) and eighth in total offense (482.6). They set school records for total offense (5,487 yards), passing yards (3,658) and passing touchdowns (29) and Toledo was a finalist for three Coach of the Year awards.
- The 1997 UCLA team finished 10-2 and ranked No. 5 in the nation after rallying to defeat Texas A&M in the Cotton Bowl. The Bruins trailed the Aggies 16-0 before making a dramatic second-half comeback to win 29-23. UCLA averaged 40.7 points and more than 430 yards during the regular season.
- Prior to becoming UCLA head coach in January of 1996, Toledo was the Bruins' offensive coordinator for two seasons (1994-95) under Terry Donahue. Offensive tackle Jonathon Ogden won the Outland Trophy and tailback Karim Abdul-Jabbar was first team All-America in 1995.
- Served as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach for R.C. Slocum at Texas A&M for five years (1989-93). During that span, the Aggies posted a gaudy 49-12-1 record with three Southwest Conference titles and five straight bowl games, including three consecutive Cotton Bowl appearances. His 1990 Aggie offense still holds the school record for total yards in a single game (774 yards on 76 plays against Louisiana-Lafayette) and season game average with 471.1 yards per game that year.
- Toledo served as the offensive coordinator at Oregon for six seasons (1983-88), and helped tutor two of the Pac-10's most productive quarterbacks - Chris Miller and Bill Musgrave.
- Before his head coaching stint at Pacific, Toledo guided the secondary under John Robinson at Southern Cal from 1976-78. The Trojans went 31-6 in three seasons and were co-national champs after the 1978 campaign. Toledo's most heralded pupils included Dennis Thurman, Ronnie Lott and Dennis Smith.
- Toledo's first collegiate head coaching position was at Cal Riverside from 1974-75. The Highlanders were 15-6 and captured a pair of California Collegiate Athletic Association championships.

Game 1 • Tulane 47, Southeastern Louisiana 33

Louisiana Superdome • New Orleans, La.

Sept. 3, 2011 • 15,912

Ryan Griffin tossed three touchdown passes and six Green Wave players found the endzone as Tulane opened the 2011 season with a 47-33 victory over Southeastern Louisiana.

Albert Williams, Orleans Darkwa and Robert Kelley each scored a rushing touchdown while Griffin connected with Wilson Van Hooser, Ryan Grant and Trent Mackey for scoring strikes of 55, 27 and three yards, respectively. Kelley set a Tulane single-game record with 213 kickoff return yards.

While the offense rolled up 393 yards (126 rushing, 267 passing), the Green Wave defense posted seven sacks among eight tackles for loss, broke up eight passes and picked off another. On special teams, Tulane added a pair of blocked punts by Matthew Bailey, including one that resulted in a safety.

Kelley got the game started on a high note as he returned the opening kickoff 66 yards to help set up Cairo Santos' 36-yard field goal four plays later. Southeastern Louisiana answered with a one-yard touchdown plunge by Zeke Jones on its first possession of the game, but the Green Wave came right back with a three-play, 67-yard drive which ended on Griffin-to-Van Hooser's 55-yard touchdown pass to give Tulane a 10-7 lead it would not relinquish.

On their next drive, the Mackey snared a three-yard Griffin pass with 2:15 left in the opening quarter to put the home team on top, 17-7. The Lions roared back with a Jones five-yard touchdown run, but Griffin found Grant deep for a 27-yard scoring strike. Southeastern cut the deficit to three courtesy of a one-yard Sam Fairley touchdown run. Williams, however, scored on a 30-yard run five scrimmage plays later to send the Green Wave into the locker room at halftime with a 31-21 advantage.

The two teams traded punts to open the second half but Bailey's second stuff off the toe of Beau Mothe saw the ball roll out of bounds in the Tulane endzone for a safety to make it a 33-21 affair.

Darkwa added a two-yard scoring jaunt six plays later and the route was on. Southeastern sandwiched 30- and 38-yard field goals by Seth Sebastian around a Kelley 11-yard touchdown run to make it 47-27, and the Lions closed out the scoring when quarterback Brian Young snuck in from one yard out with 6:34 left in regulation.
